## WILDCATS AND VOLS CLASH ON HALLOWEEN NIGHT AT THE NEW CWS

With three road tests in a four-week span, Kentucky will break from travel and play host to border rival Tennessee, with kickoff on Saturday slated for 7:30 p.m. ET at The New Commonwealth Stadium. Traditionally an end-of-season game, this will be the first time the teams have met in October since 1909.

Kentucky will be seeking to snap a two-game losing streak overall and improve to level in Southeastern Conference play. UK will travel to Georgia and Vanderbilt following its UT tilt to conclude league action.

The Wildcats are coming off a 42-16 loss at Mississippi State last week. UK got 95 rushing yards from sophomore RB Boom Williams, with QB Patrick Towles tossing 218 yards and WR Dorian Baker leading the club with seven catches for 56 yards. Freshman TE C.J. Conrad had a career game with six catches for 56 yards.

Freshman QB Drew Barker also made his NCAA debut in the fourth quarter, completing 7-of-9 passes for 42 yards and scrambling three times for 20 yards. Defensively, Cory Johnson had a team-high eight tackles, and freshman S Mike Edwards had a career-high seven stops. Senior LB Josh Forrest notched a sack.

Tennessee is coming off a 19-14 loss at No. 8/8 Alabama, with the Vols sustaining close losses at Florida, vs. No. 19/17 Oklahoma and Arkansas, but own a win over No. 19/16 Georgia on Oct. 10.

## QUICK NOTES

- Junior QB Patrick Towles has 4,681 passing yards in his career, ranking sixth in UK history. Towles also ranks sixth in career completions (390). He needs just four yards of total offense to become the sixth player in school history to reach 5,000 total yards, joining UK QB greats Jared Lorenzen, Andre Woodson, Tim Couch, Mike Hartline and Bill Ransdell.
- Sophomore TB Boom Williams has totaled 1,037 rushing yards in just 16 career games. Over the last 30 years, he is the second fastest Wildcat to reach 1,000 career yards, trailing only Moe Williams who reached 1,000 in his 13th game.
- Junior TB Jojo Kemp joins Williams among the 35 Wildcats to achieve 1,000 rushing yards in their careers. Kemp has 1,056 rushing yards in his career. It marks just the sixth time in school history that two Wildcats have reached 1,000 career yards in the same season.
- Kentucky has one of the nation's youngest offenses. The Wildcat offense currently starts one senior, two juniors, seven sophomores and one true freshman.
- Sophomore WR Garrett Johnson leads the team with 512 receiving yards on 33 catches.
- Senior LB Josh Forrest was recruited to Kentucky as a wide receiver, before transitioning to linebacker early in his career. A three-year starter, Forrest has accumulated a club-best 64 tackles this season which ranks sixth in the SEC. He also leads the team in TFL (4.0) and sacks (3.5).
- C.J. Conrad is one of two freshmen in the nation on the John Mackey Award Watch List, given annually to the nation's top tight end. Conrad is coming off a career-high six catch effort at Mississippi State and has 12 grabs for 133 yards on the year.
- UK leads the SEC and ranks tied for 12th nationally in red-zone offense as the Wildcats are 23-for-25 in 2015 with 16 touchdowns and 7-of-7 field goals.
- For the first time in school history, Kentucky's first six games were all decided by eight points or less.
- Kentucky has won 27 consecutive games when staked to a third-quarter lead, the longest streak in the SEC. UK is 9-0 in the coach Mark Stoops era when holding a lead entering the fourth quarter.
- UK has allowed just five passing touchdowns in the first five SEC games, its fewest allowed since 2004 (two).
- The UK campus is in the midst of more than \$1.7 billion of construction projects. UK Athletics is financing \$65 million of the new Academic Science Building, believed to be the first athletic department in the nation to provide the majority of financing for a campus academic building.

## GAME NOTES VS. TENNESSEE

### SERIES RECORD VS. TENNESSEE

- In a series that dates back to 1893, Tennessee has a 77-24-9 advantage.
- The two teams have met annually since 1919, except for 1943, when Kentucky did not field a team. The 110 all-time meetings are the most for UK vs. any one opponent.
- Kentucky won the first meeting in 1893, 56-0 in Knoxville.
- In games played in Lexington, Tennessee holds a 36-14-3 lead in the series, including an 18-3 advantage in Commonwealth Stadium.
- Tennessee had a 26-game winning streak in the series, before UK posted a 10-7 win in 2011 in Lexington, behind the strength of a stout defense and UK senior wide receiver, turned quarterback, Matt Roark.
- UT has won the last three meetings since the 2011 UK win, including the last two under Coach Butch Jones.
- Biggest UK win: 56 (56-0) in 1893 in Knoxville (first-ever meeting)
- Biggest UT win: 52 (52-0) in 1994 in Knoxville
- Games decided by 7 points or less: Tennessee leads 24-11-9

### ON THIS DATE

- Kentucky is 5-9 overall on Oct. 31, including 3-5 at home.
- UK's last game on Halloween was a 31-24 loss to Mississippi State in 2009 in Lexington. UK went on to win its three of its next four games and advance to face Clemson in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl.

### IN THE LAST MEETING IN THE SERIES

- In the 2014 meeting between Kentucky and Tennessee, the Vols posted a 50-16 win in Knoxville.
- UK got an Austin MacGinnis field goal to open the scoring in the first quarter, before UT tallied 30 unanswered points to stretch its lead to 30-3 with four minutes remaining in the first half.
- UT collected 511 total yards of offense, including 297 yards through the air.
- Patrick Towles completed 13-of-25 passes for 168 yards, with senior WR Javess Blue collecting six passes for 131 yards.
- UK LB Josh Forrest had a 20 tackle effort, with Bud Dupree collecting one sack and 14 tackles and LB Ryan Flannigan charting a career-high 12 tackle game.
- UT QB Joshua Dobbs was 19-for-27 through the air with three TDs and 297 yards, also rushing for 48 yards and a score. Jalen Hurd carried it 24 times for 118 yards and a touchdown.

### KENTUCKY/TENNESSEE TIES

- Kentucky has two players on its 2015 roster from the state of Tennessee in senior punter Landon Foster (Franklin) and sophomore quarterback Reese Phillips (Signal Mountain). Foster's dad, Cliff, played safety for the Volunteers under coach Johnny Majors in 1983.
- Tennessee does not have a player on its 2015 roster from the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- UK defensive backs coach, Derrick Ansley, came to Kentucky after coaching one season at Tennessee in 2012.

### A WIN ON SATURDAY WOULD ...

- Improve Kentucky to 5-3 on the year for the second consecutive season, which would mark the first time UK had at least five wins in its first eight games of the year in consecutive seasons since 2007-08.
- Give the Wildcats a 3-3 record in SEC play, marking their first three-win season in league action since 2009.

