Louisville plays its second true road game of the season the day after Christmas as the Cardinals face intrastate rival Kentucky in Lexington, Ky. on Saturday. Louisville beat Utah Valley 98-68 in its second game of the Billy Minardi Classic on Dec. 23 as Trey Lewis totaled 21 points, seven rebounds and hit 7-of-10 shots from the field. The Wildcats (9-2), ranked 11th in the USA Today poll and 12th by AP, fell 74-67 to Ohio State in the CBS Sports Classic on Dec. 19 in their last game as guard Jamal Murray scored a career-high 33 points. Kentucky had the week off prior to facing the Cardinals.

### CARD FILE

■ Louisville's **134 victories** over the last five years are the **second-most wins in the nation** in that stretch. Louisville and Wichita State are the only schools in the nation to win 30 games in three of the last four seasons.

■ UofL **leads in the nation** in scoring margin (+30.2), is second in rebounding margin (+14.9) and scoring defense (55.9), and is fifth in field goal percentage defense (.352).

■ UofL has a **26-3 record** during the month of December over the last four years, winning 14 of its last 16 in that month.

■ Louisville is **sixth in the nation** in field goal percentage (.519). UofL has shot above 50 percent in nine of its 12 games. The Cards shot 50 percent or above on eight occasions all last season. UofL is 13th nationally in scoring (86.1 ppg).

■ Louisville has opened with at least a 11-1 record through 12 games for the sixth straight season. The Cards have won at least 11 of their first 13 games each of the last five years (12-1 last year).

■ UofL has an all-time **10-5 record** vs. teams ranked No. 12 in the AP poll, winning seven of those last 10. UofL has won 27 of its last 50 against AP ranked foes.

■ Louisville has a **60-33 record** over the last 10 years on its opponents' home court.

■ **Damion Lee** has been the Cardinals' top scorer in eight of 12 games this season. He is among the ACC leaders in scoring (17.3, 5th), steals (1.8, 3rd) and free throw percentage (.891, 3rd).

■ **About Kentucky** — Louisville plays its second true road game of the season the day after Christmas as the Cardinals face intrastate rival Kentucky in Lexington, Ky. on Saturday. The Wildcats (9-2), ranked 11th in the USA Today poll and 12th by AP, fell 74-67 to Ohio State in the CBS Sports Classic on Dec. 19 in their last game as guard Jamal Murray scored a career-high 33 points. Kentucky had the week off prior to facing the Cardinals. Kentucky has won 27 straight home games and is 61-1 against non-conference opponents in Rupp Arena in Coach John Calipari's seven seasons there.

Louisville trails the all-time series against Kentucky 15-33. UK has won seven of the last eight. The Wildcats hold a 24-11 advantage since the series resumed in 1983. Current UofL Coach Rick Pitino had a 6-2 record as the Wildcats' head coach in games against Louisville; and has a 5-11 record facing UK. The campuses are 78 miles apart, connected by Interstate 64.

Louisville fell 58-50 to the top-ranked Wildcats last season as the Cardinals made just 25.9 percent of its field goals, with Terry Rozier scoring 15 points to lead UofL.

The two teams have met in NCAA Tournament competition on six occasions, with Louisville winning twice. UofL won 80-68 in overtime in the 1983 Mideast Regional championship in Knoxville, Tenn. in a game labeled as the first "Dream Game." The two teams had not met in regular season play for 62 years before the current series was renewed in 1983; the rivals have met all 33 seasons since. UofL has a collective 83-67 all-time record against current members of the SEC.

■ **Cards-Cats Ties** — Louisville Coach Rick Pitino coached eight years at Kentucky (1989-97, 219-50 record), including guiding the Wildcats to the 1996 NCAA Championship and a 1997 national runner-up finish. A jersey hangs in his honor in Rupp Arena.

□ UofL assistant coach Ralph Willard was associate head coach on Pitino's first staff at Kentucky in 1989-90 before leaving to become the head coach at Western Kentucky.

□ Kentucky assistant coach Kenny Payne played at Louisville from 1985-89 and totaled 1,083 career points. He was a freshman on the Cardinals' 1986 NCAA Championship team. He averaged 14.5 points, 5.7 rebounds and shot 50.8 percent from the field as a senior. He had 10 points and five rebounds against UK his junior year (12/12/87) and totaled 16 points and five rebounds as a senior (12/31/88).

□ UofL equipment manager Vinny Tatum was a student manager at UK under Pitino for four years (1990-93).

□ UofL Director of Player Development Wayne Turner helped Kentucky win the 1996 and 1998 national titles in his four seasons there (1995-99). UK's career leader in steals (238), Turner worked on UK's staff in 2010-11 while completing his undergraduate degree. He had 11 points, four assists and two steals vs. Louisville as a senior in 1998-99.

□ Louisville began its run to the 2013 NCAA Championship in Kentucky's Rupp Arena, beating North Carolina A&T 79-48 in the second round and Colorado State 82-56 in the third round.

