CAT SCRATCHES

- UK earned a 76-42 win on Friday in its first exhibition contest of the season over Transylvania. Freshman Julius Randle turned in a double-double effort with team-highs in points (16) and rebounds (12).
- The Wildcats utilized a 20-2 run to begin the second half to pull away from the Pioneers. Freshman Dakari Johnson chipped in with nine points and eight boards.
- Kentucky enters the season ranked No. 1 in the AP and Coaches' polls. UK was unranked at the end of last season. It is the first time in the 22-year history of the poll that a team begins the season No. 1 after finishing the previous season unranked. The Wildcats last started at No. 1 prior to the 1995-96 season -- finishing at No. 1 in that season as well.
- Kentucky was selected by the media to win its 46th Southeastern Conference championship, while freshman Julius Randle was the preseason pick for Player of the Year.
- Randle was the only freshman in the league to earn recognition to the preseason All-SEC first team, while Willie Cauley-Stein, Andrew Harrison and Dakari Johnson were second-team honorees.
- Since John Calipari's arrival at Kentucky, the Wildcats have turned in four semesters with team grade-point averages of 3.0 or better including the spring semester of the 2013 season that saw a record 3.23 average with 12 players earning a 3.0 or higher. Additionally, UK has graduated 10 players during Calipari's tenure including current team members Jon Hood and Jarrod Polson.
- Andrew Harrison was selected as a preseason candidate for the Bob Cousy award presented in March to the nation's top point guard.
- UK is 50-4 all-time in preseason exhibition contests and has won 36 of the last 37 played.





A Look at the Series ...

Scouting the Falcons

Montevallo capped the 2012-13 season with an at-large bid to the NCAA Division II tournament, falling in the opening round to Barton College.

Montevallo, earned an at-large bid in the Southeast Region, and made its eighth NCAA Division II men's basketball tournament appearance in the last 10 years, including its fourth-consecutive appearance in the national tournament. The Falcons were the defending NCAA Division II Southeast Region tournament champions.

Montevallo, in its fifth season as a member of the Peach Belt Conference and the NCAA Division II Southeast Region, captured its third region tournament title in school history in 2011-12 on its way to the school's first ever appearance in the national championship game. The Falcons also captured NCAA Division II South Region tournament championships during the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 seasons.

The Falcons won the 2013 Peach Belt Conference West Division championship for the second-consecutive season. Montevallo advanced to the Peach Belt Conference tournament championship game before falling to East Division champion USC Aiken 65-60.

Montevallo is led by junior Troran Brown who garnered preseason accolades from a pair of preseason men's basketball publications.

Brown was named an All-American by the Division II Bulletin, the weekly newsletter of Division II men's basketball. Brown was also named an honorable mention All-American by The Sporting News.

The Division II Bulletin also named Brown its preseason PBC Player of the Year and predicted the Falcons to capture their third consecutive PBC West Division regular season

championship.

Brown led the Falcons last season with an average of 18.7 points per game and 5.8 assists per game. Brown was named first team All-PBC while also garnering second team National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and Daktronics NCAA Division II All-Southeast Region honors.

Head Coach Danny Young

Danny Young is in his 12th season as the head coach of the University of Montevallo. He has guided the Falcons to NCAA Division II Tournaments in eight of the last 10 seasons.

The program has been one of the most consistent postseason participants in NCAA Division II competition during Young's tenure.

Young owns a 246-107 record at Montevallo. He has directed eight teams to the NCAA "Sweet Sixteen" with three of those teams advancing to the "Elite Eight." One squad advanced to the NCAA Championship game.

He was the Gulf South Conference East Division Coach of the Decade for 2000-2010.

UK in Exhibition Games

Kentucky has rolled up a 50-4 all-time mark in exhibition games to start the season or in season games following a 76-42 victory over Transylvania on Friday. The Wildcats have won 36 of their last 37 exhibition games and are currently on a 21-game winning streak in such games.

Transylvania Recap

Freshman forward Julius Randle posted a double-double and top-ranked Kentucky pulled away for a 76-42 exhibition victory over Transylvania on Friday night.

Shooting solidly but leading only 41-30 at halftime, Kentucky broke it open with an 18-2 run over the first eight minutes of the second half. The Wildcats went on to make 15 of 26 from the field in the second half (57.7 percent) and finish 29 of 58.

