#### WILDCATS OPEN SEC PLAY VERSUS NO. 15 GATORS

After losing its first battle for the Governor's Cup since 2006, Kentucky looks to regroup and get back to its winning ways by opening Southeastern Conference play with the 15th-ranked Florida Gators on Saturday at Commonwealth Stadium.

The matchup with the Gators will complete a three-game homestand for the Wildcats, who will travel to square off against nationally ranked LSU and South Carolina in the following two weeks.

Offensively, Kentucky has been led this season by junior wide receiver La'Rod King, who has scored a touchdown in all three UK games this season. King leads the Wildcats in receiving with 14 catches for 226 yards and three touchdowns, while junior E.J. Fields is second on the team with seven catches for 57 yards and a touchdown.

Junior starting quarterback Morgan Newton continues to gain more experience and improve game by game. The native of Carmel, Ind., has completed 55.8 percent of his passes this season for 466 yards and four touchdowns. Newton is also third on the team in rushing with 50 yards, while true freshman Josh Clemons leads UK's rushing attack with 37 carries for 193 yards and two touchdowns.

On defensive, Kentucky is led by senior All-America linebacker Danny Trevathan, whose 38 tackles leads the SEC. The native of Leesburg, Fla., will look to extend his impressive streak of 12-consecutive games of 10-plus tackles against his home state school. Fellow senior Winston Guy is second on the team with 30 tackles, four tackles for loss, one pass breakup and two interceptions.

UK is looking for its first win over Florida since 1986. The teams have met annually since 1967.

#### **QUICK NOTES**

- UK ranks in the top 40 of five national statistical categories. The Cats are 11th in net punting (42.1 net yards per punt); 16th in pass efficiency defense (96.6 rating points); 19th in scoring defense (13.3 points per game); 32nd in pass defense (178 yards per game) and 39th in total defense (314.7 yards per game).
- Kentucky and Florida are meeting for the 62nd time in school history. The Gators have won 24 consecutive games against the Wildcats, dating back to the 1987 season. UK's last win over Florida Florida was a 10-3 victory in Lexington in 1986.
- The Wildcats are looking for their first win over a ranked opponent since upsetting No. 10 South Carolina last season in Commonwealth Stadium, 31-28. UK's last win over a ranked Florida team was a 28-9 decision in 1976. The Gators were ranked No. 15.
- Linebacker Danny Trevathan has posted double-digit tackles in 12 consecutive games, dating back to last season. The SEC's leading tackler (38) ranks fourth nationally in tackles per game (12.67).
- UK punter Ryan Tydlacka is 15th in the nation in punting (44.9 yards per punt).
- Kentucky's Joker Phillips is in his second season as head coach of the Wildcats after leading UK to a school record fifth-consecutive bowl game last season.
- UK is 5-0 under Joker Phillips in games that the Wildcats win the turnover margin.
- Kentucky is opening a stretch of three-consecutive games against teams that likely will be
  nationally ranked. Previous times in school history that has occurred include 1958, 1968,
  1970, 1976, 1988, 2007 and 2009.
- The Cats are in their 39th season at Commonwealth Stadium. UK holds a 131-109-4 record and a .546 winning percentage on its home field.

# ON THIS DATE IN WILDCAT HISTORY

# **MILESTONES TO WATCH**

- Kentucky senior linebacker Danny Trevathan has 269 tackles in his
  career, only 31 tackles short of being the 18th player in school history
  to record 300 tackles or more for the Wildcats.
- Trevathan owns a streak of 12 consecutive games with double-figure tackles. He recorded a team-high 13 tackles vs. WKU and Central Michigan and had 12 vs. Louisville.
- Matt Roark has blocked six kicks in his career for the Wildcats, which
  ranks him second in school history. Roark needs one more blocked kick
  to tie Lonnell Dewalt for the school record. Roark's blocks include five
  extra points and a field goal.

