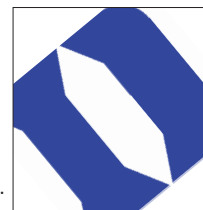

QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its 42nd season of varsity women's basketball with a 745-496 (.599) record.
- UK has had a great start to the 2015-16 season, sitting at 9-0 for the first time since the 2013-14 season when UK started 11-0. The Wildcats have showed their depth - albeit inexperienced - as seven different UK players have scored in double figures so far.
- The Wildcats' 9-0 start is something only accomplished four other times in program history (1980-81, 2009-10, 2011-12, 2013-14).
- UK ranks high nationally in several categories. Kentucky is 11th in the nation and 2nd in the SEC in assists per game at 19.1; 18th in the nation and 2nd in the SEC in defensive rebounds per game at 31.0; 9th in the nation and 2nd in the SEC in FG% defense at 32.6; 8th in the nation and 2nd in the SEC in FG% at 49.1%; 26th in the nation and 4th in the SEC in scoring defense at 53.7; 16th in the nation and 3rd in the SEC in scoring offense at 82.6; 5th in the nation and 1st in the SEC in 3-point FG% at 40.6%. More national rankings can be found on page 9.
- Makayla Epps had a great week against UofL and MTSU, earning her espnW National Player of the Week and SEC Player of the Week honors. Epps is the first player to earn national POW honor since Jennifer O'Neill in 2013.
- Before a big road win at Middle Tennessee last Sunday, Kentucky started its week with a victory over in-state foe Louisville - a preseason top-10 team - in Rupp Arena, 72-54. Kentucky shot 51.8% from the field, including 6-of-14 from 3. Makayla Epps paced UK with 24 points on 10-of-

- Leads the team with 96 rebounds, including 36 offensive and 60 defensive.

#25 MAKAYLA EPPS G 5-10 JR. LEBANON, KY.

- Second triple-double in UK history vs. Morehead State with 21 points, 11 rebounds, 12 assists.
- Had 24 points against Louisville on 10-of-11 shooting - highest for any Wildcat since 1987.
- Performance vs. UofL/MTSU earned Nation POW by espnW and SEC POW.

#35 ALEXIS JENNINGS F/C 6-2 SO. MADISON, ALA.

- Impressive in post vs. Morehead St. with a game-high 28 points, including 13 rebounds and a block.
- Her 28 points were a career high as she went for her second career double-double.
- Huge vs. UofL in the post with 14 points and eight rebounds, adding two blocks and an assist.

