» **EASTERN TAKES ON DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPS:** The Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team will travel to Lexington, Ky. Wednesday, Jan. 2, for a matchup with the 2012 NCAA National Champion, University of Kentucky Wildcats. Tip-off at Rupp Arena is scheduled for 6:02 p.m.

This New Year's matchup will be the first between Kentucky and the Eagles. Although both programs have storied histories, this will be the first time that these two institutions lock-up on the hardwood.

» **FINDING THE GAME AT HOME:** The Eagles' matchup with the Wildcats will be broadcast on WEMU (89.1 FM). Veteran play-by-play voice **Chad Bush** will calling the game solo in Lexington.

The game will also be available for viewing on ESPNU. Tom Hart will serve as the play-by-play broadcaster while Joe Dean is scheduled as the color analyst. Coverage on ESPNU begins at 6 p.m. with the tip set for 6:02 p.m.

THE ROB MURPHY FILE

Rob Murphy put an instant mark on the Eastern Michigan University men's basketball program in the 2011-12 season, his first as the head coach, the Eagles found themselves on top of the Mid-American Conference West Division, the first-ever division title for EMU.

For his efforts in leading the team to that West championship, Murphy was named MAC Coach of the Year while also earning Co-Coach of the Year honors in the NCAA District 14 Division I ranks by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

Murphy took over the EMU job with a strong understanding of high school basketball in the state of Michigan. He spent six years coaching in the Detroit Public School League (1996-2002), four as the head boys basketball coach at Detroit Crockett Technical High School. He led Crockett to the Class B State Championship in 2000-01.

A graduate of Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio, Murphy was a two-year starter on the basketball team and the team's Defensive Player of the Year as a senior.

After graduating from Central State, Murphy returned to his hometown of Detroit to begin his coaching career at Detroit Central High School as the associate head coach in 1996-98. Central won the state Class A championship in 1997-98 after finishing runner-up in 1996-97.

From Crockett, Murphy joined the Kent State University staff for two seasons, 2002-03 and 2003-04, and the teams turned in back-to-back 22-9 seasons on the way to two Mid-American Conference East Division crowns. Both teams were invited to the National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

After that successful two-year stint as an assistant for the Golden Flashes, Murphy joined Head Coach Jim Boeheim's Syracuse University men's basketball program as an assistant. During his seven years on the staff, the Orange recorded a 180-67 overall record and played in the post season every year, with five NCAA appearances and two NIT stops.

A native of Detroit, Murphy attended Mumford High School where he lettered in both football and basketball, earning All-State honors in football.

ALL-TIME VERSUS KENTUCKY: The Eagles will take on another nationally ranked institution Wednesday, Jan. 2, when they travel to Lexington, Ky. to take on the defending 2012 NCAA national champion University of Kentucky Wildcats. This will be the first meeting between No. 23-ranked Kentucky and Eastern Michigan.

FIRST TIME OVER 75: Eastern made history in the **Rob Murphy** era Friday, Dec. 28, when they posted 87 points. That output was the most recorded by a team coached by Murphy. The previous high was 75 when the Eagles defeated Madonna University, 75-57, Nov. 24, 2012. This is also only the third time that a team coached by Murphy has posted 70-or-more points in a contest. The third time EMU scored 70 was in a 74-70 loss to Colgate, Dec. 1, 2011.

FOUR IN DOUBLE-DIGITS: Eastern's offensive balance showed in the game against Siena Heights as they put four players in double figures. That was the first time this season that EMU has had more than three players score 10-or-more points. **Daylen Harrison, Derek Thompson** and **Jalen Ross** each had double-digit scoring affairs against Oakland, Dec. 22.

SCORCHING SHOOTING: EMU's win over Siena Heights was the first time the Eagles have shot 50% or better from the field they shot 22-of-44 (50.0 percent) in a 57-62 overtime loss to Miami last season, Feb. 1, 2012. The Eagles' 33-of-60 (55.0 percent) is the best shooting percentage since Eastern shot a sizzling 28-of-39 (57.1 percent) against Toledo during the 2007-08 campaign, Jan. 22, 2008.

GET THAT OUTTA HERE: The Eagles posted a season-high 10 blocks for the second time in the 2012-13 campaign Friday, Dec. 28, against Siena Heights, including five from junior **Da'Shonte Riley**. The Eagles also posted 10 blocks against Eastern Illinois, Nov. 16. That game against EIU was the first time EMU had posted 10-or-more blocks in a game since the 1998-99 campaign when it notched 11 blocks in an overtime win against Central Michigan, Jan. 20, 1999.

