Kentucky gymnastics has enjoyed a rich tradition of excellence both on and off the mat. Since the program began in 1981, the Wildcats have accumulated:

- Eight NCAA Individual Championship Titles
- Six All-America Honors
- Nine Individual Southeastern Conference Championships
- Two SEC Athlete of the Year Awards
- Two SEC Freshman of the Year Awards
- 102 Academic All-SEC selections
- One Freshman All-SEC team selection

Always a Crowd Favorite

- Kentucky has ranked in the nation's **top-12 in attendance** in each of the past five seasons.
- UK has recorded **top-10 final attendance** rankings in **four of the past five years.**
- Kentucky was 10th in the nation in attendance last season, averaging 2,421 fans per home meet.
- The Cats' annual Excite Night last season was the **seventh-most attended single gymnastics meet** in the country last season.

THE NCAA & SEC EXPERIENCE

The Southeastern Conference is widely regarded as the most dominating gymnastics conference in the NCAA.

Since the inaugural NCAA Championship in 1982, the SEC has had at least one team in all 27 national championship meets, with Florida being one of only two teams nationally (Utah is the other) to have appeared at all



19 contests prior to the Gators barely missing the cut in 2000. The SEC has also had at least one team finish in the Top-10 in the NCAA since 1982.

The Best of the Best

SEC NOTES

- Georgia won its ninth national championship and fourth in a row in 2008 and brought home the SEC's 13th overall title.
- In 1998 the SEC entered the record book as the only conference to sweep the top three spots at the NCAA meet (Georgia, Florida, Alabama).
- 2008 marked the 24th consecutive year that the SEC placed at least two teams in the final top five and the 16th consecutive year placing three in the top 10.
- 18 times in the past 24 years the SEC has placed at least four teams in the Top 10 at the NCAA meet, including 1991 1993 and 2008 when five teams were ranked.
- SEC leads all Division I conferences in NCAA Individual titles with 69.
- The SEC was awarded 34 first team All-American honors in 2008.

The Kentucky gymnastics team is synonymous with making postseason appearances. The Wildcats, who have made four consecutive NCAA Central Regional appearances, have qualified for regionals in 20 of the last 24 years.

In 1990, Amie Winn became UK's first regional all-around champion. Winn also earned the vault championship the same year. In 1994, Jenny Hansen took center stage as she claimed first place on the vault and floor to become the school's second regional all-around champion. Her 10.0 on the vault was only the third such score in the meet's history. She would go on to claim another vault championship in 1995 along with second-place finishes on the beam and in the all-around, as well as third place on the bars. In 1996, Hansen placed second on vault and floor.

Though the 2009 gymnasts are attempting to earn their first-ever trip to the NCAA Nationals as a team, several Wildcats have had individual success at the national level. In 2002, sophomore Aronda Primault became just the third gymnast in school history to earn All-America status.

FANTASTIC FACILITIES

of Kentucky Gymnastics

Since the program's inception, historic Memorial Coliseum has served as the home of the Kentucky gymnastics program. In addition, the Wildcats have their own exclusive practice facility in the Nutter Field House, so they never have to worry about sharing practice time with any other team.

The Kentucky gymnastics facilities at Memorial Coliseum have undergone a complete transformation. New gymnastics facilities include:



- A **new locker room** overlooking the Memorial Coliseum court.
- A new team room, exclusively for the gymnastics team, that features room to meet, study or relax, adjacent to the squad's locker room in Memorial Coliseum.
- New offices for the Kentucky gymnastics coaches overlooking the Memorial Coliseum floor.
- A brand-new state-of-the art athletic training room adjacent to the court and locker room.

MEMORIAL COLISEUM

Memorial Coliseum served as the host of the 1991 Southeastern Conference Gymnastics Championships and the 1997 NCAA Southeast Regional. It was also recently named the host site for the 2010 NCAA Central Regional Championships.



- The Wildcats host each of their meets in Memorial Coliseum, the home of the team since the program's inception in 1981.
- Attendance at home meets in Memorial Coliseum has ranked in the top-12 in the nation over the past five seasons, including top-10 attendance rankings in four of those years.

Home of Champions

- New in 2007, Memorial Coliseum features a brand-new state-of-the-art locker room, team room and coaches' offices.
- A new video board and scoreboard were installed in 2007 and a sound system was added in 2008.
- Completed in 1950 at a cost of \$3,995,000, the building serves as a memorial to the more than 10,000 Kentuckians who lost their lives in battle.
- The Coliseum covers an entire city block and has as much space as a seven-story office building.
- The building also houses the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS), a \$2.4 million facility which opened in 1998 and is fully dedicated to ensuring the academic success of the Wildcats.



STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

Emphasizing First-Class Development

UK OLYMPIC SPORT TRAINING PHILOSOPHY:

1. Development of core strength.

Imagine the body as a three-link chain with the head and arms being one link, the torso / trunk being the second link and the legs being the third link. If the core (trunk / torso) link is weak or inflexible, there is little chance of maximizing potential because all body movements stem from the core.

2. Train using ground-based, multi-joint lifting vs. machine (isolation) lifting.

Most athletes participate in stand up power sports using many muscle groups at once. The emphasis of training should be on total body athleticism and flexibility rather than having body weight supported by a machine and forcing isolation of just one muscle group. By incorporating ground-based lifts and exercises that focus on the total body, the athlete becomes more prepared to use his/her whole body in sport skills.

