THE ESSENTIALS

- USF and No. 1 Kentucky meet at the Miami Hoophall Invitational
- It is the first-ever meeting between the two schools and the fifth time USF will play a team ranked No. 1.
- USF's turnovers since committing 21 vs. NJIT: 16 vs. GW, 12 vs. BU, 11 vs. Albany
- After missing the final 12 games of last season, Chris Perry is averaging 8.8 pts. and 7.6 rebs. per game.
- Roddy Peters (back) is getting healthier by the day. He had 8 pts., 5 rebs. and 5 assists against Albany.
- USF's top three scorers are newcomers: Jahmal McMurray, 13.4, Angel Nunez, 11.4, Roddy Peters, 11.2.
- Chris Perry ranks fifth in The American with 8.6 rebounds per game.
- USF has outrebounded its opponents in four of five games this season and holds a 5.6 RPG advantage overall.

THE SEASON

- This is the 45th season of USF basketball, which began in the fall of 1971.
- USF is celebrating its 50th anniversary of athletic competition, which began with men's soccer in 1965.
- USF was picked 10th in the 11-team American Athletic Conference preseason poll.
- Orlando Antigua is in his second season as the USF's head coach with seven players back from last season. A big difference from coach's first season when he inherited three players who logged minutes.
- Counted among USF's seven returners is Troy Holston Jr. who suffered a torn ACL in July and is unlikely to play.
- USF returns five players who started at least eight games last season including all three post players, Jaleel Cousins, Ruben Guerrero and Chris Perry.
- Overall, 74 percent of the Bulls' rebounding and 89 percent of their blocked shots return from last season.
- Among the Bulls' newcomers is former five-star point guard Roddy Peters.
- USF's schedule includes nine teams with an RPI of 54 or better.

THE OPPONENT

- Kentucky is the winningest team in NCAA history with 2,183 wins.
- UK has won each of its first five games by at least 11 points.
- Alex Poythress is coming off his second consecutive double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds in UK's 82-62 win over Boston University.
- Kentucky was ranked No. 1 in the AP and USA Today Coaches' poll on Monday. The Wildcats are 216-28 all-time as the nation's top-ranked team.

LAST TIME OUT

TAMPA, NOV. 24, 2015 – Chris Perry slammed home the go-ahead dunk with just nine seconds left and the Bulls secured their first win of the season by holding off Albany, 63-61, on Tuesday night.

USF (1-4) stormed back from an eight-point deficit in the final nine minutes and got the defensive play of the night from Roddy Peters when it mattered most. Following Perry's dunk, Peters stepped in front of a sideline pass for a steal on the Albany end and Jahmal McMurray's free throws capped off the scoring with two seconds remaining.

USF got a lot of production from its big men and leading the way was Angel Nunez, who finished with a game-high 16 points after going 7-for-10 from the field. Jaleel Cousins posted his second consecutive double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds to help the Bulls finish with a 40-38 edge on the boards.

Steady play from Nunez and Cousins, and strong defense down the stretch helped the Bulls head into halftime tied at 33-33 in the programs' first-ever meeting.

Nehemias Morillo scored four points during a 12-0 run that put the Bulls ahead, 18-11, seven minutes into the action. Albany took the lead back with a 10-2 run and Evan Singletary's free throws extended the Great Danes' advantage to 27-20 with 5:42 remaining in the half.

USF outscored Albany, 13-6, down the stretch with seven points coming from Nunez, who had a team-high nine points at the half. Cousins was up to eight points and eight rebounds after posting a career-high 14 points and 12 rebounds against Boston University the last time out on Nov. 21.

Albany went more than six minutes without a field goal late in the first half and tied things up just before the buzzer with a 3-pointer from Ray Sanders.

The Great Danes jumped out to a 53-45 lead in the first 10 minutes of the second half before the Bulls came roaring back once again.

Bo Zeigler's free throws forced the 10th tie of the game with 5:17 remaining and the lead changed hands four times leading up to the wild finish in the final seconds. Down 61-60, Peters tried to feed the ball inside to Cousins and the deflected pass wound up right in front of Perry, who put down a thunderous dunk with a hand in his face.

Albany's desperation shot at the end didn't come close as USF played lockdown defense to seal a very valuable win for the program. USF had the lead in three of its first four games and put together the complete team performance Antigua has been looking for since the opener.

NOTES

QUICKIES

■ With the Bulls' trailing Albany 61-60 and nine seconds remaining, Chris Perry dunked the ball with a hand in his face to give USF a 62-61 lead. USF got the ball back via a Roddy Peters steal and then Jahmal McMurray hit one free throw as the Bulls won their first game of the season, 63-61. USF had trailed by as many as eight points, midway through the second half.