- Improve UK's record in Commonwealth Stadium to 147-125-4, including 4-2 this season.
- Snap Tennessee's three-game winning streak in the series and give UK coach Mark Stoops his first win over the Vols.
- Give UK just its 15th all-time win at home, including fourth in Commonwealth Stadium vs. the Volunteers.

## SCOUTING THE VOLS

- Tennessee (3-4, 1-3 SEC) is led by third-year head coach Butch Jones, who took over in 2013 after successful coaching tenures at Central Michigan and Cincinnati.
- The Vols are paced by an explosive offensive attack that has generated 415.9 yards per game, including 206.7 yards in the air and 209.1 yards on the ground. UT has averaged 33.9 points per game.
- Defensively, UT has held opponents to 411.1 yards of total offense, including 162.9 yards per game on the ground.
- LB Jalen Reeves-Maybin leads the defense with 67 tackles, including 10.5 tackles for a loss and four sacks. LaDarrell McNeil and Todd Kelly Jr. each have two interceptions.
- QB Joshua Dobbs has charted a strong season, completing 111-of-191 passes for 1,272 yards, throwing just two interceptions and nine TDs. On the ground, Dobbs has five TDs and 387 yards.
- RB Jalen Hurd leads the club with 664 yards rushing on 144 carries, with Alvin Kamara rushing 50 times for 276 yards and three TDs.
- Kamara and Josh Malone lead the team with 19 catches, with Kamara catching two TDs and Josh Malone totaling 212 yards and one TD. Ethan Wolf, Josh Smith and Preston Williams have each caught two TDs.
- Aaron Medley handles field goals for the Vols and is 9-for-17 on the year, with a long of 45. Trevor Daniel has punted 37 times for a 47.1 average, with a long of 61, and 13 dropped inside the 20 and 50 longer than 50 yards.

## BACK-TO-BACK 400

- With 497 total offensive yards vs. Auburn, followed by 423 at Mississippi State, it marked the first time since 2010 that UK had consecutive 400-yard games against SEC opponents.

## COMPARING HISTORICAL QBS

- When comparing the career statistical accomplishments of Kentucky's junior QB Patrick Towles, it ranks among the best in UK history.
- Seven games into his junior season, Towles ranks third in passing yards among UK's legendary QBs at the same point in their junior seasons.

- Towles and Jared Lorenzen are the only two QBs in school history to have at least 10 career rushing touchdowns and at least 20 career passing touchdowns.
- Against Mississippi State, Towles surpassed Rick Norton for sixth place on UK's career passing yards list and now needs 319 more to become the sixth player in school history to reach 5,000 career passing yards.

## TWO BACKS REACH 1,000 CAREER YARDS IN SAME YEAR

- UK running backs Boom Williams and Jojo Kemp each reached the 1,000-yard mark in career rushing this season, marking the sixth time in school history that two Wildcats have reached 1,000 career yards in the same season – also Sonny Collins and Doug Kotar in 1973; Chris Hill and Rod Stewart in 1978; Mark Higgs and Marc Logan in 1985; Damon Hood and Moe Williams in 1994; and Derek Homer and Anthony White in 1998.

## BOOM!

- Against Mississippi State, Boom Williams reached 1,000 yards in the 16th game of his career. Over the last 30 years, he is the second earliest Wildcat to reach 1,000, trailing only Moe Williams, who reached career yard 1,000 in his 13th game.
- He now has 1,037 rushing yards for his career, becoming the 35th player in school history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Williams has totaled 551 rushing yards this season to lead UK's ground attack.
- Williams has 416 rushing yards through the first four SEC games of the season, and had 187 through the first two games of the year, which marked the most by a Kentucky player since Rafael Little in 2005 (197).
- Williams picked up where he left off last season vs. Louisville with consecutive 100+ yard rushing performances to start the season. He became the first player to rush for 100 yards in three consecutive games since Derrick Locke in 2010.



## MILESTONES TO WATCH FOR ...

- Senior punter **Landon Foster** has 227 career punts, qualifying him for UK's career punt records. His career average of 41.9 yards per punt (9,512 yards) ranks him third all-time.
- Junior QB **Patrick Towles** has 4,681 passing yards for his career, ranking sixth in UK history. He needs 883 more to tie Bill Ransdell (1983-86) for fifth.
- Towles** is sixth in completions (390) and needs 79 more to tie Bill Ransdell (469) for fifth.
- Towles** has 390 pass completions and needs 10 more to become the sixth player in school history to reach 400 career passing completions.
- Towles** has 675 career pass attempts and needs 24 more to tie Randy Jenkins (699) for sixth place.
- Towles** has 4,996 yards of total offense in his career and needs four more yards to become the sixth player in school history to reach 5,000 career yards.
- Ryan Timmons** has 944 receiving yards for his career. He needs 56 receiving yards to become the 25th player in school history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Junior RB **Jojo Kemp** has 1,056 yards rushing in his career, ranking 30th in UK history and needs 84 yards to equal Shawn Donigan (1978-82) for 29th in UK annals.
- Sophomore RB **Boom Williams** has 1,037 career rushing yards and ranks 33rd on the career rushing list. He needs five more yards to up to No. 32, 10 to move up to No. 31 and 19 to tie Kemp at No. 30.

- In the win at South Carolina, Williams had the most rushing yards by a Kentucky player in an SEC road win (107) since Derrick Locke against Vanderbilt on November 14, 2009 (144).
- Williams ranks seventh in the SEC in rushing with 343 yards – 85.8 per game – on 47 carries. He has added seven catches for 30 yards.

## LEWIS OUT FOR REGULAR SEASON

- Kentucky senior DT Melvin Lewis has suffered a regular-season ending leg injury, it was announced by Coach Mark Stoops before UK faced Mississippi State. He went through successful surgery on Tuesday, Oct. 20 to repair a broken fibula.
- Lewis is an emotional and physical leader for the Wildcats, serving as one of UK's captains in his first six games of the year. In his first six games of the year, Lewis had 20 tackles and a sack.

## CATS IN THE CLOSE ONES

- UK's first six games were decided by eight points or less. Dating back to 1881, Kentucky has never opened a season with six consecutive games decided by eight points or less.
- The last time UK had six straight games (in the same season) decided by eight or less came in 1975.
- With wins in the first two games it marked the first time UK won consecutive close ones (games decided by seven points or less) since 2006, when the Wildcats defeated Mississippi State (34-31) and Georgia (24-20).

