FOOTBALL BEGINS 2014 SEASON WITH UT MARTIN AT CWS

After months of preparation and planning, the University of Kentucky football team is set to begin its second season under head coach Mark Stoops when it plays host to the UT Martin Skyhawks on Saturday, Aug. 30 at noon ET inside Commonwealth Stadium.

The Wildcats and Skyhawks will meet for the first time in program history on Saturday with UK trying to win its season opener for the first time since 2011 when it bested WKU in Nashville at LP Field.

Head Coach Mark Stoops, entering his second season with the Wildcats, welcomes back 15 primary returning starters from last season, seven on offense and eight on defense. And, as a byproduct of the team's youth over the last two seasons, 36 returnees have started at least one game during their careers. All told, UK returns 49 lettermen from last season, including 22 on offense, 24 on defense and three specialists.

UT Martin is coming off a 7-5 season, including a 5-3 mark in Ohio Valley Conference play. The Skyhawks return 61 lettermen, including 10 starters under ninth year head coach Jason Simpson.

QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its second season under head coach Mark Stoops, who has reenergized the UK fan base with the two highest ranked recruiting classes in program history, the nation's second-largest attendance increase last season and record-breaking spring game attendance.
- Stoops started the fall with 49 returning lettermen, including 15 primary offensive and defensive starters returning. A byproduct of the youth Stoops inherited last season is UK has 36 players that have started at least once.
- On offense, UK has four starters back in the offensive line (Jon Toth, Jordan Swindle, Darrian Miller, Zach West), along with wide receivers Javess Blue, Demarco Robinson and Ryan Timmons.
- There are eight returning regulars on defense, including ends Bud Dupree and Za'Darius Smith, linebacker Khalid Henderson and the entire secondary – cornerbacks Nate Willis and Fred Tiller along with safeties Ashely Lowery and Eric Dixon, plus nickelback Blake McClain.
- Senior defensive end/linebacker Alvin "Bud" Dupree has been picked as one of the top five athletic "freaks" in college football by NFL.com and Fox Sports. For more, see page 11.
- UK has an all-time record of 83-35-5 (.695) in season openers, including a 70-15-4 (.801) mark in season openers at home. UK is 13-19-1 (.401) in season openers away from home, including 8-16-1 in true road games and 5-3 in neutral site openers.
- Saturday will mark the first time since 2007 that UK has opened its season at Commonwealth Stadium. The Wildcat s defeated ECU 51-10 that day, marking its first season opening win at CWS since 1997. UK has opened its season each of the last six years on the road, going 4-2 during that stretch.
- Kentucky is scheduled to play eight teams either ranked or receiving votes in the Associated Press Top 25 or USA Today Top 25. UK will face No. 9/9 South Carolina (Oct. 4), No. 12/12 Georgia (Nov. 8), No. 13/13 LSU (Oct. 18), No. 24/rv Missouri (Nov. 1), rv/rv Florida (Sept. 13), rv/rv Mississippi State (Oct. 25), rv/rv Louisville (Nov. 29), and nr/rv Vanderbilt (Sept. 27).
- Through a \$120-million reinvention, Commonwealth Stadium will be transformed into a state-of-the-art facility in time for the start of the 2015 season. For more on the reinvention of CWS, visit TheNewCWS.com.
- UK had a attendance increase nearing 10,000 fans last season, which was the second-largest attendance increase in the nation. UK averaged 59,472 fans last season to finish top 30 in average attendance.
- This is the 124th season of intercollegiate football for the UK football program.