- 11 shooting, which was the highest field goal percentage for a Wildcat since 1987. Alexis Jennings, Janee Thompson and Taylor Murray each scored in double figures.
- The Kentucky-Louisville game at Rupp Arena drew 14,425 fans, which was the fifth-largest crowd for a UK women's basketball home game in program history.
- Kentucky had its longest home stretch of the season recently, going 4-0 in Memorial Coliseum. UK used a balanced scoring effort to go along with its impressive defense during the home stretch as UK had at least four players record 10 or more points in all four games, including five or more players in double figures three times. During the stretch, Kentucky averaged 94.7 points per game and shot 48.9% from the field, including 42.6% from 3-point land.
- Sophomore forward Alyssa Rice missed the first month of the season due to a stress reaction in her foot, but returned for the first time against Louisville and played four minutes with one rebound. Rice played nine minutes against Middle Tennessee with three points and three rebounds.
- Wednesday, Nov. 18 was a historic night in Memorial Coliseum as Kentucky put up impressive numbers against Morehead State. Kentucky tied its all-time team rebounding record with 67 boards, set on March 22, 2014 against Wright State, while UK was one assist off the all-time record with 32.
- Makayla Epps recorded UK's second ever triple-double vs. Morehead State as she scored 21 points with 11 rebounds and 12 assists. It was the first triple-double in program history that involved points-rebounds-assists. The only other triple-double was Feb. 14, 1986 by Leslie Nichols (18pts, 13rebs, 11 steals).
- Three players had double-doubles by the close of the third period vs. Morehead State (Evelyn Akhator, Epps and Alexis Jennings). It was the first time since Nov. 28, 1989 against East Carolina, that three Wildcats had double-doubles in the same game. Jennings, Epps and Thompson all scored 20+ points, marking the first time three players had 20+ since 1989.
- UK is ranked No. 8 in the USA Today/Coaches Top 25 and No. 8 in the Associated Press Top 25. UK has been ranked in each poll since week 13 of the 2009-10 season, the longest-ranking streak in program history.
- The Wildcats are 1-0 against ranked teams this season and are scheduled to face several teams also ranked in both major polls, including No. 2/2 South Carolina (twice), No. 14/16 Tennessee, No. 9/9 Mississippi State and No. 18/18 Texas A&M and No. 13/11 Duke. Kentucky is also scheduled to face Florida, Auburn, Georgia and Missouri, who are receiving votes in one of the two polls.
- Kentucky is 1-0 against ranked foes this season, taking down then-No. 15/15 Arizona State on the first weekend of the season. UK also defeated UofL, which was receiving votes at the time after starting the season ranked in the top-10 of both national listings.
- The win over highly-ranked Arizona State was the 37th win for UK over a ranked team under Matthew Mitchell and the 78th in program history.
- The Wildcats have been impressive in the specialty stats this season. UK has outscored its opponents in the paint, 386-176, outscored opponents in points off turnovers, 205-97, has more fast-break points, 86-23, and more bench points, 187-124.
- UK trailed Arizona State by 12 with 5:01 to go in the third quarter, making the comeback win a tie for the 10th largest comeback for UK under Mitchell. The Wildcats were also down six at NKU early in the third period before outscoring the Norse 47-22 the rest of the half to open up the win.
- Three UK players posted scoring efforts vs. Rice that rank in the top-10 for the most points in a first varsity game. Evelyn Akhator and Maci Morris both had 16 points, which tie for fifth all-time for a varsity debut game. Taylor Murray chipped in 12 points, good for the 10th-best varsity debut scoring effort.
- Kentucky's defense has been impressive so far this season, limiting opponents to 32.6% from the field and 27.2% from 3-point. UK limited Jackson State to 15.6% from the field, which is the lowest field goal percentage defense in school history.
- UK's defense showed vs. Morehead State as the Eagles entered the game leading the nation in scoring. The Wildcats held MSU to just 25.6% shooting from the field.
- Kentucky has gone on 13 runs of 10+ this season. Against Jackson State, UK went on four such runs, including a season-best 24-0 run as part of a 31-2 run to break open the game. UK also went on a 19-0 and two 13-0 runs against Jackson State.
- Kentucky did not go on any 10-0 runs against ASU, but did have several short spurts in key situations. UK went on a 6-0 run in 35 seconds to tie the game at 54-54 in regulation. Trailing 64-60 in overtime, Kentucky scored the last eight points of the game to clinch the win. During that 8-0 stretch, UK went 4-of-4 from the free-throw line.
- Kentucky has won 55 consecutive regular-season non-conference games in Memorial Coliseum, dating back to Dec. 19, 2008 vs. Alabama A&M. UK is 5-0 in such games this season.
- Last season, UK finished 24-10 and earned its sixth-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, which is a new school record. Kentucky finished No. 11/16 in the final rankings after five wins over ranked foes, including No. 2/2 South Carolina, No. 8/9 Baylor and No. 7/7 Louisville.
- Kentucky appeared in the NCAA Tournament for the sixth-straight year last season, marking a school record for consecutive appearances.

