Louisville plays its final non-conference game of the season as the Cardinals face intrastate rival Kentucky in the KFC Yum! Center on Saturday. Louisville won its sixth straight in beating Western Kentucky 78-55 in Nashville last Saturday as the Cardinals shot 50.9 percent from the field and forced 20 turnovers. Kentucky (8-3), ranked No. 23 in the ESPN/USA Today poll, has won four straight after an 82-54 victory over Marshall last Saturday.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Louisville leads the nation in turnover margin (+8.6). The Cards have forced an average of 21.4 turnovers a game, scoring 325 of its 937 points off turnovers (35 percent).
- School with each of its football and men's and women's basketball teams in the top 25 in the AP poll. Louisville is the only one (MBB 4, WBB 14, FB 22).
- National rank for UofL in steals, averaging 11.9 per game. UofL has collected double digit steals in 10 of its 12 games. Two Cards rank among the national leaders: Russ Smith (2.8/game, ninth nationally) and Peyton Siva (2.3, 38th).
- Points scored by Wayne Blackshear vs. Western Ky., adding eight rebounds. He has averaged 13.6 points, 4.8 rebounds and shot 54.5 percent from the field over the last five games (12-of-25 threes).
- Times over the last three years in which the Cardinals trailed by nine or more points and rallied to win. UofL trailed by 16 at Memphis.
- Points needed by Peyton Siva to reach 1,000 for his career. UofL has 63 1,000 point scorers, second highest in the nation to North Carolina. Siva is 19th nationally in assists with 6.3 per game.
- M Attendance for UofL men's basketball games in the KFC Yum! Center passed the one million mark at the Cards' game vs. FIU. A total of 1,011,011 fans have attended 47 games in the facility's third year.

■ **About Kentucky** — Louisville plays its final nonconference game of the season as the Cardinals face intrastate rival Kentucky in the KFC Yum! Center on Saturday. Kentucky (8-3), ranked No. 23 in the ESPN/USA Today poll, has won four straight after a 82-54 victory over Marshall last Saturday.

The Wildcats lead the Southeastern Conference in field goal percentage (.490, 16th in the nation) and blocked shots (7.9 per game, 4th in the nation), and are second in assists-to-turnovers ratio (1.3). Archie Goodwin leads the Wildcats in scoring (16.0) and assists (4.2). Alex Poythress (14.5 ppg, 6.5 rpg) leads the SEC and is sixth nationally in field goal percentage (.649). Nerlens Noel (10.7 ppg, 9.1 rpg) is fifth nationally in blocked shots (3.73). Julius Mays (9.3 ppg, 3.6 apg) is ninth nationally in assists-to-turnovers ratio (3.64). Kentucky, which opened the season ranked third in both polls, is No. 51 in the ratings percentage index and No. 35 in the Sagarin Ratings through games of Dec. 25.

Louisville trails the all-time series against Kentucky 14-30 and UK has won the last four. Kentucky won both meetings last season. In Lexington last year, UofL's Russ Smith exploded for 30 points off the bench but Kentucky prevailed 69-62 (12/31/11). In the last meeting, the Wildcats beat UofL 69-61 in the NCAA national semifinals in New Orleans, La. The campuses are 78 miles apart, connected by Interstate 64.

■ **Cards-Cats Ties** -- U of L Coach Rick Pitino coached eight years at Kentucky (1989-97, 219-50 record), including guiding the Wildcats to the 1996 NCAA Championship and a 1997 national runner-up finish. A retired jersey hangs in his honor in Rupp Arena.

□ Kentucky assistant coach Kenny Payne played at Louisville from 1985-89 and totaled 1,083 career points. He was a freshman on the Cardinals' 1986 NCAA Championship team which celebrates its 25th anniversary this season. He averaged 14.5 points, 5.7 rebounds and shot 50.8 percent from the field as a senior. He had 10 points and five rebounds against UK his junior year (12/12/87) and totaled 16 points and five rebounds as a senior (12/31/88).

□ U of L equipment manager Vinny Tatum was a student manager at UK under Pitino for four years (1990-93).

■ **Non-Conference Success** -- UofL has a 144-37 record against non-conference opponents in Coach Rick Pitino's 12 seasons (includes post-season), including a 105-10 record at home (13-6 away). The Cardinals are 101-9 at home in regular season non-conference games under Pitino, including a 32-4 mark over the last three seasons.

■ **Cards Have Been Tough on the Road** — Louisville has the most road victories in BIG EAST Conference games over the last six years (32; five last year, three in 2010-11, four in '09-10, eight of nine in 2008-09, and six in each of the previous two years). Overall, UofL has a 38-22 record over the last six years on their opponent's home court. Louisville has won 28 of its last 47 on the road, including six against Top 25 ranked opponents.

■ **Thieving Cardinals** — Louisville's defense picked up where it left off with last season's stellar effort as the Cardinals have forced an average of 21.4 turnovers and have collected double-digit steals in 10 of its 12 games. UofL, which leads the nation in turnover margin (+8.6) and is second in steals (11.8), is rated as the top defense in the nation in Ken Pomeroy's rankings through Dec. 25. Louisville forced 20 turnovers and grabbed 10 steals in its last game against Western Kentucky as seven Cardinals collected steals. Russ Smith has at least three steals in seven of his 11 games this season and Peyton Siva has three or more in four games. UofL had double-digit steals on 16 occasions last season and Smith had three or more steals in 14 games in 2011-12 when he produced a UofL single-season record 87 steals. Manhattan's 27 turnovers were the most for a Louisville opponent since Morehead State had 30 errors on Dec. 27, 2004. The Cardinals matched those 27 forced turnovers at College of Charleston. Louisville limited Samford to just 13 points in the first half, the lowest since Arkansas St. scored 12 in the first half of a 54-27 victory last season on Nov. 22, 2011.

■ **Happy Holidays** — The Cardinals have enjoyed success in recent years with its first game after Christmas. Louisville has won 17 of its last 19 games played following Christmas, including 10 of the last 11 under U of L Coach Rick Pitino. All but two of those have been UofL home games. The Cardinals dropped a 68-71 decision to Georgetown on Dec. 28, 2011 in U of L's first game after Christmas last season.

