## QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky entered the rankings after opening weekend, checking in No. 30 in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association top-30 poll and No. 25 in the Perfect Game USA top 25.
- Juniors Austin Cousino and A.J. Reed have been named to the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award Watch List, given to the NCAA's top collegiate player.
- UK has won 89 consecutive games when staked to an eighth-inning lead, dating back to 2011. In the UK head coach Gary Henderson era, UK is 141-5 when leading after eight innings.
- The Wildcats posted an 8-3 win over No. 1 Virginia in the season opener, marking their fourth win over a No. 1 ranked team in the Henderson era. UK had just one win over a No. 1 ranked team from 2003-08.
- UK's seven-game road swing to open up the 2014 season marks a season-long.
- Sophomore Kyle Barrett enters the weekend having reached base safely in a team-high 22 straight games.
- Two-way star A.J. Reed is a preseason first-team All-America selection by Baseball America, with centerfielder Austin Cousino earning a third-team preseason All-America honors.
- Junior Chandler Shepherd entered his final start of the summer with a shot at the Cape Cod League ERA title, owning a 0.87 mark.
- Shepherd is ranked as the No. 70 prospect available in the 2014 MLB Draft, with Reed ranked No. 85 and Cousino tabbed No. 97.
- Righty Kyle Cody is ranked by Baseball America as the seventh-best sophomore in college baseball. Infielder Connor Heady is ranked as the 38th best freshman in the nation.
- The Wildcats will face 41 percent of its 2014 schedule against teams ranked in the preseason.

## OPENING WEEKEND

Kentucky opened the 2014 season with four games in four days, with its trip to Wilmington, N.C., an adventure with a storm hitting the east coast. UK adjusted its departure time to beat the storm, leaving at 6 a.m. on Wednesday morning and driving for 16 hours to make it to the North Carolina beach. UK posted an 8-3 win over No. 1 Virginia in the season opener on Friday, riding a strong start from A.J. Reed, who worked five innings and allowed just one run. In relief, sophomore lefty Ryne Combs tossed 3.2 innings and was an out shy of recording a four-inning save before UVA struck for two, two-out runs to end his outing. UK was paced by an offensive attack that belted six doubles and stole four bases.

The win over No.1 ranked UVA marked the fourth win over a top-ranked foe in the Gary Henderson era. UK won just one game over a No. 1 ranked team from 2003-08, with Henderson claiming three wins in the last three years vs. No. 1 foes.

On Saturday, UK got a dominating start from junior right-hander Chandler Shepherd in a 10-4 win over UNC Wilmington, the two-time Colonial Athletic Association Champion. Shepherd carried a no-hitter into the fifth inning and finished an out shy of his second career quality start. UK got a four-RBI game from Reed, who belted a three-run homer into the teeth of a 25-mph wind blowing from right to leftfield. UK was also paced at the plate by a 3-for-3 game from Ka'ai Tom, making his UK debut in leftfield.

UK faced off with VMI on Sunday in a 10 a.m. ET first pitch at Brooks Field, with the Wildcats jumping out to a hefty lead before the Keydets bounced back to take a one-run lead on a two-out, three-run homer in the bottom of the eighth inning. UK rallied with a game-tying, two-out pinch-hit single from Micheal Thomas and a wild-pitch run from Tom served as the go-ahead run. UK then went to Zach Strecker in relief to try and close out the game, with Strecker getting a groundout to open the game and then an error on a routine grounder put the tying run at second. Strecker then got a slow roller to the left side that went as an infield single with UK short-stop Matt Reida's throw just not enough to get the runner at first. Strecker then got a tailor-made double-play ball to the left side of the infield, that slide under the glove of UK third baseman Max Kuhn for an error, loading the bases with one out and the walk-off run at second base. Strecker worked the count to 1-2, before a game-winning single was hit up the middle.

Immediately after the game, UK traveled to South Carolina to face USC Upstate on Monday at 1 p.m. ET, the third consecutive year UK has faced Upstate on a Monday on opening weekend. UK jumped out to an early lead but Upstate rallied to tie the game at 4-4 after getting four runs in the bottom of the third inning against starter Dylan Dwyer, who had struck out the side in the first two innings of the game. Upstate took a lead in the sixth inning with a three-run rally, with the Spartans holding off a UK threat for an 8-6 win.

