

BY THE NUMBERS

9.825 Sophomore Tiara Phipps scored a meet-high-tying 9.825 on bars Friday. It not only was her first event title at UK, but also her collegiate debut on the apparatus.

Last season, UK tied then-No. 6 Georgia, **195.825**, in Lexington. The Cats won the final two events, and Audrey Harrison claimed the all-around title.

1981 2013's tie with UGA was UK's first dual meet tie since 1981. The Cats' last tie was in 2004, when they tied Mizzou for first in a four-team meet.

With Friday's win, Kentucky improved to 2-0 against **2-0** Missouri in SEC competition.

QUICK NOTES

- * No. 20 Kentucky closes a three-meet roadtrip Saturday at sixth-ranked Georgia. The Wildcats (4-2, 1-1 SEC) and Bulldogs (2-3, 1-1 SEC) are set to square off at 4 p.m. ET inside a sold out Stegeman Coliseum.
- * Georgia will have a live video stream of the meet and live results on GeorgiaDogs.com. Fans can find live updates from Athens at @UKgymnastics on Twitter. The contest will also be broadcast on Fox Sports Net and air on Feb. 8 at 11 a.m. ET with Brian Drebber and Lori Strong-Ballard on the call.
- * Saturday will be the 76th all-time meeting between the Wildcats and Bulldogs. UK and UGA tied last year in Lexington, Kentucky's first dual meet tie since 1981. UK won the final two events and erased a 0.825-point deficit entering the final rotation.
- * UK is coming off a win at Missouri on Jan. 24. Kentucky won three events and claimed three individual event titles along with Audrey Harrison's second all-around win of the season. The Bulldogs, who have competed in five meets in 15 days to open the season, suffered a 198.050-196.700 loss at then-No. 3 Florida on Jan. 23.
- * Head coach Tim Garrison is in his third season at Kentucky after a record-setting 2013. The Wildcats won three SEC meets for the first time in school history with a 3-3-1 league mark, also a program best. UK's best regular season score, regional qualifying score and NCAA Regional score were also set in the 2013 campaign.

Ticket Information

Season tickets for the 2014 season are \$15 for reserved seating in Sections C through G. General admission seating is located in all other sections. Reserved tickets for single meets are \$5.00 each, regardless of age. General admission tickets are \$5.00 for adults, \$2.00 for Seniors (65+) and Youth (6-18). Children ages 5 and under are admitted free of charge.

Tickets can be purchased by calling the ticket office at 1-800-928-2287. Tickets are also sold at the Joe Craft Center Ticket Office on the night of the event. Group tickets (20+ people) are available by calling the ticket office in advance of the event.

Parking Information

Parking will be available in all E-Lots (Employee Lots) surrounding Memorial Coliseum beginning 3 hours prior to the start of the meet. Additional parking will be available in Parking Structure #5 (adjacent to Kennedy's Bookstore), which is a 5-10 minute walk or a short shuttle ride over to the Coliseum. The PS#5 shuttle picks up/drops off on Administration Drive, at the end of the pedestrian sky bridge accessed from the 3rd floor of the parking garage. The shuttle will be available beginning at 5:30pm and will end 1 hour post-meet.

Handicap parking is available in the E-Lot (Employee Lot) north of the Joe Craft Center, adjacent to the metered spaces, with a valid, state-issued handicap tag. These spaces are available on a first-come, first-serve basis until full. Please note that parking is prohibited in any R-Lot (Residential Lot). Vehicles parking in R-Lots without a proper permit, along yellow curbs, grass spaces or other non-specified and unapproved areas may be subject to ticket and/or tow.



PRIMER: NO. 20 KENTUCKY AT NO. 6 GEORGIA

The No. 20 University of Kentucky gymnastics team caps a three meet roadtrip at No. 6 Georgia Saturday at 4 p.m. ET. The Wildcats and Bulldogs square off in a sold out Stegeman Coliseum a year after UK tied UGA in Lexington.

