MEDIA WORK AREAS

Media Entrance: All media must enter the Media Entrance near the South Gate of the Stadium. Once you receive your credential, you may enter Protective Stadium. Protective Stadium event staff will ensure that you enter the stadium at the correct entrance. Once in the stadium, you can take the stairs or elevator to floor six (press level). The press box for the print media is located in the last room at the end of the hallway on the sixth floor.

Broadcast Booth: The broadcast booth is located on the sixth floor (press level), near the press box.

Digital Media Work Room: Photographers and videographers have access to the main press conference room and the media auxiliary room on the ground floor. The press conference room is near the east tunnel, across from the visitor's locker room. The auxiliary room is between the press conference and visitor's locker rooms. Credentialed media members with field access must pick up and wear vests while working at Protective Stadium. Vests must be returned to the press conference room at the end of the game. Any unreturned vests will result in the revoking of any future Stallions credentials.

Before each game, the UFL will provide a complementary box meal, snacks and beverages in the sixth floor media area.

CREDENTIALS & PHOTO VEST PICKUP

Media members can pick up their season or single-game credentials at the Media Entrance near the South Gate of the stadium. Media will call will be open two hours prior to kickoff on game day and from 10 AM to 2 PM on the day before each game. You must provide a form of identification to receive your credential. Photographers and other electronic media members will be required to wear a photo vest that a member of the Stallions communications staff will provide. Photo vests must be signed out and returned to a member of the Stallions communications staff or placed in a designated spot in the press conference room at the conclusion of the game. For any questions regarding media will call and the status of your credential, contact Mary Timmons Cross, mtcross@champbranding.com.

POSTGAME PRESS CONFERENCE

Format: Credentialed media will have access to the postgame press conferences for both the home and away teams in the press conference room on the ground floor of Protective Stadium. The head coach and a key player from both teams will appear in the press conference room to answer questions from the media about the game.

Cooling-Off Period: The visiting team's cooling-off period is 10 minutes long and begins when the head coach enters the locker room immediately after the game. The visiting team will always go first in the press conference room, with the home team immediately following.


Locker Rooms: Media members will not have postgame locker room access. For special requests, contact team communications staffs.

FIELD ACCESS

Credentialed media are allowed designated field access before and after the game. **Before kickoff,** credentialed media are allowed field access in designated areas along the sidelines and end zones until 30 minutes remain on the pregame countdown clock. At that point, all credentialed media without credentials that allow field access during the game will be escorted off the field to access the auxiliary media room or the press box.

Only media with field access credentials—photographers, broadcasters, and select team/UFL staff—can access the field and shoot game action from designated locations during the game. All other credentialed media without field access must work from one designated working media area.

With five minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, all credentialed media are allowed field access in designated areas along the sidelines and end zones. Once the game is over and the live broadcast has concluded, credentialed media are permitted to conduct live shots in the south end zone until two hours after the game clock hits 0:00. Once the time is up, a member of the Stallions communications staff or Protective Stadium event staff will ask you to leave the playing field immediately. Persons violating any specified guidelines on game day at Protective Stadium must surrender their credentials upon request and leave the stadium immediately. **Please note:** Tripods are not allowed on the field during the game. Photographers must also stay between the end zones and the 20-yard lines on both sides of the field.



STALLIONS VS SHOWBOATS GAME PREVIEW

THREE STALLIONS TO WATCH ON OFFENSE:

Davion Davis: The 2023 Stallions standout returned to the team this season after spending two seasons in the NFL. He is currently the team leader in receptions with 11 and is second to Deon Cain in receiving yards and receiving touchdowns. Davis had two huge catches for the Stallions in last week's win over the Houston Roughnecks. The first catch resulted in a 26-yard touchdown and he followed with a two-point conversion reception. The final catch came on 3rd-and-long late in the game when he hauled in a 36-yard pass from backup quarterback Case Cookus. Davis had 47 catches for 705 yards with seven touchdowns in 12 games in 2023.

Case Cookus: The first snap of Cookus' tenure with the Stallions featured the 6-foot-3, 210-pound veteran quarterback voluntarily serving as a lead blocker for C.J. Marable. Obviously, doing what it takes to win is at the top of his objectives list. Now, more traditionally, his 36-yard pass to Davion Davis was the key play of a drive that finished with a critical field goal by Harrison Mevis. Cookus has 4,654 yards with 34 touchdowns and 18 interceptions in USFL and UFL regular season action.

Jordan Thomas: The 6-foot-5, 285-pound Thomas is a tight end in an offensive lineman's body. The former Houston Texans starter has made a big – pardon the pun – impact since joining the Stallions for the 2024 season. He's shown he can move the chains with six catches for 87 yards, which is an average of nearly 15 yards per catch, this season. Thomas had four catches for 75 yards in the 2024 UFL regular season.