## LEADING THE WILDCATS

Kentucky has hit .308 as a team in 2014, slugging .441 with a .398 on-base percentage. UK has belted 13 doubles, two homers and stolen 10 bases. Defensively, UK has fielded .944 through four games, with four double plays turned. On the mound, UK has a 5.24 ERA as a team, walking 15 in 34.1 innings, striking out 32 and holding opponents to a .321 slugging percentage.

Individually, UK has been led by sophomore outfielder Ka'ai Tom's .625 average to open the year, with the Hawaiian going 5-for-8 with an RBI to open his career. All-American centerfielder Austin Cousino has hit .444 (8-for-18) with two hits in each game, slugging two doubles, one homer and three RBI, stealing two bags. A.J. Reed has hit .353 (6-for-17) with two doubles, one homer and six RBI, with third baseman Max Kuhn batting .353 (6-for-17) with three doubles and two RBI. Rightfielder Kyle Barrett has batted .333 (6-for-18) with a double and three RBI, stealing two bases. Catcher Micheal Thomas has hit .333 with two doubles and two RBI. Freshmen JaVon Shelby and Connor Heady are both 2-for-8 to open their careers, each tallying two RBI.

In the bullpen, UK has been paced in two appearances by junior Spencer Jack (0-0, 0.00) who has worked four innings, allowing three singles and striking out five. Freshman southpaw Logan Salow (0-0, 0.00 ERA) worked 2.1 innings without allowing an earned run in his NCAA debut, striking out five of the seven outs he recorded. Zach Strecker (0-1, 0.00 ERA) has appeared in two games with two outs recorded and two unearned runs scoring. Ryne Combs (0-0, 4.91 ERA) has worked 3.2 innings in relief, with Andrew Nelson (0-0, 5.40 ERA) and Sam Mahar (0-0, 5.40 ERA) each allowing a run in 1.2 innings in relief. Taylor Martin (0-0, 11.57 ERA) has worked 2.1 innings, with Matt Snyder (0-0, 13.50 ERA) and Robert Zeigler (0-1, 81.00 ERA) each making their sea-

## SERIES HISTORY

Kentucky will be facing St. Joe's for the first time since 1969, with the series tied 1-1. UK won the last meeting, 4-2 in Lexington in 1969, with UK suffering a 13-12 loss in the first meeting in 1968 in Lexington. UK has also faced Old Dominion twice in program history, with the last meeting coming in 1999, a 6-3 ODU win. UK won the first meeting in 1996, 12-8, which came in Wilmington, with the second meeting coming in Charleston, S.C. The Wildcats have faced St. John's once in program history a 12-5 UK win in the 1988 NCAA Tournament in New Britain, Conn.

## PROJECTED PITCHING MATCHUPS

Kentucky will send the weekend rotation of junior southpaw A.J. Reed (1-0, 1.80 ERA) to the mound on Friday to face St. Joe's senior right-hander Jordan Carter (3-5, 4.63 ERA in 2013). On Saturday, UK junior right-hander Chandler Shepherd (1-0, 3.18 ERA) faces off with Old Dominion, who has yet to announce a starting pitcher. Sunday, UK sophomore right-hander Kyle Cody (0-0, 5.40 ERA) will face St. John's sophomore right-hander Ryan McCormick (0-0, 4.15 ERA).

A native of Terre Haute, Ind., Reed will be making his 16th consecutive weekend series-opening start on Friday. On Friday, Reed pitched Kentucky to a win over No. 1 Virginia in the season opener, working five innings and allowing just one run on three hits, with three walks and two strikeouts. In his three-year career, Reed a first-team preseason All-America selection by Baseball America, has a 8-11 record and a 3.38 ERA in 31 games and 20 starts, working 141 innings, walking 27 and striking out 105. Carter, a 6-foot-4, 184-pound native of Collegeville, Pa., served as the Hawks' Saturday starter in 2013, ranking second on the team in innings and third in wins and strikeouts. He owned a 3-5 mark with a 4.63 ERA in 14 starts, tossing 83.2 innings, allowing 100 hits and 15 walks, striking out 54.