HEAD COACH MARK STOOPS SECOND SEASON

- Named the 37th head coach of the Kentucky football program on Nov. 27, 2012
- First task as UK coach was to put together a bright and energetic coaching staff. Accomplished that feat by hiring two of the best up-and-coming coordinators in the game in D.J. Eliot and Neal Brown.
- Inherited a recruiting class ranked in the 60s by the national evaluation services before Stoops and Co. hit the trail hard to sign a top-30 class, which was the highest ranked class in program history before Stoops' most recent class was a unanimous top-25 class.
- UK averaged almost 10,000 more fans per game last season than in 2012, which is the second largest attendance increase in the nation.
- Accomplished major defensive turnarounds at Arizona and Florida State.
- During Stoops' three seasons at FSU, the Seminoles went 10-4, 9-4 and 12-2, including wins over South Carolina in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl, Notre Dame in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl and Northern Illinois in the 2013 Orange Bowl.
- Developed many players to NFL careers, including Antoine Cason, Michael Johnson, Philip Buchanon, Kelly Jennings, Brandon Meriweather, Ed Reed, Antrel Rolle, Mike Rumph, Sean Taylor and Brian Lee.

GAME NOTES VS. UT MARTIN

SERIES RECORD VS. UT MARTIN

- Saturday marks the first meeting between Kentucky and UT Martin in football.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN

- Entering his ninth season as the head coach of the Skyhawks, Jason Simpson returns 10 starters from last year's squad that went 7-5, including a 5-3 mark in the Ohio Valley Conference. All totaled, UT Martin returns 61 letterwinners from 2012, including 30 on offense and 31 on defense. The Skyhawks will replace 12 starters from last season, including five on offense and seven on defense.
- Returning from last season on the offensive side of the ball is redshirt junior quarterback Jarod Neal, who completed 57.4 percent of his passes last year for 1,529 yards and nine touchdowns. Neal, who tossed seven interceptions in 2012, split time with Dylan Favre, who went 101-for-142 for 1,081 yards and nine touchdowns. UT Martin also returns both starting guards and tackles from last season along with wide receiver/tight end Corey Jordan, who had 13 receptions for 128 yards and a touchdown.
- Defensively, UTM returns senior linebacker Tony Bell, who posted 80 tackles last season, including 15 tackles for loss, 10.5 sacks, eight quarterback hurries, three fumbles forced and three fumble recoveries. Also returning is defensive back Leon Carlton III, who had 40 tackles, two tackles for loss, three pass breakups and one interception. Returning starters on the defensive line are Ryan Isom and Matt Murphy. Isom had 31 tackles last season with three tackles for loss and five quarterback hurries, while Murphy had 13 tackles and three quarterback hurries.

KENTUCKY-UT MARTIN TIES

- Kentucky has four players on its 2014 roster from the state of Tennessee: junior punter Landon Foster (Franklin), freshman quarterback Reese Phillips (Signal Mountain), senior fullback Darrell "D.J." Warren (Alcoa) and junior defensive tackle Christian Coleman (Milan).
- UT Martin has seven players on its 2014 roster from the Commonwealth of Kentucky: junior wide receiver Ben Axline (Shelbyville), senior offensive lineman Matt Axline (Shelbyville), senior defensive end Nick Brown (Louisville), junior offensive lineman Corey Rogers (Winchester), sophomore Tyler Sweeden (Louisville), senior offensive lineman Anthony Topps (Fort Campbell) and senior defensive lineman Dean Wathen (Henderson).
- Current UT Martin senior wide receiver William Tanner started his career at Kentucky and was with the Wildcats from 2010-12 but did not see game action. Tanner is from Nashville, Tenn.
- UTM's Nick Brown attended duPont Manual High School in Louisville, Ky., with UK cornerbacks Rodney Cox and Keron Wakefield, and wide receiver Miles Thompson.
- UTM's Tyler Sweeden went to Trinity High School in Louisville, Ky., along with UK's Jason Hatcher, Max Strong and Thaddus K azunas.
- UT Martin Head Coach Jason Simpson was the offensive coordinator at UT Chattanooga from 2003-05, working with current UK defensive line coach Jimmy Brumbaugh, who was the defensive line coach for UTC that season. Simpson also spent a season coaching with UK defensive coordinator D.J. Eliot at Texas State in 2003.

UK FOOTBALL LANDS CONSENSUS TOP-25 RECRUITING CLASS

Coach Mark Stoops and his relentless staff brought home Kentucky's highest-rated class in the Internet era of recruiting evaluation, scoring a No. 17 ranking on Rivals.com, No. 20 by ESPN.com, No. 21 by Scout.com and No. 22 by 247Sports.com.