3. Train for power (which results in increased speed).

Power = (Mass Moved x Distance) / Time

The less time it takes to move a mass a certain distance, the higher the output. As seen in the above formula, an increase in speed of movement results in an increase in power.

4. Train athleticism.

Many factors are included in athleticism: strength, power, speed, agility, flexibility, coordination, fitness level and mental toughness are just a few. It is the goal to maximize an athlete's overall athleticism.

5. Train as a team.

When teams train together, it provides another opportunity to develop chemistry, teamwork, leadership skills and a competitive environment. Within this competitive environment, teams can work on mental toughness, attacking the weights and maintaining a positive attitude. By enabling athletes to work on these things as a team, it helps to promote a stronger sense of unity, therefore making it harder to "fold" under pressure.

6. Make workouts short and intense.

There are many philosophies on how to get athletes stronger, faster and more flexible. But, when combined, all these philosophies have the same three underlying principles:

- 1. The workouts should be highly organized;
- 2. The workouts should be short in duration;
- 3. The workouts should be extremely intense.

The following are recommendations for athletes concerning days and times of strength training (including warmups):

- In-season: 2-4 days /week; 25-45 mins /workout;
- · Post-season: 3-4 days /week; 45-60 mins /workout;
- Pre-season: 3-4 days /week; 30-60 mins /workout.

The Wildcats Start Off The Season In Style

The 24th annual UK Gymnastics Excite Night brings in excellent gymnastics talent, an amazing atmosphere and thrilling moments for many fans in Central Kentucky. This year will be no different and will be presented in Hollywood Style vs. Utah State.

ACADEMIC PRIORITY - CATS

Ohio Casulaty Center for Academic & Tutorial Services

The University of Kentucky has made a commitment to put the student-athlete at the heart of the program.

The cornerstone of that commitment lies in the academic success of the University's studentathletes. And at UK, that success stems from the resources within the Ohio Casualty Group's Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS).

UK opened CATS in 1981, the nation's first academic center dedicated exclusively to student-athletes. Over the years, as the services offered by CATS have grown, so did the need for additional space.

As a result, UK built a new facility - the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one-million dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group. The Ohio Casualty Center opened in 1998 at a total cost of \$2.4 million.

Much of the credit for UK's academic success goes to the Athletics Association's academic support system - the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, or simply, "CATS."





CATS, constructed in Memorial Coliseum, includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space more than double the size of the former CATS facility;
- a computer room housing 35 computers;
- a study area which accommodates 90-100 people;
- 24 tutoring rooms;
- a career development and life skills resource center:
- · a community outreach office; and
- · offices for the staff.

Certainly, a facility is a good start, but any program - especially in academics - is only as good as the people who run it. And UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system.

Bob Bradley, Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, oversees the CATS program. Bradley was named National Academic Advisor of the Year in 1989 and 1992. In 2000 he was selected as the CHAMPS Life Skills Coordinator of the Year by the NCAA Division I-A Athletic Directors Association.

CATS has a full-time staff of 11. In addition to Bradley, they are:

- Barb Deniston, Director of Academic Services;
- Mike Haley, Director of Advising Services;
- Michael Stone, Senior Academic Counselor
- Amy Craiglow, Jon Ross and Katrina Sally, Academic Counselors;
- Martina Martin, Lifeskills Coordinator;
- D'Ann Blankenship and Dustin Lewis, Staff Assistants.

CATS also employs seven graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the University and the surrounding community. UK has budgeted more than \$1,000,000 for the operation of CATS in the coming year.

"We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena," Bradley says. "The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals, and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete."

For the CATS staff, showing you care means more than helping athletes maintain eligibility, graduate, or win awards. The academics staff also prepares student-athletes for life after college with the Wildcat Career Development Program.

The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look to the future through a step-by-step process which includes:

- Mentoring and internships, which help determine career interests;
- career counseling;
- · resume writing; and
- forming a career plan.

The Wildcat Career Development Program works closely with the University's Career Planning and Placement Center in order to provide additional assistance when needed.

DR. LEE T. TODD, JR., PRESIDENT

ee T. Todd, Jr.
became the 11th president of the University of Kentucky on July 1, 2001, after serving as senior vice president of IBM's Lotus Development Corp. President Todd is the sixth UK alumnus to hold the presidency.

President Todd has concentrated his efforts and energies on helping his alma mater achieve a greater level of national prominence. He launched the Universi-

ty of Kentucky's Top 20 Business Plan in December 2005. The plan is a quantitative analysis highlighting what it will take for UK to achieve its state-mandated goal of building a Top 20 public research university. Widely hailed as the first business plan by a public university in the nation, UK's plan garnered widespread national attention. It has been featured by national media outlets and recognized by peer institutions, as several higher education leaders have visited UK's campus to learn more about the Business Plan approach.

He continues to champion UK's outreach efforts. President Todd launched a university-funded research program called the Common-

wealth Collaboratives. The initiative features 36 of UK's top research teams, who are focused on solving the intrinsic problems that have held the state back from reaching its full potential. It is part of UK's effort to ensure that its research hits the ground in Kentucky and changes lives throughout the Commonwealth.