Shepherd, a native of Louisa, Ky., will be making his second career weekend start, after working 5.2 strong innings at UNC Wilmington on Saturday. Shepherd carried a no-hitter into the fifth inning vs. the Seahawks, the two-time CAA Champs. He worked four hitless innings to open the season, his first career weekend start, before allowing a leadoff single in the fourth inning. Retired the first eight hitters he faced and was just two hitters over the minimum entering the sixth inning. Ran into trouble with a one-out rally that led to two runs and kept him from his second quality start of his career in the sixth inning with two outs, walking two and allowing three hits in the inning. In his career, Shepherd has worked 45 games with 11 starts, owning a 9-1 record and a 3.30 ERA, with one save. Shepherd has tossed 117.1 innings in his career, allowing 114 hits – 87 singles – walking 35 and striking out 76.

Cody, a native of Chippewa Falls, Wis., made his season debut on Sunday vs. VMI, while working on a strict 60-pitch limit to open the 2014 campaign. He got into the fourth inning, escaping a first-inning jam and allowing three runs in the second inning on two hits and a walk, with UK committing two errors in the frame. Cody, a 6-foot-7, 245-pounder, got out of the second-inning jam with a strikeout of the No. 2 hitter, before then rebounding with a quick inning in the third, retiring the 4-5-6 hitters in order and getting a quick out in the fourth at 62 pitches. Retired the final five hitters he faced in his season debut. In his two-year career, Cody – ranked as the seventh-best sophomore in college baseball – has made 16 appearances with 11 starts, owning a 3-3 record and a 4.87 ERA in 61 innings, walking 22 and striking out 50. St. John's will turn to McCormick, who had a strong relief appearance at Pepperdine on opening weekend. McCormick worked 4.1 innings, allowing four hits and two runs, walking one and striking out two.

## SCOUTING THE FOES

St. Joseph's had its opening weekend cancelled due to the winter storm that hit the east coast last week. The Hawks had a 26-26 record in 2013, with a 12-12 mark in the Atlantic 10. St. Joe's hit .262 as a team in 2013, with 27 homers and 51 steals, fielding .962 as a team. On the mound, SJU had a 4.14 ERA, allowing 48 steals.

Old Dominion (1-2) opened the year with a 6-5 loss at Georgia Tech and a 6-3 loss to Virginia Commonwealth, before picking up a 8-7 10-inning win over Radford. The Monarchs hit .223 as a team to open the year, with two homers and 16 runs scored, stealing five bases in three games. Defensively, ODU fielded .9654 with three double plays turned and three steals allowed. On the mound, ODU had a 5.19 ERA in 26 innings, walking nine and striking out 20.

St. John's (1-2) is coming off an opening weekend in Malibu, Calif., where it played Pepperdine in a competitive three-game series. The Red Storm hit .183 as a team with one homer and seven runs scored, fielding .955. On the mound, St. John's had a 5.40 ERA as a team with one save in 25 innings, walking 10 and striking out 20.



#### 41-PERCENT OF SCHEDULE VS. RANKED FOES

Kentucky will face off with a grueling schedule in 2014, featuring the annual 30-game gauntlet of the Southeastern Conference, the nation's best conference. UK will face a total of 41-percent of its schedule against teams that are ranked in the preseason polls. Over the five-year era with UK head coach Gary Henderson, the Wildcats have played 112 games against ranked foes, an average of 22 games vs. ranked opponents per season. UK's best season against ranked foes came in 2012, going 14-11, including an 8-3 mark against the top 10.

#### COUSINO, REED ON USA BASEBALL GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD WATCH LIST

Kentucky juniors Austin Cousino and A.J. Reed have been named to the 60-man preseason watch list for the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award, given to the nation's top collegiate player.

USA Baseball annually gives the Golden Spikes Award to the top player in amateur baseball, with the preseason list trimmed to 40 players on April 10 with the semifinalists are announced on May 27.

Cousino and Reed mark the third consecutive season a UK player has earned a spot on the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award Watch List, as Trevor Gott and Luke Maile were on the 2012 Golden Spikes mid-season watch list and Cousino and Corey Littrell were on the preseason watch list in 2013.

