UNDER DANES

UAlbany men's basketball kicks off the season with an AP/USA Today Top-5 team for the first time all-time. The Great Danes faced RV/25 Syracuse to begin the 2009-10 campaign and 23/25 Villanova to start the 2008-09 slate. Will Brown has also never met a foe from the state of Kentucky.

MID-MAJOR POLL

After finishing 2014-15 ranked No. 13 in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll, the Purple & Gold is receiving votes in the preseason. Will Brown & co., reached a program-best No. 12 ranking last season in the midst of a 13-game winning streak and 15-1 conference record.

HOOLEY NAMED TO LOU HENSON PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Two-time America East Tournament Most Outstanding Performer Peter Hooley was named to the Lou Henson Player of the Year Watch List. The University at Albany men's basketball senior guard enters his final season ranked eighth in all-time scoring for the Danes.

Hooley was one of thirty honorees on the Watch List. He averaged 13.7 points per game in his junior campaign en route to America East All-Conference honors for the third consecutive year. The two-time America East Most Outstanding Performer hit a game-winning three in the closing moments of the championship game against Stony Brook to send UAlbany to its third consecutive and fifth overall America East title in 2014-15.

The Lou Henson Award is presented annually to the top Mid-Major player in Division I college basketball. The award is named in honor of Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. When he left the game in 2005 he was sixth all-time in career Division I wins with 779. He is the winningest coach at both Illinois and New Mexico State. He is one of only 12 coaches in the history of the game to take two schools to the Final Four.

THE RETURN OF HOOLEY

Peter Hooley returns for a fifth year after an up-and-down season in 2014-15. Hooley's story of perseverance became a national news story in 2015. After becoming the second-leading scorer in the America East conference, Hooley returned to his native Australia to be with his mother, Sue. Sue fought a 4.5-year battle with colon cancer before passing away on Jan. 30.

Despite missing eight conference games, Hooley returned to the Danes on Feb. 11, netting his 1000th career point on Feb. 13 at NJIT. He was a Capital One Academic All-District First Team and America East All-Academic selection for the second consecutive year. In his junior season, Hooley also earned America East All-Conference second team accolades.

After helping UAlbany to the No. 1 seed in the America East Tournament, Hooley hit the game-winning three at the buzzer against Stony Brook to send the Danes to their third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. Consequently, he was named the Reggie Lewis Most Outstanding Player in the America East Tournament for the second-consecutive year. He also received All-Championship squad honors.

Hooley appeared on SportsCenter shortly after, and wrote a column for the New York Post. His buzzer-beater was the SportsCenter top play of the day (March 14), week and month of March on ESPN. The Australia native completed his undergraduate studies in May, and delivered the student address at UAlbany commencement. He also competed for his native Australia in the World University Games this past summer.

RECORD-CHASING

Peter Hooley has the opportunity to make a mark on several aspects of the UAlbany record book this season. He is 35 points shy of passing current assistant coach Jon Iati on the all-time scoring list, currently sitting at 1,108 points to rank eighth. Hooley ranks third in Division I career free throw percentage (.299-.365, .819) and 10th all-time in free throws made (299). Before the start of his senior season, Hooley is 25 three-point field goals away from passing UAlbany great Jamar Wilson in career treys.

AMERICA EAST PRESEASON POLL

The Danes garnered two first-place votes and a total of 55 points to take the No. 2 spot. Stony Brook edged out the Purple & Gold for No. 1 with seven first-place votes and 63 points. Vermont rounded out the top-three with 49 points, followed closely by New Hampshire at No. 4 (47 points).

For the second straight season, senior guard Peter Hooley was selected to the Preseason All-Conference team. Hooley is the two-time America East Tournament Reggie Lewis Most Outstanding Player, a three-time All-Conference and two-time All-Academic pick; as well as a two-time All-Championship team member. In his third season as a team co-captain, Hooley enters his final season of eligibility as one of the top scorers and free throw shooters in the league.

