LADY BULLDOGS HOST WILDCATS

Late-night basketball invades Stegeman Coliseum on Thursday evening as the Georgia Lady Bulldogs host No. 13 Kentucky at 9:00 p.m. The contest will be televised by Sport-South and also available via espn3.com, with Dave Neal calling the play-by-play and Nell Fortner handling the color analyst duties.

Georgia slipped to 14-6 overall and 2-5 in SEC play following last Sunday's loss at Alabama. The Lady Bulldogs raced to an 11-0 start – equaling the seventh-best beginning in school history – and climbed as high as No. 15 in the national polls **before losing five of their next six and their first four SEC outings. Georgia bounced back with consecutive wins over Arkansas and Florida before falling to the Tide in Tuscaloosa.**

Shacobia Barbee paces Georgia in scoring (12.8 ppg), rebounding (7.9 rpg), assists (tied with Khaalidah Miller at 3.5 apg) and steals (an SEC-leading 2.7 spg). Miller (11.3 ppg) and Tiaria Griffin (10.5 ppg) also are contributing points at a double-digit pace.

In SEC action, Barbee leads the Lady Bulldogs at 13.4 ppg and 7.1 rpg, while Miller (11.0 ppg) and Krista Donald (10.4 ppg) also sport double-figure scoring averages.

Kentucky arrives in Athens with a 16-4 overall record and a 4-3 SEC mark. The Wildcats' non-conference slate included impressive wins over No. 4 Louisville and No. 9 Baylor, as well as a lone loss to No. 2 Duke.

No less than five Kentucky players currently average double figures in the scoring column. Jennifer O'Neill leads the team offensively at 12.7 ppg, followed by DeNisha Stallworth (11.2 ppg), Samarie Walker (10.6 ppg), Kastine Evans (10.2 ppg) and Bria Goss (10.0 ppg). With two more points, Janee Thompson (9.9 ppg) would be a sixth double-digit contributor. **Walker is the top Wildcat on the boards at 9.4 rpg.**

SERIES HISTORY VERSUS UK

The Lady Bulldogs currently lead the all-time series with Kentucky 35-14, including a 16-4 record here at Stegeman Coliseum.

Georgia and Kentucky split two meetings last season, with the Lady Bulldogs upsetting No. 8 Kentucky, 75-71, in Lexington on Feb. 3 and the Wildcats exacting revenge with a 60-38 victory in the semifinals of the SEC Tournament in Duluth.

In the SEC Tourney, No. 7 Kentucky outscored No. 12 Georgia 41-14 in the second half en route to a decisive win.

Georgia scored the final four points of the half on a James layup and two free throws from Marjorie Butler to gain its largest lead of the period, 24-19, at the intermission.

Georgia led 26-20 following a Jasmine Hasell layup to open the second half scoring but watched as a 15-0 Kentucky spurt more than erased that advantage.

Kentucky's run eventually supplied a 34-26 lead before James banked in a free throw line jumper with 13:58 remaining. The Lady Bulldogs were within nine points at 45-36 with 7:33 left, but the Wildcats then closed out the contest on a 15-2 run.

In Lexington, Khaalidah Miller scored a career-high 25 points and No. 13 Georgia outscored Kentucky 16-4 over the final 5:33 en route to victory. The upset snapped the Wildcats' 34-game home winning streak.

Georgia trailed by double digits in both halves before rallying to take the lead midway through the second stanza. Following four ties, Kentucky surged back to a 67-59 lead with 6:04 remaining. A pair of Jasmine James free throws began UGA's decisive run. James, Miller and Anne Marie Armstrong accounted for all 16 points down the stretch.

LAST TIME OUT...

Alabama rallied from a 12-point deficit with just over seven minutes remaining to defeat Georgia, 69-66, at Foster Auditorium on Sunday afternoon.

Georgia led 62-50 following a Krista Donald jumper with 7:57 left in the game. A Khaadijah Carter 3-pointer at the 7:08 mark opened a 19-4 Alabama run down the stretch.

The Lady Bulldogs missed on two 3-point attempts to tie the game in the final 10 seconds, the first by Khaalidah Miller and another by Shacobia Barbee.

The Lady Bulldogs opened each half quickly. Georgia scored the game's opening eight points and built a 12-2 lead before the Tide eventually claimed a 30-29 halftime advantage.

