

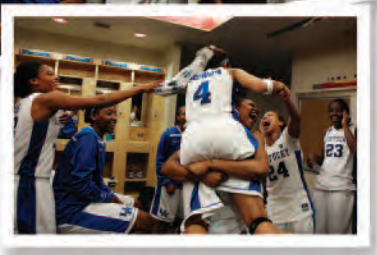

### MEDIA POLICIES

#### Credential Requests

Current season credentials previously issued for football and/or men's basketball, will be accepted for use in covering home UK Hoops games. If you do not have season credentials for football or men's basketball but wish to cover UK Hoops throughout the season, e-mail your season credential requests to:

#### SEC Credential Policy

By accepting or using a media credential ("Credential") for access to any game or athletic contest sponsored or hosted by the Southeastern Conference (the "SEC") or by any one or more of its member institutions (herein an "Event" or the "Events") each person and entity issued such a Credential (herein referred to, along with the employer of each such person, collectively as a "Bearer") agrees to the following terms and conditions:

#### General

Each Bearer must be and hereby represents that he or she is acting on a specific assignment for an accredited media agency and has a legitimate working function in connection with the Event attended. The Credential is not transferable and may be revoked at any time.

The rights and privileges granted to Bearer may be terminated if any term or condition for use of the Credential is breached. The unauthorized use of the Credential subjects the Bearer to ejection from the Event.

While within the Event venue, Bearer shall, at all times, adhere to the policies in place for the Event, abide by and respect access limitations, and accept and follow directions provided by the SEC or the SEC member institution(s) hosting the Event.

Bearer assumes all risks incidental to the performance by the Bearer of Bearer's services in connection with the Event and assumes all risks incidental to each Event, whether occurring before, during or after the actual playing of the Event, and agrees that the SEC, its member institutions, and their respective agents, employees, directors, officers, student-athletes, coaches, and contractors shall not be liable for bodily injury, property damage or theft losses suffered or incurred by Bearer at the Event. Bearer understands that sports contests are physical, and that in the normal course of play it is possible for balls, players, or other objects to leave the court, track, course, or field of play and impact spectators. Bearer hereby waives and releases any and all Claims (as defined below) against the SEC and its member institutions arising directly or indirectly from any such injury, including those attributable to their negligence or that of their agents.

In the event that the name or likeness of Bearer is included in any broadcast, telecast, photograph, film, video or other media taken in connection with any Event, Bearer grants the SEC (or, if the media is controlled by a SEC member, grants such SEC member) the nonexclusive, transferable, perpetual right and license to use (and to sub-license the use of) such name and likeness in any media worldwide whether now known or thereafter devised.



#### Media Services

**Interview Policies-General** — All interviews with Kentucky women's basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Media Relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly. Team locker rooms, and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate University personnel.

**Practice** — Practice will run from 3-5 p.m. on the women's court of the Joe Craft Center. Media planning to attend practice should call in advance due to changing practice schedules during the season. Player and coaches interviews can be conducted prior to or following each practice. Gameday shoot-arounds are closed to the media.

**News Conference** — Coach Mitchell and selected players meet with members of the media in the Memorial Coliseum media room at schedule times to be announced.

**Telephone Player Interviews** — Request telephone interviews at least 24 hours in advance through the Media Relations office. Telephone requests will be returned when players' schedules allow.

**Radio Call-In Shows/Internet Chats** — As specified by the Southeastern Conference, no players will be allowed to participate in live radio shows or on live chat sessions on the Internet other than UKAthletics.com. Coach Mitchell may participate in radio shows as his schedule allows.

**Postgame Interviews** — Selected players and both head coaches will be available to the media following a 10-minute cooling off period at the end of the game in the Memorial Coliseum media room.

Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Mitchell conducts his postgame press conference while a player is taken to the UK IMG Sports Radio Network. Following Coach Mitchell's press conference and the visiting team's press conference, selected UK players are brought to the media interview room.

SIDs from each school should be asked to coordinate any other interview requests.

Quotes will be available for all working media in the UK Media Relations Office and on the official UK website, UKAthletics.com.

**UKAthletics.com** — The official Web site for University of Kentucky Athletics is updated 24 hours before each game with the latest game notes and quotes from Coach Mitchell and selected players.

Following each game, the site will post a game box score with summary, postgame quotes and notes from all home games and updated season statistics.

**Accessing Publicity Photos/Logos** — Media members wishing to obtain photos and logos of the University of Kentucky women's basketball team may do so by utilizing the XOS Vault System. Please contact a member of the UK Media Relations Office for the website and login information.

**Radio/TV Rights** — Broadcasting rights to UK Hoops games are assigned exclusively to IMG College (formerly Host Communications) of Lexington. Contact Mike Dodson, network coordinator, at (859) 226-4678 for questions. Two phone lines and an ISDN line are provided for visiting radio on press row.

**Video Highlights/Feeds** — UK Video Services can provide highlight footage of most UK games. Contact Shane Fannin at (859) 257-9863 to request assistance. Video highlight feeds for non-televised games will be announced prior the games.

#### Game Day Media Services

**Media Parking** — A limited number of parking spaces are available in the back of Memorial Coliseum off Rose Street and College Blvd. Requests for parking should be made when submitting press and/or photo credential requests.

**Media Entrance/Will Call** — The media entrance is located in the back of Memorial Coliseum (behind Papa John's and Qdoba). The entrance is marked MEDIA ROOM. Credentials are not available at the public Will Call window on Euclid Avenue and will not be mailed.

## MEDIA POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Bearer agrees to indemnify and save harmless the SEC, its member institutions, and their respective agents, employees, directors, officers, student-athletes, coaches, and contractors, of and from any and all claims, liabilities, demands and causes of action asserted by persons and entities other than the SEC and its member institutions (jointly "Claims") arising out of any act or omission, or anything done or purported to have been done, by Bearer, including but not limited to Claims arising from Bearer's breach of any term or condition hereof. With respect to any Claim that might give rise to liability of the Bearer as an indemnitor, the indemnified party shall: (a) have the right to fully participate in the litigation of such claim with counsel selected by the indemnified party at the sole expense of the Bearer, and (b) not be obligated, without its consent, to participate in any settlement of such Claim.

### SEC Real-Time Internet Policy

By acceptance and use of an SEC media credential, the holder agrees to the following conditions for any and all athletic events hosted by the SEC and its member institutions:

1. The SEC and its member institutions grant a media organization a limited license to use certain gathered information on the media organization's own Internet or online site beginning at the start of an athletic event and up to the conclusion of such event, all subject to the following limitations and conditions:

(a) No more than 10 still photographs may be used for news coverage of the game and other editorial purposes during the event.

(b) Video tape may only be shown as part of a single, non-archived, online "simulcast" of a television station's regularly-scheduled news program.

(c) While a game is in progress, the use of textual statistical information is time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., updates pertaining to score, injuries and national, conference or institutional record-breaking performances, a condensed half-time story) so that an organization's Internet or online game coverage does not undercut the authorized and rights-paying fee organization's rights to play-by-play accounts of the game and/or exclusivity as to such rights.

2. Any proposed media use on an Internet or online sight of the game information that is more detailed and/or more than described above will require separate written authorization by the SEC and/or its member institutions. However, such written authorization will not permit the use of game information in entertainment contexts and will not authorize game coverage that, due to immediacy or detail, constitutes or approaches a play-by-play account of a game.

3. Should any of these conditions be breached, the SEC and/or its member institutions will issue a written warning for the first violation. If this violation occurs during the last game of the institutions' regularly-scheduled season, the media organization may not be credentialed for the SEC Tournament. A second violation of this policy will result in revocation of credentials to cover future basketball games hosted by the SEC and/or its member institutions.

**Media Room** — The media room is located in Memorial Coliseum and can be accessed through the hallway on the press row side of the Coliseum. Working facilities, with electrical outlets and a limited number of telephones, are available.

**Media Services** — The University of Kentucky uses a computerized statistics system. Working media will receive:

- Game program and notes
- Halftime statistics
- Final statistics
- Complete play-by-play
- Shot charts
- Coach and player quotes

**Wireless Access** — Memorial Coliseum offers free wireless internet service to media members. To log on, open a browser window, go to <https://ukwv1.uky.edu>, sign in as a Guest and type in a valid email address.

To use the UK Wireless Network, you must select the 'ukyedu' network name (SSID, service set identifier) from the list of available wireless networks that appear in your wireless card configuration program, and WEP (wireless encryption protocol) must be disabled.

**Stats on Your Laptop** — The University of Kentucky has partnered with BCS Stats Systems to provide stats technologies, namely its StatMonitr wireless stat monitors and online media stats, at Kentucky women's basketball home games this season.

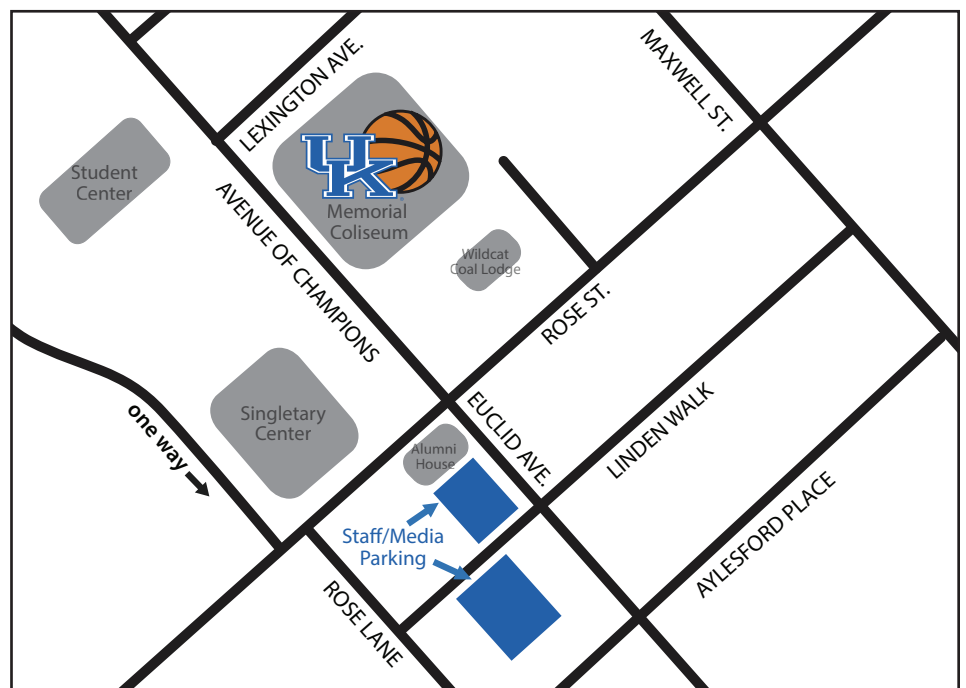

The University of Kentucky is in the midst of a landmark 10-year deal for the University's expanded multimedia marketing rights.

The agreement was signed in 2005 with IMG College (formerly Host Communications) and Gray Television. IMG partnered with Lexington's top-rated television station, WKYT, to pay the University \$80.5 million over the 10 years of the agreement, making it one of the most lucrative deals of its kind in NCAA history.

Also, enhancing Kentucky's national presence is the SEC's unprecedented 15-year deal with ESPN. Beginning in 2009, at least 60 SEC women's basketball games were available on national or regional television.

*"The SEC Network, through the efforts of ESPN, will be the largest college sports syndication television package in the country," SEC Commissioner Mike Slive said. "The SEC will be the most widely distributed conference in the country, utilizing every known distribution platform, including national network, national cable, over the air syndication, regional cable, Internet, broadband, and mobile TV phones, all of which will be supplemented by the SEC Digital Network and our local institutional packages."*

ESPN's deal is reportedly worth more than \$2 billion, the most lucrative in history for a college athletics conference.

### Here's a breakdown of the WOMEN'S BASKETBALL SEC TV deal:

- SEC teams will play a minimum of EIGHT games (16 appearances) on ESPN or ESPN2 and one of the networks will also televise the conference tournament championship game.
- ESPNU will also feature a minimum of EIGHT games (16 appearances) by SEC teams, in addition to the women's conference tournament semifinals.
- ESPN Regional Television (known as the SEC Network) will syndicate ONE game-of-the-week during the regular season.

- In addition to the ESPN games, FS South will air a minimum of 16 games and CSS will air a minimum of 16 games.
- The NCAA Tournament 1st/2nd rounds will be on FS South or CSS (decision has not been made yet); the Semifinals will be on ESPNU and the Championship on ESPN or ESPN2.
- In addition to the SEC/ESPN TV pacts, the UK IMG Sports Network will feature full-game, tape-delayed action of at least FIVE UK women's basketball home games that are not televised by ESPN. The network serves eight over-the-air stations and Fox Sports Net South on cable.

## Neil Price Play-by-Play Broadcaster

Neil Price, a 17-year radio veteran, enters his eighth season as the voice of UK Hoops on the UK IMG Sports Network. He also serves as the host of the Coach Matthew Mitchell and the Coach Gary Henderson radio show, the UK football pre-game show, the Wildcat Sports Update (a daily radio feature on the network, highlighting UK's Olympic sports programs), radio play-by-play announcer for UK Baseball and also provides play-by-play for the SEC Women's Basketball Tournament and SEC Baseball Tournament on the SEC Radio Network heard on XM Radio.

UK Hoops has advanced to postseason play in each of Price's seven seasons, including three consecutive NCAA Tournaments and appearances in the Elite Eight in 2010 and 2012. He also has been a part of two SEC titles, calling the action for a UK baseball squad that completed an historic worst-to-first turnaround to claim their first SEC championship in 2006, as well as providing the play-by-play for UK Hoops' 2012 SEC regular season championship title, their first in 30 years.

Price, a native of Russellville, Tenn., joined the UK IMG Sports Network from Middle Tennessee State, where he spent three seasons as the school's broadcast coordinator. He called the action for the Blue Raiders' women's basketball and baseball teams, and was the sideline reporter for football broadcasts.

Price, a 2003 graduate of MTSU, received his bachelor's degree in mass communications with an emphasis in electronic media journalism. While working at MTSU, he also began his master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sport management. Prior to MTSU, he attended Walters State Community College in Morristown, Tenn., where he earned an associates degree in general studies with an emphasis in broadcasting.



At the young age of 15, Price began working in the broadcasting business at WCRK in Morristown. He learned everything from serving as a studio producer for high school and college sports broadcasts to disc jockeying during morning and afternoon drives. He even worked as a part-time news anchor and reporter. It was also where he debuted as a radio sports broadcaster, serving as a play-by-play announcer and color commentator on Morristown East HS football, basketball, and baseball broadcasts.

Price, 32, resides in Lexington and is married to the former Beth Davis, a UK Hoops student manager (2002-06) and administrative assistant (2006-08). Beth graduated with a bachelor's degree in exercise science in 2006 followed by a master's degree in sport leadership from UK in 2008.

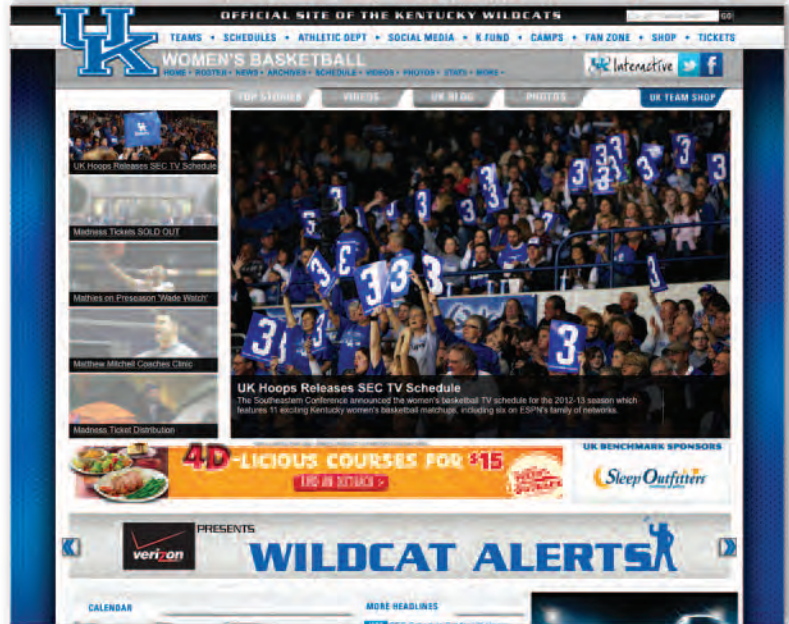

### SEC History

The Southeastern Conference was formed Dec. 8-9, 1932, to include 13 schools: Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, Sewanee, Tennessee, Tulane and Vanderbilt.

In the fall of 2012, the Missouri and Texas A&M became members of the SEC and begin in the league for the 2012-13 academic year. It was the first expansion for the SEC since 1991 when South Carolina joined the league. Arkansas joined the SEC in August of 1991. With the addition of Arkansas and South Carolina, the SEC was the first conference to split into divisions and add a conference championship football game in 1992.

Frank L. McVey of Kentucky was the first president of the league. The first commissioner was former Mississippi governor Martin Conner (1940-48), followed by Bernie Moore (1948-66), A.M. "Tonto" Coleman (1966-72), Dr. Boyd McWhorter (1972-86), Dr. Harvey Schiller (1986-90) and Roy Kramer (1990-2002).

The first SEC champions were crowned in 1933 in baseball, basketball, football and outdoor track. Cross country, golf, swimming, tennis and indoor track were added later. The SEC began recognizing women's championships during the 1979-80 school year and women's athletics officially came under the auspices of the conference office on Sept. 1, 1984.