A live video stream of the meet along with live results can be found on GeorgiaDogs.com. Live updates from Athens will also be available on Twitter at @UKgymnastics. The contest will be broadcast on Fox Sports Net and air on Feb. 8 at 11 a.m. ET with Brian Drebber and Lori Strong-Ballard on the call.

The Wildcats (4-2, 1-1 SEC) are 20th in the GymInfo Top 25 after three weeks of competition after a 195.150-193.775 win at Missouri on Jan. 24. The Bulldogs (2-3, 1-1 SEC), who opened the season with five competitions in 15 days, are ranked sixth nationally and are coming off a 198.050-196.700 loss at then-No. 3 Florida.

Kentucky tied Georgia in last year's meeting, 195.825-195.825, in Memorial Coliseum. The Wildcats trailed at the halfway point in the meet but won balance beam and floor, the final two events, to catch up to the Bulldogs. UK erased a 0.825-point deficit entering the final rotation. Audrey Harrison won the all-around title and finished first on floor. Saturday will be the 76th all-time meeting between the Wildcats and Bulldogs

HEAD COACH TIM GARRISON PREVIEWS GEORGIA

"To this point in the season, we have been very average. Some great performances, but as a whole, we have had a cautious approach to each competition. I am looking for this team to compete with energy and confidence this weekend, but more than that, I want them to compete to their ability."

SCOUTING NO. 6 GEORGIA

With one of the nation's toughest schedules to open the year, Georgia is 2-3 on the season and 1-1 in SEC competition. The Bulldogs have competed five times in 15 days, and its meet against the Wildcats marks the halfway point in their regular season. After losses at No. 3 Oklahoma and No. 9 Stanford, UGA downed No. 2 LSU and Iowa at home before a loss last weekend at No. 3 Florida.

With a 196.785 season average, Georgia is sixth nationally. The Bulldogs are ranked in the top 11 on all four events, including the nation's best average on uneven bars with a 49.435. UGA is eighth on balance beam with a 49.010, 10th on vault with a 49.220 average and has a 49.120 on floor, good for 11th-best in the country. In the top 25 rankings for individual events, the Bulldogs are ranked seven times, including four times on bars. Senior Lindsey Cheek leads the way with a No. 2 ranking on bars and is 11th on vault and 17th on balance beam. Sophomore Brittany Rogers is fourth on bars and 19th in the all-around. Junior Chelsea Davis and freshman Kiera Brown are also in the top 25 on bars, at third and 21st, respectively.

LAST YEAR VS. THE BULLDOGS

Kentucky produced a dramatic late rally to spark a wild finish in Memorial Coliseum on Feb. 8, 2013, as UK tied Georgia, 195.825-195.825.

In an exciting evening of action that reached a fever pitch with the final event of the night, the Wildcats won the final two events and erased a 0.825-point deficit going into the final rotation.

Kentucky trailed 146.7-147.525 as it went to floor, but rallied to outscore Georgia 49.125-48.3 on the final rotation to pull off one of the most impressive regular season conference dual meet results in school history.

Audrey Harrison won the individual all-around title for the second straight week with a 39.300 and also took the floor exercise crown after a 9.900 helped spark the improbable comeback.

The final four Wildcats to compete on floor each notched scores above 9.800. Kayla Hartley's 9.825 to anchor the event would seal the tie.

UP NEXT: VS. NO. 2 FLORIDA (FEB. 7, 7 P.M. ET)

The Wildcats return home to face second-ranked Florida on Feb. 7 at 7 p.m.

Kentucky hosts the defending NCAA and SEC champions in Memorial Coliseum after the Gators claimed their first national crown in 2013. UF is undefeated on the season and is ranked first or second nationally on three events.

LAST TIME OUT: AT MISSOURI

In its first true road meet of the season, Kentucky had season high scores on three events en route to a 195.150-193.775 win at Missouri on Jan. 24.