# **GAME NOTES VS. FLORIDA**

#### SERIES RECORD VS. FLORIDA

Kentucky and Florida will meet for the 62nd time in school history ... The Gators have won 24 consecutive meetings with the Wildcats, dating back to the 1987 season ... The last time UK defeated Florida was a 10-3 victory in Lexington in 1986 ... Florida has an all-time record of 17-10 against the Wildcats in Lexington, winning 11 straight games against the Wildcats in Commonwealth Stadium ... Florida leads the all-time series 44-17 ... Kentucky is 3-28 against ranked Florida teams ... The two teams have met annually since the 1967 season.

#### LAST TIME VS. FLORIDA

Senior wide receiver Chris Matthews hauled in a career-high six catches for 114 yards and two touchdowns, but it was not enough for the Cats, who fell to the Florida Gators 48-14 in front of a crowd of 90,574 at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium in Gainesville, Fla., last season.

Florida freshman quarterback Trey Burton began his six-touchdown career night with an 11-yard touchdown run from behind center. On the Gators' next possession, Burton switched the tables and caught an 11-yard touchdown pass from UF starting quarterback John Brantley.

In the second quarter, the Gators' Jeremy Brown ended a Kentucky drive with a 52-yard interception return for a touchdown. The Cats responded with a drive deep into Florida territory. It was there that Kentucky pulled off a fake field goal attempt, in which junior Randall Cobb, who was the holder for the kick, threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to a wide-open Matthews. The touchdown pass capped the scoring in the first half and made the score 21-7.

After Florida's Burton rushed 10 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter, the Cats' Matt Roark blocked the Gators' point-after attempt to make the score 27-7. Just over midway through the third quarter, Kentucky senior quarterback Mike Hartline threw a gorgeous 27-yard touchdown pass to Matthews to bring the Cats within 13 points. Hartline finished the game completing 21-of-39 passes for 242 yards and a touchdown. Burton and the Gators responded, however, with a nine-yard touchdown rush from the speedy freshman. Burton continued his record-setting play in the fourth quarter with two more touchdowns.

#### **SCOUTING FLORIDA**

Under first-year head coach Will Muschamp, the Florida Gators come to Commonwealth Stadium with a 3-0 record and boasting one of the best defenses in the nation.

The Gators rank seventh in the nation in total defense, allowing only 209.3 yards per game, while UF leads the nation in rushing defense only allowing 30.7 rushing yards per game. Florida is led by junior linebacker Jonathan Bostic, who has 16 tackles, three tackles for loss and one sack on

the season. Sophomore Jelani Jenkins is second on the team with 13 tackles, one tackle for loss and one sack.

As a team, the Gators have an impressive 20 tackles for loss, 11 quarterback hurries, 13 pass breakups and two blocked kicks this season.

Offensively, the Gators have performed well, scoring over 33 points per game. Senior quarterback John Brantley paces UF by completing over 65% (47-72) of his passes for 637 yards and three touchdowns.

Brantley's key targets are seniors Chris Rainey and Jeff Demps, who rank first and second on the team in both rushing and receiving. Rainey has 48 rushes this season for 306 yards and two touchdowns, while Demps isn't too far behind with 24 rushes for 163 yards and two touchdowns. On the receiving end, Rainey leads the way again with 11 catches for 214 yards and two touchdowns, while Demps is second with eight catches for 68 yards.

#### **BIG GAMES VS. FLORIDA**

1950 - One of Kentucky's big wins in its national championship season was a 40-6 home victory over No. 17 Florida. All-America quarterback Vito "Babe" Parilli threw two touchdown passes and led the Wildcats to 459 yards total offense.

1976 - Kentucky played seven ranked teams in the 1976 season, winning four of those games. One of those victories was a 28-9 home win over No. 15 Florida as the Wildcats eventually won the Southeastern Conference championship. Coach Fran Curci termed Kentucky's effort, "The most complete game I have ever been associated with as a coach."

1986 - Kentucky's last win over Florida came in 1986 as the Wildcats defeated the Gators, 10-3, on a cold, drizzly day in Lexington. Quarterback Bill Ransdell completed 20-of-23 passes for 161 yards as the Kentucky offense controlled the ball for 41 minutes. Mark Higgs rushed for 95 yards and scored the game's only touchdown on a one-yard run in the first quarter.