Cousino, UK's preseason All-America centerfielder, is off to a strong start to open the 2014 season, batting .444 through four games, with two doubles, one homer and three RBI, stealing two bases. In his three-year career Cousino, a two-time member of the USA Collegiate National Team, has hit .294 (143-for-487) with 34 doubles, three triples, 16 homers and 71 RBI, stealing 31-of-33 bases.

A native of Terre Haute, Ind., Reed has hit .353 to open 2014, with two doubles, one homer and six RBI. On the mound, Reed picked up a win in the season opener vs. No. 1 Virginia, tossing five innings for UK's fourth win over a top-ranked foe over the last three years. A 6-foot-4 southpaw, Reed has hit .292 (126-for-431) in his career, with 19 doubles, two triples, 18 homers and 101 RBI. During a first-team All-Southeastern Conference season in 2013, Reed ranked fourth in the SEC in homers (13) and RBI (52). On the mound in his career, Reed has worked in 31 games and started 20, owning a 3.38 ERA in 141 innings, walking 27 and striking out 105.

#### CATCHING TANDEM

Since Gary Henderson took over as pitching coach in 2004, the Wildcats have been blessed with talented catchers behind the plate. In 2014, UK will have another talented catching tandem with returning starter Micheal Thomas, who saw 41 starts behind the dish in 2013, and Greg Fettes, who was the first UK catcher to even earn a spot on the All-SEC Freshman Team. Thomas put together one of the top seasons in school history defensively for a catcher in 2013, fielding .997 with his lone error coming on a catcher's interference. Fettes has great arm strength and power, with the Wildcats also blessed with defensive dynamo in sophomore Zach Arnold, who has a bright future for UK behind the plate.

#### DO-IT-ALL REED

With the NCAA limiting scholarships in college baseball, coaches have to get creative in spending their 11.7 scholarships a season. When a coach finds a true impact player, it can change a program. UK has that kind of program-changing talent in junior lefty/first baseman A.J. Reed. A 6-foot-4, 240-pounder, Reed is coming off a season as the first-team All-SEC selection by the league coaches after ranking fourth in the circuit in homers (13) and RBI (52). He served as UK's No. 1 starting pitcher in 2013, becoming the first player in school annals to hit No. 3 or No. 4 in the order and serve as the Friday night starter. A first-team preseason All-America selection by Baseball America, Reed enters 2014 with a .290 average and 17 homers in his career, with a 7-11 record and a 3.44 ERA on the mound.

#### COUSINO LOOKING TO BOUNCE BACK

Centerfielder Austin Cousino enters 2014 looking for a bounce back season after falling below his expectations at the plate in 2013. After winning SEC Freshman of the Year in 2012, Cousino led the USA Collegiate National Team in hitting during the summer, entering his sophomore season as Baseball America's selection as the preseason SEC Player of the Year. Cousino went on to hit .249 in 2013, while experiencing failure for the first time in his baseball career. The Dublin, Ohio, native hit .270 in league play, before joining Team USA for a second summer. Entering 2014, Cousino has earned rave reviews for his leadership in the fall and preseason, a key role in the UK program. Cousino, who won the Rawlings Gold Glove Award as the nation's top defensive outfielder in 2013, enters his junior season as a preseason All-American by Baseball America. In his 117 game career, Cousino has reached base safely in 106 games, with a .288 average with 32 doubles, 15 homers and 29 steals.

## SHEPHERD CARRIES SUMMER INTO 2014

Junior right-hander Chandler Shepherd enters his junior season ranked as the 70th-best college player available in the 2014 MLB Draft. The native of Louisa, Ky., solidified his prospect status in the summer in 2013 in the Cape Cod League, where he earned all-star honors. A 6-foot-2, 185-pounder, Shepherd entered his final start in the CCBL with a 0.87 ERA and a shot at the ERA title. Over his two-year career, Shepherd has done a little bit of everything, serving as a midweek starter, middle reliever, late-inning stopper and closer. In 2013, Shepherd was UK's go-to reliever, owning a 5-0 record and a team-high 2.77 ERA. As a freshman, Shepherd went 3-1 with a 3.83 ERA in 18 games and nine starts, also starting the NCAA Regional Championship game.

