#### UK HOSTS MIZZOU, ARKANSAS IN FIRST FULL SEC WEEKEND

The University of Kentucky women's soccer team will look to pick up six more points this weekend as Southeastern Conference play picks up as the Wildcats host Missouri on Friday night at 7:30 p.m. ET and Arkansas on Sunday night at 6 p.m. ET.

Kentucky sits tied for first in the SEC after the first two rounds of SEC action for the first time under Jon Lipsitz. UK had been tied for first in 2012 after one weekend, but dropped in the second weekend to third place.

Kentucky went 2-0-0 on the weekend last weeken to move to 8-1-1 overall, and 2-0-0 in the SEC. The Wildcats got a 1-0 win on the road at Alabama on Friday before turning around to beat Butler on Sunday in the weekend capper, 4-1.

Sophomore Katy Keen scored the game-winning goal on Friday night on a corner kick re-fire from Kaitlin Miller, poking home the winner with the outside of her right foot past the keeper.

UK finished the non-conference slate of matches 6-1-1, with many quality wins over teams ranked in the top 50 of the current RPI. UK notched wins over Washington, Butler, UNC Greensboro and Louisville.

#### **QUICK NOTES**

- UK has yet to beat Missouri since it entered the SEC in 2012 (0-4-0).
- The Wildcats have used the same starting XI in nine of 10 matches this season.
- Katy Keen has scored two game-winning goals in 1-0 matches (Louisville, at Alabama).
- UK's 7-0 win over Toledo was the most goals UK has scored under Jon Lipsitz.
- Katelyn Jensen, a freshman keeper, has seven shutouts in 10 matches.
- · UK has won five-straight matches over in-state rivals Louisville, not conceding a goal in any of those five matches.
- Lipsitz's .694 career winning percentage ranks third among active coaches in the SEC.
- Kentucky made the 2014 SEC Tournament Championship match for the first time since 2006, after also collecting the program's first-ever SEC Tournament win under Jon Lipsitz in 2014.
- Arin Gilliland was drafted No. 8 overall to the Chicago Red Stars in the 2014 NWSL Draft. She became the first UK player ever drafted to play professional soccer at any level.
- For the first time in program history, UK has made four-straight NCAA Tournaments. The Wildcats have advanced to the second round each of the last the seasons, setting a program record for the best season in program history in 2014 with an appearance in the Sweet 16, going 16-7-1 last year.

#### LIPSITZ IN SEVENTH YEAR

Jon Lipsitz is in his seventh year as the head soccer coach at the University of Kentucky.

Lipsitz currently owns a 181-79-20 career record after four years at UK and stops at Charlotte (59-24-4 in four years) and Denison (43-10-4 in three years) prior to coming to Lexington.

His .695 career winning percentage is the third highest among active coaches in the Southeastern Conference.

#### **WILDCATS ON NATIONAL TV**

The University of Kentucky women's soccer team will see unprecedented media coverage in the 2015 season, as the Wildcats will see all of their games featured on SEC Network+, as well as WatchESPN and the WatchESPN app. In addition to all 13 home matches being available on SECN+, Kentucky's entire SEC slate of matches, home and away, will also be featured on SECN+. The 15 SECN+ matches are in addition to the three already scheduled televised matches, which will remain the same, as the Wildcats will face Ole Miss, Wisconsin and Tennessee on the SEC Network.

#### **SOUTHERN HOME COOKING**

UK is 32-5-4 in its last 41 home games, dating back to the 2012 season, with wins over No. 4 Florida (2014), No. 20 Washington, No. 24 South Carolina (2014), No. 13 Florida (2012) and a draw with No. 6 Texas A&M (2012). UK has won its last three NCAA Tourment matches on home soil (UT Martin, Ohio State, SIUE).

#### **GET AHEAD EARLY**

Kentucky finished the 2014 season 15-1-0 when scoring the match's first goal, and was a perfect 11-0-0 when leading at the halftime intermission of matches. UK is 7-0-0 this season when scoring the game's first goal and is also a perfect 6-0-0 when leading at the half this season.

#### **MIZZOU BREAKTHROUGH**

Kentucky is 0-4-0 against Missouri since the Tigers entered the SEC in 2012, going 0-4-0 in the four meetings. All of UK's matches with Missouri have been one-goal affairs, with the meetings in 2012 and both in 2013 all being 2-1 decisions in favor of the Tigers.

#### **CAN'T BEAT THE CATS**

UK is currently on an eight-match unbeaten streak, going 7-0-1 in its last eight matches. That streak is the longest unbeaten streak in the SEC at the present time, with South Carolina 6-0-0 in its last six matches.

#### **PLAYERS SCORING IN BUNCHES**

UK has had 11 different players score a goal this season, which is the most in the SEC. Six players (Swift, Dooley, Klump, Raetzman, Ledman, Keen) have scored multiple goals, and that is tied with Tennessee for the most players to score multliple goals in SEC play.

#### ATOP THE TABLE

Kentucky sits tied for first in the SEC after the first two rounds of SEC action for the first time under Jon Lipsitz. UK had been tied for first in 2012 after one weekend, but dropped in the second weekend to third place.

#### HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS

Kentucky finished 2014 tied for the lead in the SEC with a +18 goal differential (TAMU).

### K WOMEN'S SOCCER NOTES

#### **KEEN ON KENTUCKY**

Kentucky picked up Penn State transfer Katy Keen in the offseason. Keen, from Zionsville, Ind., had two assists in her only year in State College last season, including one in the NCAA College Cup Sweet 16 against Virginia Tech. Keen logged over 700 minutes on the pitch for Penn State with a season-high 76 coming against Michigan on Oct. 16. She also logged 10 shots for PSU. Keen has a long and distinguished club career, having been named an All-American, a part of the Olympic Development Program Region II Team since 2010 and has also trained with the United States Women's National Team in 2013. Under head coach Rory Dames, who is currently the head coach of the National Women's Soccer League's Chicago Red Stars, she helped lead the Carmel United to the U-15 National Championship. She has also been a part of the U-18 USWNT player pool in her young career.