The SEC sponsors championships in 21 sports – 12 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, equestrian, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

### SEC GAME FORMAT

The conference schedule increased from 14 games to 16 in 2009-10. Each team's 16-game schedule will feature a single-round robin, with one permanent opponent (South Carolina) and two random opponents (LSU and Texas A&M). The league as a whole is divided into the Eastern and Western Divisions but the women will not use a division format for scheduling.

The SEC Tournament format will feature each of the league's 14 teams and will begin a day earlier with a pair of games. New this coming year to the women's format will be splitting the sessions in which the league's top-two seeds play. The tournament's top seed will play its early games in the afternoon session, while the No. 2 seed will play in the evening session.

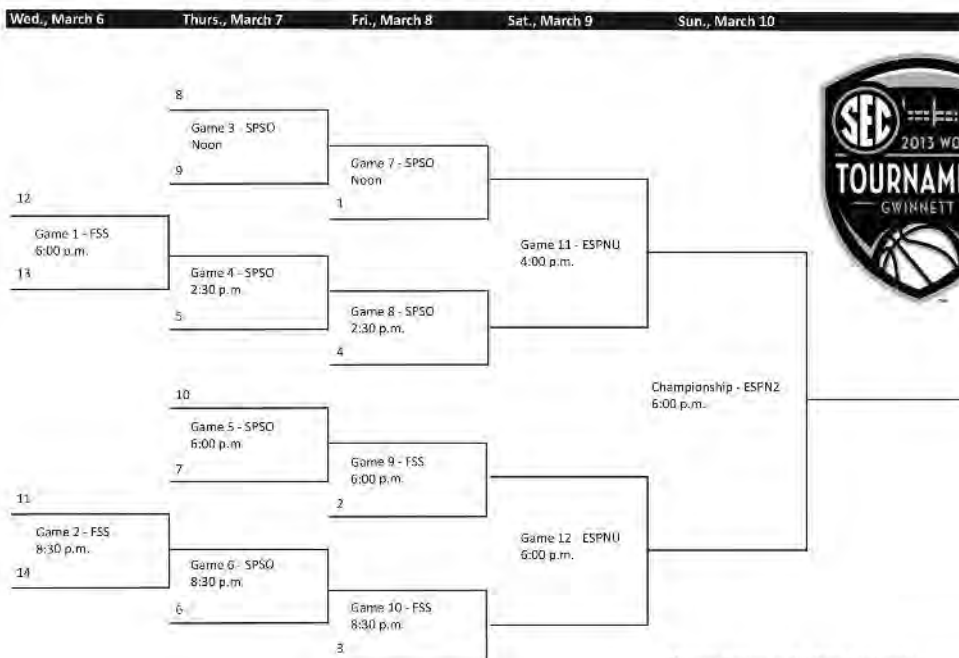

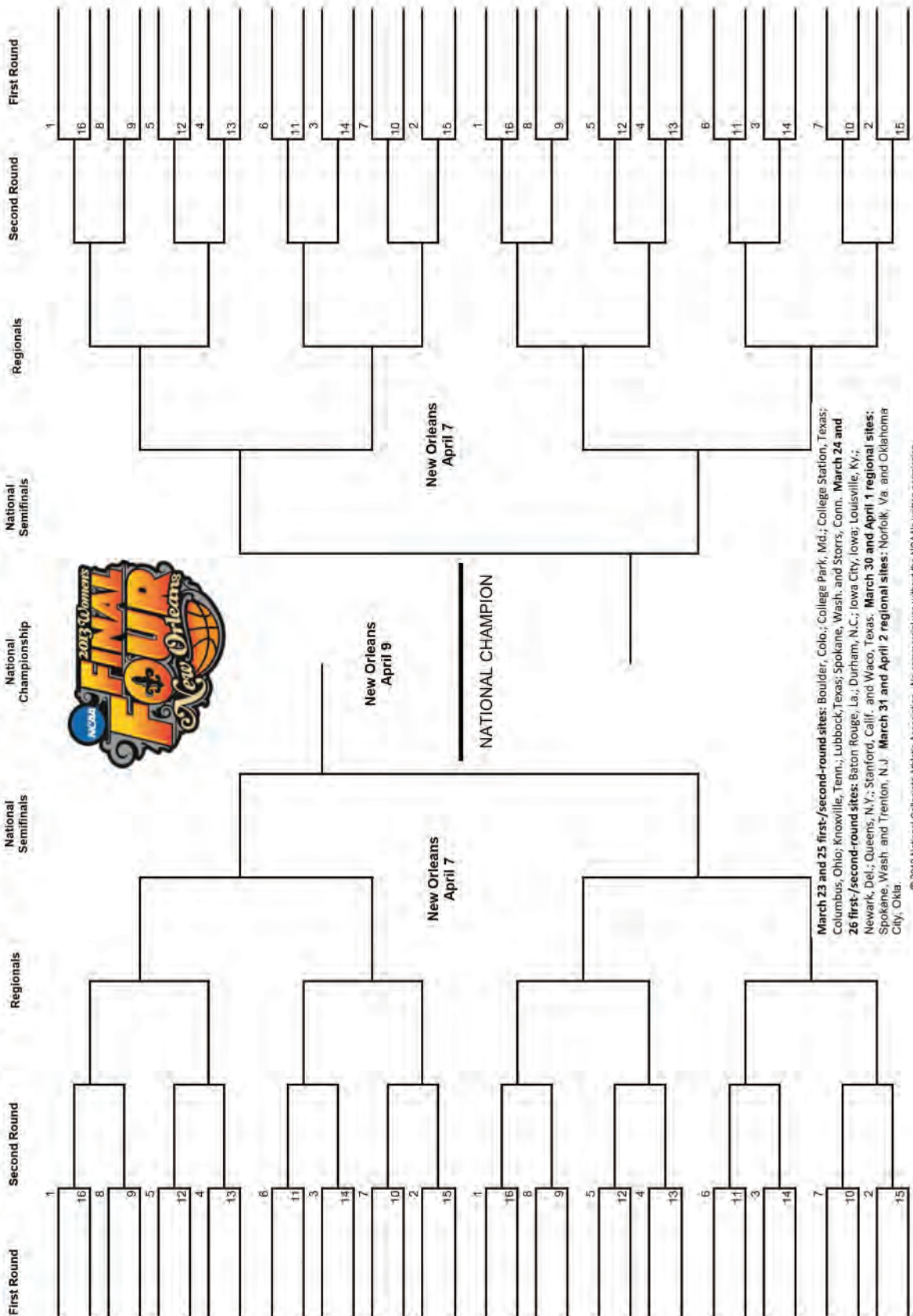

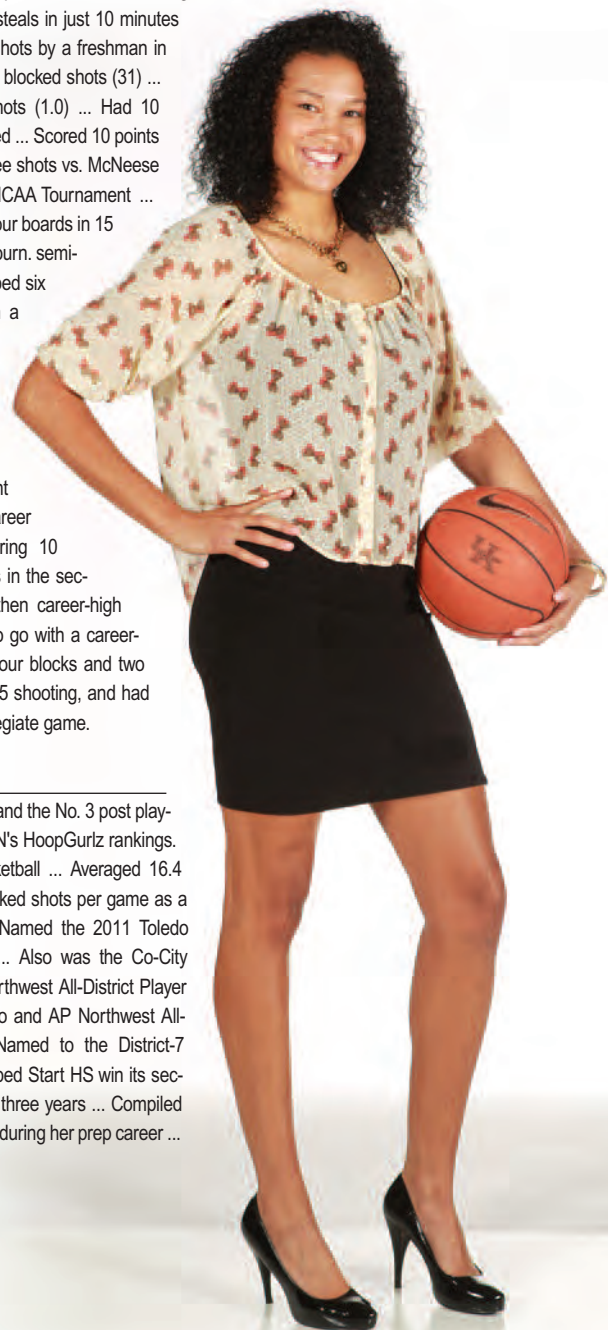

Kentucky head coach Matthew Mitchell's teams are known for using three "winning tools" for success: honesty, hard work and discipline. So it's no surprise that in just five seasons at the helm, he has used those winning tools to turn Kentucky into one of the premier programs in the country and one that most opponents dread facing.

Under his leadership, the Wildcats have advanced to five consecutive postseason tournaments, including three straight NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in school history. UK has finished in the top three in the Southeastern Conference race three consecutive seasons, including winning the 2012 SEC regular season championship, the school's first in 30 years. The Wildcats have also charted over 25 wins in three consecutive seasons, including a school-record 28 victories in 2009-10 and 2011-12.

Mitchell's defensive philosophy, implemented at the beginning of the 2009-10 season, is a big reason for Kentucky's success. The Wildcats use a full-court, trapping, pressure style of defense that has been dubbed by many as "40 minutes of dread." Since introducing this signature style of play, the Wildcats have compiled an 81-24 (77.1 percent) overall record, a 34-13 (72.3 percent) mark in SEC play and advanced to two SEC Tournament championship games. UK has also defeated 16 nationally-ranked opponents, including four in the top 10. Over the last three seasons, Mitchell's teams have ranked in the top 25 of the national polls, garnered top-25 rankings in average attendance and recorded a remarkable 48-2 record at home.

Under Mitchell, 10 different players have received SEC accolades, including 2012 SEC Player of the Year A'dia Mathies, 2012 SEC Freshman of the Year Bria Goss and 2012 Co-SEC 6th Woman of the Year Keyla Snowden.

Mitchell also helped two Wildcats (Victoria Dunlap and A'dia Mathies) receive All-America honors and Dunlap was chosen as the school's first-ever WNBA first round draft pick in 2011.

His players excel not only on the hardwood but in the classroom as well. Ten different Wildcats have been SEC Academic Honor Roll members and 100 percent of his players (13) in their final seasons of eligibility have received their degrees.

Mitchell led Kentucky to one of the most successful seasons in school history in 2011-12 with a 28-7 overall record, including an 18-0 mark at home, and an appearance in the Elite Eight for the second time in three years. The Wildcats won their first SEC regular season championship since 1982 with a school-record 13-3 mark in league play. The Cats finished No. 12 in the final AP poll & No. 8 in final USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll, marking the highest final AP ranking since finishing 11th in 1983 and the highest final ranking in the coaches' poll in school history. He was named SEC Coach of the Year for the second time in three seasons by the AP and was rewarded a new seven-year contract extension in the spring by UK Athletics Director Mitch Barnhart.

In 2010-11, he led the Wildcats to an outstanding season with a 25-9 overall record and 11 wins (11-5) in the SEC. UK took a second-place finish in the league standings for the second consecutive year and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament as the No. 4 seed.

Year three (2009-10) was a pivotal season, as Mitchell was named SEC Coach of the Year for his remarkable job in turning around a team that went 16-16 overall, 5-9 in conference play a year prior, to an impressive 28-8 overall record in 2009-10. The Cats' 28 overall wins, including 11 in SEC play, represented a school record. UK finished second in the league despite being picked to finish 11th in the preseason polls.

Mitchell became Kentucky's head coach on April 23, 2007, when he was hired by Barnhart. A whirlwind salesman, Mitchell presented a vision of UK Hoops as a powerhouse program; and a warm and loving family.

In his first season at UK, the Wildcats went 17-16 overall and finished fourth in the SEC with an 8-6 mark, just one win shy of the school record. The eight league wins were the most by a first-year head coach in UK Hoops history. Mitchell also became the first head coach in UK Hoops history to lead his team to the semifinals of the SEC Tournament in his/her debut season. The Wildcats earned a first-round bye and upset No. 23/21 Georgia in the quarterfinals (57-50) before falling to NCAA Final Four participant LSU in the semis. UK went on to defeat Middle Tennessee and James Madison in the postseason WNIT before falling to eventual champion Marquette in the quarterfinals, 69-64.

Despite another tough schedule and injuries to key players throughout the season, the Wildcats again

advanced to postseason play with a second-round finish in the WNIT in his second season. It marked their school-record fifth consecutive postseason tournament appearance. Mitchell became the first head coach since Terry Hall in the 1980-81 and 1981-82 seasons to advance to postseason play in his first two seasons as head coach.

The Cats finished 16-16 overall, 5-9 in the SEC and defeated No. 13/19 Tennessee 66-56, their first win over the Lady Vols in Memorial Coliseum in 23 years. Mitchell also captured his 30th win at UK on Feb. 5, 2009, vs. South Carolina. He did it in only 56 games, becoming the second-fastest coach to reach 30 wins behind Hall who earned it in only 38 games during her first two seasons in 1980 and 1981.

Mitchell came to Kentucky in the spring of 2007 when Mickie DeMoss resigned as head coach after four seasons.

So when Athletics Director Mitch Barnhart went about the daunting task of finding a coach whose skills, personality and charisma could build on the success and excitement that DeMoss had brought to the program, he immediately thought of Mitchell, who had played a key role in UK Hoops landing four brilliant prep performers in the fall of 2004 – a class ranked No. 6 by the All-Star Girls Report.

In his first season as an assistant coach under DeMoss at UK, Mitchell helped lure former Wildcats Chanté Bowman, Samantha Mahoney and Eleia Roddy away from Big Ten powers Michigan State and Ohio State while convincing 6-6 center Sarah Elliott, a Kentucky high school legend, to stay at home.

Mitchell then became a key factor in the development and improvement of UK's young post players. Elliott ranked in the top 10 in two SEC statistical categories and

was named to the 2004-05 SEC All-Freshman team. Forward Jennifer Humphrey – then a sophomore – also flourished under Mitchell's direction, leading the team in rebounding and ranking 15th in that category in the SEC in 2004-2005. She finished her college career as UK's second all-time leading rebounder.

When DeMoss resigned and buzz around the Bluegrass quickly shifted to her replacement, Barnhart needed to look no further than 60 miles east on Interstate 64, where Mitchell already had established himself as an up-and-coming head coach at in-state Ohio Valley Conference school Morehead State.

When Barnhart interviewed Mitchell, Morehead State was fresh off two exciting campaigns in which he had revived a declining Lady Eagles women's basketball program with a 30-29 record (.508) – the third-highest coach's winning percentage in school history. The Lady Eagles were coming off a 5-22 record a year prior to Mitchell's arrival and earned a 16-13 overall mark and 11-9 league record in his first season. The Lady Eagles also reached the semifinals of the OVC Tournament.

In his second season, Mitchell guided Morehead to a third-place finish in the league with a school-record 13 conference wins. During the season, the Lady Eagles strung together a nine-game winning streak, the program's longest in 20 seasons.

Mitchell's two-year MSU conference record of 24-16 (.600) marks the second-highest OVC winning percentage in school history. He was only the third coach in the program's history to post an overall winning record during his tenure.

Barnhart also was impressed with Mitchell's coaching pedigree. He had served as an assistant coach and recruiter at Florida under Carol Ross beginning in 2000. He helped the Gators compile a 51-36 record, and during his first two seasons the Gators recorded a 19-9 league

record en route to two NCAA Tournament appearances (2001 and 2002). With Mitchell's help, the Gators had a program-tying 24 wins and tied the school record with 11 SEC wins in 2001. He stayed at Florida to serve under then-new UF Coach Carolyn Peck during the 2002-03 season. As the primary recruiter at UF, Mitchell brought in the nation's ninth-ranked recruiting class in 2002 and the No. 2-ranked class by All-Star Girls Report in 2003.

The Louisville, Miss., native began his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant at Tennessee under Hall of Fame Coach Pat Summitt during the Lady Vols' run to the Final Four in 2000. UT advanced to the national championship game before losing to top-ranked Connecticut. The Lady Vols finished No. 2 in the national polls with a 33-4 overall record and a 13-1 mark in the SEC.

Prior to his stint at Tennessee, Mitchell spent one year in Yazoo City, Miss., as a coach and teacher at Manchester Academy. He taught American history and served as both the boys' and girls' head basketball coach.

A 1995 graduate of Mississippi State, Mitchell's first head-coaching experience came in 1996 at Central Holmes Academy High School in Lexington, Miss. Mitchell performed multiple duties at the school, including head coach of both basketball teams as well as the track and golf teams. He also served as the defensive coordinator for the football team.