THREE STALLIONS TO WATCH ON DEFENSE

Tae Crowder: The former New York Giants starter has stepped right into one of the deepest and most productive linebacker rooms in the UFL. After four games, Crowder is second on the team with 27 tackles while adding one tackle for loss and one pass breakup. Crowder is a former linebacker at the University of Georgia.

Chapelle Russell: The former Temple University linebacker is coming off his best game in a Stallions uniform. Russell had seven tackles and one tackle for loss in the win over the Houston Roughnecks. His big hit on Nolan Henderson knocked the Houston starting quarterback out of the game in the second quarter with a shoulder injury. Russell has 15 tackles, one tackle for loss, one sack, one pass breakup and a forced fumble on the season.

Perrion Winfrey: The 6-foot-3, 317-pound defensive tackle from Oklahoma leads the defensive front with 14 tackles, one tackle for loss and two pass breakups. He had six tackles and a pass breakup in the win over the

Roughnecks. Winfrey was the nation's top junior college prospect following two seasons at Iowa Western Community College. After two seasons at Oklahoma, he was fourth round draft pick by the Cleveland Browns. He played in 13 games as a rookie in 2022.

BEND BUT DON'T BREAK

The Stallions defense is just below the middle of the UFL pack if you judge a defense by yards allowed per game. The Stallions give up 282.3 yards per game through the first four games, which is fifth best in the league. But final results aren't determined by yardage, which is why the Stallions defense has played a big role in helping the team get off to a 3-1 start. The Stallions are second in the league in scoring defense, giving up an average of 13.8 points per game. Birmingham shares the top overall record in the league with the D.C. Defenders, Arlington Renegades and Michigan Panthers. Those four teams also represent the leaders in scoring defense.

Birmingham's defense gave up just four touchdowns in four games with two of those coming in last week's win over Houston. Arlington leads the league with three touchdowns allowed in four games.

SCOUTING THE MEMPHIS SHOWBOATS

It's been a rough start, once again, for the winless Showboats. But wide receiver Jonathan Adams is showing once again that he's one of the best wide receivers in the UFL. Through four weeks, the 6-foot-3, 220-pound Arkansas State product leads the UFL in receptions (22) and receiving yards (284) with one touchdown. A year ago, Adams had 33 catches for 443 yards with a touchdown for a Memphis team that finished 2-8. He had 31 catches for 406 yards with five touchdowns for New Orleans in the USFL in 2023. Adams had 75 catches for 1,111 yards with 15 touchdowns as a senior at Arkansas State.

Ken Whisenhunt stepped down as the Memphis head coach on April 16. Jim Turner is serving as the interim head coach. The Showboats dropped a 26-12 decision to the Michigan Panthers in Turner's debut at the helm. Turner coached the offensive line during his 30-year career, including the past two seasons with the Showboats.

Memphis has three of the UFL's top 10 in tackles. Linebacker Steele Chambers in second in total tackles (37) and solo tackles (23). Safety Eli Walker and linebacker Zeke Vandenburgh each have 28 tackles, which is seventh best in the UFL. Walker is fourth in solo tackles with 21. The defense has struggled overall. The Showboats are sixth in the UFL in rushing defense (123.8 ypg) and total defense (286.3 ypg) and seventh in scoring defense (22 ppg). Memphis has an UFL-low two sacks in four games and have yet to force a turnover.

UFL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The United Football League (UFL) will continue to build on the innovation of both the XFL and USFL with its rules for the 2025 season. The UFL has adopted several innovative rules from both previous leagues to deliver an exciting, fast-paced game with plenty of action.

The UFL has adopted the XFL's points after-touchdown options. Slight modifications have been made to the rules that overlapped, including alternate possession options in the fourth quarter. Both leagues implemented opportunities in 2023 for teams that are trailing or if the scores are tied.

In 2025, the UFL will offer a 4th-and-12 from the 28-yard line.

NEW KICKOFF FORMATION

The UFL's kickoff rules this season will be based on a combination of the kickoff used by XFL Legacy during its 2023 season and the NFL Dynamic Kickoff used by the NFL during the 2024 season. These changes include:

- Kickoffs will now start from the 30-yard line after being at the 20-yard line last season.
- The 10 remaining players on the kickoff team will line up at the receiving team's 40-yard line. All kicking team players were at the 20-yard line, including the kicker, last season.
- The receiving team's set up zone will stretch from its 35-yard line to the 30-yard line and must have at least nine players in that zone. Last season, the receiving team had to have a minimum of eight players, but no more than nine players, in their set up zone, which was the kicking team's 30- to the 40-yard lines (10-yard zone).
- The landing zone will be from the receiving team's 20-yard line to the goal line.
- The ball must reach the landing zone or it will be spotted at the 40-yard line.
- There will be two touchback spots: the 35-yard-line for balls kicked into
 the end zone and the 20-yard line for balls that hit in the landing zone and
 then enter the endzone. All touchbacks were placed at the 25-yard line last
 season.

