QUICK FACTS

- Redshirt freshman defensive lineman Joey Kraemer was killed in a car accident early Sunday morning (Sept. 27).
- Devin Borders blocked a punt against Austin Peay, the 12th blocked kick of his career. The FCS record is 17.
- Eastern leads the OVC and is 10th in FCS in turnover margin (1.33/gm). The Colonels also lead the conference, and are sixth in the nation, with just one turnover this season.
- The Colonels have not turned the ball over in each of their last two games.
- Eastern leads the OVC in kickoff returns (24.0 ypr) and kickoff return defense (16.0 ypr).
- After beating Austin Peay, EKU has now won 14 straight games played after an open week.
- Eastern began the season ranked No. 17 in both the FCS Coaches Poll and the STATS FCS Top-25 preseason poll. In the most recent rankings, EKU is No. 17 in the STATS poll and No. 21 in the coaches poll.
- Senior Stanley Absanon had 182 all-purpose yards against Valpo. He returned an interception 56 yards for a touchdown, had 80 kickoff return yards and 46 punt return yards.
- Running back Dy'Shawn Mobley, a 2014 Sports Network All-American, was chosen as a preseason All-American this season by STATS, Phil Steele, College Sporting News and *Athlon*. The senior is also on the FCS National Performer of the Year Trophy Watch List and the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year Watch List.
- Senior offensive lineman Brett Eyckmans is a third team STATS FCS Preseason All-America selection.
- Dy'Shawn Mobley was chosen as the Preseason OVC Offensive Player of the Year by the OVC media and the OVC coaches/media relations directors.
- In addition to Dy'Shawn Mobley, offensive linemen Trey Shelton and Brett Eyckmans, and defensive back Stanley Absanon were chosen to the Preseason All-OVC team.
- OVC media members picked EKU to place second in the conference this season in their preseason poll.

The most recent meeting came on Nov. 7, 2009, Dean Hood's second season as head coach. The Colonels were down just 10-6 with 2:44 left in the first half, but Kentucky scored right before the half and went on to win 37-12.

FALLEN TEAMMATE

Redshirt freshman Joey Kraemer was killed in a single car accident early Sunday morning (Sept. 27). The defensive lineman transferred to EKU in August after spending one season at UTEP. Due to an injury, he had not appeared in any games for the Colonels.

IT'S JUST SOMETHING WE DO

EKU made its 21st appearance in the NCAA FCS playoffs last season. The Colonels trail only Montana (23) for most playoff trips all-time.

I'LL TAKE THAT, THANK YOU

In 2014, Eastern Kentucky led the OVC and ranked second in the nation with 33 turnovers forced. The Colonels led the OVC with a turnover margin of +0.23 per game. Through three games this season, EKU leads the OVC and ranks 10th in FCS with a turnover margin of +1.33 per game. Eastern also leads the OVC and is sixth in the nation with just one turnover this season.

TWO STRAIGHT WITH NO TOs

Eastern has not turned the ball over in either of its last two games, including against North Carolina State. It's the first time the Colonels have gone two straight games without a turnover since the final two games of the 2012 season and the first game of the 2013 season.

"BLOCK"-ING PARTY

Redshirt junior Devin Borders blocked a field goal attempt against North Carolina State and a punt against Austin Peay. His seven career blocked field goals and 12 career blocked kicks are both OVC records. In the FCS career rankings, he is now tied for second on the blocked kicks list and third on the blocked field goals list. The national FCS records are 10 and 17 respectively.

MAKING THE SACKS

Eastern has sacked opposing quarterbacks seven times in three games. The Colonel offensive line has only allowed three sacks.

IN THE LEAGUE

Former EKU punter Jordan Berry won the punting job for the Pittsburgh Steelers. The native of Victoria, Australia was a Colonel from 2009 to 2013.

NEWCOMERS SHINE IN BACKFIELD

True freshman Ethan Thomas and Florida transfer Adam

Lane combined for 117 yards and three touchdowns in Eastern's 51-13 win over Austin Peay. Thomas had 59 yards and two scores. Lane finished with 58 yards and one touchdown.

BACK WITH A VENGEANCE

Wide receiver Devin Borders, who had seen limited action in the first two games due to an injury, made a big impact in extended action against Austin Peay. Borders caught nine passes for 91 yards.

LET'S KICK THIS THING OFF

Through Eastern's first two games, newcomer Ben Deighton had kicked off four times with just one touchback. Against Austin Peay, the former Division III soccer player kicked off seven times and all seven were downed in the end zone.

