

2025 UFL RULES HIGHLIGHTS

NEW KICKOFF FORMATION

- THE UFL'S KICKOFF RULES THIS SEASON WILL BE BASED ON A COMBINATION OF THE KICKOFF USED BY XFL LEGACY DURING ITS 2023 SEASON AND THE NFL DYNAMIC KICKOFF USED BY THE NFL DURING THE 2024 SEASON. THESE CHANGES INCLUDE:
- KICKOFFS WILL NOW START FROM THE 30-YARD LINE AFTER BEING AT THE 20-YARD LINE LAST SEASON.
- THE 10 REMAINING PLAYERS ON THE KICKOFF TEAM WILL LINE UP AT THE RECEIVING TEAM'S 40-YARD LINE. ALL KICKING TEAM PLAYERS WERE AT THE 20-YARD LINE, INCLUDING THE KICKER, LAST SEASON.
- THE RECEIVING TEAM'S SET UP ZONE WILL STRETCH FROM ITS 35-YARD LINE TO THE 30-YARD LINE AND MUST HAVE AT LEAST NINE PLAYERS IN THAT ZONE. LAST SEASON, THE RECEIVING TEAM HAD TO HAVE A MINIMUM OF EIGHT PLAYERS, BUT NO MORE THAN NINE PLAYERS, IN THEIR SET UP ZONE, WHICH WAS THE KICKING TEAM'S 30- TO THE 40-YARD LINES (10-YARD ZONE).
- THE LANDING ZONE WILL BE FROM THE RECEIVING TEAM'S 20-YARD LINE TO THE GOAL LINE.
- THE BALL MUST REACH THE LANDING ZONE OR IT WILL BE SPOTTED AT THE 40-YARD LINE.
- THERE WILL BE TWO TOUCHBACK SPOTS: THE 35-YARD-LINE FOR BALLS KICKED INTO THE END ZONE AND THE 20-YARD LINE FOR BALLS THAT HIT IN THE LANDING ZONE AND THEN ENTER THE ENDZONE. ALL TOUCHBACKS WERE PLACED AT THE 25-YARD LINE LAST SEASON.

HEAD COACH'S CHALLENGE

- THE HEAD COACH'S CHALLENGE WILL BE EXPANDED IN 2025.
 THIS EXTENSION WILL FEATURE:
- EACH HEAD COACH WILL EARN A SECOND CHALLENGE IF THE FIRST CHALLENGE IS SUCCESSFUL.
- THE HEAD COACH CAN CHALLENGE ANY OFFICIATING DECISION AS LONG AS THE TEAM HAS A TIMEOUT REMAINING.

ONSIDE KICKS

 THE LEAGUE HAS ELIMINATED THIS OPTION. THE KICKOFF TEAM WILL BE ABLE TO RETAIN POSSESSION OF THE BALL WITH A FOURTH DOWN AND 12-YARD SCRIMMAGE PLAY FROM ITS OWN 28-YARD LINE.

NOTEWORTHY RULES RETURNING

- THE FOLLOWING NOTEWORTHY RULES WILL BE RETAINED THIS SEASON:
- TEAMS WILL HAVE THREE SCRIMMAGE PLAY OPTIONS (RUN OR PASS) TO ELECT TO GO FOR ONE, TWO, OR THREE POINTS AFTER A TOUCHDOWN:
- 2-YARD LINE = 1 POINT FOR A SUCCESSFUL TRY
- 5-YARD LINE = 2 POINTS FOR A SUCCESSFUL TRY
- 10-YARD LINE = 3 POINTS FOR A SUCCESSFUL TRY
- OVERTIME WILL CONSIST OF ALTERNATING ATTEMPTS TO SCORE FROM THE OPPONENT'S FIVE-YARD-LINE WITH NO KICKS ALLOWED. IT WILL REMAIN A BEST-OF-THREE FORMAT UNTIL A WINNER HAS BEEN DETERMINED.
- A DOUBLE FORWARD PASS ON ONE PLAY FROM BEHIND THE LINE OF SCRIMMAGE IS LEGAL. IN THESE SITUATIONS, THE BALL CANNOT CROSS THE LINE OF SCRIMMAGE AT ANY TIME PRIOR TO THE SECOND FORWARD PASS BEING THROWN.

CLASH OF TWO VETERANS

Saturday's USFL conference game will feature Showboats' head coach Ken Whisenhunt and Roughnecks head coach C.J Johnson, two coaches with 67 years combined of coaching experience at the FBS and professional levels of football.

WE MEET AGAIN

The Week 3 matchup at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium will be the first time the Roughnecks travel to Memphis since the final week of the regular season of the 2024 UFL season. The Roughnecks fell to the Showboats 19-12 in the season finale for as Memphis secured the first overall pick of the 2024 UFL College Draft.

