# ABOUT THE UFL

The United Football League (UFL) is the premier professional spring football league, powered by the visionary leadership and investment of Mike Repole and Impact Capital, RedBird Capital Partners, FOX, Dany Garcia, Dwayne Johnson, and ESPN. Built on innovation, accessibility, and competitive excellence, the UFL delivers the most engaging professional football experience in the world—for both players and fans. The league features eight teams: the Birmingham Stallions, Columbus Aviators, Dallas Renegades, DC Defenders, Houston Gamblers, Louisville Kings, Orlando Storm, and St. Louis Battlehawks.

## UFL RULES - HIGHLIGHTS

**The United Football League (UFL) has adopted a number of innovative rules from both previous leagues to deliver an exciting, fast-paced game with plenty of action.**

### Four-Point Field Goal

Field goals of 60 yards or longer are worth four points instead of three.

### Points After Touchdown (PAT) Options

- ★ 1 point: 33-yard field goal
- ★ 2 points: Run/pass from the 2-yard line
- ★ 3 points: Run/pass from the 8-yard line

### One Foot In Bounds

Only one foot in bounds is required for a legal catch (NCAA-style rule).

### Half-Distance Penalties

Red Zone penalties will be enforced as half the distance to the goal, consistent with NFL standards.

### Elimination of the Tush Push

The “Tush Push” quarterback sneak — where teammates push the QB forward immediately after the snap — is not allowed.

### No Punting Inside the 50

- ★ Teams cannot punt once the ball is inside the opponent's 49-yard line or closer.
- ★ If the ball is made ready inside the 50, a later penalty cannot restore punting eligibility.
- ★ Teams may punt at exactly the 50-yard line.
- ★ This restriction does not apply after the two-minute warning of either half.

### Overtime Format

- ★ Teams alternate plays from the 5-yard line.
- ★ Each team gets three attempts.
- ★ If still tied, alternating attempts continue until a winner is decided.
- ★ A coin toss determines first choice (offense or defense).

### Coin Toss Procedure

- ★ Used at the start of the game and before overtime.
- ★ The visiting team calls heads or tails.
- ★ The winner chooses possession or direction.

### New Kickoff Rules

- ★ *Kickoff Line*: The ball will be kicked off from the 30-yard line.
- ★ *Kickoff Team*: The 10 remaining players on the kickoff team will line up at the receiving team's 45-yard line (Previously, the kickoff team lined up at the 40-yard line).
- ★ *Receiving Team Zone*: The receiving team's set up zone will stretch from its 40-yard line to the 35-yard line and must have at least nine players in that zone. (Previously, it was the 35-yard line to the 30-yard line.)
- ★ *Landing Zone*: The landing zone will be from the receiving team's 20-yard line to the goal line. The ball must reach the landing zone or it will be spotted at the 40-yard line.
- ★ *Out of Bounds*: If the ball travels out of bounds, it will be spotted at the 40-yard line.
- ★ *Touchback Spots*: There will be two touchback spots – the 40-yard line for balls kicked into the end zone, and the 20-yard-line for balls that hit in the landing zone and then enter the endzone. (Previously, it was the 35-yard line for balls kicked into the end zone).

## UFL-TO-NFL SUCCESS STORIES

Overall, 65 players from the past two United Football League seasons, along with alumni from the modern era of spring football (2020–present), earned spots on NFL 53-man rosters or were added to practice squads during the 2025 NFL season. The continued presence of spring football talent at the next level highlights the UFL's growing role as a legitimate developmental pathway to the NFL.

Among those success stories, UFL kickers have been particularly impactful, translating their spring league opportunities into standout performances on NFL special teams units. Several have quickly established themselves as reliable options at the professional level, with a few even emerging as breakout contributors for their teams. Those standout kickers are highlighted below:

### BRANDON AUBREY



Aubrey connected on 36-of-42 field goal attempts this past season and was 11-of-17 from 50+ yards, which was tied for the most in the league.

Aubrey made NFL history in Week Seven, connecting on a 61-yard field goal to become the first player with five made field goals of 60-plus-yards. In Week Two, he became the first kicker in NFL history to convert a game-tying field goal with no time remaining and a game-winning field goal with no time remaining in overtime in the same game.

