WILDCATS LOOK TO GET BACK ON TRACK ON THE ROAD

The University of Kentucky women's soccer team will look to get back its offense on Friday and Sunday, as UK enters a crucial weekend of SEC action on the road at No. 16 Auburn and at Tennessee. The Wildcats will face the Auburn Tigers on Friday night at 8 p.m. ET on The Plains looking to gain valuable RPI points, with AU sitting at No. 4 in the national rankings for RPI. Sunday, UK will have its third nationally-televised match at Tennessee at 5 p.m. ET as UK looks for four-straight wins over the Vols.

Kentucky will be looking to rekindle the 2014 SEC Tournament this weekend, as UK knocked off the Tigers in the 2014 SEC quarterfinals 2-1, marking UK's first SECT win under head coach Jon Lipsitz at the time a year ago in Orange Beach. The Wildcats then went on to down Tennessee, 3-2, in the semifinals, reaching the SEC Tournament Championship match last year.

UK has been lacking offense as of late, having been shutout for three-straight matches for the first time in seven seasons under Lipsitz. UK arguably played its best soccer match of the season against Texas A&M on Friday, but were unable to score on its chances.

QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is 7-3-2 this season in home matches played at the Bell Soccer Complex.
- The Wildcats have used a different starting XI in eight of the last nine matches.
- Katy Keen has scored two game-winning goals in 1-0 matches (Louisville, at Alabama).
- UK's 7-0 win over Toledo was the most goals UK has scored under Jon Lipsitz.
- Katelyn Jensen, a freshman keeper, has eight shutouts in 15 matches.
- UK has won five-straight matches over in-state rivals Louisville, not conceding a goal in any of those five matches.
- Lipsitz's .694 career winning percentage ranks third among active coaches in the SEC.
- Kentucky made the 2014 SEC Tournament Championship match for the first time since 2006, after also collecting the program's first-ever SEC Tournament win under Jon Lipsitz in 2014.
- Arin Gilliland was drafted No. 8 overall to the Chicago Red Stars in the 2014 NWSL Draft. She became the first UK player ever drafted to play professional soccer at any level.
- For the first time in program history, UK has made four-straight NCAA Tournaments. The Wildcats have advanced to the second round each of the last three seasons, setting a program record for the best season in program history in 2014 with an appearance in the Sweet 16, going 16-7-1 last year.

LIPSITZ IN SEVENTH YEAR

Jon Lipsitz is in his seventh year as the head soccer coach at the University of Kentucky.

Lipsitz currently owns a 182-82-22 career record after four years at UK and stops at Charlotte (59-24-4 in four years) and Denison (43-10-4 in three years) prior to coming to Lexington.

His .695 career winning percentage is the third highest among active coaches in the Southeastern Conference.

WILDCATS ON NATIONAL TV

The University of Kentucky women's soccer team will see unprecedented media coverage in the 2015 season, as the Wildcats will see all of their games featured on SEC Network+, as well as WatchESPN and the WatchESPN app. In addition to all 13 home matches being available on SECN+, Kentucky's entire SEC slate of matches, home and away, will also be featured on SECN+. The 15 SECN+ matches are in addition to the three already scheduled televised matches, which will remain the same, as the Wildcats will face Ole Miss, Wisconsin and Tennessee on the SEC Network.

SOUTHERN HOME COOKING

UK is 33-7-5 in its last 45 home games, dating back to the 2012 season, with wins over No. 4 Florida (2014), No. 20 Washington, No. 24 South Carolina (2014), No. 13 Florida (2012) and a draw with No. 6 Texas A&M (2012). UK has won its last three NCAA Tournament matches on home soil (UT Martin, Ohio State, SIUE).

GET AHEAD EARLY

Kentucky finished the 2014 season 15-1-0 when scoring the match's first goal, and was a perfect 11-0-0 when leading at the halftime intermission of matches. UK is 9-0-0 this season when scoring the game's first goal and is also a perfect 7-0-0 when leading at the half this season.

PLAYERS SCORING IN BUNCHES

UK has had 11 different players score a goal this season, which is the most in the SEC. Seven players (Swift, Dooley, Klump, Raetzman, Ledman, Keen, Miller) have scored multiple goals, and that also leads the league, with one more than Tennessee.

ARKANSAS BREAKTHROUGH

Kentucky downed the Arkansas Razorbacks on Sunday night at the Bell Soccer Complex, 2-1, picking up its first win over Arkansas since 2011, snapping a series-high four-match losing streak to Arkansas.

HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS

Kentucky finished 2014 tied for the lead in the SEC with a +18 goal differential (TAMU).

The Wildcats are in first in 2015 in second half goal differential in the SEC.

JENSEN'S HEROICS

Freshman keeper Katelyn Jensen was named the NSCAA Division I Women's Player of the Week, as well as the SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 5 after her career-best 13-save effort in a 1-1 draw at No. 12 Florida. Her 13 saves were the most saves in a single match for any UK goalkeeper since 1998, and the third-most saves in a single match in UK program history.

POWER OUTAGE

UK has been shutout for three straight matches for the first time under head coach Jon Lipsitz.

WINNINGEST COACHES IN THE SEC

UK head coach Jon Lipsitz ranks second among league coaches in all-time winning percentage. Lipsitz has posted a .695 percentage throughout his career entering the 2015 season.