Fifteen members of the 28-man class received a four-star ranking in at least one of the above-mentioned services. Ten of the signees were listed at least once in the Rivals Top 250 players, the ESPN Top 300, the Scout Top 300 or the 247 Top 300.

Can Kentucky Ride its Improved Recruiting to SEC Success?

Stoops and his staff have not hesitated to compete against big-name programs on the recruiting trail. And Kentucky has won more than a few of those battles: The Wildcats beat out Louisville, Tennessee and South Carolina for Barker; Auburn, Clemson and LSU for all-purpose back Stanley Williams; and Alabama, Notre Dame and Ohio State for Elam.

"We're definitely not afraid to compete with anybody in the country," Stoops said. In a recruiting cycle that many coaches say featured rampant player poaching, Kentucky would have been a logical poaching victim. But the Wildcats locked up much of its class a year ago and didn't lose traction. About sixteen of its 28 players committed before the end of last summer, Stoops said.

Mark Stoops Makes Splash With 2014 Class

Quietly, Kentucky coach Mark Stoops made an emphatic statement with his 2014 recruiting class: The Wildcats aren't going to sit idly by and watch the big boys have all the fun ... Stoops rubbed shoulders with the SEC's best, signing 28 players, including six ESPN 300 members and eight four-stars. Stoops flipped a Florida State commit and beat out Alabama for a highly coveted defensive tackle. He snagged a top 10 quarterback and filled critical holes on both sides of the ball.

Signing Day: The Hot Fad in Recruiting is the Hand-Written Letter

One day last April, Kentucky bombarded Matt Elam, a 340-pound tackle from Elizabethtown, Ky., with 69 letters. It followed up several months later with 182 letters. Not to be outdone, Notre Dame shipped Elam 270 letters in November, a postage play that Fighting Irish recruiters call a "pot of gold." The outsize attention paid off for Kentucky last week when Elam—who said he received 50 letters on a normal day—chose the Wildcats over not only Notre Dame but also Alabama, which has won three of the last five national titles and is expected to land the nation's top recruiting class this year.

- Saturday marks the second time in school history that the Wildcats have played a game on Aug. 30. Kentucky holds an all-time record of 1-0 on this date.
- The Wildcats' lone previous game on this date was in 1997 when the Wildcats took down Louisville, 38-24, at Commonwealth Stadium.

KENTUCKY VS. CURRENT ALIGNMENT OF OHIO VALLEY CONF.

- Kentucky is 6-0 all-time against teams that make up the current alignment of the Ohio Valley Conference.
- UT Martin is the only OVC team that the Wildcats are scheduled to play this season.
- This is the first time UK has played an OVC team since defeating Jacksonville State 38-14 on Oct. 22, 2011 at Commonwealth Stadium.

IMMEDIATE PLAYING TIME LEADING TO EXPERIENCE

- A total of 15 primary offensive and defensive starters from 2013 return for the Wildcats, seven on offense and eight on defense.
- On offense, UK has four starters back in the offensive line, along with wide receivers Javess Blue, Demarco Robinson and Ryan Timmons.
- There are eight returning regulars on defense, including ends Bud Dupree and Za'Darius Smith, linebacker Khalid Henderson and the entire secondary – cornerbacks Nate Willis and Fred Tiller along with safeties Ashely Lowery and Eric Dixon, plus cornerback/nickelback Blake McClain.
- A lot of young players have seen the field for UK in the last two seasons. UK has 49 returning lettermen but it is very interesting to note that 36 of those players have started at least one game on offense or defense during their careers.

STADIUM RENOVATION UNDERWAY

- Construction has begun on the \$120 million renovation of Commonwealth Stadium, a project that features a new look for the exterior of the stadium, wider and redesigned concourses, new concession stands and rest rooms, new suites and other premium seating, a recruiting room and a new press box.
- It's a two-year project but there should be minimal disruption for the 2014 season. Part of the southside upper deck has been removed in order to begin the new suite/press box complex and there will be some utility and other site preparation work done this year. Seating capacity for the stadium will be 62,093 for the 2014 campaign.
- The majority of the construction will begin immediately after the last home game on Nov. 8. The reworked stadium is expected to be complete in time for the 2015 season.
- Meanwhile, UK also has begun planning for a \$45 million football office/practice complex that will be built on the south end of the existing Nutter Field House. Construction of that facility is expected to commence following the season, with completion targeted for 2016.