■ **Card File** — Trey Lewis was honored as the Most Outstanding Player of the 14th Annual Billy Minardi Classic, averaging 19.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and connecting on 6-of-12 three-pointers in the two games. He scored 21 points and grabbed a season-high matching seven rebounds in the second round against Utah Valley ... UofL swatted a season-high matching nine blocks vs. Utah Valley, its second consecutive and fourth time with nine blocks this season ... Louisville has averaged 19.8 points off turnovers this season, averaging 1.3 points per opponent turnover ... Louisville shot a season-high 50 percent from three-point range against Western Kentucky (7-of-14). At the defensive end, the Cardinals limited the Hilltoppers to 11.1 percent three-point accuracy (2-of-18) for a team that entered the game connecting on 40.1 percent of its threes ... Louisville has a 26-3 record during the month of December over the last four years, winning 14 of its last 16 in that month ... The Cardinals have produced double-digit steals in four games this season, including grabbing 12 vs. Utah Valley in its last game. UofL is second in the ACC in steals (8.4) ... Louisville has shot above 50 percent in nine of its 12 games this season, starting the season with five straight 50 percent-plus games. UofL shot 50 percent or above on eight occasions all of last season ... Louisville has won 125 consecutive games when scoring at least 85 points in regulation and is 105-0 in those games under Pitino ... Louisville has started six different combinations this season in its 12 games. Nine different players have started games for the Cardinals this season and 10 Cardinals are averaging at least 12 minutes a game ... Quentin Snider and Ray Spalding are the first Jefferson County high school products to start multiple games together in 21 years, since DeJuan Wheat and Jason Osborne in 1994-95 ... Rick Pitino coached his 500th game at the University of Louisville when the Cardinals played at Michigan State on Dec. 2. He has a 379-127 record in his 15th year at UofL ... Matz Stockman is averaging 6.5 points and 3.3 rebounds in his four appearances over the last five games. He totaled a career-high eight points and five rebounds in 11 minutes against Kennesaw State, the most extensive action of his career ... Louisville held No. 3 Michigan State to a pair of free throws over the first seven minutes of its game Dec. 2 and led 18-5 about 10 minutes into the game ... UofL has held four teams below 30 percent shooting from the field, including a season-best 21.0 percent vs. Samford.

■ **Happy Holidays** — The Cardinals have enjoyed success in recent years with their first game after Christmas. Louisville has won 18 of its last 22 games played after Christmas, including 11 of the last 14 under UofL Coach Rick Pitino. All but three of those have been UofL home games. The Cardinals fell to Kentucky on Dec. 27, 2014 in UofL's first game after Christmas last season.

■ **Event Champions** — Louisville claimed the Brooklyn Hoops Holiday Invitational title by sweeping its four games in the five-team, round-robin event in November. It was the 28th regular season tournament championship for the Cardinals.

■ **Computers** — Louisville is No. 24 nationally in the ratings percentage index (RPI) and fourth in the Sagarin Ratings through Dec. 23. UofL has the nation's No. 3 defense in Ken Pomoroy's adjusted defensive ratings and are sixth overall.

■ **Cards Sixth All-Time in the Polls** — Louisville has been ranked in the Associated Press poll on 592 occasions, sixth most all-time (completed the 2014-15 season with a streak of 60 consecutive weeks). UofL has been ranked among the nation's top 10 in the preseason poll four of the last five years (unranked this year, eighth in 2014-15, third in 2013-14, second in 2012-13, ninth in 2011-12). Until the first three polls of this year, the last time UofL was not in the poll was in the March 5, 2012 poll -- a year in which UofL advanced to the Final Four.

■ **Quality Start** — Louisville is off to an impressive start at both ends of the floor through its first 12 games. Defensively through games of Dec. 23, the Cardinals are second in the nation in rebound margin (+14.9) and scoring defense (55.9 points), fifth in field goal percentage defense (.352) and 13th in turnover margin (+4.8). UofL is second in the ACC in steals (8.4) while leading the league in scoring margin, scoring defense, three-point defense, field goal percentage defense, field goal percentage and rebounding margin. Louisville has a differential of 16.7 percent between its shooting percentage and its opponents. Each of UofL's 11 victories have been by 20 or more points. The Cards have won six consecutive games by at least 20 points for the first time ever. UofL is third in the nation in Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive statistics through Dec. 23.

Offensively, the Cardinals are sixth in the nation in field goal percentage (.519) and lead the nation in scoring margin (+30.2 points). UofL has surpassed the 50 percent mark in nine games. This year is the first that the Cards have shot above 50 percent from the field in its first five games of the season since at least 1971-72 (when complete records are available). The Cardinals have shot above 60 percent from the field for a half in six of the last 10 games, including a high of 69.6 percent vs. Saint Louis. Louisville scored 80 or more points in its four first games for the second straight season. UofL is 33rd nationally in fewest turnovers per game (10.9).

■ **Cards Continue Productive Defense** — Louisville teams under Rick Pitino have been known for their defensive intensity and the 2015-16 unit has followed in that tradition. UofL has limited its opponents to 57 or less points in eight of its 12 games this season, allowing an average of 55.9 points, second-best in the nation in scoring defense. Louisville committed fewer turnovers than its opponent in 11 games and is 13th in the nation in turnover margin (+4.8), committing single digit turnovers in three games this season.

Louisville has ranked among the nation's top 40 in field goal percentage defense in 12 of the past 14 years, including this season's .352 percentage, which ranks fifth nationally. UofL has held eight of its opponents under 40 percent shooting from the field, six under 36 percent and four under 30 percent.

■ **Rebounding Strength** — Louisville is second in the nation in rebounding margin with a +14.9 advantage and is 17th in offensive rebounds per game (14.8). The Cards have had a double-digit rebounding margin in six of its last 11 games. Louisville has more than doubled its opponent's rebound total in five games (vs. North Florida, St. Francis, Saint Louis, Grand Canyon and Kennesaw St.) after having done that only five times in the previous 1,000 games. The Cards have registered a +30 or better rebounding advantage in a single game in each of the past two years after finishing with a 53-22 margin vs. North Florida and 55-20 vs. Grand Canyon. Last season, UofL outrebounded Jacksonville State 60-26 on Nov. 17, 2014. Nine different UofL players average three or more rebounds. UofL was outrebounded 40-30 at Michigan State, a team which leads the nation in rebound margin.

■ **Success vs. Top 25 Foes** -- Louisville has won 27 of its last 50 against AP ranked opponents, falling at No. 3 Michigan State on Dec. 2 in its last Top 25 matchup. Louisville has a 46-36 record against Top 25 teams over the last nine years (0-1 this year, 4-7 last year, 5-5 in 2013-14, 9-3 in 2012-13). UofL has been victorious seven of the last 16 times it has faced an AP top-five opponent. UofL has won 17 of its last 35 games when facing Top 10 teams, spanning the last nine years.