Randle's 16 points on 6-of-9 shooting and 12 rebounds led the way for Kentucky. James Young added nine points, five rebounds and five assists, guard Aaron Harrison scored eight points and center Dakari Johnson had nine points and eight rebounds.

Blue-White Recap

James Young scored 25 points on 11-of-16 shooting and Julius Randle added 21 as the Blue squad cruised past the White 99-71 in Kentucky's Blue-White scrimmage on Tuesday night.

Aaron Harrison added 19 points and six assists for the Blue, which hit its first six shots en route to finishing 43 of 69 from the field (62 percent) and outrebounding the White 36-28. Dakari Johnson had 15 points and nine rebounds.

Derek Willis' 21 points led the White, which shot 45 percent (29 of 64). Sophomore 7-footer Willie Cauley-Stein combined for 15 points and seven rebounds playing for both teams.

Kentucky Begins the Year Ranked No. 1 in the AP and Coaches' Polls

Kentucky (21-12) was unranked at the end of last season. It is the first time in the 22-year history of the poll that a team begins the season No. 1 after finishing the previous season unranked. The Wildcats last started at No. 1 prior to the 1995-96 season -- finishing at No. 1 in that season as well.

UK as the Top Ranked Team

The Wildcats own an all-time record of 176-26 mark as the nation's top-ranked squad. UK has won 18 of its last 19 contests as the AP's top team.

Calipari at No. 1

Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank Mc-Guire) to lead three teams to a No. 1 ranking. Calipari is 62-8 as the top-ranked coach in the country. He tallied a 32-4 mark at UMass when the Minutemen were No. 1 and he was 9-1 at Memphis when he had the Tigers at the pinnacle of the rankings. Calipari is 21 of 24 when his team is at the top as UK's head coach.

In addition, Calipari has guided four of his last six teams to the No. 1 ranking and this year marks the sixth time he's led his team to the top ranking throughout his career. He guided his 1994-95 and 1995-96 UMass teams to the No. 1 ranking, as well as his 2007-08 Memphis team and his 2009-10 and

Harrison Tabbed to Bob Cousy Award Watch List

Freshman guard Andrew Harrison was one of 45 players to earn recognition as a member of the watch list of candidates for the 2014 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award in was announced in late October.

The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball. The list was created by a committee of well-respected media members and influential people within college basketball from around the country. The watch list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 20 in early February, then final five by early March.

Media Select Kentucky as Preseason Favorite for SEC Title

The Kentucky men's basketball team was selected by the media to win its 46th Southeastern Conference championship this season as announced by the league office. Voting was conducted by a select panel of both SEC and national media members. Each school selected media members that cover their team and additional media from across the nation were selected by the conference office to comprise the voting panel.

The Wildcats were the overall preseason favorite, marking the ninth time since 1998-99 that UK was the early-season pick. UK tallied 21 first-place votes, while Florida earned five first-place votes and Tennessee received one.

Media Predict Randle as SEC Player of the Year, Three Others Earn Preseason All-SEC Teams

Freshman Julius Randle as the favorite to win the league's Player of the Year honor. Randle garnered 11 votes as the media selected him as the preseason pick for the award. Randle was also selected as a preseason All-SEC first team selection, the only first-year player earning the honor.

Three Kentucky players were picked to earn second-team honors including sophomore Willie Cauley-Stein and freshmen Andrew Harrison and Dakari Johnson. Cauley-Stein was an All-SEC Freshman team selection in 2013.

Three-Mania

UK has the nation's third-longest active streak of consecutive games with a made three-pointer. UK has hit a three-pointer in 860 consecutive games, which trails only UNLV and Vanderbilt. The Wildcats' last game without a 3-pointer came against Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1988, a "three-point" loss in the Great Alaska Shootout.

UNLV and Vanderbilt have hit a 3-pointer in every game since the 3-point rule was adopted to start the 1986-87 season. Through the conclusion of the 2013 season, the Rebels' streak is 875 games, while Vanderbilt's streak is 866 games.

UK vs. the Country

UK will take on four first-time opponents including Belmont, Boise State, Northern Kentucky and Texas-Arlington during the 2013-14 season. Going into the year, UK has played 210 of the current 338 Division I programs.