UK REGISTERS NATION'S 2ND-LARGEST ATTENDANCE INCREASE

- The fan response to Coach Mark Stoops and his staff has been encouraging in the year-plus that the new coaches have been on board.
- "Stoops Troops" first responded when a school-record 50,831 turned out for the 2013 Blue/White Spring Game. It was the sixth-largest spring game attendance in the nation and numerous recruits who were there that day noted that the strong turnout played a key role in their eventual decision to sign with Kentucky.
- The 2013 regular season saw a sharp uptick in attendance. Kentucky averaged 59,472 per game in 2013, an increase of 9,781 from the previous season. It was the second-largest increase in the nation.
- Overall, Kentucky ranked 29th in the nation in average attendance per game. UK has ranked in the nation's top 30 in attendance 13 times since the 1999 season.

REMARKABLE RECRUITING

- Undoubtedly, the most amazing facet of Kentucky football since the arrival of Mark Stoops has been the remarkable recruiting done by the coach and his relentless staff.
- This season, Stoops and Co. registered a consensus top-25 recruiting class, which is the highest ranked class in program history. When Stoops was hired at UK in 2012, he inherited a class ranked in the 60s by the national services, but built the class to a top-30 ranking.

SCHEDULE CHANGES

- Three of UK's annual opponents – Louisville, Tennessee and Vanderbilt – will be played at different points in the schedule beginning in 2014. As requested by the SEC and the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Kentucky vs. Louisville game will be moved to the final game of the regular season on an annual basis. The leagues moved the game as a result of adjustments in scheduling brought on by the conference expansions undertaken in both the SEC and ACC.
- The switch of the Kentucky-Louisville game date means that there will be four SEC vs. ACC in-state rivalry matchups on the final weekend of the season. The Florida-Florida State, Georgia-Georgia Tech and South Carolina-Clemson tilts also are on that weekend.
- The UK vs. UofL game had been played early in the schedule since the series was renewed in 1994. For Kentucky, moving the game to the end of the regular season also will require another adjustment. Tennessee has been scheduled as the Wildcats' final foe since 1953 and the Volunteers will now move to Nov. 15, 2014, meaning that UK will close the regular season with a pair of rivalry games.
- One other significant timing change comes with the Vanderbilt game. Having played VU in November every season since 1953, the Wildcats will host the Commodores on Sept. 27, 2014.

OFFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- Despite injuries to key playmakers last season, UK still managed to improve its numbers in points per game and total yards from 2012.
- Offensive coordinator Neal Brown, who is in his second season with UK, returns 22 letterwinners on offense, including seven primary starters from last season in wide receivers Javess Blue, Ryan Timmons and Demarco Robinson, tackles Darrian Miller and Jordan Swindle, guard Zach West and center Jon Toth.
- Last season, UK limited its turnovers (15), ranking ninth in fewest turnovers and eighth in fewest interceptions thrown.
- UK had three players rush for 400-plus yards last season, marking the first time three or more players had rushed for 400 yards or more since 1986.
- The UK offense showed improvement in "Home Run Plays" last season. Compared to 2012, UK had five more 20+ yard plays, nine more 30+ yard plays and eight more 40+ yard plays.

