Series Notes: The St. Louis Battlehawks will welcome the Arlington Renegades to The Dome at America's Center at 7 p.m. CT on Friday for a rematch following the Week 4 game where the Battlehawks fell to the Renegades, 30-15. St. Louis is 3-2 all-time against Arlington, taking the first three meetings between the teams and then dropping the last two.

### DOMESWEET DOME

The St. Louis Battlehawks conclude their two game homestand vs the Arlington Renegades at The Dome at America's Center on Friday, May 2 at 7 p.m. CT. The game will be broadcast on FOX.

The Battlehawks won all five of their regular season home games last season and are 13-3 all-time inside "The BattleDome". Thus far, St. Louis is 2-1 this season in the Dome. They will host six home games throughout their 10-week schedule in 2025, returning next for a Week 8 contest against the Birmingham Stallions on Saturday, May 17 at 12 p.m. CT on FOX.

### MICHIGAN-ST. LOUIS CONNECTIONS

SS Kameron Kelly played at nearby Wylie High School after being born in Round Rock, Texas. DE Pita Taumoepeu was born in the Dallas suburb of Euless, Texas, but moved to the Polynesian country of Tonga when he was 3 months old. QB Trae Self grew up in North Richland Hills, TX.

Safety Nico Bolden was with the Battlehawks in 2024.

### GETTING THE BAND BACK TOGETHER

The Battlehawks have 31 players on their roster who were with the organization a year ago, including five players who were All-UFL honorees: WR Hakeem Butler, RB Jacob Saylor, OT Jaryd Jones-Smith and C Mike Panasiuk on offense; ILB Willie Harvey on defense.

Head Coach Anthony Becht is also back for a third season, with six members of his coaching staff returning. Wide Receivers Coach Phil McGeoghan will also be taking up the mantle of Offensive Coordinator. Defensive Coordinator Donnie Abraham, Defensive Line Coach La'Roi Glover, Linebackers Coach Chris Claiborne, Special Teams Coordinator and Running Backs Coach Kyle Caskey and Secondary Martin Bayless all return in their same roles.

They are joined by Offensive Line Coach Marc Colombo and Quarterbacks Coach Seneca Wallace. Colombo signed on as Offensive Coach after serving in the same role for the Dallas Cowboys and New York Giants. Colombo is also a former first round pick in 2002 by the Chicago Bears. Colombo played in nine NFL seasons with Chicago, Dallas, and the Miami Dolphins. Seneca Wallace will also join the staff, taking on the Quarterback Coach role. A fourth round selection by Seattle in the 2003 NFL Draft, Wallace spent ten seasons with the Seahawks, Cleveland Browns, and Green Bay Packers.

### TEACH ME HOW TO DUGGAN

QB Max Duggan started his first game of the season Week 5 vs Michigan, leading the team to a 32-27 victory. Duggan recorded two rushing touchdowns, tying QB Manny Wilkins for the most rushing touchdowns in a single game by a Battlehawks quarterback in team history. He tallied three total touchdowns responsible for, T-2nd in the UFL in a single game this season tied with D.C.'s Jordan Ta'amu's Week 3 performance in STL and trailing Ta'amu's four from D.C.'s game at Arlington this past weekend.

Duggan finished with 70 rushing yards over 10 attempts and 9-12 (75%) pass completion rate for 124 yards. His 75% completion rate is his highest since a 75.9% (22-29) with TCU at SMU in 2022. He completed two passes to WR Hakeem Butler for a team-high 67-yard and a 57-yard touchdown reception, the third longest pass this season by a Battlehawks. The 67-yarder was his longest pass since a 76-yard pass when TCU played Michigan in the 2022 Fiesta Bowl.

### THE MAIN ATTRACTION

Battlehawks fans topped their own record in their 2024 home opener April 6 with a crowd of 40,317 at The Dome at America's Center for a 27-24 victory against the Arlington Renegades. The mark set the record for a modern professional spring football game, topping the 38,310 fans St. Louis drew for its 2023 home opener on March 12, 2023, in a 24-11 Week 4 win over Arlington.

