Meet 1 - at American Gold Classic, w/ California, Oregon State (Jan. 4)

UCLA opened its season with a third-place finish at the American Gold Classic in Oceanside, scoring 195.250. California took first place with a 196.275, and No. 19 Oregon State was second with a 195.775. Two early falls on uneven bars in rotation put the Bruins in a hole early on, and although they kept pace with the other two teams on the final three events, including posting the highest mark on floor exercise, the low mark of 48.200 on bars was too much to overcome. UCLA had meet-winning routines from Jordan Chiles (9.900 on vault) and Brooklyn Moors (9.900 on floor exercise).

Meet 2 - at Sprouts Collegiate Quad, w/ Kentucky, Ohio State, Arkansas (Jan. 11)

UCLA won session 3 of the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad, posting the third-highest score in the nation, 197.550. The Bruins easily outdistanced its competition by over a point, outscoring Kentucky (196.500), Ohio State (196.425) and Arkansas (195.875). With the weight of devastating wildfires back home, the Bruins banded together to compete for the city of LA and came through with an inspired 24-for-24 performance. UCLA began the meet with a 49.475 on balance beam and never let up, scoring a national-best 49.600 on floor exercise in rotation two, a 49.100 on vault and a 49.375 on uneven bars. Emma Malabuyo earned the beam win with a 9.925, Jordan Chiles scored a near-perfect 9.975 to win floor, and Frida Esparza captured the bars title with a 9.925.

Meet 3 - at Maryland (Jan. 18)

UCLA recorded a 197.550 team score for the second consecutive week to earn its first-ever Big Ten Conference win at Maryland, 197.550-194.850, in front of a record crowd of 7,287. Jordan Chiles earned the Bruins' first perfect 10 of the season, on uneven bars in the first rotation. She also placed first in her first all-around turn of the year, scoring 39.500. UCLA closed strong in the meet, posting a 49.575 on floor, led by meet-winning 9.95s from Chiles and Brooklyn Moors, and a national-best 49.550 on balance beam, led by Emma Malabuyo's near-perfect 9.975.

Meet 4 - Illinois (Jan. 25)

UCLA celebrated its first home conference meet with a 197.200-194.750 victory over Illinois in front of 7,647 in Pauley Pavilion presented by Wescom. The Bruins led from start to finish and earned scores of 49+ on all four events, capping the day with a 49.500 on floor exercise. Graduate student Chae Campbell won the all-around with a score of 39.400. Campbell played a pivotal role in UCLA earning its third consecutive 197+ score, as she followed two low beam marks with a strong 9.850 routine that shifted the momentum back to the Bruins. She also contributed a vault score of 9.925 on her stuck Yurchenko full, tying Jordan Chiles for first, to help UCLA earn a season-best team score of 49.325.

Meet 5 - Michigan State (Feb. 1)

In front of a home crowd of 10,681 and a nationally-televised audience on FOX, No. 6 UCLA made an exhilarating comeback in the final rotation to defeat No. 5 Michigan State, 197.300-197.200. The Bruins trailed by seven-tenths of a point before scoring a national-best 49.800 on floor exercise, capped by a meet-clinching perfect 10.0 from Olympic gold medalist Jordan Chiles. Floor leadoff performer Emily Lee started with a 9.875 on her first floor routine of the year. Emma Malabuyo followed with a 9.900. Freshman Macy McGowan scored her first career 9.950. Brooklyn Moors and Chae Campbell went back-to-back with 9.975s, setting the stage for Chiles. Needing a 9.925 to win the meet for UCLA, the junior delivered with a 10.0 to give the Bruins the narrow victory.

Meet 6 - at Washington (Feb. 7)

UCLA put together a complete team performance in a 197.950-196.125 victory at Washington on Feb. 7. The Bruins recorded a season-high team total, surpassing their previous mark by four-tenths of a point, and hit 24-for-24 routines, including 14 scores of 9.9 or higher. UCLA swept the individual events, with Chae Campbell capturing the all-around title with a season-high 39.625 and winning vault with a season-best 9.925. Frida Esparza tied her career-high with a 9.950 to win uneven bars for the third time this season. Ciena Alipio and Emma Malabuyo tied for first on balance beam with scores of 9.950, a new career-high for Alipio. Jordan Chiles and Brooklyn Moors tied for first on floor exercise with 9.950s. As a team, the Bruins earned season-highs on uneven bars (49.425) and balance beam (49.625).

UCLA hit 24-for-24 for the second-straight meet to defeat No. 25 Penn State, 197.675-195.450 at home on Feb. 14. The victory was UCLA's fifth consecutive Big Ten Conference win. The Bruins earned a season-high 49.575 on uneven bars and record a total of 10 scores of 9.9 or higher. Jordan Chiles won the all-around with a season-high 39.600 and tied for first on uneven bars and floor exercise. Freshman Mika Webster-Longin earned her first career event victory, tying for first on vault with a 9.850. Frida Esparza scored a new career-high 9.975 to tie with Chiles for first on bars. Emily Lee won the balance beam with a leadoff 9.925 on her only routine of the day, and Brooklyn Moors and Chiles added to their collection of floor exercise titles, tying for first with scores of 9.950.