# **KENTUCKY-FLORIDA TIES**

- Kentucky has seven players on its 2011 roster from the state of Florida, including starting linebackers Danny Trevathan (Leesburg) and Ronnie Sneed (Tallahassee). The other five Wildcats are Mike Douglas (Largo), James Elliott (Pensacola), Brandon Gainer (Miami), Demarius Rancifer (Pensacola) and Taiedo Smith (Dunnellon)
- Florida center Sam Robey is the only Gator from Kentucky. He attended Trinity High School in Louisville. He is the son of former UK basketball player Rick Robey.
- Sam Robey played high school football at Trinity with Kentucky kicker Ryan Tydlacka, tight end Nick Melillo, defensive tackle Luke McDermott.
- Florida offensive coordinator/quarterbacks Charlie Weis and Kentucky defensive coordinator Rick Minter spent time together at Notre Dame. Weis was the head coach of the Fighting Irish from 2005-09, while Minter served as the defensive coordinator/linebackers coach from 2005-06. Together, the two coaches led Notre Dame to two bowl games.
- Phillips and co-defensive coordinator Rick Minter were on staff together at Cincinnati during the 1998 season with Florida director of strength and conditioning Mickey Marotti. Minter was the head coach of the Bearcats while Phillips was an assistant coach in charge of defensive backs and Marotti was the head strength and conditioning coach.

#### **UK VS. THE RANKED**

- Over the years, Kentucky has played 222 games against opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 20/25 Poll.
- The Cats own a 39-178-5 record against ranked opponents.
- Florida is the first of three possible ranked opponents in a row.
- UK's last win over a ranked team was last season (Oct. 16) over No. 10 South Carolina (31-28) in Commonwealth Stadium.
- Kentucky is 3-28 against Florida when the Gators have been ranked.
- UK's last win over a ranked Florida team was a 28-9 decision in 1976. The Gators were ranked No. 15.

# UK IN THE BLUE ZONE (20-AND-IN)

Kentucky has converted 5 of 8 opportunities (62.5 percent) in the "Blue Zone" (20-yard-line and in) for 31 points (4 touchdowns, one field goal, one missed field goal, one turnover, one lost on downs). UK ranks 6th in the SEC in "Blue Zone" defense as opponents have converted 4 of 5 opportunities (80.0 percent) for 12 points (four field goals and one missed field goal).

# KING OF THE RECEIVERS

Junior wide receiver La'Rod King has gotten the season off to a good start with a touchdown catch in each of the first three games.

King had a career day in the win over Central Michigan with five catches for 100 yards, including a 34-yard TD.

For the season, King has 14 catches for 226 yards and three TDs.

#### CLEMONS CONTINUES TO IMPRESS

Freshman running back Josh Clemons leads the team in rushing with 37 carries for 193 yards, including two touchdowns, both of which were eventual game-winning scores.

In the season opener vs. WKU, Clemons had a 14-yard touchdown, becoming the first true freshman running back to score a rushing touchdown in the season opener since Donnell Gordon in 1993. The TD gave UK a 7-3 lead and the Wildcats went on to win 14-3.

Against Central Michigan, Clemons totaled 14 rushes for a career-high 128 yards. His 87-yard third quarter TD run was the longest run since Bernie Scruggs' 88-yard run vs. Georgia in 1970 and the fourth-longest run and third-longest TD run in UK history. It was the longest rush by a UK freshman ever and the longest run in Commonwealth Stadium history. It put UK

#### INJURY BUG BITES UK O-LINE

With four starters and a part-time regular returning, the offensive line looked to be in great shape for 2011. However, the injury bug has bitten hard as all five starters have been injured since practice began in August.

Currently, right tackle Billy Joe Murphy has missed the last two games. True freshman Darrian Miller has started in his place. Starting center Matt Smith missed the first two games but returned in a reserve role in the Louisville game.