■ **Finals Week Over** -- The last day of classes for the UofL fall semester was Dec. 4 and final exams were Dec. 6-12. Classes for the 2013 spring semester start Jan. 7.

■ **Change** -- Louisville's Jan. 2 game vs. Providence was moved to 6 p.m. to avoid a conflict with UofL's football game in the Allstate Sugar Bowl the same day.

■ **Academic Performance at All-Time High** -- While the University of Louisville men's basketball team has performed well on the court, the Cardinals have excelled in the classroom as well. Grades for the 2011 UofL fall semester show 14 of the Cardinals' 17 players achieved a 3.0 or better grade point average, the most in its program history. The team produced a combined 3.16 GPA for the semester, the highest ever for the Cardinals. The Cards followed that performance with a 3.13 GPA for the 2012 Spring semester, with 13 of 17 players earning a 3.0 or better GPA.

The academic achievement is not new to the Cardinals. UofL's men's basketball team earned the last two BIG EAST Conference Team Academic Excellence Awards, which recognizes the highest collective grade-point averages in each of the conference's 26 sports. The men's basketball team has hovered around a collective 3.0 GPA for eight straight semesters.

■ **Career Milestones** -- Peyton Siva moved up to fourth in career assists at UofL with six against Missouri Kansas City (524 total now) and is four behind No. 3 Phil Bond (1972-77, 528 assists). Siva is just the fourth player in UofL history with 500 career assists. Siva's 211 assists in 2011-12 were the second most ever in a UofL single season, 15 behind LaBradford Smith's 226 record assists total in 1989-90. With two steals against Western Kentucky, Siva moved up to seventh in career steals (192 now). Siva recently passed 900 points for his career and is 49 short of 1,000 ... Russ Smith has 134 steals for his career (34 in 12 games this year, 2.8 average). His 87 steals last season set a new UofL record, previously held by Darrell Griffith (1979-80), Tick Rogers (1994-95) and Terrence Williams (2008-09). Smith passed 700 career points with 14 against FIU ... Chane Behanan passed 500 career points against Western Kentucky and needs 11 rebounds for 400 in his career ... Stephen Van Treese needs 15 rebounds for 200 in his career.

■ **One Millionth Fan Attained** — In just its third year in the spectacular facility, fans attending UofL men's basketball games in the KFC Yum! Center reached one million when the Cardinals faced FIU in the Billy Minardi Classic on Dec. 19. A total of 1,011,011 fans have flocked to the arena to watch the Cardinals in 47 games to date, an average of 21,511 per game.

■ **Tickets Available** -- A limited number of single game tickets for many UofL home games in the KFC Yum! Center are on sale now for \$37 each. Many remaining home games are sold out.

All of the available seats are located in the upper ends of the KFC Yum! Center. Tickets are on sale at both U of L Ticket Offices, located near Gate 2 of Papa John's Cardinal Stadium off Floyd Street; and on the third floor of the Swain Student Activities Center. Both locations are open weekdays from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Cardinal fans may also purchase tickets by visiting Ticketmaster online, calling 1-800-745-3000 or by visiting any Ticketmaster Ticket Center, including statewide Kroger locations. Convenience fees are applied with Ticketmaster orders. Further information can be obtained by calling the U of L ticket office at (502) 852-5151.

■ **All-America Siva** -- Louisville senior guard Peyton Siva was named to the All-America team by 2012-13 Blue Ribbon College Basketball Yearbook. Siva joins Indiana's Cody Zeller, Ohio State's Deshaun Thomas, Florida State's Michael Snaer and Creighton's Doug McDermott on the publication's All-America first team. All five grace the cover of this year's Blue Ribbon College Basketball Yearbook, which is available for purchase online at www.blueribbonyearbookonline.com.

Siva is also a third-team All-America selection by The Sporting News.

■ **Cards Look to Continue Productive Defense** — Louisville teams under Rick Pitino have been known for their defensive intensity and this year's unit appears ready to follow in that tradition.

Last season, UofL limited its opponents to 60 or fewer points in 23 of its 40 outings. The Cardinals allowed an average of 61.0 points per game, ranking 32nd best in the nation. UofL was second in the BIG EAST and seventh nationally in steals, averaging 8.8 per game.

Louisville has ranked among the nation's top 35 in field goal percentage defense in eight of the past 10 years, including last season's .384 percentage which ranked sixth nationally and was the school's best since 2003-04 (.382). The Cardinals held 15 of its last 26 opponents last season under 40 percent accuracy from the field, including six of its last nine foes in the BIG EAST and NCAA Championship.

Louisville has allowed 60 points or fewer in 23 of its last 33 home games dating back to the 2010-11 season. Opponents are averaging only 59.1 points per outing in 47 games at the KFC Yum! Center, including 52.0 this season.

How important was defense to the Cardinals during their Final Four run? Louisville's .422 season offensive field goal percentage a year ago was the lowest for a Final Four team in 50 years, since Oregon State shot .406 during the 1961-62 season.

■ **Cardinals Reached Ninth Final Four** -- Louisville advanced to its ninth NCAA Final Four and its first since 2005. Only four coaches have coached more Final Four teams than Pitino's six, a feat matched by three others. Pitino is the first coach to lead three different teams to the Final Four. Louisville's NCAA Final Four teams: 1959, 1972, 1975, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1986, 2005, 2012. UofL advanced to its 1986 NCAA Championship by way of the West Region, reached its 2005 Final Four through the West, and has a collective 14-5 record in that region. The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 18 occasions and have advanced to the Elite Eight three of the last five years.

■ **Doing It With D** — The Cardinals have scored 325 of their 937 points off turnovers (35 percent). Louisville is averaging 27.1 points per game off turnovers. UofL turned 24 Memphis turnovers into 29 points in the Cardinals' 87-78 road victory, collecting nine steals in the game. As it did against Northern Iowa in its 51-46 victory, Louisville scored under 60 points to win in seven games last season, including three occasions during its eight-game run to win the BIG EAST Conference Championship and reach the Final Four.