■ **Finals Week** — The last day of classes for the fall semester at the University of Louisville was Dec. 7 with final examinations completed from Dec. 9-15. The first day of the spring semester at UofL will be Jan. 6.

■ **Injury Update** — Mangok Mathiang broke his left foot on Dec. 19 against Western Kentucky. He had surgery to insert a screw on Dec. 20 and is expected out 6-8 weeks. Deng Adel, a starter in the Cards' first two games who had been out since he suffered a knee injury in practice on Nov. 20, returned to action for the last two games. Anas Mahmoud also returned to play against Utah Valley after missing three games with a sprained ankle.

■ **Lee a Candidate for Erving Award**

— UofL graduate guard/forward Damion Lee is among 20 watch list members for the 2016 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award presented by the University of Massachusetts and the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Lee was sixth among the nation's top small forwards in a preseason ranking of the position by The Sporting News. He was also cited on CBSSports.com's list of the Top 100 players entering the 2015-16 season. Lee is playing his final collegiate season at UofL after transferring from Drexel, where he was the nation's No. 4 scorer last year (21.4 ppg). He leads the Cardinals in scoring and is fifth in the ACC, averaging 17.3 points while connecting on 50.8 percent of his shots from the field.

Lee is also on the 2016 Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year 50 man early season watch list. He is one of nine ACC players included. The list will be pared to the midseason 30 on Feb. 11 and ten finalists will be named on March 2. The winner will be announced on April 3.

■ **Card Clips** — Anas Mahmoud returned to action for the first time since spraining his ankle in practice on Dec. 15, matching a career high with four blocked shots in nine minutes against Utah Valley ... Louisville matched a season-high with 10 three-point goals against Kennesaw State and hit 7-of-14 threes vs. Western Kentucky ... Louisville has dominated inside this season, scoring 51 percent of its points in the paint (518 points in 12 games, 43.2 per game) ... Quentin Snider's 53 assists with just 15 turnovers this season ranks him third in the ACC and 26th in the nation in assists-to-turnover ratio (3.53). He has committed a turnover an average of one every 22 minutes. He handed out a career-high eight assists against both Grand Canyon and Kennesaw State ... Chinanu Onuaku produced his first double-double of the season with 10 points, 12 rebounds and two blocked shots against Western Kentucky. He nearly had consecutive double-doubles, totaling 10 points, nine rebounds vs. UMKC. He scored a career-high 18 points against Hartford, adding nine rebounds and two blocked shots. His previous high of 12 points vs. Jacksonville State had been set one year ago on the same date (Nov. 17, 2014). Onuaku has grabbed six or more rebounds in 10 of his last 11 games ... Forward Herbert Crook (1984-88), a starter on the Cardinals' 1986 NCAA Championship team, was among six 2015 inductees to the UofL Athletic Hall of Fame.

■ **28 Former Pitino Assistants/Players Became Head Coaches** -- UofL Coach Rick Pitino has had 28 of his former assistants or players rise to a collegiate head coaching position. Pitino's son, Richard Pitino, added his name in April 2012 when he was named head coach at FIU and is now at Minnesota. There are 10 additional former assistants as current head coaches to bring the total to 11 active, including Mick Cronin at Cincinnati; Scott Davenport at Bellarmine; Kevin Keatts at UNC Wilmington, Steve Masiello at Manhattan; Marvin Menzies at New Mexico State; Kareem Richardson at Missouri-Kansas City; Reggie Theus at Cal State Northridge; Kevin Willard at Seton Hall; and Tubby Smith at Texas Tech. Pitino's nine Division I former assistants as current head coaches is the most in the nation. Three active coaches reached the 2015 NCAA Tournament (Cronin, Masiello and Menzies).

Pitino has a collective 40-10 record in games against his former assistants (3-0 vs. Ralph Willard; 7-5 Tubby Smith; 7-0 Billy Donovan, 7-5 Mick Cronin, 1-0 Scott Davenport, 1-0 Marvin Menzies, 6-0 Kevin Willard, 2-0 Steve Masiello, 2-0 Richard Pitino, 2-0 Kareem Richardson, 1-0 Kevin Keatts, 1-0 Reggie Theus). Davenport's team won the 2011 NCAA Division II Championship. Indiana Pacers head coach Frank Vogel was a student manager for Pitino at Kentucky and his video coordinator with the Celtics. Pitino coached former Golden State Warriors coach Mark Jackson at the New York Knicks. Donovan moved from Florida to the NBA's Oklahoma City Thunder. Eastern Kentucky coach Dan McHale was a program assistant at Louisville for two seasons. Seven former Pitino players also became collegiate head coaches, five of which are currently active including Travis Ford of Oklahoma St.; Mark Pope of Utah Valley; Sean Woods of Morehead St.; Donovan and Masiello. Including games against both his former assistants and former players who went on to become collegiate head coaches, Pitino is 47-11 (record vs. former players as head coaches: 3-1 vs. Travis Ford, 2-0 vs. John Pelfrey, 1-0 Scott Padgett, Mark Pope 1-0 and Donovan).

■ **Cards Sign Impressive Duo** — Louisville signed a pair of outstanding high school products in November including **V.J. King**, a 6-7, 180-pound guard/forward from Paul VI Catholic High School in Fairfax, Va.; and **Frankie Hughes**, a 6-3, 170-pound guard from Garfield Heights (Ohio) High School.

**King** averaged 18.5 points, 12.3 rebounds and 4.2 assists as a junior last season in helping Paul VI to a 20-15 record. A first-team all-state, all-area and all-conference selection as a junior, King is ranked No. 21 nationally by Scout.com, 24th by Rivals.com, 25th by 247Sports.com and is No. 27 in the ESPN 100.

Originally from North Carolina, King moved to Akron, Ohio, where he played at St. Vincent-St. Mary -- the alma mater of LeBron James -- through his sophomore season before transferring. He averaged 16.2 points as a sophomore in helping SVSM to a 19-10 record and 2013 Ohio Division II State Tournament semifinals.