### JAKE BATES



Bates connected on 27-of-34 field goal attempts this past season and converted 54-of-56 extra point attempts, totaling 135 points in 17 games. His 59-yard field goal marked his longest of the season, and he finished the year.

Bates also showed his range throughout the season, converting 4-of-9 attempts from 50+ yards while remaining perfect on all kicks under 40 yards.

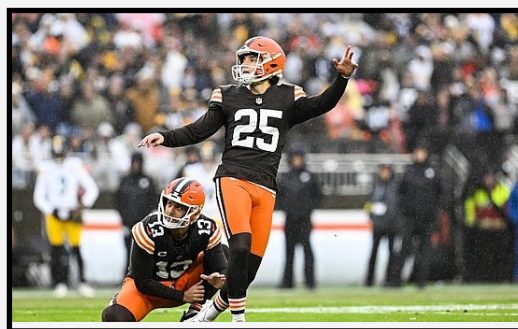
### HARRISON MEVIS



Mevis was promoted from the Rams' practice squad for Weeks 10 and 11 before earning a spot on the active roster in Week 12. He made an immediate impact, hitting field goals from 52 and 40 yards.

Through nine NFL games, he has successfully converted all 39 of his extra-point attempts and has gone 12-for-13 on field goals.

### ANDRE SZMYT



Szmyt converted on 24-of-27 field goal attempts (5-of-6 from 50-plus yards) this season. He earned AFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors in Week Three after hitting a 55-yard walk-off field goal, then closed the season by converting a game-winning 49-yard kick as time expired in the Browns win last week.

Szmyt still holds the Battlehawks record with a 61-yard field goal, which he booted in Week Seven against the Birmingham Stallions in 2024.

## FORMER RENEGADES IN THE NFL

### SAL CANNELLA



Cannella emerged as one of the most productive tight ends in spring football, showcasing his reliability as a pass-catcher and red zone target. He carried that momentum into the NFL, earning opportunities through his physicality and consistent hands. Cannella's ability to create mismatches against linebackers has made him a valuable depth option at the position.

### LUCAS HAVRISIK



Havrisik earned NFL opportunities after displaying a strong leg and consistency during his professional stops, converting key field goal attempts while showing range beyond 50 yards. He demonstrated reliability on extra points and short-range kicks, providing stability in the kicking game. His leg strength and ability to handle pressure situations have helped him remain in the mix at the NFL level.

### JALEN REDMOND



Redmond translated his disruptive presence on the defensive line into NFL opportunities, using his quick first step and strength to impact opposing offenses. He has shown the ability to generate pressure from the interior while contributing against the run. Redmond's versatility along the defensive front has added to his value as a rotational defender.

### JAYDEN PRICE



Price showcased his speed and instincts in the secondary, earning attention for his playmaking ability and coverage skills. His versatility in defending both the pass and contributing on special teams helped him transition to NFL opportunities. Price's athleticism and awareness continue to make him a promising option in the defensive backfield.

# HOME, SWEET HOME

## TOYOTA STADIUM

Toyota Stadium is the home of FC Dallas of Major League Soccer. The club adopted its current name following the 2004 season and, after playing its first nine-and-a-half seasons at the Cotton Bowl and Dragon Stadium in Southlake, moved into Toyota Stadium on August 6, 2005. The venue was the third soccer-specific stadium built in Major League Soccer and has since hosted a wide range of professional, youth, and community events.

Toyota Stadium has undergone extensive renovations to enhance the fan experience and modernize the facility. The project expanded seating capacity, upgraded premium hospitality areas, and introduced new technology and infrastructure improvements throughout the venue. The renovation included the following:

- ★ Expanded premium seating with a 175% increase in club seating.
- ★ A 58% increase in suite capacity with new hospitality configurations.
- ★ Approximately a 10% increase in overall seating.
- ★ A new canopy roof designed to shade a majority of seats.
- ★ A new 5,000-square-foot main video board, LED signage, and upgraded sound system.
- ★ Three premium club spaces: East Club, West Club, and Founders Club.
- ★ Two new suite levels with flexible hospitality options.
- ★ A 59% increase in concession points of sale and a 26% increase in restrooms.
- ★ Enhanced ADA accessibility and new press, broadcast, and event operations spaces.



