ROSE BOWL: THE 36th YEAR

The nation's most famous college football stadium - The Rose Bowl - is now in its 36th season as home to UCLA football.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 149-67-2 since moving to Pasadena for the start of the 1982 campaign, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

UCLA is 25-11 in games played in the Rose Bowl since the start of the 2012 season. The last time it went unbeaten at home was in the 2005 season.

All-Time Series: UCLA leads 53-33-1

Bruins have won three of the last four meetings

BRUINS HONOR SENIORS FRIDAY VS. CAL — UCLA (5-6, 3-5) will host the California Golden Bears (5-6, 2-6) in the Rose Bowl on Friday, Nov. 24 at 7:30 p.m. PT. The game will be televised by FS1. The Bruin IMG Radio Network will radio broadcast the contest, which will also be aired over Sirius/XM, uclabruins.com and tunein.com and the TuneIn App.

The Bruins lead the series 53-33-1 and have won three of the last four meetings. Cal won last year's meeting 36-10 in Berkeley to snap a three-game UCLA series win streak (40-24 in 2015 in the Rose Bowl, 36-34 in 2014 at Berkeley and 37-10 at the Rose Bowl in 2013). The winning team has scored at least 30 points in the last 13 meetings. Only one of those last 13 games was decided by less than a 7-point margin (2014). UCLA is 13-4 against Cal in games played in the Rose Bowl and has won seven of the last eight contests played in Pasadena. The Bruins, who are seeking bowl eligibility, have been bowl eligible following 14 of the last 17 seasons.

Looking back on the last three Bruins wins in the series ---

In 2015, UCLA spotted Cal a field goal and then ripped off 23 straight points en route to a 26-10 halftime edge and a 40-24 win on a Thursday night in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins racked up 573 yards of offense (174 r, 399 p). Cal countered with 426 yards of offense. Josh Rosen threw for three scores while completing a then-school record 34 completions. The Bruin defense sacked Jared Goff five times.

In the 2014 win at Cal, Marcus Rios intercepted a Goff pass on the two-yard line with 51 seconds left to seal the victory. Brett Hundley threw for 330 yards and two scores, while adding another tally with a touchdown run, which helped UCLA end a seven-game losing skid at Cal. Three Bruin turnovers in the contest led to three short Golden Bear touchdown drives. Cal took a 34-33 lead with less than seven minutes left only to see UCLA answer with a 55-yard, eight-play drive which produced the winning margin on a 26-yard Ka'imi Fairbairn field goal with 3:04 on the clock.

In the 2013 contest played in the Rose Bowl, UCLA moved out to a 17-0 lead. Cal closed to 24-10 at the half, but the Bruin defense blanked the Golden Bears during the second half in a 37-10 victory. Brett Hundley, who recorded 13 straight completions during one stretch of the game, passed for a career-high 410 yards and three touchdowns.

THE WATCH LIST—

- Senior Kenny Young will be the last Bruin football player to wear No. 42 in the Rose Bowl. In 2014, on the 75th anniversary of Jackie Robinson's arrival at UCLA, Athletics Director Dan Guerrero announced that the school was retiring number 42 across all sports. While he wore several numbers at UCLA, Jackie Robinson made the number 42 as iconic as the man himself.
- UCLA is averaging 6.4 yards per play which would approach a school record mark - the only other seasons (dating to 1945) in which UCLA has averaged more than 6.5 yards per play are 6.81 in 1998 and 6.62 in 1973.
- Josh Rosen (3,515) needs 226 yards to move past Brett Hundley (3,740 in 2012) into first on all-time UCLA single-season passing yards list.
- The record / ranking of teams which have beaten UCLA on road this season: 48-18 overall record (73%)-- #17 Memphis 9-1, #20 Stanford 8-3, Arizona 7-4, #15 UW 9-2, Utah 5-6, #11 USC 10-2.
- UCLA is 5-0 while playing in the Rose Bowl this season ... the last time the Bruins registered a perfect mark at home was in 2005 (6-0). Perfection in the Rose Bowl was also achieved in the 1987 (6-0) and 1985 seasons (5-0, including Rose Bowl game win).
- WR Jordan Lasley owns the P12 lead with five 100-yard receiving games this season... He has 17 catches for 366 yards in last 2 games ... Lasley and Caleb Wilson (208) own the only 200-yard receiving games by P12 players this season.
- Josh Rosen ranks first in the Pac-12 in passing yards per game (351.5) and total offense (345.2). The last Bruin to lead the Conference in passing yards/g and total offense was Tommy Maddox in 1990.
- LB Kenny Young leads the team in tackles (86) and his average per game of 8.6 is 3rd in P12... S Adarius Pickett is second with 73 stops, S Jaleel Wadood is third with 65 overall tackles (10th in P12 7.2 per game); CB Nate Meadors tops the team with 9 pass break-ups which is tied for 5th in the P12; DL Jacob Tuioti-Mariner and DL Chigozie Nnoruka lead with 6.5 TFLs; Tuioti-Mariner tops the team with 5.5 sacks (12th in P12 with 0.50 average per game) and had a career-best 10 stops vs. ASU ... He has 26 tackles in last four games.
- WR Theo Howard leads the team with a reception in each of the last 14 games and had a career-high 11 receptions vs. USC.
- With its 501-yard output vs. USC, UCLA established an all-time school season mark with its 6th such game of 2017... With its 595-yard performance earlier this season at Stanford, UCLA set a school mark with its fourth consecutive 500-yard total offense games in a season.
- Kenny Young (280 tackles) moved into a tie for 19th on the all-time UCLA tackle list after his nine-tackle effort vs. USC ... Jaleel Wadood (272) is also within range of moving into the all-time Bruin Top 20 tackle list.
- CB Nate Meadors' 27-yd interception return for a score vs. ASU was third TD by Bruin defense (T14th in NCAA, T1st in P12) this season.
- LB Kenny Young has 83 tackles in last 8 g (10.4 avg.) with season-highs of 12-tackles each at Stanford, vs. Colorado, vs. Oregon and at Utah.
- Jordan Lasley (11-Stanford, 10-SC), Darren Andrews (12-A&M, 10-Memphis) and Caleb Wilson (15 A&M, 11-Stanford) have each recorded two double-digit reception games in the same season. No Bruin receiver has done it more than twice in a season. J.J. Stokes is the all-time school leader with three for his career.
- Seven players in their first year as defensive starters were in opening lineup vs. USC - DL Rick Wade, DL Boss Tagaloa, DL Chigozie Nnoruka, LB Krys Barnes, LB Keisean Lucier-South, DB Colin Samuel, DB Darnay Holmes ... 9 freshmen defenders saw action vs. ASU and 10 (R=redshirt) at Utah: DL Martin Andrus, CB Holmes, LB Rahyme Johnson, LB Mique Juarez (R), S Quentin Lake, DL Marcus Moore (R), Osa Odighizuwa (R), CB Mo Osling III, DL Jaelan Phillips (not ASU or SC), DL Greg Rogers.
- Josh Rosen leads the P12 with seven 300-yard passing games this season - a UCLA school record total.
- Freshman and Soph. defenders made 28 of UCLA's 65 tackles vs. USC (43%) ... 11 freshmen and 16 sophomores were in action vs. ASU.