CONEY GOES FOR 200+

Redshirt junior quarterback Bennie Coney threw for 261 yards against Austin Peay. It was the third 200-yard game of his career and three yards short of tying his career-best.

SPENCE MAKES PRESENSE FELT

Ohio State transfer and former All-Big Ten performer Noah Spence had a season-high eight tackles and a sack against Austin Peay. He has recorded a sack in each of EKU's games and has a team-best five tackles for a loss.

DERRICOTT MAKES IMMEDIATE IMPACT

D'Vonta Derricott, a transfer from Kansas State, led EKU with eight tackles against Valpo. He has a team-best 18 tackles through three games.

ANOTHER AUSSIE BOOMING PUNTS

Keith Wrzuszcak, also a native of Victoria, Australia, is ninth in FCS in punting at 44.1 yards per punt. Eight of his 16 punts this season have gone for 50 or more yards.

WELCOME TO THE HALL

Three former Colonel football players were among the group of nine inducted into the Eastern Kentucky University Athletics Hall of Fame on Saturday (Sept. 26). Those three were Jason Dunn (1991-95), Larry Kirksey (1969-72) and Jim Moberly (1965-68).

POST-BYE WEEK SUCCESS

After beating Austin Peay, Eastern has now won 14 straight games following an off week and is 14-2 after open weeks since 2000.

9 STRAIGHT OVC HOME-OPENERS

With its win over Austin Peay, EKU has now won nine straight OVC home-openers, including all eight under Head Coach Dean Hood.

EKU TOP-10 RECEIVERS

Senior Jeff Glover and redshirt junior Devin Borders are closing in on EKU's top-10 for career receiving yards. Glover now needs 237 to reach the top-10. Borders totaled 533 receiving yards in 2014 and is now 435 away from earning a spot in the top-10.

EKU TOP-10 PASSER

In his first season as a Colonel, Bennie Coney threw for 1,185 yards while splitting time with Jared McClain. He is 1,583 away from breaking into Eastern's top-10 career passing yards list.

ABSANON SHINES ALL OVER FIELD

In addition to picking off a pass and returning it 56 yards for a touchdown against Valpo, cornerback Stanley Absanon returned five kicks for 126 yards, averaging 15 yards per punt return and 40 yards per kickoff return. He began the game with an 18-yard kickoff return that began a touchdown drive. In the second quarter he returned a kickoff 62 yards, leading to an EKU field goal. Later in the second, Absanon had a 34-yard punt return that keyed another touchdown drive. He totaled 182 all-purpose yards.

NOT ALLERGIC TO STARTING

Quarterback Bennie Coney didn't start against Valpo because of an allergic reaction right before the game. He

SPENCE MAKES ANTICIPATED DEBUT

Former first team All-Big Ten selection and Ohio State transfer Noah Spence made his EKU debut against Valpo. He had five tackles, including one sack, forced a fumble and had two quarterback hurries.

BALL CONTROL?

With its longest offensive scoring drive lasting 4:05, and six of its eight drives taking 2:40 or less off the clock, the Colonels' time of possession against Valpo totaled 22:51.

FIRST TOUCHDOWNS

On their first collegiate carries, true freshmen Ethan Thomas (RB) and Arien Beasley (WR) scored their first collegiate touchdowns against Valpo. Florida transfer Adam Lane and redshirt sophomore Kentayvus Hopkins also scored their first touchdowns as Colonels.

THE LAST TIME AN EKU PLAYER ...

Rushed 30 times in a game

HEAD COACH Dean Hood

The expectations for the Eastern Kentucky University football team always seem to be high and head coach Dean Hood has delivered NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff appearances three times in his seven years as head coach (2014, 2011, 2008).

"It doesn't matter if you are coaching a game in Death Valley versus Clemson or here versus Morehead State," Hood said. "It's all the same. The kids understand that point and the culture we are trying to create at EKU. They can't play to the best of their athletic ability until they know exactly where they are supposed to be and what they are supposed to do on the field."

The Eastern football program has produced nine All-Americans, one OVC Offensive Player of the Year, one OVC Defensive Player of the Year, one OVC Freshman of the Year and 26 first team all-conference performers in Hood's seven years on the EKU sidelines. This past fall, running back Dy'Shawn Mobley became the first EKU running back since Markus Thomas in 1992 to be honored as OVC Offensive Player of the Year.