SCOUTING DUKE

- The Blue Devils could have the youngest lineup that the Wildcats have faced this year, as nobody on the starting five against UMass was older than a sophomore. However, the Duke freshmen were touted as the No. 1 class in the nation.
- Sophomore Azurá Stevens is a clear standout on the team, leading the Blue Devils in points per game (19.3), rebounds per game (10.0), and blocks (26). The 6-foot-6 forward is highly ranked in several statistical categories on the national scene, including double-doubles (5th/6), blocked shots (11th/26), field goals made (8th/78), and rebounds (16th/100).
- As a team, Duke is among the nation's best in blocked shots, ranked 12th with 56 rejections and rebounds, ranked 19th with 447. The Blue Devils are similar to the Wildcats in that both teams rank in the top-25 in both field goal percentage and field goal percentage defense, with Duke converting on 45.9% of its shots and allowing opponents to shoot 33.3% from the field, good for 24th and 21st among NCAA Division I institutions, respectively.

SERIES HISTORY VS. DUKE

- Sunday's contest will be the seventh matchup against the Blue Devils in the history of the two programs. Duke holds the advantage in the all-time series, 5-1. The series is tied 1-1 in games played in Lexington with Duke leading the series 2-0 in games played in Durham and 2-0 in neutral site games.
- The Blue Devils are on a two-game win streak against the Wildcats, winning each of the last two years.
- Kentucky's lone win in the series came Dec. 8, 2011 when the Wildcats took down Duke 72-65 in Rupp Arena.

LAST TIME VS. DUKE

- Ranked eighth in the nation, Kentucky went on the road to face No. 13 Duke and fell to the Blue Devils, 89-68. The Wildcats forced Duke into 25 turnovers and scored 21 points off those turnovers, but shot only 31.3% from the field, while Duke shot 55.8% to take down the Wildcats. Alexis Jennings had 17 points in the game to lead Kentucky.

UK VS. CURRENT ALIGNMENT OF THE ACC

- All-time against the ACC, the Wildcats hold a 50-36 record. UK is 0-1 vs. Clemson, 1-5 vs. Duke, 1-0 vs. Florida State, 34-18 vs. Louisville, 5-1 vs. Miami (Fla.), 0-5 vs. North Carolina, 2-3 vs. NC State, 1-1 vs. Notre Dame, 1-0 vs. Pittsburgh, 3-0 vs. Syracuse, 1-1 vs. Virginia Tech and 1-1 vs. Wake Forest.
- Duke is the second of two ACC teams that Kentucky is scheduled to play this season. The Wildcats defeated Louisville 72-54 last week in Rupp Arena.

2015-16 GAME NOTES

EPPS EARNS NATIONAL, CONFERENCE HONORS

After being named the espnW National Player of the Week on Sunday evening following her performances in Kentucky's wins over Louisville and Middle Tennessee, junior guard Makayla Epps was named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week on Tuesday, Dec. 15. Adding to her accolades for the week, she was then named to the NCAA Starting Five, which highlights the nation's top players for the week, on Dec. 16.

The honor was the second weekly conference accolade of Epps' career, as she was named the SEC Co-Player of the Week on Feb. 16, 2015. Last week, Epps was named to the 2015-16 Naismith Trophy Women's College Player of the Year Early Season Watch List. Epps is the first Kentucky player to earn a national player of the week honor since Jennifer O'Neill in 2013.

The native of Lebanon, Ky., started her impressive week against in-state rival Louisville at Rupp Arena, putting together one of the best individual performances for a Wildcat vs. UofL in the Matthew Mitchell era. Epps went 10-of-11 from the field against the Cardinals to post the highest field goal percentage for a UK player with at least 10 attempts since 1987. The junior went for 24 points, four rebounds, four assists and three steals in the game. Her season-best 24 points were the second most points scored for a UK player against UofL in the Mitchell era.

Epps continued her strong play a few days later at Middle Tennessee, posting 17 points on 8-of-13 shooting with four assists and three steals. The guard stepped up when UK needed it most. After a 7-0 MTSU run cut the Kentucky lead to four, Epps went on a 5-0 run to push Kentucky back in control.

9-0 START ONLY MATCHED FOUR OTHER TIMES

Kentucky's 9-0 start to the season is the first time the Wildcats have started a season 9-0 since the 2013-14 team went 11-0 to start the year. UK has only had four other seasons in which it started out with nine consecutive victories (1980-81, 2009-10, 2011-12, 2013-14).