- Making their first career starts vs. Texas A&M were DL Boss Tagaloga, DB Octavius Spencer, OL Michael Alves, DL Jealan Phillips, DB Darnay Holmes...DL Nick Terry made his first start vs. Hawai'i...LB Keisean Lucier-South, DB Will Lockett, DL Chigozie Nnoruka, LB Krys Barnes made first starts at Memphis. - WR Christian Pabico's 99-receiving yards effort vs. Oregon was most productive game by Bruin walk-on receiver since Danny Farmer, who started his career as walk-on before getting a scholarship, had 148 vs. ASU in 1999.
- Dating back to 1980, Rosen's 88% completion performance vs. Hawai'i (22-25) rates as the second-best by a Bruin QB behind Rick Neuheisel's 25-27 effort (.925) in a 1983 game vs. Washington.
- 15 different receivers have caught at least 2 passes; 9 have at least 10-yard per catch avg. and 8 have caught a touchdown pass this season.
- Josh Rosen (491 v. A&M, 463 at Memphis, 480 at Stanford, 372 v. Colorado, 381 v. ASU, 421 at USC) set a new school record with his six games of 350-yards passing this season (old mark - 3 by Cade McNown) ... Rosen's 387 yards of total offense output vs. USC was his 11th career game of at least 350 yards of total offense, which is the most in school history.
- Josh Rosen has at least one scoring pass in 26 of his 28 career games (not Arizona 2017, Washington State 2015).
- UCLA is 31-9 since the start of the 2012 season when scoring first in a game.
- UCLA has posted a 13-13 overall record against ranked opponents since the start of the 2012 season.
- The Bruins are 38-3 since the start of the 2012 season when ahead at the half.
- Since the start of the 2012 season, UCLA has won 24 of 29 games (83%) when winning the turnover battle and owns a record of 22-25 (48%) in games when losing or tying the turnover ratio.
- Seven members of last year's UCLA defensive unit are with NFL teams in one capacity or another, including three defensive linemen (DL Takkarist McKinley, DL Eli Ankou, DL Eddie Vanderdoes), three members of the secondary (DB Marcus Rios, DB Randall Goforth, DB Fabian Moreau) and last year's leading tackler (LB Jayon Brown).
- UCLA's total of 25 draftees in the last five NFL Drafts is the most of any Pac-12 school during that stretch and includes a first-round selection of a defensive player selected in four of the past five drafts.
- Three dads of current Bruins are working as assistant coaches in the NFL - TE Austin Roberts (Alfredo- Chargers RB coach), TE Caleb Wilson (Chris - Eagles DL coach), DB Quentin Lake (Carnell - Steelers DB coach).
- Starts leaders among current players - OL Scott Quessenberry - 42, LB Kenny Young - 40, DB Jaleel Wadood - 39, QB Josh Rosen 29, WR Darren Andrews - 23; Quessenberry has the longest starting streak on the team for a position player with 23.
- The Bruins' 633-yards of total offense at Memphis was the most since compiling 674 yards in a 2015 win at Oregon State. It is the seventh time the Bruins have racked up at least 600 yards of offense since 2012.
- The Bruin comeback from 34 points down (10-44 with 4:08 remaining in the 3rd quarter ranks as the second-greatest number of points overcome to win a game between FBS Teams --- Michigan State rallied from a 35-point deficit (3-38 at 9:54 of 3rd quarter) against Northwestern in a 41-38 win during a 2006 game.
- Darren Andrews (12-A&M, 10-Memphis) and Caleb Wilson (15 A&M, 11-Stanford) have recorded two double-digit reception games in the same season. No Bruin receiver has done it more than twice in a season. J.J. Stokes is the all-time school leader with three for his career.
- Record in alternate unis since start of 2012: '12 (Dark Blue) W-Arizona, L-Stanford; '13 (Black) W-Wash., W-Va Tech; '14 (Gray) W-Arizona; '15 (Black) W-Cal, (Black) L-WSU; '16 (Navy Blue) W-Oregon State; '17 (White) W-Colorado.
- UCLA had season-high rushing total of 192 yards vs. ASU. Bolu Olorunfunmi (102) and Jalen Starks (63) posted career-best marks at Arizona.
- Soso Jamabo (100-yard rushing effort at Stanford) became first Bruin back to reach century mark since Paul Perkins v. WSU in 2015 for 121.
- TE Caleb Wilson's 15 catches vs. A&M (208 yds) established a school record ... Wilson was just the third Bruin receiver to go over 200 yards.
- The Bruins started two true freshmen (DL Jaelan Phillips and DB Darnay Holmes) on defense for the first time ever in a season-opener vs. A&M.
- Caleb Wilson's (15) and Andrews' (12) total of 27 catches vs. A&M made them most productive receiving tandem in Bruin single-game history.
- UCLA has won 29 straight overall games and 48 straight regular season games in which it has held the opponent to less than 20 points (last loss 17-16 to BYU in 2007 Las Vegas Bowl / last regular season loss 16-14 at Colorado 2003).
- The Texas A&M game marked second time in school history UCLA has had three 100-yard receivers in the same contest --- Caleb Wilson (208), Darren Andrews (142), Jordan Lasley (100). The other was 2005 vs. Arizona St. (Chris Markey 120, Joe Cowan 109, Mercedes Lewis 108).
- Rosen's 40 completions at Stanford this season matched Mike Fafula's school record total of 40 set in the 2016 Utah game.

No. 42 - THE LAST SEASON ON THE GRIDIRON

In 2014, on the 75th anniversary of Jackie Robinson's arrival at UCLA, Athletics Director Dan Guerrero announced that the school was retiring number 42 across all sports. While he wore several numbers at UCLA, Jackie Robinson made the number 42 as iconic as the man himself. Then freshman linebacker Kenny Young was able to continue wearing the number for the duration of his Bruin career and now enters his senior season in 2017.

In conjunction with UCLA, the City of Pasadena and the Rose Bowl Operating Committee, the Rose Bowl subsequently unveiled Robinson's iconic #42 near the east scoreboard and have made it a permanent fixture in the stadium. UCLA has permanently displayed Robinson's number 42 inside each of its athletic competition venues. In addition, a series of 22 athletic and recreation facilities across campus were named the Jackie Robinson Athletics and Recreation Complex. Chief among the campus' recognition of the complex is an in-ground number 42 at each entry point to UCLA's training centers, competition sites, fields and stadiums as a reminder of Robinson's tremendous courage in the face of adversity.

From 1939 to 1941, Robinson starred in four sports at UCLA. In football, Robinson played both offense and defense, returned punts, caught and threw passes, kicked extra points and in the process, earned honorable mention All-American accolades. In basketball, he twice led the Pacific Coast Conference in scoring. In track, he won the NCAA championship in the broad jump. And in baseball, he began his legendary journey as a highly-regarded shortstop for the Bruins.

Bruins on the Radio

The 2017 season is UCLA's 21st season with Clear Channel Radio. This will be the 11th year for the Bruins to be aired on AM 570 LA Sports (or am 1150 KTLK) in Southern California. The broadcasts are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder. The broadcast included a pre- and post-game show.

Josh Lewin is back as the voice of the Bruins for a second season. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-86) is set to begin his 21st year on the broadcast team and his 17th as the analyst in the booth. Another Bruin signal caller, Wayne Cook ('91-94) is in his 16th season as the sideline reporter.

AM 570 LA Sports also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks. UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Partner of UCLA Athletics. Games can also be heard via the internet at uclabruins.com and on tunein.com and the TuneIn App.

Bruins on Television

Following the USC game, 172 of UCLA's last 173 games have been televised live, including 105 in a row. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was on delayed).

The Pac-12 Networks will air conference games and ancillary programming which feature football coach and player interviews during the season including a special edition of The Drive one week during the season.

INTERIM UCLA HEAD COACH JEDD FISCH



Jedd Fisch, who spent the past two seasons as the University of Michigan's passing game coordinator and quarterbacks/wide receivers coach, brings nearly two decades of coaching experience to Westwood, having worked alongside collegiate and NFL head coaches the likes of Steve Spurrier, Dom Capers, Brian Billick, Mike Shanahan, Pete Carroll, Gus Bradley and Jim Harbaugh, among others.