■ **Louisville Will Host NCAA in 2015** -- The University of Louisville will serve as the host institution for the Second and Third Rounds of the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament in the KFC Yum! Center, as the early round sites for the event were announced on Nov. 12. Louisville was also the site for similar rounds of the 2012 NCAA Tournament. The KFC Yum! Center was the site of the 2012 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship on Dec. 13 & 15.

■ **Cards Have Seven Ranked Teams** -- Louisville is the only school in the nation with its football and men's and women's basketball teams all currently ranked among the nation's AP Top 25 (MBB 5, WBB 12, FB 22). In addition, the Cardinals' women's volleyball team was ranked ninth in the AVCA poll entering the NCAA Tournament, the men's soccer team finished ninth in the NSCAA rankings and the UofL men's (15) and women's (17) swimming and diving teams are both ranked in the CSCAA poll to give the Cardinals seven currently nationally ranked teams. UofL's football team will face Florida in the Sugar Bowl.

■ **Louisville Unique Accomplishment** — Louisville is the only university in the nation which over the last six years has reached each of the men's and women's Final Four, a BCS bowl game, the College World Series and the Men's Soccer College Cup. Louisville was national runner up in the 2009 Women's Final Four and 2010 Men's Soccer College Cup, won the 2007 Orange Bowl, and participated in the 2012 Men's Final Four and 2007 College World Series.

■ **Cards Sixth All-Time in the Polls** — Louisville's initial appearance in the Associated Press poll on Dec. 6, 2010 marked the 500th occasion the Cards have been ranked in the AP poll, sixth most all-time (536 now). U of L has been ranked among the nation's top ten in the preseason poll for the last two years (second this year, ninth in 2011-12). UofL is currently No. 5 in the AP poll.

■ **Siva a Senior CLASS Award Candidate** -- UofL guard Peyton Siva is one of 30 candidates for the 2012-13 Senior CLASS Award in collegiate basketball. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. The candidate classes will be narrowed to 10 men's and finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one men's finalist and one women's finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition. The Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced during the 2013 NCAA Final Four in Atlanta April 6 and 8.

■ **25 Former Pitino Assistants/Players Became Head Coaches** -- U of L Coach Rick Pitino has had 25 of his former assistants or players rise to a collegiate head coaching position. His son, Richard Pitino, became the latest to join that list when he was named head coach at FIU in April. There are eight additional former assistants as current head coaches, including Mick Cronin at Cincinnati; Scott Davenport at Bellarmine; Billy Donovan at Florida; Steve Masiello at Manhattan; Marvin Menzies at New Mexico State; Herb Sendek at Arizona St.; Kevin Willard at Seton Hall; and Tubby Smith at Minnesota.

The Cardinals will face or have faced five of those current coaches this season: Nov. 7 vs. Bellarmine (exhibition), Nov. 11 vs. Manhattan, Dec. 19 vs. FIU, Jan. 9 at Seton Hall, Feb. 23 vs. Seton Hall, March 4 vs. Cincinnati. Pitino has a collective 30-9 record in games against his former assistants (3-0 vs. Ralph Willard; 7-5 vs. Tubby Smith; 7-0 vs. Billy Donovan, 5-4 vs. Mick Cronin, 1-0 vs. Scott Davenport, 1-0 vs. Marvin Menzies, 4-0 vs. Kevin Willard, 1-0 vs. Steve Masiello, 1-0 Richard Pitino). Davenport's team won the 2011 NCAA Division II Championship. Indiana Pacers head coach Frank Vogel was a student manager for Pitino at Kentucky and his video coordinator with the Celtics. Pitino coached current Golden State Warriors coach Mark Jackson at the New York Knicks.

Six former Pitino players also became collegiate head coaches, four of which are currently active, including Travis Ford of Oklahoma St.; Sean Woods of Morehead St.; Donovan and Masiello. Including games against both his 25 former assistants and former players who went on to become collegiate head coaches, Pitino is 35-10 (record vs. former players as head coaches: 3-1 vs. Travis Ford, 2-0 vs. John Pelphrey and Donovan).

HEAD COACH RICK PITINO

In his 28th season as a collegiate head coach and 12th at Louisville, U of L Coach **Rick Pitino** has compiled a 640-235 overall record (286-107 at U of L). The first coach to take three different schools to the NCAA Final Four including his 2005 and 2012 Cardinal teams, his .729 winning percentage entering the season ranks him 11th among active coaches and No. 35 all-time. Among active coaches, Pitino (Massachusetts '74) has the seventh-highest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games (.717 winning percentage, 42-16 record in 17 NCAA tournament appearances). He guided Kentucky to three NCAA Final Four appearances in eight seasons (1989-97), winning the 1996 NCAA Championship and reaching the national title game in 1997. He has also served as head coach at Providence College (1985-87, 1987 Final Four), Boston University (1978-83), Hawaii (last six games in 1975-76) as well as the NBA New York Knicks (1987-89) and Boston Celtics (1997-2001).

Series vs. Kentucky

■ Louisville trails the all-time series against Kentucky 14-30. UK has won the last four. The Wildcats hold a 21-10 advantage since the series resumed in 1983. Current U of L Coach Rick Pitino had a 6-2 record as the Wildcats head coach in games against Louisville; and has a 4-8 record facing Kentucky.

■ The teams met twice last season, with Kentucky claiming both games. In the last meeting, the Wildcats beat UofL 69-61 in the NCAA National Semifinals in New Orleans, La. Kentucky built a 13-point second-half lead

before the Cardinals fought back to tie the game (49-49 with 9:12 remaining). Peyton Siva's 11 points and three assists led the Cardinals. Anthony Davis led UK with 18 points, 14 rebounds and six blocks.

