## UK PLAYS HOST TO DEFENDING DIVISION CHAMP NO. 25/23 MISSOURI

After suffering its first loss of the season in a hard-fought tilt with Florida, 14-9, Kentucky will return to its four-game homestand - its longest since 2001 - with a Saturday matchup vs. two-time defending Eastern Division Champion and No. 25/23 Missouri. The game televised on the SEC Network at 7:30 p.m. ET.

Kentucky (2-1, 1-1 SEC) fell behind after an early turnover vs. the Gators, before fighting back on the strength of a strong defensive effort and a trio of field goals from sophomore preseason All-SEC selection Austin MacGinnis. UK limited the Gators - who entered their league opener averaging 490 yards per game - to 245 total yards of offense. It marked the fewest yards allowed by UK to Florida since a 1986 win.

The Wildcats opened the year with a 40-33 win over Louisiana Lafayette in the debut of The New Commonwealth Stadium, before snapping a 22-game road losing streak with a 26-22 victory at South Carolina to start SEC play. After a five-point loss to Florida, it marked the first time for UK in 123 years that Kentucky has opened a year with three straight games decided by seven points or less.

## QUICK NOTES

- The Wildcats have converted on 20 consecutive red-zone opportunities, dating back to the 2014 matchup with No. 1 Mississippi State.
- UK looks to snap a three-game SEC home losing streak. The Cats' last win was vs. South Carolina in 2014.
- Junior QB Patrick Towles ranks ninth in UK history with 3,526 career passing yards. Towles has distributed catches to nine different receivers to open the season, including TD passes to three different options.
- Sophomore RB Boom Williams rushed for 80 yards in the Florida tilt, snapping his streak of three consecutive 100-yard rushing performances. He has rushed for 322 yards in 2015, averaging 8.1 yards per carry and 107.3 yards per game.
- Junior DB J.D. Harmon has nabbed two interceptions in three games and has four in his career. Harmon has been a big-play weapon for UK on defense and special teams in 2015, forcing a fumble and returning a kickoff 60 yards in the season opener.
- Senior LB Josh Forrest has 30 tackles in 2015, with four pass break-ups and one sack. Forrest, who had 110 tackles to rank third in the SEC in stops per game as a junior, is a preseason All-SEC selection.
- Sophomore Austin MacGinnis nailed three field goals in the Florida game and has made four consecutive over the last two games. MacGinnis is 27-for-34 in his career, including 6-for-7 in 2015.
- Sophomore WR Garrett Johnson leads UK with nine key catches, defined as a play that results in a first down or TD. Johnson and WR Dorian Baker (seven) lead the team, with Boom Williams owning eight key rushes.
- In the 2014 meeting between UK and Missouri, the Wildcats got a career game from tailback Mikel Horton, who rushed 10 times for 62 yards to lead the club. Boom Williams had five catches for 58 yards. Josh Forrest added one of his six career double-digit tackle performances.
- The Kentucky and Missouri coaching staffs will be wearing Coach to Cure MD patches to raise awareness and funding for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy research. Fans are encouraged to donate online at [www.CoachtoCureMD.org](http://www.CoachtoCureMD.org) or donate \$5 by texting CURE to 90999.
- Freshman CB Chris Westry was named SEC Freshman of the Week after a game-clinching interception in the win at South Carolina. Westry added a red-zone pass break-up and his first career sack.
- Several Wildcats have received preseason honors. For a complete list see page nine of this release.
- Kentucky's win at South Carolina in its SEC opener was its first road win since 2010, snapping a 22-game streak.

## GAME NOTES VS. MISSOURI

### SERIES RECORD VS. MISSOURI

- Missouri leads the all-time series between the two schools, 3-2.
- The series is tied 1-1 in games played in Lexington.
- UK's lone win over the Tigers at home was a 12-6 win in 1968.
- After Kentucky won the first two meetings, in 1965 and 1968, Missouri has won three straight since joining the SEC in 2012.

### IN THE LAST MEETING

- Missouri fought off the Wildcats to post a 20-10 win in Columbia in 2014.
- The Tigers took a lead in the second quarter on a TD strike from Maty Mauk to Bud Sasser, with the two later hooking up for a 26-yard TD. UK got an Austin MacGinnis field goal from 47 yards for a 14-3 halftime deficit. Mizzou's Andrew Baggett added a pair of field goals to stretch the lead to 20-3, before Patrick Towles and Javess Blue connected for a one-yard TD with 3:52 left in the fourth quarter.
- Mauk starred for Mizzou, rushing 14 times for 96 yards, while completing 18-of-33 passes for 164 yards and two TDs. Marcus Murphy also rushed 13 times for 52 yards, with Russell Hansbrough toting it 15 times for 19 yards. Sasser caught six balls for 67 yards and two TDs and Kentrell Brothers and Michael Scherer each had 13 tackles to lead the defense, with Shane Ray adding two sacks.
- UK got a 10-rush, 62-yard performance out of tailback Mikel Horton, with Stanley Williams catching five balls for 58 yards. Towles was 19-for-37 for 158 yards and a TD. Josh Forrest led the Wildcats with 10 tackles, including two for a loss.
- Mizzou finished with 320 total yards, with UK owning 258 yards of offense.