Fellow senior Evan Singletary garnered Preseason All-Conference accolades after making his mark as a junior college transfer last season. He was named a finalist for the Riley Wallace Award, honoring the top Division I transfer in 2015. At the point, Singletary can score, dish and hit free throws. The senior ranked sixth among league scorers with 13.0 points per game, fourth in free throw percentage (.804) and recorded 94 assists, taking All-Conference First Team accolades in 2014. He proved himself a clutch shooter at Patrick Gym last season, hitting a three-pointer at the buzzer in Burlington for a 47-44 victory.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

University at Albany men's basketball head coach Will Brown has promoted former director of basketball operations Jared Knotts to assistant coach. A former graduate assistant for the Danes, Simon Clement replaces Knotts to take over operations duties.

Knotts enters his first season as an assistant coach after serving four years as the director of operations under Will Brown. A four-year member of the Purple & Gold from 2003-06, Knotts will assist Brown in all facets of the program, including recruiting, player development, scouting opponents and academic advising for men's basketball student-athletes.

In his four years with the program, Knotts has served as an academic advisor for select players. He also coordinated the Will Brown Basketball Camp and annual men's basketball golf outing. The point person for travel logistics and administrative duties, Knotts has helped the Danes to three consecutive America East titles. A native of San Bernardino, California, Knotts rounds out the coaching staff that already includes fellow men's basketball alum Jon Iati and Josh Pelletier.

Clement returns to the UAlbany staff after spending one season as an assistant coach at Sullivan County Community College. He worked alongside former Great Dane standout Brent Wilson for the 2014-15 campaign, coordinating the daily operations of the team as well as recruiting visits and team study hall. Clement had an instrumental role in a 16-week run for the Generals in the NJCAA Division III Top-10 national poll.

Before his stint at SCCC, Clement spent four seasons with the Purple & Gold as graduate assistant and video coordinator. He oversaw film exchange and breakdown, practice, and developed a statistical database for the coaching staff. While working for the team, he earned an MBA in 2012 and began a Doctorate program in philosophy. Clement was also an adjunct professor in the UAlbany MBA program and with undergraduate business students.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior guards Peter Hooley, Ray Sanders and Reece Williams were named 2015-16 team captains in the preseason.

Hooley is a three-time team captain, and one of three members of a returning All-America East starting backcourt for the Danes. He is a two-time America East All-Conference and All-Academic selection. The senior hit the game winning shot in the league championship last year, earning his second straight Reggie Lewis Most Outstanding Player award.

Hooley is a two-time NABC Honors Court and Capital One Academic All-District First Team selection. He has averaged over 14 points per game in the last two seasons under Will Brown, netting his 1,000th point in 2014-15. With one season remaining, Hooley ranks eighth in Division I program scoring with 1,108 points.

Sanders joined the Great Danes squad last season as a junior college transfer out of Pensacola State. The Tuscaloosa, Alabama native was an America East All-Conference Third Team and All-Defensive selection one year ago, after starting all 33 games. An impact player on both sides of the ball, Sanders recorded double digits in scoring on 12 occasions and led the team in steals with 45. He shot 77.2% from the charity stripe and 43.5% from the field in 2014-15.

Williams was named a captain after three seasons as a walk-on for UAlbany. A 2014-15 NABC Honors Court awardee, Williams has made 16 appearances in his career. An active member of both the campus community and the Albany community at large, he is the first walk-on to be named a captain in the Division I era since current Sage College head coach Brian Barnes in 2002-03.

SCOUTING KENTUCKY

The Wildcats and their high-octane offense welcome UAlbany to Rupp Arena for the first time all-time. John Calipari's squad is a Final Four team from one season ago, with six NBA Draft picks in 2015. He has coached 36 NBA Draftees, including 25 first-round selections. In the last 10 seasons, Calipari is the winningest Division I head coach.