# **DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS**

- In three games, UK's defense has forced six turnovers, all interceptions. The Wildcats are tied for second in the SEC in interceptions.
- UK ranks fourth in the SEC and 32nd nationally in pass defense efficiency (96.9 rating points) and is fifth in the SEC and 19th in the nation in scoring defense (13.3).
- The Kentucky defense held Central Michigan to 88 yards rushing, the lowest amount an opponent has gained on UK since Tennessee had 76 yards rushing on Nov. 27, 2010.
- UK's defense held WKU to 93 passing yards, the fewest since allowing only 90 yards passing at Ole Miss last season (Oct. 2, 2010). The Cats currently rank second in the SEC in passing defense.
- UK also held WKU to 234 total yards, the fewest by an opponent since Akron's 172 total yards a year ago on Sept. 18, 2010.
- Kentucky's defense held WKU without a TD, surrendering only three points. That's the lowest scoring output by an opponent since shutting out Miami-Ohio, 42-0, on Sept. 5, 2009 in Cincinnati. UK ranks tied for first in the SEC with Florida in scoring defense.
- The UK defense totaled four interceptions vs. WKU, the most by Kentucky since four picks vs. Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2005. The last time UK forced four turnovers was in its win over South Carolina on Oct. 16, 2010.
- Kentucky's defense charted a season-high four sacks vs. Louisville.

# TREVATHAN LEADS SEC (AGAIN)

Senior linebacker Danny Trevathan has picked up where he left off a year ago.

Trevathan has 38 tackles this season and leads the SEC in that category. His average of 12.7 is fourth nationally. He led the SEC last season with 144 tackles.

Trevathan also has a streak of 12 consecutive games with double-figure tackles, including the last nine games of the 2010 season.

#### He's THE GUY

Hybrid defensive player Winston Guy has been all over the field for the Wildcats this season. Against WKU, the senior from Lexington, Ky., not only charted 10 tackles but led the team in tackles for loss (2.5 for 8 yards) and interceptions (2) in his new role as a hybrid safety/linebacker. He was named the Defensive Back Performer of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards for his impressive play vs. WKU.

In the Central Michigan game, Guy posted 13 tackles, just the second time in his career he has had back-to-back games with double-figure tackles.

He currently is tied for third in the SEC and tied for eighth nationally in interceptions and ranks sixth in the SEC in total tackles with 30 stops.

#### **UKWU FULFILLING THE PREDICTION**

Before the season, Coach Joker Phillips predicted that Collins Ukwu would be a standout performer and the junior defensive end is fulfilling his coach's words.

Ukwu had a career-best seven tackles in the Central Michigan game, featuring two tackles for loss, a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry.

Ukwu had a quarterback sack in the opener vs. Western Kentucky University.

#### **SPECIAL TEAM HIGHLIGHTS**

- Ryan Tydlacka has been outstanding so far this season with 16 punts for an average of 44.9 yards and four punts inside the 20-yard line. Tydlacka's average puts him third in the SEC, while the Wildcats rank first in the conference in punting as a team. He has twice been named the Honorable Mention Punter of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards.
- · Kentucky currently leads the SEC in net punting, netting 42.1 yards per punt.
- Joe Mansour also has been named the Honorable Mention Kickoff Specialist of the Week twice this season. Against CMU, Mansour had six kickoffs and three touchbacks, increasing his season totals to nine kickoffs and four touchbacks. Behind Mansour's impressive kicking, Kentucky ranks first in the SEC in kickoff coverage with 50.2 net yards per kickoff.

# **CAT SCRATCHES**

#### FIRST-YEAR Success OF "OPERATION WIN"

Coach Joker Phillips notched a number of successes in his first year of "Operation Win" - win on the field, win in the classroom and win in the community.

On the field, Kentucky's season was highlighted by a win at in-state rival Louisville and an upset of No. 10 South Carolina, the eventual Eastern Division champion of the Southeastern Conference.