### SCOUTING THE TIGERS

- Missouri (3-0, 0-0 SEC) has opened up the year with three consecutive wins, including a road win at Arkansas State, 27-20 in week two. The Tigers opened the year with a 34-3 win over Southeast Missouri in Columbia. Last week, Mizzou fought off a spunky UConn team in a 9-6 win.
- Mizzou is led by head coach Gary Pinkel, who has a 188-103-3 record overall in 25 seasons as a head coach, including 15 at Mizzou.
- The two-time defending SEC Eastern Division Champion Missouri has averaged 23.33 points per game, allowing just 9.67 points. Mizzou has rushed for 107.7 and passed for 217.33 yards per game, with the defense allowing only 217 yards per game.
- Under center, redshirt junior Maty Mauk has completed 42-of-80 passes for 474 yards, with five TDs and four interceptions. Drew Lock has contributed 178 yards on 12-of-20 passing.
- Ish Witter leads the team with 137 rushing yards on 42 carries, with Mauk contributing 32 yards per game on the ground with one TD. J'Mon Moore and Sean Culkin have a team-leading 11 catches, with each adding a TD. Moore has a team-high 130 yards. Tyler Hunt has two catches – one TD – for 129 yards, with Nate Brown catching nine passes for 125 yards and a club-high two TDs.
- Defensively, Mizzou has forced three fumbles and intercepted three passes. Kentrell Brothers has a team-high 42 tackles and two interceptions. Charles Harris has 13 tackles – eight for a loss – and three sacks, adding three QB hurries.
- Andrew Baggett, a senior who has 54 field goals in his career, has nailed 4-of-5 field-goal attempts in 2015. Corey Fatony has punted 18 times for a 44.94 yard average.

## A WIN ON SATURDAY WOULD ...

- Give Kentucky its first win over Missouri since the Tigers joined the SEC (2012-14).
- Snap a three-game losing streak in the series with Missouri and mark UK's first win vs. Missouri since 1968.
- Improve UK to 3-1 for the second consecutive season, a first for UK since 2007-08.
- Give UK a 2-1 record to open SEC play for the first time since 2007.
- Give UK its first win over a ranked team since defeating No. 10 South Carolina in Lexington in 2010.
- Snap an 18-game losing skid vs. ranked teams.
- Give Mark Stoops his first win over a ranked team as a head coach.

## CATS VS. THE RANKED

- Kentucky has played 239 ranked teams in its 125 years of football. The Cats are 39-195-5 in those games.
- UK's last win over a ranked team was in Lexington vs. No. 18 South Carolina, 31-28, in 2010.
- The Cats are 0-1 vs. a ranked Missouri team.

## CATS IN THE CLOSE ONES

- UK's first three games have been decided by seven points or less. The last time Kentucky opened a season with three consecutive games decided by seven points or less, came in its second season of football in 1892. UK opened with a 0-0 tie, an 8-6 loss and a 4-8 loss.
- With wins in the first two games, it marked the first time UK won consecutive close ones (games decided by seven points or less) since 2006, when the Wildcats defeated Mississippi State (34-31) and Georgia (24-20).

## CONSECUTIVE SELL-OUTS IN THE NEW CWS

- After a \$120-million reinvention, Kentucky has had consecutive sell-out crowds in The New CWS for the first time since 2009.
- In the opening-win over UL Lafayette, 62,933 filled the 61,000 capacity stadium, and in the SEC home opener vs. Florida, a crowd of 63,040 filled The New CWS.

## DEFENSIVE NUGGETS VS. FLORIDA

- Kentucky did not allow a UF score in the second half, the first time the Cats have shut out an opponent in the 2nd half since vs. ULM on Oct. 11, 2014.
- Kentucky allowed their fewest points vs. Florida (14) since Nov. 15, 1986 (3).
- Kentucky allowed their fewest yards of total offense against Florida (245) since Nov. 15, 1986 (241).
- Kentucky held Florida scoreless in the second half for just the third time in the last 30 seasons (1986, 2005, 2015).
- Kentucky held Florida to less than 60 offensive plays for just the third time in the last 30 seasons (1986, 2008, 2015).

## PASS DEFENSE

- Kentucky currently ranks 25th nationally and tied for third in the SEC in interceptions (4) and third in pass defense (193 ypg).
- With an J.D. Harmon interception against Florida, Kentucky has intercepted a pass in the first three games of a season for the first time since 2008.
- Stamps' interception marked UK's fourth straight game with an interception, dating back to last season.
- Senior LB Josh Forrest is tied for first in the SEC in passes defended with 5, including four pass breakups and one interception.

