General information

Enrollment guidelines

» Students must enroll through the official platform. Enrollment requests received through other channels, such as online general enquiries or email, will NOT be accepted. All registration and enrollment requests will be revised by the School of Biomedical Sciences and Health staff and if the registration does not comply with the established guidelines, the School will make the necessary modifications and inform the student via email (studentNumber@live.uem.es and the email recorded in the University system).

» If there is some specific information that we should consider before reviewing your enrollment request or if you have some petition that cannot be sent through the enrollment platform system, you must write it in the platform's "observation" field. Any information received through any other medium (online general enquiry, email, etc.) won't be taken into account.

» Please, remember that students that have been assigned an international mobility stay for 2020/21 must formalize their enrollment agreed upon with the International Adviser, registering for the subjects established in the Learning Agreement as well as the subjects that will be coursed at UEM. Furthermore, students must indicate this information in the "observation" field.

General rules

Students must register for the whole 2020/21 course. Once the enrollment request has been sent no changes can be made until the specific dates for registration modifications. Only students with special reasoning that appears within university guidelines for changes in registration, can request to modify to their enrollment during the established period.

» For all subjects enrolled in the same year the group must be the same, unless this choice is not available.

Credits' amount:

- The recommended amount of credits is 60 ECTS per academic year (credit maximum limit to enroll: 72 ECTS per academic year, 36 ECTS in each semester. Credit minimum to enroll: 30 ECTS per academic year).

» First, enroll in the courses you have pending from previous years, and then enroll in the courses for the current year, keeping in mind the credit's amount limits.

» A maximum of 2 hours of overlaps between theory subjects will be allowed. Exception: curricular practice subjects, where no overlaps will be allowed. However, since many theory subjects have mandatory lab hours, it is highly recommended to register without overlaps.

› Special subjects

Languages:

Information about curricular Language subject.

- » Throughout your studies, you will have to take the Spanish language subject (*idioma moderno*). Beginning in the 2020-2021 academic year, in all degree programs, the Language subject will be adapted to the specific needs of each Program.

You will not have to achieve an initial minimum Spanish level to enroll in the Language subject.

- » It is your responsibility to have the language level recommended to enroll in the subject to make the most of it. When you enroll in the language subject, ensure that you have the level recommended to complete the coursework. You can take a self-assessment to confirm your level through these links:

Language platform:

- » The University offers a free online platform to learn languages, in addition to the Language subject in your Curriculum.
- » Registration on this platform is done outside of the Enrollment Period and replaces the previous extracurricular courses.
- » The platform has a 24/7 online format, giving you greater flexibility when deciding where and when to continue training in your chosen language.
- » We give you the opportunity to study some of the 24 languages offered on the online platform. You can choose one of these languages for free, as long as the language chosen is in your Curriculum, and as many other languages as you want at an additional cost.
- » Before you choose a language other than the one in your Curriculum, we recommend that you have at least a level B1 in the chosen language of your degree program (English/Spanish).
- » Once the official enrollment period has ended, you will receive notification indicating what to do to register on the extracurricular languages' platform. To access at no extra cost, you must sign up during the registration period we indicate

It is a strong academic recommendation not to enroll more advanced content before having completed the basic content in specific courses. (Example: do not enroll Pediatrics II, before completing Pediatrics I).

› University Activities

The curriculum for certain degree programs and double degree programs includes the course "University Activities." If you'd like to add this subject to your enrollment you must have already accumulated a minimum of 4 ECTS credits in extracurricular activities on your transcript. And for to pass it, you must complete the remaining extracurricular credits in the same academic year as when you enrolled, until you reach a total of 6 ECTS credits.

› Elective subjects

You must keep in mind that, in order to finish your studies in dentistry, you must pass 12 credits of elective subjects in the 5th year, choosing three or four subjects depending on the number of credits that corresponds to them.