In his two seasons at Michigan, Fisch helped Wilton Speight earn third-team All-Big Ten quarterback honors in 2016, his first year as a starter, while in 2015, quarterback Jake Rudock became the second quarterback in school history to pass for 3,000 yards (3,017). Also in 2015, Jake Butt, Jehu Chesson and Amara Darboh became the first trio of receivers in school history to eclipse the 50-reception and 500-yard receiving mark in a season, and the offense surpassed 3,000 passing yards for the sixth time in school history (3,090 yards, 5th all-time at Michigan). This past season, Michigan's offense reached the end zone 59 times, the most of any Wolverine team in the modern era, and ranked in the top 30 nationally in nine offensive categories: turnovers lost (6th), fourth down conversions (10th), scoring offense (12th), interceptions (13th), red zone offense (15th), fumbles lost (16th), completion percentage (26th), sacks allowed (28th) and rushing offense (30th).

Prior to his time at Michigan, Fisch served two seasons as offensive coordinator for a young Jacksonville Jaguars team. In his first season with the Jaguars (2013), Fisch guided the offense to improvements in nearly every category from the first eight games to the final eight games, including a rise from 31st to eighth in red zone offense and a doubling of its points per game total. In 2014, Fisch mentored rookie quarterback Blake Bortles, helping him to a 58.9 completion percentage and nearly 3,000 yards of passing in 13 starts. Bortles led all NFL QBs with a 7.48 average per rush, and under Fisch's tutelage, cut down his interceptions to three over the last six games of the season after throwing 14 in his first eight games. Bortles also completed 37 passes of 25-plus yards, second-most among rookie quarterbacks. Additionally, Fisch developed two rookie receivers in 2014 that did something no one else had done in NFL history: Allen Hurns (51-677, six touchdowns) and Allen Robinson (48-548, two touchdowns) became the first rookie duo in NFL history with at least 48 receptions each.

Fisch spent the two prior seasons (2011-12) at the University of Miami as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. In 2012, the Hurricanes scored more than 40 points on six occasions and averaged 31.4 points and 440.2 yards per game. Under Fisch's direction in 2012, quarterback Stephen Morris, as a first-year starter, threw for a career-high 3,345 passing yards and set a single-season total offense record with 3,415 yards. In his first season, Fisch tutored quarterback Jacory Harris, who solidified himself as one of the best signal-callers in Miami and ACC history. Harris finished with a single-season school record 65.0% completion percentage while throwing for 20 touchdowns and only nine interceptions. Miami's offense averaged 26.5 points per game and amassed 4,533 yards of total offense in 2011.

Prior to joining Miami, Fisch served as quarterbacks coach for the Seattle Seahawks in 2010 and worked with three-time Pro Bowler Matt Hasselbeck. Fisch joined the Seahawks after serving the 2009 season as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at the University of Minnesota, where he helped the team earn a spot in the Insight Bowl.

In 2008, Fisch was the wide receivers coach for the Denver Broncos, under Mike Shanahan, where he tutored Pro Bowl wideout Brandon Marshall to a then career-high 104 receptions for 1,265 yards and six touchdowns. Prior to joining the Broncos, Fisch spent four seasons in Baltimore (2004-07). He was the Ravens' assistant quarterbacks coach in 2007 after serving as the assistant quarterbacks/wide receivers coach from 2005-06 and offensive assistant in 2004. In 2006, the Ravens posted a 13-3 record and won the AFC North. Steve McNair received Pro Bowl honors after setting a franchise record for completion percentage (64.0).

Fisch began his NFL coaching career with the Houston Texans, where he served three seasons (2001-03) as an assistant to head coach Dom Capers. Fisch served two seasons (1999-2000) as a graduate assistant under Steve Spurrier at the University of Florida while obtaining a master's degree in sports management. During those two seasons, the Gators advanced to the Citrus (1999) and Sugar (2000) bowls, in addition to winning the SEC championship in 2000.

A native of Livingston, N.J., Fisch earned a degree in criminology from Florida in 1998. He and wife, Amber, have three children - Zaylee, Ashlee, Kendall.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER NOTES

#22 Junior DB NATE MEADORS (*Sociology major*) has started each game this season at cornerback. He leads Bruin defenders with 9 pass breakups. Meadors returned his first interception for a touchdown against Arizona State. He leads the team in pass break ups and ranks fifth on the squad in tackles with 40. He made eight starts at corner last season and registered a career-best 10 tackles vs. USC. Made starts at Utah and at USC in 2015.



#6 Redshirt Junior DB ADARIUS PICKETT (*Political Science major*) ranks among the Pac-12 leaders in tackles. He posted a career-best 11 tackles in the 2017 season-opener vs. Texas A&M. He had a career-best 41-yard punt return at Arizona. Pickett saw action in 12 games in 2016, with five starts. He registered a season-high nine tackles vs. Cal and had three interceptions on the season. He was a member of a Bruin secondary which gave up a P12 low 12 touchdown passes during the season and ranked seventh in the nation in passing efficiency defense (105.85). In 2015, he saw action in all 13 games as a reserve in the secondary. He made his first career interception vs. Virginia.



#91 Senior DL JACOB TUIOTI-MARINER (*Political Science major*) ranks among the Pac-12 leaders in sacks this season. He leads the team in sacks in 2017 with 5.5. He started nine games in 2016 and ranked sixth on the team in tackles with 46. He was fourth on the squad with 5.0 tackles for loss and third with 3.0 sacks. Tuioti-Mariner had a season-high seven tackles vs. USC. He saw action in all 13 games in 2015 and made one start (at Arizona). Tuioti-Mariner was credited with at least three tackles in seven games. In 2014, he appeared in 10 games in a reserve role.



#4 Senior DB JALEEL WADOOD (*African American Studies major*) has been at or near the top of the Bruin tackle list all season and among the national leaders in solo tackles. He recorded a season-high 11 stops at Stanford. He was an honorable mention All-P12 selection in 2016 after starting 11 games and ranking third on the team with 76 tackles. His per game average of 7.0 tackles ranked ninth in the conference. Wadood was part of a Bruin secondary which gave up a Pac-12 low 12 scoring passes during the season and ranked seventh in the nation in passing efficiency defense (105.85). In 2015, he made 12 starts and earned second-team All-P12 honors after ranking third on the team in tackles (72). He was named Defensive MVP of the Foster Farms Bowls after amassing 10 tackles, a fumble recovery and a tackle for loss. In 2014, Wadood made eight starts and was named honorable mention all-conference. His total of 59 tackles was the fourth-highest ever by a Bruin true freshman player.



#42 Senior LB KENNY YOUNG (*Sociology major*) jumped into the school's all-time top 20 tackles list during the USC game. He is listed among the top ten in tackles in the Pac-12 and recorded a season-high 12 stops each in games at Utah, vs. Oregon, vs. Colorado and at Stanford. Young was named a 2016 second-team All-Pac-12 Conference selection by the coaches. He was the starter in all 12 games and finished second on the team with 90 tackles. Young ranked fifth in the Pac-12 in total tackles per game (7.5) and was second on the squad with 8.5 tackles for loss. He ranked tied for 11th in the Pac-12 in sacks per game (0.42) and ranked 8th in the country with his three fumble recoveries. The Louisiana native was credited with at least six stops in all 12 games and recorded a season-best 12 tackles vs. Arizona. In 2015, he appeared in 13 games and made 12 starts while ranking fifth on the team in tackles. Young returned his first career interception 23 yards for a touchdown against UNLV. He will be the last UCLA football player to wear the No. 42 jersey as the number has been retired in all sports in a tribute to the great Bruin

OFFENSIVE PLAYER NOTES

#3 Junior QB JOSH ROSEN (*Economics major*) has been among the nation's leaders in passing yards, total offense and passing TDs all season. Rosen's 495 total yards of offense at Memphis and at Stanford rank as tied for the third-most in school annals. Rosen's 491-yard passing effort vs. Texas A&M was the third-most in school history behind only Cade McNown (513 vs. Miami in 1998) and Drew Olson (510 vs. Arizona State in 2005). He threw for 292 yards in the fourth quarter alone.