## IMPORTANT DATES

- ★ August 6, 2005 – FC Dallas plays its first match at Toyota Stadium after relocating from the Cotton Bowl and Dragon Stadium.
- ★ 2005 – Toyota Stadium opens as the third soccer-specific stadium in Major League Soccer.
- ★ 2013 – The stadium is renamed Toyota Stadium following a naming rights agreement with Toyota.
- ★ 2024 – Major renovations are completed, expanding seating capacity and upgrading fan amenities.

## STANDOUT PLAYERS VS COLUMBUS

**QB Austin Reed** would end the day going 18-for-30, with two passing touchdowns for 147 yards, passing to nine different receivers.

**RB Dae Dae Hunter** led in rushing yards, recording 11 rushes for 62 yards and a touchdown.

For three straight games, **WR Tyler Vaughns** would lead the team in receptions and receiving yards, recording five catches for 41 yards.

**WR Deontay Burnett and Emmanuel Butler** would each record a passing touchdown.

**CB Shaun Wade and S Tra Fluellen** would each walk away with an interception, with Wade lateraling the football to **CB Ajene Harris** for a touchdown return.

## FIRST TIME, SECOND TIME

The Dallas Renegades played their first-ever matchup on Sunday, April 12. It was a back and forth contest in which Dallas held off Columbus to secure a 28-23 win.

## RICK NEUHEISEL

HEAD COACH

Renegades: 1st Year

Rick Neuheisel is the head coach of the Dallas Renegades and brings decades of experience as a player and coach across the collegiate and professional ranks. A former college quarterback, professional spring football player, NFL assistant, and veteran head coach, Neuheisel is widely recognized for his offensive expertise and leadership at multiple levels of the game.

Neuheisel was named head coach of the Renegades following a distinguished coaching career that includes stops in both college football and the NFL, as well as previous spring professional leagues. Most recently, he served as head coach of the Arizona Hotshots in the Alliance of American Football in 2019. He also spent three seasons in the NFL with the Baltimore Ravens as quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator from 2005-2007.

Prior to his professional coaching experience, Neuheisel compiled an 87-59 record as a collegiate head coach, leading programs at University of Colorado (1995-1998), University of Washington (1999-2002), and UCLA (2008-2011). Across those tenures, he guided his teams to multiple bowl appearances and established a reputation for developing high-powered offenses. In his return to UCLA, he led the Bruins to a Pac-12 South Division title in 2011.

Neuheisel began his coaching career at UCLA in 1986 as a graduate assistant and later served as quarterbacks coach and wide receivers coach, laying the foundation for his future success as a head coach.

As a player, Neuheisel starred at UCLA from 1981-1983, leading the Bruins to a Pac-10 Championship and a victory in the Rose Bowl. Neuheisel finished his collegiate career as one of the program's most efficient passers and set NCAA records for completion percentage.

Following his college career, Neuheisel played professionally in the United States Football League, serving as a quarterback for the San Antonio Gunslingers in the mid-1980s.

Born February 7, 1961, in Madison and raised in Tempe, Neuheisel is also known for his academic achievements, holding both undergraduate and law degrees—distinguishing him as one of the more accomplished figures in football both on and off the field.

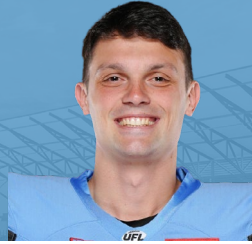

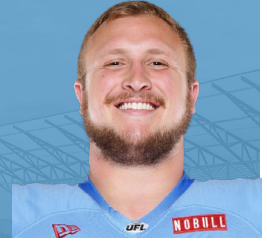

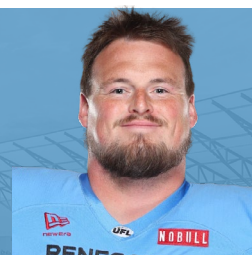