Hood, Polson Graduate to Add to Perfect Success Rate

Since John Calipari's arrival at Kentucky, the Wildcats have turned in four semesters with team grade-point averages of 3.0 or better including the spring semester of the 2013 season that saw a record 3.23 average with 12 players earning a 3.0 or higher. Additionally, players have logged a 3.0 GPA or higher on 53 occasions in various semesters since his arrival including nine during the National Championship spring semester.

Furthermore, under Calipari all seven players who exhausted their athletic eligibility have graduated from UK including Twany Beckham, Josh Harrellson, Ramon Harris, Mark Krebs, Darius Miller, Perry Stevenson and Eloy Vargas. Additionally, Patrick Patterson and Jarrod Polson completed degrees in just three years. Current senior Jon Hood has also received a bachelor's degree, and will have another year of athletic eligibility.

A Team of Champions

Six players on the 2013-14 Kentucky men's basketball roster claimed a state or national title while in high school. Aaron and Andrew Harrison, Dominique Hawkins, Dakari Johnson, Sam Malone and Julius Randle all claimed state basketball championships.

Johnson also led Montverde Academy to the National High School Invitational Championship last season.

All-Americans and Players of the Year

In addition to team success, this year's roster posts a slew of All-Americans or High School Players of the Year.

Aaron Harrison, Andrew Harrison, Dominique Hawkins, Dakari Johnson, Marcus Lee, Alex Poythress, Julius Randle and James Young all garnered All-America accolades to conclude their high-school careers.

Hawkins, Poythress and Jon Hood form the trio that earned Gatorade High School and state Player of the Year accolades.

UK Among Inaugural Team Academic Honor-

The Kentucky men's basketball team was among the inaugural Team Academic Excellence Award winners, created by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) in 2013. These awards recognize outstanding academic achievement by a team with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better for the 2012-13 season.

The Wildcats boasted a 3.23 team grade point average for the 2012-13 academic year which was a team record. Twelve UK players accumulated a 3.0 GPA or higher in the spring semester including Twany Beckham and Jarrod Polson who were honored individually by the NABC for academic excellence.

Kentucky was the only team from the Southeastern Conference to earn recognition to the NABC's inaugural team academic excellence award. The honor is even more impressive considering UK is among six BCS level institutions to earn recognition.

Cauley-Stein, Poythress Lead Returners

The sophomore tandem of Willie Cauley-Stein and Alex Poythress leads the returning group of players for John Calipari in his fifth season at Kentucky. Cauley-Stein and Poythress both earned All-Southeastern Conference Freshman Team accolades and are the team's top-two returning scorers and rebounders from a season ago.

The 2013-14 roster returns 31 percent of its scoring from a season ago, which is a significant improvement from the six-percent figure that returned for the 2012-13 season.

In addition to the sophomore duo, seniors Jarrod Polson and Jon Hood accounted for more than 140 points, 100 rebounds and 30 assists from last year's output.

Among the Best Freshman Seasons

After the conclusion of their freshman campaigns, Willie Cauley-Stein and Alex Poythress ranked among UK's all-time best freshmen.

Poythress finished ranking ninth in rebounding, 10th in made free throws and field-goal percentage and 17th in scoring.

Cauley-Stein was fourth in field-goal percentage, seventh in blocked shots, 12th in rebounding and 33rd in scoring.

SEC Domination

- · Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats have been the most dominant team in the league, recording a 911-256 mark (.781).
- Only one other team has won more than 700 regular season SEC games (Alabama) and no other team has a better winning percentage.

- UK has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.2 losses per season in 78 years in the SEC.
- The Wildcats have won 45 SEC titles and 27 SEC Tournament championships, more than the other 13 teams combined.
- · Kentucky has won 11 of the last 20 SEC Tournament titles.

A Winning Institution

The University of Kentucky is one of just seven institutions in the nation that has seen both its men's and women's basketball programs tally 20 or more wins in four-consecutive seasons. UK joins BYU, Duke, Gonzaga, Miami (FL), Notre Dame and Syracuse that have all had four-consecutive 20-win seasons by both their men's and women's teams.

UK has tallied a 233-55 (.809) combined record between its two programs. That record includes a 131-5 (.963) mark in Lexington in Rupp Arena (men) and Memorial Coliseum (women).

ESPN'S College GameDay Returns to Rupp in 2014

For the fifth time in program history, and the second consecutive year, the ESPN College GameDay tour will visit Kentucky's historic Rupp Arena for a weekly installment of the popular college basketball preview show. ESPN has selected the Florida-Kentucky matchup on Feb. 15 as one of its eight College GameDay stops during the 2013-14 season.