■ In his collegiate debut, freshman guard Jahmal McMurray scored a team-high 21 points against Troy with the help of a 5-of-15 effort from 3-point range. His 15 attempts tied for the second-most in school history with Derrick Sharp who attempted 15 vs. Oral Roberts (12/7/91). It was the most attempts since Melvin Buckley's 16 vs. Stetson (11/27/06), the USF school record.

■ USF's 10 made 3-pointers vs. Troy was the most by the program in a regulation game since Nov. 23, 2010 when it made 10 vs. Liberty. The Bulls made 10 in an overtime game at Tulsa last season (1/31/15). Last season it took the Bulls three games before they made their 10th 3-pointer of the season.

■ USF's 10 blocked shots vs. Troy was its most since blocking 12 shots vs. Florida Southern on Nov. 16, 2011.

■ Chris Perry recorded 13 points and 17 rebounds vs. Troy for his sixth-career double-double. The 17 rebounds were the most in a game for USF since 2010 when Ron Anderson Jr. had 17 vs. Liberty (11/23/10). Perry was named to the conference honor roll on Nov. 16.

■ In his USF debut, senior forward Angel Nunez made his first six shots from the field including his first four 3-point attempts. He finished with 18 points, nine rebounds and four blocked shots. In his final year at Gonzaga, Nunez was 5-of-15 from three in 28 games played.

ALL ABOUT MINUTES PLAYED

■ Having dropped 10 pounds from last season, senior center Jaleel Cousins is using his conditioning to stay on the court longer. Cousins averaged 11.5 minutes over the 32 games played last season. So far this year, Cousins is averaging 23.6 minutes per game. He played 35 minutes against Albany on Nov. 24, 10 minutes more than his previous high of 25 against Boston on Nov. 21.

■ Newcomers Angel Nunez (31.4), Jahmal McMurray (31.2) and Roddy Peters (28.8) lead the Bulls in minutes played per game. USF has never had three newcomers lead the team in minutes played for a season.

■ The last newcomer to lead USF in minutes played was Dominique Jones (35.0) during the 2007-08 season.

■ The last time two newcomers led USF in minutes played was during the 1997-98 season with Scott Johnson (28.5) and Shaddrick Jenkins (29.2).

CONSECUTIVE DOUBLE-DOUBLES FOR COUSINS

■ Jaleel Cousins posted his first-career double-double on Nov. 21 vs. Boston (14 pts., 12 rebs.). He followed that game with a

double-double vs. Albany on Nov. 24 (13 pts., 12 rebs.). It was the first time a USF player had recorded consecutive double-doubles since Victor Rudd in 2013. Rudd had 23 points and 14 rebounds against FGCU on Dec. 17, 2013 and then 19 points and 10 rebounds against Florida A&M on Dec. 19, 2013.

USF VS. NO. 1

On Friday, USF will face No. 1 ranked Kentucky in the Hoophall Miami Invitational.

■ USF is 0-4 against AP No. 1 ranked teams.

■ The last No. 1 team USF played was UConn on Feb. 21, 2009, a 64-50 Huskies' win in Hartford.

■ USF's has lost 16-straight games to ranked opponents. Its last win against a ranked foe was on Feb. 29, 2012, a 58-51 win over No. 19 Louisville.

■ The last time USF played a ranked team was on Feb. 18, 2014, an 80-54 loss at No. 11 Louisville. USF did not play a ranked team last season for the first time in 18 seasons.

USF-UK CONNECTIONS

For two teams that have never met, there sure are many connections between USF and Kentucky.

■ USF head coach Orlando Antigua spent five seasons (2009-14) as an assistant coach at Kentucky under current UK head coach, 2015 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee John Calipari. Antigua also spent one season under Calipari at Memphis (2008-09).

■ USF assistant coach Rod Strickland spent five seasons at Kentucky as its special assistant to the head coach. He was also on Calipari's staff at Memphis from 2006-09. He was the director of student-athlete development/manager for two seasons and in 2008 was named director of basketball operations.

■ USF's video coordinator Dominic Lombardi spent two seasons (2012-14) as the assistant video coordinator at Kentucky.

■ USF's strength and conditioning coach Mike Malone spent two seasons (2012-14) as the assistant strength and conditioning coach at Kentucky.

■ USF senior center Jaleel Cousins is the younger brother of former Kentucky center DeMarcus Cousins, the fifth overall pick in the 2010 NBA draft and current member of the Sacramento Kings.

MOVEMBER

USF head coach Orlando Antigua and assistant coach Oliver Antigua are taking part in Movember, also known as No-Shave November, to raise awareness of cancers that effect men, including prostate.

IN IT, BUT NOT WINNING IT

In its first two games, USF has had two sizable first-half leads lost. The Bulls also had an eight-point lead against BU.

■ USF led Troy by 14 points, 44-30, with 3:11 remaining in the first half before being outscored 38-28 in the second half in an 82-77 loss.