FIVE STRAIGHT VS. RIVAL CARDS

The Kentucky women's basketball team has won five straight games against rival Louisville after taking down the Cardinals 72-54 on Thursday, Dec. 10 inside Rupp Arena. The winning streak against UofL is UK's longest since winning five straight from 1986-1990.

DEFENSE STELLAR AS WILDCATS DEFEAT JACKSON STATE

Kentucky put together one of the best defensive performances in program history on Sunday, Nov. 29 against Jackson State. The Wildcats limited the Tigers to just one field goal in the second half and seven field goals for the game. JSU shot 15.6% from the field in the game, which is the lowest field goal percentage for a UK opponent in school history. Overall, JSU had 24 points in the game, which was the second fewest points UK has ever allowed in a contest. UK also forced 37 turnovers and turned them into 42 points.

EPPS ON NAISMITH WATCH LIST 50

Makayla Epps has been named to the 2015-16 Naismith Trophy Women's College Player of the Year Early Season Watch List, as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club on Thursday, Dec. 10.

The 50-player watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2015-2016 college basketball season. The Naismith Women's College Player of the Year presented by AT&T will be awarded on April 4, 2016, in Indianapolis.

The Wildcats have had at least one player on the Watch List 50 for six consecutive seasons, dating back to the 2010-11 season when the duo of Victoria Dunlap and A'dia Mathies earned the distinction. Mathies was also named to the watch list in 2011-12 and 2012-13, while DeNesha Stallworth was the team's representative in 2013-14 and Jennifer O'Neill had the honor in 2014-15.

THOMPSON BACK AND BETTER FOR CATS

Kentucky senior guard Janee Thompson missed most of last season after sustaining an injury against South Carolina, but she is back and better than ever this season. The Chicago native has scored in double figures seven times this season, including two 20-point games.

Thompson put together a gritty performance against NKU to pace the Wildcats. The senior was in the hospital the day before the game due to illness but made the trip and led UK with 21 points and seven assists against the Norse. Entering this season, Thompson had scored 20 points only once in her career.

On the season, Thompson is averaging 13.8 points per game and 6.5 assists per game. She ranks high nationally in several categories, including 12th in assists with 59 and 11th in assists per game. Thompson is also 48th nationally shooting 45.0% from 3-point land.

HISTORIC NIGHT IN MEMORIAL VS. MOREHEAD

What a night it was on Wednesday, Nov. 19 in Memorial Coliseum, as Kentucky defeated in-state foe Morehead State, 112-57, behind some historic numbers.

On top of scoring 100+ points for the 48th time in school history, UK's Makayla Epps became only the second player in program history to record a triple-double with 21 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists. She was joined by two other players who recorded double-doubles - marking the first time since Nov. 28, 1989 UK had three players record double-doubles. Three UK players had 20+ points, marking the first time that had happened since 1989 as well, while as a team UK had 67 rebounds - tying the school record for most rebounds in a game - and 32 assists - one off the school record for assists in the game.

Individually, Janee Thompson and Alexis Jennings posted career highs in points scored, while Epps became the first player since Stacey Reed in 1993 to record 12 or more assists in a game. The 12 assists are good for the seventh-most in a single game in UK history.

EPPS EARNS TRIPLE-DOUBLE FAMILY BRAGGING RIGHTS

Makayla Epps scored 21 points with 11 rebounds and 12 assists against Morehead State on Nov. 18, 2015 to record the second-ever triple-double in program history. The first triple-double was Feb. 14, 1986 when Leslie Nichols scored 18 points with 13 rebounds and 11 steals.

Epps' triple-double is the first of the points-rebounds-assists variety. It was the second triple-double in the SEC this season and the 27th in league history. There have been 10 triple-doubles in women's college basketball this season.

But most importantly for Epps, it was the first in her family history. After the game, Epps, whose father played men's basketball at Kentucky in the mid-1990s and won a national championship, said she was going to have to call her dad as quick as possible because he never did that.

TOP TO BOTTOM SCORING

Heading into the season, some questioned Kentucky's depth with only nine eligible players on the roster, but so far UK has shown that depth doesn't always mean experience.