## "FIRSTS" UNDER STOOPS

- Kentucky has experienced several "firsts" this season to boast about:
- The win over South Carolina marked UK's first road win since a 2010 win at Louisville, snapping a 22-game losing skid.
- The USC win was UK's first SEC road win since defeating Georgia in 2009.
- UK's win over Missouri marked its first win over a ranked opponent since upsetting South Carolina in 2010, snapping an 18-game losing streak to ranked teams.
- The win over No. 23/25 Missouri marked Stoops' first win over a ranked opponent and snapped Missouri's 11-game road winning streak, which was the third-longest active streak in the nation.
- The win over No. 23/25 Missouri marked UK's first win over a defending SEC Eastern Division Champion since 2006 vs. Georgia.
- UK's win over Eastern Kentucky marked the first overtime win in the Stoops era and tied for the largest fourth-quarter comeback (behind by 14) in school history.

## GRINDING OUT THE VICTORIES

- One of the goals Coach Mark Stoops established for 2015 was to be a more physical running team, especially when needed at the end of games. UK has been able to do that successfully in wins this season.
- Tied at 33 with 4:37 left against UL Lafayette in the season opener, Kentucky went on a 58-yard drive for the game-winning touchdown. Seven of the nine plays on the drive were running plays, including a 12-yard run by Mikel Horton for the touchdown.
- Clinging to a 26-22 lead at South Carolina with 4:32 remaining. UK ran out the clock with nine straight rushing plays, earning three first downs in the process.
- Nursing a 21-13 advantage over Missouri with 2:26 left in the game, UK ran the ball seven consecutive

# Commonwealth Stadium

*On game day, Commonwealth Stadium often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.*

- The Wildcats are in their 43rd season at Commonwealth Stadium, their first in the newly \$120 million renovated venue.
- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 275 games within the friendly confines of Commonwealth Stadium. UK has a 146-125-4 record in CWS (.542), 10-9 under Mark Stoops.
- UK announced its first sellout since 2010 when 62,933 fans attended the season opener vs. Louisiana Lafayette on Sept. 5.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 63,030 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance for 13 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years.
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

## Commonwealth Stadium Renovations:

Through a \$120-million reinvention, Commonwealth Stadium has been transformed into a state-of-the-art facility. As the Kentucky football program enters a new era, the Big Blue Nation will enjoy an intimate game-day atmosphere to match. The experience will begin outside the stadium, as the longtime home of the Wildcats will undergo a dramatic external facelift. The new Commonwealth Stadium has taken on a modern look, but one that remains uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Commonwealth has been reduced over the course of the two-year project, but the value of all remaining seats will be increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses have been revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches will reap the benefits of the new Commonwealth Stadium as well, as new home-team facilities will be built, while a new multi-purpose recruiting room will play host to future Wildcats on their on-campus visits. ## Facts and Figures on Commonwealth Stadium:

Seating Capacity: 61,000, including the Commonwealth Suites.

Playing Field: UK switched from natural grass to synthetic turf for the 2015 season. Other SEC schools with a turf surface are: Arkansas, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Missouri.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage. The interior seating bowl also has LED ribbon boards.

Sound System: Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

## Game Day Experiences

The "Cat Walk": Fans are encouraged to greet the team when the Wildcats arrive for the "Cat Walk." The team buses will arrive at the Nutter Field House approximately two hours and 15 minutes before the game and the players will make the "Cat Walk" to their stadium entry point at Gate 1. Fans are encouraged to line up on the sidewalk and cheer the players as they enter the stadium. A siren will be sounded while the team buses are on their way to the stadium. That's the fans' cue to proceed to the Cat Walk area to greet the team.

Wildcat Park: Fans of all ages, but especially the younger Wildcats, will enjoy playing at the newly named Wildcat Park, located outside of the southwest corner (outside Gate 9) of Commonwealth Stadium. There are inflatable games that are available two hours before kickoff.

- After a \$120-million reinvention, Kentucky has had consecutive sell-out crowds in The New CWS for the first time since 2009.
- In the opening-win over UL Lafayette, 62,933 filled the 61,000 capacity stadium, and in the SEC home opener vs. Florida, a crowd of 63,040 filled The New CWS. Despite inclement weather, a total of 63,380 attended UK's matchup with in-state foe ECU, a record in The New CWS.
- The UK-Auburn game, UK's first home Thursday game since 1939, marked a new high of 63,407 at The New CWS.

## STABLE OF RUNNING BACKS

- Kentucky is blessed to be able to go four deep on the running back depth chart, including sophomores Boom Williams and Mikel Horton, junior Jojo Kemp and freshman Sihem King.
- Williams leads the running-back group with 551 yards on 81 carries, adding three TDs.
- Kemp has carried it 58 times for 251 yards, including two TDs. Horton, a physical bruiser, has three touchdowns on 38 carries and 105 yards.
- An explosive talent, King got his first extended action at MSU and has eight carries for 32 yards.
- UK's running backs have combined to average 5.2 yards per carry, collecting 939 yards on 181 carries.

## KEMP REACHES 1,000 CAREER YARDS

- During the Missouri game, Jojo Kemp became the 34th player in school history to reach 1,000 rushing yards in his career. He now has 1,053 yards to rank 30th in UK history.
- Kemp rushed for 66 yards on 13 carries vs. Mizzou and helped close the game with a flourish, running the ball four straight times and helping generate two first downs as UK ran out the final 2:56 of the game.

## UK LEADS SEC IN HOLDING THIRD-QUARTER LEADS

- Kentucky has won 27 consecutive games when staked to a lead at the end of the third quarter, dating back to a 2008 loss vs. South Carolina.
- UK is 8-0 in the Mark Stoops era when holding a third-quarter lead.
- Kentucky leads the SEC with its 27 consecutive wins when staked to a third-quarter lead.

## NOT JUST PASS CATCHERS

- A key element of the Kentucky running game is the dedication of the UK receivers in blocking. Wide receivers coach Tommy Mainord has developed a reputation as coaching units that emphasize run blocking, dating back to his time at Texas Tech, Lamar and Sam Houston State.
- UK has several big bodies to contribute to the run game, including 6-foot-5 Blake Bone and 6-3 Dorian Baker.

## TOTH A CANDIDATE FOR RIMINGTON TROPHY

- Kentucky currently boasts two upperclassmen starters on the offensive line, including senior left tackle Jordan Swindle and junior center Jon Toth.
- A 6-foot-5, 310-pound product of Indianapolis, Toth (pronounced "Toeth" with a long "o" sound) has started 25 consecutive games. He was a 2013 SEC All-Freshman Team selection by the league coaches and was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week after UK rolled to 656 total yards vs. UT Martin in 2014.
- Toth is on the preseason Rimington Trophy Watch List, given to the nation's top center.