■ In the regular season meeting in Lexington last year, UofL's Russ Smith exploded for 30 points off the bench but Kentucky prevailed 69-62 (12/31/11). Gorgui Dieng grabbed five rebounds and had six blocked shots in the game, and the Cardinals' defense totaled 12 steals. Michael Kidd-Gilchrist tallied a team-best 24 points and 19 rebounds, and Anthony Davis contributed 18 points and 10 rebounds. The Wildcats, who scored 32 points from the free throw line, were held to their lowest field goal percentage of the season (29.8 percent) on a season-worst 17 made field goals.

■ The two teams had not met in regular season play for 62 years before the current series was renewed in 1983; the rivals have met all 30 seasons since.

■ The two teams have met in NCAA Tournament competition on five occasions, with Louisville winning two of the five. Before last year's matchup in the NCAA national semifinals, the latest had been a 72-67 Kentucky victory in the 1984 NCAA Mideast Regional semifinal in Lexington (3-22-84). U of L won 80-68 in overtime in the 1983 Mideast Regional championship in Knoxville, Tenn. in a game labeled as the first "Dream Game."

■ UofL has a collective 82-64 all-time record against current members of the SEC and trail only three of the 14 teams in all-time series results. Louisville has won 14 of its last 19 games against SEC competition over the last 12 seasons. UofL beat new SEC member Missouri 84-61 earlier this season in the Battle 4 Atlantis in the Bahamas (11/23/12).

■ **Behanan Named BIG EAST Player of the Week** — Chane Behanan was named to the BIG EAST Conference Player of the Week for the week of Dec. 10-16. In Louisville's only game of the week, Behanan scored a season-high 22 points and added three rebounds and two steals as the Cardinals overcame a 16-point deficit to win at future BIG EAST member Memphis. Behanan scored 16 points of his points in the second half, including his first three-pointer of the season during a 13-0 second-half run which gave the Cardinals a lead they would not relinquish. He hit 7-of-12 shots from the field and 7-of-8 free throws. Behanan has grabbed six or more rebounds in 38 of 52 career games and has scored in double figures on 28 occasions in his career, including seven games this season.

■ **Card File** -- Wayne Blackshear matched a career-high with 18 points vs. FIU and grabbed a career best eight rebounds. He followed that effort with 17 points and eight rebounds against Western Kentucky. Over the last three games, he has averaged 16.7 points and 7.0 rebounds while shooting 59.4 percent from the field ... Over the last eight games, Siva has averaged 13.4 points, 5.9 assists, 2.3 steals and shot 49.3 percent from the field (36-of-73, 13-29 three-point goals, .448). Siva had 15 points, a career-high 12 assists and buried a career-high five three-pointers against FIU, earning Billy Minardi Classic MVP honors ... Louisville made 38-of-46 free throws at Memphis, the most the Cardinals have made since converting 39 vs. Villanova on Jan. 11, 2010; and the most the Cards have attempted since also shooting 46 at Kentucky on Jan. 5, 2008 ... Russ Smith has scored at least 13 points in all 12 games this season. He led the Cardinals with 20 points against Western Kentucky, his fifth game this season with 20 or more points. He has led the team in scoring in seven of Louisville's 12 games ... Tim Henderson scored a career-high six points vs. UMKC on a pair of three-pointers ... UofL was down 13 in the first half against Illinois State and trailed 25-33 at halftime. Louisville has rallied from nine or more points down to win on 14 occasions over the last three seasons ... Stephan Van Treese played a career-high 34 minutes off the bench against Illinois State, producing six points, eight rebounds, two steals and two blocked shots. He followed that effort with four points and a season-best 10 rebounds at College of Charleston. Van Treese has averaged 3.7 points and 6.2 rebounds (12-of-16 FG, .750) in the last seven games while sharing time at center with Zach Price and Montrezl Harrell in replacing injured center Gorgui Dieng ... Memphis shot 51.8 percent from the field against Louisville (29-56), marking only the 10th time in the last four seasons that a UofL opponent has shot at least 50 percent from the field (UofL is 3-7 in those games) ... Last Saturday's game at Memphis was UofL's second true road game. The Cardinals were 6-5 on the road last year and have won 28 of their last 47 on the road ... UofL is No. 7 in the ratings percentage index and No. 2 in the Sagarin Ratings through games of Dec. 25. UofL's schedule to date is rated No. 20 in the RPI.

■ **Stifling Defense in Charleston** -- Louisville matched a season-high by forcing 27 turnovers in its 80-38 victory at College of Charleston. The Cardinals limited CofC

to a school-record low point total since it became a Division I member in 1991-92. UofL's 38-31 rebounding advantage, led by Stephan Van Treese's season-high 10 rebounds in 23 minutes of action, marked the first time this season the Cougars had been beaten on the boards. Wayne Blackshear scored a career-high 18 points, adding four rebounds, three steals and two assists (3-of-7 three-point goals). Peyton Siva, who grabbed five steals in a team-high 26 minutes, and Russ Smith (four steals) spearheaded an 18-steal effort for the Cardinals, tied for the fourth-most ever at UofL.

■ **Dieng Out With Broken Wrist** -- UofL center Gorgui Dieng is currently out while recovering from a broken wrist he suffered Nov. 23, with a return to workouts hopeful for late December. Dr. Luis Scheker of the Kleinert Kutz Hand Care Center in Louisville surgically inserted a screw on Nov. 27. Dieng, who has a broken scaphoid bone in his left wrist, fell while taking a charge early in the first half of the Cardinals' 84-61 victory over No. 13 Missouri on Friday in the Battle 4 Atlantis. He returned to the game with his wrist taped and played a total of 24 minutes, but sat out the championship game against Duke on Saturday. Dieng is averaging 8.2 points, 8.0 rebounds and two blocked shots through five games this season. He produced his 13th career double-double against Samford with 10 points, 13 rebounds, 5 assists, 4 blocks and 3 steals. Dieng is a preseason All-BIG EAST selection and is among the top 50 preseason candidates for the Wooden Award and Naismith Award.

Louisville Top College Basketball Market

-- Louisville is consistently the highest-rated television market for college basketball, according to an ESPN analysis over the last 10 years. Louisville has been the top market each of the last 10 years, averaging a 4.1 rating or higher over the past five seasons. Louisville's 4.5 rating during the 2011-12 season was a full point higher than the next closest market (Greensboro, N.C., 3.5 rating).