Since its inception during the 2004-05 season, College GameDay has featured the Wildcats eight total times, including this year's upcoming appearance.

GameDay last visited Rupp Arena during the 2012-13 season when the Wildcats hosted the Missouri Tigers. The game didn't disappoint with UK posting an exciting 90-83 overtime win. The Blue and White own a 4-0 record on days when it is featured by the GameDay crew under John Calipari's direction and has been selected for the show in each year of Calipari's tenure at UK.

Last year, a crowd of 15,087 attended the morning GameDay show, the second largest ever. UK also holds the record for the largest crowd in GameDay history of 22,144, set on Feb. 13, 2010.

The Wildcats have faced Florida in three of their seven previous GameDay appearances, with the other meetings coming against Missouri (2013), Vanderbilt (2012), Tennessee (2010) and Mississippi State (2005).

Noel, Goodwin Drafted

Former Wildcats Nerlens Noel and Archie Goodwin were both selected in the NBA Draft's opening round in late June. Noel was taken No. 6 overall by the New Orleans Pelicans, while the

Freshman Class Ranked No. 1 Again

For the fifth consecutive season the Wildcats will boast the No. 1 recruiting class entering the upcoming season. EJ Floreal, Aaron Harrison, Andrew Harrison, Dominique Hawkins, Dakari Johnson, Marcus Lee, Julius Randle, Derek Willis and James Young form the nine-member freshman class for the 2013-14 season.

Randle is the nation's consensus top power forward and is ranked the No. 2 overall player by Rivals, the No. 3 overall player by ESPN and the No. 5 overall player by Scout.

Aaron Harrison is ranked the No. 1 shooting guard in the country by all three recruiting services, while Rivals and Scout both rank him the fourth-overall prospect in the country. ESPNU Recruiting ranked him fifth.

Andrew is ranked as the top point guard in the country by all three recruiting services and the thirdbest prospect in the country by ESPNU Recruiting. Scout and Rivals both rank him as the fifth-best prospect.

Young is ranked as the No. 6 prospect in his class by ESPNU Recruiting and No. 10 by both Rivals and Scout. ESPNU and Rivals rank him as the second-best shooting guard in the country, while Scout ranks him as the third-best small forward in the nation.

Johnson is rated as the No. 11 overall player by ESPN and the top player at his position (center). Rivals ranks him as the No. 9 overall player and Scout lists him at No. 18.

Lee is ranked as the No. 17 overall player and the No. 5 power forward in his class by Rivals. ESPNU Recruiting has him rated as the No. 30 overall prospect and the ninth-best power forward. Scout has him tabbed as the No. 40 overall player and the No. 3 center.

Rivals has tabbed Willis as the No. 25 power forward, while Scout has him ranked at No. 27. ESPNU Recruiting has rated him at No. 37 at his position.

Hawkins is rated as the No. 44 point guard by 247 Sports. Rivals and Scout rank him as a three-star player. He is the 17th player in UK history to enter his freshman season after earning the Kentucky Mr. Basketball award as the state's top high school player.

Floreal is a walk-on player who played one season at Dunbar High School in Lexington. He is the son of UK's track and field coach, Edrick Floreal.

- UK has won 150 of its last 175 home games. Kentucky went on a 54-game winning streak in the venerable arena to begin the John Calipari era.
- The Wildcats are 494-62 (.889) all-time in Rupp Arena.
- UK has won 24 national attendance titles in the building, including 17 of the last 18.
- The Rupp Arena attendance record of 24,479 was set against Louisville on Jan. 2, 2010.
- The Wildcats have posted a remarkable 269-39 (.873) record in regular season SEC games in the building.

Calipari Owns Record in Rupp

With UK's 2011-12 season-opening victory over Marist, UK head coach John Calipari recorded his 34th consecutive win in Rupp Arena as UK's head coach. It broke former UK head coach Rick Pitino's longest streak of 33 games in the venue.

Calipari's winning streak was snapped at 54 games with a loss to Baylor in his fourth season. The 54-game run, however, was his longest career home winning streak.

In four seasons, Calipari has only yielded one conference loss in the arena. Texas A&M notched a win on Jan. 12, 2013.