King has won two gold medals as a member of two USA Basketball team in the 2013 FIBA Americas U16 Championship in Maldonado, Uruguay, averaging 8.2 points and 5.2 rebounds; and the 2014 FIBA U17 World Championship in Dubai, United Arab Emirates where he averaged 6.7 points and 2.9 rebounds. He participated in the 2015 USA Basketball Junior National Team minicamp in October.

**Hughes** averaged 17 points, 5.8 rebounds and 5.1 assists as a junior last season in leading Garfield Heights to a 24-4 record and the Ohio Division I semifinals, only the third time the school had advanced to that level in the state tournament. He signed with the Cardinals on Nov. 11 on his 18th birthday.

Hughes had 14 points and 11 rebounds in the state semifinal game. Current Louisville guard Trey Lewis also played at Garfield Heights, leading his team to the state semifinals during his senior year in 2011. Terry Rozier, who played two seasons with the Cardinals before joining the Boston Celtics this season, also hailed from the Cleveland area at Shaker Heights High School.

Hughes is ranked among the nation's top 200 players by 247Sports.com, Hughes scored a season-high 28 points against Mentor. He averaged 10.7 points per game as a sophomore. He averaged 7.9 points, 3.5 rebounds and three assists during the 2015 summer AAU competition.

■ **Lewis A Good Works Team Nominee** -- UofL guard Trey Lewis is among a group of 154 nominees for the 2016 Allstate National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Good Works Team®. The distinguished award shines a spotlight on a select group of student-athletes who have shown dedication to service in their communities. Former UofL guard Peyton Siva received recognition on the Allstate NABC Good Works team as a senior in 2013. A graduate transfer from Cleveland, Lewis has a passion for community service and doing his best to make an impact off the court. Whether if it is talking to local schools, church groups, summer camps, participating in health education, or visiting those who have suffered traumatic accidents, Lewis invests significant personal time to connect with each individual.

■ **Cardinal Spurts** — In its 12 games this season, Louisville has produced 33 runs of 8-0 or better, including separate runs of 10-0, 9-0 and three 8-0 runs in its last game vs. Utah Valley. UofL had a season-best 21-0 run vs. Hartford on Nov. 17. Louisville has forced its opponents into 39 scoring droughts of three minutes or more, including three separate scoring droughts of 3:17, 3:51 and 3:00 against Utah Valley. UofL had a season-best 9:24 period of scoreless defense vs. Hartford.

■ **International Flavor** — Louisville has an international flavor with four players on its roster hailing from foreign countries. Mangok Mathiang was born in Sudan, Africa and lived in Melbourne, Australia where he also played rugby and Australian Rules Football before coming to the United States. He played a season at Carbondale (Ill.) Brehm Prep School before signing with the Cardinals. Deng Adel followed a similar path as he was born in the Sudan, grew up in Australia and spent his senior year of high school in Florida. From Cairo, Egypt, Anas Mahmoud played a year at West Oaks Academy in Orlando, Florida before joining the Cards. He speaks four languages. Matz Stockman, from Oslo, Norway, attended school in Spain's Canary Islands during the 2013-14 season before his trek to the U.S.

■ **Redshirt Planned for McMahon** -- A redshirt season is planned for freshman guard Ryan McMahon. The 2015 Florida Class 3A Player of the Year, McMahon averaged 26.4 points, 3.3 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 2.5 steals last season in leading Cardinal Mooney to a 26-4 record and the state final four for the first time in school history. He had been considered a candidate for a redshirt year to allow for physical development when he initially signed with Louisville.

■ **Ear It Pronunciations** -- Trouble with pronunciations? Check out the Ear It pronunciations for the Cardinals' players from the men's basketball roster on [www.GoCards.com](http://www.GoCards.com). The links next to player names on the roster are supplied by TheNameEngine.com, an interactive audio service that provides proper audio pronunciations and phonetic spellings.

■ **Bench Production** -- Louisville's depth has been evident through the Cardinals' first 12 games this season, with UofL averaging 29.4 points off the bench. Last season, Louisville averaged just 9.9 points off the bench and had four games in which the bench was scoreless. Louisville has just three fewer bench points than it had all of last season. Louisville leads the ACC with a 12.0 points per game scoring margin over the reserves from opposing teams. UofL's bench scored 36 points vs. Utah Valley.

■ **Cards Are Light on Returning Experience** -- Louisville has just two players on its roster -- junior center Mangok Mathiang (out with an injury) and junior guard David Levitch -- that have played with the Cardinals more than a year. UofL returns just 17 percent of its scoring and a quarter of its assists from last season's 27-9 NCAA Elite Eight team. It is the lowest percentage of scoring returning for Louisville since 1972-73 when UofL was without a returning starter from its 1972 Final Four team and returned just 9.7 percent of its scoring (254 of 2,614). Quentin Snider's 146 points in 2014-15 ranks him as UofL's top returning scorer, which is the lowest figure for a UofL top returning scorer since 1972-73 (Bill Bunton, 121 points).

■ **Cardinals Reached 14th Elite Eight** -- Louisville advanced to its 14th NCAA Elite Eight in 2015 and third in the last four years. Louisville's 14 Elite Eight appearances rank sixth nationally. The NCAA recognizes Elite 8 records since 1951, the first year that all teams in the tournament would be required to win at least one game to advance to the Elite Eight. The Cardinals have a 10-4 record in regional championship games, winning two of their last three. UofL has reached the Elite Eight five of the last eight years and the Cardinals have participated in two of the last four Final Fours (UofL years in Elite Eight: 1959, 1972, 1975, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1986, 1997, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2015).