The season was topped by a trip to the BBVA Compass Bowl, making Phillips the first coach in Kentucky history to go to a bowl game in his first season. UK's six victories were the most for a



# Commonwealth Stadium



# On game day, Commonwealth Stadium usually becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.

- The Cats are in their 39th season at Commonwealth Stadium.
- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 244 games within the friendly confines of
- Commonwealth Stadium. UK has a 131-109-4 record (.546) in Commonwealth.

  Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 65,250 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 25 teams in attendance for 11 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years.
- In 2009, for the third-straight year, Kentucky fans broke the school record for average attendance at 69,594 per game. The previous mark was 69,434 per game in the 2008 season.
- The crowd of 71,024 vs. Florida on Oct. 20, 2007 was the largest crowd in the 38-year history of Commonwealth Stadium. The previous stadium record was 71,022 for the 1999 Tennessee game.
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

#### Facts and Figures on Commonwealth Stadium:

Seating Capacity: 67,942, including the Commonwealth Suites. With game workers, media, etc., total attendance can exceed 70.000.

Video Boards: Newly installed video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, will bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The new video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage.

Sound System: Also new for 2011, the Sportsound system will deliver pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

Ribbon Boards: Commonwealth Stadium's interior seating bowl will have new LED ribbon boards, allowing fans a more enjoyable experience.

#### Game Day Experiences

The "Cat Walk": Fans are encouraged to greet the team when the Wildcats arrive for the "Cat Walk." The team buses will arrive at the Nutter Field House approximately two hours and 15 minutes before the game and the players will make the "Cat Walk" to their stadium entry point at Gate 1. Fans are encouraged to line up on the sidewalk and cheer the players as they enter the stadium.

A siren will be sounded while the team buses are on their way to the stadium. That's the fans' cue to proceed to the Cat Walk area to greet the team.

Wildcat Refuge: Fans of all ages, but especially the younger Wildcats, will enjoy playing at the Wildcat Refuge, located outside of the southwest corner (outside Gate 9) of Commonwealth Stadium. There are five giant inflatable games that are available two hours before kickoff.

UK Marching Band Will Parade Around Stadium: The UK Marching Band will parade around the stadium, beginning approximately one hour prior to kickoff. The and parade will begin at and return to Gate 4.

first-year Wildcat coach since Blanton Collier in 1954.

In the classroom, the overall team grade-point average has risen over the past year. A total of 22 players earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. Offensive tackle Billy Joe Murphy was voted to the Academic All-District team and advanced to the national ballot for Academic All-America.

Phillips and the Wildcats also have been very active in community service, completing numerous personal appearances and work projects.

# WILDCATS STRIVE TO EXTEND RECORD STREAK

In 2011, the Kentucky football team is seeking to continue its school-record streak of five consecu-

The Wildcats have advanced to postseason play each year since 2006, going to the Music City Bowl twice, followed by the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, another Music City Bowl and the BBVA Compass Bowl. The Wildcats won three of those matchups, defeating Clemson in 2006, Florida State in 2007 and East Carolina in the Liberty Bowl.

Kentucky is one of only 28 teams in the country that have gone to at least five-straight bowls. Alabama, Florida, Georgia, LSU and Kentucky are the Southeastern Conference teams that have accomplished that feat.

#### **COACHING STAFF CHANGES**

Two new assistant coaches have come on board since the end of the 2010 regular season as Joker Phillips brought in Rick Minter as co-defensive coordinator and Steve Pardue as running backs coach.

Phillips and Minter first worked together in 1997-98 at the University of Cincinnati, where Minter was head coach and Phillips was an assistant. Minter has rich experience as a defensive coordinator at Notre Dame, South Carolina, Marshall and Ball State.

Pardue and Phillips were longtime associates on the recruiting trail. Phillips was an annual visitor to LaGrange (Ga.) High School, where Pardue was head coach from 1994-2010 and won three state championships. Several Grangers went on to outstanding careers at UK, including linebackers Wesley Woodyard and Braxton Kelley and wide receiver Quentin McCord. Six Grangers are on the current Kentucky roster.