## STABLE OF RUNNING BACKS

- Kentucky is blessed to be able to go four deep on the running back depth chart, including sophomores Boom Williams and Mikel Horton, junior Jojo Kemp and freshman Siihiem King. Through three games of the season, UK running backs are averaging 6.4 yards per carry.
- Williams leads UK in rushing with 322 yards and one TD, running for over 100 yards in three consecutive games, before an 80-yard performance vs. Florida in the third game of the year. Kemp is second on the team with 24 rushes for 134 yards and a touchdown, with Horton scoring two TDs on 17 carries and 69 yards.
- Kemp is poised to become the 34th player in program history to chart 1,000 yards, sitting at 939 net yards entering the Florida game.

## BOOM!

- Boom Williams has totaled 322 rushing yards through the first three games of the season, the most by a Kentucky player through three games since Derrick Locke in 2010 (372).
- Williams has 187 rushing yards through the first two SEC games of the season, the most by a Kentucky player since Rafael Little in 2005 (197).
- With 80 rushing yards against Florida, he now has 810 rushing yards for his career. He needs 190 more yards to become the 34th player in school history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Williams picked up where he left off last season vs. Louisville with consecutive 100+ yard rushing performances to start the season. He become the first player to rush for 100 yards in three consecutive games since

## MILESTONES TO WATCH FOR ...

- Senior punter Landon Foster has 209 career punts, qualifying him for UK's career punt records. His career average of 42.1 yards per punt (8,799 yards) ranks him third all-time.
- Junior QB Patrick Towles has 3,526 passing yards for his career, becoming the 12th quarterback in school history to surpass 3,000 career passing yards. He ranks ninth on the career passing yards list, needing 622 yards to tie Randy Jenkins (1979-83) for eighth in UK history.
- Ryan Timmons has 932 receiving yards for his career. He needs 68 receiving yards to become the 25th player in school history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Jojo Kemp has 939 rushing yards for his career. He needs 61 rushing yards to become the 34th player in school history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.

Derrick Locke in 2010.

- In the win at South Carolina, Williams had the most rushing yards by a Kentucky player in an SEC road win (107) since Derrick Locke against Vanderbilt on November 14, 2009 (144).
- Williams ranks fifth in the SEC in rushing with 322 yards – 107.3 per game – on 40 carries. He has added four catches for 23 yards.

## NOT JUST PASS CATCHERS

- A key element of the Kentucky running game is the dedication of the UK receivers in blocking. Wide receivers coach Tommy Mainord has developed a reputation as coaching units that emphasize run blocking, dating back to his time at Texas Tech, Lamar and Sam Houston State.
- UK has several big bodies to contribute to the run game, including 6-foot-5 Blake Bone and 6-3 Dorian Baker.

## TOTH A CANDIDATE FOR RIMINGTON TROPHY

- Kentucky currently boasts two upperclassmen starters on the offensive line, including senior left tackle Jordan Swindle and junior center Jon Toth.
- A 6-foot-5, 310-pound product of Indianapolis, Toth (pronounced "Toeth" with a long "o" sound) has started 25 consecutive games. He was a 2013 SEC All-Freshman Team selection by the league coaches and was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week after UK rolled to 656 total yards vs. UT Martin in 2014.
- Toth is on the preseason Rimington Trophy Watch List, given to the nation's top center.

## BIG GEORGE

- Among the three true freshman starting for Kentucky in the season opener was right tackle George Asafa-Adjei, a 6-foot-5, 325-pound product of West Chester, Ohio.
- Asafa-Adjei enrolled in January in order to participate in spring practice and has consistently been praised by coaches and teammates for his ability and strength. He has started every game this season.

## STAMPS LEADS SECONDARY

- Kentucky's secondary is led by senior safety A.J. Stamps, a preseason third-team All-SEC selection by the league coaches and media.
- Stamps, a junior college transfer in 2014, has started all 15 games of his UK career, owning 71 tackles, four interceptions and eight pass break-ups.

## MELVIN ANCHORS MIDDLE

- Kentucky's defensive line lost a pair of talented seniors to the NFL in Bud Dupree and Za'Darius Smith but return senior defensive tackle starter Melvin Lewis in 2015.
- Lewis has been a force as a senior, with 10 tackles and a sack, giving him 47 tackles in his two-year career. A physical 6-foot-4, 332-pound force who does a good job of holding his position at the point of attack, Lewis opened 2015 with a career-high, nine-tackle effort vs. UL-Lafayette.