Mitchell, 41, is married to Jenna Ramsey Mitchell of Amelia Island, Fla., and has two daughters, Lacy Mitchell, of Madison, Miss., and one-year-old Saylor Rose Mitchell. They are active in community service as Jenna serves on the board of the Children's Advocacy Center and Matthew volunteers his time for several area charities and organizations. Matthew also is an honorary Rotarian in the Lexington chapter.

#### When did you know you wanted to be a coach?

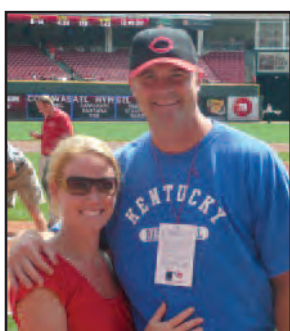

#### In one sentence, what is your coaching philosophy?

"To instill honesty, hard work and discipline in our team on and off the court."

#### Who are your coaching influences or mentors?

"My dad, John Mitchell, has been my greatest coaching influence. He taught me the winning tools of honesty, hard work and discipline. He always challenged us to be honest. His work-ethic is phenomenal and he's always had a lot of discipline in his life. Mickie DeMoss and Carol Ross have had the biggest impact on my development as a college coach. Farrell Rigby, my high school coach, also was a big influence on me because he was the first person to give me an opportunity to coach."



#### What is your favorite professional sports team?

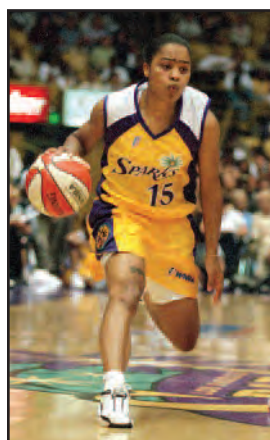

Matt Insell is in his fifth season as an assistant coach at Kentucky. Along with recruiting duties, Insell also will be responsible for the guards with Coach Danielle Santos.

In his role as an assistant coach, Insell has been a key component in recruiting and player development.

Insell has helped Kentucky ink three top-10 recruiting classes and five high school McDonald's All-Americans in Bria Goss, Jennifer O'Neill, DeNesha Stallworth, Janee Thompson and Samarie Walker.

Insell has also helped lead UK to three straight 20-win seasons and the first Southeastern Conference regular season championship in 30 years. The Wildcats, who finished in the top 25 in the final AP polls the last three seasons, also earned their third straight bid to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history.

In 2011-12, Insell helped lead UK Hoops to one of its best years in program history. The Wildcats went 28-7 overall, 13-3 in SEC play and won the SEC regular season championship, UK's first since 1982. Not only did Insell help guide the Wildcats to an Elite Eight appearance for the second time in three years, he also helped develop All-American guard A'dia Mathies, the SEC Player of the Year, Bria Goss, the SEC Freshman of the Year, and Keyla Snowden, the SEC Co-6th Woman of the Year.

The Cats also had impressive season in 2010-11 as UK advanced to its second straight NCAA Tournament and finished ranked in the top 25 of the AP poll. The Wildcats finished second in the SEC race with 11 league wins.

In 2009-10, Insell helped guide UK to a program-best 28-8 record, including an 11-5 mark in the SEC. Despite low expectations from outside observers, Kentucky went from being picked to finish 11th in the SEC to an NCAA Elite Eight team. The Cats defeated five nationally-ranked opponents, including a historic win over LSU in Baton Rouge, La., and an exciting upset over top-seeded and fourth-ranked Nebraska in the Sweet 16.



### Coach Insell on Kentucky:

"When you think of Kentucky, you think basketball. What fans invest in this program with their passion, year-in and year-out, is priceless. One thing that sets Coach Mitchell apart from the rest is his passion to succeed and that passion shows as we have been able to take the program to the top of the SEC. I love Kentucky, this is a very special place to me. Everyone is friendly and it's a great atmosphere."

With Insell's help, Mathies received UK's first SEC Freshman of the Year honor and was named the Cats' first freshman All-American since Valerie Still in 1980. Mathies also was named to the SEC All-Tournament team along with teammate Victoria Dunlap, marking UK's first honorees to that team since 1992. Mathies was again impressive in her sophomore season, earning All-SEC Second Team honors. Freshman guard Bernisha Pinkett also received conference honors as she was named to the SEC All-Freshman team.

Prior to Kentucky, Insell was the Director of Basketball Operations at Louisiana Tech under Coach Chris Long. Before that, he was considered one of the top AAU coaches in the country, coaching the Tennessee Flight, a Nike Elite Travel Program, for three years.

Insell made a national name for himself after coaching 41 of his former AAU players to play Division I basketball, including current Wildcats Victoria Dunlap and Crystal Riley. He also coached the Shelbyville Sports Shop 15-Under team to the AAU National Championship title in 2004.

Insell, 30, earned valuable basketball experience while attending the University of Tennessee from 2001-2005. He worked closely with both the men's and women's basketball programs, serving as a student assistant/video coordinator under former men's head coach Buzz Peterson and as an instructor at Pat Summitt's summer basketball camps. Shalon Pillow enters her fourth season as an assistant coach at Kentucky. Along with recruiting and scouting duties, Pillow is responsible for the post players.

Last season, Pillow was instrumental in helping UK advance to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight and win the coveted Southeastern Conference regular season championship. One of the key players in UK's school-record 28 wins was the play and development of sophomore transfer Samarie Walker. Pillow helped mold Walker into one of the top post players in the SEC as she averaged 8.7 points and 7.2 rebounds in her debut season with the Wildcats. Under Pillow's tutelage, Walker was an All-Regional Tournament team selection at the Kingston Regional, and will pair with fellow transfer DeNesha Stallworth this season to form what many experts believe to be one of the top front courts in the SEC.

In her first season in the Bluegrass, Pillow's tireless and consistent work ethic blended in perfectly with the UK Hoops staff. She coached and mentored the Wildcat post players, which included forward Victoria Dunlap, UK's first SEC Player of the Year and first State Farm/WBCA All-American since 1983. The Wildcats also enjoyed a record-breaking season that included a program-best 28 wins, a second-place finish in the SEC race and an appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight.

In her second year, Pillow once again helped lead the Cats to an impressive season as UK advanced to its second straight NCAA Tournament and finished ranked in the top 25 of the AP poll. The Wildcats finished second in the SEC race with 11 league wins.

Dunlap was again named SEC Player of the Year by the AP and she ended her illustrious career ranked No. 2 in career scoring and rebounding. Dunlap made history by becoming the highest draft pick in school history as she was the 11th overall selection in the first round of the WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

Pillow, an Addyston, Ohio, native came to Kentucky after one season as an assistant coach at Hofstra University in Long Island, N.Y., and three seasons at the University of South Florida in Tampa, Fla.

At Hofstra, Pillow coached the post players and helped the Pride compile a 16-14 record, which ranked as one of the top turnarounds in women's college basketball. Hofstra's 11-game improvement from the 2007-08 season ranked fourth-best nationally.

Two of her post players received all-conference honors, as Joelle Connelly was named the 2009 Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Year, and Jess Fuller, who ranked seventh nationally in blocks, was named to the CAA All-Defensive Team.

At USF, Pillow was the director of basketball operations for one season before being promoted to assistant coach during the 2006-07 and 2007-08 seasons. She was responsible for scouting opponents and individual player development, and also assisted in the evaluation of potential student-athletes. She was also in charge of the team's academic program and helped organize coaches' clinics.

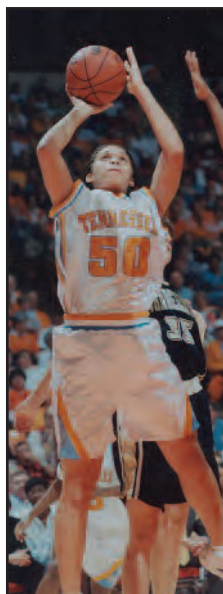
Prior to her coaching stints at Hofstra and USF, Pillow was Camp Director and Event Operator for the Ohio Girls Basketball Report (OGBR), where she was responsible for directing the largest 8-10th grade summer camp in the Midwest. She also directed the Top 64 showcase, and handled pre- and post-camp evaluations. In addition to her position with the OGBR, Pillow served as a guest services representative at the Argosy Hotel in Lawrenceburg, Ind., from 2003-05, where she assisted in the facility’s marketing and promotions.

Pillow, a 6-3 center, was a four-year letterwinner (1998-2002) at Tennessee under legendary coach Pat Summitt. She played in 108 career games and helped the Lady Vols advance to four NCAA Tournaments, including two Final Four appearances. In her collegiate career, the Lady Vols recorded a remarkable 124-5 record and a 53-3 slate in the SEC.

She graduated from UT in 2002 with a bachelor’s degree in general psychology and a minor in communications.

Following graduation, Pillow played for the Tennessee Fury of the National Women’s Basketball League during its inaugural season, and appeared in 20 games. She also served as an assistant coach with the varsity team at Taylor High School in North Bend, Ohio, from 2003-04 and worked the Lady Vols’ summer camps from 1998-2001.

The 32-year-old was a highly decorated player coming out of Taylor High School, earning Nike and Parade Magazine All-America honors after averaging 22.4 points, 11.2 rebounds, 4.1 blocks and 3.0 steals per game as a senior. She also was tabbed by the USA Today as one of the top 20 scholastic players in America and was a finalist for the Naismith High School Player of the Year Award.

Santos came to Kentucky in May of 2012 after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Illinois State under head coach Stephanie Glance.

In her first year with Illinois State, Santos helped lead the Redbirds to their first undefeated home regular season in program history and third consecutive trip to the semifinals of the Women's National Invitation Tournament. Guard Katie Broadway was named to the All-Missouri Valley Conference second team and guard Amanda Clifton received honorable mention MVC all-conference honors, along with being named to the All-MVC Defensive Team.

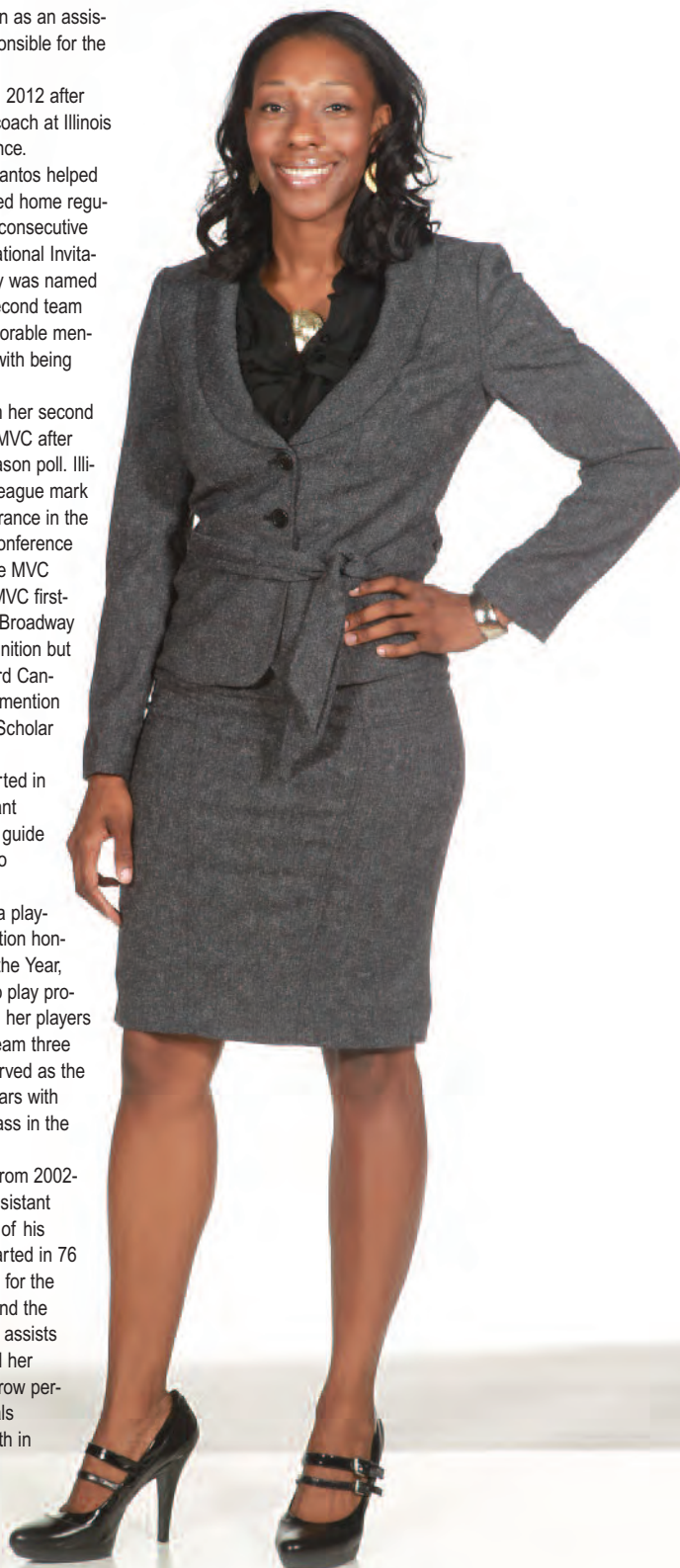
The Redbirds defied expectations in her second year (2011-12), finishing second in the MVC after being picked to finish sixth in the preseason poll. With Santos' guidance, Broadway once again earned all-conference recognition but this time to the All-MVC first team. Santos got her coaching career started in 2006, spending four years as an assistant coach at Hofstra University. She helped guide the Pride to two 20-win seasons and two appearances in the WNIT.

Under Santos' tutelage, nine Hofstra players earned All-Colonial Athletic Association honors, including the 2010 CAA Rookie of the Year, Shante Evans. Four players went one to play professionally overseas and at least one of her players was named to the All-CAA Academic Team three out of her four seasons. Santos also served as the recruiting coordinator in her final two years with Hofstra, signing the No. 41 recruiting class in the nation in 2008-09.

A four-year letter winner at Florida from 2002-06, Santos was recruited by then-UF assistant coach Matthew Mitchell and was a part of his ninth-ranked recruiting class. sports management, while achieving a minor in business administration and education. Santos was a three-time Southeastern Conference (SEC) Winter Academic Honor Roll selection, a 2004 CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Second Team selection, and a 2005 Arthur Ashe, Jr. Sports Scholar.

Santos is a 2002 graduate from Wheeler High School in her hometown of Marietta, Ga. Santos captained the

Wildcats under Coach Krista Kilburn her final three years and during her 103-game career, she totaled an impressive 1,124 points, 552 rebounds, 418 steals and 407 assists, while shooting 44.4 percent from the field and 70.1 percent from the free throw line. Santos posted career averages of 10.9 points, 5.4 rebounds, 4.1 steals and 4.0 assists, and before tearing her ACL 14 games into her senior year. For the season, she averaged 12.4 points,

4.7 rebounds, 5.9 steals and 5.5 assists per game and was named a finalist for the 2002 McDonald's All-American game. 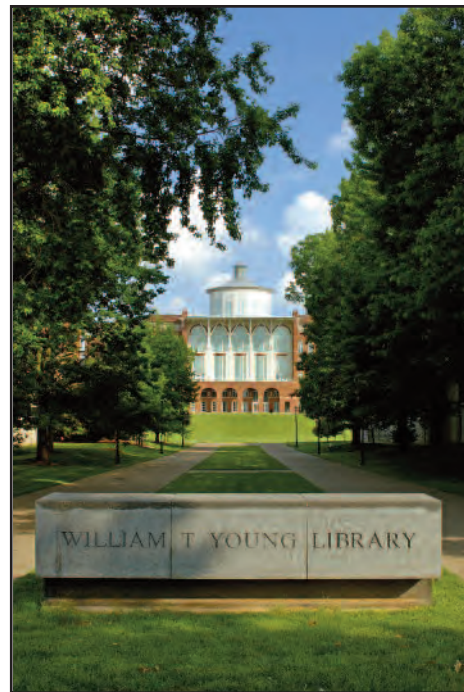
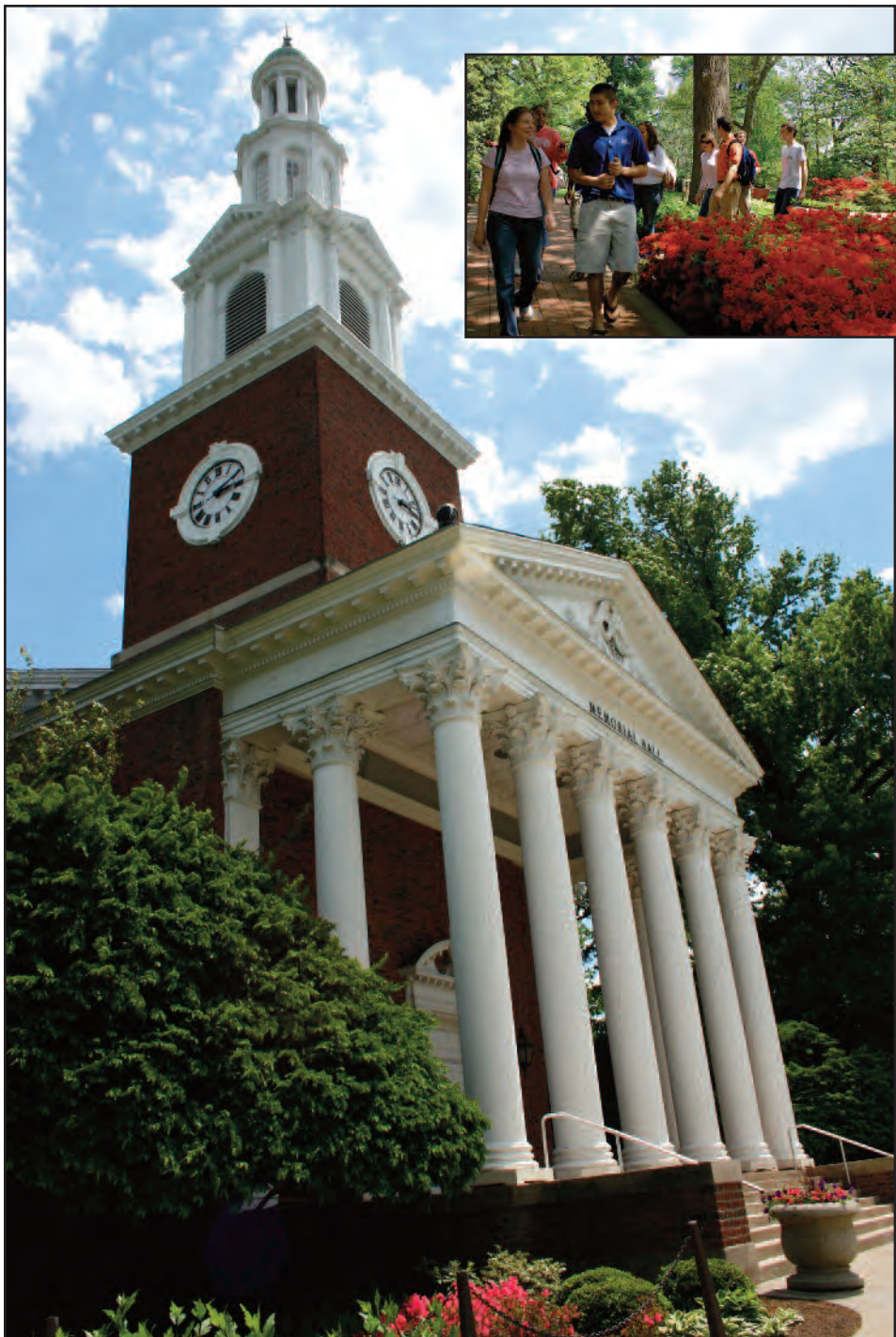

### **PRESIDENT • DR. ELI CAPILOUTO** **UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT • ALABAMA, 1971**

Dr. Eli Capilouto became the 12th President of the University of Kentucky on July 1, 2011.