Kentucky returns 10 players from last year's SEC Champion and Final Four squad, including second-leading assist man Tyler Ulis. Ulis averaged 23 minutes per game in 2014-15, topping all returning players. The Wildcats are made up of five freshmen and juniors, two sophomores and just one senior.

America East Tournament Champion 2006, 2007, 2013, 2014, 2015

Will Brown just wrapped up his 14th season as the University at Albany's men's basketball head coach. Brown, the longest tenured coach in the America East Conference, has led the program to five conference championships, five NCAA Tournament appearances, a Collegiate.com CIT Postseason Tournament appearance, and an unparalleled success in the classroom.

2014-15 was an unprecedented season for the Great Danes, earning their best Division I winning percentage (24-9, .727) and tying their highest win total. UAlbany went 15-1 in America East Conference play and 8-0 on the road to earn its second regular season title and No. 1 seed in the league tournament. Playing all three conference postseason games in the confines of SEFCU Arena, Brown earned his third consecutive and fifth overall America East Tournament title, 51-50 over Stony Brook. Peter Hooley hit a last-second three from the top of the key for the victory. The Danes continued on to Columbus, Ohio in the East Regional to face No. 3 seed Oklahoma as the 14-seed in the NCAA Second Round. UAlbany fell 69-60 in its fifth Division I NCAA Tournament appearance.

In the midst of its 15-1 America East record, the Purple & Gold went on a Division I record 13-game winning streak from Jan. 3-Feb. 13. Brown also took his 200th career victory on Jan. 14 against Binghamton, 73-58.

Under Brown's guidance, a program record four players were named to the America East All-Conference teams, including Sam Rowley, Peter Hooley, Evan Singletary and Ray Sanders. Hooley earned Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-District First Team honors for the second-straight year, and was honored as a SUNY Chancellor's Award for Academic Excellence Recipient. Rowley and Hooley were also named to the America East All-Academic Team for the second-straight year, en route to tying the program record for All-Academic picks with three.

Brown earned the program's first NCAA Division I Tournament win in 2013-14 when the Purple & Gold took down Mount St. Mary's in the First Four 71-64 in Dayton, Ohio. He led UAlbany to its second-straight America East title in 2013-14, as the No. 4 seed. The Great Danes repeated their feat as the lowest seed to ever win the tournament, once again knocking off the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds and taking the title on the road.

He was also named the top value coach among Division I head coaches in 2013-14 by HoopDirt.com. The Great Danes also earned the NABC Academic Excellence Award for earning a GPA of 3.0 or above in 2013-14. In addition, the Purple & Gold earned a program-record five spots on the NABC Honors Court, recognizing student-athletes with a GPA of 3.2 or above.

The 2012-13 Great Danes arguably ended their season as their most successful in league history with a 24-11 record, a NCAA Tournament Second Round appearance and won the America East Conference Tournament Championship. Following his third conference tournament championship, he became the fourth America East Conference head coach with at least three conference tournament titles. The 24 wins is a program-best for most wins in a season at UAlbany in Division I. The Great Danes set a record for most non-conference wins in school history with 12.

UAlbany finished the 2011-12 season at 19-15 and a 9-7 conference record. For the third time under Brown's tutelage, the Great Danes earned a postseason berth. UAlbany faced off against Manhattan in the 2012 Collegiate.com Tournament. The Great Danes defeated New Hampshire in the first round of the America East Conference Tournament only to fall short to No.1 seed Stony Brook, on a last-second tip-in, in the Semifinals 57-55.

The Great Danes, with a 9-7 conference record in the 2010-11 season, vaulted near the top of the conference standings with a third place finish. UAlbany's nine-win improvement from the previous season was the second-best turnaround in the program's 97 seasons.

In 2008-09, the UAlbany program won 15 or more games for the fourth consecutive season for the first time in 14 years. The Great Danes, who advanced to the America East semifinals for the third time in a four-year period, became the first seventh seed to defeat a second seed in America East Conference Tournament history.