Last season, he started in the first six games of the 2016 campaign before being injured and sitting out the balance of the year. In that sixth game at Arizona State, he threw for a then career-best 400 yards (T6th-best in school history). In 2015, he became the first Bruin true freshman to open the season as the starting quarterback and went on to set numerous school records, including most consecutive passes without an interception (245), most passing yards by a true freshman in a game (399 v. Cal), most passing yards in a true freshman season, most 300-yard passing games in a season (tied-6), most touchdown passes thrown by a true freshman (23), most passing attempts in a season (487). He three for at least 300 yards in games versus Nebraska (319), Washington State (340), Oregon State (333), Cal (399), Stanford (325) and Virginia (350). Rosen tossed three scoring passes in games versus Nebraska, Cal, Stanford and Virginia. His 410 yards of total offense against Washington State ranked tied for ninth on the all-time school list. He was named the Pac-12 Conference Offensive Freshman of the Year by the league's coaches.

#7 Redshirt Senior WR DARREN ANDREWS (*Political Science major*) currently ranks among the nation's leaders in scoring receptions and receptions per game and was added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List. He made his 10th scoring grab of the season at Utah. At Memphis, Darren Andrews (12 vs. Texas A&M, 10 at Memphis) became the first Bruin receiver since Craig Bragg (10 vs. Oklahoma, 10 vs. Oregon in 2003) to record double-digit receptions in two games in the same season.

Andrews was just the third Bruin receiver to do so (also J.J. Stokes 10 vs. Washington, 14 vs. Wisconsin in the 1993 season). No Bruin receiver has done it more than twice in a season. Stokes is the all-time school leader with three for his career.

Earlier this season, he hauled in a career-best 12 passes vs. Texas A&M in the 2017 opener. He made 98 catches in the previous two seasons heading into 2017, more than any other returning Pac-12 player has made (CU's Shay Fields also had 98). In 2016, he made seven starts, ranked 10th in the Pac-12 in receptions per game (4.6), and his 55 catches (t14th on all-time school list) led the team. Andrews posted two 100-yard games (Arizona-108, Wash. St.-116) and had a 19-game streak of receptions snapped in the season finale at Cal. In 2015, he made seven starts and ranked third on the team in receptions (43). He hooked up with Josh Rosen on a 70-yard scoring pass play on his way to a 100-yard receiving game at Stanford. In 2013, he appeared in eight games on special teams and as a reserve receiver. He redshirted during the 2014 season.

1st to 100 Championships

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 113 NCAA titles to their credit.

THE ROSE BOWL - HOME OF BRUIN FOOTBALL

The nation's most famous college football stadium – The Rose Bowl – is now in its 36th season as the home of the UCLA Bruins football team. The stadium is recognized as both a United States National Historic Landmark and a California Historic Civil Engineering landmark. Thanks to a generous donation from prominent UCLA alum Tod Spieker and his family, the playing surface will be called Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl for at least the next 25 years.

The Rose Bowl was built specifically for football, but has been utilized as a venue for portions of the 1932 Olympic Games' cycling events and was the soccer site for the 1984 Olympics. The Rose Bowl has also played host to five NFL Super Bowls – XI in 1977, XIV in 1980, XVII in 1983, XXI in 1987 and XXVII in 1993. It was a venue for the 1994 World Cup and the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournaments, including the championship games. The USA women's soccer team victory over China in the 1999 event drew over 90,000 fans. In addition, the 1983 Army-Navy game was played in the Rose Bowl.

On Jan. 1, 2015, the Rose Bowl served as the site of one of the College Football Playoff semifinal games. The previous January, the Rose Bowl hosted the final BCS Championship contest. It had also played host to the BCS Championship game in 2002, 2006 and 2010.

Considered an ideal concert venue, the Rose Bowl has hosted shows by such groups and artists as Beyonce, Jay-Z, Kenny Chesney, Jason Aldean, One Direction, U2, 'N Sync, Eagles, Rolling Stones, Pink Floyd, Michael Jackson, Metallica, Guns and Roses, Depeche Mode and Journey.

The iconic stadium is in the process of completing the final touches on a \$181 million dollar renovation, and now features a new video board, improved exiting, wider aisles in the end zones and the Terry Donahue Pavilion. The Pavilion area houses the press boxes, broadcast booths, premium seating, boxes and suites. In December of 2015, the radio and TV booths were renamed "The Keith Jackson Broadcast Center". Jackson, the former sportscaster, coined the phrase "The Granddaddy of Them All" for the Rose Bowl Game. Also added are field level entrances and exits, and additional concession stands and restroom facilities.



Since 2007, UCLA and its opponents have dressed in new locker rooms located underneath the south concourse of the stadium. The locker area features all of the latest amenities to benefit the players, coaches, sports medicine and equipment staffs. In addition, a new media interview room and working press area were included in the upgrades. In 1998, new individual chairs were installed in the seating areas between the end zones. Also, improved seating areas for the physically challenged were installed, as well as a new sound system.

Completed in 1922 at a cost of \$272,198, the Rose Bowl was first used for the USC-California football game that year which was won by the Golden Bears 12-0. The stadium was originally horseshoe shaped and seated 57,000 persons when it hosted the 1923 Rose Bowl Game. The south end zone was enclosed prior to the 1929 game to increase seating capacity to 76,000. Further enlargements took place in 1932 (83,677) and 1949 (100,807). A record crowd of 106,869 fans witnessed the 1973 Ohio State – USC Rose Bowl contest. With the current seating configuration for UCLA home games, the capacity is 80,616.

The Rose Bowl has many firsts in its vast history. On Jan. 1, 1927, radio stations across the nation were linked together for the first time in a coast-to-coast broadcast. On Jan. 1, 1954, The UCLA-Michigan State Rose Bowl Game was the first west-to-east color telecast on a nationwide connection.

The Rose Bowl has 77 rows of seats. It measures 880 feet from the north to south rims and 695 feet from east to west. Its circumference around the rim is 2,430 feet, compared to 1,350 feet at field level. It took 28 miles of lumber to provide the original seats. The square footage of the grass on the floor of the stadium is 79,156.

BRUIN FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS

Three true freshmen saw action in the 2017 opener against Texas A&M in the Rose Bowl --- DL Jaelan Phillips, DB Darnay Holmes, DB Mo Osling III. DL Martin Andrus saw action vs. Hawai'i and DB Quentin Lake saw his first action against Colorado and Moses Robins-Carr took the field for the first time at Arizona. Greg Rogers came in against Oregon and Rahyme Johnson at Washington.

A total of 11 Bruin true freshmen saw action last season - LB Kryes Barnes, DB Brandon Burton, LS Johnny Den Bleyker, WR Ethan Fernea, WR Theo Howard, P Austin Kent, K JJ Molson, RB Jalen Starks, RB Brandon Stephens, DL Boss Tagaloa, LB Lokeni Toailoa.

Eight true freshmen played in the 2016 opener at Texas A&M - Tagaloa, Molson, Den Bleyker, Kent, B. Burton, Lok. Toailoa, Fernea, Stephens. Starks, Barnes and Howard saw their first action against UNLV.

The Bruins played a total of 10 true freshmen in 2015. Five saw action in the 2015 season-opener against Virginia. Nine true frosh took the field in the 2014 season, seven in that season's opener at UVA .

The Bruins established a new school mark in 2013 when guard Scott Quessenberry took the field at Oregon as the 18th true freshman to see action that season. Fifteen true frosh saw action that season in the opener against Nevada. UCLA played 12 true freshmen in 2012, eight in the opener at Rice. One first-year player saw action in 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, UCLA played 10 true freshmen.

UCLA started a true freshman quarterback (Josh Rosen) in the season opener of 2015 for the first time in school history. Jaelan Phillips and Darnay Holmes became the first true freshmen defenders to start an opener was safety Rahim Moore in 2008 vs. Tennessee.