President Todd has spearheaded an effort to revitalize health care in Kentucky. In June 2006, UK unveiled the Common-

wealth's Medical Campus of the Future, a multiphased project aimed at providing Kentuckians with cutting-edge, 21st century health care. As part of the revamped academic medical campus, UK will construct a new, one million square foot University of Kentucky Albert B. Chandler Hospital and a new College of Pharmacy.

President Todd is currently a member of the Board of Directors and Vice Chair of the Executive Committee for the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASUL-GC). He is President of the Southeastern Conference (SEC) Executive Committee. President Todd serves on the Equitable Resources Board of Directors and is chair of the Kentucky Council on Post-

secondary Education's STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) Task Force. He is chair of the National Consortium for Continuous Improvement in Higher Education's (NCCI) Leveraging Excellence Award selection panel. President Todd also is a member of the Business Higher Education Forum and the Council on Competitiveness.

He is married to the former Patricia Brantley, a UK graduate who earned her master's degree from Simmons College in Boston. They have two adult children, UK graduates Troy and Kathryn.

Hired July 15, 2002, Barnhart has made the desire for overall excellence the cornerstone of Wildcat Athletics. His decision to fully fund all 22 varsity sports has produced a wave of firsts in a number of programs, while also allowing UK to achieve at a consistently high level.

Numerous sports have reached never-beforeseen levels of success. Baseball won the school's first-ever Southeastern Conference title in 2006, following in the SEC championship footsteps of women's tennis, men's golf and men's basketball from 2005. Four Wildcat coaches earned SEC Coach of the Year honors in 2005-06.

The women's soccer and rifle teams added league titles in 2006-07, with conference Coach of the Year honors going to Warren Lipka and Harry Mullins, respectively.

Perhaps the biggest on-field turnaround besides baseball has been in football, where Rich Brooks has led the Wildcats to back-to-back bowl wins (2006 and 2007) for the first time in more than 50 years. Barnhart's support of Brooks and his staff has manifested itself in a string of wins over traditional football powers, including a victory over topranked LSU in October 2007.

Financially, Barnhart instructed his staff to seek out new revenue streams, and that resulted in a record \$80 million multimedia rights agreement with Host Communications (now IMG College). The additional resources allow UK to continue its commitment to its student-athletes, a commitment Barnhart takes personally. Athletics spends \$1.5 million annually on its nationally-renowned CATS Academic Center and each spring hosts the CATSPYs, an awards program designed to recognize the very best in UK Athletics.

Other initiatives begun under Barnhart's leadership include the Big Blue Caravan, which connects UK to its vast fan base, the UK Athletics Hall of Fame, which honors past greats across all sports, a revamping of UK's donor program that has resulted in record K Fund dollars, and a 10-year, \$10-million commitment to help fund the University's general scholarship program. UK also completed the Joe Craft Center, a \$30 million expansion of Memorial Coliseum that includes new practice and office space for a variety of sports.

Barnhart's connection to UK's student-athlete is evident by his personal interaction and commitment to provide all support services necessary to meet the needs of these students.

Barnhart arrived at Kentucky from Oregon State, where he served four successful years (1998-2002) as athletics director. Before his tenure at OSU, he worked at Tennessee for 12 years (1986-98); served as assistant executive director of the SMU Mustang Club (1983-86); regional director for the Duck Athletic Fund at Oregon (1983); and was an intern for the Aztec Athletic Foundation at San Diego State (1982-1983). Barnhart, 48, is a native of Kansas City, Kan. He received his bachelor degree from Ottawa University (Kansas) in 1981 and a masters in sports administration from Ohio University in 1982. He and his wife, the former Connie Brown, have three children, Kirby, 20, Blaire, 17, and Scott, 14.

2009 OUTLOOK

ead Coach Hajile "Mo" Mitchell returns for his sixth year at the front of the Kentucky gymnastics team after guiding the Wildcats to the school's longest winning streak in UK history in 2008. Mitchell led the Cats to the most wins in Kentucky history in 2006, and in 2007 directed the Cats to their best finish at the Southeastern Conference Championships in more than five years.

"Our expectation for this season is to have the best season UK has ever had. We have a lot of depth and talent on this team," Mitchell stated. "Our goal is to make the Super Six. I know we have to make nationals first, but I feel we have so strong of a team that we can go on to nationals and then catapult ourselves to the next level."

The Wildcats have finished ranked among the nation's top-25 in four consecutive seasons and have advanced to the NCAA Central Regional in each of those years. The highly competitive nature and strength of the SEC proves to be a true test every year for its members who all consistently appear in the top ranks. UK continues to add difficulty to its schedule outside of the conference with teams such as No. 15 Illinois, No. 22 West Virginia, and No. 29 Iowa.

"Strength of schedule is tough," Mitchell said. "We compete against all SEC schools twice, which is tough within itself. But we compete against the best in the country and we know that, and it's just going to make us better as a program."

That excitement certainly has generated a lot of interest in the Kentucky gymnastics community as the Wildcats ranked 10th in the nation in attendance last season, averaging 2,420 fans per meet. Kentucky has ranked in the top-12 nationally in attendance in each year of the Mitchell era. "We have the best fans in the nation," Mitchell said. "I know that just like us, they want to see us capitalize on our potential. It is exciting for them to see some of the hardest-working athletes in the country perform at their best."

