The Arlington Renegades will play 10 regular season games during the 2025 UFL season. The team will play six games against division foes - D.C., San Antonio, and St. Louis (one home, one road) - and four games against non-division opponents - Birmingham, Houston, Memphis, and Michigan. Below are a few scheduling nuggets:

- Arlington will take part in home openers during Week 1 (at home) and Week 3 (at Birmingham)
- Six of the team's 10 games will be played in Texas (5 home, 2 road)
- Each of the team's 10 games will be played in the Central or Eastern time zone



HOW THE HOUSES WERE BUILT

ABOUT CHOCTAW STADIUM



The Texas Rangers and Choctaw Casinos & Resorts announced a multi-year naming rights partnership for the former Globe Life Park in Arlington in August 2021, re-naming the venue Choctaw Stadium. In addition to hosting the Renegades, Choctaw Stadium is home to the Dallas Jackals (Major League Rugby) and North Texas Soccer Club (MLS Next Pro), while also hosting multiple high school and college football games each year.

To be ready for the 2020 XFL season, Choctaw Stadium underwent a \$10 million renovation completed by Manhattan Construction in 115 days. The renovation included the following:

- A new seating structure was added in what was formerly left field to accommodate 4,000 more fans and create a more intimate atmosphere.
- 18 rows of seats and the dugout along what used to be the third base line were demolished.
- A new network television broadcast booth, plus coaches' booths for the home and visiting teams were added at the 50-yard line.
- Seating in corners of each end zone were reconfigured to accommodate marching bands.
- Over 200 sports light fixtures were relocated/re-aimed to be accommodate football and soccer play and broadcast quality.
- Two new locker rooms in what were previously batting cages were added to accommodate multiple events on the same day.
- More than 90,000 square feet of grass and dirt were removed.
- An unmarked, synthetic grass by Shaw Sports Turf was added.

IMPORTANT DATES

- October 24, 1990 An agreement between the Texas Rangers and the City of Arlington to build a new stadium is announced.
- April 24, 1992 Construction begins.
- April 1, 1994 The first game is played in the venue, an exhibition baseball game versus the New York Mets.
- April 11, 1994 The Texas Rangers play their first regular season game in Choctaw Stadium, then known as The Ballpark in Arlington. The Milwaukee Brewers defeat the Rangers, 4-3.
- September 29, 2019 The final baseball game is played at the stadium, as the Rangers defeat the New York Yankees, 6-1.
- **February 9**, **2020** The first professional football game in the stadium is played when the Dallas Renegades host the St. Louis BattleHawks.
- August 25, 2021 The Texas Rangers and Choctaw Casinos & Resorts announce a multi-year naming rights partnership to re-name the venue Choctaw Stadium.

The United Football League (UFL) kicked off on March 30, 2024 as the premier spring football platform, formed by the merging of the XFL and USFL in 2024. The UFL has eight teams in Arlington (TX), Birmingham (AL), Detroit (MI), Houston (TX), San Antonio (TX), Memphis (TN), St. Louis (MO), and Washington, D.C. The eight UFL teams are divided into conferences that represent the two former leagues.

UFL RULES

The United Football League (UFL) has adopted a number of innovative rules from both previous leagues to deliver an exciting, fast-paced game with plenty of action

Points After Touchdown

Teams will have three scrimmage play options following a touchdown.

2-yard line = 1 point for a successful try

5-yard line = 2 points for a successful try 10-yard line = 3 points for a successful try

Kickoffs

Kickoffs will now start from the 30-yard line. The 10 remaining players on the kickoff team will now line up at the receiving team's 40-yard line. The receiving team's setup zone now stretches from their 35-yard line to the 30-yard line, and they must have at least nine players in that zone. The landing zone for the kickoff will span from the receiving team's 20-yard line to the goal line, and the ball must reach this landing zone or it will be spotted at the 40-yard line. There will be two touch back spots: the 35-yard line for balls kicked into the end zone and the 20-yard line for balls that land in the landing zone and then enter the end zone

Alternate Possession Option

While onside kicks are allowed at any time during the game, teams will have an alternate option to retain possession in the fourth quarter. If a team is tied or behind during the fourth quarter, it may elect to retain possession after a score with a 4th-and-12 from its own 28-yard line.