## CONRAD ON MACKAY AWARD WATCH LIST

- Kentucky's C.J. Conrad has been named to the midseason watch list for the 2015 John Mackey Award, given annually to the nation's best tight end, it was announced on Wednesday afternoon. Conrad, a 6-foot-5, 245-pound product of LaGrange, Ohio, is one of just two freshman tight ends in the nation honored on the Mackey Award Midseason Watch List.
- Conrad has started four of UK's seven games, emerging as a notable weapon in run and pass blocking. In UK's win over No. 23/25 Missouri, Conrad broke out as a receiving option, nabbing three catches for 57 yards and a touchdown. Following the UK win, Conrad was named one of two honorable mentions for the Mackey Tight End of the Week award.
- The John Mackey Award has been presented since 2000 and includes 13 former winners who have graduated to the NFL. The Mackey Award is determined by a selection committee and will be announced on Dec. 9 at the College Football Awards.
- Conrad ranks fifth on the team with 12 catches, collecting 133 yards and one TD. He posted career highs with six catches for 56 yards at Mississippi State.

## BIG GEORGE

- Among the three true freshman starting for Kentucky in the season opener was right tackle George Asafo-Adjei, a 6-foot-5, 325-pound product of West Chester, Ohio.
- Asafo-Adjei enrolled in January in order to participate in spring practice and has consistently been praised by coaches and teammates for his ability and strength. He started the first two games this season.

## BIG-PLAY BADET

- Speedy sophomore wide receiver Jeff Badet has been a big-play performer for the Wildcats. So far this season, he has long balls of 37 yards (touchdown), 43 yards, 45 yards, 36 yards (touchdown) and 27 yards. His average of 15.6 yards per reception is tops for UK.

## STAMPS LEADS SECONDARY

- Kentucky's secondary is led by senior safety A.J. Stamps, a preseason third-team All-SEC selection by the league coaches and media.
- Stamps, a junior college transfer in 2014, has started all 19 games of his UK career, owning 90 tackles, four

interceptions and 10 pass break-ups.

## WR TURNED LB, FORREST NOW A TACKLING MACHINE

- Kentucky's front seven is led by senior linebacker Josh Forrest, a native of Paducah, Ky., who was recruited to UK as a wide receiver but transitioned to a linebacker as a freshman.
- Forrest is coming off a season where he ranked third in the SEC in tackles per game and had 110 stops. He is picking up right where he left off as he currently leads the team and ranks sixth overall in the SEC with 9.1 tackles per game (64). His 4.0 tackles for loss, including 3.5 sacks are team highs.
- As a former wide receiver, Forrest excels in pass defense. He leads the team along with safety A.J. Stamps and defensive back Chris Westry with five passes defended. He also has a team-high tying two QB hurries and one interception this season. His pickoff on the final play against UL Lafayette sealed UK's 40-33 victory.
- Forrest had a 15-tackle effort in the season opener and had seven tackles in the win at South Carolina. His fourth pass break-up of the season helped UK force South Carolina to a key field goal attempt in the second half in the red zone.
- In UK's win over EKU, Forrest was one of three Wildcats to earn double-digit tackles, his seventh career 10+ tackle effort.

## WESTRY ONE OF NATION'S TOP DEFENDERS

- CB Chris Westry is one of just 17 freshmen in the nation and one of four SEC freshmen to have intercepted at least two passes in 2015 (the others in the SEC are Carlton Davis of Auburn and Minkah Fitzpatrick and Ronnie Harrison of Alabama). His second interception of the season came against Mississippi State was when he nabbed a second-quarter bomb by Dak Prescott. It marked Prescott's first interception of the season, snapping a streak of 288 consecutive passes without interception.

## WESTRY NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK AFTER USC WIN

- A native of Orange Park, Fla., Chris Westry's big performance was highlighted by the interception to clinch the game – his first career pick off. It helped UK to its first win at South Carolina since 1999. The 6-foot-4 corner added his first career sack in the second quarter, forcing the Gamecocks to punt. In the third quarter, Westry had a pair of big plays, including a quarterback hurry to thwart a USC drive, and then recording a key pass breakup in the end zone on a fade route to force a field-goal attempt.

## FOSTER NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Senior punter Landon Foster has been named to the 2015 Allstate AFCA (American Football Coaches Association) Good Works Team®. Landon is one of 22 student-athletes selected, including one of just 11 Football Bowl Subdivision players, honored for making a positive impact on others and their communities.

Foster has been very involved in community service projects during his time at Kentucky. In May of 2014, he represented UK Football on a week-long community service trip to Ethiopia where he interacted with residents of impoverished communities, visited imprisoned men, helped widows, cared for orphans, and helped renovate houses. On the trip, he befriended a 14-year-old boy living in the streets of Korah named Dejene. He was so moved by the boy's resilience and character to succeed despite his circumstances that Foster worked through an organization called "Adoption Ministry of Youth with a Mission" to pay out of his own pocket to sponsor Dejene. He sent his own money for four months to help pay for his food, clothing, shelter and schooling until Dejene (now named Joshua) was able to move to America with a family from North Carolina.

Foster's other community service activities include being a frequent visitor to Indian Summer Camp, a cancer survivor camp for kids ages 6-11. He volunteers to speak at local elementary schools and other summer camps and he has taken blankets to Kentucky Children's Hospital and served as a "Breakfast with Santa"

**FAMILY TIES AT KENTUCKY**

- OL Zach Myers is the son of former UK offensive lineman Brad Myers (1984-87). Brad blocked for three of the top rushers in UK history - George Adams, Mark Higgs and Marc Logan.
- There is one set of twins on the team this season in defenders Daron and Zack Blaylock.
- UK junior wide receiver Ryan Timmons has a twin sister named Raven, who is a student assistant in the football office.

**\$165 MILLION OF FOOTBALL CONSTRUCTION**

Kentucky has two major football construction projects in process, totaling \$165 million investment in the Wildcat program.

A \$120 million "reimagining" of Commonwealth Stadium was completed for the 2015 season.

The project features a new look for the exterior of the stadium, wider and redesigned concourses, new concession stands and restrooms, new suites and other premium seating, a recruiting room and a new press box.

In addition, construction began in January 2015 on a new \$45 million practice/office complex being built on the south side of the existing Nutter Field House. The comprehensive complex features state-of-the-art practice, office and support facilities for the players and coaches. Completion is planned in time for the 2016 season.