■ **Cards Have 13 Straight 20-Win Seasons** — Louisville is one of four Division I schools in the nation which has won 20 or more games in each of the past 13 seasons. Reaching 20 victories last year and extending their streaks are Kansas (26), Duke (19), Gonzaga (17), and Louisville (13). UofL Coach Rick Pitino has won at least 20 games in a season on 23 occasions, ranking him fifth among active coaches in 20-win seasons and 11th overall. Pitino won 30 in a single season for the sixth time in 2013-14. UofL has won at least 19 games in 41 of the last 45 years.

■ **Cardinals Reached 21st Sweet 16** -- Louisville advanced to its 21st NCAA Sweet 16 appearance and a school-record fourth straight in 2014-15. The Cardinals and Michigan State are the only two teams that have reached the last four Sweet 16s. Only three teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 21 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 26, Kentucky 26, Duke 24). The Cards have won seven of their last eight regional semifinal games and Louisville has a 15-12 record in NCAA regional semifinal games (14-8 since 1975), including a 6-1 mark under Rick Pitino. Louisville has been to at least the Sweet 16 in seven of the last 11 years, has reached the Elite Eight five of the last eight years and has been to two of the last four Final Fours. Louisville's NCAA Sweet 16 teams: 1975, 1978, 1979, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1984, 1986, 1988, 1989, 1993, 1994, 1996, 1997, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015.

■ **Impressive Victory vs. Grand Canyon** — The 61 points in the opening 20 minutes were the most for Louisville in the first half of a game since scoring 61 against Towson State on Dec. 7, 1998; and the most in any half since a 61-point second half against Northwestern St. on Nov. 18, 2006 ... UofL improved to 107-1 all-time when reaching the century mark in scoring ... The Cards' +35 advantage on the glass vs. Grand Canyon (55-20) was the program's largest rebounding margin at least since 1970, when complete records are available ... UofL had a 26-5 advantage on the glass in the first half, the largest margin in any half since outrebounding Jacksonville St. 37-13 in the second half on Nov. 17, 2014.

■ **Scoring Leader** -- Graduate transfer Damion Lee has scored in double figures in all 12 games this season and has been the Cardinals' top scorer in eight games. His 17.3 scoring average leads the Cardinals and is fifth in the ACC. The co-captain is shooting 50.8 percent from the field and is tied for the team leads with 25 three-pointers (in 55 attempts, .385; ninth in the ACC). He has scored a season-high 24 points twice, topping 20 points on four occasions. Lee was the nation's No. 4 scorer last year, averaging 21.4 points per game as a junior at Drexel.

■ **Toy Collection Successful** — A total of 1,905 toys were donated by Cardinal fans at a collection at the Louisville's Dec. 19 game against Western Kentucky. The toys will be donated to Kosair Children's Hospital around the holidays. The collection was associated with UofL Athletics' CardsCARE program and Kyle's Korner for Kids, the community outreach established in 2011 by former Cards' forward Kyle Kuric while a UofL student. About 2,000 toys have been donated annually by Cardinal fans at similar collections in previous years. Kuric, who has been playing basketball for Herbalife Gran Canaria in Spain for the past two seasons, is currently recovering from brain surgery. He helped the Cardinals reach the 2012 Final Four as a senior.

■ **Three With 375** — Louisville is the only NCAA Division I men's basketball program to have three different coaches with at least 375 victories at the school. Current Cards' Coach Rick Pitino has won 379 games in his 15th season at UofL, his predecessor Denny Crum won 675 games in 30 years (1971-2001) and Bernard "Peck" Hickman won 443 in his 23 years guiding the Cardinals (1944-67). Kansas can join that list when Bill Self wins his 375th game at Kansas (362) as Phog Allen (590) and Roy Williams (418) have at least 375 wins there (through Dec. 23).

■ **Cards Among Nation's Best in Pitino Era** — Louisville is among 17 programs in the nation that have won at least 70 percent of its games over the last 14 years. Louisville has a .749 winning percentage since U of L Coach Rick Pitino took over the reins of the Cardinal program, seventh best in the nation.

■ **Impressive Academic Performance** -- While the University of Louisville men's basketball team has performed well on the court, the Cardinals have excelled in the classroom as well. The team produced a collective 3.26 grade point average for 2014-15, just below its record 3.40 GPA from the previous season. Louisville has received an NCAA Public Recognition Award in 2013 and 2014 for ranking among the top 10 percent in men's basketball in the Academic Progress Rate, which measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation for student-athletes. The Cardinals had a perfect 1000 APR in the most recent four-year period, all while winning a combined 121 games — the second-most in the nation in that stretch — and the Cardinals won the 2013 NCAA Championship and reached the 2012 Final Four.

A total of 15 of 16 Cardinals earned a 3.0 or better for the 2014 fall semester, including seven with a 3.4 or above. The men's basketball team has been around a collective 3.0 GPA for 14 consecutive semesters. Louisville placed a league-high seven individuals on the 21-member 2015 ACC All-Academic Team. Prior to entering the ACC, UofL's men's basketball team earned its league's last four Team Academic Excellence Awards, which recognized the highest collective grade-point averages in each of the 23 conference sports (2014 American Athletic Conferenc, 2011-13 Big East).

■ **Challenging Schedule** — Three participants from the 2015 NCAA Final Four are among a challenging schedule that UofL will face this season. Louisville has played a schedule ranked among the top 16 toughest by the ratings percent index (RPI) in seven of the last eight seasons. Sixteen of the Cards' 31 games will be played against teams that participated in post-season competition last season, including 10 from the 2015 NCAA Tournament. Nineteen of the Cardinals' games will be played against teams that won at least 17 games last season.

Eleven of Louisville's 31 games this season will be against teams that were ranked among the nation's top 25 or were receiving votes in the preseason USA Today coaches poll, including six games among teams in the top six (1 North Carolina, 1 Kentucky, 4 Duke twice, 6 Virginia twice, 13 Michigan State, 18 Notre Dame; receiving votes: NC State, Florida State, Miami). Four of the top 20 teams in the preseason poll hail from the ACC, with four more among those receiving votes (including Louisville). The two teams that shared the preseason top ranking are among the Cardinals' foes.