The Battlehawks welcomed 171,825 fans through the gates at The Dome through their five regular-season home games in 2024 for a league-high average attendance of 34,365.

## WEEK 1 RECAP

The Battlehawks began their 2025 campaign with a 31-6 win over the Houston Roughnecks Friday at TDECU Stadium in Houston, Texas. The 25 point margin ties the largest margin of victory in Battlehawks history, matching Orlando in Week 10 of 2023. St. Louis recorded 460 total yards, the second most for a single game in UFL history, trailing Birmingham's 466 total yards at Memphis in Week 6 of 2024. The team also logged 273 rushing yards, a new UFL record, surpassing Birmingham's 213 in Week 5 of 2024 at Houston.

FS Qwynnterio Cole started the season off with an interception on the STL 44 from Houston's first pass attempt of the contest, spurring an explosive second possession by St. Louis. RB Jacob Saylor logged 37 of his 98 rushing yards over the possession, including a 21 yard rush on 2nd and 10 at the HOU 36. Saylor rushed for 4 yards to score the first Battlehawks touchdown of the 2025 season.

The Battlehawks entered halftime with an 18-0 lead on Houston, the second largest halftime lead in team history, behind only a 23-3 advantage over New York during Week 3 of the 2020 XFL season. St. Louis has held Houston scoreless in 6 of their last 8 quarters against them, including a scoreless first half in each of their last two meetings.

Head Coach Anthony Becht started off the 4th quarter by using his Super Challenge on QB Manny Wilkins' pass intended for WR Hakeem Butler which was called incomplete. St. Louis challenged for pass interference and the play was overturned, putting the ball on the 1-yard line for 1st and Goal. The Roughnecks lost their Super Challenge in the fourth quarter, challenging QB Nolan Henderson's incomplete pass intended for WR Emmanuel Butler. The call was upheld.

QB Max Duggan took over for Wilkins with 7:15 left in the fourth quarter. Duggan handed off the ball to RB Jarveon Howard on the second play of the possession, leading to a 74 yard rushing touchdown, the longest run in UFL history. Howard totaled 115 rushing yards on 13 attempts, a new Battlehawks single-game rushing record.

Houston scored its first and only touchdown of the contest with a 5-yard pass to WR Justin Hall in the fourth quarter. Following the touchdown, Houston elected to take the ball on 4th and 12 to retain possession. The four play drive resulted in a loss of 13 yards, turning the ball back over to St. Louis.

## WEEK 2 RECAP

The St. Louis Battlehawks took down the San Antonio Brahmas, 26-9, at the Dome at America's Center in front of 32,115 fans for the team's home opener. The Battlehawks (2-0) allowed fewer than 10 points for two consecutive weeks for the first time in franchise history and lead the league in total points scored with 57 points over the first two weeks. RB Jacob Saylor set the single-game team record and tied the UFL record with three rushing touchdowns, rushing for 46 yards over 11 attempts.

The Battlehawks controlled the first half of play behind a pair of rushing touchdowns by Saylor while outgaining the Brahmas (0-2) in the first 30 minutes of play 192-135. Saylor delivered the Battlehawks' first touchdown of the game on a 20-yard rush with 11:04 to play before halftime to complete a seven-play drive that covered 61 yards. He also rumbled five yards into the end zone for the ensuing two-point conversion to give St. Louis an 11-0 lead.

WR Gary Jennings Jr. hauled in the longest pass play of the season for St. Louis on a 58-yard reception from QB Manny Wilkins in the second quarter. Saylor then found the end zone again on a 1-yard rush with 3:21 left in the second quarter to run the Battlehawks' advantage to 17-0. The Battlehawks entered halftime with a 17-3 lead, following a field goal by Brahmas K Donald De La Haye as time expired on the first half.

In the 3rd quarter, Saylor went on to record his 3rd rushing touchdown of the contest with a 5-yard run to give the Battlehawks a 23-3 lead with 7:41 left in the third quarter. Saylor has scored a touchdown in five of his last six regular-season games played dating back to 2024 Week 7 at Birmingham. Saylor has four touchdowns this season and led the UFL with eight total touchdowns in 2024.

