All-Time Series: UCLA leads, 8-3-1

The Bruins are looking to avenge a 1-0 loss to Portland at home last season

UCLA HITS THE ROAD FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 2022, FACES PORTLAND

After playing four straight at home to open the regular season, No. 6-ranked UCLA (3-0-1) plays its first road game of 2022 this weekend, heading to the Pacific Northwest to face WCC-member Portland (2-0-2). The contest will be streamed live on the WCC Network. Fans can also follow along with live stats, and updates via the team Twitter account, @UCLAMSoccer.

IN THE POLLS

UCLA appeared in every major national poll last week, checking in as high as No. 6 (TopDrawerSoccer) and also appearing at No. 9 (College Soccer News) and No. 15 (United Soccer Coaches).

- This is UCLA's second consecutive week in the national top-10
- The Bruins were ranked No. 4 last week, the program's highest since Sept. 1, 2015 (No. 1)
- Four Pac-12 schools are ranked inside the top-10 (No. 3 Stanford, No. 8 Washington, No. 10 Oregon State) for just the second time in history (Sept. 1, 2015)
- Half of the Pac-12 is nationally ranked (others: Stanford, Washington)

THE WEEK IN REVIEW

UCLA has played a pair of home contests over the last week, breaking out offensively for a 5-2 win over Liberty on Sept. 2 before absorbing a 3-2 loss to No. 24 Grand Canyon on Labor Day. Riley Ferch (2G, 1A) and Constantinos Michaelides (1G, 1A) led the Bruins to a season-high in goals against the Flames. The Bruins never trailed in the contest, but it was a back-and-forth contest until Ferch's brace-clinching goal made it 3-2 just before the halftime whistle. That was the first of three unanswered goals to close the game for the Bruins, who limited Liberty to just three shot attempts in the second half. UCLA had an unfortunate first half against the Lopes, failing to convert on a PK in the 15th minute, conceding in the 23rd, and then going down a man down in the 37th after being issued a straight red. The Bruins ultimately scored twice with 10 men, tying the game at 1-1 after Andre Ochoa played Constantinos Michaelides into a breakaway, but GCU responded in the 68th and 80th minutes to take the road win. Alec LeBarge had a brace for the visitors.

GOOD START

UCLA is 3-1-0 to start a season for the second consecutive year, and just the third time since 2015. Prior to dropping the GCU game, the Bruins had won their first three games of a season for the first time since 2002. Last year, UCLA's 6-2-0 start was the program's best eight-game start since 2009.

BACK TO BACK

UCLA has scored seven goals over its last two games. Four players have found themselves on the scoresheet for both contests:

- Constantinos Michaelides - 2G ... first time in his career scoring a goal in back-to-back games ... second-ever point streak, and first time since the final three games of the spring 2021 season
- Andre Ochoa - 1G, 1A ... first point streak as a Bruin, second of his career (scored in four straight with SDSU as a freshman in 2019)
- Pietro Grassi - 1G, 1A ... First career point streak ... First career goal
- Pablo Greenlee - 2A ... First career point streak ... First two assists of his career

BRUINS HELPING BRUINS

UCLA enters the week ranked No. 4 in the country in assists (14). Eleven different Bruins have logged a helper this season, including two apiece from Pablo Greenlee, Tommy Silva, and Jose Sosa. The Bruins have recorded two assists on seven of the team's nine goals this year.

FIVE ON FRIDAY

The Bruins' five-goal output on Friday against Liberty was one of the program's most-prolific in recent memory:

- It was the program's most in a single game since Oct. 6, 2019, matching the most single-game goals under fourth-year HC Ryan Jorden
- Riley Ferch's five points matched the most by a Bruin since Milan Iloski potted five goals in that Oct. 6, 2019 games against the Aztecs
- UCLA had eight unique players record a point against the Flames, the most in a single game since Oct. 26, 2017

NO GOALS FOR YOU

In the first week of the season, UCLA recorded back-to-back shutouts against UC Irvine and Virginia Tech...