A native of Montgomery, Alabama, Dr. Capilouto previously served as Provost of the University of Alabama-Birmingham (UAB) and Dean of the UAB School of Public Health – a period of remarkable growth and transformation at one of the leading academic and health sciences institutions in the South.

Since his arrival, Dr. Capilouto has intently engaged with University and community stakeholders to renew our founding mission and vision as a public, Flagship, Land Grant and Research University – what he has termed the Kentucky Promise.

This shared covenant calls upon the University of Kentucky to be a shining beacon for the Commonwealth of Kentucky – building a bright future for the people we serve through a comprehensive academic experience that prepares students to compete in a global, 21st century economy; groundbreaking research and discovery that pushes the boundaries of science and improves industry; and outreach through our extension network and critical care med-

ical enterprise to uplift communities and citizens of the Commonwealth.

Critically important to fulfilling this Promise, Dr. Capilouto has led a process to enhance UK's undergraduate experience by increasing institutional investments in merit-based financial aid, including the prestigious Singletary Scholarship; expanding the University Honors Program; and entering into an innovative public/private partnership to revitalize the core of campus and create a modern living/learning community.

Research at the University of Kentucky is a dynamic enterprise encompassing both traditional scholarship and emerging technologies, and UK's research faculty, staff and students are establishing UK as one of the nation's most prolific public research universities in the nation. Dr. Capilouto is committed to growing the research enterprise through high-quality partnerships, both domestic and international, and by recruiting top scholars across the world.

Essential to the service mission of the University of Kentucky is the advanced patient care and out-



reach provided by UK HealthCare. As the flagship academic-medical center in the region, UK serves patients through a network of health care professionals around the Commonwealth and by providing acute medical care at UK Chandler Hospital.

Dr. Capilouto holds several undergraduate and graduate degrees from schools within the University of Alabama system, and a Doctorate in Health Policy and Management from Harvard University. He and his wife, Dr. Mary Lynne Capilouto (D.M.D.) a former Dean of the UAB School of Dentistry, have one daughter.

### **ATHLETIC DIRECTOR • MITCH BARNHART** **DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS • OTTAWA UNIVERSITY, 1981**



Mitch Barnhart is in his 11th year at the University of Kentucky.

Since his arrival in 2002, one of Barnhart's goals has been to build an athletic program competitive in all sports and there has been significant progress in that direction. In the past year alone, Wildcat Athletics totaled four conference championships (tying the record set in 2004-05), four SEC Coaches of the Year and four SEC Players of the Year. The crowning achievement was the men's basketball national championship, the second year in a row that a UK team won a national title.

Combined with other achievements, these feats are fulfilling Barnhart's ambitious course for the future, which was revealed in November 2008 with the 15 by 15 by 15 Plan. The goals are to win at least 15 conference or national championships and rank among the NCAA's top 15 athletic programs by 2015 – all of which would be unprecedented achievements for UK Athletics – while continuing to

expand the department's service to the commonwealth of Kentucky. Another goal is a cumulative 3.0 grade-point average for UK's 500-plus student-athletes on an annual basis.

UK's steady improvement in the Directors' Cup standings under Barnhart has been highlighted with two 29th-place finishes in the last three years. It is the school's best showing since Barnhart's arrival, its top finish since 1997-98 and only three slots away from the best mark in school history.

The primary academic target was met during the 2010 spring semester as UK's student-athletes notched a composite 3.04 GPA. but Barnhart wants to continue to see academic success and improvement in the future. In addition, UK has consistently posted strong numbers in the NCAA Academic Progress Rate as every one of UK's 22 varsity sports have avoided penalties in the APR's nine-year existence. School records have been set for graduation rates.

Additional initiatives begun under Barnhart's leadership include fully funding all 22 varsity sports with maximum number of scholarships and coaches; creating the UK Athletics Hall of Fame; initiating the CATSPYs, an awards program that honors the best of UK Athletics; the construction of the Joe Craft Center, a \$30 million facility that includes practice and administrative space for a variety of sports; more than \$14 million of football facility improvements; and the construction of a new \$12 million track the Wildcat Coal Lodge dormitory and a new softball stadium.

Barnhart's influence reaches far beyond the fields of competition. Despite athletics' urgent financial needs, Barnhart directs a \$1.7-million annual contribution to the University's scholarship program, an amount he has increased to \$3 million for the 2012-13 school year.

Social responsibility in the Commonwealth of Kentucky also is a priority for Barnhart, who is extremely active in community service and encourages UK athletics staff and student-athletes to do the same. In the last two years, UK football players have made educational/service trips to Ethiopia, a program that has been expanded to include athletes from multiple sports. All totaled, UK athletes give approximately 4,000 hours of community service annually.

Barnhart has been involved on the national level as well and in 2010 became the chair of the NCAA Basketball Issues Committee.

Barnhart arrived at UK from Oregon State, where he served four successful years (1998-2002) as athletics director. Before OSU, he worked in athletics administration posts at Tennessee (1986-98), Southern Methodist University (1983-86), Oregon (1983) and San Diego State (1982-83).

Barnhart is a native of Kansas City, Kan. He earned his bachelor's degree from Ottawa University (Kansas) in 1981 and a master's in sports administration from Ohio University in 1982.

His family includes his wife, Connie, three children, Blaire, Scott, Kirby Willoughby and her husband, McKenzie.

### UK HOOPS ENDS SEASON IN ELITE EIGHT TIES SCHOOL RECORD FOR WINS; SEC REGULAR SEASON CHAMPS

No. 12/8 Kentucky completed one of the most successful seasons in school history with a 28-7 overall record, including an 18-0 mark at home, and an appearance in the Elite Eight for the second time in three years. The Wildcats won their first South-eastern Conference regular season championship since 1982 with a school-record 13-3 mark in league play. Its 28 wins tied the school record set in 2009-10 and UK has now won 25-plus games for three consecutive seasons for the first time ever. The Cats finished No. 12 in the final AP poll & No. 8 in final USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll. It marked the highest final AP ranking since finishing 11th in 1983 and the highest final ranking in the coaches' poll in school history.

Junior All-American A'dia Mathies was named SEC Player of the Year after leading Kentucky in scoring (15.0 points per game), assists (2.7 per game), steals (2.6 per game) and 3-point field goal percentage (.378). Freshman guard Bria Goss was named SEC Freshman of the Year after averaging 11.0 points per game, the most by any rookie in the SEC. Sophomore forward Samarie Walker was the team's leading rebounder with 7.2 rebounds per

game. She was named to the NCAA Kingston All-Regional Tournament team after averaging 13.3 points and 10.8 rebounds in four NCAA Tournament games. Senior guard Keyla Snowden was named the SEC Co-6th Woman of the Year, coming off the bench for 9.7 ppg and hitting a team-high 60 3-pointers. Head coach Matthew Mitchell earned SEC Coach of the Year honors by *The Associated Press* and has already climbed to No. 3 on UK's all-time wins list in just five seasons at the helm.

#### CATS ADVANCE TO SECOND ELITE EIGHT IN LAST THREE YEARS

Kentucky earned its third overall and second Elite Eight appearance in the last two years with wins over

McNeese State, Green Bay and Gonzaga. The Wildcats also advanced to the Regional Finals in 1982, the very first NCAA Tournament, and in 2010.

How did we get there? In the first round vs. McNeese State, eight players scored at least six points, led by reserves Keyla Snowden and Azia Bishop who posted double-figure scoring efforts. Snowden led the Wildcats in scoring with 11 points, while Bishop came off the bench for 10 points and three blocks in just 16 minutes. Sophomore Samarie Walker pulled down a game-high 13 rebounds which tied for the most rebounds by a UK player in the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats grabbed a season-high 58 rebounds in the win, the most for UK in the Big Dance and the most since charting a school-record 62 boards vs. Murray State on Nov. 26, 2010. Sophomore Samantha Drake, who started for the first time since Dec. 28, swatted four blocks in the win, a UK NCAA Tournament high.

In the second round vs. Green Bay, the Wildcats built a 17-point lead before turnovers nearly cost them the game. The Wildcats played one of their best halves of the season to open the game, shooting 55.6 percent from the field, outrebounding the Phoenix by seven and displaying the type of energy that won them the SEC regular season championship.

But in the second half, Green Bay forced Kentucky into 20 turnovers and 19 fewer points. What began as a 17-point deficit turned into a one-point lead for the Phoenix with less than a minute to play.

That's when Snowden took over. She scored the final six points of the game, including the game-winning jumper with 16 seconds remaining, and two free throws with 5.4 seconds on the clock to give UK the 65-62 win. UK ended the game with a season-high

34 turnovers, but the Wildcats shot 51.0 percent from the field, their third-highest field goal percentage of the season and highest since netting a season-high 54.7 percent vs. Samford on Dec. 21, 2011.

Walker was again a factor down the stretch. She finished with a team-high 15 points on 7-of-10 shooting to go along with her second consecutive game of 13 rebounds, tying the most by a Wildcat in an NCAA Tournament game. Snowden followed with 13 points, while junior guard A'dia Mathies and sophomore guard Kastine Evans added 10 points each.

In the Sweet 16 vs. Gonzaga, it was the Cats' impressive outside shooting that catapulted the Wild-

cats past the Bulldogs. UK hit 12 3-pointers, most ever by UK in an NCAA Tournament game, en route to a 79-62 win. Snowden once again was a key catalyst as she came off the bench to net a season-high tying five treys for 17 points. Walker posted her second straight double-double with 16 points and 12 rebounds, while Mathies and freshman Bria Goss followed with 15 and 10 points, respectively. Mathies also dished out a career-high tying seven assists, while Evans was relentless on the boards as she grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds, including six offensive. All 10 players that saw action scored at least two points.

#### KENTUCKY WINS ITS FIRST SEC REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONSHIP IN 30 YEARS

The Wildcats, who were picked to finish second in the SEC standings by the league coaches and media, had another remarkable season under the direction of head coach Matthew Mitchell. He led the Cats to their third straight 25-plus win season for the first time ever with a 28-7 overall record, including a 13-3 mark in SEC play. The 13 league wins were a school record for SEC wins in a season and UK's regular season championship was just the second in school history and first since 1982. UK's 28 wins tied the school record for wins in a single season set in 2009-10.

#### MITCHELL'S MARK IN MARCH

The Wildcats are 15-10 overall during the month of March under head coach Matthew Mitchell, including an impressive 11-5 mark the past three seasons. The only losses came against No. 4 Tennessee in the championship game of the 2010 and 2011 SEC Tournaments, a loss to LSU in the semifinals of the 2012 SEC Tournament, and setbacks vs. No. 12 Oklahoma in the 2010 NCAA Elite Eight and No. 3 UConn in the 2012 Elite Eight.

Mitchell is 7-3 overall in the NCAA Tournament after leading UK to the Elite Eight in 2010 and 2012, and the second round of the "Big Dance" in 2011.

### MITCHELL MOVES UP UK WIN CHART

### MITCHELL SIGNS NEW CONTRACT EXTENSION THROUGH 2019

After leading the Kentucky to three straight NCAA tournaments for the first time in school history, including two Elite Eight appearances, head coach Matthew Mitchell was awarded a new seven-year contract worth approximately \$7.95 million with the opportunity for performance-based incentives through the 2019 season. He donated \$100,000 of his new contract back to UK president Dr. Eli Capilouto for educational purposes.

### MATHIES, GOSS, SNOWDEN HONORED BY SEC COACHES

The Southeastern Conference coaches honored three Wildcats for their part in helping UK win its first SEC championship in 32 years. Junior guard A'dia Mathies was named SEC Player of the Year, freshman guard Bria Goss was named SEC Freshman of the Year and senior guard Keyla Snowden was named SEC Co-6th Woman of the Year. Mathies was also named to the All-SEC first team and the SEC All-Defensive Team for the second consecutive season.

Mathies is UK's second SEC Player of the Year as voted by the league coaches, joining former Wildcat great Victoria Dunlap, who earned the honor in 2010.

Goss is the second SEC Freshman of the Year in school history, joining Mathies on the elite list. Mathies was named the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2010. Overall, this marks the ninth consecutive season UK has had at least one player selected to the All-SEC teams, and the third consecutive season a freshman has been named to the All-Freshman team.

### UK HOOPS SWEEPS SEC ASSOCIATED PRESS AWARDS

UK was again honored for its outstanding season, this time by the Associated Press. Junior guard A'dia Mathies was named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Year by the AP, as freshman Bria Goss claimed SEC Newcomer of the Year honors and head coach Matthew Mitchell took home SEC Coach of the Year honors. Mathies was also a unanimous selection for first team All-SEC.

Mathies is UK's first AP SEC Player of the Year since Victoria Dunlap claimed the honor in 2011. Mathies was also named the SEC Player of the Year by the 12 league coaches, and was named a member of the SEC All-Defensive Team and first team All-SEC by the league coaches. Goss becomes Kentucky's first AP SEC Freshman of the Year, while Coach Mitchell earned his second AP SEC Coach of the Year award in the last three years.

### THREE WILDCATS NAMED TO SEC WINTER ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

Seniors Amber Smith, Keyla Snowden and sophomore Katine Evans were three of 43 Kentucky student-athletes named to the Southeastern Conference Winter Academic Honor Roll. A total of 398 athletes from the SEC were given the prestigious honor.

Smith graduated with a bachelor of arts degree in integrated strategic communications in May of 2011 and went on to work on a second degree in family studies. Snowden earned a bachelor of arts degree in communications with a minor in telecommunications in May of 2011 and worked on a second degree in media arts and studies, while finishing up her final season of eligibility.



### KENTUCKY IS HOME OF THE CHAMPIONS

The Kentucky men's and women's basketball teams clinched the Southeastern Conference regular season championship outright becoming just the second school in league history to have both its men's and women's team win in the same season. LSU also accomplished the feat in 2006. Overall, the UK men's team has won a staggering 45 SEC titles, while this was the second title for the women's team and first since 1982.

### UK CHARTS 3RD STRAIGHT 25-WIN SEASON FOR THE FIRST TIME IN SCHOOL HISTORY

The Wildcats charted their third straight 25-win season for the first time in school history with a school-record tying 28 wins. UK also won 28 in 2009-10.

Overall, UK has totaled 13 20-win seasons with five of those coming in the last seven years.

### 10-WIN SEC SEASONS

The win over Vanderbilt on Feb. 20 gave UK its 10th SEC win of the season. The Wildcats have now tallied three consecutive 10-win seasons in conference play, including a school-record 13 SEC wins this season. It's the first time in school history the Wildcats have 10 or more SEC wins in three consecutive seasons.

### CATS SET SCHOOL RECORD WITH SIX WINS OVER RANKED OPPONENTS

After a thrilling win over No. 10/10 Green Bay in the NCAA Tournament, Kentucky charted its school-record sixth win of the season over a ranked team in *The Associated Press* poll. The previous record was five wins set in 1982-83 and in 2009-10.

UK also defeated No. 10 Louisville (Dec. 4), No. 6 Duke (Dec. 8), No. 6 Tennessee (Jan. 12), No. 24 South Carolina (Jan. 15), No. 15 Georgia (Jan. 19).

The Cats' three losses to ranked teams came at No. 3 Notre Dame (Dec. 18), at No. 13 Tennessee (Feb. 13) and vs. No. 3/3 Connecticut in the NCAA Elite Eight.