Hood, 51, spent seven seasons working at Wake Forest University before taking over the EKU program in January 2008. Under Hood's direction, the Wake Forest defense was known for creating turnovers and scoring touchdowns. The Demon Deacons forced 186 turnovers from 2001-07, more than two per game. In 2007, Wake Forest led the Atlantic Coast Conference with 35 turnovers forced on its way to going 9-4 and capturing the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

From 1994-98, Hood spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Eastern Kentucky under College Football Hall of Fame coach Roy Kidd. He served all five years as the secondary coach and the last two seasons as the defensive coordinator. In Hood's first stint at EKU, the Colonels captured two Ohio Valley Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Division I FCS playoffs three times.

At Wake Forest, Hood and the rest of the Demon Deacons broke every program record imaginable in 2006 and set many

other milestones. WFU won the ACC title for the first time since 1970 by shattering the program record with 11 victories. The Demon Deacons earned a berth in a BCS bowl game, taking on Louisville in the FedEx Orange Bowl.

Much of the credit for Wake Forest's 2006 league championship fell to the defense. The Demon Deacons allowed just 15.4 ppg to rank second in the ACC and 21st nationally. Against the run, Wake yielded just 105.8 yards per game to rank 21st nationally, the third lowest total in Wake Forest history. Against the pass, the Demon Deacons recorded 22 interceptions, second most in the nation.

Hood's defenders earned All-ACC mention 14 times. That list includes four

NFL draft picks - Calvin Pace, Montique Sharpe, Eric King and Josh Gattis.

Hood entered the collegiate coaching ranks as an assistant at Fairmont (W.Va.) State College, where he worked with the defensive backs during the 1987 and 1988 seasons. The 1988 team won the WVIAC championship and led the nation with 31 interceptions. Hood then spent the 1989 campaign at Colgate University.

From 1990-93, Hood coached at Glenville (W.Va.) State College, the last three of which he served as defensive coordinator and assistant head coach. In 1993, Glenville finished 10-3 and advanced to the NAIA Division I championship game. Also that year, Hood's defense led the nation in scoring defense (9.2 ppg), passing defense

(118.0 ypg), and total defense (223.0 ypg).

Hood moved to Ohio University for two years (1999-2000) where he was in charge of the defensive backs. That unit record-ed 17 interceptions in 1999, the most in more than a decade. The following year, Ohio ranked 20th nationally in scoring defense (18.9 points per game) as the Bobcat defense was one of only five units in Division I-A that did not allow more than 30 points in a game throughout the entire season.

This is Hood's first head coaching position and he is just the third EKU head football coach in the last 50 years.

"Knowing first-hand what Coach Kidd built here, this is one of the best jobs in the country," Hood said. "I remember when I was here the first time thinking how many guys in the history of athletics are still coaching in a facility named after them. That is rare. It is exciting to be at the helm of this program."

Hood is married to the former Crystal Ramsey of Richmond, Ky. The couple has four children – two sons, Trey and Daven, and two daughters, Jada and Cordia.

Eastern struck early, as a 36-yard pass from Kyle Romano to Joel Brown helped set up a four-yard touchdown run by Ethan Thomas with 10:55 left in the first quarter. Five minutes later, Stanley Absanon intercepted a pass at the EKU 44-yard line and returned it 56 yards for another touchdown.

After the two teams exchanged field goals, Arien Beasley took the second end of a reverse and scampered past the pyl-

lon from 11 yards out to make it 24-3 in favor of Eastern with 4:02 to go in the second quarter.

A Jeff Glover touchdown catch from Bennie Coney took the Colonels safely into the locker room at halftime up on the Crusaders, 31-3. It was, again, all EKU in the second half, as Coney and Glover hooked up for another touchdown – this one from 30 yards out – late in the third quarter to make it 38-3.

Two more EKU touchdowns followed, as Florida transfer Adam Lane and sophomore Kentavvus Hopkins both found pay-dirt for the first time as Colonels. The only Crusader touchdown came with 45 seconds left in the game as Jake Hutson scored from 16 yards out to make it 52-10.

The EKU defense stifled Valpo to only 38 yards rushing on the night. D'Vonta Derricott paced the defensive unit with eight tackles, while sophomore Sheldon Fleming added two sacks.

RALEIGH, N.C. – Eastern Kentucky played to a 0-0 tie through the first quarter, but North Carolina State scored two touchdowns in the second quarter on its way to a 35-0 victory.

N.C. State got on the board early in the second quarter when Benson Browne caught a five-yard pass from Jacoby Brissett to cap an eight-play, 60-yard drive. RICHMOND, Ky. – Eastern Kentucky never trailed on the way to a 51-13 win over Austin Peay.