The team recorded 4.0 sacks to tie the franchise single-game record. LB Travis Feeney tallied his first sack of the season. Feeney and LB Pita Taumoepeu tied for the team lead with 5.0 sacks in 2024 while Feeney led the team in 2023. DT Austin Faoliu and FS Nate Meadors each notched the first sacks of their Battlehawks careers, as well.

The Battlehawks extended their regular-season home winning streak to seven games dating back to 2023 XFL Week 9 vs. Seattle and are 11-2 all-time in regular-season play at the Dome.





## WEEK 3 RECAP

The St. Louis Battlehawks fell to the D.C. Defenders, 27-15, at the Dome at America's Center in front of 30,014 fans for the team's first loss of the season. The Battlehawks (2-1) allowed 27 points, the most since Week 10 2023 vs Orlando.

Despite the loss, the Battlehawk's defense shined with a season-high 83 tackles (38 solo). St. Louis also produced seven pass breakups, three of which came from CB Chris Payton-Jones. WLB Olakunle Fatukasi and FS Nate Meadors each recorded a personal UFL game high. Fatukasi tallied nine tackles including three solo while Meadors tallied eight total tackles including five solo.

St. Louis started off the game by allowing 12 points in the first quarter, the most the team has allowed in the first quarter since 2023. D.C. accumulated a 62-yard touchdown reception and two field goals in the first quarter to make the score 12-0. The Defenders also picked up two turnovers with a fumble and interception from St. Louis QB Manny Wilkins in the first quarter.

The Battlehawks responded in the second quarter with a 32-yard touchdown reception Wilkins to WR Frank Darby on 3rd and 10 with 9:56 left on the clock in the first half, making the score 12-6. DB Kameron Kelly then picked up his first interception since Week 10 2024 vs San Antonio. K Rodrigo Blankenship went 2-2 on field goals to make the score 18-12 at the end of the first half.

CB Chris Payton-Jones picked up the second Battlehawks interception of the game for 9-yards, on D.C.'s first drive of the second half. That interception led to Blankenship's third field goal made. The 56-yarder set a new single-game career high for the kicker, beating out a 55-yard field goal from his time at The University of Georgia.

The Battlehawks snapped their regular-season home winning streak at seven games dating back to 2023 XFL Week 9 vs. Seattle and are 11-3 all-time in regular-season play at the Dome.

## WEEK 4 RECAP

The St. Louis Battlehawks fell to the Arlington Renegades, 30-15, at Choctaw Stadium in front of 9,614 fans. The defeat marked the first back-to-back losses in Battlehawks team history.

On the first drive of the contest, QB Manny Wilkins went down untouched while dropping back in the pocket, resulting in an Arlington fumble recovery and touchdown with a successful two-point conversion. Play was stopped following the Arlington touchdown and Wilkins was removed for an ankle injury with 12:25 left in the first quarter.

QB Max Duggan took the helm on the next drive, connecting at a 60% pass completion rate (6-10) for 48-yards and an interception through the first half. The team also racked up two fumbles in the first half, the second of which came from WR Blake Jackson's kick return leading to Arlington's second touchdown of the day.

St. Louis came back strong to start the second half, allowing Arlington only 17 yards over their first two drives. Arlington picked up a first down on their third drive, their first since the first quarter, before LB Willie Harvey recorded his first career interception for a 56-yard pick-six to make it a one-point game.

K Rodrigo Blankenship shined once again, going 3-3 in the contest, including two kicks over 50-yards. His first kick of the game was a 55-yarder, tying his 2nd longest career field goal from the University of Georgia and trailing his career-high 56-yard field goal from last week vs D.C.

Similarly, the Battlehawks Defense left their mark, allowing only 72 rushing yards and a 33% (4-12) third down conversion by Arlington. LB Chris Garrett recorded a sack during the fourth quarter, while DE Pita Taumopenu and DE Freedom Akinmoladun each added another sack in the following drive. Taumopenu leads the Battlehawks with 3.5 sacks on the season.