- For the second time ever under fourth-year head coach Ryan Jorden
- UCLA was one of just 36 teams in the country with no goals against in the season's first week (only 10 of which played multiple games)

NO SHOTS FOR YOU, EITHER

Not only did the Bruins not allow a goal against UCI and VT, they didn't even allow a shot on goal:

- First time allowing zero shots on goal in a game since Oct. 7, 2018 vs. Oregon State
- First time allowing 0 SOG in consecutive games since at least 1999 (the years in which single-game box scores are available)
- UCLA allowed 0 SOG twice in a three-game span in 2011
- UCLA was the only school in the country with 0 SOG against over the season's first week
- Including exhibition games, UCLA has allowed just 11 SOGs total in six games

PLENTY OF CONTINUITY

UCLA returns the vast majority of its offensive production from a season ago, including:

- 31 of 33 goals (94%)
- 36 of 42 assists (86%)
- 98 of 108 points (91%)
- 10 of 11 game-winning goals (91%)
- Seven of 10 outfield starters
- The top six, and nine of the top 10, scorers from a year ago (on points)

ALL-TIME SERIES AGAINST PORTLAND

UCLA owns an 8-3-1 all-time record against Portland, but the Pilots have won the last two matchups between the schools. The Bruins are making their first regular-season trip to Portland since 1980.

LAST TIME OUT AGAINST PORTLAND

The Bruins dropped a 1-0 decision to Portland in the last matchup between the two, on Sept. 10, 2021 at Wallis Annenberg Stadium. A 33rd minute goal from Portland's Kevin Bonilla was the difference, as UCLA had the majority of chances post-opener but couldn't find an equalizer. The Pilots were held without an on-frame attempt after their goal. Pietro Grassi and Tucker Lepley both had solid looks at net in the final five minutes of the game, but Portland keeper George Tasouris denied both. Jose Contell did get a second-chance effort into the net near the end of the game, but it came a couple seconds after the final whistle.

GRASSI NAMED TO HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

UCLA sophomore Pietro Grassi was one of 38 players tabbed to the Hermann Trophy Watch List before the season. The center back was the lone underclassman to make the list, and is one of just two honorees from the Pac-12 Conference. UCLA has had two Hermann Trophy winners all-time in Leo Stolz (2014) and Sasha Victorine (1993). The last Bruin to make the Hermann Watch List was defender Erik Holt in 2018.

BRUINS AGAINST THE WCC

UCLA has historically enjoyed success against the West Coast Conference, sporting an all-time record of 110-43-17 record against current WCC members. The Bruins have played at least eight games against every WCC team except Gonzaga (1-0-0) and Pacific (never played).

KEEPING IT CLOSE

The Bruins have shown a penchant for close games in recent times. Dating back to last season, UCLA has had 17 of the last 22 games (and 13 of the last 16) decided by one goal or fewer. UCLA's three-goal margin of victory over Liberty on Sept. 2, 2022 was its largest since taking down San Diego State 4-1 on Nov. 12, 2021.

HOME COOKING

The Bruins have been tough to beat at home of late, going 14-4 over the last 18 games at Wallis Annenberg Stadium (17-4-1 counting exhibitions). UCLA was 9-3 (.750) at home last fall, the program's first time posting a win percentage north of 60% at home since the 2015 season (also 9-3).

TOUGH ROAD

UCLA has routinely played one of the toughest schedules in the country under head coach Ryan Jorden, finishing each of the last three seasons in the top-20 nationwide in strength-of-schedule. The Bruins ranked No. 14 in the country in SOS last fall (.610), No. 20 in spring 2021 (.588, and they were top-10 at the end of the regular season), and No. 12 in 2019 (.609).

PLAYERS TO WATCH

UCLA had three players named to the United Soccer Coaches Players to Watch lists ahead of the 2022 season:

- Tucker Lepley (M) - Led the team in scoring last year, earning second team all-region and First Team All-Freshman honors
- Pietro Grassi (D) - Was a first team all-region pick as a true freshman after playing a team-high 1,708 minutes in 2021
- Nicolas Blassou (D) - In each of the last two seasons, led American in minutes played and earned All-Patriot League honors
- UCLA was the lone school in the country with multiple defenders selected to the Players to Watch list

BRUINS IN THE TDS TOP 100 PLAYER RANKINGS

UCLA had three players named to TopDrawerSoccer's rankings of the top-100 players to watch in the country: Tommy Silva (No. 48), Tucker Lepley (No. 68), and Nicolas Blassou (No. 96). The Bruins' three listees were the most in the Pac-12 and tied for second most in the country (Pitt: 5).

UCLA PICKED THIRD IN PAC-12 PRESEASON COACHES POLL

UCLA was tabbed to finish third in the league's annual preseason coaches poll. The Bruins garnered a pair of first-place votes, tied for the most of any team in the conference. UCLA totaled 18 points in the poll, just behind co-favorites OSU and Washington.