#### **CORNERING A BREAKTHROUGH**

With Courtney Raetzman scoring directly off of a corner kick, Friday night's result provided an unsusal event in UK's season opener vs. Washington. In 2014, UK's first win of the season came off of a direct corner kick from Cara Ledman against Seattle U in the first OT. That marks back-to-back years in which UK's first win of the season came off direct corner kick goals, one of the rarest plays in the sport.

#### **SEASON TICKETS SCARVES ROCKET**

With the new season ticket scarves, in addition to the boost created by the FIFA Women's World Cup, UK soccer season ticket sales have more than quadroupled from the 2014 season. The Wildcats have sold over 500 season tickets for women's soccer, and have already shattered the program record set in 2013 (218).

#### LIPSITZ ANNOUNCES CAPTAINS FOR 2015

Alex Carter will join seniors Olivia Jester, Cara Ledman and Courtney Raetzman as the leaders of the Wildcats for the upcoming season. Between the four players, there is 36 NCAA Tournament games played in, 10,000 minutes on the pitch, 18 goals scored, five All-SEC selections and has started 193 out of a possible 203 games played in, a starting percentage of .950.

#### SAMARZICH ADDS SCORING UP TOP

Transfer Tanya Samarzich (USC) decided to transfer to UK this offseason, after sitting out the 2014 season. She will be eligible

immediately, as she is transferring in from the University of Southern California. In her one year with the Trojans, she appeared in 14 games, scoring three goals on 17 shots, including two game-winning goals. She played 641 minutes on the pitch, and started two games. Samarzich was a critical part of the Mexican National Team's qualification for the World Cup this summer, as she participated in the World Cup qualifiers from Oct. 14-26 to help get El Tri into its third-straight Women's World Cup. She was named to the 2015 Women's World Cup squad for Mexico and would have participated had it not been for a foot injury that ended her chances of competing this summer in Canada. The injury happened in a pre-World Cup scrimmage against the host country, Canada. At 20 years old, she is the third-youngest member of the Mexican National Team's active roster.

#### **GOODSON SOUNDS GOOD**

Jason Goodson was named the new UK women's soccer assistant coach on May 11, joining Ian Carry on Jon Lipsitz's technical staff for gamedays. The San Jose, Calif., native came to Ohio State after a four year stint with the Washington State Cougars under head coach Matt Potter. Goodson was the recruiting coordinator for the Cougars, helping lead WSU to four-straight NCAA Tournament berths in 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011, with the 2011 season resulting in a third place PAC-12 finish and an appearance in the 2011 Lexington Regional, in which Washington State advanced on a penalty shootout. During Goodson's time at Wazzu, the Cougars placed four student-athletes on the PAC-12 All-Freshman Team and led the PAC-12 in Academic All-Conference members. Goodson comes to Kentucky from Ohio State, where he also served as the recruiting coordinator for the Buckeyes, helping to lead OSU to two appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance in the 2013 Lexington Regional, which Kentucky won 3-1.

#### **SCOUTING MISSOURI**

Missouri enters the weekend with a 3-3-3 record this season with wins over Auburn, Purdue and TCU. The Tigers have picked up results in their matches with SMU, Oregon State and Northestern, with two of those three results coming as 0-0 decisions. The Tigers have won just one of their last five matches after starting the season 2-1-1. Savannah Trujillo leads the Missouri offense with two goals on the season, and four points. MU has scored eight goals this season while only allowing five.

#### **KENTUCKY/MIZZOU SERIES HISTORY**

This weekend's matchup marks seventh all-time meeting between the Tigers and Wildcats. Kentucky has not beaten Missouri since the Tigers joined the SEC in 2012. All four matches have been 2-1 decisions, with UM coming out victorius in all four of them.

#### **SCOUTING ARKANSAS**

Under the direction of Colby Hale, Arkansas is 4-5-0 this season, and has yet to pick up a point in SEC play, sitting at 0-2-0 in the league. The Hogs are coming off a heartbreaking 2-1 loss to Missisippi State on Sunday, where they allowed the go-ahead goal in the final three minutes of the match. Arkansas is without USWNT player Ashleigh Ellenwood, who tore her ACL earlier in the non-conference season.

#### **KENTUCKY/ARKANSAS SERIES HISTORY**

This weekend's matchup marks the 20th all-time meeting between Arkansas and Kentucky, with UK leading 11-7-1 entering the weekend. Arkansas has won four of the last five meetings, with UK's last win against the Hogs coming in a 2-1 overtime decision in 2011 thanks to Kelsey Hunyadi's PK in the first overtime.

#### **GILLILAND TO THE RED STARS**

Arin Gilliland was drafted No. 8 overall in the first round to the Chicago Red Stars, where she will be embarking on her professional soccer career in the National Women's Soccer League. Gilliland is the first-ever Kentucky soccer player to be drafted into any level of professional women's soccer and was the first player that was selected out of the Southeastern Conference.

#### **KENTUCKY PREDICTED TO FINISH** THIRD IN THE SEC

The 2014 SEC coaches poll saw the Wildcats predicted to finish third in the 2015 Southeastern Conference season, the league's head coaches predicted in the annual coaches poll. Kentucky finished third a season ago in the SEC, matching its program-best finish. With 140 points, Kentucky also received one first-place vote. Monday marked the first time under head coach Jon Lipsitz that Kentucky has received a first-place vote.