Two Forward Passes

Teams will be allowed, as they were in both leagues last season, to throw two forward passes on one play. The ball cannot cross the line of scrimmage at any time prior to the second forward pass being thrown.

Onside Kicks

The league has eliminated this option. The kickoff team will be able to retain possession of the ball with a fourth down and 12-yard scrimmage play from its own 28-yard line.

Replay Reviews

The officiating department may stop a game at any time before the ball is next legally put in play to review a play if there is reasonable evidence to believe an error was made and it would have a direct, competitive impact on the game. Any call or non-call related to player safety is also subject to review at any point, as well as any officiating ruling in the last five minutes of the or overtime that is obviously incorrect and will have a significant impact on the outcome.

Coach Challenges

Each coach may challenge any ruling, including fouls or potential fouls, provided the team has a timeout. The head coach will earn a second challenge if the first challenge is successful.

Reeled in five receptions for 50 yards and a touchdown in his last game against the Brahmas.

Marquette King - P

Registered six punts for 58 yards, averaging 46.3 yards per punt in his last appearance against San Antonio.

Donald Payne - LB

Recordéd seven tackles, one tackle for loss and a pass breakup in his last game against the Brahmas.

Luis Perez - QB

Completed 22-for-35 (62.9%) passes for 207 yards with one touchdown and one interception in his most recent game against San Antonio.

Joe Powell - LB

Registered four tackles and one pass breakup in his last match-up with the Brahmas.

Tyler Vaughns - WR

Tallied six receptions for 75 yards, averaging 12.5 yards per catch with a long of 39 yards in his last meetup with San Antonio.

★ FIRST TIME, LAST TIME ★

The first time these two teams faced off, the Renegades were in the fifth game of their inaugural season in 2023. Arlington entered the San Antonio match up with a 2-2 record. On March 19, 2023, the Renegades improved to 3-2 when they defeated the Brahmas 12-10 at the Alamodome in San Antonio.

The last time these two teams met was May 19, 2024 at the Alamodone in San Antonio. The Brahmas defeated the Renegades, 20-15. Perez, who had been a steady force for the Renegades, threw for 207 yards and one touchdown.

★ INSIDE THE SERIES HISTORY ★

The series between the Arlington Renegades and the San Antonio Brahmas has been around since the XFL 2.0 debut. In total, the teams have met four times.

In the four games of the series there has been:

- * One game decided by double digits
- * Two games decided by less than a touchdown
- * A three-game winning streak by San Antonio
- * A 10-point win by San Antonio (4/27/24) biggest series win
- * 51 points scored by Arlington throughout the series
- * 70 points scored by San Antonio throughout the series
- A 1-1 record for the Arlington when playing in San Antonio

Additionally, two other players on the roster played college football in the state Texas: LS Antonio Ortiz (TCU) and QB Luis Perez (Texas A&M-Commerce) .

Head coach Bob Stoops has brought back 16 players on his roster that were a part of the 2023 XFL Championship Game, highlighted by XFL Championship Game MVP QB Luis Perez.

Other notable players returning include WRs JaVonta Payton, Tyler Vaughns and LuJuan Winningham, TE Sal Cannella, LBs Will Clarke, Donald Payne and Willie Taylor III, DBs Joe Powell and Jamal Carter, P Marquette King, and LS Antonio Ortiz.

Three players who were All-UFL honorees in 2024 are on the current roster: P Marquette King (Arlington Renegades) on special teams as well as DE Chris Odom (Houston Roughnecks) and DB Ajene Harris (Arlington Renegades) on defense.

Head Coach Bob Stoops is also back for a fourth season along with six members of his previous coaching staff.