### UK TIES THE BEST START IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Kentucky began the season at 21-3 which tied the best start in program history. Kentucky also started 21-3 in 1982-83. UK set three school records of consecutive regular season conference wins (13), consecutive SEC wins to begin a season (10) and consecutive SEC road wins (6) before falling at LSU on Feb. 5. The Wildcats also set a new school record for SEC wins in a season (13), consecutive SEC home wins (10) and tied the school the record for most wins in a season (28 also set in 2009-10).

### CATS PERRRRRFECTION AT HOME

With 19 consecutive victories in Memorial Coliseum and one win at Rupp Arena this season (Dec. 8), the Cats own the third-longest home winning streak in school history with 20. The streak ties for fourth nationally with Ohio State. The Cats have also won 31 consecutive games at home against non-conference opponents, dating back to 2008.

UK is 68-16 (80.9) at home in the Matthew Mitchell era (games include Rupp Arena). UK was the only school in the SEC to go undefeated at home.

### KENTUCKY BASKETBALL RULES AT HOME

Over the past three seasons, the Kentucky men's and women's basketball teams have posted a 99-2 (.980) mark in home games. That record was the best in the country for any school in home basketball games since 2009-10. The UK men currently sport the longest home winning streak in the country, having won 52 straight games and 51 straight games since the start of the 2009-10 season. The UK Hoops team is riding the country's fourth-longest home winning streak, as it has won each of its past 20 games.

### UK RANKS IN BOTH NATIONAL POLLS

Since the middle of 2009-10, Kentucky has been ranked in both polls 43 consecutive weeks. The Cats finished No. 12 in the final AP poll & No. 8 in final USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll. It marked the highest final AP ranking since finishing 11th in 1983 and the highest final ranking in the coaches' poll in school history. UK has appeared in the AP poll 139 times in the poll's 38-year history. UK's longest streak in the poll is 61 consecutive weeks from week 11 during the 1979-80 season to week 17 of the 1982-83 season.

### BASKETBALL STATE OF MIND

Both of Kentucky's basketball teams finished in the top 15 of both The Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches' poll. The men's team was No. 1 in both polls while the women's team was No. 12/8. UK was one of just three schools in the nation to have both its men's and women's teams ranked in the top 15 of the AP poll. The others were Baylor and Duke.

### "40 MINUTES OF DREAD"

Once again, opponents found the Wildcats' signature pressure, full-court defense, dubbed "40 minutes of dread" by head coach Matthew Mitchell, tough to handle. In 2010-11, UK led the SEC and ranked in the top 10 nationally in steals and turnover margin. In 2011-12, the Wildcats were second nationally in turnover margin (+9.3) and 15th (12.1) in steals.

"We want you to dread coming in and having to play Kentucky," Mitchell said. "We want you to say 'Oh my gosh, we have to play this for 40 minutes,' because we're not going to be real tricky, you're going to know when we come in, we're going to try to play as hard as we can with as many people coming at you, and not stop."

### UK FORCES A SCHOOL RECORD TURNOVERS

The Wildcats forced an NCAA-high 939 turnovers, surpassing the single season record of 823 set in 2009-10. UK has forced over 800 turnovers three consecutive seasons.

The Cats are an impressive 57-5 since the 1979-80 season when forcing 30 or more turnovers, including an impressive 17-1 in the Matthew Mitchell era.

The Wildcats also set a new school record with 49 forced turnovers vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Dec. 11, 2011.

### MATHIES MAKES HER MARK

Junior guard A'dia Mathies had one of the most impressive performances in UK Hoops history on Jan. 12 vs. Tennessee when she scored a career-high 34 points, and grabbed nine boards, one shy of tying a career high. Mathies also dished out two assists, blocked two shots and had two steals.

Her 34 points are the most points scored by a UK player since Dec. 20, 1987, when Bebe Croley scored 40 points vs. Morehead State.

Mathies is just the fifth player in school history to score 34 points or more in a game. The others are Valerie Still, Bebe Croley, Pam Browning and Leslie Nichols.

### CATS BREAK RECORDS IN DEFEAT OF MISSISSIPPI STATE

Kentucky's 48-point win (88-40) over Mississippi State on Jan. 8 marked its largest margin of victory in an SEC game in program history. It broke the previous record of +31 set in 2010-11 vs. Auburn on Feb. 3, 2011 (69-38).

The Cats' 14 made 3-pointers also set a new program record, breaking the previous record of 13 set Dec. 1, 1994 vs. Detroit.



Keyla Snowden, the SEC Co-6th Woman of the Year, hit a team-high 60 3-pointers during her senior season and ended her UK career ranked No. 2 on the career list for 3-point field goals made.

### SNOWDEN ENDS CAREER RANKED IN TOP FIVE OF 3-POINT CHARTS

With 176 career 3-pointers made, senior Keyla Snowden took sole possession of No. 2 on UK's all-time 3-point field goals made list. She ended her UK career also ranking third in 3-point field goals attempted (477) and 3-point field goal percentage, shooting 36.9 percent.

Snowden, a transfer from Akron, reached the top five on UK's 3-point career lists despite playing in just 101 games.

### UK HOOPS UPSETS NO. 6/5 DUKE IN ITS RETURN TO RUPP ARENA

For the first time in three years, the Wildcats returned to Rupp Arena, the home of UK's nationally-renowned men's basketball program. The Wildcats looked pretty comfortable in their second home as they upset No. 6/5 Duke, 72-65, in front of a school-record 14,508 fans.

UK is now 21-12 all-time in Rupp Arena, including a 2-4 record under Matthew Mitchell.

### ROOKIE ROOMMATES SHINE IN WIN OVER NO. 6/5 DUKE

Freshmen roommates Bria Goss and Azia Bishop teamed up to combine for 31 points, 14 rebounds, four blocks and four steals on 15-24 shooting from the field in UK's 72-65 win over the Blue Devils.

Goss scored a career-high 19 points while Bishop charted her first career double-double with 12 points and a career-high 11 rebounds, including 10 points and 10 rebounds in the decisive second half. She also swatted a career-best four blocks in just 19 minutes of action.

### UK SETS A NEW SINGLE-GAME ATTENDANCE RECORD

The attendance of 14,508 vs. No. 6/5 Duke marked the largest attendance in program history. The previous high was 13,689 in UK's win over top-ranked Tennessee on Jan. 26, 2006.

### CATS END NONCONFERENCE SLATE AT 11-2

Kentucky finished the 2011 portion of its schedule with an 11-2 record, including a 10-0 mark at home. The Wildcats have won 10 or more nonconference games in four consecutive seasons.

### CATS FORCE A SCHOOL-RECORD 49 TURNOVERS

Against Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Dec. 11, UK did what it does best, force turnovers. The Cats forced a school-record 49 turnovers en route to a 101-43 win. The previous record of 48 was also set this season vs. Jacksonville State (11/15/11).

### DEFENSE HOLDS JSU TO 25 POINTS

Kentucky held Jacksonville State to just 25 points, tying the school record for fewest points allowed in a game. UK also allowed just 25 points vs. the Lexington Merchants on Dec. 3, 1974, the Cats' first season of varsity women's basketball.

The 75-point margin of victory (100-25) was the second-largest margin of victory in program history.



Amber Smith ended her Wildcat career ranked sixth on UK's all-time assists list with 425. She also ranked sixth in career games played, donning the Blue and White in 123 games.

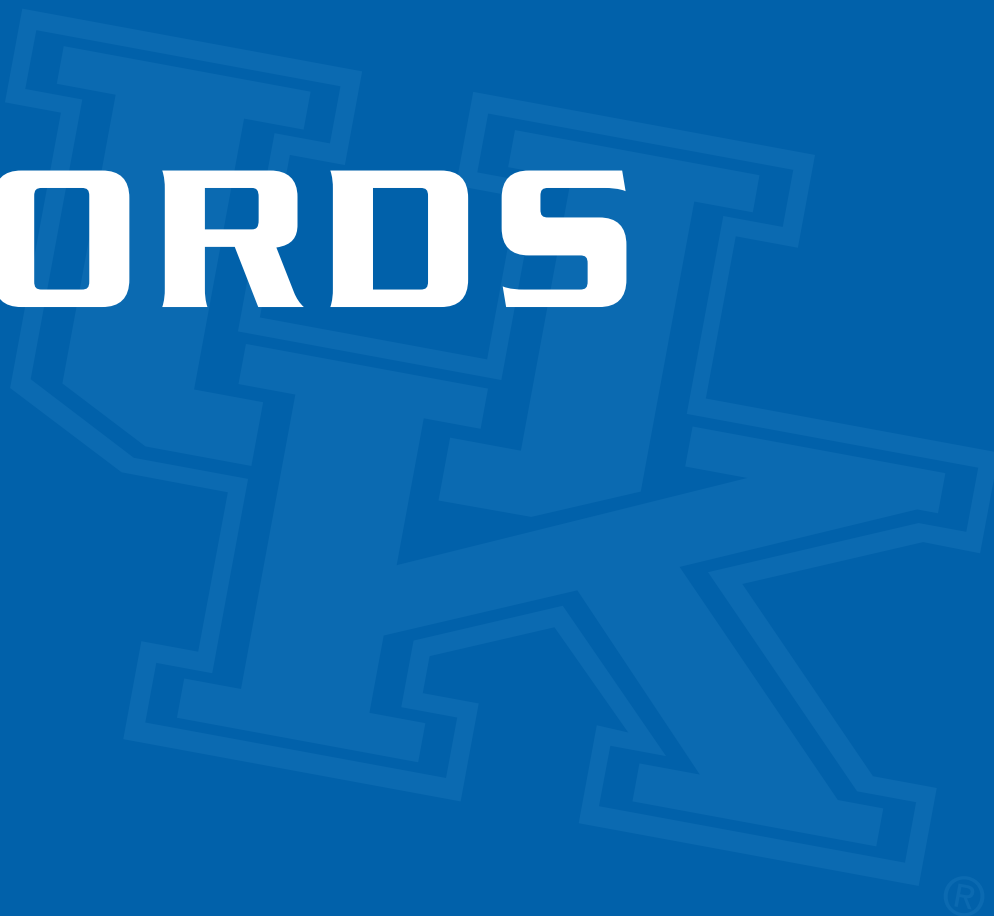

### ALL-TIME KENTUCKY COACHES



#### SUE FEAMSTER • 1971-76

**RECORD AT UK: 64-39 (62.1%)**

Sue Feamster became UK's first head women's basketball coach of the modern era when the program regained its varsity status in 1974. Women's basketball had been a varsity sport at UK from 1903 until 1925, when the University senate passed a bill abolishing the sport for being "too strenuous" for females. Feamster began coaching the UK women in 1971-72, when the squad earned a 10-3 record, and remained head coach as the squad rolled up a 26-15 record over the next two seasons. After women's basketball became a varsity sport, Feamster helped the program to a fast start, passing along to incoming coach Debbie Yow a squad that included All-American Pam Browning, who still holds several spots in the UK record book, and standout Ceal Barry.



#### DEBBIE YOW • 1976-80

**RECORD AT UK: 79-40 (66.4%)**

In the last year of her four seasons at Kentucky, Debbie Yow's Wildcats stormed to a 24-5 record and earned the school's first trip to the national playoffs — then the Association of Intercollegiate Women's Athletics Tournament. It was clear then that both Yow and the UK women's program were primed for success. And just as the Cats continued to earn postseason berths, Yow's career remained on the fast track as well. Yow enjoyed a successful coaching stint at Florida and subsequent athletics administration positions at Florida and UNC-Greensboro. She then became Athletics Director at St. Louis, and since 1994, has been AD at Maryland. She served as president of the National Association of Collegiate Athletics Directors.



#### TERRY HALL • 1980-87

**RECORD AT UK: 138-66 (67.6%)**

Terry Hall holds the laudable distinction of being the winningest coach in UK women's basketball history as well as owning the best winning percentage of any coach to guide the program. Hall coached the Cats to seven straight winning seasons, starting with a 25-6 record and a trip to the second round of the AIAW national tournament before falling by one point to Maryland to end the 1980-81 season. The NCAA welcomed women's basketball into its ranks the following year, and that historical season ended with the Cats falling to eventual national champion Louisiana Tech in the Midwest Regional finals on the Lady Techsters' home floor. After the Cats failed to make the NCAA tournament in 1986-87, Hall left coaching for the business sector. But three years later, she accepted the head coaching job at Wright State University, where she coached for seven years before succumbing to cancer in 1997.



#### SHARON FANNING • 1987-95

**RECORD AT UK: 134-97 (58%)**

Sharon Fanning guided the Cats through eight seasons and despite a dubious beginning that saw her squad record back-to-back losing seasons, she never suffered another losing season. In just her third year, Fanning coached the Wildcats to an impressive 23-8 record while also edging them into the top 25. UK won three tournament titles in 1989-90, including an 85-76 come-from-behind victory over Toledo in the NWIT Championship. The following season, the Wildcats advanced to the NCAA Tournament, UK's first appearance in the Big Dance in five years. Prior to her stint at UK, Fanning was a graduate assistant at Tennessee and a head coach at UT-Chattanooga. Since leaving UK, she was the head coach at Mississippi State University before retiring following the 2011-12 season.



#### BERNADETTE MATTOX • 1995-2003

**RECORD AT UK: 91-135 (40.2%)**

Bernadette Mattox spent eight seasons at the helm of the Wildcats basketball program. She began her coaching career at her alma mater, Georgia, but became a household name in Kentucky and across the nation when she was hired by former Wildcats coach Rick Pitino as the first female Division I assistant "bench" coach for a men's team in 1990. She was promoted to assistant athletics director at Kentucky for one year before taking over the UK women's program in 1995. Her most notable season came in 1998-99, when she led the Cats to their first 20-plus win season and first appearance in the NCAA Tournament in nearly a decade. The Cats won their first NCAA Tournament game in 17 years, finished with a 21-11 overall record and captured seven wins in the SEC, the most conference wins in school history at the time.

Since leaving UK in 2003, Mattox has served as an assistant coach for the WNBA's Connecticut Sun.



#### MICKIE DEMOSS • 2003-07

**RECORD AT UK: 71-56 (55.9%)**

Mickie DeMoss will best be remembered as the architect who took over a struggling program in 2003 and in just a short amount of time rebuilt UK women's basketball back into a national contender. During her tenure the Wildcats participated in postseason play three consecutive seasons (one NCAA Tournament and two WNIT) and captured back-to-back 20-win seasons (2005-06 and 2006-07) for the first time since the 1989-90 and 1990-91 teams accomplished the feat. DeMoss was named the 2006 SEC Coach of the Year, a UK Hoops first, after guiding the Wildcats to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven seasons. The Cats posted a 22-9 overall record in 2005-06, including a school-record nine conference wins and Kentucky made national headlines when it defeated No. 1 Tennessee in Rupp Arena. It was UK's first win over a top-ranked team in school history. DeMoss also drastically increased fan attendance, as UK ranked in the top three of the SEC and top 20 in the national average attendance poll all four of her seasons. UK went from averaging 1,694 fans prior to her arrival in 2003 to breaking the school record with 5,863 fans per game in her final season.

Prior to UK, DeMoss spent 18 seasons at Tennessee, helping the Lady Vols garner six national championship titles and 13 Final Four appearances. She also was the head coach four seasons at Florida (1979-83). In eight seasons as a head coach, DeMoss has a career record of 116-124, including a 26-65 mark in the SEC. Since leaving UK, DeMoss has served as an assistant coach at Texas and Tennessee and is currently an assistant coach for the WNBA's Indiana Fever.

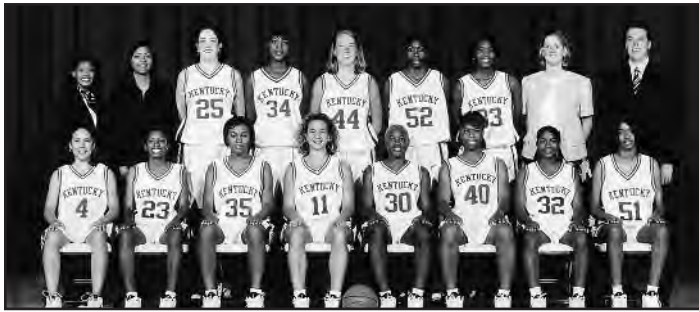

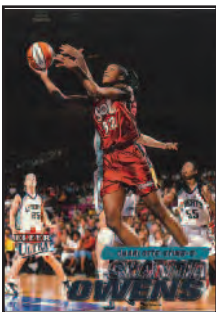

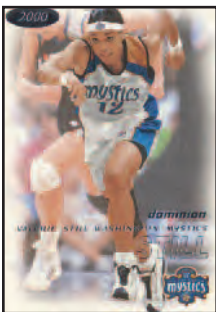

### CATS REPRESENT AMERICA

#### Liz Lukschu/Maria Donhoff (1978)

Both Lukschu and Donhoff won a silver medal in the Junior Pan American Games (1978) with the USA National Junior Women's Basketball team that toured South America.

#### Valerie Still (1980, 81, 82)

Following her freshman and junior year, Still played for the USA R. William Jones Cup team in Taipei, Taiwan. In the summer of 1981, she competed for the U.S. in the World University Games in Romania, where she helped lead the team to a silver medal.

#### Patty Jo Hedges (1983)

Hedges was a member of the silver medal winning 1983 USA World Championship Team which compiled a 6-2 record in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Hedges was also a member of the gold medal winning 1983 Junior Pan American Games, which registered a perfect 5-0 record in Caracas, Venezuela.