HEAD COACH'S CHALLENGE

The Head Coach's Challenge will be expanded in 2025. This extension will feature:

- Each head coach will earn a second challenge if the first challenge is successful.
- The head coach can challenge any officiating decision as long as the team has a timeout remaining.

ONSIDE KICKS

The league has eliminated this option. The kickoff team will be able to retain possession of the ball with a fourth down and 12-yard scrimmage play from its own 28-yard line.

POINT AFTER TOUCHDOWN

Teams will have three scrimmage play options (run or pass) to elect to go for one, two, or three points after a touchdown:

2-yard line = 1 point for a successful try

5-yard line = 2 points for a successful try

10-yard line = 3 points for a successful try

OVERTIME

Overtime will consist of alternating attempts to score from the opponent's fiveyard-line with no kicks allowed. It will remain a best-of-three format until a winner has been determined.

TWO FORWARD PASSES

A double forward pass on one play from behind the line of scrimmage is legal. In these situations, the ball cannot cross the line of scrimmage at any time prior to the second forward pass being thrown.

ALTERNATE POSSESSION OPTION

If a team is tied or behind during the fourth quarter, it may elect to retain possession after a score with a 4th-and-12 from its own 28-yard line.

CATCH DEFINITION

A completed catch or interception is defined as a player securing control of the ball prior to the ball touching the ground; and touching the ground inbounds with both feet or with any part of his body other than his hands.

DEFENSIVE PASS INTERFERENCE

Defensive pass interference will result in a 15-yard penalty or a spot foul if the foul occurred less than 15 yards downfield. Intentional defensive pass interference will result in a spot foul if it is beyond 15 yards downfield.



REPLAY REVIEWS

Designated members of the officiating department may stop a game at any time before the ball is next legally put in play to review a play if the play is reviewable, there is reasonable evidence to believe an error was made in the initial ruling and it would have a direct, competitive impact on the game. These reviews will be made from a secure location separate from the site of the game. Any call or non-call related to player safety is also subject to review at any point during the game, as well as any officiating ruling in the last five minutes of the fourth quarter or overtime that is obviously incorrect and will have a significant impact on the outcome of the game.

Blandino's illustrious NFL career included a stint as an Instant Replay Official (1999-03) and he was selected to work two Super Bowls and two conference championships. Blandino ended his NFL tenure as Vice President of Officiating and is held in high regard for crucial input on system upgrades and an early adoption of technological transformations.



MIKE Pereira

Head of Officiating

Mike Pereira is the Head of Officiating for the UFL, overseeing rules, regulations and game officials. Pereira

is involved in each game's television broadcast, providing viewers with clarity and information on the rules and regulations of UFL games. Pereira served as the VP of Officiating for the NFL, transitioning from on-the-field officiating after 14 years (1996-2010) officiating on Sundays. Pereira spent 14 years officiating college football games, nine years in the Big West Conference (1982–90) and five years in the Western Athletic Conference (1991–95). In 1998, Pereira was promoted to NFL supervisor of officiating before becoming Director of Officiating for the NFL, and eventually Vice President of Officiating in 2004. Pereira retired from the NFL after the 2009 season.



2025 BIRMINGHAM STALLIONS




PAUL ROELL was officially named the second general manager of the Birmingham Stallions in January of 2025. Roell will oversee the entire organization's day-to-day operations, transactions and signings. Roell comes to the Magic City after most recently serving as a member of the college scouting staff of the USFL before the league's merger with the XFL before the start of the 2024 season. Before Roell transitioned into spring football, he served as a member of the scouting staff for the Reese's Senior Bowl in Mobile. Before his tenure with the Senior Bowl, Roell served as the Assistant Director for college scouting for the Jacksonville Jaguars from 2013-2020. During that span, the Jags claimed the 2017 AFC South title and made an AFC Championship Game appearance during that same campaign. Before that, Roell spent seven seasons (2006-2012) in Minneapolis as a regional scout for the Minnesota Vikings, saw the organization reach the playoffs on three separate occasions, including back-to-back NFC North titles in 2008 and 2009, and a trip to the NFC Championship Game. Roell's most extended stop in the NFL came from 1991-2005 as an area scout for the Indianapolis Colts. During Roell's tenure in Indy, the Colts claimed four division championships and eight playoff appearances. Roell was a member of the Colts' organization in 1998 when the franchise selected Hall of Fame quarterback Peyton Manning as the first overall pick in the 1998 NFL Draft.