NON-SATURDAY GAMES

The Bruins have games scheduled for Sunday (win over Texas A&M) and Friday (loss at Utah, Cal) this season. The Bruins last played on a Sunday in a 1980 game versus Oregon State won by UCLA 34-3. The game vs. A&M was the first college game played on a Sunday in the Rose Bowl.

Last season, UCLA played a Thursday night affair on Nov. 3 at the University of Colorado (loss). In the 2015 season, in back-to-back weeks, the Bruins took the field on Thursday night at Stanford (loss) and in the Rose Bowl versus California (win). In 2014, on Thursday night at Arizona State, the Bruins bested the Sun Devils and on Friday of Thanksgiving week, at home, in the Rose Bowl against Stanford, the Cardinal dropped the Bruins.

In 2013, the Bruins won at Utah on a Thursday night and at home versus Washington on a Friday night. The last time UCLA had previously played a Friday game during the regular season was in 2011 at Arizona State. The most recent previous home game to have been played on Friday had been against Arizona on Oct. 27, 1978.

In 2012, UCLA opened the season with a win at Rice on a Thursday evening. In 2011, it played at Arizona on a Thursday evening. In the 2010 season, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games - Oct. 21 at Oregon (Thur.), Nov. 18 at Washington (Thur.) and Nov. 26 at Arizona State (Fri.).

Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State. The Bruins also played at San Diego State on Thurs., Sept. 26, 1991 (won, 37-12).

GAME ONE: UCLA 45, Texas A&M 44



Sept. 3 - Rose Bowl

PASADENA, California (AP) -- Josh Rosen faked to spike the ball to stop the clock and instead threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Jordan Lasley with 43 seconds remaining and UCLA overcame a 34-point deficit to stun Texas A&M 45-44 on the first Sunday college football game ever played at the Rose Bowl.

Rosen was 35 of 59 for 491 yards on the night and four fourth-quarter touchdowns. He threw for 292 yards and the four scoring passes all in the final 15 minutes to overcome a 27-point margin. "My career at UCLA, we've had a lot of times where the chips didn't fall in our favor, and I think it's time that finally it did," Rosen said.

UCLA scored touchdowns on five straight possessions after trailing 44-10 with 4:08 to play in the third quarter. Rosen threw scoring passes of 9 and 42 yards to Darren Andrews before finding Theo Howard for a 16-yard score on a broken play with 3:08 remaining.

UCLA got the ball back with 2:39 to go and drove 66 yards in 10 plays, including an 11-yard throw and catch to tight end Caleb Wilson. Rosen capped the remarkable comeback with a fade to the far corner of the end zone after faking the spike. JJ Molson kicked the winning extra point.

"We were an inch away from losing that game probably 10 times," said Rosen, who threw for the third-most yards in a game in school history. "I mean, for God's sakes, I mean, that field goal would have put us out, and we just had an incredible surge and effort just to put probably a centimeter of a finger on the ball. I mean, the things that had to go right to win this game were incredible."

Texas A&M quarterback Kellen Mond was stopped short of the first-down marker on a scramble with 20 seconds left to close out the biggest FBS comeback since 2006.

"It was a lot of fun, huh? Glad you stuck around?" UCLA coach Jim Mora said. "We knew that this was not going to be an easy game, but we didn't know we were going to be down 28 points at halftime. I was just so impressed by the way that they managed their emotions at halftime and then coming back in the second half."

Wilson had a school-record 15 receptions for 203 yards, and Andrews had 12 catches for 143 yards. Rosen's 491 yard passing effort was the third-highest in school history and tied him with Cade McNown for the most 300-yard passing games in school history with 11.

Sept. 9 - Rose Bowl

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — Josh Rosen was 22-for-25 for 329 yards passing and found Darren Andrews for three of his career-high five touchdown passes as UCLA defeated Hawaii 56-23 on Saturday.

With the 329-yard performance, Rosen moved past Cade McNown and into sole possession of the UCLA

record for most 300-yard passing games in a career with 12. The five scoring passes were the most by a Bruin quarterback since Ben Olson tossed five in a 2007 win over Stanford.

Andrews became the first UCLA receiver to haul in three scoring passes in a game since Mercedes Lewis caught three in a 2004 game versus Arizona. Theo Howard, who finished with a career-best seven catches, had his first 100-yard game (110).

Howard and Caleb Wilson each caught a touchdown pass. Demetric Felton and Bolu Olorunfunmi each had 1-yard touchdown runs for the Bruins, who have scored touchdowns on 12 of 14 possessions with Rosen at quarterback dating back to the third quarter of their 45-44 comeback win over Texas A&M on Sunday.

UH's Dru Brown threw for 227 yards, with a 4-yard touchdown pass to Diocemy Saint Juste and a 2-yard score to John Ursua, as Hawaii saw its winning streak end at five games. Brown also threw an interception that was returned 30 yards for a touchdown by UCLA freshman

cornerback Darnay Holmes.

GAME THREE: UCLA 45, at Memphis 48

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — UCLA came in after earning its first national ranking of the year, but the Memphis Tigers came away with the win. The Bruins' fourth-quarter comeback was denied by the Tigers and Memphis beat the No. 25 Bruins 48-45 on Saturday.

Memphis quarterback Riley Ferguson threw for 398 yards and six touchdowns, and Jacobi Francis broke up

a late fourth-down pass attempt by Josh Rosen to lead Memphis. Francis' breakup with 56 seconds left sent the Tigers faithful into a celebration.

Rosen finished 34 of 56 for 463 yards and four touchdowns for the Bruins. But there also were two key interceptions, one of which was returned for a touchdown and the other stopped a late Bruin drive.

UCLA gave up big plays and turnovers, key ones that thwarted drives and led to Memphis scores, including a 60-yard interception return by linebacker Tim Hart in the third quarter.

"There's a formula for winning," UCLA coach Jim Mora said. "You can't turn the ball over, and you can't give up explosive plays and we did both."

"I just made some stupid mistakes," Rosen said. "I made about 10 points worth of really bad plays. ... I just can't make really, really, silly mistakes like that. It's just trying to play hero ball. It's not needed. You've got to play within the system."

Both teams managed to answer the opponents' scores through the game. Memphis held a couple of 10-point leads, but UCLA went ahead 45-41 on Rosen's 22-yard pass to Austin Roberts with 11:51 left. Memphis responded with a four-play, 81-yard drive, the final 3 yards coming on Ferguson's pass to Phil Mayhue with 9:56 left. From there, it was up to the Tigers' defense, which despite giving up 633 yards, did not allow another touchdown.

The Bruins did have a successful rushing attack against the Tigers, including Bolu Olorunfunmi gaining 77 yards on 13 carries. The Bruins finished with 170 yards rushing after gaining 195 on the ground in their first two games.

Darren Andrews caught an NCAA-leading sixth touchdown pass of the season, a 65-yard catch-and-run. It was one of 10 catches on the day for Andrews who became the third Bruin to record two 10-catch games in a season.

GAME FOUR: UCLA 34, Stanford 58



Sept. 23 - Stanford, Calif.

STANFORD, Calif. – In a game that saw each team surpass 500 yards of total offense, UCLA dropped its Pac-12 opener on the road to Stanford, 58-34. Bruin quarterback Josh Rosen passed for 480 yards, including a career-high 158 to Jordan Lasley and 145 to Caleb Wilson, while Soso Jamabo added a career-best 100 rushing yards. Bryce Love and the Cardinal rushing attack

proved too strong, however, as the Pac-12's leading runner ran for 263 yards and a score. Beginning the initial drive of the game on its own 48-yard line after a big kickoff return, the Cardinal opened the scoring with a field goal. A muffed punt by the Cardinal's Quenton Meeks was pounced on by the Bruins' Johnny Den Bleyker at the Stanford 15 and J.J. Molson would eventually knot the game at 3-3 with a 27-yard answer. The teams would trade field goals before the Bruins finally broke through on their first full drive of the second frame. Rosen completed three consecutive passes, capped by a 48-yard strike to Lasley to reach the 12-yard line. Following his first incompletion of the stretch,

Rosen hit Darren Andrews for the game's first touchdown and the receiver's seventh of the season. A Harrison Phillips block of a Molson 23-yard attempt shifted momentum in favor of the home Cardinal. Love runs of 27 and 32 yards keyed Stanford's push to their first touchdown of the contest. The next Bruin drive would go three and out, as K.J. Costello, the Cardinal's third quarterback of the game, took over and re-established the Stanford advantage with a nine-yard scoring run to provide a 20-13 lead. A Cardinal field goal just before the clock hit zeroes sent the game to the half with the Stanford leading 23-13.

