

Junior Year

- Register for NCAA Eligibility Center
- Send updates prior to each tournament or event
- Always include schedule of tournament games, jersey numbers and year of graduation in every email
- Create a realistic list of schools and prioritize-
 - Safety, Target, Reach
- Attend ID camps/events for colleges of high interest only
- Engage in regular correspondence with coaches
- Watch college games- either live, on TV, streaming
- Make unofficial visits and meet with coaches

General Timelines for Coaches-Women's

Freshman Year-2027

- Watching-Major and mid-Major Div 1 and Top Div 2
- Sending general and college (not soccer) related mail and email

Sophomore Year-2026

- Watching-All levels (NCAA, NAIA, NJCAA)
- Recruiting-All Div 1 and most Div 2
- Sending general and college (not soccer) related mail and email
- **JUNE 15**th-coaches are allowed to engage in recruiting related communications

Junior Year-2025

- Aug 1st-Off-Campus communications and all on-campus contact is allowable
- Watching-All levels except Major/Mid Major Div 1
- Recruiting-Div 2, all Div 3, NAIA, NJCAA
- Offering- All Div 1, top and mid Div 2, many NAIA

Senior Year-2024

Recruiting-lower Div 2, all Div 3, NJCAA,
Offering-All levels other than most Major and mid-Major Div1 and top Div 2



General Timelines for Coaches-Men's

Freshman Year-2027

- Most coaches are not watching other than top 10%, except by invite
- Sending generic camp/Id camp materials

Sophomore Year-2026

- Watching-All levels Div 1, most Div 2, other programs by invite
- Recruiting-Some Major/mid-Major Div 1, (club coach contact only)
 - Note-Div2 and some many NAIA are focusing on Internationals first
- June 15th-coaches are allowed to engage in recruiting-specific communications

Junior Year-2025

- Aug 1st-Off-Campus communications and all on-campus contact is allowable
- Watching-All levels except Major/Mid Major Div 1
- Recruiting-mid/low Div 1, all Div 2, all Div 3, NAIA, NJCAA
- Offering in spring- Top Div 1, some Top Div 2, some NAIA

Senior Year-2024

Recruiting-lower Div 2, all Div 3, NJCAA,
Offering-All levels other than most Major and mid-Major Div1 and top Div 2

RECRUITING CALENDARS

 NCAA member schools limit recruiting to certain periods during the year.

 Recruiting calendars promote the well-being of college-bound student-athletes

 Ensure fairness among schools by defining certain periods during the year in which recruiting may or may not occur in a particular sport.

 NAIA regulations do not include calendar restrictions on recruiting high school athletes

ALL OTHER SPORTS, DIVISION I

RECRUITING METHOD	
Recruiting Materials and Electronic Correspondence (e.g., recruiting letters, social media messages, text messages)	You may receive brochures for camps, questionnaires, NCAA materials and nonathletics recruiting publications at any time. A coach may begin sending you recruiting materials and electronic correspondence June 15 between your sophomore/10th and junior/11th year of high school.
Phone Calls to a Coach	You or your family may call a coach beginning June 15 between your sophomore/10th and junior/11th year of high school.
Phone Calls From a Coach	A coach may call you or your family beginning June 15 between your sophomore/10th and junior/11th year of high school.
Off-Campus Contact	A college coach may have contact with you or your family off the college's campus beginning Aug. 1 of your junior/11th year of in high school.
Unofficial Visit	You and your family may visit a college at your own expense beginning Aug. 1 of your junior/11th year of high school.
Official Visit	A college may pay for you to visit the college beginning Aug. 1 of your junior/11th year of high school.

Off-Campus Contact	A college coach may have contact with you or your parents/ legal guardians off the college's campus beginning June 15 immediately preceding your junior/11th year of high school.	A college coach may have contact with you or your relatives or guardians off the college's campus after your sophomore/10th year of high school.
	No limit on number of contacts off campus.	No limit on number of contacts off campus.
Unofficial Visit	You may make an unlimited number of unofficial visits any time, except during a dead period.	You may make an unlimited number of unofficial visits any time.
Official Visit	A college may pay for you to visit the college beginning June 15 immediately preceding your junior/11th year of high school.	A college may pay for you to visit the college beginning Jan. 1 of your junior/11th year of high school.
	Between June 15 before your junior/11th year and the end of your senior/12th year, you may make only one official visit per college and up to a maximum of five official visits to Division I colleges. There is no limit to official visits to Division II colleges.	There is no limit to official visits to Division III colleges. However, you may only be provided one visit per college.