■ **Anniversary Year for Two Championship teams** — The 2015-16 season marks notable anniversaries for two of Louisville's national championship teams. It is the 30th anniversary for UofL's 1986 NCAA Championship team (32-7 record), which was guided by future Hall of Fame Coach Denny Crum and featured four starters that currently rank among the top 11 scorers all-time at UofL: Pervis Ellison (2,143 career points), Milt Wagner (1,836), Herbert Crook (1,723) and Billy Thompson (1,685); starting guard Jeff Hall was also a career 1,000-point scorer (1,294). Louisville defeated Duke 72-69 in the 1986 title game and Ellison became the second freshman in NCAA history to be named the Most Outstanding Player after producing 25 points and 11 rebounds against the Blue Devils. This season also marks the 60th anniversary of the Cardinals' 1956 National Invitation Tournament title. The 1956 NIT Champions, which UofL Coach Peck Hickman had directed to a No. 6 national ranking entering the tournament, beat third-ranked Dayton 93-80 in the title game to cap a 26-3 season. Former U of L All-America Charlie Tyra was honored as the Most Valuable Player of the 1956 NIT, scoring 29 points against St. Joseph's in the national semifinal.

■ **Non-Conference Success** -- Louisville has a 190-43 record (.815) against non-conference opponents in Coach Rick Pitino's 15 seasons (includes post-season). The Cardinals are 131-10 at home in regular season non-conference games under Pitino, including a 56-3 mark over the last six seasons in the KFC Yum! Center.

■ **Pitino Fourth in Wins Through 31 Seasons** -- UofL Coach Rick Pitino is fourth in most career coaching victories through 31 seasons, passing Jerry Tarkanian on Dec. 16. Pitino needs seven victories to add to his 733 current total to tie him for third on the list with Dean Smith (North Carolina).

**HEAD COACH RICK PITINO**

In his 31st season as a collegiate head coach and 15th at Louisville, UofL Coach **Rick Pitino** has compiled a 733-255 overall record (379-127 at UofL). A member of the Naismith Memorial



Basketball Hall of Fame, he is the first coach to take three different schools to the NCAA Final Four -- including his 2005, 2012 and 2013 Cardinal teams -- and the first to win an NCAA Championship at two different schools after guiding Louisville to the 2013 NCAA title. Among active coaches, Pitino (Massachusetts '74) has the second-highest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games (.746 winning percentage, 53-18 record in 20 NCAA tournament appearances) and his overall .741 winning percentage ranks him 14th among active coaches. He guided Kentucky to three NCAA Final Four appearances in eight seasons (1989-97), winning the 1996 NCAA Championship and reaching the national title game in 1997. He has also served as head coach at Providence College (1985-87, 1987 Final Four), Boston University (1978-83), Hawaii (last six games in 1975-76) as well as the NBA New York Knicks (1987-89) and Boston Celtics (1997-2001).

■ **Two Cards in International Competition** -- Two UofL players competed in international events during the summer. Sophomore forward/center Chinanu Onuaku won a gold medal as a member of the 2015 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Championship Team, while junior center Mangok Mathiang competed with Australia in the 2015 World University Games.

In seven games during the event played June 27-July 5 in Heraklion, Crete, Greece, **Onuaku** started six games and averaged 4.6 points, 5.0 rebounds, hit 13-of-20 field goals (.650) and added 10 steals and a team-high 12 blocked shots while averaging 16 minutes a game for the deep USA squad, coached by Arizona's Sean Miller. Onuaku's 1.7 blocked shots were the sixth-most in the 16-team event. His team was named the co-2015 USA Basketball Team of the Year.

Onuaku totaled six points, eight rebounds and a team-high four blocked shots in 28 minutes in the USA's 79-71 overtime victory over Croatia, claiming its second straight U19 World Championship, the first USA back-to-back titles in the event since 1983. Former UofL forward Montrezl Harrell was a member of the 2013 gold medal winning team.

**Mathiang** led the 23-team World University Games in rebounding and finished tied for eighth in scoring, producing five double-doubles. He started all eight games for Australia, averaging 13.5 points and 10.3 rebounds while shooting 56.1 percent from the field (46-of-82, fourth-best in the event) and adding seven blocked shots. His top scoring effort was 23 points against Chinese Taipei and his best rebounding game was 17 against the home nation Korea. The USA won the gold medal.

Australia (5-3) finished 10th in the event played in Gwangju, South Korea July 4-13. Mathiang was born in Sudan, Africa, but lived in Melbourne, Australia before moving to the United States in 2010 to attend prep school.

Former Cardinal Luke Hancock had been the last UofL player to participate in the World University Games, finishing ninth with the USA squad in the 2013 games played in Kazan, Russia.

In addition to the players, UofL's Rick Pitino coached the Puerto Rico National Team in the summer of 2015 in three international competitions. He guided an injury depleted Puerto Rico team to a fifth-place finish in the 2015 FIBA Americas tournament, keeping hopes alive for Olympic qualification.

The participation by both players, as well as Pitino's coaching stint with the Puerto Rico national team, were also part of the ACC Worldwide initiative that seeks to further the conference's member institutions internationally through promotion, marketing and athletic competition.

■ **Cardinals Visited Puerto Rico** -- The Cardinals gained valuable experience with its 10 days of practice and series of seven games over five days against the Puerto Rico National Team and Junior Team during their Aug. 10-17 visit to Puerto Rico. The competition coincided with UofL Coach Rick Pitino's decision to serve as the head coach of the Puerto Rico basketball team in two international events this summer. The opportunity to face off against the Puerto Rican teams was among the top reasons that Pitino took the position. UofL attained a waiver to allow the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, a United States territory, to serve as the destination for the team's foreign trip as Pitino was serving as head coach of the Puerto Rico National Team.