With nine players on the team - including five that have played in their first career games this season - UK has shown it has a deep bench. Kentucky has had at least three players score in double figures in every game this season, while three of UK's seven games have seen five players score in double figures.

In just nine games played, UK has played nine players with seven scoring in double figures at least once. All five Kentucky starters are averaging 10+ points per game this season.

DEFENSE STARTING STRONG

The Wildcat defense has had a great start to the season, limiting opponents to 32.6% shooting from the field and 27.2% from the 3-point line. The field-goal percentage defense ranks ninth in the nation and second in the SEC. The Wildcats are allowing 53.7 points per game, which ranks 26th nationally, while forcing 21.5 turnovers per game.

Against Rice, Kentucky limited the Owls to 26.8% shooting and 39 points, marking the fewest points an opponent has scored against Kentucky in a season opener since 1974.

Morehead State was another step in the right direction for the UK defense as the Eagles entered the game leading the nation with 111.0 points per game in their first two contests. However, the Wildcats limited MSU to 57 points on 25.6% shooting from the field, including a 21.9% mark from 3-point land.

Kentucky's best defensive performance to date was against Jackson State, when they limited the Tigers to a program-record low 15.6%.

CATS' OFFSEASON WORK PAYING OFF

After last season, Coach Mitchell put a point of emphasis on Kentucky becoming a better shooting team, asking his Wildcats to increase their field goal percentage from last season - which was 38% - to 42-45%.

The team responded by putting in a ton of off-season work and working hard on their shooting during preseason practice. So far, it has paid off as Kentucky is shooting 49.1% from the field this season, which ranks 8th in the nation and second in the SEC. Kentucky is 40.6% from 3-point land, which ranks fifth in the nation and first in the SEC.

Against Eastern Michigan, Kentucky shot 59.6%, which was its highest field goal percentage since 60% in February 2007.

YOU GET AN ASSIST AND YOU GET AN ASSIST...

Part of the reason the Wildcats have such a high field goal percentage has been efficiency on the offensive end, which is evident in Kentucky ranking 11th in the nation and second in the SEC in assists per game at 19.1.

From Nov. 18-Nov. 29, Kentucky had 20 or more assists in four straight games for the first time since Nov. 2013. Makayla Epps and Janee Thompson rank eighth and 11th in the nation, respectively, in assists per game.

MITCHELL 8TH FASTEST TO 200 WINS

Matthew Mitchell won his 200th game at Kentucky on Nov. 29 vs. Jackson State, becoming the 8th fastest SEC women's basketball coach to 200 wins. A complete list is below:

EPPS' RETURN KEYS WIN AT #15 ARIZONA STATE

Junior guard Makayla Epps wasted no time getting her feet back under her after missing the first game of the season due to an offseason suspension. Epps scored 20 points in a winning effort at No. 15/15 Arizona State with all of her points coming after halftime, including eight points in overtime.

Epps hit two free throws to tie the game in regulation before ASU took the lead again and Epps again knocked down two free throws to tie the game and force overtime. In OT, Epps hit a jumper to put the Wildcats up 66-64 and got an defensive rebound and make two free throws with seconds remaining to clinch the 68-64 win.

EPPS CONTINUES 20+ POINT PERFORMANCES

Makayla Epps has made a strong statement, not only building off her impressive season last year when she led the league in scoring in SEC games, but showing she is much improved and focused.

In eight games played this season, Epps has scored 138 points, posting 20 or more four times. Epps had 20 all after halftime against Arizona State, before 21 in a triple-double performance vs. Morehead and 21 vs. Eastern Michigan. Against Louisville, Epps scored 24 points and hit 10-of-11 field goals for the highest field goal percentage for a Wildcat since 1987.

Epps has had great success getting to the basket and finishing, but even more impressive is she is 19-for-24 on the year in free throw attempts.

In eight games played, Epps leads the team by averaging 17.3 points per game along with 5.5 rpg and 6.3 assists per game.