BOB STOOPS Head Coach

Renegades: 4th Year

Bob Stoops led the Arlington Renegades to the 2023 XFL Championship and is entering his fourth season as the team's head coach in 2025. With the team's 35-26 victory over the D.C. Defenders in the 2023 XFL Championship Game on May 13, 2023 at The Alamodome in San Antonio, Stoops became just the fifth head coach to win a championship at both the professional and college levels. The former Oklahoma coach, who won the 2000 BCS National Championship, joined Pete Carroll (Seattle Seahawks / USC), Jimmy Johnson (Dallas Cowboys / Miami), Barry Switzer (Dallas Cowboys / Oklahoma), and Paul Brown (Cleveland Browns / Ohio State) in the exclusive club.

Browns / Ohio State) in the exclusive club.

Stoops was originally named head coach of the Renegades on Feb. 7, 2019 and guided the team through five games of the abbreviated 2020 XFL campaign before returning to the same role in 2023. He was the only 2020 XFL head coach to return to the League in the same capacity as 2020.

Prior to joining the professional ranks. Stoops spent more than 30

ranks, Stoops spent more than 30 years as a college coach, including 18 seasons as head coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2016. He briefly returned to Oklahoma on an interim basis in 2021, Oklanoma on an Interim basis in 2021, leading the Sooners to a win in the Alamo Bowl. Stoops is the willingest coach in Oklahoma program history, with a 191-78 (.799) all-time record. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2021.



Stoops led the Sooners to a school-record 18 consecutive bowl games, including a BCS National Championship in 2000 in just his second season at the helm. He guided the team to 10 Big 12 championships, and no other program won more than two conference titles during his 18 years in Norman. Stepps generated four two conference titles during his 18 years in Norman. Stoops coached four Oklahoma quarterbacks that either won the Heisman Trophy under his watch, or would go on to win the award after his retirement: Jason White (2003), Sam Bradford (2008), Baker Mayfield (2017), and Kyler Murray (2018).

The Youngstown, Ohio native is a six-time winner of the Big 12 Coach of the Year award and won the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award as the nation's top college coach in 2000. He also won a National Championship as an assistant

National Championship as an assistant coach at Florida in 1996. Stoops was a defensive back at the University of Iowa and earned Team MVP honors in 1982. He was teammates at Iowa with two current Renegades assistant coaches: Jonathan Hayes (co-Offensive Coordinator) and Chuck Long (co-Offensive Coordinator).

JAY HAYES **Co-Defensive Coordinator** Run Game Coordinator/ **Defensive Line** Idaho Renegades: 3rd Year

Jay Hayes returns for his third sea-son as the team's co-defensive coordi-nator alongside Marvin Sanders. Hayes is responsible for developing the team's running game strategy and overseeing the defensive line's performance. Alongside Sanders, Hayes oversaw a strong defensive unit while defensive lineman Vic Beasley led the team with five sacks.

Hayes joined the Renegades for the 2023 season after serving as defensive coordinator for the St. Louis Battlehawks in 2020. He has extensive coaching experience at the NFL level with the Pittsburgh Steelers (1999-2001), Minnesota Vikings (2002),

Cincinnati Bengals (2003-15), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2016-17), and Green Bay Packers (2018). Hayes began his coaching career in the college ranks at Wisconsin (1995-98). Hayes is not only dedicated to his profession but also deeply committed to his family and faith. A proud husband, father, and grandfather, he values the relationships that anchor him and the

ratner, and grandratner, ne values the relationships that anchor him and the lessons he passes down to the next generation. He takes great pride in mentoring young players both on and off the field, emphasizing the importance of character and hard work in achieving success. achieving success.



Marvin Sanders returns for his fourth year with the Renegades and will serve as the team's co-defensive coordinator as the team's co-defensive coordinator alongside Jay Hayes. Last season, Sanders assisted a defensive backs room collectively recorded 157 total tackles, comprising 105 solo and 52 assisted tackles. They also achieved 8 interceptions, returning them for a total of 100 yards and 1 touchdown. Additionally, they contributed 1 sack, 1 forced fumble, and 1 fumble recovery. Sanders originally became a member of the Arlington staff in 2020 during the XFL 2.0 season before reuniting

with Coach Stoops and the Renegades

Before the Renegades, Sanders served as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach for Claremont-Midd-Scripps from 2021-23. He began his football coaching career as an assistant coach for Nebraska Wesleyan University just two years after he graduated from Nebraska, putting in two years as the Secondary Coach for the Prairie Wolves football team.