**DID YOU KNOW?**

- This is the 125th season of intercollegiate football for the UK football program.
- Kentucky is in its third season under head coach Mark Stoops, who has energized the UK fan base with record-setting recruiting classes, facility upgrades and an influx in talent.
- The Wildcats are in their first season under offensive coordinator Shannon Dawson, who joined the UK staff from West Virginia.
- Three current Wildcats traveled to Ethiopia in May for a week-long service trip - Alex Montgomery, Austin MacGinnis and Marcus McWilson.
- Three current Wildcats traveled to Prague, Czech Republic for a two-week leadership class this summer - Landon Foster, Jordan Swindle and Zach West
- The Kentucky cheerleaders have won an unprecedented 20 national cheerleading championships, including 16 of the last 20, at the annual Universal Cheerleaders Association championships.
- Kentucky is one of only 10 schools that have won an NCAA men's basketball championship while also having a claim on a national championship in football.
- UK is one of only seven universities in the U.S. that have programs in agriculture, engineering, law, medicine and pharmacy on a single campus.
- UK great kick returner Derek Abney (2000-03), who set or tied seven NCAA records, has been named to the Football Writers Association 75th Anniversary Team. Abney totaled eight kick-return touchdowns in his career.

**ART STILL SELECTED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME**

Art Still, whose dominance at defensive end helped lead Kentucky to some of its greatest moments in school history, was named to the College Football Hall of Fame by the National Football Foundation.

Originally from Camden, N.J., Still played at Kentucky from 1974-77 under Coach Fran Curci. Still helped the Wildcats to a 19-4 record in his final two seasons. UK went 9-3 in his junior year, winning a share of the Southeastern Conference championship, and capped the season with a 21-0 blanking of North Carolina in the Peach Bowl. The Cats were ranked 18th in the final Associated Press poll.

UK posted a 10-1 mark in his senior season, finishing the campaign No. 6 in the final AP ranking. The Wildcats went 7-3 against Top-20 ranked teams his last two seasons, winning the last five in a row vs. ranked foes Florida, North Carolina, West Virginia, at Penn State and at LSU. Paced by Still's dominating performances, Kentucky led the SEC in total defense and rushing defense.

Still was a four-year starter who totaled 327 tackles during his career, an amazing figure for a defensive end. Quarterback sacks were not kept during his career and tackles for loss are available only for his senior year, when he compiled 22 TFL - a school record that "Still" stands.

One interesting fact about Still is that he also saw significant action on offense as a tight end in short-yardage or goalline situations, averaging approximately 15 plays per game and frequently helping pave the way for touchdowns or first downs. Kentucky rushed for 269.1 yards per game in 1976, the second-highest mark in school history, and rushed for 228.7 yards per game in 1977.

Still was a unanimous first-team All-America selection in 1977 as chosen by AP, United Press International, Football Writers Association of America, the American Football Coaches Association, Newspaper Enterprise Association, Walter Camp Football Foundation, The Sporting News and Football News.

Still was a finalist for the Lombardi Award and the UPI National Lineman of the Year. He was the Brooks-Irvine Memorial Football Club of South Jersey College Player of the Year.

## THURSDAY REWIND: AUBURN OUTLASTS UK COMEBACK BID

- Seeking its fifth win of the season and its first over Auburn at home since 1966, Kentucky fell behind to the Tigers and mounted a fierce rally. UK's comeback was spurred by a strong second-half defense and 17 points in the second period, but lost the ball on downs at the Auburn 43 with 25 seconds to thwart UK's comeback attempt.
- UK was led on the ground offensively by 113 yards and two TDs from Boom Williams. Patrick Towles notched his fifth career and second consecutive game of 300+ passing yards, throwing for 359 yards, with sophomore WR Garrett Johnson's 160 receiving yards on nine catches marking the most for a UK wide out since 2010.
- Defensively, Marcus McWilson tied his career high with 10 tackles, equaling his output at LSU in 2014.

## MIZZOU WIN: UK TOPPLES FIRST RANKED FOE IN STOOPS ERA

- Kentucky posted a 21-13 win over No. 23/25 Missouri to improve to 2-1 in conference play and 3-1 overall.
- UK fell behind before QB Patrick Towles scampered for a 14-yard touchdown to even the game at halftime. UK's offense then went to work with a pair of TD drives, including a 24-yard TD pass from Towles to freshman TE C.J. Conrad in the third quarter for a 14-10 lead, and a five-yard strike to WR Dorian Baker for a 21-10 advantage with 6:20 remaining in the fourth quarter. UK's defense then held Mizzou to a field goal with three minutes remaining and junior RB Jojo Kemp helped UK churn out the clock for its first win over a ranked foe since 2010.

## DEFENSIVE NUGGETS VS. FLORIDA

- Kentucky did not allow a UF score in the second half, the first time the Cats have shut out an opponent in the 2nd half since vs. ULM on Oct. 11, 2014.
- Kentucky allowed their fewest points vs. Florida (14) since Nov. 15, 1986 (3).
- Kentucky allowed their fewest yards of total offense against Florida (245) since Nov. 15, 1986 (241).
- Kentucky held Florida scoreless in the second half for just the third time in the last 30 seasons (1986, 2005, 2015).
- Kentucky held Florida to less than 60 offensive plays for just the third time in the last 30 seasons (1986, 2008, 2015).

## UK OPENS THE NEW CWS AND 2015 WITH WIN OVER UL LAFAYETTE

- Kentucky opened the game with a 75-yard touchdown rush from sophomore tailback Boom Williams, marking the first UK touchdown on the first play from scrimmage since 2009 vs. Eastern Kentucky.
- UK totaled the next 14 points to stretch its lead on touchdown passes of at least 35 yards to Garrett Johnson and Jeff Badet, with Badet returning to the field after missing 2014 due to injury.
- Lafayette then rallied with its first touchdown run

but UK answered with a pair of Austin MacGinnis field goals to take a 27-7 lead.

- After UK owned a 33-10 lead in the third quarter, ULL then scored 23 straight points to even the game at 33-33 with 3:34 left in regulation.
- The Wildcats then went on a 58-yard drive on nine plays, with sophomore tailback Mikel Horton breaking loose for a 12-yard touchdown run with 57 seconds remaining.
- Senior LB Josh Forrest then picked off the final pass of the game to clinch the win.
- UK's offense went for 435 yards in the win, charting a pair of 90-yard drives in the first quarter, including a 99-yard drive to take a 14-point lead.
- QB Patrick Towles threw for 257 yards and a career-high equaling three TDs, with sophomores Jeff Badet, Garrett Johnson and Blake Bone sharing in the TD grabs.
- Sophomore TB Boom Williams, whose 75-yard TD run to open the game was the longest of his career, finished with a career-best 135 yards on just 10 carries.
- Sophomore TB Mikel Horton's game-winning touchdown run in the fourth quarter was his third career TD.
- Senior LB Josh Forrest had a dynamic game in leading UK to the season-opening win. Forrest had 15 tackles, defending three passes and hauling in the game-clinching interception as time expired. He added a sack, with his pick the fourth of his career.

