WILDCATS FACE UA, BU IN FINAL SPLIT WEEKEND OF SEASON

The University of Kentucky women's soccer team continues its season on Friday as the Wildcats return to Southeastern Conference play against the Alabama Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa, Ala., at 8 p.m. ET before flying back home to play the Butler Bulldogs on Sunday at 6 p.m. ET. Both matches will be shown live on the SEC Network+.

UK picked up three points on Friday night in Oxford, Miss., with a 4-2 win over the Ole Miss Rebels. Zoe Swift had three points and Tanya Samartzich scored her first-career goal for the Wildcats en route to the win. The Wildcats offense scored three goals in the second half to collect the win after a 1-1 halftime tie was broken by a 70-yard flank run for a goal by left back Cara Ledman in the 55th minute.

On Sunday, Kentucky drew with preseason No. 14 Wisconsin, 0-0 at the Bell Soccer Complex. The match saw just six combined shots on goal, with the Badgers not recording a shot on target until the first overtime frame.

UK is 5-0-1 when it has held its opponents to one goal or fewer in matches. The Wildcats defense has posted six shutouts this season.

QUICK NOTES

- The Wildcats have used the same starting XI in six of seven matches this season.
- UK's 7-0 win over Toledo was the most goals UK has scored under Jon Lipsitz.
- Katy Keen was the Co-SEC Player of the Week on Sept. 7 for her first-career SEC accolade.
- Kentucky has won three of its last four SEC openers.
- UK has won five-straight matches over in-state rivals Louisville, not conceding a goal in any of those five matches.
- Lipsitz's .694 career winning percentage ranks third among active coaches in the SEC.
- Kentucky made the 2014 SEC Tournament Championship match for the first time since 2006, after also collecting the program's first-ever SEC Tournament win under Jon Lipsitz in 2014.
- Arin Gilliland was drafted No. 8 overall to the Chicago Red Stars in the 2014 NWSL Draft. She became the first UK player ever drafted to play professional soccer at any level.
- For the first time in program history, UK has made four-straight NCAA Tournaments. The Wildcats have advanced to the second round each of the last the seasons, setting a program record for the best season in program history in 2014 with an appearance in the Sweet 16, going 16-7-1 last year.
- All 19 of UK's matches will be televised by the SEC Network, or the SECN+ this year.

LIPSITZ IN SEVENTH YEAR

Jon Lipsitz is in his seventh year as the head soccer coach at the University of Kentucky.

Lipsitz currently owns a 179-79-20 career record after four years at UK and stops at Charlotte (59-24-4 in four years) and Denison (43-10-4 in three years) prior to coming to Lexington.

His .695 career winning percentage is the third highest among active coaches in the Southeastern Conference.

WILDCATS ON NATIONAL TV

The University of Kentucky women's soccer team will see unprecedented media coverage in the 2015 season, as the Wildcats will see all of their games featured on SEC Network+, as well as WatchESPN and the WatchESPN app. In addition to all 13 home matches being available on SECN+, Kentucky's entire SEC slate of matches, home and away, will also be featured on SECN+. The 15 SECN+ matches are in addition to the three already scheduled televised matches, which will remain the same, as the Wildcats will face Ole Miss, Wisconsin and Tennessee on the SEC Network.

SOUTHERN HOME COOKING

UK is 31-5-4 in its last 40 home games, dating back to the 2012 season, with wins over No. 4 Florida (2014), No. 20 Washington, No. 24 South Carolina (2014), No. 13 Florida (2012) and a draw with No. 6 Texas A&M (2012). UK has won its last three NCAA Tournament matches on home soil (UT Martin, Ohio State, SIUE).

GET AHEAD EARLY

Kentucky finished the 2014 season 15-1-0 when scoring the match's first goal, and was a perfect 11-0-0 when leading at the halftime intermission of matches. UK is 5-0-0 this season when scoring the game's first goal and is also a perfect 4-0-0 when leading at the half this season.

CORNERING A BREAKTHROUGH

With Courtney Raetzman scoring directly off of a corner kick, Friday night's result provided an unusual event. In 2014, UK's first win of the season came off of a direct corner kick from Cara Ledman against Seattle U in the first OT. That marks back-to-back years in which UK's first win of the season came off direct corner kick goals, one of the rarest plays in the sport.