2021 IN REVIEW

- UCLA went 11-7-1, clinching an at-large NCAA Tournament berth and ultimately reaching the second round of the tourney
- UCLA's 11 wins, +8 goal differential, third-place league finish, Second Round NCAA finish were all bests since 2015
- The Bruins went 6-2-0 to start the year, the program's best eight-game start since 2009
- UCLA led the Pac-12 in assists per game (2.2), fewest fouls per game (9.3), and shot accuracy (48%)
- The Bruins finished the year ranked No. 24 (TopDrawerSoccer) and No. 25 (United Soccer Coaches) in the final polls
- Signature victories included a 3-2 win over then-No. 1 Oregon State on Nov. 7, and a golden goal win over UCSB in the first round of the NCAA Tournament
- UCLA had three separate three-game winning streaks, and posted a 9-3-0 overall record at home
- The Bruins had four-all region picks, their most since 2015, highlighted by first teamer Pietro Grassi

BRUINS IN THE PROS

As of the start of the 2022 college season, UCLA has eight alumni on the rosters of MLS clubs alongside former defender Reggie Cannon, who plays for Boavista F.C. in the Portuguese top flight. UCLA's MLS alums include former No. 1 overall SuperDraft picks Frankie Amaya (NY Red Bulls) and Abu Danladi (Minnesota United FC), league veterans Ryan Hollingshead (LAFC), Kelyn Rowe (Seattle Sounders), Jonathan Bornstein (Chicago Fire), Jackson Yueill (San Jose Earthquakes), and Earl Edwards Jr. (New England Revolution), as well as 2019 draftee Erik Holt (Real Salt Lake).

SUCCESSFUL SIX

In 2022 UCLA returns each of its top-six scorers from a year ago, including:

- Tucker Lepley: Led UCLA and all Pac-12 freshmen in points (17) ... Voted Team MVP ... First Team All-Freshman pick
- Jose Contell: 5G, 6A, 16P ... Led team in shots (30) ... Had a goal or assist in nine of 18 games last year
- Kevin Diaz: 6G, 4A, 16P ... Co-led team in goals ... Voted team Offensive MVP ... All-Pac-12 honorable mention
- Tommy Silva: 6G, 4A, 16P ... Led team in GWG (4) ... All-Pac-12 2nd Team ... Had a pair of 5-point games last year
- Riley Ferch: 2G, 4A, 8P ... Has had 3+ assists, 8+ points each season at UCLA ... Co-led Pac-12 with 9 assists in 2019
- Aaron Edwards: 2G, 3A, 7P ... All-Pac honorable mention ... Nat. Player of the Week after 2-goal game vs. LMU (10/14/21)

Ryan Jorden is in his fourth season as the UCLA men's soccer coach in 2022. He was named the 11th head coach in program history on Apr. 29, 2019 by then-UCLA Director of Athletics Dan Guerrero.

Through 13 seasons as a head coach at the collegiate level, Jorden has compiled an overall record of 122-96-23 (.554 winning percentage) and secured seven postseason berths. He has steered his teams to double-digit wins in seven separate seasons, including four of the last six years. On the player development side, Jorden has coached nine players who were drafted or signed Homegrown deals with MLS clubs, including five during his tenure in Westwood.

UCLA had its strongest season yet under Jorden in 2021, posting an 11-7-1 overall record and reaching the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2015. The Bruins' eight-win improvement from the spring season represented the largest year-to-year turnaround in modern program history, and UCLA's plus-8 goal differential was its best since 2015. Season highlights for the Bruins included a 3-2 victory over then-top-ranked Oregon State on Nov. 7 (the second time a Jorden-led UCLA squad has downed the No. 1 team in the country) and a golden goal victory over UC Santa Barbara in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. The Bruins went 5-4-1 in league play to take third place, the squad's highest finish in the league table since 2015. Four Bruins picked up All-Far West Region honors and a pair of UCLA froshes earned national All-Freshman honors in 2021, led by center back Pietro Grassi who was a First Team All-Region and Freshman Best XI pick. For the season, UCLA led the Pac-12 in assists per game (2.21), fewest fouls per game (9.32), and shot accuracy (48%). The team opened the season by going 6-2-0, the program's best eight-game start to a campaign since 2009.

A trio of Bruins made the jump to the pro ranks after the 2021 season, as center back Ahmed Longmire was selected No. 10 overall in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft by Nashville SC, defender Ben Reveno was the second-round choice of the New England Revolution, and goalkeeper Justin Garcés signed as a Homegrown Player with Atlanta United FC in the lead-up to the draft.

The Bruins posted a 6-9-3 record under Jorden in 2019, his first year at the helm. Fielding an opening day lineup that featured just three returning starters, UCLA saw a tangible improvement over the course of the season. Under Jorden's guidance, junior forward Milan Iloski established himself as one of the top offensive threats in college soccer, leading the country with 1.06 goals per game (17 total) including a program-record five scores against San Diego State on Oct. 6. Jorden also oversaw the seamless integration of newcomers including Riley Ferch (Pac-12-high nine assists), Marcony Pimentel, and Ben Reveno. As a team, the campaign featured a number of highlights, none loftier than a 3-2 win over defending national champion and then-No. 1-ranked Maryland on Sept. 6.