#### Bebe Croley (1985, 86)

Croley represented UK two straight years (1985 and '86) on the USA Select squad. In the summer of 1985, Croley and the US squad toured Europe and participated in the Jones Cup competition in Taiwan. In 1986, the Select team competed in the Canadian Invitational games. It marked the second straight year Bebe was named to the USA team.

#### Jodie Whitaker (1986, 87)

Whitaker played on the Gold medal-winning South squad in the summer of 1986 and went on to compete on the USA Junior Pro team that competed in the Jones Cup tournament in Taiwan in 1987.

#### Stacey Reed (1995)

Reed won a silver medal as a member of the World University Games Team. She then helped the USA Basketball's Jones Cup team take a Gold medal in Taiwan. She was a member of the USA Junior Select team in the summer of 1992.

#### Bernadette Mattox (1998)

Mattox was the first head coach for a women's basketball team at UK to be selected to coach at the USA Women's World Championship. Mattox helped lead the 1998 World Championship team to an 8-0 record and its third gold medal by defeating Russia 71-65.

*UK's All-Time Leading Scorer and Rebounder, UK Hall of Fame Charter Class*

#### UK Great Valerie Still

*Some programs have a once-in-a-lifetime player who serves as a standard for all future student-athletes. An exceptional personality. An outstanding role model. A great basketball player. For Kentucky, that player is Valerie Still.*

Although Still played long ago (1979-83), she remains the "Top Cat" in UK women's basketball annals. She was honored as such on Jan. 12, 2003 with a jersey retirement ceremony at halftime of the Alabama game. She became the first female letter winner in any UK sport to have her jersey retired.

Still is the leader among all Wildcats (men or women) for career scoring (2,763) and rebounding (1,525). She was a three-time consensus All-American. She led the program in scoring four-straight seasons with a career average of 23.2 points. At one point during the 1981-82 season, she led the nation in both scoring and rebounding before finishing second in both categories (24.8 ppg and 14.3 rpg).

She led the Cats to their highest national ranking (4th) in 1983 and helped UK roll up a 30-game home court win streak from 1980-82. In 1983, Still led the sixth-ranked Cats to an 80-66 upset over powerhouse Old Dominion before a record crowd of 10,622 in UK's Memorial Coliseum.

After leaving Kentucky, Still had a successful career in the Italian Professional League. While in Italy, Still was a television actress and hosted her own TV show, "Still Basket." She is also an accomplished print model and a professional caliber jazz, pop and concert pianist.

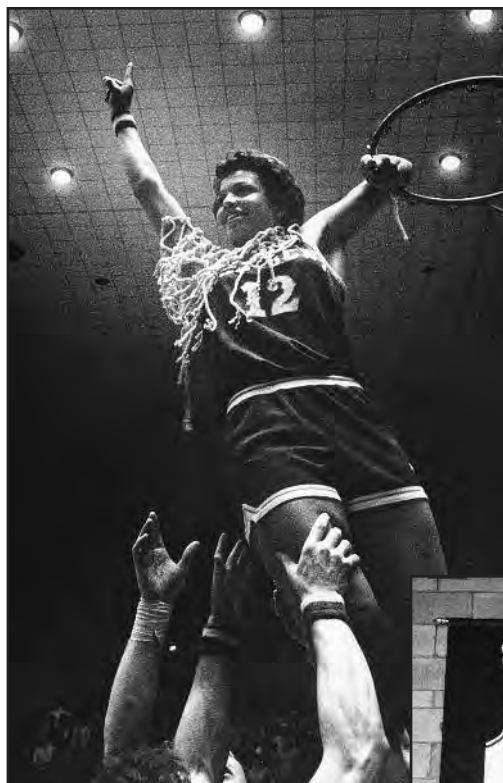
Upon her return to the United States, Still became a charter member of the American Basketball League for Women and was a two-time MVP of the ABL Championship Series. Still later played for the Washington Mystics of the WNBA before retiring from basketball. She also was an assistant coach for the Orlando Miracle for two seasons.

Still returned to Lexington to complete her degree in animal sciences and graduated with honors in 2001. She went on to earn a master's degree in African American and African studies at The Ohio State University and is working on a doctorate in sports and humanities from there as well.

In September 2005, Still was inducted into the charter class in the newly created UK Athletics Hall of Fame. She was the only female of the 88 inductees.

Still currently lives in Palmyra, N.J. with her son, Aaron, who is attending Valley Forge Military Academy. She recently started a publishing company, STILL Publications. One of her first projects was the release of UK legendary sports writer Russell Rice's latest book on UK basketball, "Big Blue Nation: Kentucky's Native Sons and Daughters."

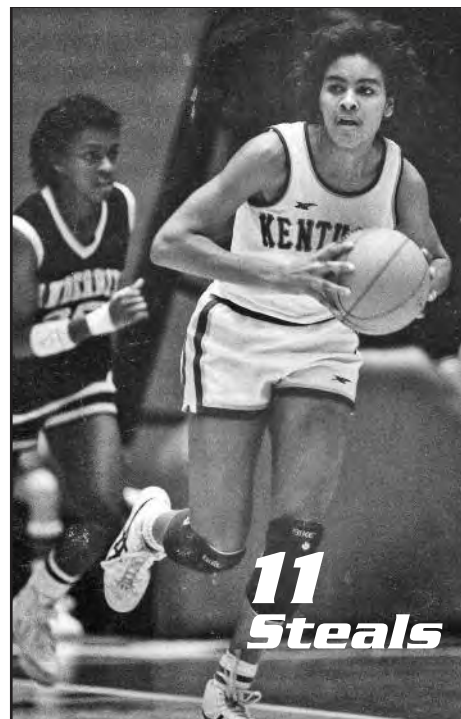
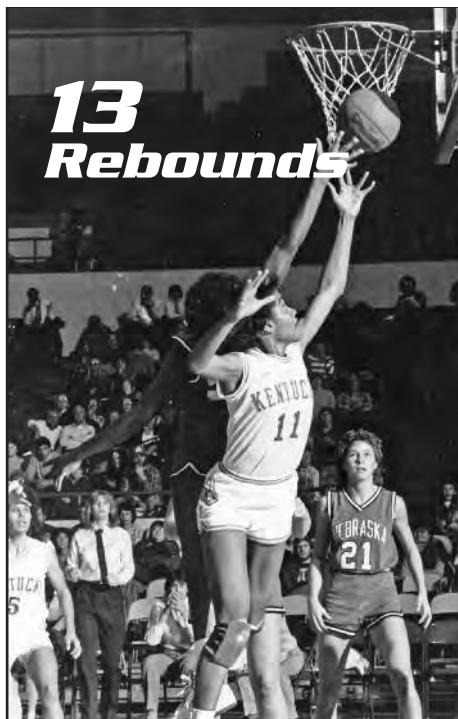

- Since, 1982, league teams have been ranked 2,739 times, including 1,472 Top 10 appearances and 748 Top 5 appearances.
- SEC teams can also boast of 136 No. 1 rankings in the AP Poll.
- The league has had the top three teams in the AP Poll twice. In week three in 2005 and in week eight in 1989.
- A nation-leading eight SEC teams were ranked at one point in the AP and CNN/USA Today Top 25 polls during the 1995-96 season. The league mirrored that feat during the 1996-97 season.

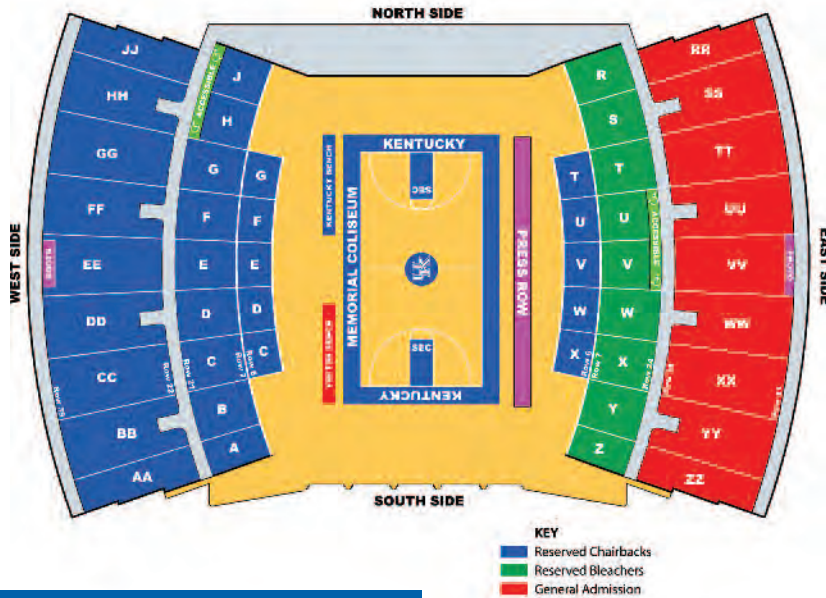


## MEMORIAL COLISEUM

*"My Old Kentucky Home" • Capacity 8,000*

*The women's team has carved a 357-140 (71.8) home-court record into the history of the Coliseum, including a 67-12 (84.8) record under Coach Matthew Mitchell.*

*Over the past three seasons, the Cats have compiled an impressive 47-2 (95.9%) record in the storied Coliseum and have ranked in the nation's top 25 in average attendance nine consecutive seasons.*

Situated along Euclid Avenue on the University of Kentucky campus, Memorial Coliseum is the home of one of the richest basketball traditions in the nation. It is also home to the University of Kentucky women's basketball team, a team that has returned glory and excitement to a facility that has known a wealth of both.

For 25 years, the historic coliseum housed the renowned Kentucky Wildcats men's team, which won two national championships and 16 Southeastern Conference titles while playing in the facility under the direction of legendary coaches Adolph Rupp and Joe B. Hall. When the Wildcats moved downtown to 23,000-seat Rupp Arena in 1976, the then-11,500 seat Coliseum became the exclusive basketball home for the women's team.

Although the Coliseum is nicknamed "the house that Rupp built," University President H.L. Donovan is credited with beginning the plans for the Coliseum's construction in 1941 when he recommended a building that would "properly take care of our athletics, our health services, our physical education and our recreation."

Memorial Coliseum was completed in 1950 at a cost of \$3,925,000. The huge building was dedicated to serve as a memorial to the nearly 10,000 Kentuckians who lost their lives in World War II and the Korean conflict. The Coliseum covers an entire city block and has as much space as a seven-story office building.

A new state-of-the-art floor was installed in the summer of 2007, as the original 52-year-old floor was taken out in place of a playing surface that will be much more friendly to each athlete's tendencies and will cut down on injuries. A new sound system and speaker cluster were added in the summer of 2008.

### RUPP ARENA

Adolph Rupp is synonymous with winning. As coach of Kentucky, he was a pioneer in the Wildcats' fast-break offense while becoming the winningest coach the game had ever seen.

The site that now serves as a tribute to his outstanding coaching accomplishments – Rupp Arena – has become one of the most recognizable gymnasiums in the world while serving as home to college basketball's most storied program.

Now in its 37th season as the Kentucky Wildcats' home court, the facility has seen UK win 89 percent of its home games since it was opened in 1976.

In recent years, Rupp Arena completed renovations - including the lower arena seats being changed to blue from their previous rainbow colors. In addition, new end-zone seating moved the student section closer to the floor in an intimidating, standing-room only arrangement. While the endowment seats along courtside continue to entice fans to financially support their Wildcats, a large portion of the media have been moved to a "press box" location between the lower and upper seating areas. And finally, nearly 40 seats were added to each corner, the first additions in seating in nearly two decades.

The improvements followed changes that included four new video boards, a new playing floor with a striking new design and enhancements to the concourses as well. It was all part of a \$15 million upgrade to what many consider the mecca of college basketball.

Since the fall of 1976, the arena in downtown Lexington has served as home to four national championship teams at Kentucky. Four others have

advanced to the Final Four. Eleven seasons have witnessed the Cats go unbeaten at home.

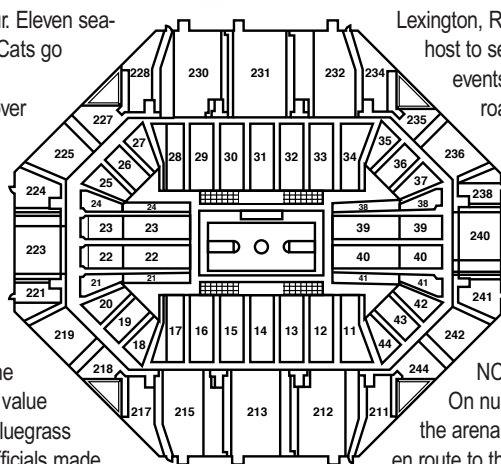
It has played host to over 500 UK games, countless KHSAA Sweet 16s, a number of NBA exhibitions, 11 NCAA Tournaments, three SEC Tournaments and two Ohio Valley Conference Tournaments. With so many unforgettable moments, the old floor still maintained a value to hoop fans across the Bluegrass and beyond. Therefore, officials made pieces of the relic available for public sale, with proceeds going to the UK Basketball Museum, the Kentucky High School Athletic Association and to help offset the costs of the new playing floor. Thanks to an auction of additional sections, like coaching boxes and lettered end zones, the old floor generated more than \$250,000.

The new portable basketball court, adorned with the official interlocking UK logo at midcourt, was designed by both UK officials and the Lexington Center Corporation. Robbins, Inc., in Cincinnati constructed it in 2001 at a cost of \$125,000. When assembled, it lies 118 feet below the ceiling and is made of a high-grade northern maple. The floor can be removed and an ice rink can be constructed for ice shows or hockey games thanks to a \$2.5 million renovation during the summer of '96.

But the playing surface is just one aspect of the impressive home of the Cats. Situated in downtown

Lexington, Rupp Arena has played host to several premier basketball events. In March of 1985, all roads led to Lexington for the NCAA Final Four as Villanova shocked Georgetown in a memorable finale.

In 1986, Rupp played host to both the Southeastern Conference Tournament and the NCAA Women's Final Four.

On numerous other occasions, the arena has served as one stop en route to the NCAA title game.

An awesome structure in sight and scope, the arena is divided into two seating areas. The lower level features 10,000 cushioned theater seats. The upper level has 13,000 seats on epoxy-coated metal bleachers. The latter can be visually isolated to provide more natural setting for small shows.

Built by the city of Lexington, the arena is the major portion of the \$53 million Lexington Center complex, which includes an expanded convention-exhibition hall, a 50-store tri-level enclosed shopping mall and a Hyatt Regency Hotel.

The Wildcats command an exclusive locker room 365 days a year, while other amenities include six team-size dressing rooms and eight smaller units.

In January 2001, the arena unveiled four new video boards, each 12'6" by 20' in size and mounted in each corner. It allowed the Wildcats to utilize a new "lights out" introduction, featuring a video presentation and indoor fireworks.

## UK 72, Duke 64 Dec. 8, 2011

In Kentucky's first game in Rupp Arena since 2007-08, it was the Wildcats' freshmen Bria Goss and Azia Bishop who shined. The duo combined for 31 points, 14 rebounds, four blocks and four steals on 15-24 shooting from the field and UK defeated No. 6/5 Duke 72-65 in front of a school-record 14,508 fans.

Junior A'dia Mathies led the way with 23 points, but it was Bishop's unexpected play following a tough week of practice under coach Matthew Mitchell that propelled the Wildcats late.

The Wildcats used their pressure defense to force the Blue Devils into a season-high 24 turnovers and made several clutch shots during an 8-0 run that sealed the victory.

## THE EARLY ERA

Did you know that basketball began on the University of Kentucky campus as a women's sport? Its first game was on Feb. 21, 1903 vs. Kentucky University (now Transylvania). That game was followed one year later by the formation of a men's team.

Women's basketball at UK, then known as Kentucky State College, was first led by Coach Jane Todd Watson. Eight coaches followed, including former University of Florida president and U.S. Commissioner of Education Dr. John J. Tigert (1911-15, 1917), before Sarah Blanding took over the coaching reigns in the 1919-20 season. She coached three years before becoming a player-captain in 1923 under a young post-graduate student named A.B. "Happy" Chandler. Blanding eventually would become president of Vassar College while Chandler would become a two-time governor of Kentucky, U.S. Senator and Baseball Commissioner.

The 1924 team, coached by Bart Peak, swept its 10-game schedule and claimed not only the championship of Kentucky, but the championship of the South. As the 1924-25 season got under way, the University Senate passed a bill to abolish women's basketball because basketball had proven to be a strenuous sport for boys and therefore was too strenuous for girls and due to inadequate facilities and general mores of the time.

Women's basketball finally reached varsity status after a 50-year absence and Assistant Athletics Director Sue Feamster was named the first coach in the new era. She guided the first varsity squad in the 1974-75 season to a 16-9 record.

### WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TIMELINE



Kentucky women's basketball has been recognized as having a spirited and winning tradition. It was in the early 1900s that women began playing the new game on "Miss Nettie's Lawn" in Lexington ... and so the tradition continues.

**1902** — The very first University of Kentucky basketball team was organized. Women's basketball begins on the UK campus with its first game on Feb. 21, 1903.

**1924** — The 1924 team, coached by Bart Peak, swept its 10-game schedule and claimed not only the championship of Kentucky, but the championship of the South.

**1924** — The University Senate passed a bill to abolish women's basketball in part because according to state politicians basketball had proven to be a strenuous sport for boys and therefore was too strenuous for girls.

After a 50-year absence, at the turn of the 70s, women teams at UK once again began playing intercollegiate games.