COREY CHAMBLIN enters his second season as defensive coordinator for the Birmingham Stallions. This year will be his first full-time season as DC, as he was promoted to the position after the departure of John Chavis in May of last year. A native of the Magic City, Chamblin was born on May 29, 1977, in Birmingham and attended Ensley High School. Chamblin played collegiately at Tennessee Tech University, where he competed in 43 career games for the Golden Eagles, totaling 161 tackles, three interceptions, eight passes defended and two blocked punts. After going undrafted in the 1999 NFL Draft, Chamblin signed with the Baltimore Ravens but was waived just before the start of the 1999 season. Chamblin's longest tenure with any NFL team came with the Jacksonville Jaguars, where he spent the 1999 and 2000 seasons. Chamblin appeared in 11 total games for the Jags and blocked a punt in a divisional playoff game against the Miami Dolphins. Chamblin spent the next four seasons with the Green Bay Packers, Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Denver Broncos, Rhein Fire of the NFL Europa League and finally with the Indianapolis Colts. After being cut by the Colts in 2004, Chamblin transitioned to coaching. His coaching career began in 2006 as assistant defensive backs coach for the Frankfurt Galaxy; Chamblin stayed in international football for four more seasons as he made the transition to the Canadian Football League to work with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers and the Calgary Stampeders, serving as DBs coach for both organizations. After working one lone season as defensive coordinator for the Hamilton Tiger-Cats, Chamblin got his first head coaching position in 2012 with one of the more legendary franchises in CFL history, the Saskatchewan Roughriders. Chamblin and the Roughriders won the 2013 Grey Cup, 45-23 over the Tiger-Cats. After a single season with the Toronto Argonauts and the Arkansas Razorbacks in 2017 and 2018, Chamblin spent one season as the head coach in Toronto in 2019. Chamblin found his way back home to Birmingham in 2022 as defensive back coach for the 2022 USFL Champion Stallions. He then departed from the Stallions at the end of the year for one lone season to work for San Antonio Brahmas in 2023 and then returned to Birmingham to initially serve as DB coach before his promotion to defensive coordinator.






LESTER ERB is a native of Milton, Pennsylvania, and received his undergraduate degree in business administration from Bucknell and will be entering his first season at Co-OC for the Stallions in 2025. While at BU, Erb was a student-athlete and a standout wide receiver for the football team, and he set school records for touchdown receptions in a season and career. Furthermore, during his 1989 season, Erb registered 902 total receiving yards, ranking second-best all-time at Bucknell. Erb's first coaching stop was at Hobart College, where he worked with the receivers before heading to Syracuse for three seasons. While with the Orange, Erb assisted the offensive line and scout team units while earning a graduate degree in high educational administration. In 1997, Erb got his first chance in the NFL with the Baltimore Ravens, serving two years as an offensive quality control coach. After a one-year hiatus as the tight ends coach for the Army Black Knights, Erb headed to Iowa City to work for Kirk Ferentz one year after he took the head coaching job for the Hawkeyes. During his tenure, Erb spent 13 seasons on staff at lowa, working with the wide receivers, running backs and special teams. Highly regarded as one of the top recruiters in the country, Erb coached Shonn Greene to the Doak Walker Award and consensus All-American honors while being named the Offensive Player of the Year in the Big Ten Conference in 2008. During his 13 seasons at Iowa, the Hawkeyes won a share of two Big Ten Championships and finished in the final top 10 of both major polls four times. Erb spent the next seven seasons coaching at Nevada and Rutgers, working with running backs, tight ends and all special team units. Erb's final stop before heading to Birmingham was with the LSU Tigers of the SEC. While in Baton Rouge from 2022 to 2024, Erb served as a senior special teams analyst. In Erb's first season with the Bayou Bengals, punter, and Alabama native Jay Bramblett earned second-team Academic All-America honors as the Tigers claimed the Western Division title and an appearance in the SEC Championship. Coach Erb and his wife, Eileen, have four children. Sons, Jacob and A.J., and daughters, Emily and Sarah.