■ USF led NJIT by 15 points, 23-8, with 6:29 remaining in the first half. The Bulls led by 10 points, 50-40, with 6:05 left in the game and five points, 57-52, with 1:48 on the clock before losing 60-57.

■ USF held an eight point lead, 18-10, with 11:36 remaining in the first half against Boston before losing 78-66.

BULLS SIGN THREE

Orlando Antigua and his staff announced the signing of three on Nov. 13, during the early signing period.

■ **Troy Baxter** is a 6-8, 190-pound forward from Tallahassee, Fla. He was rated four stars by Rivals, ESPN and 247Sports and is currently playing for Oldsmar Christian in nearby Oldsmar, Fla. Baxter was one of the first players that Antigua targeted after accepting the USF job in 2014.

■ **Andres Feliz** is a 6-2, 180-pound guard originally from the Dominican Republic, but currently plays for West Oaks Academy in Orlando, Fla. He was given a three-star rating by Rivals.com. Last season, Feliz helped West Oaks to a 32-4 record and a SIAA state championship. This past summer he was the starting point guard for the Dominican Republic at the U19 FIBA World Championships with USF assistant coach Oliver Antigua also on staff. He was the leading scorer on the team and in the tournament with 18.9 points averaged over seven games. Also last summer, Feliz was the youngest of the group that played with the Dominican Republic National Team at the Pan-American Games in Toronto.

■ **Malik Fitts** is a 6-5, 215-pound small forward from La Verne, Calif. who is in his final season at Brewster Academy Prep in New Hampshire. He is a Rivals.com three-star recruit and is ranked No. 55 among small forwards in the 2016 class. Prior to Brewster, attended Damien High School in La Verne and helped his team win the CIF D3 State Championship.

■ HoopSeen.com ranked the recruiting classes in the American Athletic Conference and placed the Bulls third behind No. 1 UConn and No. 2 Cincinnati. It also lists Andres Feliz as the best scorer in the class and Troy Baxter as the best athlete. Website writer Justin Young went on to say this: Troy Baxter is a highlight reel with unique size. Andres Feliz has league-leading scoring potential while Malik Fitts is a top 300 level talent.

A HEALTHY CHRIS PERRY

■ Junior forward Chris Perry was forced to miss the last 12 games of his sophomore season. After going through the proper medical tests, Perry told the media in July that it was a left-ventricle issue in his heart, which he was born with, that shortened his season. He was cleared to participate in team activities in May. The native of nearby Bartow, Fla., was a member of the Preseason American Athletic Conference Second Team last season after being named to the all-rookie team as a freshman. Perry led the Bulls with 7.1 rebounds per game and ranked second in points with 10.8. USF lost 11 of its last 13 games without him.

"He's a monster, man. He's a great player, he's got touch; right or left jump-hooks. Just a big body, can rebound the basketball, his basketball IQ is off the roof. To have him back full-time, I think that's gonna really, really help USF." - UConn Head Coach Kevin Ollie at conference media day on Oct. 27.

DOMINICAN TIES

USF has two coaches and three players with ties to the Dominican Republic.

■ Head Coach Orlando Antigua was born in the Dominican Republic and coached the Dominican Republic National Team in 2013 and 2014.

■ Orlando's brother, Oliver Antigua, is an assistant coach at USF and was also born in the Dominican Republic. Oliver has also coached the Dominican Republic, most recently the U19 team this past summer. With the Antigua's on staff, USF has embraced players with Dominican heritage.

■ Senior guard Nehemias Morillo was born and raised in Santiago, Dominican Republic before moving to New York in 2010. Morillo competed for his country at the 2015 Pan-American Games this past summer.

■ Newcomer Angel Nunez is originally from the Dominican and played for the Dominican Republic Select Team last season.

■ Freshman Luis Santos grew up in Santiago, Dominican Republic before moving to the U.S. prior to his sophomore season.

NEW MAN RUNNING THE SHOW

After three and a half seasons of Anthony Collins in the point guard position, USF will turn the reigns over to sophomore transfer Roddy Peters. The 6-3 guard was a five-star recruit out of Suitland High School and played his freshman season at Maryland. After sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, Peters will bring a scoring mentality to the point guard position, different from the pass-first style of Collins.

VAMOS LOS TOROS

USF was fortunate enough to travel abroad to Spain for a 10-day foreign tour from Aug. 8 - 18. The Bulls went 2-2 in the exhibitions with losses to the Venezuela National Team (68-60) and the Angola National Team (90-71) in Madrid and wins over CB VIC roster 1 (83-63) and CB VIC roster 2 (84-75, OT) in Barcelona.

■ In the game against CB VIC (2), the final game of the trip, USF trailed by 22 points early in the third quarter before mounting a big comeback. Freshman Jahmal McMurray hit a 3-pointer to tie the game with a few seconds remaining to send the game into overtime where the Bulls won by nine.