An 18-7 surge to open the second stanza put the Lady Bulldogs up 47-37. After Alabama trimmed the margin to 50-47, Georgia regained a 12-point edge before the Tide again rallied.

With the upset, the Crimson Tide snapped a 23-game losing streak to the Lady Bulldogs dating back to 1998.

DOGS VS. CATS...TIGHT OR A BLOWOUT

If recent history holds, tonight's game will either be a nail-biter or a relative blowout.

In the last 11 meetings dating back to the 2007-08 season, seven have been decided by five points or less. The other four have featured margins of victory of 16 points or more.

BARBEE LEADS HERE, THERE, EVERYWHERE

Shacobia Barbee now leads Georgia – average wise – in scoring (12.8 ppg), rebounding (7.9 rpg), assists (tied with Khaalidah Miller at 3.5 apg) and steals (an SEC-leading 2.7 spg).

Barbee is the only player in the SEC who leads her team in all four stats. In fact, she is one of just six Division I women's hoops players leading their team in ppg, rpg, apg and spg through last weekend as outlined below.

For the record – and to probably *totally* jinx Barbee's chances to do so – no player has ever led UGA in all four statistics for a season.

QUOTING COACH LANDERS...

ON THE CHALLENGES OF PLAYING KENTUCKY...

"Kentucky is a team that our past teams have matched up well with. This is a different team. I'm not sure at this point how we're going to match up with Kentucky. They are certainly a team as deep as anyone in the conference. They are extremely athletic, with excellent quickness and the ability to shoot the 3-ball. They're also a team that complete in that they have outstanding guard play and they also have very consistent and outstanding interior play with their two post players."

QUOTE FROM JAN. 12 ON REBOUNDING FROM AN 0-4 START IN SEC PLAY...

"We didn't wake up this morning 0-4 in the league. It took us two weeks to get here. To get out will take at least two weeks. We didn't get here overnight, and we're not in Vegas...we can't double-down. We can only do that by winning one game at a time...preparing one day at a time what our exit will look like from being 0-4. We've got to dig out of this thing one day at a time. It's doable. There's obviously a lot of basketball left to be played, but we have to do so with some sense of urgency."

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THE CHARITY

Although Georgia ranks 14th in the SEC and 324th in the nation in free throw percentage, you wouldn't think so after watching the Lady Bulldogs' last 81:46 of basketball.

For the season, Georgia has made just 227-of-272 attempts at the charity stripe, a paltry percentage of 61.0. However, the Lady Bulldogs are 35-of-43 – a sizzling 81.4 percent – in the aforementioned span, which includes the final 106 seconds against Arkansas and the entire games at Florida and Alabama.

Georgia held off the Razorbacks by hitting 8-of-10 FTs in the final 1:46 and then connected

on 16-of-18 free throws – including 11-of-12 in the final 5:34 – in Gainesville. The Lady Bulldogs followed that by converting on 11-of-15 trips to the line in Tuscaloosa.

Andy Landers' confidence in his players' abilities to knock down free throws never wavered, largely due to what he saw in practice on a daily basis.

"We shoot them great in practice just about every day," Landers said. "I didn't think it was broke. I just thought it was something a young team needed to get comfortable with in games. We shoot a good percentage in practice. I know we have good strokes."

TURNING DEFENSE INTO OFFENSE

Through 11 games, the Lady Bulldogs possessed a healthy +141 (+12.8 ppg) edge on their opponents in points off TOs.

In the stretch when Georgia lost five of six outings, opponents outpaced Georgia 118-91 (-4.5 ppg) in points from giveaways.

That was a relatively significant swing of 17.3 ppg.

"The cause, I think, has just been a lack of discipline," Andy Landers said following a Jan. 2 loss at Vanderbilt. "We've turned it over excessively. They haven't been forced turnovers. It has been, at times, decision making and at other times it has just been poor execution of fundamental passing and catching."

In its last three games against Arkansas, Florida and Alabama, Georgia owns a 52-45 edge on points from TOs.

MILLER TOPS MILLENNIUM, MOVES UP MORE

Khaalidah Miller became Lady Bulldog Basketball's 35th 1,000-point scorer during the Nov. 19 victory over Furman.