CHRIS BONIOL enters his second season as special teams coordinator for the Birmingham Stallions. Born on December 9, 1971, in Alexandria, Louisiana, Boniol was a standout placekicker and catcher for Alexandria Senior High School. Boniol elected to stay in-state for college, playing at Louisiana Tech University. He finished his collegiate career third on the school's all-time scoring list and won or tied five games in the final seconds with made field goals during his career with the Bulldogs. Boniol was honored in 2018 by La Tech, being named one of the greatest 50 players in school history. Upon going undrafted in the 1994 NFL Draft, Boniol signed with the Dallas Cowboys and made 22-of-29 (75.9%) field goal attempts during the 1994 season, setting a rookie franchise record for field goal percentage in a single season. After an injury-filled campaign in 1995, Boniol returned to full strength the following season and had one of the best statistical years by any NFL kicker in history. Boniol connected on 27 consecutive field goals during the '96 season, including seven made field goals in a primetime matchup against the Green Bay Packers on Monday Night Football. He was named NFC Special Teams Player of the Week twice in 1996, marking the first time anyone had won the award multiple times in a season. Boniol finished the 1996 season with 32 made field goals and became the first Cowboys' kicker to have three consecutive 100-point seasons. Boniol spent the next three seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles, Cleveland Browns and the Chicago Bears. Boniol played six years in the NFL and finished his career making 128-of-163 field goals and 183-of-189 extra points for 567 total points. Boniol's coaching career began in 2010 with the team that gave him his first shot in the NFL. In his four seasons coaching for Dallas, Boniol primarily worked with the kickers and punters. Boniol was credited with signing Pro Bowl kicker Dan Bailey in 2011. After brief stints with the Oakland Raiders, Louisiana College Wildcats and the Mississippi State Bulldogs, Boniol returned to professional coaching to serve as the specialists coach for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 2019-2022. Boniol assisted Special Teams Coordinator Keith Armstrong and was a part of the organization when the Bucs won Super Bowl LV over the Kansas City Chiefs. Boniol joins a select group of individuals that have won a Super Bowl title as a player and then later as a coach, as he won Super Bowl XXX when he was with Dallas.





RON BURTON enters his first season with the Birmingham Stallions in 2025. Burton will lead the defensive line this season and brings over 30 years of coaching experience to an already talented and determined coaching staff. Born on May 2, 1964, in Highland Springs, Virginia, Burton attended Highland Springs High School, where he was an allstate, all-district, and all-regional outside linebacker. Upon his college decision, Burton accepted a full scholarship to play for Coach Dick Crum at the University of North Carolina from 1982 to 1986. While in Chapel Hill, Burton was a four-year letterman and finished his collegiate career with 161 total tackles and 15 sacks. Voted as team captain in 1986, Burton helped the Tar Heels reach three consecutive bowl games in his time at UNC. Burton went undrafted coming out of college but was signed as an undrafted free agent by the Dallas Cowboys after the 1987 NFL Draft. Burton played for four seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys, Phoenix Cardinals and the Los Angeles Raiders before retiring from his playing days. His best season in the league came in 1988, in his second year with Dallas, where he registered 74 total tackles, two sacks, five passes defended, and a forced fumble, serving as one of the starting outside linebackers for the Cowboys that season. After being released in the summer of 1991, Burton transitioned to coaching, working as a graduate assistant at his alma mater for the 1992 and 1993 seasons under Mack Brown.

Furthermore, Burton's coaching career spans almost every Division I college football level, as Burton has made coaching stops at Morehead State, Eastern Michigan, Indiana, Grand Valley State and Air Force. One of the more notable coaching positions that Burton has held was from 2013 to 2021 as defensive line coach for the Michigan State Spartans. While in East Lansing, Burton was a part of the 2013 Big Ten and Rose Bowl Championships for the Spartans. After one lone season coaching the defensive line at Miami (OH), Burton spent the 2023 and 2024 seasons as assistant head coach and defensive line coach for the Tulsa Golden Hurricane of the American Athletic Conference. This season will be Burton's first year coaching at the professional level.



DARIC RILEY enters his third season as linebackers coach for the Birmingham Stallions in 2025. A native of Beaufort, South Carolina, Riley brings a multitude of success and knowledge to Corey Chamblin's defense. Riley graduated from Charleston Southern University in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in psychology and physical education. A three-year letterman at Charleston Southern, Riley got his first coaching job at CSU, working as a graduate assistant and then serving as outside linebackers coach. Riley's next big coaching stop after working at smaller universities nationwide was with the Clemson Tigers from 2007 to 2010. Riley served as a defensive GA under Tommy Bowden and Dabo Swinney while at Clemson. After working for one season at Jacksonville State for Bill Clark in 2013, Riley followed Coach Clark to Birmingham to coach special teams and outside linebackers during the 2014 UAB season that saw the Blazers reach bowl eligibility for the first time in 10 years. Riley returned to UAB's coaching staff in 2020 after brief stints at SMU, East Carolina, and Old Dominion. Coach Clark brought back Riley to coach UAB's corners and serve as Director of Player Relations from 2020 to 2022. The one-time USFL and UFL champ looks to build upon a talented linebacker core for the Stallions this season.