KEEN STRIKES FOR FIRST GOAL

Transfer Katy Keen scored her first-career goal in the second half of the "Battle of the Bluegrass" as Kentucky toppled in-state rival Louisville, 1-0. Keen transferred in from Penn State this offseason. It was the game-winning goal. She was named the SEC Player of the Week. She has since scored twice more to bring her season total to three goals.

OLE! OLE! OLE! OLE!

Tanya Samarzich, a player on the full Mexican National Team, scored her first-career goal in just her second appearance with the Wildcats against Ole Miss. It was UK's fourth goal of the match, and assisted by Zoe Swift. She is still in the process of recovering from an ankle injury that cost her a starting spot at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup.

BREAKING ATTENDANCE BARRIERS

Kentucky set a new school and facility record on Sept. 4 as 3,397 fans were at The Bell to watch UK down Louisville, 1-0. It was the largest crowd to ever watch a soccer match at Kentucky, men's or women's.

RECORD RANKING

KEEN ON KENTUCKY

Kentucky picked up Penn State transfer Katy Keen in the offseason. Keen, from Zionsville, Ind., had two assists in her only year in State College last season, including one in the NCAA College Cup Sweet 16 against Virginia Tech. Keen logged over 700 minutes on the pitch for Penn State with a season-high 76 coming against Michigan on Oct. 16. She also logged 10 shots for PSU. Keen has a long and distinguished club career, having been named an All-American, a part of the Olympic Development Program Region II Team since 2010 and has also trained with the United States Women's National Team in 2013. Under head coach Rory Dames, who is currently the head coach of the National Women's Soccer League's Chicago Red Stars, she helped lead the Carmel United to the U-15 National Championship. She has also been a part of the U-18 USWNT player pool in her young career.

CORNERING A BREAKTHROUGH

With Courtney Raetzman scoring directly off of a corner kick, Friday night's result provided an unusual event in UK's season opener vs. Washington. In 2014, UK's first win of the season came off of a direct corner kick from Cara Ledman against Seattle U in the first OT. That marks back-to-back years in which UK's first win of the season came off direct corner kick goals, one of the rarest plays in the sport.

SEASON TICKETS SCARVES ROCKET

With the new season ticket scarves, in addition to the boost created by the FIFA Women's World Cup, UK soccer season ticket sales have more than quadrupled from the 2014 season. The Wildcats have sold over 500 season tickets for women's soccer, and have

already shattered the program record set in 2013 (218).

LIPSITZ ANNOUNCES CAPTAINS FOR 2015

Alex Carter will join seniors Olivia Jester, Cara Ledman and Courtney Raetzman as the leaders of the Wildcats for the upcoming season. Between the four players, there is 36 NCAA Tournament games played in, 10,000 minutes on the pitch, 18 goals scored, five All-SEC selections and has started 193 out of a possible 203 games played in, a starting percentage of .950.

SAMARZICH ADDS SCORING UP TOP

Transfer Tanya Samarzich (USC) decided to transfer to UK this offseason, after sitting out the 2014 season. She will be eligible immediately, as she is transferring in from the University of Southern California. In her one year with the Trojans, she appeared in 14 games, scoring three goals on 17 shots, including two game-winning goals. She played 641 minutes on the pitch, and started two games. Samarzich was a critical part of the Mexican National Team's qualification for the World Cup this summer, as she participated in the World Cup qualifiers from Oct. 14-26 to help get El Tri into its third-straight Women's World Cup. She was named to the 2015 Women's World Cup squad for Mexico and would have participated had it not been for a foot injury that ended her chances of competing this summer in Canada. The injury happened in a pre-World Cup scrimmage against the host country, Canada. At 20 years old, she is the third-youngest member of the Mexican National Team's active roster.

GILLILAND TO THE RED STARS

Arin Gilliland was drafted No. 8 overall in the first round to the Chicago Red Stars, where she will be embarking on her professional soccer career in the National Women's Soccer League. Gilliland is the first-ever Kentucky soccer player to be drafted into any level of professional women's soccer and was the first player that was selected out of the Southeastern Conference.

KENTUCKY PREDICTED TO FINISH THIRD IN THE SEC

The 2014 SEC coaches poll saw the Wildcats predicted to finish third in the 2015 Southeastern Conference season, the league's head coaches predicted in the annual coaches poll. Kentucky finished third a season ago in the SEC, matching its program-best finish. With 140 points, Kentucky also received one first-place vote. Monday marked the first

time under head coach Jon Lipsitz that Kentucky has received a first-place vote.

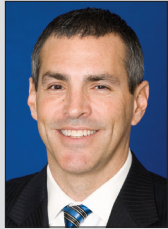

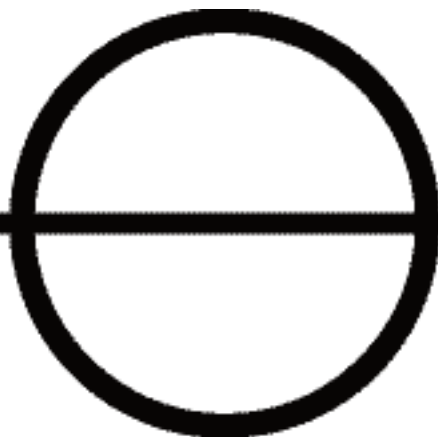