The Atlanta native has since moved up to No. 26 among Georgia's career scoring leaders and enters the Kentucky game five points shy of current No. 25 Angel Robinson.

Miller's ascension went into overdrive at Vanderbilt when she moved from No. 31 to No. 28. With 16 points against the Commodores, Miller passed No. 30 Pam Irwin-Osbolt, No. 29 Carla Green and No. 28 Cynthia Collins.

FYI, Green is now Dr. Carla Williams and an Executive Associate Athletic Director and Senior Woman Administrator for the UGA Athletic Association and the envy of every former Lady Bulldog...as Andy Landers' boss.

LADY BULLDOGS FALL FROM POLLS

After being ranked as high as No. 16 by the Associated Press and No. 15 in the USA Today coaches poll in December, Georgia dropped out of both rankings on Jan. 13 after losing its first four SEC outings.

That marked the first time the Lady Bulldogs were not ranked by the Associated Press since the end of the 2010-11 campaign and snapped a streak of 50 consecutive weeks in AP ledgers.

Georgia has a long history of AP rankings.

The Lady Bulldogs' first poll appearance came in the preseason edition prior to the 1981-82 season, the same campaign that women's intercollegiate athletics came under the auspices of the NCAA. That also was the fifth year the AP published a women's college basketball poll.

Despite that half-decade gap prior from the poll's beginning to UGA's first ranking, Georgia and Andy Landers rank No. 2 in poll appearances by a school and coach, respectively.

Since 1981-82, the Lady Bulldogs have been included in 509 of 588 weekly Associated Press polls, or 86.6 percent of those released.

Of those weeks, Georgia was featured in the top-10 of 268 polls, 45.6 percent of the rankings released during that span.

MULTI-GAME LOSING SKIDS RARE FOR UGA

Georgia's four-game losing streak was the second-longest in Andy Landers' 35 seasons and 1,115 games coached for Georgia.

Just nine times during Landers' tenure has UGA dropped three straight. In seven of those occasions, Georgia successfully snapped the skid in its next outing.

The only five-game stretch of "Ls" came between Feb. 5-22, 2009.

AN UNFORGIVING LEAGUE

When Southeastern Conference play opened on Jan. 2, both Georgia and Arkansas were riding high.

Prior to their Jan. 16 match-up at Stegeman Coliseum, the Lady Bulldogs endured their first 0-4 SEC start ever, while Arkansas was just 1-3 in the league.

That was a combined 1-7.

ALL SEC FROM HERE ON OUT

Georgia will wrap up its 2013-14 regular season with 16 straight conference dates.

At Florida on Jan. 19, Georgia concluded a challenging stretch of six games to begin SEC play versus teams that were a combined 65-12 when the calendar rolled over to 2014.

During that span, the Lady Bulldogs faced Vanderbilt (11-2), Tennessee (11-1), Missouri (11-2), Texas A&M (9-4), Arkansas (13-0) and Florida (10-3).

Of those, the Commodores, Lady Volunteers, Aggies and Razorbacks have been ranked at some point this season...and the Gators have defeated No. 24 Arkansas and No. 6 Kentucky.

LADY BULLDOGS HIT "MAGIC NUMBER"

Georgia has reached the 80-point plateau five times this season and, in the process, improved perhaps the greatest statistical indicator other than wins and losses.

The Lady Bulldogs are now 430-6 when scoring 80 or more points during Andy Landers' 35 seasons in Athens. That equates to a winning percentage of 98.623853211009.

Georgia scored 80-plus points in three consecutive outings against Belmont, Kennesaw State and Lipscomb, the first time UGA has done so since the first three games of 2007-08 – 81-53 vs. Richmond, 84-56 vs. George Mason and 105-66 vs. Georgia Southern.

FRESHMAN STARTER SORORITY GROWS

Andy Landers has continued his long-standing penchant of starting freshmen.

Sydnei McCaskill got the nod against Presbyterian to become the 73rd freshman to start during Landers' 35 seasons at UGA and the 23rd do so in her Lady Bulldog debut. McCaskill played all 40 minutes, joining Coco Miller as the only Lady Bulldog freshmen to play every second of their collegiate opener.



A MILESTONE(S) CAMPAIGN

Last season's "Elite Eight" campaign featured a pair of memorable victories for Andy Landers, the first – and still only – full-time head coach in the history of Lady Bulldog Basketball.