DISHING OUT THE ROCK: Including five assists from **Antoine Chandler**, along with four apiece from **Daylen Harrison** and **Jalen Ross**, the Eagles posted 20 assists against Siena Heights which is the most this season, since dishing out 18 against Madonna, Nov. 24.

UMASS ON THE HORIZON: The Eagles will stay on the road after taking on the Kentucky Wildcats. EMU is scheduled to travel to Amherst, Mass. to take on the University of Massachusetts for a 2 p.m. contest.

Eastern is 0-1 all-time against UMass. The last time EMU and the Minutemen faced off was during the 1972-73 season when the Eagles fell, 61-68, in the Motor City Tournament

ALMOST SOME COMEBACK KIDS: Eastern almost came back from a 14-point deficit when hosting Oakland, Dec. 22. The Eagles were able to tie the game up when **J.R. Sims** hit one-of-two free throws with 18 seconds left on the clock. However, Ryan Bass of Oakland hit a jumper with just over a second left to give the Golden Grizzlies the win at the Convocation Center.

HAVE TO HIT THE FREE ONES: Free throw shooting proved to be the difference down the stretch in the Eagles' loss to Oakland. Despite hitting 73.7 percent of its shots from the charity stripe in the second half, Eastern shot just 50 percent (3-of-6) from the line in the final minute of its first home loss of the 2012-13 campaign.

ROSS WITH A CAREER DAY: Freshman Jalen Ross posted 17 points, four assists, three rebounds and two steals in the EMU's loss to Oakland. His 17 points almost doubled his previous career-high of nine points that he scored at No. 2 Michigan.

LUCKY NUMBER SEVEN: EMU entered Saturday's game against Oakland looking to win their seventh-straight game at home to start the season. The last time the Green and White accomplished that feat was the 1997-98 season in which the Eagles rattled off ten straight home wins en route to qualifying for the NCAA Tournament. Eastern has won six straight at home to start a season twice since then, but has not been able to get to the lucky number seven.

FIRST HALF DROUGHTS: In the past two road contests, the Eagles have gone through major scoring droughts in the first twenty minutes of play. In the Windy City against UIC, the Green and White went over nine minutes without finding the basket. Against No. 2-ranked Michigan, Eastern got off to an early 6-2 lead before going nearly eight minutes until scoring its next points.

EARLY SEASON TESTS: The non-conference schedule has not been kind to the Eagles this season. Coach **Rob Murphy's** squad has had to face two top-five teams on the road in No. 4 Syracuse, Dec. 3, and No. 2 Michigan, Dec. 20. Since games against ranked teams have been recorded (1995-96 season), Eastern Michigan has never faced a pair of the nation's top-ten teams, let alone two top-five teams.

IN THE NATIONAL RANKS: As of the last NCAA statistical update (Dec. 16), the Eagles boasted the 27th-best scoring defense in the country at 57.6 points per game this season. EMU is also tied for 20th in the NCAA in blocked shots per game (5.6). Defensively, the Eagles hold their opponents to a 37.9 percent field goal percentage which is tied for 33rd in the country.

Da'Shonte Riley is tied for 20th in the nation for blocked shots per game (2.7).

CAREER-HIGHS AGAINST COUNTY RIVAL: True freshman **Jalen Ross** and sophomore **Antoine Chandler** both registered career-high in scoring against Washtenaw County rival Michigan, Dec. 20. Ross tallied nine points in the loss while Chandler added eight.

BURNED BY THE THREE: Over a three game stretch, Dec. 15-22, the Eagles were torched by the three-point ball in three games, surrendering 31 made baskets from beyond the arc. Both Michigan and Illinois-Chicago made a dozen three-balls, while Oakland knocked down seven.

MISSING SOME TIME: EMU true freshman, **Ray Lee**, will be out indefinitely with an injury to his foot.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: When playing at home this season, the Eagles are 7-1. Eastern shoots a blistering 42.8 percent within the friendly confines of the Convocation Center, while holding its opponents to just 34.1 percent shooting from the floor. The Eagles also hold their opponents to 50.9 points per game when playing in Ypsilanti.

Conversely, the Green and White is 0-4 outside of the Convo this season. EMU is shooting just 34.8 percent on the road, while its opponents are hitting 45.3 percent of its shots. EMU scores just 51.0 points per game away from Ypsilanti and the opposition is posting 78.0 points per game in those four contests.