WES SMITH enters his first season as assistant defensive backs coach for the Birmingham Stallions. A native of Kannapolis, North Carolina, Smith earned a bachelor's degree from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte in 2016. While in school at Charlotte, Smith spent time on the rosters for the football and baseball teams for the 49ers. He began his coaching career at Missouri Baptist University as a graduate assistant for the 2016 season. In his lone season at MBU, Smith coached the defensive line, assisted in recruiting operations and coordinated the team's video. Smith returned to his alma mater in 2017 to coach Charlotte's defensive line and linebacker units. He would coach in Charlotte for two seasons before heading up the road to Boone, North Carolina, to coach linebackers at Appalachian State. During that 2019 campaign, Appalachian State finished the year with a record of 13-1 and a Sun Belt Conference and New Orleans Bowl title under current Missouri Head Coach Eli Drinkwitz. The 2025 season will not be his first time coaching in the Magic City, as Smith was on staff for the UAB Blazers during the 2020 and 2021 seasons. While in Birmingham working for Bill Clark, Smith coached linebackers and helped the Blazers win the 2021 Independence Bowl and the 2020 Conference USA Championship. His two final stops before returning to Birmingham to coach for the Stallions were with Wake Forest in 2022 and 2023 and then with Albany State during the 2024 season.



MIKE JONES enters his fourth season as wide receivers coach for the Birmingham Stallions. Coach Jones brings a wealth of football knowledge and a résumé full of notable accolades and accomplishments. Born on April 14, 1960, in Chattanooga, Tennessee, Jones attended and graduated from Riverside High School and elected to play his college ball at Tennessee State University. After playing at TSU, Jones went on to play in the NFL for seven seasons from 1983 to 1989. Drafted in the sixth round with the 159th overall pick in the 1983 NFL Draft, Jones began his professional career with the Minnesota Vikings, where he would spend his first three seasons in the NFL before heading south to play for the New Orleans Saints, then the Kansas City Chiefs. In Jones' final professional season in 1989, he began the year with the New England Patriots before heading back down to NOLA to finish the season with the Saints. In his seven-year career in the NFL, Jones registered 165 receptions for 2,372 yards and 11 touchdowns. Jones started professional coaching in 1998 with the Rhein Fire of the World League of American Football, serving as receivers coach for three seasons. After one year with the Orlando Rage of the XFL in 2001 as wide receivers coach, Jones returned to Europe to serve as OC for the Rhein Fire in 2002 and 2003, making World Bowl appearances in both seasons. His stellar tenure with the Fire earned him the chance to become head coach of the Frankfurt Galaxy in 2004. Over his four seasons as head coach for the Galaxy, Jones guided the team to three World Bowl appearances and the World Bowl XIV Championship in 2006. After one season working in the CFL with the Toronto Argonauts, Jones returned to his college alma mater as offensive coordinator for Tennessee State from 2010 to 2014. Before joining the Stallions organization in 2022, his three coaching stops were with Lake Minneola High School in Florida and East Central Community College in Mississippi. The two-time USFL and onetime UFL Champ looks to build upon his already astounding coaching career in 2025.




DAVE DEGUGLIELMO OFFENSIVE LINE

DAVE DEGUGLIELMO enters his second season as offensive line coach for the Birmingham Stallions. The two-time Super Bowl and one-time UFL champ looks to build upon his impressive coaching résumé. DeGuglielmo was born on July 15, 1968, in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and attended Lexington High School, where he was a two-way player on the offensive and defensive line for LHS, where he won two Middlesex League Championships and played for the Division I Super Bowl Championship against nationally ranked Brockton High School. After a stand-out prep career, DeGuglielmo elected to stay in-state for college and attended Boston University from 1986 to 1990. After initially walking on to the football team and being redshirted in '86, DeGuglielmo lettered for the next four seasons at BU and earned the right to become team captain in 1990. While in college, DeGuglielmo played for future NFL coaches Chris Palmer and Tony Sparano. Playing guard and center for the Terriers, DeGuglielmo was a first-team All-New England selection and a two-time Academic All-Yankee Conference participant. DeGuglielmo's coaching career spans nearly every level of collegiate and professional football, as the veteran offensive line coach began his coaching career as a GA at nearby Boston College for the 1991 and 1992 seasons. "Coach Guge" would stay in college coaching until 2003, making stops at Boston University, Connecticut, and South Carolina and before heading to the Big Apple in 2004 to become the assistant offensive line coach for Tom Coughlin and the New York Giants, where he would be a part of winning Super Bowl XLII over the New England Patriots. His career would lead him to be the OL coach for the Miami Dolphins, New York Jets and the Patriots from 2009 to 2015. After serving one lone season in 2016 as the assistant OL coach for the San Diego Chargers, Coach Guge went on to lead the OL for the Dolphins once again, the Indianapolis Colts, back to Miami and then with the New York Giants during the COVID season in 2020. In 2021, Coach Guge made his return to college coaching for the first time in 18 years when he headed to Ruston, Louisiana, to coach the offensive line for Skip Holtz at Louisiana Tech, renewing the relationship between the two. Holtz's and DeGuglielmo's paths would cross again in February of last year when the Stallions were on the hunt for a new offensive line coach, and Holtz brought DeGuglielmo to the Magic City.