# WILDCATS ADD NEW DEFENSIVE SCHEME; LOOK FOR MORE BIG PLAYS

Kentucky has developed a new look on defense this season as the Wildcats are adding the 3-4 defensive system to the 4-3 alignment already in place. With two players designated as "hybrids" -- a combination linebacker/defensive end and combination safety/linebacker, the UK defense has more flexibility to adapt to opponent offensive formations.

Coach Joker Phillips has stated that creating more big plays on defense - turnovers and negativeyardage plays - is a goal for the 2011 season. Turnovers have been called the most important statistic in football. It's interesting to note that Kentucky was +7 in turnover margin during the team's wins last season and had a -11 margin in the games lost.

# TREVATHAN, GUY CALL DELAY OF (NFL) GAME

With both players citing "unfinished business" as a reason, All-America linebacker Danny Trevathan and All-Southeastern Conference safety Winston Guy went through the National Football League evaluation process in January but decided to remain at Kentucky for their senior seasons.

Trevathan led the SEC in tackles with 144 stops, most for a league player since 2002. He also had 16 tackles for loss and caused four fumbles. He was chosen first-team All-America by CollegeFootballNews.com and first-team All-SEC by multiple selectors.

Guy notched 106 tackles and led the team in interceptions with three pickoffs. He was tabbed secondteam All-SEC by CollegeFootballNews.com and fourth-team All-SEC by Phil Steele's College Football.

# TOP 11 TACKLERS RETURN

Kentucky fielded its most inexperienced defensive unit in 20 years in the 2010 season. The positive for the coming season is that the top 11 tacklers return from that youthful unit.

Linebacker Danny Trevathan and safety Winston Guy each topped the century mark last season with 144 and 106 tackles, respectively. The additional top stoppers returning are linebacker Ronnie Sneed (61 tackles), safety Mychal Bailey (58), cornerback-turned-safety Martavius Neloms (55), cornerback Randall Burden (36), cornerback Anthony Mosley (34), linebacker Ridge Wilson (30), end Taylor Wyndham (27), end Collins Ukwu (26) and tackle Mark Crawford (24).

#### **MUCH PRODUCTION TO REPLACE**

An obvious priority in 2011 will be replacing some of the most productive offensive players in Kentucky history, quarterback Mike Hartline, wide receivers Randall Cobb and Chris Matthews, and running back Derrick Locke.

Hartline threw for 3,178 yards last year, Cobb set the Southeastern Conference single-season record for all-purpose yardage, Matthews tied for the league lead in touchdown catches and Locke rushed for 2,618 yards in his career. All four earned various All-SEC honors and Cobb was a first-team All-American.

To put it in perspective, UK's returning players account for only 22 percent of last year's rushing yardage, 7.5 percent of the passing yardage and 31.1 percent of the receiving yardage.

On the bright side on offense, four starters return in the O-line, tackle Chandler Burden, guards Stuart Hines and Larry Warford and center Matt Smith. The new starter at right tackle is senior Billy Joe Murphy, who has significant experience in his career.

Another positive is that UK also has some experience returning at quarter-back. Junior Morgan Newton has started nine games over the past two seasons when Hartline was sidelined. Newton's career stats feature 100 of 178 passing (56.2 percent) for 971 yards and six touchdowns.

Newton has a returning starter at wide receiver as La'Rod King caught 36 passes for 478 yards and five touchdowns last season. Raymond Sanders is the leading returning rusher with 254 yards.

#### SCHEDULE NOTES

Kentucky began the 2011 season on Thursday, Sept. 1, as the Wildcats took on Western Kentucky University in Nashville. The teams played at LP Field, home of the NFL's Tennessee Titans. UK had a similar scenario in 2009, when the Wildcats opened the slate in Cincinnati's Paul Brown Stadium against Miami (Ohio).

UK's home opener came against Central Michigan on Sept. 10. UK last took on the Chippewas in 2006 ... The annual game against in-state rival Louisville was Sept. 17 ... Kentucky's SEC slate starts on Sept. 24 at home vs. Florida ... LSU replaces Auburn as the rotating SEC opponent. The Wildcats' last game at LSU was in 2006 ... UK's open date is Oct. 15, the exact midpoint of the schedule ... On Oct. 22, UK begins a three-game homestand with Homecoming foe Jacksonville State, followed by Mississippi

State and Ole Miss. It will be UK's first game against Jacksonville State, which gained notoriety last season for knocking off Ole Miss in Oxford.