The 2009 Kentucky gymnastics team adds four members to its roster, three freshmen and one sophomore transfer. Sophomore Jasmine

Minion comes from Utah State after a stand-out year with the Aggies. Minion competed at the NCAA Northeast Regionals as an individual on vault. Incoming freshmen include, Storey Morris (Tyler, Texas), Whitney Rose (Frisco, Texas), and Jennifer Taylor (Tulsa, Okla.).

"The newcomers bring some unity, fresh ideas and what young people always bring is vigor, energy and different outlooks," Mitchell stated. "They have all jumped right on board. They trust the system and their teammates, which is huge because if we have anchors, we're not going anywhere."

With the addition of Minion and the three freshmen, as well as 11 returnees, the Kentucky gymnastics team adds great depth to the roster. After a healthy off-season the Wildcats are prepared for any obstacles they face. There is strong competition among all the gymnasts for starting positions for every event, promoting motivation and individual improvement.

"The biggest thing we've noticed between the great teams and the good teams is depth," Mitchell said. "In a great team, the top dog may score a 9.9, but the sixth person will hit a 9.8. There's not a big difference and when you have depth, if someone goes down you're in a great position. The athletes know it may be their time tomorrow, and we feel this year we are sitting in that position."


Vault

Kentucky returns all six of the 2008 starting line-up from the No. 15 ranked vault team in the nation. The Cats were led by junior Emily Green who finished the year in the top-20 on vault with eight individual titles and a career high score of 9.925. The vault continues to be under the direction of second-year assistant coach Chuck Dickerson, who brings more than 25 years of coaching expertise to the event. His emphasis on training and conditioning will help keep the vault as one of the team's strong points in 2009.

Junior Hillary Ferguson proved herself as one of the team's leaders on vault during her sophomore campaign, adding five vault titles to her career total of seven in 2008 with a career best score of 9.9, tallied on two occasions.

Veteran Emilie Rymer will also be a strong vault contender as she averaged a 9.762 score, while tallying seven marks of 9.8 or better throughout 2008.

Despite competing on vault during only four meets last season, senior team captain Heather Hite is also a strong candidate for the starting line-up after pre-season workouts.



Sophomore transfer Minion is another contender for the vault line-up after hitting a 9.9 at the NCAA Northeast Regional and earning three of the top-five spots in the USU vault record book.

Adding to the depth chart of the vault lineup is freshman Texas native, Rose who notched scores of 9.8 and 9.9 during her high school career. She was also the 2008 Texas State and Region III

Uneven Bars

Although the Wildcats lost one of their strongest bars routines with the graduation of senior Crissy Cannon, UK brings plenty of fresh talent to fill the void.

"We have solid returners on bars," Mitchell said. "But, we also have a three-time national bar champion in freshman Jennifer Taylor. In addition to Taylor, we have girls who couldn't compete last year, but are now healthy and should make a major contribution to the team."

Rymer brought home two uneven bars titles and a career high 9.875 earned at Georgia. She looks to continue leading the Cats in the event after taking team top honors in eight of 15 meets, and a season average of 9.665 last year.

Senior Natalie Rubinstein looks to return to the Kentucky uneven bars line-up after sitting out in 2008. She has the potential to be a strong competitor in the event, as she was UK's second-best athlete on the bars in 2006 and averaged a 9.778 in two meets in 2007.

"If we can get her back on bars, Natalie can produce a phenomenal routine," Mitchell stated.

Balance Beam

Traditionally one of the toughest events for teams across the nation, the balance beam was again a strong event for Kentucky gymnastics. With the direction of assistant coach Jackie McCarter, the Cats finished 15th in the country on beam.

UK recorded five of the top team scores in school history as well as etching nine individual marks into the record books. The Cats' leading performer on beam is Hite who holds 19 career titles, with 11 on the balance beam, four of those coming in 2008. In 2007, Hite became the first Wildcat to tally a 9.95 on the beam since 13-time All-America selection Jenny Hansen recorded the high score twice during her illustrious career. Hite is seeking additions to her résumé of high achievements after notching 9.925 twice in '08 and being ranked nationally at No. 12.

Green looks to also be in the starting line-up for Kentucky after hitting a career high 9.9 against Ohio State.



"Beam is generally where you win and lose a lot of meets," Mitchell said. "We expect to do well on the beam and win a lot of meets. We're very fortunate to have Jackie in charge of making sure our team is together on beam. I don't think too many coaches across the country can compete with her ability and accomplishments as a beam coach."

Floor Exercise

The Wildcats had an explosive season in the floor exercise ending the year ranked No. 11 in the nation, maintaining a top-20 position throughout 2008.

Kentucky returns the entire starting lineup, including junior Ferguson who took team top honors in eight of 15 meets, earning five floor titles, and tallying seven scores of 9.85 or better. Ferguson also captured conference honors in March and finished out the season ranked in the top-20 nationally.

This year sees the return of Hite and Green who have both upped the difficulty of their routines. Rymer was another consistent performer on floor for the Cats, competing in every meet with a season average of 9.753.

The floor exercise has consistently been a high scorer for Kentucky with six team totals and eight individual marks from last year in the school record books.