Kentucky Leads the Nation

For 17 of the last 18 seasons, Rupp Arena has owned the national attendance average including a Rupp Arena record of 24,110 in John Calipari's first season as head coach in 2009-10.

During the last 18 seasons, UK has averaged 22,960 fans per season. In the Calipari Era, UK has averaged no fewer than 23,099 fans per outing.

Calipari at No. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three teams to a No. 1 ranking in his career. He has guided three of his last six teams to the top spot in the polls. Coach Cal has coached five different teams to a No. 1 ranking including his 1994-95 and 1996 teams at UMass, his 2007-08 Memphis squad and his 2009-10, 2011-12 and 2013-14 teams at Kentucky.

The Success Rate

Coach Calipari has graduated 100% of the players (10 of 10) who have been eligiblie to graduate by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility. Of that group, Patrick Patterson and Jarrod Polson each completed their degrees in just three years. Current senior Jon Hood has also received a bachelor's degree, and will ahve another year of eligibility.

Calipari Comfortable at Home

Since the 2000 season, John Calipari-coached teams have posted a 221-21 (.913) record at home. In Calipari's first season, UK tallied an 18-0 mark at home, and the Cats were 15-0 in Rupp in his second season. Kentucky finished 18-0 last season and went 16-2 this year.

His 54-game winning streak at Rupp was the longest streak since the arena opened in 1976.

Calipari on a Roll in Conference Play

Calipari has recorded an 99-14 record in league play over the last six seasons. He's 52-14 in SEC action at the helm of Kentucky.

Calipari Unrivaled in the Conference

UK head coach John Calipari is unrivaled in the league when it comes to conference accolades. During his career, Calipari has won 12 league championships, including the 2010 and 2012 SEC Championships, seven more than the next closest coach (Billy Donovan has five conference titles).

Calipari also has 11 conference tournament titles, eight more than his closest competitor.

Furthermore, he's tallied a 260-80 (.765) all-time record within conference play as a head coach. He owns a 52-14 (.788) clip since joining the SEC.

Fifty is Nifty

With a 90-83 overtime victory over Missouri on Feb. 20, John Calipari claimed his 50th Southeastern Conference victory. He achieved the feat in just 62 games as head coach of the Cats. It's the second-fastest stretch of games to win 50 in league history, trailing only Adolph Rupp who achieved the feat in 57 contests.

Calipari's Undefeated Conference Teams

When John Calipari led Kentucky to a 16-0 mark in league play in 2012, he joined rarified air. Calipari is believed to be one of three coaches, along with Frank McGuire and Jerry Tarkanian, to lead multiple teams to an unblemished mark in multiple Division 1 conferences.

Calipari did so at Memphis in Conference USA and Kentucky in the Southeastern Conference.

McGuire led St. John's in the Metro New York ('51, '52), North Carolina in the ACC ('57) and South Carolina in the ACC ('70) to undefeated marks.

Jerry Tarkanian guided Long Beach State in the Pacific Coast Athletics Association ('70, '71) and UNLV in the Big West ('87, '91, '92) to perfect conference seasons.

Calipari and the NBA Draft

Coach John Calipari has had two or more players selected in SIX consecutive NBA drafts dating back to 2008 with Memphis. He has three players who have been taken No. 1 overall. Following the 2013 draft, Calipari has had nine players taken in the top 10 of the draft in the last four seasons and 13 taken in the first round of the draft. With Anthony Davis going No. 1 overall in 2012, Calipari has coached three No. 1 picks in a five-year span. And his three No. 1 picks are the most by one coach in NBA Draft history.

Kentucky head coach John Calipari reached the mountaintop in his third year in Lexington, guiding Kentucky to its eighth national championship and its 15th Final Four. In doing so, he claimed his first national championship and his fourth appearance in the Final Four. He is one of only two coaches to lead three different schools to a Final Four (UMass-1996; Memphis-2008; Kentucky-2011, 2012).

The Wildcats rode the trademark hard-nosed Calipari defense to the 2012 title, finishing the season as the nation's top-ranked team in field-goal percentage defense and blocked shots.

Kentucky lost three members of its 2011 Final Four team (two to the draft, one to graduation), but Calipari reloaded with the nation's top-ranked recruiting class for the third straight season. Included in the class were eventual National Player of the Year Anthony Davis and All-American Michael Kidd-Gilchrist.