## NEW OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR FOR THE WILDCATS

Kentucky brought in a new offensive coordinator during the offseason as Shannon Dawson takes over for Neal Brown, who is now the head coach at Troy.

The players' adaptation in the spring was not as drastic as one might think. Dawson and Brown have similar systems, each coming from the coaching tree whose roots are in the Hal Mumme offensive philosophy.

Dawson spent the previous four years at West Virginia, the last three as offensive coordinator, and the Mountaineers threw for more than 3,000 yards each season. In 2014, WVU ranked in the nation's top 12 in total offense and passing offense, averaging almost 500 yards and 33.5 points per game. In addition to the success throwing the ball, WVU also had a physical running attack, averaging more than 180 yards per game.

Dawson also was offensive coordinator at Stephen F. Austin (2008-10) and Millsaps College (2006-07). He built dynamic offenses while helping engineer dramatic turnarounds at each school, as those teams won four conference championships during that five-year period.

- Kentucky will play eight home games in 2015, joining the 2007 season as the only years in school history that the Wildcats have had eight home contests.
- Kentucky's first nine opponents in 2015 advanced to postseason play last year. All totaled, 10 of UK's 12 opponents were in the postseason – nine bowl teams plus FCS playoff participant Eastern Kentucky.

• It will be Kentucky's first-ever meeting with Charlotte. Charlotte will play its first season as an FBS team (Conference USA) in 2015.

• For the second consecutive season, the UK-Louisville game will be on the final weekend of the regular season. Prior to 2014, the UK-UofL game had been played early in the season since the series renewed in 1994.

• Kentucky and Tennessee will face off in the month of October for the first time since 1909. It will only be the fourth time in UK's 125-year history it has faced Tennessee in the month of October.

• The Wildcats will have a four-game home stretch from Sept. 19 to Oct. 15, marking the longest home-stand since the 2001 team started the season with four straight home games.

• Kentucky's game against Auburn will be on Thursday, Oct. 15. It will be the first Thursday home game since 1939.

• UK ends the regular season with consecutive non-conference games for the first time since it entered the SEC in 1933.

## KENTUCKY 40, LOUISIANA LAFAYETTE 33

SEPT. 5, 2015 • LEXINGTON, KY.

### THE NEW CWS (62,933)



Anticipation. Electricity. And then a Boom. Williams, that is.

Kentucky's Stanley "Boom" Williams raced 75 yards for a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage to open the 2015 season and The New Commonwealth Stadium in storybook fashion. But, the Wildcats would need a storybook ending to fend off a late UL Lafayette charge.

Sophomore running back Mikel Horton scampered 12 yards for a touchdown with 57 seconds remaining to lift UK to a 40-33 win over visiting UL Lafayette in front of a sellout crowd of 62,933 fans.

After jumping out to a 23-point advantage behind three touchdown passes from junior Patrick Towles, Boom's rushing touchdown and two field goals, Kentucky yielded 23 consecutive points to the Ragin' Cajuns

in less than nine minutes of play to tie the score at 33.

UL Lafayette forced the home team into a three-and-out to take over possession with a chance at seizing the lead with 6:58 remaining. UK senior lineman Melvin Lewis stuffed Louisiana's Elijah McGuire for a three-yard loss to help force the Cajuns into a punt, setting the stage for Horton and the offense.

Needing a score, UK generated a nine-play, 58-yard game-winning drive. Kentucky's offense benefited from two 15-yard penalties during the winning push, but Horton was able to take advantage of the miscues to lift Kentucky to the win.

Kentucky quarterback Patrick Towles threw for 257 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. UK generated 435 yards of total offense. Williams secured his third-career 100-yard rushing game on 10 carries for 135 yards, which included the opening-drive score. Horton carried six times for 28 yards and the final touchdown. Sophomore Garrett Johnson led the receiving corps with five catches for 85 yards and a touchdown. Five receivers snared at least one ball for 30 or more receiving yards, and three different receivers caught touchdowns from Towles.

Senior linebacker Josh Forrest paced the defensive effort with 15 tackles, including a sack, three pass breakups and the game-clinching interception. Junior corner J.D. Harmon was a part of two turnovers for the Cats. He forced a fumble deep in Kentucky's territory to end a lengthy Ragin' Cajun drive in the opening quarter before picking off a pass in the second quarter. Lewis added nine tackles to the defensive effort.

## KENTUCKY 26, SOUTH CAROLINA 22

SEPT. 12, 2015 • COLUMBIA, S.C.

### WILLIAMS BRICE STADIUM (82,178)



It was a tale of two halves, with Kentucky's offense scoring 24 unanswered first-half points before the Wildcat defense made big play after big play in the second half, securing a 26-22 victory over South Carolina in front of 82,178 at Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia, S.C.

Heading into halftime with a 24-7 lead, South Carolina scored the first 15 points of the second half, including three Elliott Fry field goals and a 33-yard touchdown pass from Perry Orth – who was playing for injured Gamecock quarterback Connor Mitch – to Jerrell Adams, to cut the UK lead to 24-22.

The Gamecocks decided to go for the two-point conversion to try to tie the game before freshman Denzil Ware scooped up a fumble and returned it 98 yards for two points to give UK a 26-22 lead with 8:09 to go in the game.

After a short drive by the UK offense, South Carolina started another drive on a tired Kentucky defense before another freshman made a big play with rookie cornerback Chris Westry earning his first-career interception to put the Wildcats back in the driver's seat.

The Wildcat offense, which struggled for much of the second half, sealed the victory from there, taking the final 4:32 off the clock, including a key 11-yard quarterback drive by Patrick Towles on third down to drain the Gamecocks of timeouts. Sophomore Stanley "Boom" Williams took over from there with a 25-yard rush to end the game.

The victory for Kentucky broke a 22-game losing streak in road games with the Wildcats last road win coming at Louisville in Sept. 2010. Kentucky's last SEC road victory was at Georgia in Nov. 2009. UK is now 2-0 on the season and starts conference play with a victory for the first time since defeating Arkansas in 2007 in Fayetteville.

Towles was in command in the first half through the air, going 21-for-29 overall for 192 yards. The junior signal caller threw his only interception on the first drive of the game that set up South Carolina deep in Kentucky territory with Mitch rushing in from one-yard out to give USC a 7-0 lead with 12:03 to play in the first quarter.

That was all the Gamecocks would get offensively in the first half as Kentucky rattled off the next 24 points to end the half, starting with an eight-yard rush from Horton to tie the game 7-7. Kemp got in on the scoring later in the first quarter, completing an eight-play drive with a two-yard rush for a touchdown to give Kentucky a 14-7 lead.