Louisville recently visited Puerto Rico for the 2014 Armed Forces Classic, facing Minnesota in Aguadilla, Puerto Rico for the opening game last season in a hangar at the Coast Guard's US Air Station Borinquen.

■ **Two NBA Draft Picks** -- A pair of UofL underclassmen were selected in the 2015 NBA Draft as guard Terry Rozier was selected in the first round by the Boston Celtics as the 16th overall pick, while forward Montrezl Harrell was taken in the second round by the Houston Rockets as the 32nd selection. Rozier left UofL following his sophomore year while Harrell played three seasons with the Cardinals.

A total of 68 former Louisville players have been selected in the NBA Draft, including five in the last three years. Currently with the Memphis Grizzlies, Russ Smith was selected by the Philadelphia 76ers in the second round of the 2014 NBA Draft with the 47th overall pick, and was subsequently traded to the New Orleans Pelicans. Gorgui Dieng was a first-round selection and the 21st overall pick by the Utah Jazz in 2013, with his rights subsequently traded to the Minnesota Timberwolves, where he has played the last two seasons. Peyton Siva was a second round choice of the Detroit Pistons in 2013 with the 56th pick overall.

Louisville has produced 22 first-round NBA Draft choices, including 11 in the top ten and five among the top three picks (Pervis Ellison first in 1989; Wes Unseld second in 1968; Darrell Griffith second in 1980; Charlie Tyra second in 1957; Rodney McCray third in 1983).



## 10 Things About Louisville Basketball

■ **1.** Louisville's 134 victories over the last five years are the second-most wins in the nation in that stretch (Kentucky leads with 135 through Dec. 23).

■ **2.** Louisville and Wichita State are the only schools in the nation to win at least 30 games in three of the last four seasons seasons, including a school-record 35 victories by UofL's 2012-13 NCAA Championship team (30 in 2011-12, 31 in 2013-14).

■ **3.** Louisville reached the NCAA Sweet 16 for a school-record fourth straight time in 2015 (tied for the most in the nation) and the 21st occasion in school history. Michigan State is the only other school that has reached each of the last four Sweet 16s. The Cardinals have been to the Elite Eight in five of the last eight years.

■ **4.** Louisville Coach Rick Pitino reached his 700th collegiate coaching win in 2014. He is one of five active collegiate coaches in the Basketball Hall of Fame, four of which are in the ACC.

■ **5.** The Cards' 2014-15 senior class was the winningest in UofL history, winning a combined 123 games over the last four years.

■ **6.** Louisville, Syracuse and VCU are the only three teams to rank among the top 25 nationally in steals over the last five years. In 2014-15, UofL ranked among the national defensive leaders in blocked shots (5.4, 13th in the NCAA), steals (7.9, 23rd), three-point field goal percentage defense (30.3, 19th), scoring defense (59.8, 23rd), and field goal percentage defense (.392, 23rd).

■ **7.** Louisville is one of just four schools which have won 20 or more games in each of the last 13 seasons. Louisville has won at least 19 games in 41 of the last 45 years.

■ **8.** While also winning on the court, Louisville has earned its last four consecutive conference top team academic excellence awards. The Cardinals have a perfect Academic Progress Rate score for the most recent four-year period (2009-13). The team posted a record 3.40 grade point average collectively for the 2013-14 academic year and had a collective 326 mark in 2014-15.

■ **9.** Louisville has won 10 of its last 11 conference tournament games, claiming three of its last four conference tournament championships. Six of the last 13 NCAA Championships have been won by current ACC schools, including the Cardinals' 2013 title.

■ **10.** Louisville has a 60-33 record in road games over the last 10 years (.645) and has a 32-6 record in neutral site games over the past five seasons (.842).



■ **Cards Have Been Tough on the Road** — UofL has a 60-33 record over the last 10 years on its opponent's home court (.652). Louisville had the most road victories of any school in Big East Conference games over its last seven years in that league and was a league-best 8-1 in its road games in The American during the 2013-14 season. UofL posted a 6-3 road record in its first year in the ACC, fourth-best in the league. The Cardinals have a 52-28 record in conference games on the road over the last nine seasons (.650). In neutral site games, Louisville has a 32-6 record over the last five years (.842) and a 42-13 neutral site record over the last eight years (.763).

In conference games overall, Louisville had the most Big East Conference victories over its eight years in that league during the regular season (from 2005 to 2013). Louisville had a 95-45 Big East record in league victories during the regular season, just ahead of Syracuse and Pittsburgh (both at 92-48). Louisville finished fourth in its first year in the ACC with a 12-6 league record.

■ **Cards Will Host 2016 NCAA Regional** — The University of Louisville will serve as the host institution for the South Regional of the 2016 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship to be played March 24 and 26, 2016 at the KFC Yum! Center. It is the first time in which Louisville has served as the site for an NCAA Regional since 1987, when a Rick Pitino coached Providence squad beat Georgetown in the Southeast Regional Championship in Louisville's Freedom Hall to move on to the Final Four. UofL and the KFC Yum! Center also served as host for the Second and Third Rounds of the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship on March 19 and 21, 2015 at the KFC Yum! Center.

■ **Mitchell's Effort Among Top Freshmen Starts** — Freshman guard Donovan Mitchell got off to a great start against Samford in the Cardinals' opener. He is one of just 10 players in Louisville history to score as many as 14 points in a freshman career debut, tying for eighth on that list with 14 off the bench, hitting all four of his field goals, his lone three-pointer and 5-of-6 free throws. He added three steals, three rebounds, and an assist without a turnover -- all in just 17 minutes. His individual scoring high at Brewster Academy last season was 29 points against St. Thomas More.