Chuck Long returns for his third season with the Renegades, second as the team's solo offensive coordinator. During the 2024 campaign, he led an offense that accumulated 2,355 passing yards with 844 rushing yards and 190 yards with 844 rushing yards and 190 first downs. Under Long's guidance, Luis Perez finished the inaugural season leading the UFL in passing, averaging 230 yards per game and 2309 yards for the regular season, surpassing all quarterbacks in the league by over 400 vards.

Long joined the Renegades for the 2023 season after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach on Hayes' St. Louis Battlehawks staff in 2020. He was the head coach at San Diego State from 2006-08, and has also held assistant roles at Iowa (1995-99), Oklahoma (2000-05), and Kansas (2010-11).

Long was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1999 following a standout career as a quarterback at lowa, where he was teammates with Bob Stoops and Jonathan Hayes. In Bob Stoops and Jonathan Hayes. In 1985, he won the Davey O'Brien Award, Maxwell Award, and Big Ten Most Valuable Player Award. Long was selected with the 12th overall pick in the 1986 NFL Draft and played for the Detroit Lions and Los Angeles Rams.



Jonathan Himebauch returns to the Renegades for his third season as the offensive line coach after joining the team in 2023. He has been involved in all three iterations of the XFL as a player and coach. Himebauch coached for the Tampa Bay Vipers in 2020 and was the starting center for the 2001 XFL-champion Los Angeles Xtreme.

Himebauch (pronounced HIME-bock) has two decades of coaching experience at the professional and college levels. In addition to the XFL,

he has spent time in the USFL, AAF, and CFL. Himebauch was offensive line coach for the USFL-champion Birming-ham Stallions in 2022, and won three Grey Cups during his time in Canada. He was an offensive lineman at USC from 1993-98 and spent five seasons playing in various professional leagues after college.

Jonathan is the founder of 5asONE, a training program for offensive linemen. His son, Walker, is a long snapper

at Kentucky.

REGGIE DAVIS Running Backs Tight Ends Washington Renegades: 4th Year

Reggie Davis returns for his third season as a coach for running backs and tight ends for the Renegades. Under Davis' tutelage, Arlington running backs rushed for 844 yards in 2024 while tight end Sal Cannella led the team with 53 receptions and 497 receiving yards, and he also led the league with six receiving touchdowns.

Davis joined the Renegades for the 2023 season after serving as running backs coach for the St. Louis Battlehawks during the 2020 XFL campaign. The former tight end has NFL experience as a player for the San Diego Chargers (1999-2000) and as coach for the San Francisco 49ers, as he worked on head coach John Harbaugh's staff as tight ends (2011-12) and assistant offensive line (2013-14) coach.



Davis got his start in coaching at the college level, as he has held assistant roles at San Diego, UNLV, Oregon State, and Nebraska. He also worked as a head coach in the Home School Athletic Association (HSAA) in 2019. The California native played collegiately at Washington at Washington.

SCOTT SPURRIER Special Teams Quality Control

South Carolina Renegades: 4th Year

Scott Spurrier is back for his fourth season with the Renegades, serving as the team's special teams coach for the the team's special teams coach for the second season. In the 2024 season, the Arlington Renegades' special teams unit had 46 kickoff returns, totaling 1,028 yards, with an average return of 22.35 yards per return. The longest kickoff return was 45 yards, though the unit did not score any touchdowns on kickoffs. On punt returns, the Renegades had 14 returns for a total of 125 yards, averaging 8.93 yards per return. His special teams unit was led by All-UFL team punter Marquette King.

Mueller has held player personnel leadership roles in the NFL with the Philadelphia Eagles as director of player personnel (2012-16) and with the New Orleans Saints as vice president of player personnel (2000-08). He also spent time in the United Football League as a vice president and general manager from 2009-11.

Growing up in Spokane, Mueller was influenced by his older brother, Randy, fostering a deep passion for football. Both brothers have had parallel careers, with Randy also working in football operations, including a stint with the Seattle franchise.