## REIDA ANCHORS DEFENSE

Kentucky senior Matt Reid enters 2014 having started 118 consecutive games at shortstop, dating back to 2011. A native of Russiaville, Ind., Reid has been a defensive anchor up the middle since arriving on campus and making a team-high starts at second base in 2011. With the departure of Taylor Black, Reid and J.T. Riddle battled in the 2012 preseason for the middle infield positions, with Reid beating out Riddle for the job thanks to his quick hands and ability to dominate the average play. Reid and Riddle formed one of the nation's best defensive tandems up the middle in 2012 and 2013, with Riddle signing with the Marlins as a 13th round pick after his junior season. Reid, who entered the season as the 94th best college player available in the 2013 MLB Draft, went undrafted and played his summer ball in the New England League, a year after playing in the Cape Cod League. Reid dedicated himself to the weight room in the summer while playing in the relaxed NECBL, adding 15-20 pounds of muscle and earning starting all-star honors. Reid's offensive game has progressed since arriving on campus, culminating in a career-long 11 game hitting streak to end 2013.

## BARRETT SPEEDS WAY INTO LINEUP

Outfielder Kyle Barrett arrived on campus in 2013 without a large expectation for the freshman to contribute. He certainly blew those expectations out of the water, leading UK with a .349 average and earning a spot on the All-SEC Freshman Team. He ranked second in the SEC among freshmen in hitting, behind only LSU shortstop Alex Bregman. His line-drive approach and opposite-field swing led UK to push Barrett into the leadoff spot, seeking a spot for All-American Austin Cousino – UK's regular leadoff dynamo – to drive in runs. Barrett played his summer ball in the Perfect Game Collegiate League, earning all-star honors and leading his Amsterdam team to the league crown.

## INSTANT IMPACT NEWCOMERS

The Wildcats brought in 16 newcomers for its 2014 roster, including seven position players and nine pitching talents. UK's class consists of six junior college transfers and 10 high school standouts. Robert Ziegler, a 6-foot-4, 205-pound native of Defiance, Ohio, is UK's highest rated newcomer, tabbed before the draft as the No. 207 prospect available. Connor Heady, a native of Prospect, Ky., and a veteran of the USA Baseball 18-Under National Team, was ranked No. 287 by Baseball America and right-handed pitcher Zack Brown, a native of Seymour, Ind., was tabbed No. 385 before the draft by Baseball America. A 6-foot-2, 180-pounder, Brown was a 38th round pick by the Chicago Cubs in the 2013 MLB Draft. UK also welcomes a familiar name to the program, in infielder/outfielder JaVon Shelby, a 6-foot-2, 180-pound product of Lexington's Bates Creek High School. Shelby follows in his brother, John's, footsteps, with the elder Shelby having an All-SEC career with the Wildcats (2004-06), that culminated in the 2006 SEC Championship. JaVon's second-oldest brother, Jeremy, was a draft pick of Grambling State, and his father, John Shelby, was an 11-year MLB veteran with two World Series rings and is currently on the Milwaukee Brewers managerial staff. Kentucky welcomes junior college righties Spencer Jack (Los Angeles, Calif.) and Andrew Nelson (Omaha, Neb.), and junior college outfielder Ka'ai Tom (Kaneohe, Hawaii), the first-ever Hawaiian born player in UK history. Marcus Carson, a speedy outfielder and native of London, Ky., also helps bolster the Wildcat recruiting class. Baseball America's highly in-depth rankings are formulated after a staggering amount of 2013 MLB Draft coverage and consulting with coaches and scouts. Baseball America ranks the top-25 recruiting classes in the nation, with Collegiate Baseball ranking the top-40 classes. Kentucky's program has produced a staggering amount of professional baseball talent since Henderson arrived on campus as UK's associate head coach and recruiting coordinator in 2004, taking over as head coach in 2009. Since 2006, a total of 54 UK players have either been drafted or signed a professional contract, an average of 6.75 per season, compared to 2.55 per season before 2006. A total of 36-percent

of the total draftees or free agent signees (56) in Kentucky baseball history (156) have come under the watch of Henderson.