# TREVATHAN, TYDLACKA, WARFORD NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

University of Kentucky seniors Danny Trevathan and Ryan Tydlacka, along with junior Larry Warford were named Preseason All-Southeastern Conference by league coaches and members of the media.

Trevathan and Warford each brought home first-team honors as a line-backer and a offensive lineman respectively. Tydlacka, who is entering his third season as the starting punter, took home third-team honors in both.

Trevathan and Warford both were honored with All-SEC honors last season with Trevathan a first-team linebacker and Warford a second-team offensive lineman. Tydlacka had a good season for UK in 2010 including being named National Punter of the Week during the season.

#### **SPECIAL FORCES**

An admirer of the United States military, Joker Phillips hopes to emulate the military's discipline, teamwork and efficiency with the Wildcats, most notably on special teams, which Phillips has renamed "Special Forces."

Here are some notes about the "Special Forces":

- Senior Ryan Tydlacka returns as the starting punter after averaging 43.8 yards per punt in 2010. Tydlacka was named the National Punter of the Week for the Ole Miss game after he launched a career-long 73-yard punt.
- Also returning for UK is junior field goal kicker Craig McIntosh, who finished the 2010 season second on the team in scoring with 67 points. The native of Lexington, Ky., made 11-of-15 field goals and 34-of-35 extra points. McIntosh made eight-consecutive field goals last season, which is the second-longest streak in school history.
- Matt Roark has used his 6-foot-6 height advantage to be a force on special teams. Roark has blocked six kicks during his career, including five extra points and a field goal. His six blocked kicks ranks him second all-time in UK history.

# **GAMEDAY READY IN AFRICA**

Seven people affiliated with University of Kentucky Athletics - Athletic Director Mitch Barnhart and wife Connie, Head Football Coach Joker Phillips and wife Leslie, Associate AD Jason Schlafer, and football players Stuart Hines and Danny Trevathan - spent a week doing a service trip to Ethiopia. They visited orphanages, did work projects, distributed food and athletic equipment, etc.

The experience was a once-in-a-lifetime chance for Hines and Trevathan, who both said the trip was life-changing.

The trip was part of Phillips' Gameday Ready Tour initiative, which made five in-state stops in the summer of 2010 and two in-state stops this summer. In all, Phillips has held the fun and interactive tour stops in Hyden, Central City, Danville, Louisville, Franklin, Pikeville and Covington.



# **KENTUCKY 14, WESTERN KENTUCKY 3**

# **SEPT. 1, 2011**



Behind the first career rushing touchdown from freshman tailback Josh Clemons and junior La'Rod King's seventh career receiving touchdown, the University of Kentucky football team claimed its fifth-consecutive season opener, taking down in-state foe Western Kentucky University 14-3 at LP Field in Nashville, Tenn.

The win extended Kentucky's school-record regular-season non-conference winning streak to 20 games and also kept UK undefeated against WKU all-time, moving to 3-0 in series history. Although a home game for WKU, the game was played at LP Field in Nashville, the home of the Tennessee Titans.

The Wildcats had an impressive defensive performance under new co-defensive coordinator Rick Minter, limiting WKU to 93 passing yards and only 234 yards of total

offense. Kentucky's defense surrendered only three points to the Hilltoppers, while racking up four interceptions in one game for the first time since 2005.

Individually, Kentucky was led defensively by seniors Danny Trevathan, Winston Guy and Ronnie Sneed, who each posted double-figure tackles. Trevathan paced the Wildcats with 13, while Guy had 10 tackles and two interceptions and Sneed earned a career-best 10 stops and also had a pickoff.

WKU opened the scoring in the first quarter with a 41-yard field goal by Casey Tinius. In the second quarter, the UK offense was sparked by Guy's first interception of the game, leading to Clemons' 14-yard touchdown run to give the Wildcats a lead they would not relinquish.