## WR TURNED LB, NOW TACKLING MACHINE

- Kentucky's front seven is led by senior linebacker Josh Forrest, a native of Paducah, Ky., who was recruited to UK as a wide receiver but transitioned to a linebacker as a freshman.
- Forrest is coming off a season where he ranked third in the SEC in tackles per game and had 110 stops. In 2015, Forrest leads UK and ranks tied for fifth in tackles and leads the league with five passes defensed. He had a 15-tackle effort in the season opener and had seven tackles in the win at South Carolina. His fourth pass break-up of the season helped UK force South Carolina to a key field goal attempt in the second half in the red zone.

# Commonwealth Stadium

*On game day, Commonwealth Stadium often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.*

- The Wildcats are in their 43rd season at Commonwealth Stadium, their first in the newly \$120 million renovated venue.
- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 272 games within the friendly confines of Commonwealth Stadium. UK has a 144-124-4 record in CWS.
- UK announced its first sellout since 2010 when 62,933 fans attended the season opener vs. Louisiana Lafayette on Sept. 5.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 63,030 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance for 13 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years.
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

## Commonwealth Stadium Renovations:

Through a \$120-million reinvention, Commonwealth Stadium has been transformed into a state-of-the-art facility. As the Kentucky football program enters a new era, the Big Blue Nation will enjoy an intimate game-day atmosphere to match. The experience will begin outside the stadium, as the longtime home of the Wildcats will undergo a dramatic external facelift. The new Commonwealth Stadium has taken on a modern look, but one that remains uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Commonwealth has been reduced over the course of the two-year project, but the value of all remaining seats will be increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses have been revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches will reap the benefits of the new Commonwealth Stadium as well, as new home-team facilities will be built, while a new multi-purpose recruiting room will play host to future Wildcats on their on-campus visits. ## Facts and Figures on Commonwealth Stadium:

Seating Capacity: 61,000, including the Commonwealth Suites.

Playing Field: UK switched from natural grass to synthetic turf for the 2015 season. Other SEC schools with a turf surface are: Arkansas, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Missouri.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage. The interior seating bowl also has LED ribbon boards.

Sound System: Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

## Game Day Experiences

The "Cat Walk": Fans are encouraged to greet the team when the Wildcats arrive for the "Cat Walk." The team buses will arrive at the Nutter Field House approximately two hours and 15 minutes before the game and the players will make the "Cat Walk" to their stadium entry point at Gate 1. Fans are encouraged to line up on the sidewalk and cheer the players as they enter the stadium. A siren will be sounded while the team buses are on their way to the stadium. That's the fans' cue to proceed to the Cat Walk area to greet the team.

Wildcat Park: Fans of all ages, but especially the younger Wildcats, will enjoy playing at the newly named Wildcat Park, located outside of the southwest corner (outside Gate 9) of Commonwealth Stadium. There are inflatable games that are available two hours before kickoff.

### FRESH FACES

- UK started four freshmen in the season opener, including RT George Asafo-Adjei, TE C.J. Conrad, DE/LB Denzil Ware (redshirt) and CB Chris Westry.
- UK started three true freshmen for the first time since 2000.
- Fourteen freshmen played in the season opener, including Asafo-Adjei, Conrad, Ware, Westry, LB Josh Allen, DB Derrick Baity, DE Tymere Dubose, DB Mike Edwards, LB Nico Firios, RB Sihiem King, LB Jordan Jones, DE Adrian Middleton, WR Thaddeus Snodgrass and DB Darius West.

### ROAD WIN AT SOUTH CAROLINA

- Kentucky's win at South Carolina marked its first road win since a 2010 win at Louisville, snapping a 22-game losing streak. It was UK's first league road win since a victory at Georgia in 2009.
- It served as UK's first win in an SEC opener since 2007 at Arkansas and was the first Kentucky win at South Carolina since 1999.
- Kentucky jumped out to a 24-7 lead after the first half, fighting back after throwing a goal line interception that set up the Cocks for a one-yard TD drive on UK's first possession. UK rallied with TD rushes from Mikel Horton, Jojo Kemp and Patrick Towles, with Austin MacGinnis adding a field goal.
- The Gamecocks rallied in the second half, mounting four consecutive time-consuming drives. UK's red-zone defense stiffened however, holding South Carolina to three field goals and one touchdown.
- With the Gamecocks lining up to go for the game-tying, two-point conversion attempt, in a 24-22 game, UK's defense stopped the attempt and forced a fumble that freshman Denzil scooped up and ran 98 yards for two UK points and a 26-22 lead.
- Sophomore Boom Williams rushed 14 times for 107 yards to lead the offense, with Towles throwing for 192 yards on 21-of-29 passing. Jeff Badet had a team-leading 62 yards on four catches.
- Senior LB Khalid Henderson led the defense with 12 tackles. Freshman Chris Westry would turn in an SEC Freshman of the Week performance, recording his first career sack and a game-clinching interception on the final South Carolina drive of the game to clinch the win. Westry added a key pass break-up in the end zone to force a USC field goal in the second half.
- Junior DB J.D. Harmon also had a key tackle on a third-down rushing attempt to force a field goal, adding two tackles. Safety A.J. Stamps had nine tackles, and senior DT Melvin Lewis notching a sack.