**1974** — Women's basketball finally reached varsity status. Sue Feamster was named the first coach. She guided that first squad to a 16-9 record. The team is given the nickname "Lady Cats."

**1976** — Feamster handed over the coaching reins to Debbie Yow, who compiled a 79-40 record in four seasons from 1976-1980. In 1979, Yow recruited Valerie Still, Lea Wise and Patty Jo Hedges, one of the best recruiting classes in UK women's basketball history.

1977 — Lady Kat starting center Pam Browning became an All-American and compiled 1,598 points in her collegiate career. She ranks as the third-leading scorer at UK to this day.

1979 — The Lady Kats upset second-ranked Tennessee, 66-64, before 4,500 fans in Memorial Coliseum. The attendance got a big boost when the much-anticipated game between the school's men's teams later that evening was canceled because of snow.



Terry Hall arrived at UK in 1980 and was named the Kentucky Women's Intercollegiate Conference Coach of the Year in her first season at UK.



Memorial Coliseum hosted the largest crowd ever to attend a women's college basketball game in 1983.

1980 — Terry Hall became the third head coach of the Lady Kats.

1982 — Lea Wise hit 15-of-16 outside shots against Illinois in an NCAA playoff game, helping the Cats win 88-80. Wise, a Lexington product, also led the team in autograph and photo requests because of her flashy and productive court play and her resemblance to actress Farrah Fawcett.

1982 — The Cats captured the SEC Tournament title for the first time in school history with an 80-74 victory over Tennessee. Following the game, the huge home crowd stormed the court in a celebration that lasted nearly 30 minutes.

1983 — With the talented trio of Hedges, Still and Wise, Kentucky was ranked fourth twice during the '82-83 season and broke the national record for attendance at a women's collegiate game when 10,622 fans saw the Cats defeat Old Dominion, 80-66, in Memorial Coliseum on Feb. 5, 1983.

Lea Wise was selected to the All-SEC team in 1982. Wise and Patty Jo Hedges were regarded as the best guard combination in the country.

Three-time All-American Valerie Still ripped past Dan Issel's UK career scoring mark of 2,138 points just three games into her senior season.





In her third year, Sharon Fanning led UK to an impressive 23-8 record, into the top-25 poll and won three tournament titles ('90).

**1983** — Valerie Still became the all-time leading scorer (among men and women) in Kentucky basketball history with 2,763 points in 119 games, a record that still stands.

**1986** — Kentucky served as the host to the NCAA women's Final Four in Rupp Arena.

**1987** — Sharon Fanning is named the fourth head coach of the Lady Cats.

**1987** — The three-point goal is introduced to the women's game, proving to be an integral part of Kentucky basketball history for years to come.

**1990** — Under third-year coach Sharon Fanning, UK compiled a 23-8 record, edged into the top 25, and won three tournament titles, including an 85-76 come-from-behind victory over Toledo in the NWIT Championship.

**1991** — One year after winning the NWIT, UK made its first NCAA appearance since 1985-86.

**1991** — UK scores one of the biggest upsets in the program's history with a 67-66 victory over intrastate rival and eventual NCAA runner-up Western Kentucky in Bowling Green.

*Fanning arrived at courtside of the NWIT finals in Amarillo, Texas in a blue Texas-style leather jacket, white leather pants and Kentucky blue boots, surprising the crowd and her own team.*



After winning the 1982 Southeastern Conference title, a crowd stormed the floor at Memorial Coliseum in a celebration that lasted nearly 30 minutes.

Kentucky upset intrastate rival Western Kentucky in 1991 in Bowling Green. The Lady Toppers advanced to the NCAA title game later that season.

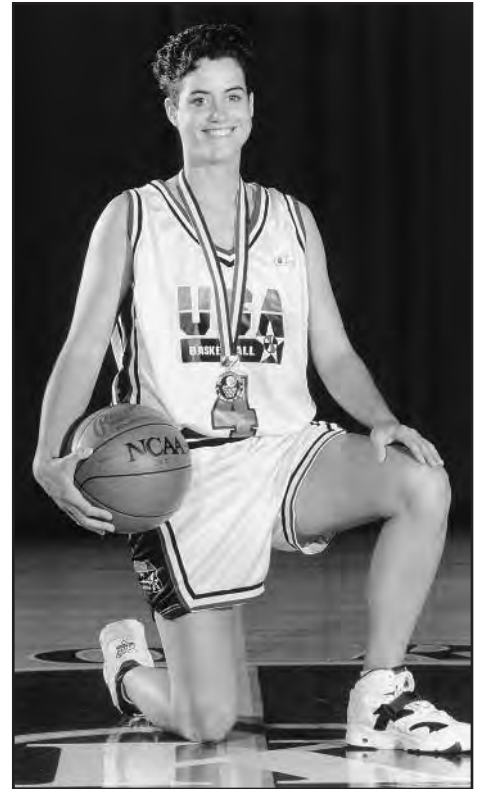

**1993**—UK re-enters the AP Poll at No. 24 after claiming the Lady Kat Invitational title.

**1995** — Stacey Reed and Chrissy Roberts are members of Gold Medal squads during the summer; Reed with USA Basketball's Jones Cup team and Roberts with the U.S. Olympic Festival South squad.

**1995** — Bernadette Locke-Mattox is chosen as the fifth head coach of the Cats.

**1995** — Stacey Reed graduates after four successful seasons at UK, leading the Cats in scoring both her junior and senior seasons, and assists and steals during all four years at Kentucky. Reed also broke UK's all-time career steals record with 309, which still stands.

**1998** — Mattox is chosen to be an assistant coach for the USA Basketball World Championship team.

**1999** — The Cats turned heads by charting more than 20 wins for the first time in nine years and defeating three ranked opponents. After reaching the semifinals of the SEC Tournament, the Cats beat Nebraska in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to UCLA in the second round.

**1999** — Erica Jackson hit a jumper to upset South Carolina 78-76 in Columbia, the first time in five years UK had won a game there. The shot earned Compaq's "Play of the Week" and "Play of the Year" awards.

*The Cats shucked the Nebraska Cornhuskers, 98-92, in the first round of the 1999 NCAA Tournament West Region in Los Angeles, Calif. UK scored a record-breaking 64 second-half points.*



● Bernadette Mattox became the first female Division I assistant "bench" coach for a men's team, serving on former UK coach Rick Pitino's staff from 1990-94.

● Erica Jackson led the Cats in both assists and steals in her two seasons as a Wildcat.

● Jaye Barnes led the Cats in scoring in 1998.





**1999** — UK celebrates 25 years of varsity women's basketball.

**2000** — Shantia Owens becomes the first player from UK to be taken in the WNBA draft, selected 53rd by the Phoenix Mercury.

**2000** — Tiffany Wait broke a school record for most games played with 122, also surpassing Jodie Whitaker on the Cats' all-time scoring list with 1,445 points.

**2001** — The Wildcats took a summer tour of France and Switzerland and returned home with an unblemished 5-0 record.

**2003** — Valerie Still's jersey is retired at halftime of the UK-Alabama game at Memorial Coliseum, marking the first time in school history that a woman's jersey was retired.

**2003** — After 18 seasons as an assistant coach at Tennessee, Mickie DeMoss is named the sixth head coach of the UK women's basketball team.

*Tiffany Wait is UK's eighth all-time leading scorer with 1,445 points. She holds the school record for most games played in a career with 122.*

*Valerie Still is the leader among all Wildcats for career scoring (2,763) and rebounding (1,525). Her jersey was the first to be retired for a female at UK.*

**2003** — Within months of her hire, Mickie DeMoss and her staff hit the recruiting trail and signed one of the most highly touted recruiting classes in school history. Many dubbed the 6th-ranked class as the “Fab Five”.

**2003** — Coach Mickie DeMoss earned her first win as the head coach at Kentucky as the Wildcats downed IPFW, 79-59, on Nov. 21, 2003.

**2004** — Kentucky celebrates 30 years of varsity women's basketball.

**2004** — Junior Sara Potts broke the school record for most 3-pointers made in a career (190) and single game (7).

**2004** — Senior and Kentucky native Selia “SeSe” Helm ended her UK career etched in the record book in three different categories: scoring (5th), rebounding (8th) and field goals (3rd).

**2004** — Enthusiasm generated by the hiring of the wildly popular Mickie DeMoss, combined with a brilliant and well-funded marketing plan, resulted in a staggering fan craze. Kentucky fans bought tickets at an unprecedented rate. UK ranked No. 1 nationally in increased attendance (3,488 more than the



2002-03 average), ranked No. 2 (behind perennial power Tennessee) in Southeastern Conference attendance, and was 16th nationally (5,182) in attendance average.

**2004** — The Cats moved into second place in the all-time single-season attendance total when 8,429

fans witnessed UK vs. No. 1 Tennessee on January 29, 2004. UK drew 41,000 fans in 19 home games during the 1981-82 season when the Cats won the SEC title and attendance was at an all-time high. The 2003-04 Cats brought in a school-record 72,553 fans in just 14 home games.

UK set new season attendance records in 2003-04, averaging 5,182 fans per game.

Senior Selia “SeSe” Helm finished her career as one of the top scorers and rebounders in UK history.

Sara Potts concluded her illustrious career as the only player in UK women's basketball history to hit 200 or more 3-pointers in a career.

**2004** — Sara Potts' 27 points help UK rally from a 17-point deficit to defeat Oregon State, 73-70, in the opening game of the Paradise Jam in St. Thomas, Virgin Islands.

**2005** — Freshman center Sarah Elliott scored a team-high 15 points to lead UK to a 71-63 win over 18th-ranked Georgia in Rupp Arena. It was UK Hoops' first win over a ranked opponent in five seasons and the first under second-year coach Mickie DeMoss. Elliott was named SEC Freshman of the Week after that performance, the first freshman to receive the honor in Wildcat history.

**2005** — UK Coach Mickie DeMoss makes her first return to Thompson-Boling Arena in Knoxville, Tenn., where she first made a name for herself as a coach. DeMoss is presented with a glass vase by UT Coach Pat Summitt before a standing ovation.

**2005** — UK made its first postseason appearance since the 1998-99 season with a berth in the Sportsview.tv Women's National Invitation Tournament. The Wildcats were rewarded for their spectacular attendance with a host site throughout the tournament. The Cats made their longest postseason run in school history, advancing to the semifinals of the WNIT before falling to West Virginia in double overtime.

**2005** — Sara Potts sank a jumper with 35 seconds remaining and fellow senior Danyelle Payne picked off Xavier sharpshooter Tara Boothe in the waning seconds as the Wildcats edged the Musketeers, 67-62, to advance to the tournament's semifinal round. Potts scored 29 of her 31 points in the final period to rally the Cats from a 14-point second-half deficit.

**2005** — For the second consecutive season, the Wildcats broke the school's attendance record. A total of 90,663 fans passed through the turnstiles during the 2004-05 season, smashing the school's previous single-season attendance total of 72,553 set during the 2003-04 campaign.

**2005** — Sara Potts finished her career as one of the most accomplished players in school history. She ranks fourth on the all-time scoring list (1,563 points) and the UK career scoring average list (13.4 ppg). The lefty was UK's leading scorer in both her junior (16.8 ppg) and senior (15.6) campaigns.

**2005** — Valerie Still was inducted into the charter class in the newly created UK Athletics Hall of Fame. She was the only female of the 88 inductees.

UK Hoops' average attendance (4,772) finished in the top 20 nationally for the second consecutive year.

UK completed the longest postseason run in school history by advancing to the 2005 WNIT final four. Potts, who averaged 27.8 points per game during the four-game run was named to the all-tournament team.

**2005** — Kentucky began the season 8-0 its best start since the 1980-81 campaign. During that stretch the Wildcats defeated Indiana State and Hofstra to win the 2005 Pepperdine Thanksgiving Classic. It was UK's first regular season tournament title since winning the Dartmouth Blue Sky Classic in 2000.

**2006** — DeMoss piloted a team that went from winning a combined 20 games in the two years prior to her arrival in 2003, to a record-breaking regular season that included the most wins (22) since 1989-90, the most conference wins in school history (nine), the highest conference finish (fourth) in 23 years, an appearance in the SEC Tournament semifinals for the first time in seven years, and UK's first bid in the NCAA Tournament in seven years with its highest seed (fifth) since 1983.

**2006** — DeMoss was named the SEC Coach of the Year by the SEC coaches and *The Associated Press*. It was the first Coach of the Year honor in UK Hoops history.

**2006** — Kentucky became just the fourth unranked team in the history of NCAA women's basketball to knock off a No. 1 team when the Cats defeated top-ranked Tennessee, 66-63, on Jan. 26, 2006—Junior Jenny Pfeiffer led the Cats in scoring with 16 points,

including 7-of-7 free-throws. Pfeiffer nailed the game-winning free-throws with 14.8 seconds remaining and junior Nastassia Alcius added two charity shots in the waning seconds of the game to ice the victory. It was Kentucky's first win over the Lady Vols in 20 years.

**2006** — After defeating Ole Miss on the road and taking a 66-63 win over top-ranked Tennessee a game later, the Cats appeared in the top 25 national polls for the first time in 13 years. The Wildcats were ranked 21st in *The Associated Press* and 23rd in the *USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll* for one week. UK's No. 21 ranking marked the highest ranking in the AP poll since receiving a No. 19 position on Feb. 10, 1985.

**2006** — Sophomore Samantha Mahoney and freshman Carly Ormerod were named to the All-Southeastern Conference team. Mahoney was named to the second team, while Ormerod was named to the all-freshman team.

**2006** — Kentucky's record-breaking season came to an end with a heartbreaking loss to No. 16/17 and fourth-seeded Michigan State, 67-63, in the NCAA second round. The Cats defeated UT-Chattanooga in the first round, 69-59.



Sophomore Samantha Mahoney was Kentucky's leading scorer in 2005-06, averaging 11.9 ppg. She currently ranks fourth on UK's all-time scoring list with 1,601 career points.

**2006** — Kentucky once again set season ticket records as 4,803 season tickets were sold for the 2005-06 campaign. The Wildcats ranked 20th in the nation and third in the SEC in average attendance with 5,161 fans per game.

A school-record attendance of 13,689 fans witnessed Kentucky upset No. 1 Tennessee, 66-63, in Rupp Arena on Jan. 26, 2006.

Coach DeMoss, who was named the SEC Coach of the Year by the SEC coaches and *The Associated Press*, led the Wildcats to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven years.





*Jennifer Humphrey set a school record for rebounds by a senior in a single season with 351 rebounds in 2006-07. She also broke the UK mark for most games played in a career with 129.*

**2007** — Kentucky advanced to postseason play for the third consecutive season (one NCAA Tournament and two WNIT) for the first time in school history and captured back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since the 1989-90 and 1990-91 teams accomplished the feat.

**2007** — Kentucky senior Jennifer Humphrey and juniors Sarah Elliott and Samantha Mahoney each were named to the All-Southeastern Conference teams. Elliott and Mahoney were named to the second team by the league coaches and Elliott also received second-team honors from The Associated Press. Humphrey and Mahoney were named honorable mention by the AP.

**2007** — During halftime of the UK vs. Ole Miss game on Jan. 17, a special ceremony took place as 571 fallen soldiers from Kentucky were honored. Since its completion in 1950, Memorial Coliseum has borne the names of thousands of Kentucky's war dead. But the lists of names – framed and hung on the walls of the ramps along two sides of the coliseum – had not been updated since the end of the Vietnam War. Their names were added to those of their predecessors during the ceremony. A season-high 7,565 fans and family members of the fallen soldiers witnessed the special event in Memorial Coliseum.

**2007** — The Wildcats participated in their third straight postseason tournament with a third-round finish in the postseason WNIT. UK defeated Oakland and Ball State on the road before falling Wisconsin on the Badgers' home floor, 67-61.

**2007** — Jennifer Humphrey pulled down 964 career rebounds, becoming just the second Wildcat in UK history to chart over 900 rebounds in a career. Former All-American Valerie Still (1,525 rebounds) is the other Wildcat to accomplish the feat.

**2007** — UK ranked in the nation's top 20 in average attendance for the third consecutive season. The Cats were 14th nationally and second in the SEC, averaging a school-record 5,863 fans per game.

**2007** — After four seasons at the helm, Mickie DeMoss resigned April 11 as head coach. She compiled an overall record of 71-56 at Kentucky, including a 20-14 mark during the 2006-07 season.

**2007** — Former UK Hoops assistant coach Matthew Mitchell was named the seventh head coach of the Kentucky women's basketball team on April 23.

UK ranked in the nation's top 20 in average attendance (14th) for the third consecutive season. UK averaged a school-record 5,863 fans per game.

Matthew Mitchell was named the seventh head coach in UK Hoops history on April 23, 2007. He was welcomed by UK President Dr. Lee T. Todd, Jr. and Athletics Director Mitch Barnhart.





Chelsea Chowning became the first women's basketball player in school history to earn Academic All-America honors when she was named to the 2008 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America third team as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

**2008** — With Kentucky's impressive come-from-behind victory over No. 17/14 Georgia in Athens, Ga., on Jan. 31 the Wildcats charted their first win over the Lady Dawgs since 2005, their first win in Athens since 1994 and their first win over a ranked SEC opponent on the road since 1986. It also marked UK's first win over any ranked opponent on the road since 1997.

**2008** — Kentucky charted eight wins during regular season Southeastern Conference play, marking the second-most league wins in school history. In his first season as head coach of the Wildcats, Matthew Mitchell's eight SEC wins were the most conference wins by a first-year head coach in UK Hoops history.