■ **Louisville Top College Basketball Market** -- Louisville is consistently the highest-rated television market for college basketball on ESPN. Louisville has been the top market each of the last 13 years, averaging a 5.9 rating for the 2014-15 season. Louisville was nearly three points higher than second-place Greensboro, which averaged a 3.0 rating. The remaining top 10 was Raleigh-Durham (2.7), Kansas City (2.4), Columbus (2.1), Cincinnati (1.9), Dayton (1.9) Indianapolis (1.8), Charlotte (1.8) and Memphis (1.8). The Cardinals' NCAA Sweet 16 game against Kentucky in 2014 drew a 51.5 rating and 73 share, making it the second highest-rated event in Louisville television history. Louisville's 2013 NCAA Championship game against Michigan is the top-rated television event all-time in the Louisville market.

■ **Sixth Season in KFC Yum! Center** -- This is Louisville's sixth season in the spectacular KFC Yum! Center, located on the banks of the Ohio River in downtown Louisville. The Cardinals had previously played basketball for 54 years in Freedom Hall (1956-2010). The 22,000-seat multi-purpose arena was built at a cost of \$238 million and includes 71 luxury suites, 62 four- or six-seat premium boxes, over 2,000 side-court club seats and four party suites with a seating capacity of 32 each.

UofL's men's and women's teams have permanent locker rooms. There are five additional team locker rooms, two officials locker rooms, five star dressing rooms, a full-function media work room and a full-sized basketball practice court on the event level. The seven levels of the arena (including the upper catwalk) include a collective 721,762 square feet, or roughly the area of 13 football fields.

After passing through the one and a half acre landscaped entry plaza that features a basketball-themed fountain, entering fans can visit the 2,500-square foot U of L adidas store, the 3,000-square foot U of L Hall of Honor, or head to their seats using one of the eight escalators or seven elevators within the building.

Lounge space is abundant within the arena. Four spacious donor rooms are available for Cardinal fans, including three that overlook the Ohio River. The 7,000-square foot main concourse restaurant overlooks the river and a main concourse sports bar has views directly into the arena bowl. Two 4,000-square foot club lounges on the event level, as well as the terrace club and premium box lounges, provide amenities for their respective patrons. The KFC Yum! Center served as the site for the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament second and third rounds in 2012 and 2015, will be the site for the South Regional in March 2016 and was the site for the 2012 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship on December 13 and 15.

... 10 of its last 11 conference tournament games. Louisville is 15-3 with three championships over its last seven conference tournaments, reaching the title game five times. Louisville has won three of its last four conference titles.

■ **Cards Chosen Seventh in ACC Preseason Poll** — Louisville was chosen seventh in the Atlantic Coast Conference men’s basketball race in 2015-16 in a preseason poll of media, behind No.1 North Carolina. North Carolina guard Marcus Paige and Virginia guard Malcolm Brodgon were the preseason Co-Players of the Year while Duke forward Brandon Ingram was named the preseason Freshman of the Year. Louisville finished fourth in its inaugural season in the ACC last year. The league championship will be staged March 8-12 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C.

■ **Statistical Trends** — UofL is 167-9 over the last 15 seasons under Coach Rick Pitino when scoring 80 or more points (8-0 this season, 11-0 in 2014-15) ... Over the past 15 years under Pitino, Louisville is 125-6 when shooting 50 percent or better from the field (9-0 this season, 8-0 in 2014-15) ... UofL is 304-46 when holding its opponent below 70 points over the past 15 years under Pitino (11-0 this season, 24-4 in 2014-15, 27-1 in 2013-14, 32-1 in 2012-13).

■ **Wake Forest Awaits Next** — Louisville opens the new year with its first Atlantic Coast Conference game of the season as the Cardinals face Wake Forest in the KFC Yum! Center on Jan. 3. Wake Forest (8-3) has won six of its last seven games, falling to No. 6 Xavier 78-70 on Dec. 22 in its last outing after leading by 18 in the first half. The Demon Deacons will play at LSU on Dec. 29 prior to facing the Cardinals in both teams’ ACC opener.

Senior forward Devin Thomas, who totaled 31 points and 11 rebounds against Louisville last year, is second in the ACC and 16th nationally in rebounding with 10.5 boards per game. Thomas is ninth in the ACC in scoring (16.6), fourth in blocked shots (2.0) and has 27 career double-doubles. Louisville has won three of its four previous meetings against Wake Forest, including an 85-76 victory on Jan. 7, 2015 in Winston-Salem, N.C. in the Cards’ first-ever ACC game. UofL has won its conference opening game in six of the last seven seasons. In their first game of the new year, the Cardinals have won six of their last seven games in the last seven years.

**Cardinals in the NCAA Tournament**

■ Louisville made its 41st NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. The Cardinals have reached the NCAA Tournament 32 of the last 39 years (nine straight, 12 of the last 13, 14 of the last 17 years, and 20 of last 24). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 21 occasions (four straight) and have advanced to the Elite Eight five of the last eight seasons. Louisville is sixth in tournament victories (75) and is fifth in tournament appearances (41). UofL has a 75-42 overall NCAA Tournament record, reaching the Final Four 10 times.

■ Only four teams -- Kentucky (55), North Carolina (46), UCLA (45), and Kansas (44) -- have more NCAA Tournament appearances than Louisville’s 41.

■ U of L Coach Rick Pitino has a 53-18 record in NCAA Tournament play (.746), ranking him second among active coaches in winning percentage and 10th all time. Only three coaches have coached more Final Four teams than Pitino’s seven, a feat matched by one other. Pitino is the first coach to win an NCAA Championship at two different schools; the first to lead three different teams to the Final Four; is one of 11 coaches to lead four different schools to the NCAA Tournament; and one of 11 active collegiate coaches who have won an NCAA Championship.

■ Only three teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville’s 21 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 26, Kentucky 26, Duke 24).

■ U of L Coach Rick Pitino has guided 20 teams to NCAA tournament appearances, including 12 of his last 13 years at Louisville (nine straight). His last six straight Kentucky teams reached the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats won the 1996 NCAA title and were national runner-up in 1997 under his guidance.
