A FULL ROTATION

What you need to know about the Spartans

- Michigan State opens the season at the Kentucky Bluegrass Invitational, taking on the host Wildcats (No. 15), Little Rock (RV), and IUPUI. Friday's match against UK will air live on the SEC Network, streaming live on WatchESPN.

- The Spartans appeared at No. 19 in the AVCA pre-season coaches poll after finishing 2014 among the teams receiving votes. MSU is one of six Big Ten teams to appear in the top 20, and one of nine that received votes in the survey.

- MSU will play a challenging pre-Big Ten schedule. Non-conference opponents North Carolina (No. 7), Kentucky (No. 15) and Duke (No. 25) all appear in the preseason AVCA Top-25, and first-weekend opponent Arkansas-Little Rock received votes. Eight of MSU's 11 non-conference opponents won 20 or more games in 2014, with five advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

- MSU returns 12 letterwinners and four starters for the 2015 season. The Spartans are coming off a 2014 campaign in which they finished with a 19-14 overall record, and went 11-9 in Big Ten play. MSU made its 17th overall NCAA Tournament appearance and earned its fourth consecutive at-large bid to the Championship, the second-longest streak in school history.

- The Spartans have won seven of their last nine non-conference tournaments over the last three seasons, including the 2014 UAB/Samford Invitational.

- Three returning All-Americans are in the Spartan lineup: junior **Chloe Reinig**, freshman **Rachel Minarick**, and junior transfer from Marquette **Autumn Bailey**. In addition, **Allyssah Fitterer** was an All-North Region Honorable Mention selection.

- The Spartans appeared at No. 19 in the AVCA pre-season coaches poll after finishing 2014 among the teams receiving votes.
- MSU is one of six Big Ten teams to appear in the AVCA top 20, and one of nine that received votes in the survey. Two-time defending National Champion Penn State (No. 1), Nebraska and Wisconsin (tied for No. 5), and Illinois (No. 8) are the B1G teams which start the year in the top 10, while Ohio State (No. 14) and MSU round out the top 20. Purdue, Minnesota, and Michigan all received votes in the poll.
- The Spartans will play a challenging pre-Big Ten schedule. Non-conference opponents North Carolina (No. 7), Kentucky (No. 15) and Duke (No. 25) all appear in the preseason AVCA Top-25, and first-weekend opponent Arkansas-Little Rock received votes. Eight of MSU's 11 non-conference opponents won 20 or more games in 2014, with five advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

- The Spartans have won seven of their last nine non-conference tournaments over the last three seasons, including the 2014 UAB/Samford Invitational.
- MSU is one of just four schools to finish .500 or better in Big Ten play over the last four seasons, along with Penn State, Nebraska, and Purdue.
- In the final statistics of the 2014 season, MSU ranked 26th in the nation in blocks per set (2.68), and 27th in total blocks (318). Meanwhile, the Spartans limited opponents to a .168 hitting percentage, 41st nationally.
- Michigan State ranked ninth in the country in total attendance (43,918), which shattered MSU's single-season attendance record for the second-straight season. MSU's average attendance of 2,928 was 11th nationally.
- MSU welcomes some new faces on the sideline, as three-time former captain **Kristen Kelsay** joins the staff as an assistant coach, and UCSB graduate **Evan Licht** is the new volunteer assistant coach. **Mike Gawlik**, who has been on **Cathy George's** staff since her hiring in 2005 was elevated to the position of associate head coach last winter.

PLAYER NOTES

- The Spartans had four players earn AVCA All-North Region honors in 2014, the most in a single season in program history. **Kori Moster** was a First Team selection for the third straight season, while **Chloe Reinig** and **Rachel Minarick** earned the same honor for the first time. **Allysah Fitterer** was an Honorable Mention All-North Region pick.
- Moster, Reinig, and Minarick each earned AVCA Honorable Mention All-America honors, the second straight season that the program had three honorees.
- **Chloe Reinig** is a 2015 pre-season All-Big Ten selection, and was a First Team All-Big Ten for the first time in her career as a sophomore. She ranked fourth in the Big Ten in kills (3.70 per set) and fifth in points (4.14) a year ago, while hitting .233 and averaging 0.91 digs and 0.70 blocks per set.
- Sophomore **Rachel Minarick** was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman team last winter, giving MSU an All-Freshman team selection for the third-straight year (the longest streak in program history.) Minarick was fifth a year ago in the Big Ten with 10.24 assists per set, and first among B1G freshmen. Her 10.24 assists is fifth-best for a freshman all-time at MSU, as is her 1,157 total assists. She also contributed 1.16 kills per set, hit .384, with 1.95 digs and 0.58 blocks per frame.
- Junior **Autumn Bailey** joins the Spartan roster for this fall. The reigning BIG EAST Player of the Year was an Honorable Mention AVCA All-America in both 2013 and 2014 at Marquette. She was a club volleyball teammate of **Allysah Fitterer**, where the pair won a Canadian U-18 National Championship as members of Defensa in 2013. In 2014, Bailey recorded a Marquette-record 576 kills, while totaling 405 digs, which ranked second on the team, and 46 service aces, which led the team. She also recorded 21 double-doubles on the season.
- **Halle Peterson** will serve as the captain of the Spartans this season. She was a member of the 14-player Big Ten Foreign Tour of Europe in the summer of 2015. Peterson appeared in just 11 matches last season after being injured in a match in early September at Oregon.
- Junior **Allysah Fitterer** earned AVCA All-North Region Honorable Mention kudos last fall, and was a selection to the NCAA All-Regional team as a freshman. Fitterer played in 117 of a possible 119 sets in 2014, leading the team with a .277 hitting percentage, posting 2.73 kills, 0.89 blocks, and 0.56 digs per set.
- Sophomore **Alyssa Garvelink** spent time with the U.S. Collegiate National Team in New Orleans in June, and won a gold medal with Team Blue. Garvelink was a two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week in 2014, posting 122 total blocks (fourth all-time by a freshman in MSU history). In the freshman record book, Garvelink's 110 block assists is fourth, and her 1.06 blocks per set ranks seventh.
- Senior **Kristen Muir** and sophomore **Abby Monson** are vying to step into the libero role with the graduation of three-time All-American Kori Moster. Muir appeared in all 33 matches in 2014, and averaged 1.96 digs per set while ranking third on the team with 21 service aces. Monson appeared in 21 matches, averaging 0.86 digs per set and also had six service aces.
- MSU played its Green & White intra-squad scrimmage last Saturday, as the White team took a 2-1 victory. Bailey had a double-double with 20 kills, 11, digs, and three blocks, hitting .457 on the day, Monson contributed a match-best 17 digs, adding three assists, while Minarick had 28 assists and four kills. Fitterer had nine kills and a match-high five blocks for the White squad.