### WILDCATS IN THE BIG LEAGUES

Kentucky had six players play in the big leagues in 2013, including three former UK greats on the same team in the middle of the season. Lefties Andrew Albers (Minnesota Twins) and James Paxton (Seattle Mariners) had dominating MLB debuts, with southpaw Chris Rusin having a strong season in the Chicago Cubs rotation. Scott Downs saw time with the Los Angeles Angels, where he teamed with former UK greats Joe Blanton and Collin Cowgill. Cowgill earned the starting spot in centerfield and as the No. 1 hitter on opening day for the New York Mets, before a trade to the Angels. Downs was traded to the Atlanta Braves for the pennant chase, helping the Braves to the division title. In addition, former UK lefty Logan Darnell was added to the Twins 40-man roster, with the Twins Alex Meyer tabbed as the 32nd best prospect in minor league baseball.

### PRESEASON ACCOLDES

Kentucky has had a bevy of honors in the preseason, including two-way star A.J. Reed earning first-team preseason All-America honors by Baseball America. Reed was also named preseason All-America by NCBWA and Louisville Slugger, with centerfielder Austin Cousino earning third-team All-America honors from Baseball America. Junior righty Chandler Shepherd enters the year ranked as the No. 70 prospect available in the 2014 MLB Draft by Baseball America, with Reed ranking No. 85 and Cousino ranking No. 97. UK right-hander Kyle Cody was ranked by Baseball America as the seventh-best sophomore in college baseball, with infielder Connor Heady ranked No. 38 among NCAA freshmen. In Perfect Game USA's SEC preview, Reed was tabbed preseason all-conference.

### INJURY UPDATE

Kentucky has had a fairly healthy preseason but will be without the services of freshman right-hander Logan Parrett, who had Tommy John Surgery after an arm injury suffered in the high school playoffs. UK got pitchers Sam Mahar and Taylor Martin back from injury after they each missed 2013 due to arm surgeries. Freshman infielder/outfielder JaVon Shelby has returned from an injury that ended his high school career and limited him from fall practice, with catcher Greg Fettes also returning from a hamstring injury that ended his 2013.

### NO STEALS FOR YOU

One of Gary Henderson's cornerstones in building a program is controlling the running game from the mound and behind the plate, a fundamental that has taken increased importance with the change in bat standards in 2011. Since Henderson took over UK's pitching staff in 2004, UK has ranked as the SEC leader in fewest stolen bases allowed in five of 10 seasons, also ranking among the top three in pickoffs in four consecutive seasons. In 2013, UK allowed only 29 steals to rank third-best in the SEC, a year after leading the circuit with just 27 steals allowed in 2012.

Each of UK's recruiting classes has earned a top-25 ranking under UK head coach Gary Henderson. UK's 2013 recruiting class (current sophomores) was ranked No. 11 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 18 by Baseball America. UK's 2012 recruiting class (current juniors) – which included freshmen All-Americans Austin Cousino and A.J. Reed – was ranked No. 25 by Collegiate Baseball. Since UK brought in a star-studded class in 2006 that claimed the Southeastern Conference Championship, the Wildcats have earned a ranking in nine consecutive seasons. UK set program record in 2009 with the No. 4 class, according to Baseball

*Andrew Albers (2005-08) - Minnesota Twins*

*Triple-A Rochester Red Wings - 22 starts, 11-5, 2.86 ERA, 132.1 IP, 32 BB, 116 SO*

2013 Season: Had a dynamic season with the triple-A Rochester Red Wings, earning his first-career MLB call-up with the Twins, where he has gotten off to a tremendous start to a big league career. Made 22 triple-A starts, with an 11-5 record and a 2.86 ERA, tossing 132.1 innings, walking 32 and striking out 116. Finished the year ranked seventh in the International League in strikeouts, third in wins and fifth in ERA.

Immediately emerged as one of the top pitching prospects in the Twins organization, making his double-A debut with the Rock Cats, joining former UK teammate Logan Darnell. Worked in 13 games for the Rock Cats, with a 4-3 record and a 3.21 ERA, striking out 84, walking 29 and working 70 innings. *Triple-A Tacoma Rainiers - 26 starts, 8-11, 4.45 ERA, 145.2 IP, 58 SO, 131 SO*

2013 Season: Made his triple-A debut with the Rainiers in the Mariners system, before earning a September call-up for his MLB debut, which has been historic through his first two big league starts. Finished with an 8-11 record in 26 starts in triple-A, with 131 strikeouts, 58 walks and 145.2 innings pitched. A former first-round pick in 2009 and a fourth-round selection in 2010, Paxton finished his season ranking sixth in innings pitched and third in strikeouts.