Despite the Battlehawks' efforts, Arlington picked up two more touchdowns, including a 100-yard pick-six from their own endzone with 33 seconds left on the clock, to lock in a 30-15 Arlington victory.



## WEEK 5 RECAP

The St. Louis Battlehawks triumphed over the Michigan Panthers, 32-27, at The Dome at America's Center in front of 30,406 fans. WR Hakeem Butler returned from injury to record two touchdown receptions, including a 67-yarder on his first reception of the season. QB Max Duggan recorded two rushing touchdowns to tie QB Manny Wilkins for the most by a Battlehawks quarterback in a single game.

The Battlehawks (3-2) scored first with a 44-yard field goal by K Rodrigo Blankenship after an eight play drive including 24 rushing yards by QB Max Duggan. The Panthers (3-2) responded with a 12-yard touchdown reception on the following drive to make the score 6-3. St. Louis' defense tallied 17 tackles through the first quarter with CB Nate Meadors recording four solo tackles.

FS Lukas Denis recorded his second sack of the season on the first drive of the second quarter, taking down Michigan QB Bryce Perkins for a 7-yard loss on 2nd and 10. Michigan was not able to get a first down to finish the drive causing a turnover by downs. The Battlehawks took advantage of the field position, scoring their first touchdown of the game on a 1-yard rush by QB Max Duggan. The team recorded four first downs and 43 rushing yards over nine plays to put St. Louis back in the lead, 9-6.

Following the two minute warning, SS Kameron Kelly recorded an interception off Michigan QB Danny Etling for 37 interception return yards, the most by a Battlehawk this season. QB Max Duggan followed it up with a pass to TE Jake Sutherland for 20-yards. Duggan then scored his second rushing touchdown with an 8-yard run. He then returned to Sutherland for a successful pass play to complete a two-point conversion making the score 17-6 entering half time.

St. Louis started the second half with the ball, recording 34-yards over nine plays leading to a 28-yard field goal by Blankenship to increase the Battlehawks lead to 20-6. Michigan returned the favor, scoring two touchdowns early in the second half to put Michigan back in the lead, 21-20. Their first came in the third quarter on a 20-yard reception from Perkins to WR Turner Malik, paired with a successful two point conversion pass to TE Cole Hikutini. The other was a 5-yard rush by RB Toa Taua to start the fourth quarter and a successful one point conversion by RB Nate McCrary.

WR Hakeem Butler then made his triumphant return to the Battle-dome, catching a pass from Duggan for a 67-yard touchdown on his first reception of the season to restore the Battlehawks lead, 26-21. Butler's reception is his longest since an 80-yard touchdown reception from the fourth quarter of Week 5 last season vs the Defenders. Michigan then rushed for a 4-yard touchdown by Taua. Hakeem, however, then followed that up with another 57-yard touchdown reception from WR Blake Jackson on a reverse play to increase the Battlehawks lead to 32-27 with 6:21 left on the clock. Michigan was unable to respond, being forced into a turnover on downs, returning the ball to St. Louis with 1:53 left in the game and cementing a Battlehawks victory.

### RECENT TRANSACTIONS

The St. Louis Battlehawks picked up QB Brandon Silvers. Silvers spent the 2024 season with St. Louis and re-signed on April 22nd. He started eight games for Houston in the XFL in 2023, throwing for 1,551 yards and 13 touchdowns with a 59.5 completion percentage. He was also the starting quarterback for Seattle in the 2020 XFL.

Before spring football, Silvers spent time in the New York Jets organization in 2019 and was invited to New Orleans Saints rookie minicamp in 2018 after going undrafted in the 2018 NFL Draft.

Silvers played collegiately at Troy from 2014-17, setting an NCAA freshman record with a 70.5 completion rate in 2014. He finished his college career with a 27-21 record in 48 games while passing for 10,677 yards and 71 touchdowns.