The Great Danes finished in the upper echelon of the America East Conference by tying for second place in the standings in the 2007-08 campaign. UAlbany won 10 or more conference games for the third consecutive year.

Brown guided the Great Danes to their second straight America East Conference championship after defeating top-seed Vermont in the 2007 tournament final. The Great Danes, who earned an automatic NCAA berth, were seeded No. 13 against Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season winner Virginia. Brown's team totaled 20 victories during the regular season for the first time at the Division I level. UAlbany tied the second-highest single-season win total (23) in school history and posted consecutive 20-win campaigns for the first time in 17 years. Jamar Wilson made his second appearance on the Associated Press All-America squad.

Brown led the Great Danes to their first-ever NCAA Division I Tournament berth in 2005-06 after winning both the America East Conference tournament and regular-season titles. UAlbany set the program's Division I record for single-season victories with a 21-11 record and produced its highest win total since 1993-94. His squad posted UAlbany's first postseason triumph in 11 years with three wins in America East tournament play. The Great Danes, who also established their top conference mark with 13 victories in the regular season, went on to put up a monumental fight against second-ranked Connecticut in a memorable NCAA first-round battle. Brown was named the New York State Coach of the Year.

In 2004-05, Coach Brown led UAlbany to an eight-win improvement from the previous season. The Great Danes registered their best-ever league record at the time with a 9-9 mark and a fourth-place finish. UAlbany also tied the fourth-best improvement among Division I teams which recorded single-digit victories in 2003-04, as only Texas A&M, San Diego and Houston were better.

Brown was appointed as UAlbany's head coach on March 13, 2002, and has worked on the collegiate level since 1995. He became the 15th head coach in the history of the program. At age 40, Brown is still one of the youngest Division I head coaches in the nation.

Coach Brown and his wife, Jamie, work closely with many charitable organizations in the Capital District and surrounding areas. Jamie currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Big Brothers, Big Sisters Organization of the Capital Region. She also serves as the Associate Board of Directors for St. Peter's Hospital and co-chairs Coaches vs. Cancer to benefit the American Cancer Society. The Browns are also involved with the upstate Northeastern New York chapter of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of America.

Brown, who joined the UAlbany staff as an assistant in Sept. 2001, was promoted to interim head coach on Dec. 20 of that year, and guided the Great Danes to a 7-13 record over the last 20 games. UAlbany was among the conference leaders in scoring defense. He coached the team to several impressive victories, including a win over Vermont, the America East Conference's regular-season champion.

Brown previously served as the head coach at Sullivan County Community College in Loch Sheldrake, N.Y., from 1998-2001. He led the Generals to a 90-10 record over a three-year period with two regional and two district titles. Sullivan County C.C. posted a 30-2 record and reached the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championship game in 2000-01. Brown's first SCCC squad appeared in the NJCAA "Final Four" and finished 32-3 overall. The Generals were ranked second nationally in scoring at 92.9 points per game, and ninth in team defense with a 67.1 average.

Brown was chosen the New York State Coaches Association junior college coach of the year in 1999. He also earned Mid-Hudson Conference coach of the year honors three times, and was District V's Coach of the Year twice. In addition, he worked at Sullivan County C.C. as an associate athletic director and as an adjunct professor of sports management.

Previous to his appointment at Sullivan County C.C., Brown spent three years at The College of Saint Rose as an assistant coach on Brian Beaur's staff. The Golden Knights made two NCAA Division II "Elite Eight" appearances in that span, and captured three New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC) championships and two Northeast Regional crowns. Saint Rose compiled an 88-13 record from 1995-98.

As a collegiate player, Brown was a two-time NYCAC all-star and three-year starter at Dowling College, an NCAA Division II program on Long Island. He is the only player in school history to combine for more than 1,000 points and 500 assists. Brown completed his career as Dowling's all-time leader in assists (591), three-point field goals (181) and free throw percentage (.859). He also played second singles on the school's tennis team.