En route to the national championship, Calipari guided the Wildcats to an NCAA record-tying 38 wins, a perfect 16-0 mark in the Southeastern Conference and the school's 45th SEC championship, all while extending his winning streak in Rupp Arena to 51 straight games. Calipari extended his perfect mark at home as UK's coach to 54 games before finally losing in his fourth year at Kentucky.

Upon being named head coach on April 1, 2009, Calipari continued to work his magic of resurrecting once proud programs, taking an NIT team in 2009 to the 2010 NCAA Elite Eight. Along the way he led the Wildcats to a No. 1 ranking (UK's first since 2003), the program's 44th SEC regular-season championship and 26th SEC Tournament title.

The honors continued after the 2009-10 season as Calipari became the first coach in UK history to receive the Adolph Rupp National Coach of the Year award. He then watched as five of his players were selected in the first round of the 2010 NBA Draft, the first time a school has ever produced five first-round picks. Among those picks was the first Wildcat ever taken as the No. 1 overall pick, John Wall.

In his second year in 2010-11, a season that was labeled as a "rebuilding effort," one in which Calipari and the Cats were supposed to struggle after losing an unprecedented five first-round picks in the 2010 NBA Draft, Kentucky reloaded as Calipari guided UK to its 27th SEC Tournament championship, kept his unbeaten record at Rupp Arena alive and collected his 500th career on-court win.

In his inaugural season as head coach of the Wildcats, Calipari posted his fifth straight 30-win season, the only coach in NCAA Division I history to do so. In addition to the Rupp National Coach of the Year, Calipari was also named the Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year.

When he led Kentucky back to the No. 1 spot in the country, Calipari became one of only two coaches (Frank McGuire) in NCAA history to lead three teams to a No. 1 ranking. He led UMass to a No. 1 ranking in 1995 and 1996, and he led Memphis to the No. 1 spot in the 2008 season.

Much like he did at UMass, when his players graduated at nearly 80 percent, Calipari has stressed academics. Fifteen of his last 18 seniors that came through the Memphis program earned their bachelor's degrees, and all 10 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a degree in hand.

The Wildcats posted a 3.4 grade-point-average in the 2013 spring semester with 12 players earning a 3.0 GPA or better. It marked the fourth semester in the last five fall/spring semesters Coach Cal's team earned a 3.0 or better.

As someone who prides himself on helping young men

reach their dreams, he has placed 29 players in the NBA during his college coaching career, including 17 over his first four seasons at Kentucky. The 17 picks over a four-season span is the most of any coach.

In 2010, five of his UK players were selected in the first round for the first time in NBA history. He followed that up with four players in the draft in 2011, six players in 2012 — the most in a two-round draft — and two more in 2013.

Overall, he's churned out 17 NBA draft picks, 13 first-rounders, two No. 1 overall selections, five top-five picks and eight lottery picks at Kentucky. Since the 2008 draft, 22 of Coach Cal's players have been taken in the NBA Draft, including 15 first-rounders.

Included in Calipari's NBA success are three No. 1 overall picks (Derrick Rose, Wall and Davis) over the last five years. No other coach has had three No. 1 picks, and 2012 was the first time two players from the same team (Davis and Kidd-Gilchrist) were taken with the top two picks in the draft.

After bringing the University of Massachusetts basketball program to national prominence in the '90s and resurrecting the Memphis basketball program in the 2000s, Calipari became the 22nd coach in UK history and seventh in the last 80 years.

Following his fourth season at UK, Calipari's overall oncourt record is 568-166, the third-highest winning percentage (77.4) among active NCAA Division I coaches with 10 years experience at college basketball's Division I level, trailing only Mark Few and Roy Williams.

His 173 victories from 2008-12 are the most ever for a coach over a five-year span in Division-I history. On the NCAA Division I list for winning percentage for all coaches (minimum 10 years), Calipari is in 10th place and ahead of Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Bob Huggins and Lute Olson.

Calipari's eight 30-win seasons are third most for a head coach in NCAA Division I history. For his career (21 years), Calipari has 19 20-win seasons and 12 25-win campaigns.

Coach Cal started his head-coaching career at UMass in 1998, guiding a struggling program at UMass to the top of college basketball, capped off by a Final Four appearance in 1996

At 29, when he was named head coach, Calipari began building a program from the ground up, going 10-18 his first season before posting a 17-14 record his second year (receiving a bid to the National Invitation Tournament). The Minutemen won their first Atlantic 10 championship in 1992 with a 30-5 record, including a 13-3 mark in league play. With a 77-71 overtime win over Syracuse in an East Regional second-round game, UMass made its first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance.