## LEAVING IT ALL ON THE FIELD

The Battlehawks lead the UFL in scoring (119 points), rushing yards (730 yards/146 avg), rushing attempts (160) and are T-2nd in rushing first downs (35) with DC, trailing Michigan (39). They also rank 3rd in all-purpose yards (2,220) on the season.

St. Louis tops the league with 9 rushing touchdowns and ranks second in most touchdowns overall (13), trailing only Michigan (15).

Quarterbacks Max Duggan and Manny Wilkins have combined to provide the third best passing efficiency rating in the UFL (63, 63-100) and St. Louis ranks 2nd in passing yards per reception (12.0 yards).

The Battlehawks have also incurred the second fewest penalites of any team (26).

## RUN THAT BY ME AGAIN

WR Jahcour Pearson has returned a UFL-leading 14 punts for 179 yards to help put St. Louis on top of that category this season (16-199). “Peezy” has led the league in punt return yards for four consecutive weeks. He also holds the fourth longest punt return of the season at 26 yards from Week 1 at HOU.

WR Blake Jackson currently holds the 4th longest kickoff return of the season with his 41 yard return from Week 4 at Arlington. The Battlehawks claim two of the top six average kickoff return in the league as Jackson ranks fifth (24 avg. yards) and WR Gary Jennings ranks sixth (23.63 avg. yards).

## HAKEEM THE DREAM

WR Hakeem Butler made a splash in the Week 5 contest for his first game since Week 1. Butler now ranks second in UFL individual game highs with 124 recieving yards and first with two touchdown receptions.

Butler recorded a team-leading 67-yard touchdown reception from QB Max Duggan on his first reception of the season. Butler’s reception is his longest since an 80-yard touchdown reception from the fourth quarter of Week 5 last season vs the Defenders. He then followed that up with a 57-yard touchdown reception from WR Blake Jackson on a reverse play, the third longest reception of the season, to cement a win over Michigan.

Butler was named to the All-UFL Team Offense on June 5, 2024 and received UFL Offensive Player of the Year on June 7, 2024. He caught 45 passes during the regular season for a UFL-high 652 yards, which is also the franchise single-season record. Butler also ranked second in the league with a team-high five touchdown receptions for the season.

## RESPECT THE SPECS

K Rodrigo Blankenship has recorded a perfect 12/12 field goals made so far this season. He has the second most field goal points in the league (36) and is one of only two kickers in the UFL with a perfect record this season .

His 3rd quarter 56-yarder vs D.C. during Week 3 set a personal single-game high and is the longest field goal by any kicker this season. The following week at Arlington, he kicked a 55-yard field goal to also tie San Antonio's Donald De La Hayes for the 2nd longest field goals.

## FIRING ON ALL CYLINDERS

The Battlehawks defense continues to dominate through Week 5 of the 2025 UFL season. The team has allowed the fourth fewest yards per rushing attempt (4.16 yards). They also have the second lowest pass completion percentage allowed (54.9%) trailing Arlington (47.6%).

St. Louis has recorded 10 sacks, the third most in the league. Linebacker Pita Taumoepenu leads the Battlehawks with 3.5, which ranks fifth in the league.

The team ranks second in passes defended (34) with CB Chris Payton-Jones having the 2nd most (8) behind Arlington's CB Ajene Harris (11). Included in those passes defended are 27 breakups, the 3rd most of any team.

LB Willie Harvey's 56 yard interception return for a touchdown from Week 4 currently ranks as the fifth longest interception return while CB Chris Payton-Jones' 31 yard pick and return from Week 3 vs D.C. ranks 6th.

SS Kameron Kelly is T-1st with 3 others for the most interceptions (2). St. Louis also has the most interceptions (7) and interception return yards (129).

## PUNT IT LIKE ITS HOT

P Sterling Hofrichter has recorded the least amount of punts in the UFL this season (14). Despite this, Hofrichter ranks first in punting average (50.1 yards) and has the 4th longest punt of the season (63 yards). His punting average of 57 yards in Week 5 vs MICH set a new 2025 UFL single game punting average.