MAKING THE BEST OF IT: Since the 1998-99 season when the most accurate records have been kept, the Eagles had not won a game shooting less than 32.0 percent from the field. However, in the victory over Purdue, Dec. 8, EMU shot just 30.8 percent but slid past the Boilermakers, 47-44, at the Convocation Center.

THOSE ARE SOME FORMIDABLE FOES: Eastern has made a habit of traveling to top-notch teams over the past five seasons. EMU has played a team ranked in the top-25 each of the last seven seasons, including matchups with top-five teams in the last three-consecutive seasons.

In 2010-11 the Eagles opened the season with No. 2-ranked Michigan State. In 2011-12 EMU traveled to Syracuse to take on the No. 3/4-ranked Orange. This year the Eagles took on No. 4 Syracuse and now square off with No. 2 Michigan.

TOPPING THE BIG DOGS: With the 47-44 win, Dec. 8, against Purdue, Eastern defeated a Big Ten Conference opponent for the first time since an 89-83 overtime victory against the University of Michigan, Dec. 17, 1997, in Ann Arbor. The win was also the first home victory over a Big 10 team since a 92-76 throttling of Wisconsin, Dec. 10, 1994, at venerable Bowen Field House.

TAKING CARE OF THE ROCK: Since the 1998-99 campaign when the most accurate records have been kept, the Eagles had not turned the ball over less than six times in a single game. EMU coughed up the rock just five times against Purdue, while causing 18 Boilermaker miscues, good for a +13.0 turnover margin.

AREN'T THEY SUPPOSED TO BE FREE: Eastern Michigan shot a dismal 8-of-19 (42.1 percent) from the free throw line in its victory against the Boilermakers. The last time EMU shot that poorly from the charity stripe was Nov. 27, 2011, when EMU hit just 5-of-13 (38.5 percent) free throws when Michigan State came to the Convocation Center and topped the Green and White, 72-40. The last time the Eagles won a game shooting less than 50.0 percent from the free throw line was back in the 2010-11 season when they hosted Jacksonville State, Feb. 19. Eastern shot 13-of-28 (46.4 percent) from the line en route to a 63-60 win.

EMU'S STIFLING DEFENSE: The Eagles have prided themselves on defense since head coach **Rob Murphy** took over in Ypsilanti. Eastern is second the Mid-American Conference in scoring defense (61.1 ppg), but leads the MAC in field goal percentage defense (39.5 percent) and three-point field goal percentage defense (31.2 percent). EMU is also second in the MAC in blocks (5.6 bpg).

LOW SCORING AFFAIRS: The Eagles defeated Purdue without having a player post double digit points. Eastern had not won a game without someone scoring in double figures since Jan. 21, 2012, against Toledo when Darrell Lampley was EMU's high scorer with nine points.

BRYANT FINDS HIS FORM: Junior transfer **Glenn Bryant** notched the first double-double of his career Monday, Dec. 3, at Syracuse. Bryant poured in 16 points and pulled down 10 rebounds in the 48-84 loss at the Carrier Dome.

TURNOVER TROUBLES: The Eagles turned the ball over a season-high 24 times against Syracuse, Dec. 3. Those 24 turnovers were the most in a game since the Eagles turned the ball over 24 times against then No. 15 Ohio State, Dec. 12, 2009. It was also the first time EMU had turned the ball over 20 or more times since Dec. 21, 2010, when they had 21 turnovers against Samford.

STRUGGLES AGAINST THE BIG BOYS: Eastern Michigan is 9-71 all-time against Big Ten competition in its history. The most wins over a Big Ten opponent have come against Michigan State University, with four. The Eagles have defeated Michigan twice, Wisconsin twice and are 1-0 against Penn State. The only Big Ten team EMU has not faced is Northwestern.

LET'S NOT DO THAT AGAIN: In two straight seasons taking on Syracuse the Eagles have dropped both contests, and both were by the same score and margin. Back on Nov. 29, 2011 the Eagles fell, 48-84, at the Carrier Dome. EMU dropped its tilt with SU, 48-84, Monday, Dec. 3, 2012, as well.

RILEY GETTING IT DONE: Junior **Da'Shonte Riley** pulled down a career-high 13 rebounds against the Crusaders of Madonna, Nov. 24. He currently is second on the Eagles with 6.3 rebounds a game. The Detroit, Mich. native is also providing a force on the defensive end. Riley is posting 2.7 blocks per game, including notching a season-high six against Syracuse.