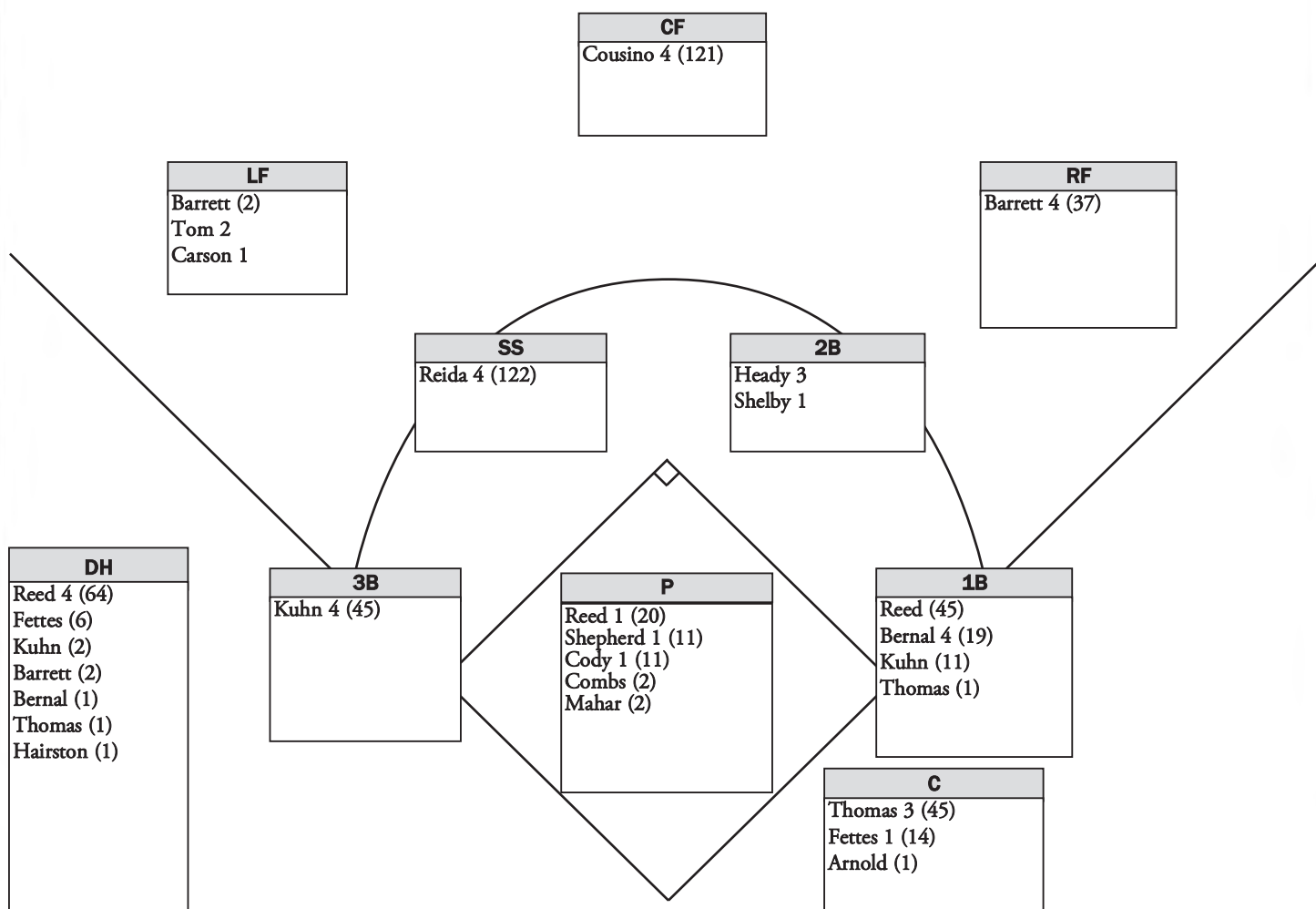