## WHAT MAKES US RULE

The UFL is using innovative rules during the 2025 season to deliver an exciting, fast-paced game.

The UFL has adopted the XFL's points after-touchdown options. Kickoffs will resemble the USFL's more traditional-style play, with a modification moving the kickoff line back to the 20-yard line.

Slight modifications have been made to the rules that overlapped, including alternate possession options in the fourth quarter. Both leagues implemented opportunities in 2023 for teams that are trailing or if the scores are tied. In 2024, the UFL offered a 4th-and-12 from the 28-yard line.

- **Points After Touchdown** - Teams will have three scrimmage play (run/pass) options following a touchdown:

2-yard line = 1 point for a successful try  
5-yard line = 2 points for a successful try  
10-yard line = 3 points for a successful try

- **Kickoffs** - Kickoffs will now start from the 30-yard line. The 10 remaining players on the kickoff team will line up at the receiving team's 40-yard line. The receiving team's set up zone will stretch from its 35-yard line to the 30-yard line and must have at least nine players in that zone. The landing zone will be from the receiving team's 20-yard line to the goal line. The ball must reach the landing zone or it will be spotted at the 40-yard line.
- **Other Kicking/Touchback Rules** - There will be two touchback spots: the 35-yard-line for balls kicked into the end zone and the 20-yard line for balls that hit in the landing zone and then enter the endzone. Onside kicks have been eliminated. The kickoff team will be able to retain possession of the ball with a fourth down and 12-yard scrimmage play from its own 28-yard line.
- **Alternate Possession Option** - While onside kicks are allowed at any time during the game, teams will have an alternate option to retain possession in the fourth quarter. If a team is tied or behind during the fourth quarter, it may elect to retain possession after a score with a 4th-and-12 from its own 28-yard line.
- **Two Forward Passes** - Teams will be allowed, as they were in both leagues last season, to throw two forward passes on one play. The ball cannot cross the line of scrimmage at any time prior to the second forward pass being thrown.
- **Catch Definition** - A completed catch or interception is defined as a player securing control of the ball prior to the ball touching the ground; and touching the ground inbounds with both feet or with any part of his body other than his hands.
- **Defensive Pass Interference** - Defensive pass interference will result in a 15-yard penalty or a spot foul if the foul occurred less than 15 yards downfield. Intentional defensive pass interference will result in a spot foul if it is beyond 15 yards downfield.
- **Replay Reviews** - Designated members of the officiating department may stop a game at any time before the ball is next legally put in play to review a play if the play is reviewable, there is reasonable evidence to believe an error was made in the initial ruling and it would have a direct, competitive impact on the game. These reviews will be made from a secure location separate from the site of the game. Any call or non-call related to player safety is also subject to review at any point during the game, as well as any officiating ruling in the last five minutes of the

fourth quarter or overtime that is obviously incorrect and will have a significant impact on the outcome of the game.

- **Coach Challenges** - Each coach may challenge any ruling, including fouls or potential fouls, provided the team has a timeout remaining. A successful challenge will not result in a loss of a timeout, while the timeout is lost if the challenge is unsuccessful. Each head coach will earn a second challenge if the first challenge is successful.
- **Overtime** - Overtime will consist of alternating attempts to score from the opponent's 5-yard line with no kicks allowed. It will be a best-of-three format or until a winner has been determined.

## HOW WE GOT HERE

The UFL announced its arrival Dec. 31, 2023, as a new spring football league formed from the XFL and USFL. The eight UFL teams are divided into conferences that represent the two former leagues.

The UFL then held a Dispersal Draft from Jan. 5-15, 2024, for the teams to acquire players from teams in the former leagues.

The Battlehawks have embarked on their fourth season of spring football. They were a member of the 2020 edition of the XFL that ceased operations after five games because of the COVID-19 pandemic, and they returned in 2023 to go 7-3, tying for the second-best record in the league and lead the XFL in attendance with 175,121 fans across five home games.