■ **Big Crowds** — Louisville fans have flocked to the KFC Yum! Center, including eight crowds exceeding 22,000. In 20 home games in 2011-12, Louisville averaged 21,503 fans, topped only by Syracuse and Kentucky. The top crowd last season came on Feb. 26 when the Cardinals faced Pittsburgh in front of 22,746 fans, fifth-largest ever in KFC Yum! Center. Three preseason intrasquad scrimmages, including one televised live locally, drew crowds of 10,355; 9,432 and 7,447 fans.

■ **Highest Preseason Ranking** -- Louisville's No. 2 preseason AP ranking matches its highest ever, also achieved prior to the 1986-87 season. That year also marked the highest the Cardinals have been ranked in the preseason coaches' poll, when UofL was tabbed No. 1 in the 1986-87 UPI coaches poll.

The Cardinals have been ranked the No. 1 team in the nation on two other occasions: in the ESPN/USA Today poll on March 15, 2009, and in the final the Associated Press poll that same 2008-09 season.

■ **Tough Schedule** — Louisville's 2011-12 schedule was ranked as the second toughest in the nation by the ratings percentage index (RPI) and this year's figures to be a difficult one as well. The Cardinals will play 20 of their 31 games this season against teams that reached postseason competition in 2012, including at least 13 in the NCAA Tournament (NCAA: Cincinnati, Connecticut, Georgetown, Kentucky, Marquette, Memphis, Notre Dame twice, USF twice, Syracuse twice, Western Kentucky; NIT: Illinois State, Seton Hall twice; College Basketball Invitational: Pittsburgh; plus all three opponents in the Battle 4 Atlantis). UofL plays 11 games against teams which are currently ranked or receiving votes in the ESPN/USA Today poll. Six BIG EAST teams are ranked among the nation's Top 25 teams and another is among those receiving votes in the AP poll. The Cardinals' schedule to date is rated No. 20 in the RPI.

■ **Cards Won BIG EAST Championship** — The Cardinals won the 2012 BIG EAST Tournament Championship for the second time in the last four years. After a first-round bye, the seventh-seeded Cardinals won four games in four days, beat a pair of top 25 ranked teams and prevailed 50-44 over Cincinnati in the championship game at Madison Square Garden in New York. UofL had last won a conference tournament championship in 2009 when it won the BIG EAST and claimed the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Championship that season. The Cardinals have won 17 conference tournament titles (2 BIG EAST, 2 C-USA, 11 Metro, 2 KIAC).

It was the first time the Cardinals have won four games in four days in 64 years. -- since UofL won four straight on March 10-13, 1948 to win the 1948 NAIB National Championship. UofL had won three games in three days on 13 previous occasions.

■ **Cards Have 10 Straight 20-Win Seasons** — Louisville is one of nine Division I schools in the nation which have won 20 or more games in each of the past 10 seasons. Kansas tops the list with 23 consecutive years, followed by Duke (16), Syracuse (15), Gonzaga (15), Florida (14), Texas (13), Utah State (12), Pittsburgh (11) and Louisville (10). UofL Coach Rick Pitino has won at least 20 games in a season on 20 occasions, ranking him sixth among active coaches in 20-win seasons and 15th overall. Pitino won 30 in a single season for the sixth time. UofL has won at least 19 games in 39 of the last 43 years.

■ **Cards Chosen First in BIG EAST Preseason Poll** — U of L was top choice to win the 2012-13 BIG EAST Conference championship in a preseason poll of league coaches. UofL guard Peyton Siva was honored as the preseason Player of the Year while teammate Gorgui Dieng was selected to the preseason all-conference second team and Chane Behanan was an honorable mention pick. In league play, each school plays 18 games, playing four teams twice. The Cards' four mirror games are against Syracuse, Notre Dame, USF and Seton Hall.

■ **Cards Lead in BIG EAST Wins** -- Since the 2005-06 season when the Cardinals joined the BIG EAST, Louisville leads in league victories with an 81-41 mark during the regular season, just ahead of Pittsburgh (80-42). Louisville is also the sole leader in league victories over the last six years with a 75-31 record.

■ **Smith's Scoring** -- Russ Smith's 19.7 scoring average is the highest for a Cardinal since Reece Gaines averaged 21.0 points during the 2001-02 season. It would rank as the 12th highest at UofL.

■ **Jan. 2 Time Change** — Louisville's Jan. 2 men's basketball game vs. Providence was been moved to a 6 p.m. ET tipoff. The Cards' BIG EAST Conference opener, which was originally scheduled at 7 p.m., was moved up an hour so as not to conflict with UofL's Allstate Sugar Bowl football game against Florida on the same night. Coverage for the football game kicks off on Jan. 2 at 8:30 p.m. on ESPN. The basketball game will be televised on the BIG EAST Network, including locally on WHAS-TV.

■ **Cards Win Billy Minardi Classic** -- Louisville beat FIU 79-55 on Dec. 19 to win the 11th Annual Billy Minardi Classic, presented by Kentucky One Health and Sun Tan City. The event was originated in 2002 to honor the memory of Billy Minardi, brother-in-law of U of L Coach Rick Pitino who died in the Sept. 11 terrorist attack on the World Trade Center. Peyton Siva was honored as the game's Most Valuable Player as he produced 15 points, a career-high 12 assists and two steals. Wayne Blackshear had 18 points and 8 rebounds for the Cardinals. FIU is coached by former UofL assistant coach Richard Pitino, son of UofL Coach Rick Pitino. It was the 17th father-son coaching matchup in NCAA Division I history.

■ **Statistical Trends** — U of L is 123-7 over the last 12 seasons under Coach Rick Pitino when scoring 80 or more points (6-0 this season, 8-0 in 2011-12) ... Over the past 12 years under Pitino, Louisville is 95-6 when shooting 50 percent or better from the field (2-0 this year, 6-0 in 2011-12) ... U of L is 223-40 when holding its opponent below 70 points over the past 12 years under Pitino (10-0 this year, 25-7 in 2011-12).