JENNINGS MAKING A MARK

Sophomore forward and 2015 SEC All-Freshman Team member Alexis Jennings changed her attitude over the summer, Coach Mitchell said. And so far he

Jennings also had a double-double in UK's exhibition game vs. Union University and narrowly missed a double-double in the season opener vs. Rice with 10 points and nine rebounds. Against ASU, Jennings had eight points and six rebounds, while she had 10 points vs. Colorado and Jackson State.

Jennings is averaging 11.1 points per game with 6.8 rebounds per game, 1.4 blocks per game and only has 13 turnovers in 224 minutes played.

ROOKIES HAVING GOOD PERFORMANCES AS GROWING PAINS CONTINUE

Kentucky's three freshmen - Batouly Carara, Maci Morris and Taylor Murray - are going to have some growing pains in their first season in college. But so far, they have had success with those pains as all three have scored in double figures at least once.

Camara had her career game at No. 15 Arizona State as she scored 10 points - including six straight to get the Wildcats back in the game in third quarter. Morris scored 16 points to lead UK in the season opener vs. Rice and bested that with 17 against Eastern Michigan, including a career-best five 3-pointers made. Murray has scored in double-figures six times this season, including a season-best 13 points against Jackson State. The guard is also averaging 3.1 assists per game and 1.8 steals per game.

The freshman class is responsible for 30% of the team's scoring this season.

EPPS EARNS PRESEASON ALL-SEC HONORS

The Southeastern Conference announced that junior guard Makayla Epps has been named to the Preseason All-SEC team, as voted on by a panel of both SEC and national media members, and First-Team Preseason All-SEC, as voted on by league coaches. Epps is one of six players in the league to earn preseason honors from both the media and league coaches.

Epps was an All-SEC First Team honoree following the 2014-15 season. The Lebanon, Ky. native assumed the point guard role after Janee Thompson suffered a season-ending leg injury, and went on to average a team-high 14.3 points per game during the regular season for an average that ranked eighth in the SEC. Within league action, she was atop the SEC with 15.1 ppg and had the second-highest field goal percentage at a .413 clip. Additionally, she was eighth in assists (2.9), ninth in free throw percentage (.750) and sixth in minutes played (33.6). Epps also earned a spot on the Nancy Lieberman watch list, an award given annually to the nation's top point guard.

WILDCATS PICKED TO FINISH FIFTH IN SEC

The Southeastern Conference announced its Preseason Media Poll on Oct. 20, as voted on by a panel of both SEC and national media members. Kentucky was picked to finish fifth in the league, while 2015 SEC champion South Carolina was tabbed as the top team in the conference with 265 votes. The Wildcats were also selected to finish fifth in the preseason poll by league coaches.

HARPER, RICH, ROE, GOODIN-ROGERS LEAVE UK

Three players left the women's basketball program prior to the start of the 2015-16 season, while Kyvin Goodin-Rogers left the team on Nov. 30. On Oct. 15, Chrishae Rowe was dismissed from the team for failing to uphold the standards of the program. Two players also elected to transfer, with Linnae Harper making the decision to leave on Oct. 26 and Morgan Rich leaving the team on Nov. 3.

KENTUCKY VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

In order to be one of the nation's best, you have to play against the nation's best. So far this year, Kentucky is 1-0 vs. ranked foes and is scheduled to face five opponents who are ranked in both the AP and USA Today/Coaches Top 25 and an additional two teams that received votes in one of the polls.

UK started the season with a 68-64 OT win at No. 15 Arizona State before defeating UofL, who was receiving votes in the AP poll on Dec. 10. December ends with UK hosting No. 11/13 Duke on Dec. 20 inside Rupp Arena.

When SEC play opens up in January, UK will face No. 2/2 South Carolina on Jan. 14, followed by No. 14/16 Tennessee on Jan. 25, hosting both opponents inside Memorial Coliseum.

A road swing in February should prove to be a tough test for the team. The Wildcats will first head to South Carolina on Feb. 4 before traveling to Starkville, Miss., to square off with No. 9/9 Mississippi State. The regular season is then slated to come to a close against No. 18/18 Texas A&M in College Station, Texas.