LIPSITZ KNOWS LOUISVILLE

Jon Lipsitz is now 6-1-0 all-time against Louisville, having won every meeting with the Cards since 2011. Since he arrived on campus in Lexington, UK has allowed just two UL goals (both in the 2010 match), and has outscored

the Cards 12-2 overall in his six years at the helm. UL has not scored on Kentucky in the "Battle of the Bluegrass" in 497 consecutive minutes of action.

WILDCATS AGAINST THE BIG EAST

Kentucky all-time is 17-13-2 against the current alignment of the Big East Conference and 1-3-0 against the Bulldogs, the worst record for UK against any team from the Big East.

KEEN STRIKES FOR FIRST GOAL

Transfer Katy Keen scored her first-career goal on Friday night in the second half as Kentucky toppled in-state rival Louisville, 1-0. Keen transferred in from Penn State this offseason. It was the game-winning goal. She was named the SEC Player of the Week.

OLE! OLE! OLE! OLE!

Tanya Samarzich, a player on the full Mexican National Team scored her first-career goal in just her second appearance with the Wildcats on Friday night against Ole Miss. It was UK's fourth goal, and assisted by Zoe Swift. She is still in the process of recovering from an ankle injury that cost her a starting spot at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup.

BREAKING ATTENDANCE BARRIERS

Kentucky set a new school and facility record on Sept. 4 as 3,397 fans were at The Bell to watch UK down Louisville, 1-0. It was the largest crowd to ever watch a soccer match at Kentucky, men's or women's.

WINNINGEST COACHES IN THE SEC

UK head coach Jon Lipsitz ranks second among league coaches in all-time winning percentage. Lipsitz has posted a .695 percentage throughout his career *entering* the 2015 season.

HOLY TOLEDO!

Kentucky set and tied numerous school records against the Toledo Rockets in a 7-0 win. Included in them was scoring six goals in a single half for just the second time in program history (Bellarmine, 1992). Michaela Dooley netted a hat trick for just the sixth time in program history and the first of her career. Additionally, freshman Sophie Babo and Allie Gorgol both scored their first-career goal. It was UK's highest offensive output in a match under Lipsitz.

GORGOL BREAKS THROUGH

Senior Allie Gorgol, who has played four seasons in Lexington, scored her first-career goal against Toledo. She is known as one of the hardest-working players on the roster and has played all three positions on the pitch in her time at UK, filling in up top her freshman and sophomore years, playing midfield her junior year, and transitioning to the back for her finale.

KEEN ON KENTUCKY

Kentucky picked up Penn State transfer Katy Keen in the offseason. Keen, from Zionsville, Ind., had two assists in her only year in State College last season, including one in the NCAA College Cup Sweet 16 against Virginia Tech. UK WOMEN'S SOCCER NOTES

KENTUCKY PREDICTED TO FINISH THIRD IN THE SEC

The 2014 SEC coaches poll saw the Wildcats predicted to finish third in the 2015 Southeastern Conference season, the league's head coaches predicted in the annual coaches poll. Kentucky finished third a season ago in the SEC, matching its program-best finish. With 140 points, Kentucky also received one first-place vote. Monday marked the first time under head coach Jon Lipsitz that Kentucky has received a first-place vote.

GILLILAND TO THE RED STARS

Arin Gilliland was drafted No. 8 overall in the first round to the Chicago Red Stars, where she will be embarking on her professional soccer career in the National Women's Soccer League. Gilliland is the first-ever Kentucky soccer player to be drafted into any level of professional women's soccer and was the first player that was selected out of the Southeastern Conference.

HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS

Kentucky finished 2014 tied for the lead in the SEC with a +18 goal differential in the second half of matches this season with Texas A&M. The Wildcats are already tied for first in 2015 in second half goal differential.

LIPSITZ ANNOUNCES CAPTAINS FOR 2015

Alex Carter will join seniors Olivia Jester, Cara Ledman and Courtney Raetzman as the leaders of the Wildcats for the upcoming season. Between the four players, there is 36 NCAA Tournament games played in, 10,000 minutes on the pitch, 18 goals scored, five All-SEC selections and has started 193 out of a possible 203 games played in, a starting percentage of .950.