■ **Dieng Swats in Record Numbers** -- Gorgui Dieng's 128 blocks last season set a new Louisville record, 26 more than Pervis Ellison's previous record of 102 swats in 1987-88. That will be tough to accomplish this season, now that Dieng will miss 4-6 weeks with a wrist injury. Dieng's 194 career blocks are the third most all-time at UofL, 14 short of second place Charles Jones' 208 career swats (1980-84).

Dieng has blocked a shot in 66 of 74 career games, including 47 with multiple blocks (2 of 5 this year, 32 of 40 in 2011-12). He swatted at least five shots on 11 occasions as a sophomore. Dieng led the BIG EAST and ranked eighth nationally in blocked shots last year, averaging 3.2 per game. He matched a career-high with seven blocked shots against Michigan State in the West Region semifinals, tying Pervis Ellison (7 vs. Illinois, 1989) for the most by a UofL player in an NCAA Tournament game.

He also was productive on the boards last year, grabbing at least eight rebounds in 25 games last season -- including pulling down 12 boards against Kentucky in the national semifinals -- and was third in the BIG EAST in rebounding (9.1).

■ **Success vs. Top 25 Foes** -- Louisville has won 11 of its last 18 against ranked opponents, falling to No. 5 Duke in its last top 25 matchup. Louisville has a 29-21 record against Top 25 teams over the last six years, including a 20-17 record during the regular season (1-1 this year, 6-6 in 2001-12). UofL has been victorious six of the last 11 times it has faced an AP top-five opponent. UofL has won 14 of its last 28 games when facing Top 10 teams, spanning the last six years.

■ **Cards 18th in All-Time Victories** — Louisville has an all-time 1673-865 record in its 99th season of intercollegiate basketball. The Cardinals are 18th among all NCAA schools in victories. U of L started playing intercollegiate basketball in 1911-12, but did not field teams in 1916-17, 1922-23 or 1942-43. The Cardinals have produced winning seasons in 65 of the last 68 years, including winning 20 or more games in the last 10 straight seasons.

■ **La Poderosa Broadcast Three** — Three U of L home men's basketball games will be broadcast this season in Spanish on La Poderosa (WTUV, 620AM): Nov. 1 vs. Pikeville, Dec. 8 vs. Missouri Kansas City and Jan. 12 vs. USF. Carlos Lucio and Elvis Martinez call the action for the broadcasts in U of L's effort to reach out to the Hispanic community for the eighth straight year. All of U of L's home football games over the last eight years have also been broadcast in Spanish.

■ **Mathiang Will Sit Out Season** -- UofL freshman center Mangok Mathiang (pronounced MANG-go, silent "K," MATH-ee-ang) will sit out the 2012-13 season. He is ineligible to compete, but will practice with the team and will have four years of eligibility. Mathiang averaged 12 points, 10 rebounds and four blocked shots last season for IMG's postgraduate team, which posted a 28-2 record in 2011-12. Born in Sudan, Africa, Mathiang lived in Melbourne, Australia for several years before moving to the United States to play a season of high school basketball at Carbondale (Ill.) Brehm Prep School in 2010-11.

■ **Cardinal Spurts** — Over its first 12 games of the season, Louisville has produced 21 runs of 8-0 or better. The Cardinals have forced their opponents into 38 scoring droughts of three minutes or more. UofL had a 13-0 run at Memphis, turning a 10-point second half deficit into a lead it would not relinquish. UofL had scoring runs of 13-0, 13-0, 9-0 and 8-0 at College of Charleston; and had a season-high 18-0 run vs. UMKC.

■ **Three Straight 5-0 Starts** -- U of L began the season 5-0 for the third consecutive year, the first time it has had three straight 5-0 starts since the 1949-52 seasons when the Cardinals won their first five in each of those years. Louisville won its first 11 games last season and its initial eight games in 2010-11. The Cardinals have started at least 11-1 in five of Coach Rick Pitino's 12 seasons at UofL. The Cards have not started 12-1 since the 2003-04 season (16-1 then).

■ **Generous Siva** — Senior guard Peyton Siva relishes his role as the Cardinals' playmaker. He handed out a career-high 12 assists against FIU and had 10 against both Manhattan and Miami (Ohio) this year. He is fifth in career assists at UofL and has handed out five or more assists in 38 of his last 52 games. He handed out nine assists on six occasions last season, one of 13 times in his career he has handed out as many.

■ **Siva Thefts** — Peyton Siva moved up to seventh in career steals with two steals against Western Kentucky. Eight more will move him up a spot to sixth. Siva had a season-high six steals against Duke, one below his career best effort, and is averaging 2.3 steals this year.

■ **Third Season in KFC Yum! Center** -- Louisville is in its third season in the spectacular KFC Yum! Center, located on the banks of the Ohio River in downtown Louisville. The Cardinals had previously played basketball for 54 years in Freedom Hall (1956-2010). The 22,000-seat multi-purpose arena was built at a cost of \$238 million, includes 71 luxury suites, 62 four- or six-seat premium boxes, over 2,000 side-court club seats and four party suites with a seating capacity of 32 each.

U of L's men's and women's teams have permanent locker rooms. There are five additional team locker rooms, two officials locker rooms, five star dressing rooms, a full-function media work room and a full-sized basketball practice court on the event level. The seven levels of the arena (including the upper catwalk) include a collective 721,762 square feet, or roughly the area of 13 football fields.

After passing through the one and a half acre landscaped entry plaza that features a basketball-themed fountain, entering fans can visit the 2,500-square foot U of L adidas store, the 3,000-square foot U of L Hall of Honor, or head to their seats using one of the eight escalators or seven elevators within the building.

Lounge space is abundant within the arena. Four spacious donor rooms are available for Cardinal fans, including three that overlook the Ohio River. The 7,000-square foot main concourse restaurant overlooks the river and a main concourse sports bar has views directly into the arena bowl. Two 4,000-square foot club lounges on the event level, as well as the terrace club and premium box lounges, provide amenities for their respective patrons. The KFC Yum! Center served as the site for the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament second and third rounds in March 2012, will be the site for a similar event in March 2015 and was the site for the 2012 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship on December 13 and 15.