The Wildcats won their first three events, vault, uneven bars and floor, all with season best scores. Individually, UK notched three event titles along with the senior Audrey Harrison's all-around win. Fifteen career or season highs were set or tied in UK's first dual meet of the year.

Harrison led UK with a 38.675 to win the all-around title for the second time in three weeks to open the year. Harrison also won floor and tied two others, including sophomore Tiara Phipps, for the win on uneven bars. Sophomore Amy Roemmele won balance beam. Harrison posted UK's first 9.900 of the season on floor and tied Phipps on uneven bars, who was making her collegiate debut on the event.

CATS RANKED 20TH NATIONALLY

After three weeks of competition, the Wildcats are ranked 20th as a team and are within the top 30 on all four events. With a 194.933 average, UK is one of seven SEC squads in the top 25.

After season-high scores on three events, the Wildcats moved up in the rankings on floor, bars

and vault. Kentucky is 16th on floor with a 48.983 average and 21st on balance beam with a 48.517. The Wildcats are tied for 27th on uneven bars with a 48.683 and 30th on vault with a 48.750 average.

RECORD CROWD SEES EXCITE NIGHT WIN

As Kentucky beat three teams to win its season-opener on Jan. 10, it did so in front of one of the largest crowds in UK gymnastics history. A crowd of 5,839 witnessed the Excite Night victory, which marked the largest since 2007, when 6,875 were in attendance. It also marked the third-largest UK home crowd since at least 1997.

CATS BEAT THREE TO WIN OPENER

In front of a lively crowd of nearly 6,000 fans, Kentucky defeated three teams and won the annual Excite Night at the Kentucky Classic event to open the 2014 season in Memorial Coliseum on Jan. 10.

The Wildcats scored a 195.000, ahead of No. 15 Penn State's 193.975. West Virginia placed third with a 193.700, while Ball State recorded a 190.875. UK senior Audrey Harrison won the all-around title with a 39.075 along with a win on beam with a 9.850. She joined redshirt junior Kayla Hartley with a meet-best 9.825 on floor.

The Wildcats claimed the top scores on vault with a 48.600, beam with a 48.675 and floor with a 48.950. UK's uneven bars score of 48.775 was second to West Virginia's.

2014 SCHEDULE NOTHING TO LAUGH AT

With 10 top-25 teams on Kentucky's 2014 slate, including four of the top five, ranked in the preseason coaches poll, the Wildcats face one of the most grueling schedules in the nation. Among top-25 teams, CollegeGymFans.com has tabbed UK's schedule as the toughest in the country, while RoadtoNationals.com the Blue and White's schedule as the second-best strength of schedule among all NCAA teams. Seven of the SEC's eight teams enter the season ranked nationally, with the eighth, Missouri, receiving votes.

HIGHEST PRESEASON RANKING

The Wildcats earned their highest preseason ranking in team history at 21st. In the GymInfo Preseason Coaches Poll, UK is one of seven SEC teams ranked nationally, led by top-ranked and defending national champion Florida and No. 2 Alabama. In 2012, head coach Tim Garrison's first season, the Wildcats were ranked 23rd while they were voted 25th last season.

RETURNING STARPOWER

UK returns 13 letterwinners from the record-setting 2013 team and lost just two. Among

the returners are seniors Holly Cunningham, Audrey Harrison and Kayla Sienkowski along with redshirt junior Kayla Hartley. Harrison returns after winning a league-leading six all-around titles in SEC competition last year. The Wildcats welcome three freshmen, Alyssa Bertoni, Kirsten Canini and Taylor Puryear to the team in 2014.

SEC'S ALL-AROUND LEADER IS BACK

Senior Audrey Harrison is coming off a record-setting 2013 season. One of the most consistent competitors in the nation last season, the Knoxville, Tenn., native tallied a league-leading six all-around titles in SEC meets and totaled seven in all competitions. Harrison scored a career-high score of 39.425 at Ball State and also won all-around titles against then-No. 13 Auburn, No. 9 Arkansas, No. 6 LSU, No. 6 Georgia and No. 1 Florida.