### WESTRY NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK AFTER USC WIN

- A native of Orange Park, Fla., Chris Westry's big performance was highlighted by the interception to clinch the game – his first career pick off. It helped UK to its first win at South Carolina since 1999. The 6-foot-4 corner added his first career sack in the second quarter, forcing the Gamecocks to punt. In the third quarter, Westry had a pair of big plays, including a quarterback hurry to thwart a USC drive, and then recording a key pass breakup in the end zone on a fade route to force a field-goal attempt.

### UK OPENS 2015 WITH WIN OVER UL LAFAYETTE

- Kentucky opened the game with a 75-yard touchdown rush from sophomore tailback Boom Williams, marking the first UK touchdown on the first play from scrimmage since 2009 vs. Eastern Kentucky.
- UK totaled the next 14 points to stretch its lead on touchdown passes of at least 35 yards to Garrett Johnson and Jeff Badet, with Badet returning to the field after missing 2014 due to injury.
- Lafayette then rallied with its first touchdown run but UK answered with a pair of Austin MacGinnis field goals to take a 27-7 lead.
- After UK owned a 33-10 lead in the third quarter, ULL then scored 23 straight points to even the game at 33-33 with 3:34 left in regulation.
- The Wildcats then went on a 58-yard drive on nine plays, with sophomore tailback Mikel Horton breaking

- Senior LB Josh Forrest then picked off the final pass of the game to clinch the win.
- UK's offense went for 435 yards in the win, charting a pair of 90-yard drives in the first quarter, including a 99-yard drive to take a 14-point lead.
- QB Patrick Towles threw for 257 yards and a career-high equaling three TDs, with sophomores Jeff Badet, Garrett Johnson and Blake Bone sharing in the TD grabs.
- Sophomore TB Boom Williams, whose 75-yard TD run to open the game was the longest of his career, finished with a career-best 135 yards on just 10 carries.
- Sophomore TB Mikel Horton's game-winning touchdown run in the fourth quarter was his third career TD.
- Senior LB Josh Forrest had a dynamic game in leading UK to the season-opening win. Forrest had 15 tackles, defending three passes and hauling in the game-clinching interception as time expired. He added a sack, with his pick the fourth of his career.

## FAMILY TIES AT KENTUCKY

- OL Zach Myers is the son of former UK offensive lineman Brad Myers (1984-87). Brad blocked for three of the top rushers in UK history - George Adams, Mark Higgs and Marc Logan.
- There is one set of twins on the team this season in defenders Daron and Zack Blaylock.
- UK junior wide receiver Ryan Timmons has a twin sister named Raven, who is a student assistant in the football office.

## 14 STARTERS RETURN

A total of 14 offensive and defensive starters from 2014 return for the Wildcats, seven on each side of the ball. On offense, UK has four starters back in the line, along with quarterback Patrick Towles and wide receivers Ryan Timmons and Joey Herrick.

The seven returning regulars on defense are tackle Melvin Lewis, end/linebacker Jason Hatcher, linebackers Josh Forrest and Khalid Henderson, cornerbacks Fred Tiller and Cody Quinn, and safety A.J. Stamps. A lot of young players have seen the field for UK in recent seasons. UK has 44 returning lettermen but it is interesting to note that 33 of those players have started at least one game on offense or defense during their careers.

A nice bonus is the return of several special teams starters – kicker Austin MacGinnis, punter Landon Foster, snapper Kelly Mason, and kickoff returner Stanley “Boom” Williams.

## NEW OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR FOR THE WILDCATS

Kentucky brought in a new offensive coordinator during the offseason as Shannon Dawson takes over for Neal Brown, who is now the head coach at Troy.

The players’ adaptation in the spring was not as drastic as one might think. Dawson and Brown have similar systems, each coming from the coaching tree whose roots are in the Hal Mumme offensive philosophy.

Dawson spent the previous four years at West Virginia, the last three as offensive coordinator, and the Mountaineers threw for more than 3,000 yards each season. In 2014, WVU ranked in the nation’s top 12 in total offense and passing offense, averaging almost 500 yards and 33.5 points per game. In addition to the success throwing the ball, WVU also had a physical running attack, averaging more than 180 yards per game.

Dawson also was offensive coordinator at Stephen F. Austin (2008-10) and Millsaps College (2006-07). He built dynamic offenses while helping engineer dramatic turnarounds at each school, as those teams won four conference championships during that five-year period.

## UK SETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR DEFENSIVE TDS

The Kentucky defense scored six touchdowns last season, setting a school record for most defensive TDs in a season.

Linebacker Khalid Henderson got the season off to a good start with an 89-yard fumble return for a score in the opener. In the season finale, tackle Mike Douglas returned a fumble for a TD at Louisville.