Redshirt sophomore **Brooke Kranda** led all Green scorers with 10 kills, adding three blocks and hitting .500. **Holly Toliver** contributed a seven kills, adding a match-high five blocks and adding six digs and three service aces. Garvelink contributed seven kills and four blocks. Peterson had 26 assists, with five digs and a block; Muir contributed 11 digs.

CATHY GEORGE

Head Coach • 11th season at MSU (29th overall) • Illinois State '85



Before arriving at Michigan State, Cathy George had already established herself as one of the more well-respected coaches in the sport. Her decade-long tenure on the Spartan sideline has seen the Spartans ascend to one of the elite programs in the country. With four straight NCAA appearances under her belt (including two trips to the sweet 16), two returning All-Americans, and back-to-back top-10 recruiting classes dotting her current roster, George is positioning MSU for another strong run in 2015.

George currently boasts a career record of 553-364, and is 188-153 while at MSU. She ranks 29th among active coaches for total wins in NCAA Division I volleyball, and is ranked among the top 80 coaches all-time with a career .603 winning percentage.

The Spartans boasted three Honorable Mention All-America selections in 2014 (tying it's program best), and pushed top overall seed Stanford before falling in four sets to the Cardinal in the NCAA Tournament. It was the fourth straight NCAA bid for MSU, only the second time in school history that the Spartans have accomplished that feat. MSU's streak of four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances is the third-longest active streak in the Big Ten, behind Penn State and Nebraska; in addition, only four Big Ten schools have finished .500 or better in Conference play in each of the last four seasons: MSU, Nebraska, Penn State, and Purdue. During the season, senior libero Kori Moster cemented her spot in Big Ten volleyball lore, finishing third all-time in Big Ten history in career digs, while sophomore Chloe Reinig and freshman Rachel Minarick also were honored with post-season honors by both the AVCA and the Big Ten.

Every season, George's teams have attracted rapidly-growing crowds to Jenison Field House, ranking in the top-25 in Division I attendance in each of the last 19 years. The Spartans ranked 11th nationally in average attendance, (2,928), as 43,918 fans took in a volleyball match at Jenison Field House in 2014, the ninth highest total among Division I programs. MSU has now shattered its home attendance record three seasons in a row - in 2013, MSU had 43,368 fans over 15 home matches.

While the on-court success has continued to climb, the program has maintained its tradition of excellence in the classroom and community as well. George's players include 46 Academic All-Big Ten selections and 10 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars over nine seasons. In 2013, captain Kristen Kelsay was an Academic All-America selection, captured the Gwendolyn Norrell Community Service & Leadership Award at the Student-Athlete Support Services Academic Gala for excelling in the field of community service and outreach, then won both the Chester Brewer Leadership Award as well as the Dr. James Feurig Achievement Award (honoring dedication, honesty, academic achievement, and perseverance), two of MSU's major athletic awards, at the end of the 2013-14 academic year. In addition, she was named the Detroit Athletic Club Female College Athlete of the Year as well as the recipient of a Big Ten Postgraduate Scholarship.

A 1985 graduate of Illinois State and four-year letterwinner in the volleyball program, George helped the Redbirds win three consecutive Missouri Valley Conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances. A team captain and crafty outside attacker, she was a three-time All-MVC selection who earned all-region honors.

George, who earned her master's degree in education from Central Michigan in 1987, resides in Okemos, Mich., with her husband Jerry and their two sons, T.J., 22, and Conner, 18, who both attend Michigan State.