Meet 8 - at Michigan (Feb. 23)

UCLA remained unbeaten in the Big Ten after a 197.550-196.850 win at Michigan. The Bruins used strong scores on floor exercise and balance beam in the last two rotations to take the victory. UCLA grabbed a slim .025 lead after the first rotation, scoring 49.325 on uneven bars. Emma Malabuyo led the way with a career-high 9.925, and Frida Esparza saved the Bruins from counting a fall when she improvised after overdoing a handstand, keeping her score to 9.800. Michigan moved ahead of UCLA after rotation two, scoring 49.350 on bars to the Bruins' 49.250 on vault. The lead was short-lived, however, as UCLA went to its best two events and pulled away, scoring 49.550 on floor, led by back-to-back 9.975s from Brooklyn Moors and Jordan Chiles, and 49.425 on beam, thanks to three scores of 9.900 and five stuck dismounts.

Meet 9 - at Big Fours (March 2)

UCLA won its first-ever Big Ten Regular Season title after a first-place finish at the Big Four Meet at Ohio State. The Bruins went unbeaten in conference play with a 9-0 record, earning their eighth consecutive meet victory with a first-place score of 197.200. Nebraska was second with 196.675, followed by Ohio State (196.650) and Rutgers (195.875). The Bruins scored 49.500 on floor in the first rotation but led Nebraska by just two-tenths at the halfway mark. UCLA extended its lead to 0.35 after scoring 49.300 on bars and did just enough on beam in the final rotation, scoring 49.125 to clinch the victory. Jordan Chiles won the all-around with a 39.550 and took home victories on uneven bars (9.950) and floor exercise (9.950), tying for first on the latter with Brooklyn Moors.

UCLA won its Senior Day meet, beating No. 12 Stanford, 197.675-197.100, in front of a program record home crowd of 12,918. The Bruins used strong performances on balance beam (49.575) and floor exercise (49.525) in the final two rotations to take the over half-point victory. UCLA has won nine straight meets, scoring 197 or higher in all nine. Each graduating senior had their shining moments during the meet, including team-best scores of 9.925 on beam from Emily Lee and Emma Malabuyo, a career-high-tying 9.900 on beam and 9.925 on floor from Brooklyn Moors, and a 9.900 on vault from Chae Campbell, but it was junior Jordan Chiles who stole the show, winning the all-around with a 39.750. Chiles also won vault, bars and floor with scores of 9.950.

Meet 11 - at Utah (March 15)

UCLA's nine-meet winning streak came to an end on March 16 as the No. 4 Bruins fell to No. 5 Utah, 198.100-197.425. UCLA did, however, extend its streak of 197+ team scores to 10 consecutive meets, thanks in part to 9.950s from Frida Esparza on bars, Brooklyn Moors on floor and Chae Campbell on beam. The Bruins started out with a strong 49.425 on uneven bars in the first rotation, matching the Utes' 49.425 on vault. UCLA's final three each scored 9.900 or higher, with Esparza leading with a 9.950, Jordan Chiles contributing a 9.925, and Macy McGowan scoring a career-high 9.900. But Utah separated itself in rotation two, scoring 49.525 on bars to UCLA's 49.175 on vault. Utah's 49.600 on beam in the third rotation increased the lead to 0.575, and even four scores of 9.900 or higher on beam were not enough for the Bruins to catch up.

Meet 12 - at Big Ten Championships (March 22)

Top-seeded UCLA came from behind to win the Big Ten Championship with a Championships record score of 198.450. The Bruins tied their season-high on vault with a 49.350 in the first rotation but found themselves in third place. They moved up to second at the halfway mark after all six gymnasts scored 9.900 or higher on uneven bars, led by Frida Esparza's 9.950. A school record-tying 49.750 on balance beam pulled the Bruins within .025 of first-place Michigan State. The Bruins counted five scores of 9.925 or higher on beam, led by the first career perfect 10 from Ciena Alipio. UCLA closed the meet on floor exercise, scoring 49.800 for the second time this season, with back-to-back perfect 10s from Brooklyn Moors and Jordan Chiles sealing the victory.

Jordan Chiles scored 9.975 on floor, a season-high-tying 9.950 on vault and a new season-high of 9.950 on beam. Brooklyn Moors also had a strong showing, posting a new career-high of 9.925 on vault and earning a 9.950 on floor.

A year after finishing 17th in the nation, UCLA rebounded with a second-place finish at the NCAA Championships. The fifth-seeded Bruins were less than .350 behind second-seeded Oklahoma heading into the final rotation but could not make up enough ground on balance beam, finishing as national runner-up by four-tenths of a point. No. 7 seed Missouri finished third, and No. 4 seed Utah was fourth. The Bruins began the meet with a big score of 49.6125 on floor exercise, tying for first with Oklahoma, who matched that total on balance beam. The Sooners claimed sole possession of first in rotation two after totaling 49.5875 on floor exercise while UCLA scored 49.2875 on vault. Down by three-tenths of a point going into rotation three, the Bruins scored 49.4000 on uneven bars to remain in contention, sticking four of six dismounts. Oklahoma, however, hit a 49.4375 on vault to remain in first with a 148.6375 to UCLA's 148.3000. Needing to make up .3375 on beam in the final rotation, the Bruins fell short, scoring 49.3125 to Oklahoma's 49.3750 on bars.
