For Openers...

> Missouri Basketball will look for its third consecutive win on Saturday as the Tigers host the Kentucky Wildcats for the first time in series history ... Missouri and Kentucky played to an overtime decision (90-83 UK win) last year at Rupp Arena and the Tigers will look for their first win all-time against the Wildcats.

> Head Coach **Frank Haith** will continue to wear his sneakers on Saturday to help promote awareness for Coaches vs. Cancer ... Haith is on the leadership council for Coaches vs. Cancer, which was of course co-founded by Mizzou's **Norm Stewart** ... The program began as "The 3-Point Attack... Norm's Special Challenge" 20 years ago and was adopted by the NABC the following year at a national level ... In addition to the sneakers, Haith and his staff will wear blue pins to raise awareness for autism.

> Mizzou has been very good at home under Haith and is 43-2 at Mizzou Arena since Haith took over prior to the 2011-12 season ... Overall Missouri is an outstanding 40-5 at home in league play (SEC and Big 12) since the 2008-09 season and the Tigers have never dropped more than two home games in a year during that stretch.

> Haith is also a very good 10-4 vs. Top 25 opponents (regardless of site) as the head coach of Mizzou and is 5-3 vs. the Top 10 ... Kentucky enters Saturday's game ranked No. 11 nationally and the Tigers are 7-4 vs. Top 12 opponents at Mizzou Arena since the facility opened in 2004-05.

> Was anyone in college basketball better than **Jabari Brown** in the month of January? ... The junior recorded six 20-point games in eight opportunities during the month and averaged 22.3 points on 56 percent shooting from the floor and 57 percent shooting from three-point range ... Brown has topped 20 points in five consecutive games overall, including 24 in the win at Arkansas on Tuesday when he hit 4-of-5 treys and poured in 19 second-half points to lift Mizzou to its first win at Bud Walton Arena. > Over his last five games Brown is 20-of-29 from three-point range (.690) and in his last three contests the junior is a spectacular 13-of-17 (.765) from bonus distance, while averaging 25.0 points and 5.0 rebounds ... He currently leads the SEC in scoring (22.3), ranks No. 2 in field goal percentage (.540), and is tops in both three-point makes (3.6) and three-point percentage (.581).

> The tandem of Brown (19.8) and **Jordan Clarkson** (18.5) continue to lead the Tigers offensively this season ... The duo has reached double figures in all 20 games played this season ... The last Tiger to open a season with 20 consecutive double-figure scoring games was **Kareem Rush** (21 consecutive) in 2000-01. > With Brown surging into league play the Tigers have three award candidates in the backcourt ... Clarkson was named to the Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 list and **Earnest Ross** is one of the SEC's most versatile players ... Clarkson was one of college basketball's Top 25 players through the first half of the 2013-14 season and ranks among the SEC's leaders in scoring (18.5) and assists (3.5), which includes a team-leading 10 20-point games (tied with Brown for the team lead).

> Mizzou is 16-4 on the season and its four losses are by a combined 16 points to Illinois (1), Vanderbilt (3), Georgia (6) in overtime and at LSU (6) ... The Tigers are accustomed to playing close ball games this year, with 12 of their last 13 outcomes being decided by 10 points or less.

Mizzou Basketball Cliffs...

> Mizzou Basketball returns home on Saturday as the Tigers host No. 11 Kentucky at Mizzou Arena ... The Tigers are facing their second ranked foe at home this year ... Mizzou defeated then-No. 17 UCLA on Dec. 7 (80-71) and together UCLA and Kentucky have a combined 19 national championships.

> Saturday's game will be a Gold Rush at Mizzou Arena ... Fans are encouraged to wear gold for the Noon contest.

> Following Saturday's game the Tigers are back on the road for consecutive games at Florida and Ole Miss, the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the SEC standings.

> Mizzou has improved its field goal percentage defense each season under Haith and the Tigers currently rank No. 1 in the SEC in FG% defense (.388) ... The last time the Tigers limited opponents to sub-40 percent shooting from the floor was **Norm Stewart's** final year (1998-99), when opponents shot just 39.3 percent for the season.