His recruiting success has continued at UCLA, with his two most-recent classes earning a national ranking from TopDrawerSoccer. The Bruins' 2021 group of newcomers was ranked No. 4 in the country, the highest of any Pac-12 program.

Jorden arrived in Westwood with 23 years of collegiate coaching experience under his belt, most recently serving as head coach at the University of the Pacific in Stockton, Calif., where he re-started a dormant program in 2013 and turned the Tigers into perennial national contenders. Pacific reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament in each of his last three seasons, one of just two west coast programs able to make that claim over that span (Stanford).

Prior to that, he helmed the men's soccer program at Cal Baptist, transforming the Lancers into two-time NCCAA National Champions during his five-year tenure.

His 2016 squad at Pacific went 13-4-2, representing what was then the largest single-season win-loss turnaround in Division I men's soccer history at 11.5 games. Jorden secured a number of accolades after that standout season, including NCAA Far West Region and West Coast Conference Coach of the Year honors.

His last two seasons in Stockton were just as successful. In 2017, the Tigers posted an identical 13-4-2 record while reaching as high as No. 14 in the national rankings. In 2018, Pacific went 12-5-2 and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Over his final three seasons, the Tigers went 38-13-6 (.719).

At Pacific, Jorden oversaw the development of a trio of players who went on to be drafted by MLS teams, as Tristan Blackmon was the third overall selection in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft (LAFC), Camden Riley was a second-round pick by Sporting Kansas City in 2019, and Jonathan Jimenez went No. 26 overall to the Chicago Fire in 2020. Overall, his time at Pacific yielded 27 All-WCC selections, five All-Far West Region picks, three All-Americans, and 13 WCC Academic honorees.



Jorden got his head coaching start at Cal Baptist University in 2008, taking the Lancers to an unprecedented level of success during his five years in Riverside. Taking over a program that had qualified for postseason play just once in the prior 18 years, Jorden guided CBU to the postseason in all five of his seasons, including NCCAA National Championships in both 2011 and 2012. Jorden was honored as the NCCAA National Coach of the Year after both of those championship campaigns.

He recorded a 60-30-10 overall record at Cal Baptist, including a 48-15-3 (.750) mark over his final three seasons. He was instrumental in NCAA compliance management as CBU transitioned to Division II during his tenure.

Cal Baptist had 12 players earn All-PacWest honors over his final two seasons, including two-time Goalkeeper of the Year Joey Pacheco. Seven Lancers earned All-America status during that span, headlined by 2012 NCCAA National Player of the Year Carlos Figueroa.

Jorden made assistant coaching stops at Westmont College – his alma mater – Northern Colorado University, and Oregon State earlier in his career.

He served as the lead assistant under head coach Dave Wolf at Westmont from 2000-2007, helping the Warriors to an 82-39-11 record. Westmont was consistently ranked in the NAIA Top-25 during his time in Santa Barbara, including No. 1 in 2000. The Warriors claimed back-to-back conference championships in 2001 and 2002.

Jorden was an assistant on the Northern Colorado University women's soccer staff in 2003 and 2004 as he pursued his doctoral degree. His first coaching stop came at Oregon State, where he served as the lone assistant from 1996-1999. With the Beavers, he managed day-to-day aspects of the program such as recruiting, training, scheduling, and compliance.

A graduate of Westmont College, Jorden played for the Warriors from 1991-1994. Westmont won 65 games and made two NAIA Tournament appearances during his time as a student-athlete.

Jorden completed his Ph.D. in sport and exercise science with an emphasis in biomechanics at Northern Colorado in October 2010. He earned his master's degree from Oregon State in 2000 and his bachelor's degree from Westmont in 1995. Jorden is a USSF "A" Licensed coach, and was head coach of the Olympic Development Program (ODP) Region IV from 2013-19. He and his wife Liz have two sons, Graeme and Evan.

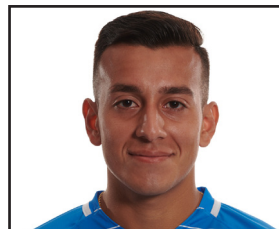

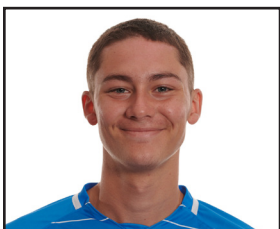