A LOOK BACK AT A RECORD-SETTING 2013

Kentucky is coming off a record-setting 2013 campaign that saw numerous school records fall. UK earned a ninth-consecutive NCAA Regional bid with a school-record regional qualifying score of 196.06 after breaking the team best score twice. A 196.775 in the regular season finale at Penn State bested the previous high score, set earlier in the season at Ball State.

The Wildcats notched three wins against SEC opponents, the most in program history and earned a 3-3-1 league mark, also a school best. All three wins were against teams ranked in the top 15, with two over top-nine foes. In postseason play, UK tallied the program's highest-ever NCAA Regional team score of 195.575 and finished fourth at the regional.

WINNING BIG AT THE CATSPY AWARDS

The Kentucky gymnastics team wrapped up a historic 2013 season by claiming the prestigious "Team of the Year Award" at the annual CATSPY Awards along with two individual awards.

Tim Garrison was named Coach of the Year alongside baseball coach Gary Henderson and rifle coach Harry Mullins, while sophomore Shannon Mitchell picked up the Scratch Award, given to the top non-scholarship student-athlete.

The 11th-annual CATSPYs recognized UK's athletic and academic performance during the year. A spin-off of the popular ESPY Awards held each year by ESPN, the CATSPYS feature 24 individual and team honors, chosen from UK's 22 varsity sports.

Kentucky will appear on five nationally televised broadcasts during the 2014 season.

A total of 21 SEC gymnastics meets will be broadcast in addition to the SEC Championship, all on a delayed basis.

The SEC Championship on March 22 will air on ESPNU on March 27 at 5:30 p.m. ET and again on ESPN2 at 11 a.m. on March 29.

UK's contest at Georgia on Feb 1 will air on Fox Sports Net on Feb. 7. Florida, the defending NCAA and SEC Champions, come to Lexington on Feb. 7, which will be broadcast by FSN on Feb. 15. Kentucky's meet at Arkansas on Feb. 21 will also air on FSN, on March 1. The times for all eight of FSN's SEC gymnastics broadcasts will be announced at a later date.

The Wildcats will appear on CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast) once. Jan. 18's tri-meet, against Alabama and Nebraska in Knoxville, Tenn., will be broadcast on Jan. 24, with a time to be announced.

HEAD COACH TIM GARRISON



Tim Garrison enters his third season as the University of Kentucky gymnastics head coach after leading the team to unprecedented success in his first two seasons.

Kentucky is coming off a record-setting 2013 campaign that saw numerous school records fall. UK earned a ninth-consecutive NCAA Regional bid with a school-record regional qualifying score of 196.06 after breaking the team best score twice. A 196.775 in the regular season finale at Penn State bested the

previous high score, set earlier in the season at Ball State.

The Wildcats notched three wins against SEC opponents, the most in program history and earned a 3-3-1 league mark, also a school best. All three wins were against teams ranked in the top 15, with two over top-nine foes. In postseason play, UK tallied the program's highest-ever NCAA Regional team score of 195.575 and finished fourth at the regional.

The Kentucky gymnastics team wrapped up a historic 2013 season by claiming the prestigious "Team of the Year Award" at the annual CATSPY Awards along with two individual awards. Garrison was named Coach of the Year alongside baseball coach Gary Henderson and rifle coach Harry Mullins, while sophomore Shannon Mitchell picked up the Scratch Award, given to the top non-scholarship student-athlete.

The Wildcats finished 2012 with three consecutive scores of 195.875 or higher, Kentucky's best-ever three meet stretch. UK also sealed the first winning regular season since 2008 in Garrison's first campaign. Garrison guided the Wildcats to a final No. 25 ranking with a National Qualifying Score of 390.240 in 2012. The ranking made Garrison the first head coach in school history to take his team to a top-25 final ranking in his first season.