Riley notched a career-high seven blocks, which is also good for second-best all-time in EMU laurels against Buffalo, Jan. 24, 2012, last season.

FINDING .500: Eastern Michigan second year Head Coach **Rob Murphy** moved to a .500 winning percentage in his short career as a head coach for the first time since Dec. 8, 2011, after defeating Madonna University, 75-57, Nov. 24.

SEEING DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Junior transfer, **Daylen Harrison**, posted the first double-double of the 2012-13 campaign by an Eagle when he posted 16 points and 12 rebounds against Texas-Pan American, Nov. 18.

THOMPSON NAMED MVP: Senior guard, **Derek Thompson**, was named the 2012 "Ice Man" Classic Tournament Most Valuable Player Sunday, Nov. 18. Thompson averaged 15 points per game, while shooting 48.8 percent from the field and 44.8 percent from beyond the arc, leading EMU to a sweep of the tournament's field. Defensively, Thompson had a team-high five steals in the tournament.

HARRISON EARNS ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS: Akron, Ohio native, **Daylen Harrison**, was named to the 2012 "Ice Man" Classic All-Tournament Team Sunday, Nov. 18. Harrison posted 13.5 points and six rebounds a game. Not only was Harrison strong offensively, but on the other side of the ball, he picked up a block and four steals in the tournament.

EAGLES SWEEP FIRST EVER EMU "ICE MAN" CLASSIC: The EMU men's basketball team hosted a tournament inside the friendly confines of the Convocation Center. The Green and White swept the inaugural EMU "Ice Man" Classic, Nov. 9-21, going 4-0 in the four games they played at the Convo.

Eastern opened the tournament with a 66-52 victory over Rochester College, Nov. 9. After taking a break from the classic, EMU won three games in three days, topping Eastern Illinois, 60-52, IPFW, 60-47, and Texas-Pan American, 57-47. **STRUGGLES IN THE LANE:** Despite having an average height of over 6-feet and 6-inches in the starting lineup, the Eagles struggled to get points in the paint against the Jacksonville State Gamecocks, Nov. 11. Eastern was out-scored, 34-20, by JSU in the paint, while they also allowed 16 points off of turnovers. Jacksonville State allowed just four points off turnovers en route to a 61-54 victory.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION: EMU opened up its 2012-13 campaign with an exciting offensive performance against Rochester College. The Eagles shot 49.0 percent (25-for-51) from the floor, while hitting 33.3 percent (4-for-12) of their shots from beyond the arc. **Derek Thompson** went 4-for-6 from the three-point line with 14 points, while "true" freshman **Ray Lee** and redshirt junior **Daylen Harrison** posted 12 points in the 66-52 victory at the Convocation Center.

NEW FACES IN THE CROWD: The EMU men's hoops squad has a slew of new faces on the court this season for second-year Head Coach **Rob Murphy's** Eagles. Returning this season after sitting out due to transfer rules will be redshirt juniors **Glenn Bryant**, **Daylen Harrison**, and sophomore **Josh Lyle**.

Mike Talley will sit out the season for EMU as a junior transfer, but will be eligible for the 2013-14 campaign with a pair of seasons left, as a redshirt junior.

Other new faces to Ypsilanti, Mich. will be a pair of freshmen guards, **Ray Lee** and **Jalen Ross**.

FILLING IN HIS SHOES: In 2011-12, **Darrell Lampley** was the starting point guard for the 2012 MAC West Division Champion Eagles. With the graduation of Lampley, the Eagles had to fill a Third Team All-MAC performer's shoes, and Head Coach **Rob Murphy** thinks he has done just that with a pair of freshmen point guards.

Ray Lee and **Jalen Ross** will be vying for the starting point guard position for the first few games of the 2012-13 campaign. Both Lee and Ross were extremely talented point guards for their respective high school teams. Lee known more for his offensive scoring ability, while Ross is more of a "true" point guard who can distribute the ball and play strong defense.

BLOCKING HIS WAY IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Eastern Michigan senior forward, **Jamell Harris**, posted 40 blocks last season which ranks as the ninth-most in EMU laurels. The Euclid, Ohio native trails former EMU defensive great **Theron Wilson** (1992-96) by 108 blocks. Harris sits second in the record books with 151 career blocks.

Harris not only has been a force blocking shots, but he has made a name for himself on the glass as well. With 444 career rebounds, he is 33rd all-time. **Kennedy McIntosh** (1967-71) has the most with 1,426.