UK got four interception returns for a touchdown, one each by linebacker Josh Forrest, safety Marcus McWilson, defensive end Bud Dupree and cornerback Fred Tiller.

Dupree’s pick-six was the biggest play of the season, the winning score of UK’s dramatic 45-38 win over South Carolina, capping the largest fourth-quarter comeback in school history.

UK’s six defensive touchdowns led the SEC and ranked second nationally in that category.

## \$165 MILLION OF FOOTBALL CONSTRUCTION

Kentucky has two major football construction projects in process, totaling \$165 million investment in the Wildcat program.

A \$120 million “reimagining” of Commonwealth Stadium was completed for the 2015 season.

The project features a new look for the exterior of the stadium, wider and redesigned concourses, new concession stands and restrooms, new suites and other premium seating, a recruiting room and a new press box.

In addition, construction began in January 2015 on a new \$45 million practice/office complex being built on the south side of the existing Nutter Field House. The comprehensive complex features state-of-the-art practice, office and support facilities for the players and coaches. Completion is planned in time for the 2016 season.

### ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Last year, UK had 24 players on the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll and five were named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- Six current Wildcats already have completed their bachelor degrees (see picture) - Kelly Mason, Jabari Johnson, Farrington Hugenin, Josh Forrest, Melvin Lewis and Zach West.
- Jordan Swindle, Patrick Towles and Glenn Faulkner are all expected to graduate in December with their undergraduate degrees.

### WILDCATS DIAL LONG DISTANCE

Kentucky turned in long-distance plays last season on offense, defense and special teams.

Offensively, quarterback Patrick Towles connected on an 83-yard pass to Javess Blue, tying for the seventh-longest pass play in school history. Freshman Stanley “Boom” Williams had three touchdown runs of at least 50 yards, one of only 10 players in the nation who achieved that distinction last season.

Defensively, linebacker Khalid Henderson alertly gathered a fumble in the season opener against UT Martin and returned it 89 yards for a touchdown.

On special teams, freshman kicker Austin MacGinnis tied the existing school record with a 53-yard field goal against Ohio. He followed with a 51-yard field goal at Florida, sending that game to overtime. Finally, he eclipsed the school record with a 54-yard blast at Tennessee.”

### FRESHMEN MAKE BIG IMPACT IN 2014

Kentucky had several freshmen make a big impact last season, boding well for the future of the Wildcats. Two of the yearlings earned Freshman All-America honors, running back Stanley “Boom” Williams and kicker Austin MacGinnis.

Williams led the Wildcats in rushing, zipping for 486 yards and 6.6 yards per carry, while living up to his nickname with three touchdown runs over 50 yards. He also returned kickoffs and was named Freshman All-America as a return man. MacGinnis nailed 21 of 27 field goals and set six school records.

In addition, MacGinnis and offensive guard Ramsey Meyers earned Freshman All-SEC honors. Four wide receivers provided immediate help at their position, while on the defensive side, first-year tackles Regie Meant and Matt Elam showed flashes of outstanding ability.

**2015 SCHEDULE NOTES**

- Kentucky will play eight home games in 2015, joining the 2007 season as the only years in school history that the Wildcats have had eight home contests.
- Kentucky has the nation's fifth most difficult schedule, according to the NCAA preseason evaluation.
- Kentucky's first nine opponents in 2015 advanced to postseason play last year. All totaled, 10 of UK's 12 opponents were in the postseason – nine bowl teams plus FCS playoff participant Eastern Kentucky.
- It will be Kentucky's first-ever meeting with Charlotte. Charlotte will play its first season as an FBS team (Conference USA) in 2015.
- For the second consecutive season, the UK-Louisville game will be on the final weekend of the regular season. Prior to 2014, the UK-UofL game had been played early in the season since the series renewed in 1994.
- Kentucky and Tennessee will face off in the month of October for the first time since 1909. It will only be the fourth time in UK's 125-year history it has faced Tennessee in the month of October.
- The Wildcats will have a four-game home stretch from Sept. 19 to Oct. 15, marking the longest home-stand since the 2001 team started the season with four straight home games.
- Kentucky's game against Auburn will be on Thursday, Oct. 15. It will be the first Thursday home game since 1939.
- UK ends the regular season with consecutive non-conference games for the first time since it entered the SEC in 1933.

**ART STILL SELECTED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME**

Art Still, whose dominance at defensive end helped lead Kentucky to some of its greatest moments in school history, was named to the College Football Hall of Fame by the National Football Foundation.

Originally from Camden, N.J., Still played at Kentucky from 1974-77 under Coach Fran Curci. Still helped the Wildcats to a 19-4 record in his final two seasons. UK went 9-3 in his junior year, winning a share of the Southeastern Conference championship, and capped the season with a 21-0 blanking of North Carolina in the Peach Bowl. The Cats were ranked 18th in the final Associated Press poll.