■ Louisville made its **38th NCAA Tournament appearance**. The Cardinals have reached the NCAA Tournament 29 of the last 36 years (six straight, nine of the last 11, 11 of the last 14 years, 17 of last 21). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 18 occasions, including advancing to the Elite Eight three of the last five seasons. Louisville is sixth in tournament victories (64) and is fifth in NCAA Tournament appearances (38). U of L has a 64-40 overall NCAA Tournament record, reaching the Final Four nine times.

■ Only four teams -- Kentucky (52), North Carolina (43), UCLA (42), and Kansas (41) -- have more NCAA Tournament appearances than Louisville's 38.

■ U of L Coach Rick Pitino has a **42-16** record in NCAA Tournament play (.724), ranking him seventh among active coaches in winning percentage and 12th all time. Only four coaches have coached more Final Four teams than Pitino's six, a feat matched by three others. Pitino is the first coach to lead three different teams to the Final Four; is one of eight coaches to lead four different schools to the NCAA Tournament; and one of 12 active collegiate coaches who have won an NCAA Championship.

■ Only four teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 18 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 25, Kentucky 24, Duke 22 and Kansas 19).

■ U of L Coach Rick Pitino has guided 17 teams to NCAA tournament appearances, including nine of his last 10 years at Louisville (six straight). His last six straight Kentucky teams reached the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats won the 1996 NCAA title and were national runner-up in 1997 under his guidance.

■ Louisville advanced to its 18th NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2012. Only four teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 17 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 25, Kentucky 23, Duke 22, and Kansas 19). Louisville has been to at least the Sweet 16 in three of the last seven years.

U of L has reached the NCAA Elite Eight on 12 occasions, including three of the last five years (1959, 1972, 1975, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1986, 1997, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2012).

■ **Don't Count the Cards Out** — Louisville has rallied from nine or more points down to win on 14 occasions over the last three seasons, including five occasions during 2011-12. This year, the Cards trailed by 16 at Memphis on Dec. 15 before recovering and were down 13 in the first half against Illinois State on Dec. 1 before coming back. The Cardinals pulled off a dramatic comeback victory against Florida in the NCAA West Region Championship after trailed by 11 with 8:04 remaining (54-65), using an 18-3 closing run to cap the Louisville victory and sending the Cardinals to their ninth Final Four. Also last season, UofL was down 17 at DePaul with 5:17 left in the first half (17-34) before rallying for the win. One of the most improbable recoveries occurred two years ago when the Cardinals beat Marquette 71-70 on Jan. 15, 2011 after U of L had trailed by 18 with 5:44 to play.

■ **Five Will Join Cards in 2013** -- Five impressive high school, prep and junior college products will continue their basketball playing careers at the University of Louisville, ranking this Cardinal group among the nation's top recruiting classes. The list includes **Akoy Agau**, a 6-8, 235-pound center from Omaha (Neb.) Central High School; **Anton Gill**, a 6-4, 180-pound guard from Raleigh, N.C., who is currently at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va.; **Chris Jones**, a 5-10, 175-pound guard from Memphis, Tenn., who is currently at Northwest Florida State College; and **Terry Rozier**, a 6-1, 170-pound guard from Cleveland, Ohio who is also currently at Hargrave Military Academy. **David Levitch**, a 6-3, 160-pound guard from North Oldham High School in Goshen, will also join the Cardinal roster next year as a preferred walk-on.

Akoy Agau (name pronounced uh-KOY uh-GOW; like cow with a "G") has helped Omaha Central win three straight state titles, averaging 11.6 points and 6.8 rebounds and blocked 92 shots as a junior last season. He produced a triple-double in the state title game against Omaha South last season with 16 points, 14 rebounds and 13 blocked shots. Originally from Sudan, Africa, Agau moved to Cairo, Egypt as a child before coming to the United States in 2002. After starting on three Central state championship teams, he is bidding to become the first Class A player in Nebraska history to start for four state title teams. A two-time all-state selection, Agau is ranked No. 84 nationally in the ESPN 100, 86th by Rivals.com, and is 18th nationally among centers by Scout.com.

Anton Gill averaged 18.1 points and 6.3 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.3 steals as a junior last season in leading Ravenscroft High School to a 31-4 record and the Class 3A North Carolina state championship. He is playing his final prep year at Hargrave Military Academy, where he teams in the backcourt with fellow UofL signee Terry Rozier. Gill has averaged 19.1 points, 4.2 rebounds, 3.9 assists and 2.8 rebounds at Hargrave through nine games this season (7-2 record). Gill helped Ravenscroft to a combined 78-14 record in three seasons at Ravenscroft, where he was on pace to become the school's all-time leading scorer before transferring. A first-team AP All-State selection as a junior, Gill is ranked No. 29 nationally in the Scout.com Top 100, 40th in the ESPN 100, and 48th nationally by Rivals Top 150.

Chris Jones averaged 18.0 points, 4.2 assists, 4.6 rebounds and 1.8 steals per game as a freshman last season at Northwest Florida State College in Niceville, Fla. He earned first team 2012 NCJAA All-America honors after leading Northwest Florida to a 32-2 record and a national runner-up finish. The top junior college player in the nation, Jones has averaged 28.3 points this season in leading Northwest Florida to a 4-0 record and the No. 2 ranking in the NJCAA national poll. A top 50 prospect as a senior at Melrose (Tenn.) High School, Jones originally signed with Tennessee in the same class as current Cardinal Kevin Ware before opting for the junior college route. He was rated as the nation's 10th-best point guard in high school by ESPN, Rivals and Scout, and the No. 39 prospect overall by Rivals. He averaged 20.5 points, 6.8 rebounds and 6.1 assists per game as a junior in leading Melrose to the Tennessee Class AAA state title and a No. 15 finish in the ESPN Rise Fab 50 national rankings.