Kentucky is also scheduled to face Missouri, Georgia, Florida and Auburn, who are receiving votes in one of the two polls.

UK was 6-6 vs. ranked teams last season, and 3-4 vs. the top-10. Matthew Mitchell is 37-43 all-time vs. ranked teams, and 15-24 vs. the top-10.

CORSARO, SCOTT SIGNED NLI FOR 2016

The University of Kentucky women's basketball program added two talented players to its 2016 class on Friday as highly ranked guard Lindsey Corsaro from Indianapolis and talented all-around athlete Chanin Scott from Charlotte have signed National Letters of Intent.

Lindsey Corsaro, a 6-foot guard out of Roncalli High School in Indianapolis, has racked up the awards during her high school career. She is in the top portion of the espnW HoopGurlz Top 100 as a five-star recruit, sitting at No. 35 in the nation while she was also tabbed as the No. 8 guard in the class of 2016.

Chanin Scott is a 6-foot wing player out of North Carolina, where she was a member of the No. 4 nationally-ranked Myers Park High School Team. Scott helped the Mustangs win two consecutive North Carolina 4A Championships in 2014 and 2015, and is tabbed as the No. 41 wing in nation by ESPN.

KENTUCKY ENDS 2014-15 NO. 8 IN THE RPI

The NCAA listed Kentucky at No. 8 in the Rating Percentage Index (RPI) in 2014-15's last report. The RPI is a measure of strength of schedule and how a team does against that schedule. It does not consider things like margin of victory, only whether or not a team won and where the game was played. It is used by the NCAA as one of its factors in deciding which teams to invite to the NCAA Tournament and where to seed them.

The basic formula is 25% team winning percentage (WP), 50% opponents' average winning percentage (OWP), and 25% opponents' opponents' average winning percentage (OOWP).

UK was one of two schools in the nation with both its men's and women's basketball team in the top 10 of the RPI (Maryland is the other). The UK men were No. 1.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE DAUGHTER

Junior guard Makayla Epps, daughter of former UK and All-SEC point guard Anthony Epps (1993-97), provided a huge spark for the Cats last season and against Arizona State this season. Epps scored in double figures in 26 of 33 games, including four straight to end the season.

Overall, she was UK's leading scorer with 14.5 ppg (tied for fourth in the SEC), while dishing out a team-high 98 assists. In conference play, Epps led the league in scoring with 15.1 ppg.

"40 MINUTES OF DREAD"

Since Coach Mitchell implemented the "40 minutes of dread" style of play before the 2009-10 season, UK has had quite a remarkable run:

- Recorded an impressive 170-49 overall record, including a 99-10 mark at home.
- Won 20-plus games every year, averaging 26.8 wins per season over the last six years.
- Advanced to a school-record six straight NCAA Tournaments, including Elite Eight appearances three times.
- Finished in the top four of the SEC standings five of the last six seasons, including winning the SEC regular season title in 2012, its first in 30 years.
- Advanced to the SEC Tournament championship game four times.
- Ranked in the top five nationally four of the last six seasons in turnover margin.
- Forced 800 or more turnovers four of the last six seasons.
- Been ranked in the AP top 25 poll 119 straight weeks, including a stretch of 35 straight weeks in the top 10.

THE MAGIC "80"

The Wildcats hold a remarkable 327-22 (.936) record since 1974 when scoring 80 points or more. The last loss came against at Dayton on March 22, 2015 when the Cats fell 99-94 in the 2nd round of the NCAA Tournament. UK is 81-4 (.952) under Mitchell when scoring 80 points or more.

UK IN OVERTIME

UK is 28-24 all-time in overtime games, including an 9-2 mark under Matthew Mitchell, who is 11-3 in his 11-year career as a head coach in extra minutes.

The Wildcats are 1-0 this season after a 68-64 win at No. 15 Arizona State on Nov. 15, 2015.