UK posted a 10-1 mark in his senior season, finishing the campaign No. 6 in the final AP ranking. The Wildcats went 7-3 against Top-20 ranked teams his last two seasons, winning the last five in a row vs. ranked foes Florida, North Carolina, West Virginia, at Penn State and at LSU. Paced by Still's dominating performances, Kentucky led the SEC in total defense and rushing defense.

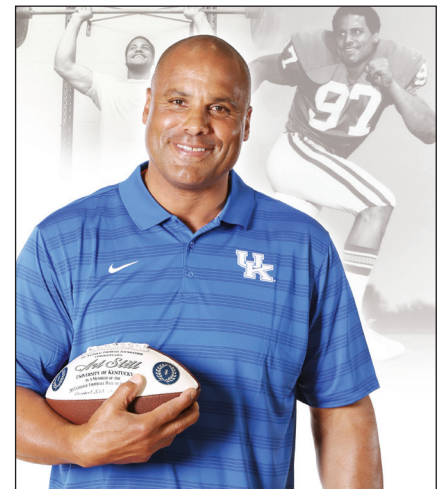
Still was a four-year starter who totaled 327 tackles during his career, an amazing figure for a defensive end. Quarterback sacks were not kept during his career and tackles for loss are available only for his senior year, when he compiled 22 TFL – a school record that "Still" stands.

One interesting fact about Still is that he also saw significant action on offense as a tight end in short-yardage or goalline situations, averaging approximately 15 plays per game and frequently helping pave the way for touchdowns or first downs. Kentucky rushed for 269.1 yards per game in 1976, the second-highest mark in school history, and rushed for 228.7 yards per game in 1977.

Still was a unanimous first-team All-America selection in 1977 as chosen by AP, United Press International, Football Writers Association of America, the American Football Coaches Association, Newspaper Enterprise Association, Walter Camp Football Foundation, The Sporting News and Football News.

Still was a finalist for the Lombardi Award and the UPI National Lineman of the Year. He was the Brooks-Irvine Memorial Football Club of South Jersey College Player of the Year.

## KENTUCKY 40, LOUISIANA LAFAYETTE 33

SEPT. 5, 2015 • LEXINGTON, KY.

### THE NEW CWS



Anticipation. Electricity. And then a Boom. Williams, that is.

Kentucky's Stanley "Boom" Williams raced 75 yards for a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage to open the 2015 season and The New Commonwealth Stadium in storybook fashion. But, the Wildcats would need a storybook ending to fend off a late UL Lafayette charge.

Sophomore running back Mikel Horton scampered 12 yards for a touchdown with 57 seconds remaining to lift UK to a 40-33 win over visiting UL Lafayette in front of a sellout crowd of 62,933 fans.

After jumping out to a 23-point advantage behind three touchdown passes from junior Patrick Towles, Boom's rushing touchdown and two field goals, Kentucky yielded 23 consecutive points to the Ragin' Cajuns

in less than nine minutes of play to tie the score at 33.

UL Lafayette forced the home team into a three-and-out to take over possession with a chance at seizing the lead with 6:58 remaining. UK senior lineman Melvin Lewis stuffed Louisiana's Elijah McGuire for a three-yard loss to help force the Cajuns into a punt, setting the stage for Horton and the offense.

Needing a score, UK generated a nine-play, 58-yard game-winning drive. Kentucky's offense benefited from two 15-yard penalties during the winning push, but Horton was able to take advantage of the miscues to lift Kentucky to the win.

Kentucky quarterback Patrick Towles threw for 257 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. UK generated 435 yards of total offense. Williams secured his third-career 100-yard rushing game on 10 carries for 135 yards, which included the opening-drive score. Horton carried six times for 28 yards and the final touchdown. Sophomore Garrett Johnson led the receiving corps with five catches for 85 yards and a touchdown. Five receivers snared at least one ball for 30 or more receiving yards, and three different receivers caught touchdowns from Towles.

Senior linebacker Josh Forrest paced the defensive effort with 15 tackles, including a sack, three pass breakups and the game-clinching interception. Junior corner J.D. Harmon was a part of two turnovers for the Cats. He forced a fumble deep in Kentucky's territory to end a lengthy Ragin' Cajun drive in the opening quarter before picking off a pass in the second quarter. Lewis added nine tackles to the defensive effort.

## KENTUCKY 26, SOUTH CAROLINA 22

SEPT. 12, 2015 • COLUMBIA, S.C.

### WILLIAMS BRICE STADIUM



It was a tale of two halves, with Kentucky's offense scoring 24 unanswered first-half points before the Wildcat defense made big play after big play in the second half, securing a 26-22 victory over South Carolina in front of 82,178 at Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia, S.C.