EAGLES PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN THE WEST: EMU was picked to finish second in the West Division in the 2012-13 Mid-American Conference preseason poll by the MAC News Media Panel. The announcement was made in Cleveland Tuesday, Oct. 30. Second-year Head Coach **Rob Murphy** and his Eagles received 118 votes, which was shy of only the University of Toledo's 143 votes in the West Division. Following Toledo and EMU in the poll was Western Michigan (88), Ball State (74), Northern Illinois (46) and Central Michigan (35).

PLAYING TOP-NOTCH TALENT: The EMU men's basketball team has a schedule chock-full of top-notch NCAA talent for the 2012-13 campaign. Throughout the next few months, Eastern will take on three teams ranked in the NCAA top-ten polls.

First, the Eagles traveled to Syracuse, N.Y. to take on the then No. 4/4-ranked Orange of Syracuse University and fell, 48-84. Next, Dec. 20, EMU makes the short trek down Washtenaw to take-on in-county rival University of Michigan who comes into the polls ranked No. 2/2. And, finally Eastern heads to Lexington, Ky. to take on the 2012 NCAA National Champion University of Kentucky Wildcats, Jan. 2. The Wildcats come into the 2012-13 campaign ranked No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll.

CELEBRATING THE FIRST MAC WEST TITLE IN HISTORY: Prior to the Eagles' 2012-13 opening matchup against Rochester College, Nov. 9, the Green and White received their 2012 MAC West Championship rings and raised a banner for winning the division with a record of 9-7 in conference tilts. It was Eastern Michigan's first ever divisional title since the conference moved to the division format in 1997-98.

39th MAC SEASON: The 2012-13 season will also be the 39th for the Eagles in the Mid-American Conference. The first year of MAC play for EMU was 1974-75 when the then-Hurons went 12-14 overall and 4-9 in league play.

EMU has won three Mid-American Conference titles: 1987-88, 1990-91, and 1995-96. The Green and White captured MAC Tournament crowns in all three of those years in addition to winning the tournament title in 1997-98. In 2011-12, the Eagles captured their first-ever Mid-American Conference West Division crown, going 9-7 in MAC tilts.

CONVO UPGRADES SCOREBOARD FOR 2012-13 SEASON: The scoreboard has been replaced inside the Convocation Center just in time for the 2012-13 campaign. The fixture will feature four 10MM full color video boards, with each board's active area measuring 15.7-foot wide by 11.5-foot tall. In addition, the system also features three ribbon displays on the west and east sides and under the scoreboard. The arena also showcases an integrated light emitting diode (LED) courtside scorer's table. It will also features ribbon boards along the sidelines above, between the lower and upper bowls.

EMU'S MURPHY NAMED 2011-12 MAC COACH OF THE YEAR: It did not take long for Eastern Michigan University Head Men's Basketball Coach **Rob Murphy** to make his mark on the Mid-American Conference as the first-year Head Coach was named Mid-American Conference Men's Basketball Coach of the Year for the 2011-12 season. Murphy led the Eagles to a 9-7 MAC record and the school's first-ever West Division championship. Murphy is one of just four first-year coaches to earn the Coach of the Year Award since its inception in 1970.

EAGLES FACE FOES FROM 10 LEAGUES: The 2012-13 EMU men's basketball team will square off against teams from at least 10 different leagues. In addition to its Mid-American Conference schedule that starts Wednesday, Jan. 9, the Eagles will meet teams from the Big Ten (Michigan and Purdue), the Ohio Valley Conference (Jacksonville State and Eastern Illinois), the Summit League (IPFW and Oakland), Horizon (UIC), Great West (Texas-Pan American), Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference (Madonna and Siena Heights), Big East (Syracuse), Southeastern Conference (Kentucky) and Atlantic 10 (Massachusetts). The Eagles will also meet a team that does not hail from a conference, as Rochester College is an independent NAIA school.

MAC TOURNAMENT FORMAT REMAINS THE SAME IN 2013: The 2012 MAC Tournament format returns this season, as the top four seeds will receive multiple byes in 2013. The third and fourth seeds will earn berths in the quarterfinals, with seeds one and two being placed directly into the semifinal round. To put it another way, a team seeded first or second will need to win only two MAC Tournament games to capture the title, while the third or fourth seed would need three wins. Any team seeded fifth through 12th will need to reel off five consecutive wins to capture the tourney crown. The seeding is based on conference winning percentage, regardless of division.