THE QUARTERBACKS

- As expected, much of the attention in fall camp was directed at the quarterback competition with redshirt sophomore Patrick Towles being named the starter on Monday, Aug. 18. Towles, who impressed in spring practice by how much he had improved his overall game including fundamentals, won the job over redshirt freshman Reese Phillips, true freshman Drew Barker and junior Maxwell Smith, who missed the spring while recovering from an injury.
- Towles played in five games in 2012, but did not start. The native of Ft. Thomas, Ky., completed 19-of-40 passes for 233 yards and one touchdown. Towles led UK to a touchdown on his first career drive, going 5-for-5 for 71 yards, including a 32-yard touchdown toss.
- Smith is the lone other QB with game experience, playing in 21 career games with 11 starts. In his career, Smith is 292-of-486 for 3,070 yards and 21 touchdowns. Last season, Smith played in nine games with four starts throwing nine touchdown passes and just one interception.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

- A common theme from Stoops and Brown during fall camp was no matter which QB ended up winning the job, the staff felt there would be more weapons around him, especially at wide receiver.
- The returning wideouts include seniors Javess Blue (43 catches for 586 yards and four touchdowns last season) and Demarco Robinson (20 for 213, including two TDs); junior Joey Herrick (3 for 22); and sophomores Ryan Timmons (32 for 338, 2 TDs), Jeff Badet (22 for 285, 1 TD) and Alexander Montgomery (16 for 137, 2 TDs).
- The group has shown big-play potential as Blue, Timmons and Badet each had plays of 50 yards or longer

MILESTONES TO WATCH FOR ...

- Senior defensive end Bud Dupree has 16 career sacks, needing 1.0 more to tie for fourth most all-time in school history.
- Sophomore punter Landon Foster has 129 career punts, qualifying him for UK's career punt records. His career average of 42 yards per punt (129 punts, 5,424 yards) ranks him third all-time.
- Senior wide receiver Javess Blue - although only entering his second year with UK - could become the 23rd player in program history with 1,000+ receiving yards. Blue currently has 586 receiving yards and needs 414 to earn that honor.



Commonwealth Stadium

On game day, Commonwealth Stadium often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.

- The Wildcats are in their 42nd season at Commonwealth Stadium, which is currently undergoing a \$120 million reinvention to be completed for 2015.
- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 263 games within the friendly confines of Commonwealth Stadium. UK has a 138-121-4 record (.532) in CWS.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 63,408 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance for 13 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years.
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

Commonwealth Stadium Renovations on the Way:

Through a \$120-million reinvention, Commonwealth Stadium will be transformed into a state-of-the-art facility in time for the start of the 2015 season. As the Kentucky football program enters a new era, the Big Blue Nation will enjoy an intimate game-day atmosphere to match. The experience will begin outside the stadium, as the longtime home of the Wildcats will undergo a dramatic external facelift. The new Commonwealth Stadium will take on a modern look, but one that remains uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Commonwealth will be reduced over the course of the two-year project, but the value of all remaining seats will be increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses will revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches will reap the benefits of the new Commonwealth Stadium as well, as new home-team facilities will be built, while a new multi-purpose recruiting room will play host to future Wildcats on their on-campus visits. Facts and Figures on Commonwealth Stadium:

Seating Capacity: 62,093, including the Commonwealth Suites.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage. The interior seating bowl also has LED ribbon boards.

Sound System: Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

Game Day Experiences

The "Cat Walk": Fans are encouraged to greet the team when the Wildcats arrive for the "Cat Walk." The team buses will arrive at the Nutter Field House approximately two hours and 15 minutes before the game and the players will make the "Cat Walk" to their stadium entry point at Gate 1. Fans are encouraged to line up on the sidewalk and cheer the players as they enter the stadium. A siren will be sounded while the team buses are on their way to the stadium. That's the fans' cue to proceed to the Cat Walk area to greet the team.

Wildcat Refuge: Fans of all ages, but especially the younger Wildcats, will enjoy playing at the Wildcat Refuge, located outside of the southwest corner (outside Gate 9) of Commonwealth Stadium. There are five giant inflatable games that are available two hours before kickoff.

UK Marching Band Will Parade Around Stadium: The UK Marching Band will parade around the stadium, beginning approximately one hour prior to kickoff. The band parade will begin at and return to Gate 4.