Heading into halftime with a 24-7 lead, South Carolina scored the first 15 points of the second half, including three Elliott Fry field goals and a 33-yard touchdown pass from Perry Orth – who was playing for injured Gamecock quarterback Connor Mitch – to Jerrell Adams, to cut the UK lead to 24-22.

The Gamecocks decided to go for the two-point conversion to try to tie the game before freshman Denzil Ware scooped up a fumble and returned it 98 yards for two points to give UK a 26-22 lead with 8:09 to go in the game.

After a short drive by the UK offense, South Carolina started another drive on a tired Kentucky defense before another freshman made a big play with rookie cornerback Chris Westry earning his first-career interception to put the Wildcats back in the driver's seat.

The Wildcat offense, which struggled for much of the second half, sealed the victory from there, taking the final 4:32 off the clock, including a key 11-yard quarterback draw by Patrick Towles on third down to drain the Gamecocks of timeouts. Sophomore Stanley "Boom" Williams took over from there with a 25-yard rush to end the game.

The victory for Kentucky broke a 22-game losing streak in road games with the Wildcats last road win coming at Louisville in Sept. 2010. Kentucky's last SEC road victory was at Georgia in Nov. 2009. UK is now 2-0 on the season and starts conference play with a victory for the first time since defeating Arkansas in 2007 in Fayetteville.

Towles was in command in the first half through the air, going 21-for-29 overall for 192 yards. The junior signal caller threw his only interception on the first drive of the game that set up South Carolina deep in Kentucky territory with Mitch rushing in from one-yard out to give USC a 7-0 lead with 12:03 to play in the first quarter.

That was all the Gamecocks would get offensively in the first half as Kentucky rattled off the next 24 points to end the half, starting with an eight-yard rush from Horton to tie the game 7-7. Kemp got in on the scoring later in the first quarter, completing an eight-play drive with a two-yard rush for a touchdown to give Kentucky a 14-7 lead.

A USC missed field goal gave possession back to Kentucky with 2:46 to go in the half and Towles and Co. took advantage. After a 20-yard completion to Dorian Baker, Towles connected to Jeff Badet for 43 yards to the USC 11-yard line to set up a 1-yard rush from Towles with 17 seconds to go in the half to give UK a 24-7 lead.

## FLORIDA 14, KENTUCKY 9

## THE NEW CWS



Despite a sparkling defensive effort in which the Kentucky football team held Florida scoreless in the second half, a fourth-quarter rally fell short as Florida prevailed 14-9 on Saturday night in a front of a sold-out Commonwealth Stadium.

Trailing 14-3 going into the fourth quarter, the Wildcats made it a one-score game behind two Austin MacGinnis field goals. UK had the ball twice over the final five minutes in an attempt to score the go-ahead touchdown but Florida held on for the win.

Kentucky's defense stymied the Gator attack for the entire second half. Five Wildcats registered six or more tackles on the night, led by Khalid Henderson's nine stops. UK posted three tackles for a loss and J.D. Harmon picked off a pass in the end zone to halt a Florida drive in the middle of the third quarter that would have pushed UF's lead to three scores. The interception sparked a momentum change in the game as UK would go on to put together back-to-back scoring drives.

Following Harmon's interception in the third quarter, Patrick Towles' 33-yard quarterback scramble highlighted a 75-yard drive by the Wildcats to inch closer at 14-6 with 14:50 in the fourth. MacGinnis connected on a 22-yard field goal for the Wildcats to make it a one-possession game.

After the UK defense forced a three-and-out, MacGinnis made it a five-point contest with 10:57 to go with a 45-yard field goal. Towles found Jeff Badet for a 45-yard strike down the left sideline to push the Wildcats into field-goal range as the drive's highlight.

Following UK's third field goal of the game, Florida managed one first down before being forced to punt with 8:34 remaining. Faced with a third-and-10 from its own 22, Towles found Baker open on the right sideline to keep the drive alive. Williams followed with a 14-yard rush, but the drive stalled at UK's 48.

The Gators picked up two first downs and killed 3:44 of clock before punting back to the Wildcats, which began the final drive at their own 20. Towles and Baker hooked up for a 20-yard gain on fourth-and-3 at the Kentucky 27 to keep the drive alive. On a subsequent fourth-down play, Towles' deep ball down the left side line intended for Ryan Timmons was picked off to preserve the Gators' victory.

Florida opened the game's scoring with a 1-yard run by Will Grier on fourth down to go ahead 7-0. Kentucky answered with a 14-play, 64-yard drive that resulted in a MacGinnis 29-yard field goal to make the score 7-3.

In the second quarter, the Gators put together an 11-play, 67-yard drive, which ended in a 34-yard field goal attempt by Austin Hardin that was subsequently blocked by UK's CJ Johnson to preserve the 7-3 score. The visitors capped the half by marching 57 yards for a three-yard plunge by running back Kelvin Taylor to push UF's lead to 14-3 with 14 seconds remaining.