"We feel floor is the event we want to slam the door on," Mitchell said. "It gets the fans excited and it is the last event at all of our home

> meets. We want to put on a strong show on floor because we want the fans to leave the arena wanting more."

All-Around

Last season Kentucky had four allaround competitors emerge. Ferguson, Green, Rymer and freshman Andrea Mitchell each competed in all four events.

In her rookie season, Mitchell was listed as an all-around performer in nine meets and captured her first collegiate event title for the all-around at Ohio State with a 39.150. She also earned an uneven bars title with a 9.875 and was named to the All-SEC Freshman team.

Ferguson took home 10 titles in four of five events while Green secured 11 on three of five. Rymer tallied seven top honors in three events, four of which were all-around titles. She is also the returning leader for the Cats with a 38.832 season average and career high 39.300.

Morris has shown potential to appear in all four events, as she was the Texas state and regional allaround champion.

HEAD COACH HAJILE "MO" MITCHELL

ead coach Hajile "Mo" Mitchell has become a leader in landmarks for the Kentucky gymnastics team. Only six years has past since Mitchell acquired the Wildcat team, which he quickly re-established as a program that can compete on the national scene and in the demanding Southeastern Conference.

In 2008 Mitchell's Cats smashed multiple school records throughout the season and put several team and individual scores in the UK record books. The Wildcats also broke two Regional Qualifying Score (RQS) records and had Kentucky's longest winning streak of eight meets.

Last season had the Blue and White ranked No. 21 nationally, the third consecutive year

Mitchell's teams have been ranked in the GymInfo Top 25 polls. Kentucky also finished 11th in the country on floor, the team's best finish in school history. The Cats earned a final ranking of No. 15 on both the vault and balance beam.

Not only has Mitchell created a winning program, but he has established an exciting brand of gymnastics for fans to watch. Kentucky has made four uninterrupted NCAA Regional appearances and ranked in the nation's top-12 in attendance in each of his five seasons guiding the Cats, including top-10 attendance rankings in four of those seasons.

Off the mat, eight of Mitchell's student-athletes were named to the SEC Academic Honor

Roll, and one earned SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll distinctions.

In 2006, Mitchell directed UK to its first winning season in 13 years and just the second in the program's history. During the year, the Wildcats posted two of the top-four team totals in school annals. Three of the top four overall have come in the past three seasons as Kentucky has continued to ascend to national prominence.

The Wildcats also scored one of the biggest wins in school history when they knocked off ninth-ranked Auburn. Along with the success came a second consecutive NCAA Regional appearance, at which UK finished fourth, and NCAA Central Region Coach of the Year hon-





ors for Mitchell. The 2005 campaign was another building block in Kentucky's step-up into national prominence. The year saw the Cats enjoy their highest win total in over a decade, an NCAA Regional appearance and a top national ranking of No. 10. Outside of the gym,

Mitchell's gymnasts continued to perform at a high level in the classroom, earning a 3.39 team GPA. Of the team's 16 gymnasts on the roster, 13 earned a GPA of 3.0 or higher, including seven above a 3.5. Throughout his coaching career, Mitchell has been determined to guide his gymnasts to their top performing level. He coached numerous state, regional and national team and individual champions. Two athletes under his coaching direction won the prestigious McDonald's Cup award.

"Coaching at different levels gives me the opportunity to see gymnasts' careers progress," Mitchell said. "It's wonderful to see the determination and growth of your athletes pay off for them."

Mitchell not only pushes his athletes to excel in the gym, but in the classroom and social settings as well.

"I love college, especially the academic part of it," Mitchell said. "I'm in a perfect world because I love academia and I love working with athletes and helping them reach their full potential. I couldn't ask for anything better."

A native of Chicago, Mitchell attended the University of Houston and graduated in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in Engineering Technology-Piping and Design. As an assistant under legendary coach Leah Little, he made a name for himself as a phenomenal coach and recruiter. He was twice named NCAA Regional Assistant Coach of the Year (1999 & 2002). Mitchell, who has 25 years of coaching experience, started coaching at Lansing (Mich.) Eastern High School, when he was a sophomore in college.

After a year as an assistant coach, Mitchell was promoted to head coach and took the team to its first conference championship. His next assignment was at a private club, the Capital City Kips, in Lansing. He coached there for two years until moving to Texas to work briefly with the highly regarded Bela Karolyi.

"It was pretty intense and eye-opening," Mitchell said of his experience with the former Olympic coach. "It's an experience I don't regret because I learned a lot, but it wasn't the route I wanted to take as far as how I wanted to train athletes."

Mitchell then spent eight years coaching at Gizi Gymnastics in Houston before joining Little's staff in 1997. He had become acquainted with Coach Little several years before and helped her with summer gymnastics camps in the Bluegrass.

Q & A WITH COACH MITCHELL

What kind of schedule is planned for 2009? "Our schedule is tough. We're talking all SEC schools which we compete against at least twice which is tough within itself. Then we go to West Virginia who is a difficult opponent and we have lowa who ranked in the top-25 last year. We compete against the best in the country and we know that. it's just going to make us better and our goal is to go out there and beat some of those teams. We need to beat the team's we're supposed to beat, and really hang in there with some of the ones we're not, and try to knock off some of those as well. If we can do that, we'll have a great season."