The Wildcats earned back-to-back victories over top-25 teams when UK took down Southeastern Conference foe Auburn at home and highly ranked Illinois on the road midway through the season. The Wildcats also posted just the 10th score of 196 or higher in school history with a 196.025 against George Washington and Ball State during Garrison's inaugural season.

Garrison arrived at UK after helping the Huskers reach new heights with two NCAA Super Six appearances and two Big 12 Conference championships. The native of Conroe, Texas, served as the Huskers' vault, floor exercise and strength and conditioning coach, while also helping in all facets of recruiting.

In his five years at Nebraska, Garrison was responsible for producing 10 NCAA All-Americans, while his vault and floor teams consistently ranked as one of the top-10 teams in the nation. In 2011, Garrison helped lead the Huskers back to the NCAA Super Six Finals, where they matched their best finish in school history, finishing fourth. Two of Garrison's vault performers ended the individual finals in the top five, while two other gymnasts were in the top 12 on floor.

In his first year on the job in Lincoln in 2007, Garrison's vault team finished sixth in the nation, while the floor squad was in the top five of the final rankings. In 2009, Nebraska was ranked sixth nationally on floor and in 2010 the Huskers were fifth on vault. Garrison's vault and floor teams had an excellent season in 2011 with the Huskers finishing among the nation's best on vault (third) and floor (seventh). Nebraska made the NCAA Tournament in each of Garrison's five years, advancing to nationals three times.

Prior to Nebraska, Garrison developed a reputation as one of the most successful club coaches in the country, serving as a head coach for SCEGA Gymnastics in Temecula, Calif., for 10 years. SCEGA Gymnastics is one of the largest and most thriving gymnastics teams in the nation. While with SCEGA, Garrison produced 27 national champions, 10 Junior Olympic

National Team members and four Elite National Team members. For his efforts, Garrison was named Coach of the Year for Southern California by USA Gymnastics a impressive five times, including four consecutive from 2001-04.

In 2001, Garrison coached Rachel Tidd to the World Championships in Ghent, Belgium, where she captured a team bronze medal and finished eighth on beam. A year earlier, Garrison coached Tidd to a 10th-place showing in the 2000 U.S. Olympic Trials.

Garrison spent three years at SCATS Gymnastics in Huntington Beach, Calif., where he was responsible for conditioning and meet preparation for a group of optional and compulsory gymnasts. During his time there, Garrison produced a national qualifier every year at both the Junior Olympic National Championships and the Elite Classic competitions. Garrison also coached at Karolyi's Gymnastics in Houston, Texas, alongside famed former U.S. Olympic Team coach Bela Karolyi.

Garrison and his wife, Rachel, served as the directors for the Nebraska School of Gymnastics during their time in Lincoln. The duo successfully increased the enrollment in the program from 40 participants to over 170 members. Garrison also was named the USAG Coach of the Year in 2009 for Nebraska.

Garrison graduated from California State University at Fullerton in 1995 with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education. The Garrisons have three daughters: Rayley, Taige and Teagan; and one son: Reece.

SEVENTH SEASON

Chuck Dickerson enters his seventh year with the Kentucky gymnastics program as a key component of head coach Tim Garrison's staff.

Dickerson was retained as an assistant coach when Garrison arrived in Lexington before the 2012 season.

Dickerson, who was the 2010 Gymnastics Assistant Coach of the Year for the central region by the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches, has enjoyed five very successful seasons as an assistant coach for Kentucky.

Dickerson helped the program begin a resurgence on floor under the new coaching staff in 2012. UK defeated four consecutive opponents on the event. In addition, Hartley and Harrison combined to win six straight floor titles at the regular seasons' conclusion.

Dickerson coached previously coached vault and uneven bars for the Wildcats, guiding UK to a school-record team score on vault of 49.4, while the Wildcats tied a school record team-score on bars with a 49.325.

Dickerson helped the UK gymnastics team steadily improve its efforts on the vault apparatus since his arrival in Lexington in 2008. Kentucky has ranked among the top 18 schools on the event each season under Dickerson. The Wildcats set a school record with a 49.150 regional qualifying score on vault in 2009 while in 2010 then-sophomore Whitney Rose (Frisco, Texas) became UK's first gymnast to qualify for nationals since 2006 when she scored a 9.900 to tie for first place.