The Bruins came out firing in the second half, as Rosen completed five consecutive passes to get the Bruins to the Stanford 12. Three Jamabo runs from there led to a UCLA touchdown to cut its deficit to 23-20. With Stanford pinned on its own eight-yard line, the Bruins looked poised for another shift in momentum. A 22-yard Costello pass to JJ Arcega-Whiteside set up a 43-yard Connor Wedington run to nix those plans, and Costello completed 15-yard pass to Trenton Irwin for the score. Down 30-20 near midfield, Christian Pabico had the ball stripped and recovered by the Cardinal defense, setting up a 4:49 scoring drive that culminated in a short scoring run to push the lead to 17. The Bruins would not go away, though, as two long passes to Lasley—including a 39-yarder for a score—put UCLA down by a 37-27 score with the fourth quarter nearing. A 6:18 drive ate into the clock and the Bruins' hopes for a comeback, as Costello eventually found Dalton Schultz for a three-yard touchdown pass and a 44-27 lead. UCLA once again answered thanks to a Rosen strike to Eldridge Massington at 6:59 of the final quarter, but a two-play, 70-yard Stanford drive—including a 69-yard Love scamper—buried the Bruins. "It's an incredibly disappointing feeling for all of us," UCLA coach Jim More said. "A lot of things were going right and then all of a sudden it goes wrong. I still believe great things will happen for us and they will."

GAME FIVE: UCLA 27, Colorado 23



Sept. 30 - Rose Bowl

PASADENA, Calif. – Josh Rosen completed 28 of 45 passes for 372 yards to lead UCLA past Colorado, 27-23, in a white-out game at the Rose Bowl Stadium on Saturday evening. UCLA claimed a 14-10 lead midway through the second quarter, pushed its advantage to 21-10 just after halftime and came away with the victory.

Rosen threw for one touchdown, connecting with eight different receivers. Darren Andrews caught eight passes for 96 yards, while Jordan Lasley had seven receptions for 146 yards, his third 100-yard game of the season. On the defensive end, Kenry Young led all players with 12 tackles. Rosen, who has thrown for at least 300 yards in all five games this season, helped UCLA ice the contest in the game's final seven minutes. He directed the Bruins' offense during a 15-play drive that took over six minutes and concluded with JJ Molson kicking a 31-yard field goal at the 26-second mark in the final quarter. Trailing 27-23 in the game's final seconds, Colorado moved the ball down to UCLA's 37-yard line in two plays, but quarterback Steven Montez's last-second heave sailed out of the end zone as time expired.

UCLA's 15-play drive in the final six minutes of the fourth quarter came after the Buffaloes had trimmed the Bruins' margin to 24-23 on a 33-yard field goal at the 6:46 mark. The Bruins trailed twice in the first half, but secured the lead for good – 14-10, midway through the second quarter – after an eight-play, 75-yard drive. Jalen Starks capped off the the drive with a one-yard touchdown run.

After forcing Colorado to punt the ball on a three-and-out at the start of the third quarter, UCLA used a five-play, 58-yard drive to establish a 21-10 advantage. Rosen's 21-yard strike to Caleb Wilson put the Bruins on the Colorado three-yard line before Soso Jamabo punched it in from two yards out for his third touchdown of the season. The Buffaloes answered with a 10-play, 75-yard drive, capped by a two-yard rushing touchdown by Philli Lindsay, which cut UCLA's advantage to 21-17. With fewer than two minutes to play in the third quarter, Colorado kicked another 33-yard field goal to slice the Bruins' cushion to 21-20.

GAME SIX: UCLA 30, Arizona 47

Tucson, Ariz. - Arizona quarterback Khalil Tate rushed for 234 yards and two touchdowns and threw for another touchdown to lead the Wildcats to a 47-30 win over UCLA.

Bruin running backs accounted for all four touchdowns, including two by Bolu Olorunfunmi, who rushed for a career-high 102 yards on 10 carries. Jalen Starks (career-high 63 yards) and Soso Jamabo (33) had the other two touchdowns.

Untimely turnovers hurt the Bruins, who dropped to 3-3, 1-2 in the Pac-12. Quarterback Josh Rosen threw three interceptions, two in the red zone and a pick six.

Arizona jumped out to a quick lead, taking just four plays to score after the opening kickoff. Tate ran it in from 45 yards out at 13:44 to put Arizona up 7-0. UCLA got on the board with 2:23 to play in the first quarter, as Starks ran it in from less than a yard out for his fourth touchdown of the year, trimming Arizona's lead to 10-7.

The Wildcats (4-2, 2-1) used a 53-yard pass from Tate to Shun Brown to quickly move down the field on their next possession, and Nick Wilson's one-yard touchdown rush increased Arizona's lead to 17-7 with 39 seconds remaining in the first.

The Bruins were driving towards a score on their next possession, but an interception by Jace Whittaker in the red zone killed the drive. Whittaker struck again later in the quarter, to even more damaging results, intercepting Rosen again and returning it 42 yards for a 24-7 Arizona lead.

UCLA's running backs got the Bruins back to within 10 at 24-14, thanks to big gains by Starks, a second-effort two-yard gain on fourth-and-one by Olorunfunmi, and a Jamabo nine-yard touchdown run. However, Arizona drove 75 yards on its next possession, ending with a six-yard touchdown pass from Tate to Wilson with 11 seconds remaining for a 30-14 halftime advantage.

Late in the third quarter, Olorunfunmi used two big gains of 24 and 47 yards to set up a four-yard touchdown run to cut Arizona's lead to 33-22. But Tate used his speed once again to break another run on the next play, taking what was nearly a loss of yardage and turning it into a 71-yard touchdown run and 40-22 Wildcat lead.

Arizona penalties helped the Bruins get down the field quickly on its next drive, culminating in Olorunfunmi's second touchdown of the game, a one-yarder with 1:04 left in the third quarter. The Bruins were successful on the two-point conversion once again, trimming the lead to 40-30.

Another big play, a 44-yard touchdown pass from Tate to Tony Ellison, got Arizona down to the six, and Wilson rushed it in to give the Wildcats the final score, 47-30.

UCLA will next face Oregon on Saturday, Oct. 21 at 1pm at the Rose Bowl for Homecoming.

GAME SEVEN: UCLA 31, Oregon 14



Oct. 21 - Rose Bowl

PASADENA, Calif. — Josh Rosen completed 21 of 35 passes for 266 yards and two touchdowns as the UCLA football team earned a 31-14 win over Oregon on Saturday at Rose Bowl Stadium. The Homecoming win marked the 600th victory in program history.

UCLA outscored the Ducks 17-0 in the second half after being tied with Oregon

at halftime, 14-14. Christian Pabico caught four passes for 99 yards with a touchdown, while Theo Howard had five receptions for 60 yards and Darren Andrew had five catches and a touchdown. Bolu Olorunfunmi and Soso Jamabo combined for 142 yards on the ground on 30 carries with one touchdown each. The UCLA defense came up with two turnovers during the game as Jaleel Wadood forced a fumble and Colin Samuel picked off a pass.

After JJ Molson kicked a 42-yard field goal on the opening drive of the second half, UCLA pushed its lead to 24-14 with 3:14 left in the third quarter. Olorunfunmi scored on a 22-yard rush, leaping over an Oregon defender to cross the goal line for his fourth scoring rush of the season.