What is it like competing against teams you have never seen before?

"I think the unknown is always the scariest. We'll do a little research on the teams and I think more than anything, the girls aren't worried about the team as much as the environment. Because in our sport, rules and regulations in environments are pretty much going to be the same. But gymnastics is gymnastics, the vault is going to be the same, the floor is going to be the same, the bars are going to be the same. We just have to make sure that we do things the right way."

How important is it to start the year with Excite Night?

"It is so important because it is all the girls talk about is the first meet of the year. We love the fact that we have such a large crowd. Excite Night is so exciting for them because like any athlete you like to have people appreciate what you're doing. When they see six or seven thousand people in the stands and know they are there to see them and appreciate what they're doing, it is just so huge for them because they can feed off the crowd. When the crowd is behind us and they're tumbling or doing their vault, they feel like they're floating, like it's so effortless."

Under Little's tutelage, Mitchell refined his skills and learned valuable lessons about coaching at the collegiate level.

> "I was pretty good at dealing with upper-level gymnasts (at the club level) before coming here, and that's what made my transition a lot easier."

> > Mitchell said. "But, I also learned that you really have to be willing to listen, and it's not just about gymnastics. You have to be a role model, counselor, and tutor among other personas to be successful."

Mitchell is married to Lynn Mitchell of Cincinnati, Ohio. The couple recently welcomed the addition of a baby boy, Xavier Alexander on April 28th 2008. The family resides in Richmond, Ky.



ASSISTANT COACH JACKIE McCARTER

ackie McCarter enters her fourth season as an assistant coach at Kentucky. She is primarily responsible for the team's performance on the balance beam as well as assisting with floor exercises.

Under McCarter's tutelage, the Wildcats have shown remarkable improvement on the balance beam. In her first season with the Wildcats, UK's team average on the balance beam rose .716 from the previous season. McCarter's techniques and demand for attention to detail have also added improvement to the floor routines. Junior Hillary Ferguson earned top-20 status in 2008 on the floor exercise scoring a 9.85 or better on eight separate occasions and claiming five event titles.

McCarter has also helped shape Kentucky's lead balance beam gymnast senior Heather Hite into a top-20 competitor. Hite ended 2008 ranked No. 12 in the nation on the beam. In the

three years Hite has attended UK, she has earned 19 event titles, 11 on the beam. In 2007 Hite became the first Wildcat to record a 9.95 since 13-time All-America selection Jenny Hansen scored a 9.95 on beam twice during her illustrious career.

"Jackie has come a long way in distinguishing between the elite world of gymnastics and the college arena," head coach Mo Mitchell said. "She is primarily responsible for our balance beam team. Her job is to keep us on and competitive on the beam. Jackie's expertise are among the best in the country."

Prior to joining the Kentucky staff, McCarter was one of the most sought after gymnastics coaches and consultants in the nation for more than 25 years. She coached a number of Olympic competitors, including gold medalist Dominique Moceanu, silver medalist Mohini Bhardwah and bronze medalist Kim Zmeskal.

Among McCarter's other pupils was Ellen Diaz, the first Puerto Rican Olympic gymnast and the youngest competitor Puerto Rico has ever sent to the Olympic games. She also worked with former Wildcat Alison Sarruci and current member Hillary Ferguson prior to their signings with Kentucky.

In the mid-1990's McCarter also had the opportunity to work with Svetlana Bogishkaya, who had previously won three gold and five total medals in her Olympic career.

McCarter spent 11 years over two stints working with legendary coach Bela Karoli, including the two years prior to the 1996 Olympic Games, in which the U.S. team, led by Karoli, won the team all-around gold medal.

After her time at Karoli's gym, she followed Alexander Alexandrov to Brown's Gymnastics for nearly eight years, building a national reputation as a routing beam and floor choreographer.

McCarter was born in Arcadia, Calif., and moved around as a child before eventually graduating from Rex Putnam High School in Milwaukee, Ore., just outside of Portland. From there, she attended Cal State-Fullerton before beginning her coaching career.

McCarter began coaching at S.C.A.T.S Gym in Huntington Beach, Calif. She spent two years there before moving to Houston to coach at Karoli's.

McCarter is married to Blair McCarter III. The couple has two children, their son Blair (IV) is 15 and daughter Emily is 13.



ASSISTANT COACH CHUCK DICKERSON



Thuck Dickerson, now beginning his second year with the Kentucky gymnastics program, has helped oversee UK's success since his inaugural year in 2008.

"Chuck has been a breath of fresh air to the gymnastics team," head coach Mo Mitchell said. "He is well respected and his passion for success is incredible. I am very comfortable with everything he brings to the program. Chuck handles the responsibilities of the vault team and shares the responsibilities of the bars team. He is definitely the catalyst that we needed to complete our staff."

Last season Dickerson helped coach sophomore Emily Green to a top-20 ranking on the vault. Green earned four scores of 9.9 or better on the event with a career high of 9.925 and

ended the season with a total of eight vault titles. Dickerson's expertise on the event also led the Cats to a No. 15 national ranking.