> On Tuesday, Arkansas was averaging 82.9 points per game on the year and an impressive 89.3 points at Bud Walton Arena, but the Tigers held the Razorbacks to just 71 points on the road, Arkansas' fewest this year at home ... This is becoming a trend for the Tigers ... In non-conference play the Tigers faced two of the nation's top scoring teams, West Virginia and UCLA, and held the two clubs a combined 35 points below their scoring norms ... Mizzou also held Western Michigan 10.6 points below its season scoring average, Illinois 6.5 points below its norm, N.C. State 13.0 points below its average and Long Beach State 8.3 points below its average.

> Mizzou continues to be one of the top free throw shooting teams in the SEC, both by volume and percentage of makes ... The Tigers lead the SEC with 72.3 percent shooting from the foul stripe and Mizzou's 19.6 free throw makes per game ranks No. 2 behind Kentucky (21.1) and ranks No. 28 nationally ... Mizzou was a perfect 16-of-16 from the foul line in the second half in the win at Arkansas to seal the victory.

> **Jabari Brown** (96), **Jordan Clarkson** (92) and **Earnest Ross** (91) are each approaching 100 free throw makes this year ... The Tigers haven't had three players with 100 makes in a season since 1995-96.

> Missouri has had at least one player score 20 or more points in 16-of-20 games this season ... **Jabari Brown** is coming off five consecutive 20-point efforts vs. Vanderbilt, Alabama, LSU, South Carolina and Arkansas ... Brown has topped 20 points 15 times in his career and Mizzou is 13-2 in those contests.

> The Tigers have a total of 23 20-point games this season,

all coming from Clarkson (10), Brown (10) and Ross (3) ... Missouri had a player top 20 points 25 times last season.

> Missouri has been one of the leagues better rebounding teams as well, ranking No. 3 in the SEC with a +7.2 rebounding margin ... The Tigers average 27.6 defensive boards per game, No. 1 in the SEC, tied with Kentucky.

> Missouri recorded a rare ACC road win on Dec. 28 at N.C. State ... Although the Tigers haven't played many road games in ACC territory, the win in Raleigh was the second in ACC country in program history ... Mizzou won 87-73 at Maryland on Jan. 24, 1989 ... It was the club's first non-league road win since a 75-68 win at Old Dominion on Dec. 30, 2011.

> Head Coach **Frank Haith** will coach his 315th career game overall and is a spectacular 64-20 in three seasons at Mizzou ... Haith was the fastest coach in school history to 50 wins and has just one starter back for the second consecutive campaign.

> Haith is quickly approaching his 200th career victory ... He has 193 career wins heading into Saturday's game.

> Missouri is being led in scoring by the dynamic junior tandem of **Jabari Brown** (19.8 ppg) and **Jordan Clarkson** (18.5) ... The duo is combining for 38.3 points per game, No. 1 in the Southeastern Conference, just ahead of the Auburn duo of **KT Harrell** and **Chris Denson** ... Brown leads the SEC in scoring during league play (22.3 ppg) and tops in the league overall with 19.8 tallies per night ... Clarkson ranks No. 6 in the conference in scoring and his 16.9 points in seven league contests ranks No. 9.

> The pair is one of three teammate tandems in high-major college basketball averaging 18.0+ points per game.

> **Johnathan Williams, III** is on pace to become the first Tiger freshman to lead the team in rebounding since **Linas Kleiza** (8.4) in 2003-04 ... Williams is coming off a 12-rebound effort at Arkansas and is No. 6 in the SEC in rebounding.

> Mizzou plays in the friendly confines of Mizzou Arena where the club is 43-2 since 2011-12 and went a perfect 17-0 at home last season.

> Mizzou boasts a 147-22 (.871) record at home since the building opened in 2004-05 ... The Tigers are also 94-5 at home since 2008-09, amounting to an incredible .950 winning percentage.