Under the leadership of head coach Skip Holtz, the Stallions continued their dominance from the USFL, finishing with nine wins in ten games leading to the USFL Conference title and a spot in the inaugural UFL Championship Game.

The UFL Championship Game pitted the Stallions against the San Antonio Brahmas, where Birmingham achieved the first and only shutout of the UFL season, winning 25-0. Led by UFL MVP Adrian Martinez, the Stallions' top-rated offense found its rhythm late in the second quarter, scoring on three consecutive possessions leading to the dominant win. This victory not only secured Birmingham's first UFL championship but also solidified their status as a football dynasty with three consecutive spring football championships.

Under head coach Skip Holtz, the Stallions finished the regular season with an 8-2 record, securing the top spot in the South Division. Driven by a balanced offensive attack with quarterback Alex McGough at the helm, the Stallions showcased a strong rushing game and a resilient defense throughout the regular and post seasons. McGough's ability to extend plays and make clutch throws was a key factor in the team's consistent success, earning him the league's MVP Award.

In the postseason, their dominance continued as the Stallions defeated the New Orleans Breakers in the South Division
Championship before facing the Pittsburgh Maulers in the USFL Championship Game. The Stallions controlled the title game from start to finish, winning 28-12 to clinch their second consecutive USFL championship with McGough being named Championship Game MVP. With back-to-back title wins, Birmingham further solidified itself as the premier franchise in the USFL.

The Birmingham Stallions were the story of the 2022 revival season of the United States Football League (USFL), finishing with a 9-1 regular season record, the best in the league, and serving as the host hub for all eight teams. Lead by head coach Skip Holtz, the Stallions excelled on both offense and defense throughout the season. The team was led on the field by quarterback J'Mar Smith and playmakers like wide receiver Marlon Williams and runningback Bo Scarbrough. The Stallions' defense was a force, led by standout performances from linebackers Scooby Wright and DeMarquis Gates. Their dominant play throughout the season earned them a spot in the USFL Championship Game where they beat the Philadelphia Stars 33-30. The win was the first milesone in a spring football dynasty. The game was marked by an electrifying fourth-quarter comeback, with J'Mar Smith leading the way in a crucial drive that sealed their victory. The Stallions' resilience and ability to execute in high-pressure moments highlighted their season-long strength and solidified their place as the premier team in the inaugural USFL season, catapulting them as the face of the revived USFL.



BRANDON AUBREY: DALLAS COWBOYS KICKER

2023 STALLIONS - USFL CHAMPION | 2022 STALLIONS - USFL CHAMPION

A native of Plano, Texas, Aubrey began his professional career as a soccer player for the Toronto FC of Major League Soccer. Despite never having played organized football, he was drafted by the Birmingham Stallions in the 2022 USFL Draft and played in all 10 regular season games, finishing the 2022 season 21-of-27 (77.8%) on field goals, and earning a place on the All-USFL team. In 2023, Aubrey improved on all statistical categories from his rookie campaign, finishing the season 16-of-17 on field goals and a perfect 35-of-35 on extra points. He was integral in helping the Stallions claim back-to-back USFL Championships. Days after the season ended, Aubrey signed with the Dallas Cowboys. During his time in the NFL, he has been named a First Team All-Pro (2023), a two-time Pro Bowler (2023, 2024), NFL scoring leader (2023) and holds the record for the longest field goal made in Cowboys history, a 65-yarder against the Baltimore Ravens last season. In his 35 NFL games, Aubrey has connected on 77-of-86 field goals and 80-of-84 extra points, totaling 311 points in only two years in the NFL.



KEVIN AUSTIN JR.: NEW ORLEANS SAINTS RECEIVER

2024 STALLIONS - UFL CHAMPION

A 2024 UFL champ, Kevin Austin Jr., provided a consistent and reliable option for Matt Corral and Adrian Martinez throughout the Stallions' run to a UFL title. Playing in all 10 regular season games, making eight starts, Austin Jr. finished last season with 15 receptions for 253 yards and two touchdowns. Austin Jr. posted a career-high 108 yards receiving and a touchdown on May 4 of last season against Memphis. One day after his contract with the Stallions was terminated, he agreed to a one-year deal with the New Orleans Saints. After multiple injuries to the Saints' receiver room through last season, Austin Jr. was promoted to the active roster for the first time in a Week 10 matchup against the Atlanta Falcons. Throughout last season with New Orleans, Austin Jr. hauled in 11 receptions for 151 yards while adding one lone rush for nine. Austin Jr.'s first run in the NFL came as an undrafted free agent with the Jacksonville Jaguars. He was waived after the preseason and transitioned into spring football after spending his entire rookie season in 2022 on the practice squad.