The Bruins pushed its lead to 31-14 at the 9:03 mark in the fourth quarter as Rosen found Andrews for a one-yard touchdown, his eighth scoring reception of the season, in the back of the end zone to complete a 10-play, 40-yard drive.

UCLA scored twice in the first quarter to jump out to a 14-0 lead. Jacob Tuioti-Mariner recovered a Ducks fumble on their own 45-yard line and used an 11-play drive capped off by a Jamabo four-yard run for the game's opening touchdown.

UCLA found the end zone on its next drive as Rosen connected with Pabico for a 33-yard touchdown pass to highlight a seven-play 65-yard drive that took just under three minutes. It marked Pabico's first career touchdown reception.

Oregon was able to tie the game at 14-14 with a pair of second-quarter touchdowns. UO used a 15-play, 75-yard drive to cut the score to 14-7 with 10:34 remaining in the quarter as Braxton Burmeister ran into the end zone from seven yards out.

The Ducks then tied the game with just 37 seconds left until halftime when Burmeister recorded his second rushing touchdown of the afternoon from the four-yard line to cap off another 15-play drive that took over five minutes off the clock.

GAME EIGHT: UCLA 23, Washington 44



Oct. 28 - Seattle, Wash.

SEATTLE, Wash. — No. 12 Washington rushed 58 times for 333 yards as the Huskies defeated UCLA at Husky Stadium, 44-23.

The Bruins (4-4, 2-3) were led by receiver Darren Andrews, who caught eight passes for 73 yards and one of two receiving touchdowns. Jordan Wilson caught the other. Redshirt freshman Devon Modster

recorded the first passing touchdown of his career, finding Andrews from four yards out.

After holding the Huskies on their first drive, UCLA started its opening possession on the Bruin 29-yard line. Thanks in large part to a Husky roughing-the-passer penalty and 16-yard strike from Josh Rosen to Andrews, the Bruins were able to drive 46 yards to set up a 42-yard JJ Molson field goal that gave the Bruins the first points of the contest.

Washington's first scoring drive went much the way of the Bruins', as a 15-yard personal-foul penalty and an 18-yard Coleman run counted for more than half of the Huskies' yardage leading to Tristan Vizcaino's 31-yard tying field goal.

A 35-yard Jake Browning strike to Coleman accompanied six Gaskin rushes on the Huskies' next scoring drive, with Browning capping the nine-play drive with a one-yard run of his own to give Washington its first lead at 10-3.

The Bruins took a page out of the Huskies' book the next time out, as Soso Jamabo and Bolu Olorunfunmi each rushed three times to help the Bruins down to the Husky eight-yard line, from there Rosen found Wilson for the tight end's second touchdown of the season. Olorunfunmi ran for 24 yards on three carries. The Molson extra point was missed, however, as Washington maintained the lead.

An 82-yard Salvon Ahmed kick return put Washington in prime scoring position and Coleman ran in from a yard out two plays later. They would conclude first-half scoring with a 26-yard Vizcaino field goal at 3:50 of the frame to send the game to the break with the Huskies leading, 20-9.

The Bruins were unable to capitalize on a Darnay Holmes interception of Browning on the Huskies' first drive of the second half and Washington returned to the run its next time out. The home Huskies tallied 27-unanswered points and surged into a 37-9 advantage.

With Modster under center, the Bruins chipped away at the Husky lead with an 81-yard drive. The redshirt-freshman signal caller completed six of seven passes, including throws of 21, 19 and 14 yards to Andrews, Wilson and Christian Pabico, respectively. The Huskies would answer, though, as Gaskins controlled the middle of the field before Coleman once again scored in the redzone.

The Bruin defense would put an end to scoring when Osa Odighizuwa rumbled 51 yards after picking up a Kamari Pleasant fumble to give the Bruins a 14-7 fourth-quarter advantage.

The eight catches by Andrews moved the senior into a tie for fourth place on the Bruins' all-time catch list. He is knotted with Danny Farmer at 159. Next on the list is Kevin Jordan, in third place with 179. Andrews joined Jordan as the only Bruin receivers to put together three straight 40-catch seasons.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah - Devon Modster went 8-12 in his first career collegiate start and completed all seven of his first-half attempts for 101 yards and a score, while Zack Moss accumulated 153 yards on 23 carries and two touchdowns for the Utes and Tyler Huntley went 15-22 for 243 yards and four touchdowns as the UCLA football team dropped a 48-17 contest on Friday at Utah from Rice-Eccles Stadium.

Bolu Olorunfunmi led the ground game with 63 yards on a career-high 16 carries, while Darren Andrews had led all UCLA receivers with 66 yards on three receptions and a score.

The Utes scored the first points of the game as they were able to pounce on a Moss Johnson fumbled punt at the UCLA 16-yard line. Four plays and 1:36 later, Moss pounded it in from three yards out for a 7-0 lead.

The Bruins responded as Modster hit Andrews streaking down the sideline for 42 yards down to the Utah 25-yard line, setting up a 37-yard field goal by J.J. Molson to cut into the early in the second quarter.

Utah would then use 10 plays to maneuver 73 yards, with Moss rushing for 31 yards, leading to Huntley finding Darren Carrington for a 25-yard score at 6:08 in the quarter for a 14-3 lead.

UCLA cut the lead to 14-10 as Modster completed all three of his passes on the 10-play 73-yard drive, including a spectacular one-handed grab by Theo Howard along the sideline. On the next play, Modster would hit Andrews from 24 yards for a touchdown.

The Utes would make it a 17-10 game at halftime when Matt Gay hit a 25-yard field goal with seven seconds left in the half.

Utah wasted no time getting on the board in the second half, as Huntley hit Troy McCormick for a 75-yard strike and a two-score advantage. Another 10-play drive would consume 4:25 of the third quarter as Moss capped off the drive with a 20-yard score for a 31-10 advantage.

Huntley would later cap off another quick, three-play drive with a 13-yard pass to McCormick in the end zone in the middle of the third

quarter for a 38-10 lead.

After a Utah field goal in the first minute of the fourth qarter, redshirt freshman Matt Lynch marched the Bruins 75 yards down the field in nine plays and ended the drive with a five-yard score to Eldridge Massington with 9:59 left in the final quarter.

The Utes would push the lead to 48-17 as Huntley tossed his fourth touchdown of the game with 3:27 left on the clock to Cody Ippolito from two yards out.

Nov. 11 - Rose Bowl



PASADENA, Calif. - UCLA kept its perfect home record intact against Arizona State on Saturday evening, posting a 44-37 victory. Saturday marked the return of junior quarterback Josh Rosen, who missed last week's game at Utah after suffering an injury at Washington on Oct. 28. Rosen finished the game 25-for-45 for 381 yards and a touchdown. It marked the 16th 300-yard passing game of his career, increasing his own school record.

Rosen also moved into third place in the UCLA record books in both career passing yards and completions. Bruin wideout Jordan Lasley had a career-high 162 yards receiving on the evening, hauling in a crucial 22-yard touchdown pass from Rosen early in the fourth quarter to give UCLA a 41-34 advantage. Lasley also hauled in a 59-yard reception in the second quarter to set up an eventual UCLA field goal.

Arizona State got off to a quick start in Saturday's contest, jumping out to an early lead with a pair first-quarter touchdowns. The Sun Devils' first strike came with 8:34 remaining in the quarter when quarterback Manny Wilkins hit wideout N'Keal Harry for a seven-yard TD pass. ASU scored again just five minutes later, this time on a two-yard TD run from Demario Richard, as the Sun Devils moved out to a 14-0 advantage.

UCLA defensive back Nate Meadors tallied the Bruins' first score of the game, as he intercepted a tipped pass from Wilkins, taking it in from 27 yards out to cut the lead to 14-7. It was Meadors' first career touchdown and second-career interception. UCLA then tied things up on a one-yard TD run from Rosen just after the start of the second quarter.