> Non-conference opponents have not enjoyed their stops in Columbia, Mo., over the last few seasons and the Tigers have raced to an incredible 81 consecutive wins at home vs. non-league opposition since the end of the 2005-06 campaign ... Missouri's last non-conference



<p>loss at home came vs. Sam Houston State in the 2005 Preseason NIT, but since then, Missouri has gone nearly eight full seasons without a loss.</p> <p>> That non-conference win streak is No. 2 nationally behind Duke ... Duke has won 109 consecutive non-ACC games at home.</p> <p>> Jordan Clarkson recorded the first 30-point game of the SEC season on Nov. 12 and logged the 26th 30-point game during Missouri's SEC / Big 12 eras ... Clarkson needed just 18 shots to reach 31 points (12-of-18 FGs), and is one of just two Tigers during the two eras to have 30+ points, 5+ assists and zero turnovers ... Clarence Gilbert had a ridiculous 43 points, nine assists and zero turnovers vs. Iowa State in a four overtime win on Jan. 13, 2001.</p> <p>> Clarkson has topped 20 points in nine of his last 16 games ... The junior has topped 20 points 10 times in 20 games overall.</p> <p>> Head Coach Frank Haith enters his third season at Missouri and will look to lead the Tigers to their third consecutive 20-win campaign ... Only Norm Stewart, Quin Snyder and Mike Anderson have enjoyed three 20-win seasons at Mizzou ... Stewart of course led the way with 17 20-win campaigns ... Snyder and Anderson each had three.</p> <p>> Missouri has won at historic levels over the last five seasons ... In fact the Tigers have won 23+ games each of the last five seasons.</p> <p>> The five consecutive 20-win seasons is a school record and Missouri's five consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament is the longest active streak in the Southeastern Conference.</p> <p>> Mizzou Arena has been the site of two undefeated home seasons in its history ... Missouri was 18-0 in 2008-09 and was 17-0 at home last season ... Hearnes Center, the former home of Missouri Basketball, was the site of five undefeated home campaigns (1974-75, 1980-81, 1988-89, 1989-90 and 1993-94).</p> <p>> Since 2006-07 (72-0) the club's margin of victory has been 25.8 points in those non-league home tilts.</p> <p>> Mizzou has three transfers sitting out this season ... Zach Price transferred from Louisville, where the 6-foot-10 forward was a member of the Cardinals' NCAA National Championship team ... Most recently the Tigers added Cam Biedscheid from Notre Dame at semester break.</p> <p>> Mizzou will be on national television a school-record 20 times this season ... The Tigers were on national TV 18 times last season, which was also a school record.</p> <p>> Mizzou was picked fifth in the Southeastern Conference's preseason media poll ... a career-high 28 points at LSU on Jan. 21 thanks to 5-of-6 shooting from three-point range.

> Brown also scored 24 points at Arkansas, 24 vs. South Carolina, 24 points vs. Alabama and 22 at Vanderbilt ... Brown is the first Tigers since **Anthony Peeler** (1991-92) with four consecutive games of 24+ points and is the first to accomplish the feat in league play since **Derrick Chievous** (1987-88).

> Over his run of four consecutive games scoring 24+, Brown is averaging 25.0 points and is shooting 63 percent from the floor (30-of-48) and 73 percent from three (16-of-22).

> Brown now has 15 career 20-point games at Missouri and the Tigers are 13-2 in those contests.

> Brown has reached double figures in each of Missouri's 20 games this season and has missed double figures just six times in 45 career games as a Tiger ... He is also one of the leagues most consistent three-point shooters, hitting a trey in each of Missouri's 20 games this season and has hit multiple triples in 19-of-20 contests overall.

> On this current four-game surge Brown is one of college basketball's most efficient scorers, averaging 1.6 points per field goal attempt and has supplemented his scoring by hitting 24-of-28 free throws (.857).

> Brown has also made 3+ treys in six consecutive games, the first Tiger to accomplish that feat since **Marcus Denmon** in 2011-12.

> Clarkson has been one of college basketball's most impactful newcomers this year and is averaging 18.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.5 assist and 1.4 steals through 20 games this season ... The San Antonio native leads Missouri with 10 20-point games (tied with **Jabari Brown**), including a career high 31 points in a Nov. 12 win against Southern Illinois ... He has also reached double figures in 20 consecutive games.

John Brown Named Allstate® SEC Basketball Legend

John Brown (1970-73) was named an Allstate SEC Basketball Legend and will be honored at the SEC Tournament (March 12-16) in Atlanta.