Bryant's Double Double Not Enough in 84-48 Loss to No. 4 Syracuse

Bryant and Thompson hit double figures, Riley racks up six blocks

SYRACUSE, N.Y. (EMUEagles.com) - The Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team fell for just the second time this season Monday night, Dec. 3, with a 84-48 setback to No. 4 Syracuse University inside the Carrier Dome.

EMU has now dropped a road contest to the Orange (6-0) in consecutive seasons by the same 36-point margin. SU won for a program-best 26th straight time on their home court while improving to 2-1 all-time against the Eagles.

The Green and White entered Monday's matchup boasting the eighth-best scoring defense in the nation, but was largely outmatched by Syracuse's press. The Eagles committed 24 turnovers which resulted in 31 points for the Orange. In comparison, EMU converted just nine points off of 18 SU turnovers.

Derek Thompson led all scorers with 18 points, going 7-of-18 with a trio of three-pointers in the second half. Bryant was 6-of-18 to go along with a perfect 4-of-4 effort from the free throw line. The double-double was his first as an Eagle.

Da'Shonte Riley was a force under the basket for the Eagles, denying six Syracuse shots. Those six blocks fell just one shy of his career-best mark of seven.

As a team, the Eagles shot at a 29.5 percent clip (18-of-61) with a 4-of-19 (21.1 percent) effort from downtown and 8-of-12 (66.7 percent) from the charity stripe.

Five Syracuse players reached double figures, with DaJuan Coleman's 14 points pacing the Orange. Brandon Triche's strong second half gave him 12 points for the game, with Mike Carter-Williams, Jerami Grant and Trevor Cooney all posting 11. SU was a blistering 44.1 percent (30-of-68) from the field and went 5-of-22 (22.7 percent) from long distance.

Syracuse's early struggles were nearly forgotten by the end of the first half, as the Orange shot 11-of-31 (35.5 percent) from the floor despite going 1-of-10 from beyond the arc. Carter-Williams and Triche each had seven points at the break.

Eastern Michigan will host Purdue University Saturday, Dec. 8, at 2 p.m. inside the Convocation Center. The game will be available on ESPN3 and 89.1 FM (WEMU).

Eagles Nab Sixth Straight Home Victory, 47-44, Over Purdue
EMU posts first win over Big Ten school since 1997

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) -The Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team held off Purdue University, 47-44, Saturday, Dec. 8, at the Convocation Center. The Eagles (6-2) defeated a Big Ten Conference opponent for the first time since an 89-83 overtime victory against the University of Michigan, Dec. 17, 1997, in Ann Arbor.

Saturday's win was the first home victory over a Big Ten team since a 92-76 throttling of Wisconsin, Dec. 10, 1994 at venerable Bowen Field House.

The Green and White trailed by as many as nine points early in the first half, but were behind by just one at the break after closing the period on a 6-0 run. Efficient three-point shooting and solid defense contributed to the Eagles charging ahead by as many as 10 in the second frame. A late push by the Boilermakers (4-5) proved not to be enough as the Eagles remained undefeated (6-0) at home this season.

As a team, Eastern Michigan shot 17-of-55 (30.9 percent) for the game and 5-of-18 (27.8 percent) from long distance. Following a 0-for-8 mark from three-point range in the opening 20 minutes, EMU caught fire to the tune of a 5-of-10 effort in the second half.

Senior Derek Thompson had a pair of those three-pointers and led the Eagles in scoring with eight points. Saturday's win was truly a team effort as all 10 players that saw action scored at least two points. Redshirt junior Daylen Harrison hauled in 11 boards and added four points.

EMU also won the turnover battle, forcing 18 Purdue turnovers while making just five of its own. The Eagles also picked the Boilermakers' pocket 11 times, with nine players turning in at least one steal. Junior Da'Shonte Riley and redshirt junior Glenn Bryant each posted a pair of blocks on the afternoon.

For the Boilermakers, Terone Johnson (12 points), A.J. Hammons (11) and Ronnie Johnson (11) all reached double figures despite the rest of the team only contributing a total of 10 points. Purdue shot just under 30 percent for the game (14-of-47) and was 4-of-14 (28.6 percent) from downtown.

The Eagles are back on the hardwood Saturday, Dec. 15, with a 1 p.m. road tilt against the University of Illinois-Chicago in Chicago, Ill. EMU will have a chance to win its first road game of the year against the Flames after starting the season 0-2 away from home.