RINGING A NEW BELL IN 2014

Kentucky's new \$7.7 million dollar soccer complex is named the Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex, after longtime UK Athletics supporters Wendell and Vickie Bell. The Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex houses separate facilities for the men's and women's programs, including new team rooms, player lounges, locker areas, coaches offices, press box and a gorgeous new grandstand.

SAMARZICH ADDS SCORING UP TOP

Transfer Tanya Samarzich (USC) decided to transfer to UK this offseason, after sitting out the 2014 season. She will be eligible immediately, as she is transferring in from the University of Southern California. In her one year with the Trojans, she appeared in 14 games, scoring three goals on 17 shots, including two game-winning goals. She played 641 minutes on the pitch, and started two games. Samarzich was a critical part of the Mexican National Team's qualification for the World Cup this summer, as she participated in the World Cup qualifiers from Oct. 14-26 to help get El Tri into its third-straight Women's World Cup. She was named to the 2015 Women's World Cup squad for Mexico and would have participated had it not been for a foot injury that ended her chances of competing this summer in Canada. The injury happened in a pre-World Cup scrimmage against the host country, Canada. At 20 years old, she is the third-youngest member of the Mexican National Team's active roster.

GOODSON SOUNDS GOOD

Jason Goodson was named the new UK women's soccer assistant coach on May 11, joining Ian Carry on Jon Lipsitz's technical staff for gamedays. The San Jose, Calif., native came to Ohio State after a four year stint with the Washington State Cougars under head coach Matt Potter. Goodson was the recruiting coordinator for the Cougars, helping lead WSU to four-straight NCAA Tournament berths in 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011, with the 2011 season resulting in a third place PAC-12 finish and an appearance in the 2011 Lexington Regional, in which Washington State advanced on a penalty shootout. During Goodson's time at Wazzu, the Cougars placed four student-athletes on the PAC-12 All-Freshman Team and led the PAC-12 in Academic All-Conference members. Goodson comes to Kentucky from Ohio State, where he also served as the recruiting coordinator for the Buckeyes, helping to lead OSU to two appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance in the 2013 Lexington Regional, which Kentucky won 3-1.

SCOUTING ALABAMA

Alabama enters the weekend with a 3-3-2 record this season with wins over Troy, LSU and Southern Miss. The Crimson Tide have picked up drawing results with Harvard and Wake Forest, while dropping matches to Memphis, Tennessee Tech and Rhode Island. The Crimson Tide defeated Alabama in its SEC opener on Friday night in Tuscaloosa. UA is led in scoring by Celia Jimenez, who has scored two goals on the year, as well as Alexis Mouton.

KENTUCKY/ALABAMA SERIES HISTORY

This weekend's matchup marks 19th all-time meeting between the Tide and Wildcats. Kentucky has won four of the last five meetings, including a 2-1 result in Lexington a season ago in the SEC regular season finale. UK has won 4-2 each of its last two visits to the Alabama Soccer Stadium in 2013 and 2011.

SCOUTING BUTLER

Under the direction of Tari St. John, Butler enter the weekend with a 6-2-1 record on the year, with its only draw coming in its opening match to Cleveland State. The Bulldogs have won three of their last four matches, picking up winning results over IPFW, Wright State and Evansville - while only suffering a setback to Kent State. BU is led in scoring by Halle Stelbasky, who has seven goals and one assist on the season, for 15 points.

KENTUCKY/BUTLER SERIES HISTORY

This weekend's matchup marks the fifth all-time meeting between UK and Butler. Kentucky's only win in the series came back in 2000 when the Wildcats walked away with a 1-0 win in Indianapolis. The other three meetings were all multiple-goal winning scores for the Bulldogs, and also all coming before the year 1997.

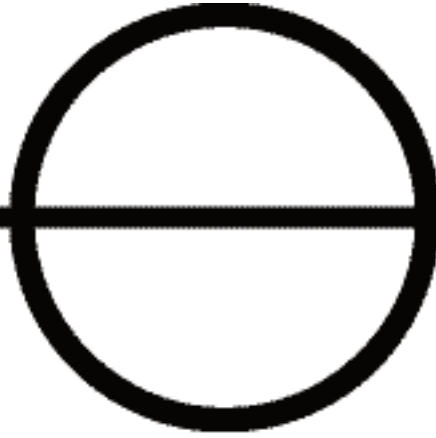