## CHAMPIONSHIP DOME

On April 13, 2025, the UFL announced the site as the host of the UFL Championship Game for a second consecutive year. The Championship Game presented by Underdog will be played at 7 p.m. CT on June 14, 2025. The game is scheduled to be broadcast on ABC and will feature the winners of the XFL and USFL conferences.

The Battlehawks will hold their six home games at The Dome at America's Center. The dome will feature new LED lighting and a new \$1 million turf system that is lighter and rolls up quicker.

The Dome was constructed in 1995 and hosted NFL games from 1995-2015. The Battlehawks are 10-3 franchise history at The Dome, including postseason games. They also hold the top 12 attendance marks in modern professional spring football history, highlighted by a record 40,317 fans at their 2024 home opener April 6 in a 27-24 win over the Arlington Renegades. St. Louis led the way in attendance in both the XFL in 2023 and UFL in 2024, averaging more than 34,000 fans per game each year.

A multi-purpose facility that has hosted a wide variety of events in its nearly three decades, The Dome also hosted the Battlehawks during the 2020 season. The team won both of its home games that season.





BUILDING THE BATTLEHAWKS

The Battlehawks compiled their 2025 roster through various means. 29 players in the organization are players from the 2024 team that went 7-3. 14 players will return for their third year with the Battlehawks. Two players, Nate Meadors and Lukas Denis, will rejoin the team after spending 2024 in the NFL. 18 players are new to the organization.

- The Battlehawks will enter the season with five players who earned All-UFL honors in 2024 as well as the 2024 UFL Offensive Player of the Year Hakeem Butler and Special Teams Player of the Year Chris Garrett.
- St. Louis kept five of its 12 selections from the 2024 UFL Dispersal Draft that was held Jan. 5-15, 2024. Four of those selections were former Seattle Sea Dragons (Cole, Jackson, Payton-Jones and Pearson), while C Dohnovan West played for the Vegas Vipers in 2023.
- Two of the Battlehawks' eight selections from the 2024 UFL Super Dispersal Draft on Jan. 15, 2024, made the final roster. OG Abdul Beecham played for the XFL's Orlando Guardians and S Kameron Kelly played for the XFL's San Antonio Brahmas.

## HEAD COACH ANTHONY BECHT

St. Louis Battlehawks Head Coach Anthony Becht returns for his third season after leading the team to a 7-3 record and the XFL Conference playoff game last year. In 2023, the Battlehawks also finished 7-3, which was tied for the second-best record in the XFL.

Selected in the first round (27th overall) by the New York Jets in the 2000 NFL Draft, Becht played 11 seasons at tight end in the NFL, also spending time with Tampa Bay, St. Louis, Arizona, and Kansas City. From 2000 to 2010, he played in 152 consecutive games - the third longest streak in the NFL over that time period behind only Brett Favre and Peyton Manning.

Following his playing career, Becht worked as a college football analyst for ESPN and hosted the New York Jets pregame show before being promoted to their radio color analyst in 2024. He also coached Tight Ends in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl before accepting the same position with the San Diego Fleet of the Alliance of American Football in 2018.

A graduate of West Virginia, Becht was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in 2024. He received the John Russell Award and was named the Mountaineer's Most Valuable Player in 1999. Becht also served as a Trust Captain for the NFLPA Trust from 2015-20 and remains Legends Community Southeast Coordinator.

## GENERAL MANAGER DAVE BOLLER

Dave Boller, entering his third season with the St. Louis Battlehawks, brings 19 years of NFL front office and scouting experience to the role of General Manager. The former Assistant Pro Director for the Detroit Lions, Boller also worked as a scout for the St. Louis Rams, Philadelphia Eagles, Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and New York Jets.

In 2019, he served as General Manager for the San Diego Fleet in the AAF. In the collegiate ranks, Boller transitioned from Director of Recruiting Operations to Director of Player Personnel at Syracuse after previously working in recruiting at Louisville. A graduate of Arizona State, Boller began his athletics career as the Director of Operations for the Sun Devils in 1985.