In 2009, Dickerson coached the vault squad to top-20 status all year long, peaking at No. 7. It was the second year in a row the vault line-up finished the year top 15. One of the lead vaulters, Emily Green, earned a 9.950, the first mark of that caliber on vault since 2003. Green dominated the event averaging a 9.85. Also grabbing recognition for her talent was Whitney Rose who also became a solid vault worker and was named the SEC Freshman of the Year.

With over 25 years of coaching experience, Dickerson is able to assist the Wildcats in recruiting top talent. In 2008, Dickerson helped sign fellow Tyler, Texas, native Storey Morris, Rose of Frisco, Texas, the 2008 Texas State vault and all-around champion, and three-time national bar champion Jennifer Taylor of Tulsa, Okla.

Since 2004, the Tyler, Texas, native had been working in his hometown at Texas East Gymnastics where he coached former UK gymnast, Storey Morris. In both 2006 and 2007, he qualified a gymnast for the USA Championships to go along with his numerous national qualifiers in his four-year span.

Prior to his time at Texas East, Dickerson spent eight years at Rowland/Ballard Gymnastics in Kingwood, Texas. While there, he had seven athletes receive Division I scholarships and sent 15 on to the national championships. In 2002, he earned the great honor of being voted the Texas USA Gymnastics Coach of the Year by his peers.

Early on in his career, Dickerson spent 10 years working under famed coach Bela Karolyi. In his coaching career, he has coached three national champions.

Dickerson resides in Lexington.

Mary McDaniel enters her third season as an assistant coach at Kentucky after enjoying a great debut campaign in 2012.

McDaniel, who was hired on July 11, 2011 oversees Kentucky's efforts on balance beam as well as coordinating dance routines for floor exercise.

Beam proved to be one of Kentucky's best and most consistent events as a team in 2012. The Wildcats ranked in the top 20 on the event for much of 2012.

The team notched three of the top-15 scores in school history on the event last season.

McDaniel helped senior Storey Morris close out her career in style as she nearly broke a career-best score with a 9.85 at her final meet, the 2012 NCAA Regional.

On floor in 2012, UK defeated four consecutive opponents on the event. In addition, Hartley and Harrison combined to win six straight floor titles at the regular seasons' conclusion.

McDaniel came to UK after a successful 20-year stint as a club coach in Kansas, helping countless young gymnasts fulfill their dreams in collegiate athletics.

McDaniel spent time at McCracken's Gymnastics and Swim in Olathe, Kan., before arriving in Lexington. She held countless titles there, including head coach and meet director since 1991. While in Olathe, McDaniel was directly responsible for all aspects of McCracken's team program, including personally training and coaching all level nine and 10 gymnasts and helping design routines, practice schedules and performance requirements.

Over her 20-plus years of coaching club, McDaniel has coached numerous athletes to USA Gymnastics Western Nationals and level 10 USA Gymnastics Junior Olympic Nationals. McDaniel has also coached numerous athletes to state and regional championships, while helping a large handful of gymnasts to Division I programs across the nation.

While coaching at McCracken's Gymnastics, McDaniel spent 15 years as a member of the USA Gymnastics Kansas State Administrative Committee, helping organize state clinics and other gymnastics activities around the state.

McDaniel began coaching in 1987 as a level four and five beam and floor coach at McCracken's Gymnastics before moving to Gym Country Gymnastics in Tulsa, Okla., where she served as the beam and floor coach for a year. McDaniel moved back to McCracken Gymnastics in 1991 to begin her successful 20-year post as office manager, meet director and head coach.

The native of Olathe graduated from the University of Kansas in 1994 with a bachelor of science degree in business administration with a concentration in exercise science.

Mary is married to Ken McDaniel and the couple has one daughter, Isabelle, 6.