A native of Miller Place, N.Y., Brown earned first-team Class B all-state recognition as a high school senior, when he averaged more than 35 points per game. He was chosen All-Long Island and was a three-time All-Suffolk County selection. In May 2010, Brown was inducted into the Suffolk Sports Hall of Fame.

In 2011, Coach Brown received the National Sportsmanship Award, organized by the St. Louis Sports Commission and the Citizenship Through Sports Alliance. He was honored for allowing an Xavier University player to travel on the team bus to Cincinnati, Ohio following a December snow blizzard. Additionally, UAlbany's basketball program was recognized with the America East Conference Sportsmanship Award.

Brown resides in Latham with his wife, Jamie, and their two sons, Jackson and Landon. Brown has a master's degree in management and a B.A. in marketing from Dowling College. His father, William, Jr., has served as director of athletics at Miller Place High School, where he previously was head basketball coach for 17 years. His teams won three Suffolk County League VII scholastic titles.

JON IATI | ASSISTANT COACH | UALBANY '07 | FOURTH SEASON

Jon Iati was named assistant men's basketball coach on Thursday, Sept. 6, 2012.

Prior to his appointment at UAlbany, Iati spent four years on staff with the Quinnipiac Bobcats out of the MAAC.

In 2015, Iati was responsible for the recruitment of three starters on the America East Tournament and America East Regular Season Championship squad. Included in those three student-athletes were America East All-Conference First Team selection Evan Singletary as well as All-Defensive & Third Team pick Ray Sanders.

Combined with his time at Quinnipiac, Iati has made six consecutive appearances in national postseason tournaments; not to mention three-straight NCAA Tournaments with the Great Danes in his first three years. He has guided UAlbany to 67 victories over that three-season span.

A five-time America East Champion as coach and player with the Danes, Iati serves as recruiting coordinator for the Northeast and Canada, junior college transfers, Florida, Illinois, Kansas, Missouri, Utah and Wyoming.

Iati scored over 1,000 points in his career at UAlbany, leading the Great Danes to two America East Conference Championships and two NCAA Tournament appearances. He was named the 2004 America East Rookie of the Year, and led the nation in minutes played in 2003-04. He graduated as UAlbany's career leader in games played, while also ranking second and sixth, respectively, in three-pointers made and points scored all-time for the Great Danes in Division I play.

A standout in high school, Iati was the York Catholic (Pa.) all-time leading scorer with 2,216 points, before being surpassed by his brother, Jacob (2,388 points) in 2008. He also holds the single-game scoring record with 56 points against York Suburban at the 2001 Special Olympics Holiday Classic. Iati was the 2002-03 York Area Interscholastic Athletic Association League Player of the Year while also earning Associated Press All-State First Team recognition. He was inducted into the York Catholic Athletic Hall of Fame on Feb. 1, 2014.

A native of York, Pa., whose family resides on Long Island, Iati received his degree from UAlbany in sociology with a minor in education in 2007 and a graduate degree in liberal studies in 2009.



JOSH PELLETIER | ASSISTANT COACH | ST. ROSE '09 | SECOND SEASON

Pelletier begins his second season with the Great Danes in 2015-16. He recruits throughout the Northeast and nationally, specifically prep schools in New England. Pelletier is also responsible for recruiting out of portions of the Midwest, Texas, California Junior Colleges and international regions.

Head coach Will Brown announced the appointment of former graduate assistant Josh Pelletier to the position of assistant coach on Wednesday, July 23, 2014. Pelletier spent two years as a graduate assistant with the Great Danes from 2010-2012 and was most recently the Director of Basketball Administration at Duquesne.

"Josh did a great job for our program during his two years as a graduate assistant," said Brown. "His time spent at LIU working for Jack Perri and his experiences working for Jim Ferry at Duquesne have helped prepare him for this opportunity as an assistant at UAlbany. I am confident he will have a positive impact on our program as we continue to strive for success on the court and in the classroom."