> A native of Dixon, Mo., Brown led Mizzou in scoring and rebounding his final two seasons and averaged nearly 20 points and 10 rebounds per game for his three-year career ... He is a member of the school's Hall of Fame and All-Century Team and ranks 16th in career scoring at Missouri with 1,421 points (just three seasons) and is fourth in career rebounding average (10.0).

> A 6-foot-7 forward, Brown was a member of the 1972 United States Olympic Team (did not play due to injury) and was drafted 10th overall by the Atlanta Hawks in 1973, being named to the 1974 NBA All-Rookie Team.

Charting Freshmen Rebounders

Johnathan Williams (7.6 rpg) recorded his fifth double-figure rebounding game (12 rebounds) in the win at Arkansas and currently rank No. 5 nationally among freshmen on the glass ... Williams is the SEC's No. 2 freshman rebounder behind Kentucky's **Julius Randle** (10.2 rpg) and is No. 3 among freshmen playing in high major conferences.

> In addition, Williams' 7.6 rebounds per game is the fourth highest total by a freshman in school history and the most since **Linas Kleiza** (8.4) in 2003-04 ... **Stan Ray** (8.3 in 1975-76) and **Arthur Johnson** (7.8 in 2000-01) are the only other freshmen to have a more prolific rookie season on the glass than Williams.

Jordan Clarkson reached the 1,000-point milestone in the Dec. 7 victory against UCLA and **Earnest Ross** hit the mark in the Dec. 21 Bud Light Braggin' Rights Game vs. Illinois.

> Clarkson is No. 6 in the SEC in scoring and has topped 20 points in scoring nine times in his last 16 games, while Ross has played well over his last 14 outings, averaging 16.0 points on 46 percent shooting.

Six In A Row?

Missouri is looking for a school-record sixth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament this season ... The Tigers have qualified for every Big Dance since 2009, a streak that began with an exciting run to the Elite Eight in Glendale, Ariz.

> Mizzou has only made five consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament once and that was 1986-90 ... A return this season would be uncharted waters for the Tigers.

Just One Starter Back... Again!

This is nothing new for Head Coach **Frank Haith**, his Tigers will have just one starter returning from an NCAA Tournament squad for the second consecutive year ... Last season Missouri returned only **Phil Pressey** from a 30-5 team and this year the lone regular starter back is **Jabari Brown**, who joined the squad mid-season due to NCAA transfer rules.

> Brown led Mizzou in scoring during SEC play last season, averaging 14.6 points on 38 percent three-point shooting ... Mizzou does have other double-figure scoring experience returning as **Earnest Ross** begins his senior campaign.

> Ross was one of six Tigers to average double figures last year, tops in the NCAA ranks, after recording norms of 10.3 points and 5.0 rebounds as the SEC's top scoring sub.

Transfers Good For Mizzou Hoops

Missouri fans know the value of quality four-year transfers and have enjoyed a number of great memories courtesy of some key "short-timers" over the last 15 years ... Missouri welcomes another quality newcomer this season, as **Jordan Clarkson** makes his Tiger debut this season ... In addition to Clarkson, Missouri has two other transfers expected to make key contributions this season, junior **Jabari Brown** and senior **Earnest Ross**.

Jabari Brown Named All-SEC

Jabari Brown, Mizzou's lone returning starter from last season's 23-11 campaign, was picked Second Team All-SEC by the league media ... The Oakland, Calif., native averaged 13.7 points and 3.4 rebounds and started the season's final 23 games after becoming eligible following his transfer from Oregon.

> In SEC play, Brown was Missouri's leading scorer (14.6 ppg) and ranked among league leaders in scoring (7th), free throw percentage (9th - .778) and three-point percentage (6th - .376) in conference games.

> Overall the shooting guard topped 20 points five times in SEC action, including a career-high 23 points in wins at South Carolina and in the 2012-13 home finale vs. Arkansas ... Missouri was 5-0 when Brown scored 20 points last season.

Winningest Stretch at Mizzou

Missouri Basketball is looking to continue its impressive winning trend over the last six seasons, which has seen the club win 146 games since the start of the 2008-09 campaign.