- Also in the mix are true freshmen Thaddeus Snodgrass and T.V. Williams, explosive speedsters who graduated from high school in December and enrolled in January. Three more frosh receivers - Dorian Baker, Blake Bone and Garrett Johnson - joined the team over the summer and have impressed in their short time with the team.
- Although the tight end position was hit hard by graduation, two players are available with significant game experience. Senior Ronnie Shields has caught 12 passes during his career and fellow senior Steven Borden caught three passes for 63 yards in 2013, his first season at UK after transferring from junior college.

THE RUNNING BACKS

- Running back coach and running game coordinator Chad Scott has a ton of weapons to use in the backfield this season with the addition of junior running backs Josh Clemons and Braylon Heard, who had to sit out the 2013 season for different reasons.
- Clemons has been out of game action since mid-season 2011 because of injuries. He showed great promise in the first half of 2011, rushing for 279 yards and two TDs. The coaches limited his action somewhat in the spring in order to give him plenty of rest but were very happy with what they saw as Clemons seemed to run, catch and block with no ill effects.
- Heard, a transfer from Nebraska, rushed 77 times for 452 yards and a 5.9-yard average for the Cornhuskers during the 2011 and '12 seasons.
- Along with sophomore Jojo Kemp, who led the Wildcats with 482 rushing yards last season, and true freshmen Mikel Horton and Stanley "Boom" Williams, UK will have a deep and talented backfield in the 2014 season.
- Senior D.J. Warren is a capable fullback when the staff opts to use two-back sets and Jeff Witthuhn provides solid depth there.

THE OFFENSIVE LINE

- With four starting linemen returning from last season, the coaches are optimistic that the offensive line will take a lead role in the improvement sought by the offense.
- Senior Darrian Miller is a two-year starter at left tackle and has been a capable blindside protector. Junior Zach West also is a two-year regular at left guard and the coaches were pleased with his improvement since last season.
- Two players stepped into the starting line last year, right tackle Jordan Swindle and center Jon Toth, both of whom earned praise from the coaches for their toughness and competitiveness.
- Additional returnees with some game experience include senior tackle Teven Eatmon-Nared, senior guard Max Godby, junior guard Jack Gruenschlaeger, and sophomore center Zach Myers.
- Redshirt freshman Ramsey Meyers took the lead as the starting right guard in the spring and will be the starter at that position. Three promising redshirts are competing in the line as well, guard/center Nick Haynes, tackle Kyle Meadows and guard Cole Mosier.

DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- The obvious defensive question heading into fall camp was how to replace All-SEC linebacker Avery Williamson and starting defensive tackles Donte Rumph and Mister Cobble, who all three signed NFL contracts.
- There is good news for defensive coordinator D.J. Eliot as 24 lettermen return to the defense with more familiarity in Eliot's system. The Wildcats return eight starters on that side of the ball, including 15 of the top 20 tacklers from last season and six of the top seven.
- The UK defense recovered 12 fumbles last season, which ranked first in the SEC and 15th in the nation.
- UK's best defensive game last season came against Miami (Ohio) as the Wildcats limited MU to just 122 yards of total offense - the fourth lowest total in the last 25 years.

- Junior Khalid Henderson is the top returnee at linebacker, having made 51 tackles last season. Fellow senior TraVaughn Pascal showed good speed last season while racking up 39 tackles, including four for loss.
- Junior Josh Forrest made a strong move during the spring and started fall camp as the starter at middle linebacker. He made 16 stops last season and blocked two kicks on special teams.
- Another pleasant development of the spring was junior Daron Blaylock, who moved from safety to linebacker and played well. Senior Tyler Brause also has some game experience.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKS

- The competition is intense at cornerback. Senior Nate Willis and junior Fred Tiller are the returning starters. Willis tied for the team lead in pass breakups with five while Tiller had four PBU.
- Junior Cody Quinn has been a part-time starter during his career and had three breakups last season. Sophomore J.D. Harmon, who led the team in 2012 with two interceptions, has returned after a redshirt season. Sophomore Jaleel Hytchye has good potential.
- Senior Ashely Lowery (46 tackles, one interception last season) is a two-year starter at safety. Yet another positive development of the spring was the addition of junior-college transfer A.J. Stamps, who moved from cornerback to safety and made a great impression at the new position. He had four interceptions and nine PBU last season while helping lead East Mississippi to the national junior-college championship.
- Glenn Faulkner and Zack Blaylock bring additional depth at safety. Several freshman signees also could contend for playing time in the secondary.
- UK often played a 4-2-5 system last year, with versatile cornerback Blake McClain stepping into the nickelback role. He made 59 tackles last season and tied for the team lead in pass breakups with five. Freshman Kendall Randolph also can play the nickel.

THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- Both of UK's returning starters at defensive end -- Bud Dupree and Za'Darius Smith -- received All-Southeastern Conference honors last season and after going through the National Football League evaluation process both decided to come back to UK for their final campaigns.
- Dupree totaled 61 tackles while leading the team with 9.5 tackles for loss, including seven quarterback sacks. He also caused two fumbles and broke up a pass. He was a second-team all-league pick by The Associated Press and Phil Steele's College Football.
- Smith made 59 stops, 6.5 for loss, featuring six sacks. He led the team in quarterback hurries with six, broke up one pass and recovered a fumble. He was a third-team all-conference pick by CollegeSportsMadness.com.
- Junior Farrington Huguenin and sophomore Jason Hatcher provide experienced depth. Hatcher, who had 19 tackles and a pair of sacks last season, backs up Dupree and also has the athleticism to play linebacker in the 3-4 scheme.
- There is optimism in rebuilding the tackles. Seniors Mike Douglas and Christian Coleman, along with junior-college transfers C.J. Johnson and Melvin Lewis, give the team some veteran presence. Douglas made 28 tackles last season, including 1.5 tackles for loss. Redshirt freshmen Regie Meant and Jacob Hyde provide more depth and competition. Several talented freshman signees could make their mark at tackle or end.

DUPREE HAS "FREAK" ATHLETIC ABILITY

- Senior defensive end/linebacker Alvin "Bud" Dupree has been labeled as one of the top five athletic "freaks" in college football, according to NFL.com and Fox Sports. Here's what Bruce Feldman of Fox Sports had to say:
- "One of the best things about Wildcat football is this 6-3, 267-pound hybrid LB-DE who made 61 tackles and 9.5 TFLs last season. Dupree, who has vertical jumped 40.5 inches and broad-jumped 11 feet, should light up the NFL Combine. UK's sports performance coach Erik Korem, who came from FSU, said Dupree's speed was clocked at 21 miles per hour on their GPS system."

SPECIAL TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Kentucky returns starters at all of its specialist positions except placekicker, where redshirt freshman Austin MacGinnis has performed well this fall to win the job for kickoff, field goal and extra point duties.
- Junior Landon Foster has averaged 42 yards per punt during his two seasons as the starting punter for UK and is looking to have a strong junior season. Long snapper Kelly Mason and holder Jared Leet also return and have been very consistent in their roles.
- In the return game, UK brings back Javess Blue and Demarco Robinson after both handled a majority of the returns in 2013. Blue averaged 20.4 yards on kickoff returns and 2.9 yards on punt returns, while Robinson averaged 25.6 on kickoff returns and 10.4 on punt returns.
- Other return options are wide receiver Ryan Timmons, running backs Jojo Kemp and Stanley "Boom" Williams and defensive backs J.D. Harmon and Cody Quinn.

WILLIAMSON TAKEN IN 5TH ROUND BY TITANS

- Kentucky had one player selected in April's National Football League draft, linebacker Avery Williamson, who was tabbed in the fifth round by the Tennessee Titans. Two other Wildcats signed free-agent contracts. During the last seven years, 48 Wildcats have been drafted or signed as free agents.

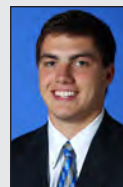

Guided by UK senior associate director of athletics Jason Schlafer, the players visited families, played with children, distributed food and did work projects.

- The Kentucky cheerleaders have won an unprecedented 20 national cheerleading championships, including 16 of the last 20, at the annual Universal Cheerleaders Association championships.

- UK is one of only seven universities in the U.S. that have programs in agriculture, engineering, law, medicine and pharmacy on a single campus.