The Troy, N.Y., native spent one season with the Dukes of the Atlantic-10 in 2013-14. As the Director of Basketball Administration, Pelletier oversaw the team's summer camp operations as well as its community outreach initiatives. He served as the team's primary contact for donor and alumni relations in addition to coordinating the team's travel and daily itinerary. Pelletier also developed scouting and recruiting strategies in conjunction with the Duquesne coaching staff.

Pelletier rejoins the Purple & Gold after departing for Long Island to serve as the Director of Basketball Operations for the Blackbirds in 2012. He spent one season at LIU, assisting the coaching staff with scouting, player development, recruiting and film exchange. Pelletier served as the program's community outreach liaison as well as an academic advisor during the 2012-13 season. The Blackbirds made their third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2012-13 after earning the NEC's automatic qualifier for the third straight year.

In two seasons as Will Brown's graduate assistant, Pelletier coordinated recruiting visits, travel itineraries and was responsible for game film exchange. He also served as co-director of the Will Brown Basketball Camp.

A 2009 graduate of the College of Saint Rose, Pelletier was a four-year letterwinner for Brian Beaury and guided the Golden Knights to three NCAA Division II Tournament appearances. He was also named a team captain in his senior season. Pelletier graduated from St. Rose with a degree in social studies and a secondary education before pursuing a master's degree in liberal studies at UAlbany.

In the high school ranks, Pelletier played locally for La Salle Institute in Troy, N.Y., in addition to his AAU time with the Albany City Rocks. He was named to the All-Area Times Union First Team as a junior and senior for the Cadets, as well as becoming the all-time leading scorer.





JARED KNOTTS | ASSISTANT COACH | UALBANY '06 | FIFTH SEASON

Jared Knotts enters his fifth season as director of men's basketball operations in 2015-16. He is responsible for administrative duties, travel and logistics. He also coordinates the Will Brown summer basketball camp and well as the UAlbany men's basketball golf outing.

He has previously worked as a microcomputer technician at Hudson Valley Community College and an IT specialist for the New York State Department of Health.

Knotts earned four varsity letters and appeared in 73 career games as a member of the UAlbany basketball program from 2003-06. As a senior, the 6-foot-6 forward helped the Great Danes capture their first America East Conference championship and NCAA Tournament berth in 2005-06.

A three-sport scholastic athlete in football, basketball and lacrosse, Knotts attended St. James School in Hagerstown, Md. He was chosen the 2002 Tri-State Small School Player of the Year and was selected to the All-Washington County and All-Mid Atlantic Conference teams.

A native of Colton, Calif., Knotts received a B.A. in information science and policy with a minor in education from UAlbany in 2006. Knotts and his wife, the former Allison Brown and son Jalen reside in Clifton Park.

Simon Clement enters his first season in a full-time role in 2015-16. He returns to the UAlbany staff after spending one season as an assistant coach at Sullivan County Community College. He worked alongside former Great Dane standout Brent Wilson for the 2014-15 campaign, coordinating the daily operations of the team as well as recruiting visits and team study hall. Clement had an instrumental role in a 16-week run for the Generals in the NJCAA Division III Top-10 national poll.

Before his stint at SCCC, Clement spent four seasons with the Purple & Gold as graduate assistant and video coordinator. He oversaw film exchange and breakdown, practice, and developed a statistical database for the coaching staff. While working for the team, he earned an MBA in 2012 and began a Doctorate program in philosophy. Clement was also an adjunct professor in the UAlbany MBA program and with undergraduate business students.

Clement played as a collegian at Hudson Valley CC in Troy, N.Y., for one season and Johnson State College in Johnson, Vt., for two seasons. He earned his B.A. from JSC in business management and his M.B.A. from UAlbany in human resource and information systems.