With over 25 years of coaching experience, Dickerson is able to assist the Wildcats in recruiting top talent. In 2008, Dickerson helped sign fellow Tyler, Texas, native Storey Morris, Whitney Rose of Frisco, Texas, the 2008 Texas State vault and all-around champion and three-time national bar champion Jennifer Taylor of Tulsa, Okla.

Since 2004, the Tyler, Texas, native had been working in his hometown at Texas East Gymnastics where he coached current UK freshman gymnast, Storey Morris. In both 2006 and 2007, he qualified a gymnast for the USA Championships to go along with his numerous national

qualifiers in his four-year span.

Prior to his time at Texas East, Dickerson spent eight years at Rowland/Ballard Gymnastics in Kingwood, Texas. While there, he had seven athletes receive Division I scholarships and sent 15 on to the national championships. In 2002, he earned his greatest honor when voted the Texas USA Gymnastics Coach of the Year by his peers.

Early on in his career, Dickerson spent 10 years working under famed coach Bela Karolyi. In his coaching career, he has coached three national champions.

2008 SEASON IN REVIEW

n 2008 the Wildcat gymnastics team catapulted themselves into the University of Kentucky record books, breaking multiple program records. The Cats earned two record Regional Qualifying Scores (RQS) and set the bar for Kentucky's longest winning streak. The Wildcats broke the school's overall RQS

The Wildcats broke the school's overall RQS record with six totals exceeding 195.00. The Wildcats posted a 195.395 for an overall RQS tally, crushing 2007's total by .640. Kentucky also broke the floor exercise RQS record totaling 49.160, compared with last year's score of 49.125. With record breaking totals, the Cats catapulted themselves into the top-20 rankings.

Kentucky had an eight-meet win streak in March, which helped bring them from the No. 33 spot to No. 19. The Wildcats finished the season at No. 21, tying the team's best final ranking since Mitchell began his coaching career at UK in 2004. Kentucky also received a No. 11 ranking on floor, the team's best finish in school history. The Cats excelled individually earning an impressive 39 titles and putting 18 team and 19 individual marks in the school's record books. Junior Heather Hite led the Cats with 19 career titles while sophomores Hillary Ferguson and Emily Green each led UK in season titles, each with 10.

UK ranked in preseason polls at No. 24 but jumped to No. 18 after their 24th Annual Excite Night against conference rival No.19 Auburn. UK ranked at the No. 5 spot on floor after their meet-winning performance. The Wildcats defeated the Tigers 193.450-191.950 for the program's fifth opener win in six seasons under Coach Mitchell.

The Wildcats returned home to face No. 3 Alabama for the second conference meet of the year. Hite won her third consecutive floor title with a 9.9 while freshman Mitchell performed in her first all-around.

The Cats headed south to Baton Rouge, La. for a meeting with the No. 7 LSU Tigers. Ferguson and Green took team top honors on vault with 9.85's and Mitchell and senior Crissy Cannon earned team highs on the uneven bars with 9.725's. Hite again excelled on beam and floor with a 9.675 and a 9.750, respectively.

UK hosted the No. 3 Florida Gators in just the third home meet of the season. Rymer hit season highs on the uneven bars, 9.8, the balance beam, 9.7, and the all-around, 39.025. Her uneven bar score tied her for third place overall with Florida's Ashley Reed. Rymer's vault score of 9.775 tied her season high.

In the first of two consecutive road meets, Kentucky headed to Fayetteville, Ark. to meet the No. 10 Razorbacks. Three titles were earned by UK, vault, beam, and floor. Green took her third vault title with a 9.9 and Rymer took her first career beam title with a 9.875. Ferguson won the floor exercise with a 9.9. The team's beam score was Coach Mitchell's third best in his career at UK. The Big Blue was edged out by the Lady Backs by half a point, 195.675-195.175, at the time a season high for the Cats.


Finishing out conference competition, Kentucky went to Athens, Ga. to meet the No. 1 Georgia Bulldogs in front of a sell-out crowd of 10, 224. Per usual, UK's best event of the meet was the floor exercise, hitting a 49.175, led by Ferguson, scoring a career high 9.925. Green led

the Wildcats for the sixth time on vault with a 9.875 while Rymer took team top honors on bars with a 9.875 and Hite led UK on the beam, 9.825. All three all-arounders, Green, Ferguson, and Rymer tallied 39.150's.

Kentucky returned to the bluegrass for a twomeet home stand. The Cats faced the No. 15 Nebraska Huskers in the Pink Meet. Senior Cannon earned her first career title with a 9.8 on the uneven bars. UK was clipped by the Huskers, falling short one tenth of a point, 194.350-194.250. Ferguson earned a career high on vault with a 9.9 and continuing to reach highs was Hite with a 9.9 on floor, tying her top season score.

Marking the last home meet of the season and final performance in Memorial Coliseum for the Kentucky seniors, was a Senior Night trimeet against No. 18 Arizona and Western Michigan. The night would be one to remember for all classes. Ferguson took two of the night's titles on vault, 9.875, and floor with her second score of 9.925. Green tied Ferguson on vault with 9.875 and won the all-around title with a career high of 39.350. Honored during Senior Night were Crissy Cannon, Kristen O'Shields, and Amanda Coates. The trio was a part of the 2006 team which posted the most wins in school history. UK's season high mark of 195.925 was enough to defeat Arizona for the first time in program history. Arizona posted a 195.625 and WMU notched a 191.325. The Cats also posted a season high score on beam of 49.225. The floor routine squad, which earned a 49.275, was later recognized by the university at the annual CATSPY Award show for Female





Play of the Year. Kentucky's win would mark the beginning of the record-breaking win streak for the Cats.