**2008** — A school-record five Wildcats earned post-season SEC honors. Samantha Mahoney and Sarah Elliott were named to the second team, Victoria Dunlap and Amber Smith were selected to the All-Freshman Team and Chelsea Chowning was named the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year. Elliott and Mahoney also were named honorable mention All-SEC by *The Associated Press*.

**2008** — The Wildcats participated in a school-record fourth consecutive postseason tournament with a quarterfinals finish in the WNIT. UK received a

first-round bye and defeated Middle Tennessee and James Madison in Memorial Coliseum before narrowly falling to eventual champion Marquette in the quarterfinals in Lexington.

**2008** — Seniors Sarah Elliott and Samantha Mahoney played in 132 career game, breaking the school record of 129 games set by Jennifer Humphrey from 2003-07.

**2008** — Senior center Sarah Elliott became UK's all-time leading blocker. She holds the school record for blocks in a game (6), season (56), and career (195).

**2008** — UK ranked in the nation's top 25 and the SEC's top four in average attendance for the fifth consecutive season. The Cats were 23rd nationally and fourth in the SEC, averaging 4,765 fans per game.

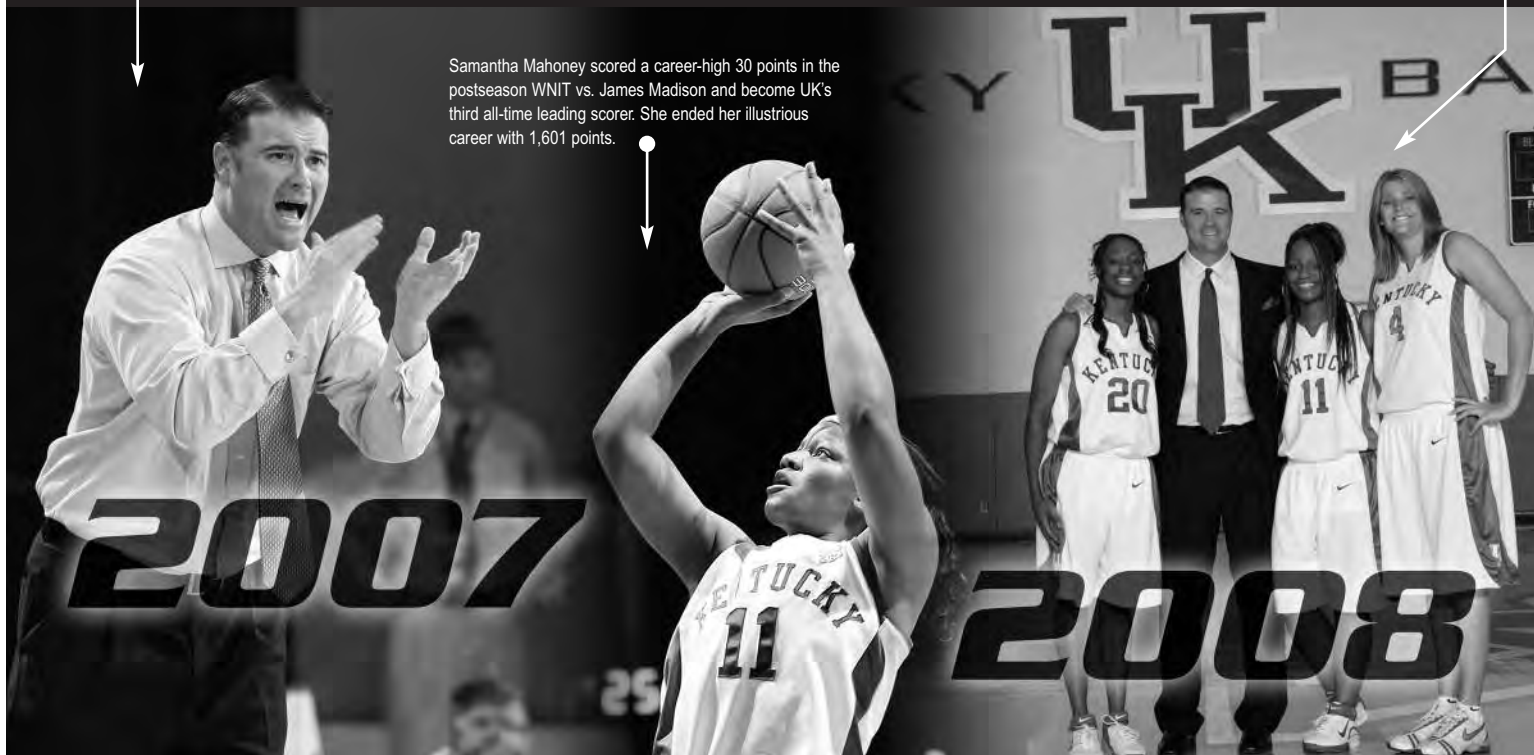
**2008** — Kentucky saw a season-high attendance of 8,335 vs. No. 9 LSU in Rupp Arena on Jan. 27. It marked the fifth-largest crowd to see a women's game in Rupp Arena and was the seventh-largest crowd overall at UK.

**2008** — Matthew Mitchell hired new assistant coaches Kyra Elzy and Matt Insell to replace Niya Butts (now the head coach at Arizona) and Vonn Read.

Coach Matthew Mitchell earned his first win as the head coach at Kentucky when the Wildcats defeated USC-Upstate in the season opener, 74-59, on Nov. 10, 2007.

Seniors Chanté Bowman, Sarah Elliott, and Samantha Mahoney will forever leave a mark on the program as they helped UK appear in four straight postseason tournaments and ink several "firsts" in UK Hoops history in their four-year career.

Samantha Mahoney scored a career-high 30 points in the postseason WNIT vs. James Madison and become UK's third all-time leading scorer. She ended her illustrious career with 1,601 points.

Senior Carly Ormerod was named the Most Valuable Player of the Courtyard LaGuardia Turkey Classic in 2008.

**2008** — UK won the Courtyard LaGuardia Turkey Classic title in Long Island, N.Y., for its 27th tournament title in school history. The Cats defeated Yale and Long Island for the title.

**2008** — Senior Carly Ormerod ended her illustrious career ranked on several career lists including, 3-pointers made (8th - 101), 3-pointers attempted (7th - 315), 3-pt field goal percentage (10th - .321) and assists per game (9th - 2.92).

**2009** — Sophomore Victoria Dunlap totaled a team-high 290 rebounds which ranks seventh on UK's single-season rebounding list.

**2009** — Kentucky's 10-point win (66-56) over No. 13/19 Tennessee on Feb. 19 was the third-highest margin of victory over the Lady Vols in the all-time series.

**2009** — Senior center Eleia Roddy recorded 12 double-doubles during her senior season. With seven consecutive double-doubles, she became just the fourth player in school history and first since Jocelyn Mills in 1991 to record double-doubles in four or more straight games. She and former UK All-American Valerie Still are the only players in school history to have recorded five or more consecutive double-doubles.

**2009** — Victoria Dunlap was named SEC Player of the Week after scoring 20 points and pulling down a career-high 15 rebounds vs. Miami (Ohio) on Jan. 3. She became just the sixth player in school history to join the 20/15 club and the first player to accomplish the feat since Jennifer Humphrey did so in an SEC Tournament first-round win against Arkansas in 2007.

**2009** — Senior center Eleia Roddy and sophomore forward Victoria Dunlap were named to the All-SEC second team by the league coaches.

**2009** — UK ranked in the nation's top 25 and the SEC's top four in average attendance for the sixth consecutive season. The Cats were 21st nationally and fourth in the SEC, averaging 4,423 fans per game.

**2009** — UK played every home game in Memorial Coliseum during the 2008-09 season. The Cats' 11 home wins were the most since the 2004-05 squad won 12 games in Memorial.

**2009** — The Wildcats made their school-record fifth consecutive postseason appearance with a second-round finish in the Women's Invitational Tournament.

**2009** — Matthew Mitchell hired new assistant coach Shalon Pillow to replace Wendy Palmer.

Matthew Mitchell became the first Kentucky head coach since Terry Hall in the 1980-81 and 1981-82 seasons to advance to a postseason tournament in the first two seasons at the helm.

Kentucky defeated No. 13/19 Tennessee, 66-56, on Feb. 19, 2009. It marked the Cats' first win over the Lady Vols in Memorial Coliseum in 23 years (Jan. 24, 1986).

UK was the only school in the SEC to boast two or more graduates on its roster (Carly Ormerod and Eleia Roddy) during the 2008-09 season. Ormerod graduated an entire year early while Roddy graduated a semester ahead of schedule.

**2009** — UK opened "Year Three" of the Matthew Mitchell era with the first game of the women's collegiate basketball season against first-time opponent Boston in Memorial Coliseum. The Cats went on to win 92-58, the first of a school-record tying 11 straight wins to start the 2009-10 season.

**2010** — UK defeated intrastate Louisville, 101-67, in front of the eighth-largest crowd in Memorial Coliseum. The Cats set the school record for free throws made (36) and attempted (52) in a game.

**2010** — Hardly on anyone's radar in the preseason, UK quickly caught the rapt attention of Wildcat fans and foes alike on its way to rolling up a school-record 28 wins, including 11 in conference play, reaching the finals of the SEC Tournament and advancing to the NCAA Regional finals.

**2010** — UK finished with a national ranking of ninth in the *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches Poll and 19th in the AP poll.

**2010** — UK defeated No. 18/19 LSU in Baton Rouge on Jan. 28, snapping a 16-game losing skid to LSU, including an eight-game losing streak in Baton Rouge.

**2010** — Junior Victoria Dunlap was named UK's first SEC Player of the Year by the AP and the league coaches. She also became just the second player in UK history to earn State Farm/WBCA (formerly Kodak) All-America honors, joining three-time All-American Valerie Still.

**2010** — Freshman guard A'dia Mathies was named UK's first SEC Freshman of the Year by the league coaches. She also earned Full-Court Press second team freshman All-America honors and was second team All-SEC as well as being a unanimous choice for the All-SEC Freshman team.

**2010** — UK ranked in the nation's top 25 and the SEC's top four in average attendance for the seventh consecutive season. The Cats were 14th nationally and second in the SEC, averaging 4,810 fans per game. A school-record 95,615 fans passed through the turnstiles.

**2010** — UK ranked among the top 20 in four different team categories in the NCAA statistical rankings, including third nationally in turnover margin (+7.33).

**2010** — The Wildcats made their school-record sixth consecutive postseason appearance with their seventh overall bid to the NCAA Tournament.



*Kentucky went on the road and upset No. 18/19 LSU in Baton Rouge, La., on Jan. 28 to snap a 16-game losing streak to the Lady Tigers. Guard Crystal Riley, who transferred from LSU, was impressive against her former school, scoring 11 points off the bench.*

UK, which received a No. 4 seed, advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight for just the second time in program history after upsetting top-seeded and ninth-ranked Nebraska in the Sweet 16.

The Cats went undefeated at home (17-0) for just the second time in school history. The 17 wins in Memorial Coliseum were a school record.

UK became just the second school in SEC history to sweep all three of the major SEC awards as Victoria Dunlap was SEC Player of the Year, A'dia Mathies was SEC Freshman of the Year and Matthew Mitchell was named SEC Coach of the Year. Tennessee did it prior to its 1998 national title.





**2010** — UK won the Lady Eagle Thanksgiving Classic title in Hattiesburg, Miss., for its 28th regular-season tournament title in school history. The Cats defeated host-team Southern Miss in the championship game. Sophomore Adia Mathies was elected the MVP while freshman Kastine Evans was named to the All-Classic team.

**2011** — Victoria Dunlap ended her career ranked in the top 10 of 14 career lists, including No. 1 in all-time games played and started (133) and No. 2 all-time in scoring (1,846), rebounding (1,099), blocks (178), steals (307), free-throws made (445) and free-throws attempted (714).

**2011** — Victoria Dunlap was the 11th overall pick in the WNBA Draft as she was selected in the first round by the Washington Mystics. She became the highest draft pick in school history and the first UK player taken in the draft since Shantia Owens in 2000.

**2011** — The Cats ranked 26th nationally and led the SEC in steals per game (11.0). UK charted double-digit steals in 20-of-34 games and were 17-3 when doing so. Victoria Dunlap led the way, ranking 17th nationally and topping the SEC with 3.1 steals per game.

**2011** — The Cats ranked fifth nationally and led the SEC in turnover margin at +7.6. UK forced a league-high 24.0 turnovers per game while only turning it over 16.4 times per game. The Cats averaged 24.4 points per game off turnovers compared to the opponents' 13.3 ppg.

**2011** — The Wildcats charted their second straight 20-win season, marking the first time UK accomplished that feat since the 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons.

**2011** — Kentucky finished 11th nationally in average attendance according to the official attendance rankings kept by the NCAA. It marked UK's highest ranking since leading the nation in attendance in 1982-83.

**2011** — UK finished second in the SEC regular season and was runner-up in the SEC Tournament for the second straight season.

**2011** — The Wildcats made their school-record seventh consecutive postseason appearance with a second-round finish in the NCAA Tournament. It marked UK's first back-to-back NCAA appearances since the 1982-83 seasons.

**2011** — The Cats finished No. 17 in the final AP poll & No. 16 in final USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll. It marked the highest final AP ranking since the Wildcats finished 11th in 1983.

**2012** — For the first time in three years, the Wildcats returned to Rupp Arena on Dec 8, 2011. The Wildcats looked pretty comfortable in their second home as they upset No. 6/5 Duke, 72-65, in front of a school-record 14,508 fans. Freshmen Bria Goss and Azia Bishop teamed up to combine for 31 points, 14 rebounds, four blocks and four steals on 15-24 shooting from the field. After defeating No. 10/11 Louisville just days before, the Duke win gave the Wildcats their first back-to-back wins over top 10 teams in school history.

The senior class of Victoria Dunlap, Carly Morrow and Amber Smith won 86 games in their careers, tying for the third-winningest class in school history.

Kentucky defeated Vanderbilt 80-71 on Feb. 20, 2011 in Nashville, Tenn., marking its first win in Memorial Gym since 1986.

Victoria Dunlap became the highest pick in the WNBA Draft in school history when she was selected in the first round as the 11th overall pick by the Washington Mystics.

## KENTUCKY WOMEN'S BASKETBALL 2012-13



**2012** — A'dia Mathies turned in one of the most impressive individual performances in UK Hoops history, netting a career-best 34 points to go along with nine rebounds, two assists, two blocks and two steals in Kentucky's 61-60 win over No. 6/7 Tennessee in Memorial Coliseum. Mathies hit the game winner with 4.2 seconds remaining to snap the Lady Vols' 36-game SEC winning streak.

**2012** — Kentucky defeated Mississippi State on Feb. 26, 76-40, giving the Wildcats their school-record 13th conference win and the outright SEC regular season championship, their first since 1982. UK charted an SEC-high 20 steals in the game,

while forcing 33 turnovers. Ten players scored at least two points, led by A'dia Mathies and Bernisha Pinkett with 13 points apiece.

**2012** — UK earned several postseason SEC honors as Matthew Mitchell was named SEC Coach of the Year by *The Associated Press*, A'dia Mathies was named SEC Player of the Year (Coaches & AP), Bria Goss was SEC Freshman of the Year (Coaches and AP) and Keyla Snowden was Co-6th Woman of the Year (Coaches). UK is the only SEC school to ever win three consecutive AP SEC Players of the Year honors. Victoria Dunlap was the AP SEC Player of the Year in 2010 and 2011, while Mathies was the 2012 AP SEC Player of the Year.

**2012** — Kentucky completed one of the most successful seasons in school history with a 28-7 overall record, including an 18-0 mark at home, and an appearance in the Elite Eight for the second time in three years. The Wildcats defeated McNeese State, Green Bay and Gonzaga before falling to No. 3 Connecticut in the NCAA Regional Finals. Samarie Walker was named to the All-Regional Tournament team after averaging 13.3 points and 10.8 rebounds in four NCAA Tournament games.

**2012** — The Cats finished No. 12 in the final AP poll & No. 8 in final *USA Today*/ESPN coaches' poll. It marked the highest final AP ranking since finishing 11th in 1983 and the highest final ranking in the coaches' poll in school history.

**2012** — UK's defense, dubbed "40 minutes of dread," forced a school-record and NCAA-high 939 turnovers. The Cats forced Arkansas-Pine Bluff into a school-record 49 miscues.

**2012** — UK hit a UK single-season and SEC-high 211 3-pointers, including 12 threes vs. Gonzaga, the most ever by the Cats in an NCAA Tournament game.

**2012** — UK tied the school record for wins at 28. The record was set in 2009-10. UK also won a school-record 13 SEC games. The previous record was 11 in 2009-10 and 2010-11.

**2012** — Matthew Mitchell hired new assistant coach Danielle Santos to replace Kyra Elzy.

**2012** — Matthew Mitchell was awarded a new seven-year contract in May.

A'dia Mathies became the 28th member of UK's 1,000-point club and was named UK's third straight SEC Player of the Year. UK is the only SEC school to ever win three consecutive AP SEC Players of the Year.

The Wildcats won the 2012 SEC regular season championship, their first in 30 years.

UK was the only SEC school to go undefeated at home in 2011-12. The Wildcats posted an impressive 18-0 home record and are now 48-2 over the last three seasons.

#### ELITE CAMP

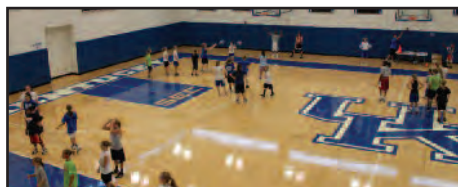