KHALIL DAVIS: SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS DEFENSIVE TACKLE

2024 STALLIONS - UFL CHAMPION

The twin brother of current Stallions defensive tackle Carlos Davis, Khalil Davis, proved vital to the defensive front during the 2023 season. Totaling 29 total tackles and a sack during the regular season, Davis' standout play led the defensive unit to back-to-back titles and a stifling performance in the USFL Championship Game against the Pittsburgh Maulers. The Stallions defense only allowed 98 yards rushing in the title game. Once the season concluded, the Stallions front office agreed to release Davis from his contract to allow him to sign with an NFL team. The Houston Texans added Davis to the practice squad a few weeks before training camp in 2023. Over the next two seasons in H-Town, Davis appeared in 24 games, registered 41 tackles, three sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery. On November 5, 2024, Houston traded Davis to the San Francisco 49ers for a seventh-round pick. In his three games played this past season with San Francisco, Davis brought down three total tackles. Recent success or even a career in the NFL is no stranger to Davis, as the Blue Springs, Missouri native was drafted by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2020, appearing in two games and earning a Super Bowl ring after the Bucs defeated the Kansas City Chiefs in Super Bowl LV. His prior stops before his lone season in the Magic City were with the Indianapolis Colts and Pittsburgh Steelers, a second stint with Tampa Bay, and then a few weeks with the Los Angeles Rams.

JONATHAN GARVIN: SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS DEFENSIVE END

2024 STALLIONS - UFL CHAMPION

Jonathan Garvin spent one season with the Birmingham Stallions and helped the franchise claim the UFL Championship last year. In all 12 games last season, Garvin totaled 28 tackles and 5.5 sacks for the Stallions' defense. After being selected in the seventh round of the 2020 NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers, Garvin spent three seasons in Green Bay and appeared in 38 games for the Packers, making one start. Throughout the 2020, 2021 and 2022 seasons, Garvin registered 32 tackles, 1.5 sacks and a pair of passes defended. Green Bay released Garvin a few weeks before the start of training camp in 2023, leading him to the Stallions last season. Fast forward to the UFL offseason this past summer, Garvin's contract was terminated to allow him the opportunity to sign with an NFL franchise. The San Francisco 49ers agreed to a deal with Garvin, signing him to the practice squad for the 2024 season. Both parties agreed to a reserve/future deal to keep Garvin on the roster for the 2025 season.

2024 STALLIONS - UFL CHAMPION | 2024 UFL MVP


In just one lone season with the Stallions, Adrian Martinez left a lasting impact on the organization and the league with all his on-field accomplishments. In 2024 Martinez claimed the UFL MVP, All-UFL team and won the 2024 UFL Championship while taking home the game's MVP honors. Making his way to Birmingham after a stint with the Detroit Lions, Martinez exploded onto the scene, throwing for 1,750 yards, 15 touchdowns, an completed 134-of-229 passes while also leading the UFL with 528 rushing yards and three touchdowns. Martinez's ability to escape the pocket and extend plays with his athleticism led Birmingham to its third-straight league title. The New York Jets signed Martinez and designated him a spot on the practice squad. The Nebraska and Kansas State alum signed a reserve/future contract with the Jets in January and Martinez looks to compete for the starting quarterback job under first-year Head Coach Aaron Glenn.




DONDREA TILLMAN: DENVER BRONCOS DEFENSIVE END

2023 STALLIONS - USFL CHAMPION | 2024 STALLIONS - UFL CHAMPION

A charter member with the Stallions, Dondrea Tillman led Birmingham to three straight championships, amassing 108 tackles and 12.5 sacks to anchor the Stallions defense. In postseason play Tillman registered 16 total tackles and four sacks. Four days after earning the UFL Championship game, Tillman signed with the Denver Broncos and spent the first two games of the 2024 season on the practice squad. After an active roster spot opened up due to an injury on the Broncos, Tillman took full advantage of his first snaps in the NFL and ended up playing in 12 regular season games last year. In his debut in Week 3 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Tillman picked up a pair of sacks. Throughout those 12 games, Tillman brought down 23 total tackles and five sacks. His standout play in the regular season earned him a spot on the Broncos' playoff roster against league MVP Josh Allen and the Buffalo Bills in the AFC Wild Card. Despite coming up short, Tillman excelled in his playoff debut, totaling seven tackles and being a constant force and disruption in Buffalo's backfield all game. In March of this year, the Broncos assigned his exclusive-rights free agent tender that keeps him on contract through the 2025 season.