A USC missed field goal gave possession back to Kentucky with 2:46 to go in the half and Towles and Co. took advantage. After a 20-yard completion to Dorian Baker, Towles connected to Jeff Badet for 43 yards to the USC 11-yard line to set up a 1-yard rush from Towles with 17 seconds to go in the half to give UK a 24-7 lead.

## FLORIDA 14, KENTUCKY 9

SEPT. 19, 2015 • LEXINGTON, KY.

### THE NEW CWS (63,040)



Despite a sparkling defensive effort in which the Kentucky football team held Florida scoreless in the second half, a fourth-quarter rally fell short as Florida prevailed 14-9 on Saturday night in a front of a sold-out Commonwealth Stadium.

Trailing 14-3 going into the fourth quarter, the Wildcats made it a one-score game behind two Austin MacGinnis field goals. UK had the ball twice over the final five minutes in an attempt to score the go-ahead touchdown but Florida held on for the win.

Kentucky's defense stymied the Gator attack for the entire second half. Five Wildcats registered six or more tackles on the night, led by Khalid Henderson's nine stops. UK posted three tackles for a loss and J.D. Harmon picked off a pass in the end zone to halt a Florida drive in the middle of the third quarter that would have

pushed UF's lead to three scores. The interception sparked a momentum change in the game as UK would go on to put together back-to-back scoring drives.

Following Harmon's interception in the third quarter, Patrick Towles' 33-yard quarterback scramble highlighted a 75-yard drive by the Wildcats to inch closer at 14-6 with 14:50 in the fourth. MacGinnis connected on a 22-yard field goal for the Wildcats to make it a one-possession game.

After the UK defense forced a three-and-out, MacGinnis made it a five-point contest with 10:57 to go with a 45-yard field goal. Towles found Jeff Badet for a 45-yard strike down the left sideline to push the Wildcats into field-goal range as the drive's highlight.

Following UK's third field goal of the game, Florida managed one first down before being forced to punt with 8:34 remaining. Faced with a third-and-10 from its own 22, Towles found Baker open on the right sideline to keep the drive alive. Williams followed with a 14-yard rush, but the drive stalled at UK's 48.

The Gators picked up two first downs and killed 3:44 of clock before punting back to the Wildcats, which began the final drive at their own 20. Towles and Baker hooked up for a 20-yard gain on fourth-and-3 at the Kentucky 27 to keep the drive alive. On a subsequent fourth-down play, Towles' deep ball down the left side line intended for Ryan Timmons was picked off to preserve the Gators' victory.

Florida opened the game's scoring with a 1-yard run by Will Grier on fourth down to go ahead 7-0. Kentucky answered with a 14-play, 64-yard drive that resulted in a MacGinnis 29-yard field goal to make the score 7-3.

In the second quarter, the Gators put together an 11-play, 67-yard drive, which ended in a 34-yard field goal attempt by Austin Hardin that was subsequently blocked by UK's CJ Johnson to preserve the 7-3 score.

The visitors capped the half by marching 57 yards for a three-yard plunge by running back Kelvin Taylor to push UF's lead to 14-3 with 14 seconds remaining.

## KENTUCKY 21, MISSOURI 13

SEPT. 26, 2015 • LEXINGTON, KY.

### THE NEW CWS (58,008)



Patrick Towles guided Kentucky to two second-half touchdowns, while pacing the Wildcats to a 21-13 victory over No. 25 Missouri and a myriad of firsts on Saturday night at Commonwealth Stadium. The win was UK's first league victory at the New Commonwealth Stadium and its first win over a ranked foe since 2010.

Towles directed scoring drives in the third and fourth quarters to ignite the offensive effort in the second half. The junior found C.J. Conrad for a 24-yard strike before connecting with Dorian Baker with less than seven minutes to play to give the Wildcats an 11-point lead it would not relinquish.

Towles had his most consistent game of the season, connecting on 22-of-27 passes for 249 yards with the two touchdown passes. He also added a 14-yard scamper for a score in the opening half.

Defensively, lineman C.J. Johnson paced the Wildcats with 11 tackles, besting his career high by five. Senior linebacker Josh Forrest added nine tackles, while junior end/linebacker Jason Hatcher posted eight stops to aid the stout defensive effort.

Garrett Johnson led the team in receiving with a season-high 119 yards, including a long of 35 yards that matched his season best. Conrad had a breakout game, not only recording his first career catch but also his first career touchdown with 55 yards of offense through the air. Baker also had a standout game, matching his career high of 51 yards and recording the second touchdown of his career.

Mizzou was the first team of the night to scratch the scoreboard, using two third-down conversions to reach the red zone. With 17 yards between himself and the end zone, Mauk tossed a lob to an open J'Mon Moore for a touchdown with a successful extra point to give the Tigers the 7-0 advantage with 3:42 remaining in the opening quarter.

Following a rocky start to the drive that found the Wildcats in a first-and-29 situation, Towles found Johnson for consecutive 20-plus-yard throws to move the chains and get UK into Missouri territory for the first time in the contest. Towles used the opening play of the second quarter to dodge and weave through the Tiger defense for a rushing touchdown. That knotted the score at seven apiece.

A Missouri field goal made the score 10-7 before sophomore running back Jojo Kemp acted as the catalyst for the team, as three of his carries totaled a combined 37 yards, giving UK a first-and-goal late in the third quarter to set up the Conrad touchdown and put UK on top 14-10.

Kentucky continued to pour it on offensively in the final quarter, taking to the air again when Towles first found Johnson for a 35-yard reception, matching the wide receiver's season long, before Baker pulled in a 25-yard toss on the sideline.

Another pass to Johnson, fanned out to the left sideline for a 24-yarder, put the Wildcats within five yards of the end zone. Towles then found Baker on a 5-yard lob for his first touchdown of the season and the second of his career, putting UK up 21-10 over the Tigers with 6:20 left in the game.

The Tigers looked like they would soon answer back with a touchdown, quickly making their way through Kentucky territory. Despite their momentum, the staunch UK red zone defense, led by a pass breakup followed by a quarterback hurry by Ryan Flannigan, once again forced Missouri to concede a field-goal attempt. Baggett's 24-yard attempt was good, but the Wildcats were able to close out the final 2:56 of the game with a pair of first downs.

## KENTUCKY 34, EKU 27

### OCT. 3, 2015 • LEXINGTON, KY.

#### THE NEW CWS (63,380)



Despite trailing by 14 points with less than eight minutes in the fourth quarter, the Kentucky football team celebrated its 100th Homecoming anniversary at The New CWS in thrilling fashion, notching a 34-27 comeback overtime victory over in-state foe Eastern Kentucky University.