The Lady Bulldogs' Nov. 20, 2012 victory over Savannah State represented Andy Landers' 800th win at UGA. He became just the eighth coach – men's or women's – to secure 800 victories at one Division I school as listed below left with active coaches in bold.

Georgia's win at Ole Miss on Feb. 24, 2013 represented the 900th victory in Landers' career as a collegiate head coach. Pictured above: Georgia's seniors presented the game ball from the Ole Miss win to Landers prior to the regular-season finale against Vanderbilt.

Landers became just the fourth women's coach to reach that milestone, joining Pat Summitt, Jody Conradt and Sylvia Hatchell. C. Vivian Stringer became the fifth coach to 900 wins two days after Landers did so. The winningest active coaches are outlined below right.

OUR TAKE ON ANDY LANDERS' "CAREER"

As Andy Landers approached his 900th career win last season, the question came on a relatively frequent basis.

"Hey, the NCAA Records Book says that Andy Landers only 795 career wins entering 2012-13. What gives?"

The University of Georgia politely disagrees with the NCAA on Landers' career record as a collegiate head coach. Prior to arriving in Athens, Landers was 82-21 in four seasons at Roane State, a junior college in Harriman, Tenn.

UGA chooses – and has since 1979 – to include Landers' Roane State results in his overall record as a collegiate head coach.

Conversely, the NCAA does not recognize Landers' wins at Roane State because they were not obtained at a four-year institution. FYI, Michigan men's coach John Beilein has the same situation.

Therefore, the NCAA lists Landers' "career" record as only his coaching efforts in his 35 seasons at Georgia.

"I get it," Landers said last season prior to UGA career win 900/NCAA career win 818 at Ole Miss. "I understand that I am probably the only person who will ever have this situation. It doesn't upset me in any way. But I will say this...I am as proud of the 82 wins at Roane as I am of the victories at Georgia."

MILLER SPOTS AN UNRELINQUISHED LEAD

Atlanta native Khaalidah Miller certainly made the most of her final game against Georgia Tech.

The Douglass High grad knocked down three 3-pointers in the opening 4:15 to spot the Lady Bulldogs a 9-0 lead they never relinquished. She finished with a season-high 20 points against the Yellow Jackets.

DONALD DOUBLES DOUBLE-DOUBLE TALLY

Krista Donald recorded her second straight double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds against Furman. She also had 10 points and a career-high 16 boards against Ohio State.

Donald produced as many double-doubles in those back-to-back outings as she had in her first 50 contests in a Georgia uniform.

The 5-11 Donald hauled in 12 of her 16 boards after intermission against the Buckeyes and did so against an OSU rotation with four players 6-2 or taller.

NOVEMBER 14 HAS A NEW NAME

Merritt Hempe notched a career-high offensive output against Mercer on Nov. 14, topping the previous mark she set last season against Presbyterian on...wait for it...Nov. 14.

Nov. 14 is now known within UGA circles as "Hem-pee DAY!"...spoken with the same tone and emphasis as the camel in the popular TV commercial pertaining to Wednesdays.

UGA RANKED BY AP FOR 500TH TIME

Georgia was 24 team in the preseason AP poll, the program's 500th appearance all-time.

"Five-hundred is a big number," Landers said. "I think I'm most proud of the consistency we've been able to maintain and the high level of play that has led to us being considered worthy of ranking all those times. Our university, athletic administration, staff, players and everyone associated with our program – and this year's team is no different – have committed themselves to competing at the highest level. To be recognized as one of the top teams in the country basically week after week after week for 30-plus years is certainly a reward for all that hard work and commitment."

WANTED: STAT SHEET STUFFERS

A year ago, the Lady Bulldogs returned all but two players – Meredith Mitchell and walk-on Brittany Crews and Georgia's percentages of returning statistics were relatively massive as outlined below under "2012-13."

The difference in those numbers and the ones returning to the Lady Bulldogs for this season are polar opposites.

After losing five seniors – including WNBA players Anne Marie Armstrong, Jasmine Hassell and Jasmine James – Georgia was looking to replace more than 40 percent of its statistical accountability as listed under "2013-14."

That foundation has always been a vital part of our success."