Terry Rozier originally signed with the Cardinals last November, but is spending the 2012-13 season at Hargrave Military Academy. Through a 7-2 start for Hargrave, Rozier has averaged 24.0 points, 6.4 rebounds, 7.4 assists and 3.9 steals. He has averaged 36.7 points over the last three games, including pouring in a season-high 50 points in a loss to Louisburg College while adding 10 rebounds, four assists and four steals in the game. Rozier averaged 25.6 points, 6.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 4.7 steals as a senior in leading Shaker Heights to a 21-3 record, the Erie League Championship and a berth in the regionals for the first time since 2002. An-All Lake Erie League selection for three years, Rozier was rated 74th overall in the 2012 ESPNU Top 100 players, No. 80 by Rivals in the class of 2012, and 68th by Scout.com. He averaged 18.2 points, 4.5 rebounds and 3.2 assists as a junior as Shaker Heights won nine of its last 13 games en route to a 14-8 record.

David Levitch, who will join the Cardinals as a preferred walk-on and non-scholarship player, averaged 18.8 points, 4.2 assists and 3.2 rebounds as a junior in leading North Oldham High School in Goshen, Ky. to a 19-11 record. He connected on 42.3 percent of his three-point goals (66-of-156) last season. An All-Eighth Region selection last season, Levitch has already scored over 1,000 career points at North Oldham and will be the lone starter returning from a year ago. He was seventh in the state in free throw percentage last season, connecting on 81.7 percent from the line (151-of-185). He scored a career-high 37 points against Spencer County last season.

Mangok Mathiang, although already enrolled and practicing at Louisville, is sitting out this season and essentially will be a member of this class with four years of eligibility. (name is pronounced MANG-go like the fruit, with a silent "K" MATH-ee-ang).

■ Three Cards on Naismith List --

Three UofL players - Peyton Siva, Gorgui Dieng and Chane Behanan - were named to the 50-player watch list for the 2012-13 Naismith Men's College Player of the Year presented by AT&T. Louisville and Kentucky were the only two schools with three representatives. The list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2012-13 season. The honor will be awarded on April 7, 2013 in Atlanta. A mid-season Top 30 list will be compiled in February and the Naismith Trophy voting academy will narrow the list to four finalists in March.

■ **Card File** — Montrezl Harrell totaled 13 points - second highest this year -- six rebounds and a season-high four blocked shots against Western Kentucky. Harrell scored a season-high 14 points and grabbed seven rebounds in 23 minutes off the bench against UMKC. He has six games with at least four rebounds. Harrell averaged 17.5 points and 8.5 rebounds in the Cardinals' two preseason exhibition games ... Louisville has held double-digit rebounding margins in four games. The Cardinals' +6.5 rebounding margin ranks 43rd in the nation through games of Dec. 23 ... Peyton Siva has handed out six or more assists in seven of the Cardinals 12 games, including dishing out at least 10 on three occasions this year. Siva's 20 points against Illinois State was the second-highest of his career. He has also scored 19 points twice in the last seven games (vs. Duke, Memphis) ... Kevin Ware scored eight points and pulled down a career-best seven rebounds vs. UMKC. He has averaged 6.4 points and 2.6 rebounds in the last five games ... Luke Hancock scored a career-high 19 points vs. Missouri. He made 5-of-7 three-point goals in the game after starting the season hitting 3-of-29 threes ... Russ Smith has a steal in 53 of 68 career games ... Smith has been the Cards' scoring leader in seven of 12 games, scoring at least 13 points in each contest ... Louisville committed a season-high 20 turnovers vs. N. Iowa, but recovered to allow just eight points to be scored off those miscues ... Louisville's next opponent Providence is among the national leaders in field goal percentage defense (.373, 22nd in the NCAA), scoring defense (57.8, 29th) and three-point pct. defense (.233, 3rd).

■ **Board Work** — Louisville is 43rd in the nation in rebound margin (+6.5). The Cardinals have held a rebounding advantage in nine of 12 games this season (8-1 in those games), including four games with at least a 14-rebound margin. After being outrebounded 33-37 by Manhattan in its opening game, the Cardinals' 53-28 rebounding advantage over Samford was its largest in 14 years -- since holding a 56-26 edge over Morgan State on Dec. 30, 1998. UofL had as many offensive rebounds (28) as Samford had in the game and two Cards - Chane Behanan (18) and Gorgui Dieng (13) totaled more as a duo than Samford. The Cardinals had a 47-33 rebounding advantage over Missouri-Kansas City. UofL held a 33-32 edge over Western Kentucky in the Cards' last game.

■ **Cards Only School With 3 on Wooden List** -- Three University of Louisville men's basketball players have been named to the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50, as announced by the Los Angeles Athletic Club. Louisville is the only school in the nation with three players on the prestigious list.

Peyton Siva, Gorgui Dieng and Chane Behanan were among those chosen by a preseason poll of national college basketball media members, the list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early front-runners for college basketball's most prestigious honor.

Siva is one of nine upperclassmen who return to the list from a year ago. Seven schools had two players named to the list. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are not eligible for the Preseason Top 50. The players on the list are considered strong candidates for the midseason list and the official voting ballot, both of which are open to freshman and transfer students. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All American Team, consisting of the nation's top 10 players, will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round of the NCAA Tournament.

■ **Nunez Departs** — Sophomore forward Angel Nunez will transfer from the University of Louisville to an undetermined school, a decision reached on Dec. 16. Nunez has not been available to play in any game this season. He missed the Cardinals' opening game against Manhattan with a stomach virus, and the remaining nine games UofL has played with a concussion suffered in practice on Nov. 13. A 6-8 forward from Washington Heights, N.Y., Nunez played in 12 games as a freshman last season, averaging 2.0 points and 0.7 rebounds.

■ **Cards Among Nation's Best in Pitino Era** — Louisville is among 15 programs in the nation that have won at least 70 percent of their games over the last 12 years. Louisville has a .727 winning percentage since U of L Coach Rick Pitino took over the reins of the Cardinal program, 11th best in the nation.