HOMETOWN HERO

Despite the Week 2 loss to the Arlington Renegades, the Houston Roughnecks' defensive performance stood out above the rest. Leon O'Neal Jr., native of Cypress, Texas, had his best performance in a Roughnecks uniform during the matchup against their North Texas rivals. The former Texas A&M Aggie totaled 13 tackles to go along with his sack and forced fumble.

Player Spotlight Justin Hall



Wide receiver Justin Hall is been a key contributor of the Houston Roughnecks offense heading into his second season with the team. Hall, currently in his second season with the Roughnecks, leads the team in receptions (7) and receiving yards (55). The former Ball State standout also led the Roughnecks in receiving yards (603), touchdown receptions (3), and total receptions (56) during the 2024 UFL season.





HEAD COACH C.J. JOHNSON

The United Football League's Houston Roughnecks are led by Head Coach Curtis "C.J." Johnson. Previously, he coached the United States Football League (USFL's) Houston Gamblers.

Johnson brings 40 years of coaching experience, including four as head coach at Tulane and 33 seasons in all as an assistant coach in the NFL, college and high school

He spent the next decade as wide receivers coach for the Miami Hurricanes, where he went to nine bowl games and won the 2001 National Championship. There, he coached Houston Texans legendary wide receiver and 2024 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Andre Johnson, newly elected Pro Football Hall of Famer Devin Hester, Pro Football Hall of Famer Ed Reed, Santana Moss and Reggie Wayne.

Johnson then transitioned to the NFL after being named wide receivers coach for the New Orleans Saints from 2006-2011, winning a Super Bowl with the team in 2009

In February 2023, Johnson was hired by the Houston Gamblers of the USFL, serving as head coach for the 2023 season. And in 2024, he was named Head Coach for the Houston Roughnecks of the UFL, the premier spring football platform, formed by the merging of the XFL and USFL.



HOUSTON ROUGHNECKS COACHING STAFF



ERIC PRICE* PASS GAME COORDINATOR

Eric Price returns to the Roughnecks staff as the pass game coordinator for the 2025 UFL season. Price reunited with Coach Johnson two years ago, having served as the offensive coordinator with the Houston Gamblers during the 2023 USFL season and previously served in the same role with him at Tulane University.



TOM CABLE RUN GAME COORDINATOR

Cable joins the Roughnecks staff for the 2025 season with more than thirty years of experience at the FBS and NFL levels. He is most known for his time with the Seattle Seahawks under head coach Pete Carroll. Cable's offensive line helped the Seahawks became one of the most feared rushing attacks in the entire league, which led to win in Super Bowl XLVII versus Peyton Manning's Denver Broncos.



GARRET CHACHERE SPECIAL TEAMS/RUNNING BACKS

Garret Chachere returns to the team having coached the running backs under head coach CJ Johnson for the past three seasons. Chachere brings more than three decades of collegiate experience with him, most recently coaching running backs at Western Kentucky University.



CHRIS WILSON DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR/LINEBACKERS

Wilson returns to the Roughnecks staff with more than three decades of NFL and college coaching experience under his belt. The former 12th round pick in the 1992 NFL draft was part of the Philadelphia Eagles coaching staff that won Super Bowl LII in 2018.



KWAHN DRAKE DEFENSIVE LINE

Kwahn Drake returns as defensive line coach for the Houston Roughnecks for the 2025 UFL season. The Marrero, LA native previously coached under Coach Johnson during the 2014 and 2015 while at Tulane, and was in charge of the Houston Gamblers defensive line during the 2023 USFL season.



JORDAN HIGGINS Quality Control Offense

Jordan Higgins returns to H-Town after having spent a season as an offensive assistant at Princeton University. Prior to that, Higgins served as offensive line coach for his alma mater Texas Wesleyan.



BRETT MAXIE SPECIAL TEAMS/DEFENSIVE BACKS

Maxie returns to Houston having played his college ball at Texas Southern University, before enjoying a productive 12 year NFL career that included stops with the New Orleans Saints, Atlanta Falcons, Carolina Panthers, and San Francisco 49ers. Maxie also brings more than 25 years of experience coaching at the NFL and FBS levels.



ZACH SHAGI* Quality conrol defense

 Shagi returns as defensive quality control with the Houston Roughnecks during the 2025 UFL season. Prior to his time under Coach Johnson, he has served as running backs coach at Central Connecticut State University.

Will Lewis returns to the Houston Roughnecks, after being named general manager for the 2025 UFL season in July 2024. Lewis played in Houston in the mid-80's with the Houston Gamblers and worked with June Jones as the assistant general manager with the 2020 Houston Roughnecks. Most recently, he worked as the Director of Player Personnel with the XFL's San Antonio Brahmas in 2023.