> The Tigers have won 20 games in five consecutive years, a new school record, including a school-record 31 wins during a memorable run to the Elite Eight in 2008-09 and 30 wins in 2011-12, highlighted by its final Big 12 title.

Interim Coaches at Mizzou

Mizzou Associate Head Coach **Tim Fuller** capped his run as interim head coach on Nov. 25 as the Tigers dispatched of IUPUI, 78-64, at Mizzou Arena ... Fuller was a perfect 5-0 as head coach, which also included wins over Southeastern Louisiana (89-53), Southern Illinois (72-59), Hawaii (92-80) and Gardner-Webb (72-63).

> While the five games were Fuller's first as a head coach, it was not the first instance of an interim taking over at Mizzou ... The most notable interim head coach for the Tigers was **Rich Daly**, who went 9-5 in 1989 after **Norm Stewart** was diagnosed with cancer.

> Daly's first game was memorable ... See if you can name owner of this quote: "Regardless of how terrible the officiating is, please don't throw things onto the floor."

> You guessed it, Oklahoma's **Billy Tubbs** ... No. 3 Mizzou fell to Tubbs' No. 5 Sooners 112-105 that night, but Daly won 93-80 the following game vs. Kansas and knocked off OU two times the rest of the year before advancing to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16.

> **Melvin Watkins** also served as interim head coach after **Quin Snyder** resigned in 2006 ... He defeated Kansas State 74-71 in his first game ... K-State's Head Coach for that Mizzou win, which came on Mizzou's 100-year celebration of intercollegiate basketball, was **Jimmy Elgas**, who subbed for **Jim Wooldridge** following neck surgery.

That feat puts the Tigers in rare company along with: BYU, Connecticut, Duke, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisville, Memphis, Murray State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Syracuse and Utah State as the only schools to enjoy multiple 30-win seasons since 2008-09.

Missouri National Guard

Missouri Basketball enjoyed a unique opportunity Aug. 24-25 as it traveled to Camp Crowder in Neosho, Mo., to participate in a promotional activity with the Missouri National Guard ... The Mizzou student-athletes played paint ball against the Tiger coaching staff, went on a 4.5 mile endurance hike in 95-degree heat, carrying 50-pound packs, and enjoyed weapons training with M16 rifles.

> **Wes Clark** stole the show on the range, hitting 23 of 40 targets ranging from 50-to-300 meters in distance.

NOTING MIZZOU HEAD COACH FRANK HAITH

Head Coach Frank Haith begins his third season at the University of Missouri after leading the Tigers to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and transitioning the program into its new home, the Southeastern Conference.

The winningest coach at Missouri through his first two seasons (53-16, .768), Haith has made an immediate impact at Mizzou, not only with his club's efforts on the hardwood, but his commitment to the program's academic advancement and his support of the Columbia community.

Last year en route to Mizzou's fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament, Haith's Tigers enjoyed a record-breaking team cumulative GPA of 3.06 and had three players, including starters Jabari Brown and Laurence Bowers, named to the SEC Winter Honor Roll. Bowers later became the first-ever Missouri Basketball player to finish his playing career with a Master's degree and Haith's time at Mizzou has resulted in 9-of-10 seniors earning degrees. In the community, Haith has been an active fundraiser for the Boys & Girls Club of Columbia and serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer leadership council. Coaches vs. Cancer was of course co-founded by Mizzou legend Norm Stewart. Haith was also a 2012 recipient of the Key to the City of St. Louis from Mayor Francis Slay and was honored by his alma mater, Elon, as the 2012 Eugene Perry Distinguished Alumnus, and was tapped into the Mizzou Omicron Delta Kappa leadership society for his efforts mentoring student-athletes.

While Haith has shown an incredible ability to be well-rounded outside of basketball, it has been his team's play on the court that has led to record-breaking attendance marks at Mizzou Arena the last two seasons. Last year he became the fastest Tiger head coach to 50 wins and has worked diligently to revamp a roster that has completely transformed in just two years.

Last season Missouri was the lone college basketball program to advance to NCAA Tournament play with just one returning starter and Haith will look to duplicate that feat once more this season with just one starter, Jabari Brown, back from last year's 23-11 campaign.