After both defenses dominated play in the third quarter, Kentucky put the game away with a key touchdown with less than five minutes remaining in the fourth quarter. Facing third-and-long deep in his own territory, UK quarterback Morgan Newton rushed up the middle for 58 yards for a pivotal first down. Two plays later, Newton hit King on a beautiful pass in the corner of the endzone to propel the Wildcats to a 14-3 victory.

# KENTUCKY 27, CENTRAL MICHIGAN 13

# **SEPT. 10, 2011**



Kentucky used another second-half shutout from its defense and scored 24 unanswered points, including an 87-yard touchdown run by freshman Josh Clemons, to win its sixth-consecutive home opener in a 27-13 victory over Central Michigan at Commonwealth Stadium.

The Wildcats' defense was solid for the second-consecutive game, limiting Central Michigan to less than 100 yards rushing and earning two interceptions. UK was led by linebacker Danny Trevathan, who notched 13 tackles, including three tackles for loss, plus an interception. Safety/linebacker Winston Guy also had 13 tackles and safety Martavius Neloms posted 10 stops.

The Chippewas jumped out to an early lead in the game, taking the opening drive down the field for a David Harman 19-yard field goal.

After Kentucky tied the score at 3-3 by a 41-yard field goal from Craig McIntosh, Central Michigan scored 10 straight points to take a 13-3 lead behind a touchdown reception from Jerry Harris and another field goal from Harman.

Kentucky tacked on another field goal before halftime, this time a 45-yarder from

McIntosh before rattling off 21 unanswered points.

After both teams punted twice to start the second half, Kentucky swung the momentum in its direction by stopping CMU on fourth-and-inches in its own territory. On the next play, UK quarterback Morgan Newton rifled a 34-yard touchdown pass to

wide receiver La'Rod King, tying the game at 13-13.

On Kentucky's next possession, UK true freshman running back Josh Clemons ran into a pile in the middle of the field, then broke away to his right and raced to the end zone for an 87-yard touchdown. It is the longest run in school history by a Wildcat freshman and the fourth-longest run in school history. The dash gave the Wildcats a lead they wouldn't relinquish. UK put the game away on its next drive, marching 85 yards down the field before Newton rushed for a one-yard touchdown to go up 27-13.

# **LOUISVILLE 24, KENTUCKY 17**

# **SEPT. 17, 2011**



Kentucky put together a late rally but came up short in a comeback effort against in-state rival Louisville, falling 24-17 at Commonwealth Stadium. The win for Louisville marked the first time since 2007 that Kentucky did not win the battle for the Governor's Cup.
The game started with the Wildcats marching down the

field to the Louisville two-yard line before the Cardinals' defense stiffened and held the Wildcats to a 20-yard field goal by junior Craig McIntosh. Late in the quarter, Louisville gained the lead it would not relinquish when starting quarterback Will Stein connected on a 38-yard touchdown pass to Andrell Smith to give the Cardinals a 7-3 lead.

U of L tacked on seven more points with just over a minute to go in the first half when Teddy Bridgewater,

who replaced the injured Stein at quarterback, completed a 25-yard touchdown pass to DeVante Parker.

Kentucky and quarterback Morgan Newton responded before the half ended, taking the ball 80 yards down the field and cutting the U of L lead to 14-10 when King caught

a 15-yard touchdown pass from Newton with 10 seconds remaining in the half.

Louisville received the opening kickoff of the second half and put three points on the board to take its lead back to seven when Chris Philpott connected from 20 yards out.

The Cardinals took a 24-10lead with just over 11 minutes remaining in the game when Bridgewater hit Josh Bellamy for a 25-yard touchdown pass.

UK began its comeback effort on the next drive, getting a two-yard touchdown pass from Newton to wide receiver E.J. Fields to cut the lead in half. After U of L went three-and-out on its next possession, Kentucky started a would-be game tying drive before losing the ball on downs at the Louisville 18-yard line.