Kentucky rallied from a 27-13 deficit late in the fourth quarter with back-to-back touchdown drives. Facing a fourth-and-3 at the end of regulation, Patrick Towles stood in the face of a blitz and found Dorian Baker for a 5-yard touchdown to force overtime.

The duo connected again in overtime with a 3-yard pitch-and-catch to take a 34-27 lead. CJ Johnson, who recorded 19 tackles, the most by a defensive lineman in program history, fittingly sealed the outcome with a game-clinching sack.

The outcome tied the school record for biggest fourth-quarter comeback in school history – previously set a year ago when UK rallied from 14 down in the final stanza to win vs. South Carolina.

Towles rebounded from a two-interception first half to lead the offense for the Wildcats, connecting on 29-of-42 pass attempts for 329 yards and three touchdowns to go along with a rushing score.

The duo of Baker and Blake Bone carried the offense in receiving with 86 and 85 yards, respectively. Both bested their career highs by more than 20 yards each, and Baker's two touchdowns, which included the game-tying and game-winning catches, is a career best for the wide receiver.

Kentucky stayed in the game thanks to standout defensive performances by a number of players. Eight of Johnson's 19 tackles were solo stops, including a sack and two-and-a-half tackles for loss. Ryan Flannigan was one tackle off his career best with 11 tackles, Josh Forrest recorded double-digit tackles with 10 stops on the night, and Farrington Huguenin blocked a field goal and recovered a fumble.

For the Colonels, Bennie Coney paced the offense with 19-of-32 passing for 183 yards and two touchdowns. The pair of Thomas Ethan and Dy'Shawn Mobley combined for 158 of EKU's 180 rushing yards with 84 yards and 74 yards, respectively. Mobley also led the team in receiving with 50 yards on five catches.

## AUBURN 30, KENTUCKY 27

### OCT. 15, 2015 • LEXINGTON, KY.

#### THE NEW CWS (63,407)



Kentucky scored 17 second-half points and rallied to within one score, but the Auburn Tigers held on for a 30-27 win in front of 63,407 fans in The New CWS in the first Thursday night primetime game in program history.

Auburn earned a 10-point advantage at 30-20 with less than eight minutes to play before the Wildcats pulled to within three following a Mikel Horton 1-yard plunge. Kentucky got the ball back at its own 15-yard line with 2:12 remaining and drove into Auburn territory, but lost the ball on downs as the Tigers clinched the victory.

Auburn took little time in taking an early lead thanks to the combination of Sean White and Ricardo Louis moving the chains with a pair of 20-plus-yard receptions. Once in the red zone, the Tigers turned to Peyton Barber to carry the ball in for a 1-yard rushing touchdown and a 7-0 advantage with just under four minutes into the quarter.

The Wildcats quickly retaliated, covering 75 yards on just six plays. Boom Williams broke through the Auburn defense and tore away for a 60-yard dash to put the Wildcats at first-and-goal from the 3-yard line. Williams completed the drive with consecutive rushes, tying the game at 7-7.

Three Daniel Carlson field goals and a Kerryon Johnson TD rush allowed Auburn to open up a 23-10 halftime lead.

Kentucky came out energized in the second half, with Patrick Towles spreading out the offense through the air as Johnson, Jeff Badet and Dorian Baker combined for 50 receiving yards to set up Williams for a 13-yard rush along the left sideline. Williams shouldered his way through the Auburn line and extended his arm with the ball in hand to complete a 6-yard rush for his second touchdown of the game. Within just over three minutes' time, the Wildcats were within six points of the Tigers, 23-17.

The Wildcats' defense came up with some impactful plays following the touchdown, forcing Auburn to concede a punt on consecutive drives. Highlighted by a 13-yard rush by Towles and an 11-yard pass to C.J. Conrad, who pulled two Auburn defenders along with him to give the team a first down, UK was able to lessen the deficit to 23-20 with 1:03 remaining in the quarter after an Austin MacGinnis field goal.

The fourth quarter saw the Tigers retaliate, aided by a 34-yard pass to Louis to reach the red zone. Barber added another rushing touchdown with 7:56 remaining in the contest, as the Wildcats fell behind 30-20.

With plenty of fight left, Kentucky answered back immediately. Towles found Blake Bone for an 11-yard pass and later launched to Badet on the Auburn 2-yard line for a 27-yard catch. Horton scored for the Wildcats on a 1-yard rush, once more bringing the Blue and White within three points of the Tigers, 30-27.

## MISSISSIPPI STATE 42, KENTUCKY 16

### OCT. 24, 2015 • STARKVILLE, MISS.

#### DAVIS WADE STADIUM (61,168)



Mississippi State scored 21 points in the second quarter behind the impressive play of Bulldog senior quarterback Dak Prescott, handing Kentucky its first road loss of the season Saturday, 42-16, at Davis Wade Stadium in Starkville, Miss.

Prescott was the star of the game, going 25-for-35 through the air for 348 yards and three touchdowns, while rushing 13 times for 117 yards and three touchdowns on the ground. Brandon Holloway was the team's second-leading rusher, carrying the ball six times for 36 yards. Holloway was also the team's leading receiver with five catches for 98 yards and a touchdown.

Kentucky quarterback Patrick Towles went 23-for-42 in the game for 218 yards, rushing for a touchdown on six carries for 13 yards. Boom Williams was the leading rusher for Kentucky, carrying the ball 18 times for 95

yards, including a 25-yard rush. Dorian Baker had seven receptions for 56 yards, while tight end C.J. Conrad had a career game with six receptions for 56 yards and sophomore Juice Johnson had five catches for 74 yards.

Kentucky (4-3, 2-3 Southeastern Conference) scored first when Towles put in a quarterback sneak from two yards out to complete a seven-play, 69-yard drive in the first quarter. After the Bulldogs responded with a Prescott touchdown run to tie the game 7-7, UK put together an eight-play drive to retake the lead 10-7 after an Austin MacGinnis 44-yard field goal, his first of three on the day.

That was the last lead the Wildcats would claim as Mississippi State opened up the lead with three straight touchdowns in the second quarter, including two in the final 1:34 of the half. Prescott was at the center of all three touchdowns, throwing a 13-yard score to De'Runnya Wilson and eight-yard TD pass to Holloway before rushing in for 20 yards late in the first half.

MacGinnis added a 48-yard field goal with three seconds to go in the half and a 32-yarder late in the third quarter before Prescott connected with Darrion Hutcherson to increase the lead to 35-16. Prescott put the finishing touches on the win with 9:14 to play in the fourth quarter, rushing in from 18 yards out to give the Bulldogs a 42-16 victory.