From there, the program skyrocketed under Coach Cal.

Calipari compiled a 193-71 record (.731) during his eightyear career at Massachusetts, including a 108-44 mark (.684) in A-10 play. In addition to five straight NCAA Tournaments and a Final Four appearance in 1996, UMass also made two appearances in the NIT, advancing to the NIT semifinals in 1991. The 1990-91 season was the first of six straight seasons in which the Minutemen won at least 20 games.

Calipari's personal 20-win streak reached the 17-season mark after 35 wins in his first year at UK and 29 in his second. All nine of his Memphis clubs won 20-plus games, along with his last six teams at UMass. In his final season at UMass, Calipari was named the 1996 Naismith National Coach of the Year and The Sporting News National Coach of the Year. He was also named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time in four years, as well as Basketball Times East Region Coach of the Year.

During the Minutemen's 35-2 Final Four season in 1995-96, UMass posted wins over Kentucky, Maryland, Wake Forest, Georgia Tech, Syracuse, Virginia Tech and Louisville. UMass ended the regular season ranked No. 1 in the nation in the final regular-season poll after being the top-ranked team for nine weeks earlier in the year. The Minutemen also won their first 26 games of the season, setting a school record for most consecutive wins.

In addition to his Naismith National Coach of the Year honors in 1996, Calipari was a Naismith Coach of the Year finalist in 1994 and 1995. He was the USBWA District I Coach of the Year in 1993.

Calipari left UMass in June of 1996 to become executive vice president of basketball operations and head coach of the New Jersey Nets. He led the Nets to a second-place finish in the NBA's Atlantic Division and the playoffs in 1998, ending a five-year postseason drought for the franchise. The Nets' 17-game turnaround from the previous year was the best that season in the NBA.

He became a member of the Philadelphia 76ers coaching staff in 1999, rejoining Philadelphia coach Larry Brown, for whom Calipari was an assistant at Kansas.

Calipari returned to the college game in 2000 at Memphis, where he led the Tigers to the 2008 NCAA title game. Memphis' 38 wins in 2007-08 made him the winningest coach for a single season in NCAA history. As a result, Calipari was named Naismith National Coach of the Year for a second time in his career. He is only the second coach to receive the honor multiple times since the award's inception in 1987. Krzyzewski is the other to do so.

Calipari, the 2009 Sports Illustrated National Coach of the Year, led the Tigers to nine straight 20-win campaigns and nine consecutive postseason appearances, the only Memphis coach to do that. He posted 252 wins — 28 wins per season — as the Tigers' head coach, making him the winningest coach in school history.

Calipari, who is now on the board of directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches, began his coaching career at Kansas as a volunteer assistant under Ted Owens. In 1983, he was hired as the recruiting coordinator at the University of Vermont, but he was swayed back to the nation's heartland when Brown was hired as head coach at KU. He spent three seasons at Kansas (1982-85) before another three-year stint as an assistant coach to Paul Evans at Pittsburgh (1985-88).

The 53-year-old lettered two years at North Carolina-Wilmington before transferring to Clarion State. He played point guard at Clarion during the 1981 and 1982 seasons, leading the team in assists and free-throw percentage. The Eagles were ranked in the Division II Top 20 both years and participated in the 1981 NCAA Division II Tournament.

Calipari's foundation, The Calipari Foundation, has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and across the country, and in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with another telethon in 2012 that raised \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy.

A year after helping raise \$350,000 for charity during the inaugural UK alumni weekend, Calipari was the driving force behind the more than \$1 million that was donated to local and national organizations during the second annual alumni weekend.

His foundation has also worked with and donated money to Samaritan's Feet, the West Liberty Recovery Fund, 4 Paws for Ability, the Starkey Hearing Foundation, the Urban League of Lexington and the V Foundation. Calipari has also headed up the EverFi Financial Literacy Program, which teaches students across Kentucky the importance of money management.

Author of the national bestseller, "Bounce Back: Overcoming Setbacks to Succeed in Business and in Life," and the soon-to-be-released "Players First," Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto "that it's never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it's about how high you bounce back."

Calipari and his wife, Ellen, have two daughters, Erin and Megan, and a son, Bradley.