Arizona State scored once more prior to halftime when Wilkins notched a rushing touchdown of his own, a 16-yard scamper with 7:55 to play in the half, to give the Sun Devils a 21-14 advantage. UCLA managed to cut the lead to 21-20 prior to halftime following a pair field goals from kicker JJ Molson.

Following the intermission, running back Soso Jamabo gave UCLA its first lead of the game when he capped a 6-play, 59-yard drive with a 22-yard touchdown run, putting the Bruins up 27-21. It marked Jamabo's sixth touchdown in seven games this season. In addition to Rosen and Jamabo, Bolu Olorunfunmi also rushed for a touchdown on Saturday, his fifth of the season, giving UCLA a 34-24 advantage on a two-yard run with 5:41 to play in the third quarter. That scoring drive also included a 56-yard reception by Olorunfunmi, the longest reception of his career. His 15 carries (for 79 yards) in the game were also a career high.

Down by 10 late in the third quarter, the Sun Devils would show some resilience. A 22-yard field goal from Brandon Ruiz cut the lead to 34-27, and ASU would tie the game moments later when Eno Benjamin blocked a UCLA punt and ran it in from nine yards out to tie the game at 34-34.

The Bruins, however, would remain steady down the stretch, getting that crucial touchdown from Lasley to start the fourth quarter, and following it up with another Molson field goal, his third of the game, to take a 44-34 lead. The Sun Devils scored just three points in the fourth quarter on a 23-yard field goal from Ruiz with 3:57 to play in the game.

On the defensive end of the field, sophomore linebacker Kryz Barnes tied a career high with 12 tackles, and senior defensive lineman Jacob Tuoti-Mariner had a personal-best 10 tackles and two sacks and tied a career high with two tackles for loss. Redshirt sophomore defensive lineman Chigozie Nnoruka (eight) and senior defensive back/wide receiver Mossi Johnson (seven) also posted career highs in tackles.

The Bruins have just two regular-season games remaining. UCLA is scheduled to face crosstown rival USC on Nov. 18 at the Los Angeles Coliseum (5:00 p.m./ABC) and Cal at the Rose Bowl on Nov. 24 (7:30 p.m./FS1). UCLA can go undefeated at home this year with a win over the Bears. The Bruins' last undefeated campaign in Pasadena was a 6-0 mark in 2005.

GAME ELEVEN: UCLA 23, USC 28

LOS ANGELES, Calif. - LOS ANGELES - UCLA quarterback Josh Rosen threw for 421 yards, 204 to Jordan Lasley, and the Bruin defense held USC to 153 rushing yards, a season-low total for the defense, but UCLA's effort was just short, as No. 12 USC held on for the 28-23 victory at the Los Angeles Coliseum.

Turnovers in the red zone and a few costly penalties left UCLA without much-needed points earlier in the game, but the Bruins did not quit. Down 21-7 late in the third quarter, UCLA closed to within five on a Lasley touchdown with 2:43 to play. But the Bruins missed the two-point conversion and were unable to recover the onside kick, and USC was able to get the first down it needed to run out the clock. Rosen's 421 yards were the most ever by a UCLA quarterback against USC and just two yards shy of Matt Barkley's all-time record in the series, set in 2011. Lasley's 204-yard game was the fourth-best receiving performance in UCLA history. USC (10-2) struck first on a 72-yard punt return for a touchdown by Michael Pittman, but the Bruins answered right back with a seven-play, 80-yard drive that culminated in an 11-yard touchdown pass from Rosen to Lasley.

A long kickoff return gave USC good field position on its next possession, and it took six plays and two and a half minutes to go 56 yards for the touchdown, a two-yard rush by Ronald Jones that put USC ahead, 14-7. The Bruins appeared to tie the game early in the second quarter on a Bolu Olorunfunmi touchdown run on a reverse, but the play was nullified by a clipping penalty, which set the ball back 15 yards to the USC 30. The Bruins ended up with no points on that drive after J.J. Molson missed a 47-yard field goal attempt.

A Jaleel Wadood interception on fourth and 8 on the UCLA 30 gave the Bruins their first break of the game late in the second quarter. UCLA got down to the USC 17, but Rosen was strip sacked, and USC regained possession on their own 40 with 36 seconds to play in the half. The half, however, ended without a score, as the Bruins chased Sam Darnold out of the pocket, and he was tackled in bounds shy of the first down as time expired in the half with USC up 14-7.

UCLA's opening drive of the second half saw the Bruins drive down to the USC 15, only to have Rosen throw an interception in the end zone. USC scored on a one-yard touchdown run by Darnold on the ensuing possession to take a 21-7 lead.

But much like the Trojans' first touchdown, UCLA answered with one of its own. Rosen and Lasley linked up for their second touchdown of the game, a nine-yard pass that cut USC's lead to 21-14 with 2:57 to play in the third. A 26-yard Molson field goal with 10:19 to play in the game put UCLA down by just 4, 21-17.

USC answered with a touchdown drive to increase its lead to 28-17, and on its next possession, UCLA was on the verge of turning it over on downs with under four minutes to play, but a holding penalty by USC gave the Bruins new life with a first down on the USC 38. Rosen found Lasley four plays later for their third touchdown of the game, a 27-yard TD pass with 2:43 to play that cut the deficit to five points, 28-23. But after USC recovered the onside kick, the Bruins ran out of time to attempt a comeback.

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) -- Davis Webb became the second quar-terback in Cal history to throw for more than 4,000 yards in a season, Matt Anderson tied a team record with five field goals and California beat UCLA 36-10 at Memorial Stadium on Saturday.

Webb completed 32 of 48 attempts for 301 yards in his final game with the Golden Bears. He threw touchdown passes of 7 and 2 yards, giving Webb 37 this season.

Anderson converted field goal from 43, 25, 44, 24 and 19 yards to set the Bears' modern day scoring record with 111 points. That matched the school record set by Mark Jensen in 2002. California snapped a four-game losing streak overall to keep its slim postseason hopes alive.

All of UCLA's scoring came in the third quarter. Quarterback Mike Fafaul connected with Kenneth Walker III on a seven-yard touchdown strike at the 11:00 minute mark. Kicker JJ Molson also had a 28-yard field goal. UCLA ended its season 4-8 overall and 2-7 in the Pac-12.

"In order for us to get back to where we want to be, we all have to resist the urge to look somewhere else for the problem and look at ourselves first," Mora said. "If we can do that first, then we can come up with the solutions that are necessary to be a good football team again."

PASADENA (AP) - After two straight conference losses, quar-terback Josh Rosen produced a passing performance that put the true freshman's name in the Bruins' record book and lifted UCLA past California on a Thursday night. Rosen completed a school-record 34 passes (for 399 yards) and threw two of his three touchdown passes to Devin Fuller.

Junior Thomas Duarte had career highs of 10 catches for 141 yards for the Bruins. UCLA rebounded from consecutive losses to Arizona State and Stanford, with a 573-yard offensive per-formance and a stellar effort by its defense, which sacked Cal's Jared Goff five times.

"Every time you win, it's a step forward," said Rosen, who broke the school completions record set by Richard Brehaut and Brett Hundley. "Especially with our bye week, that was three weeks without a win, so it felt great to come out here and put it to them."

Soso Jamabo rushed for a score after star UCLA tailback Paul Perkins left with an injury, and the Bruins' injury-plagued de-fense limited Goff and Cal's potent offense to 170 yards in the first half.

Debuting their black-and-gold "City" uniforms, UCLA appeared revitalized. Ka'imi Fairbairn made four field goals, including a school-record 60-yarder at the halftime gun, and the UCLA defense caused trouble for Goff throughout. Senior linebacker Aaron Wallace recorded a career-best 2.5 sacks to lead the Bruins defense.

"The key was getting that quarterback on the ground," UCLA coach Jim Mora said. "We struggle with that, and we got it done against a really good player."