KENTUCKY ALL-TIME

Kentucky is 745-496 (.597) in its 42nd year of varsity women's basketball, including 202-81 (.713) in eight seasons under Matthew Mitchell.

CATS EARN HIGHEST GRADE-POINT AVERAGE IN MITCHELL ERA

Kentucky not only excelled on the court last season but in the classroom as well. The Wildcats earned a 3.335 grade-point average in the 2014 fall semester, the highest mark in the Matthew Mitchell era and the third straight semester with a 3.0 GPA or better.

Overall, 10 of UK's 12 players had a 3.0 GPA or better, including two Wildcats, freshman Alyssa Rice and senior Jelléah Sidney, with a perfect 4.0.

In eight seasons under Mitchell, 19 Wildcats have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 100 percent of his players in their final season of eligibility have received their degree, including Azia Bishop, Bria Goss, Jennifer O'Neill and Sidney last May.

UK's scholarship student-athletes across all 22 varsity sports had a cumulative GPA of 3.112 for the fall semester of 2014.

A WINNING INSTITUTION

The University of Kentucky is one of just five institutions in the nation that has seen both its men's and women's basketball programs tally 20 or more wins in six consecutive seasons. UK joins BYU, Duke, Gonzaga and Notre Dame in that elite category. UK has tallied a 373-88 combined record between its two programs. That record includes a 203-14 mark in Lexington in Rupp Arena (men) and Memorial Coliseum (women).

Victoria Dunlap re-entered the professional rankings after taking time off following a stint with the Seattle Storm. She recently signed to Sport León in Spain and was named player of the week for a strong performance she had recently.

Bria Goss is currently playing her first professional year in Finland for Hyvinkään Ponnema.

A'dia Mathies stayed with Ramat Hasharon in Israel for another year, while 2015 alum Jennifer O'Neill will also be in the country playing for Hapoel Rishon Le-Zion.

After spending a year in Spain, DeNesha Stallworth has signed a contract with SEQ Basketball in Australia.

Samarie Walker rounds out the list of active professionals out of UK's program. She recently signed with the Visby Ladies in Sweden.

MATTHEW AND JENNA MITCHELL DONATE \$1 MILLION TO UK ATHLETICS

In June of 2014, Coach Matthew Mitchell and his wife, Jenna, pledged \$1 million over the next 10 years to the University of Kentucky Athletics Department. The donation will provide UK Athletics \$100,000 per year over the next 10 years to be used for a variety of capital projects, including updates and renovations for football. The donation is the largest ever given by a UK athletics employee to the athletics department.

RUPP ARENA CHOSEN FOR THREE STRAIGHT NCAA REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS

For the first time since the women's basketball Final Four in 1986, Rupp Arena and the University of Kentucky have been selected to host the NCAA regional tournament in 2016, 2017 and 2018 for women's basketball, the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee has announced.

In 2016, Bridgeport, Conn. (Webster Bank Arena), Dallas, Texas (American Airlines Center), Lexington (Rupp Arena) and Sioux Falls, S.D. (Denny Sanford Premier Center) will serve as the four regional sites March 25-28.

In 2017, Bridgeport (Webster Bank Arena) and Lexington (Rupp Arena) will again host, joined by Oklahoma City (Chesapeake Energy Arena) and Stockton (Stockton Arena) March 24-27.

In 2018, Lexington will again play host at Rupp Arena, joined by Albany, N.Y. (Times Union Center), Kansas City, Mo. (Sprint Center) and Spokane, Wash. (Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena), with regional play taking place March 23-26.

COMEBACK CATS

Kentucky's mantra last season could be the "Comeback Cats" as UK had to battle back from at least nine-point deficits six times and double-digit second half deficits in four games (Baylor, Louisville, Alabama and Mississippi State). UK followed a similar story line in its second game this season, trailing by 12 in the second half at Arizona State before bouncing back to earn a win in overtime.

The Cats are 81-47 (.632) in "close games" (games decided by 10 points or fewer) under Matthew Mitchell, including 12-6 last season.

- Became UK's all-time winningest coach on March 3, 2013 with 139 wins in just six seasons.