■ Along with the four games and 10 additional practices leading up to the tour, the team received an educational and cultural experience by seeing many historical sites and museums while earning up to three credits of an upper-level elective. The men were joined on the trip by USF's women's basketball team and played doubleheaders all four days of competition.

SCHEDULE

■ USF plays five schools that were ranked or receiving votes in the AP preseason Poll: Kentucky (2), UConn (20), SMU (RV), Cincinnati (RV), NC State (RV).

■ USF plays five schools that were ranked or receiving votes in the preseason Coaches Poll: Kentucky (1), UConn (24), Cincinnati (RV), NC State (RV), Tulsa (RV)

■ USF's schedule includes nine teams with an RPI of 54 or better last season.

■ The Bulls will host 19 teams, including its exhibition with Eckerd, and five of those teams made the NCAA Tournament last season.

■ USF will play Albany, Delaware, Kentucky, NJIT and Troy for the first time.

■ Two of the most anticipated coaching matchups include Orlando Antigua against Kentucky's John Calipari, whom Antigua assisted for six seasons and against South Carolina's Frank Martin. Antigua and Martin are the only two Hispanic head coaches in NCAA Division I.

RETURNING

■ USF returns five players who started at least eight games last season. Troy Holston Jr. is not counted among those five returners as he suffered a torn ACL in July.

■ The Bulls return all three of their post players, Jaleel Cousins, Ruben Guerrero and Chris Perry. That doesn't include inside-out forward Bo Zeigler.

■ Overall, 74 percent of the Bulls' rebounding and 89 percent of their blocked shots return from last season.

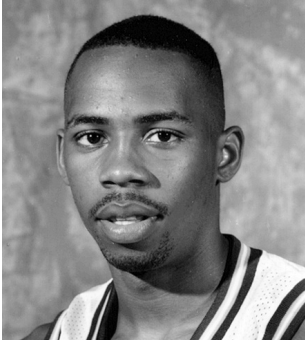

SUN DOME

■ Opened in December 1980, the 30-year old Sun Dome Arena has served as the home venue and facility for the USF men's and women's basketball teams. The multi-purpose venue also has hosted an abundance and variety of other events both internal and external to USF including, but not limited to, commencement, concerts, sports and entertainment events, consumer shows, religious services, conventions, ethnic festivals, rodeos, wrestling, youth sports camps, gymnastics and cheerleading competitions, lectures, and political rallies among other corporate, community and USF events.

■ In June 2011, the USF Board of Trustees approved a \$35.6 million major renovation to the 250,000-square-foot Arena including, but not limited to, the complete reconfiguration of the approximately 10,000 seat bowl (to oval bowl seating setting), adding a state-of-the-art center hung LED scoreboard, additional concessions and restrooms at the concourse level (by adding a concourse under and throughout the permanent second level seating), modifying and enhancing the southeast and southwest entries, and the restoration of existing exterior concrete amongst other cosmetic improvements.

■ Additionally, the project provided for 10 loge boxes with a total capacity of ~60 seats to be sold by the USF Athletics Department. Basketball loge box holders have the first right of refusal to purchase tickets to other external events (e.g. concerts). The project, which was completed in May 2012, is anticipated to extend the useful life of the Arena for a 30-year time period.

MUMA CENTER

■ Pam and Les Muma made a lead gift of \$3 million to the basketball center on March 26, 2008.

■ The USF coaches, players, administration and special guests helped celebrate the opening of the new on-campus Pam and Les Muma Basketball Center in 2011.

■ It is a two-story, 51,000 sq. foot facility.

■ The building has a split floor plan that provides both men's and women's programs their own practice court, locker room, offices, film room and lounge, while offering shared training room and strength and conditioning facilities.

ORLANDO ANTIGUA PERSONAL STORY

- The oldest of three children to Damaris Antigua, Orlando grew up in a Bronx apartment with no record of a father at home. His father, also named Orlando, popped in every few years.
- Orlando, just three years older than brother Oliver, was the father figure in the three bedroom apartment. He would discipline, cook and protect at the age of 10 in a house of four.
- On Halloween night in 1988, an argument broke out between some men in his neighborhood outside an electronics store and one of them pulled a gun. A .22 caliber bullet hit Orlando, an innocent bystander, near his left eye. Oliver took the call from the hospital. Due to the bullet's location (it never penetrated the skull), doctors deemed it safer to not to remove the bullet. He was back playing basketball two weeks after the incident. It was extracted during his junior year at Pitt. He still has the bullet and keeps it next to his championship rings.

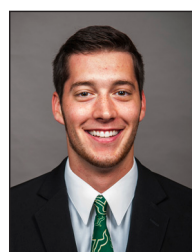