Two days later the Blue and White headed north to visit the No. 26 Ohio State Buckeyes. The momentum from a huge home win propelled the Cats to their third upset of the season, defeating the Bucks, 195.275-193.400. Kentucky took home a total of five titles. Ferguson earned her first uneven bars title by sticking a 9.875, tying OSU's Kaylan Clevinger for the top honor. Green then continued her domination of the vault, notching a 9.875 for her fifth career vault title. However, after the first two rotations, the Cats trailed Ohio State by .15. Kentucky, ranked No. 14 on the floor exercise, grabbed the lead after solid performances on the mat. Scoring two-tenths higher than the Buckeyes on the event, the Wildcats concluded the night on what would be the team's best event of the evening. Led by beam title winner Hite, Kentucky tallied a 49.125 for the win. Hite earned a 9.925, tying her season high followed by Green and Mitchell, each with career high scores of 9.9 and 9.875, respectively. Mitchell also took home her first title in the all-around along with teammate Rymer, both notching scores of 39.150.

Following UK's stellar performance against Arizona, WMU, and Ohio State, sophomore Ferguson was named SEC Athlete of the Week for week nine. The Kentucky native earned three titles during those meets, on floor (9.925), vault (9.875), and bars (9.875). She earned a career high all-around mark of 39.325 in the tri-meet while leading the Cats to a season high floor total of 49.275, a score which ranks among the school's top five overall records.

The Kentucky gymnastics team also took a giant leap in the rankings after its three consecutive wins. Previously ranked at No. 33, the Wildcats made a 10-spot jump to a top-25 ranking at No. 23. Green remained in the top-25

individually on vault at the No. 18 position.

UK took a trip to the south for a quad meet hosted by Texas Woman's University in Denton, Texas, and a dual meet with Centenary College in Shreveport, La. Also attending the quad were Utah State and Centenary.

Despite a rough start on beam, the Cats jumped back into the competition with the team's best event, the floor exercise. Scoring a 2008 season high mark of 49.325, the Cats were behind only Utah State by .55. Green and Ferguson helped push UK to the top with two scores of 9.9, earning the floor titles. Kentucky led the meet on vault as well with a 49.125 and a score of 9.925 by Green, earning her sixth career vault title. Big Blue received the score they needed to claim first place, jumping ahead of Utah State by half a tenth. Kentucky wrapped up the event with solid scores on the bars, being led by SEC Athlete of the Week Ferguson who landed a 9.825. The Wildcats scored a 195.200 for the top position and added three more wins to their resume.

In an attempt to tie the Kentucky win-streak record of seven consecutive wins from 2006, the Cats saw Centenary again, but this time on the Ladies' home equipment in Shreveport, La. With a score that broke into the top-10 totals in Kentucky history, the Wildcats gained the team's seventh win. Tying their 2008 season high vault score of 49.125 and obtaining a 2008 season high on bars of 49.100, UK tallied a 195.975, defeating Centenary's 192.275. Big Blue ended the night with six Wildcat titles. Ferguson and Green each scored a 9.9 on vault, Hite took her 10th career beam title with a 9.925, Mitchell took her second career title with a career high 9.875 on the uneven bars, freshman Madison Snowden brought in her first title with a career high 9.875 for her floor routine, and Rymer added her fourth all-around title with a 39.300.

Rounding out the regular competition season was a meet at Bowling Green. Seven more Kentucky titles were earned and a record broken. Ferguson earned her third vault and seventh



career floor title with scores of 9.850 and 9.875, respectively. Green took home her eighth season and career vault title with 9.850 matching Ferguson, and notched her first season beam title with a 9.875. Hite matched Green's score on beam for her nineteenth career title. Rymer wrapped up the UK success taking her second career uneven bars title holding a 9.8 and winning the all-around title with a 39.225 for her 10th career title. The win against the Falcons marked the eighth consecutive win for the Blue and White, breaking the school record.

The Kentucky gymnastics team went to Baton Rouge, La. to participate in the NCAA Central Regional Championship hosted by LSU. The Wildcats took a 194.950 to finish fifth, with a .175 point difference between the Cats and third place, taken by Ohio State at 195.125. LSU took first place by edging out Stanford, 197.625-197.525. On the team's best event of the night, vault, the Cats crept closer to the No. 3 spot. Kentucky stuck a 49.100 with three 9.850's by Mitchell, and Rymer and Ferguson.

Mitchell's tally was a career high, beating out her previous mark of 9.825. Rymer tied her season high with the score. Ending the night for Kentucky was the uneven bar event. Taking team top honors was Cannon. In the final meet of her career, Cannon stuck a solid 9.825, tying her career high.

"They fought hard," Head Coach Mo Mitchell stated. "Unfortunately we dug ourselves a hole in the first event. We needed more determination. But mark my words, we will go to Nationals next year, we will." In the all-around, Ferguson took team top honors for Kentucky. The all-around champion was LSU's Clare-Kearney with an almost perfect 39.825.