"I was really proud of that team last year because we had so many new parts, including on our coaching staff, but those who know me understand I am never satisfied and always want to achieve more," Haith said. "We are going to continue to develop a program that our fans and our state can identify with. We want this program to have that same blue-collar mentality that Coach Stewart brought and I feel like that's starting to take shape."

During last season's NCAA Tournament run Missouri enjoyed its second undefeated season in Mizzou Arena history, going 17-0 at home with wins over a pair of nationally-ranked opponents, including No. 5 Florida. In fact under Haith Missouri is an outstanding 9-4 vs. Top 25 teams including a 5-3 mark vs. the Top 10.

That performance came on the heels of a 30-5 inaugural season in Columbia.

Picked fourth in the Big 12 Conference pre-season coaches' poll, Missouri won a school-record 14 league games, and finished second in the conference standings with a 14-4 mark. The Tigers won the school's final Big 12 Tournament Championship with a 3-0 run in Kansas City, before advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

With that record-setting first season in the books, Haith received recognition in the form of numerous coaching accolades, including the prestigious Henry Iba National Coach of the Year honor, as well as the Associated Press National Coach of the Year. He was also named the Big 12 Coach of the Year and was the U.S. Basketball Writers Association District VI Coach of the Year. As a first-year coach, Haith guided his team to more regular season wins than any other Mizzou coach before him and became the first Tiger head coach since 1920-21 to win his first 14 games.

"It has been a special two years here and the future is only going to get brighter," Haith said. "Anytime you take over a program there is a process you need to follow to build a recruiting base, build your brand and most importantly, build the support of your fans. That has taken place here quickly and I'm really excited about the long-term future of Mizzou Basketball."

The 27-year coaching veteran was hired at Missouri on April 5, 2011, and immediately appreciated the Tiger's passionate fan base. The Burlington, N.C., native came from the University of Miami where he was not only forced to instill a winning mentality to his players and supporters, but do it at a university void of any lengthy basketball tradition.

Haith's task at the University of Miami was monumental, but his process of building a well-rounded program certainly helped turn around the fortunes of the Hurricanes last season, which had the most experienced team in the country with a host of fifth-year and sixth-year seniors, each recruited by Haith.

In his first of seven seasons as the head coach, Haith guided the 'Canes to seven ACC victories (despite being picked last) and qualified for postseason play. He was recognized by being named a Naismith National Coach of the Year finalist and NABC District 6 Coach of the Year.

Miami returned to postseason play the following year. The Hurricanes won 18 more games and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT, recording the program's first postseason wins since 2000. Over his final four seasons, Haith's Miami squad averaged 21 wins per season, with four consecutive postseason trips.

Postseason success was a theme under Haith. His teams won six total games in the NCAA and National Invitation tournaments, including a memorable run to the second round of the Big Dance in 2008. The 'Canes went 23-11 in Haith's fourth season, just one win shy of the school record and he was named a finalist for ACC Coach of the Year and the Skip Prosser Man of the Year honors.

And it's not just on the hardwood where Haith has fueled incredible growth amongst his players. During his time at both Missouri and Miami his players were visible in the community and Haith has seen an incredible 31-of-33 seniors to play for him walked across the stage to receive a diploma.

"That's my proudest moment," Haith said. "To know we churn out young men, ready to make positive contributions in the community, ready to be great fathers and husbands. That's what coaching at the college level is all about."

It's not an accident Frank Haith was hired as the 17th basketball coach at Mizzou. The grind from student-assistant at Elon College to being named the National Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com doesn't just happen without a dedication to family, career and your student-athletes.

Haith paid his own way through Elon and graduated in 1988. He helped the Fighting Christians twice win 20 games and earned the opportunity to cut his teeth at perennial power Wake Forest the following year as a graduate assistant. His first full-time coaching position at Division I came at UNC-Wilmington from 1990-92 and he laid the foundation for his job at Missouri with a three-year stop at Texas A&M from 1992-95, which included helping the Aggies reach postseason play in 1994.

One of 10 siblings, family will always be first for Frank Haith, and his student-athletes are part of that family. A proud father and husband, Frank and his wife Pam are the parents of two children, Corey and Brianna and his son is entering his second year with the Mizzou program this season.
