All-Time Series: Kentucky leads, 7-4
Kentucky in 2014-15: 38-1, 18-0 SEC
UCLA in 2014-15: 22-14, 11-7 Pac-12

THURSDAY'S MATCHUP

UCLA hosts Kentucky on Thursday, Dec. 3, in a nationally-televised (ESPN) game at 6 p.m. (PT). The Bruins and Wildcats enter the first year of a two-year home-and-home series, with UCLA scheduled to play its first-ever game at Kentucky's Rupp Arena on Dec. 3, 2016. Kentucky has compiled a 7-4 all-time record against UCLA and will be playing in Pauley Pavilion for the first time in school history. Previously, the Wildcats faced UCLA in Los Angeles (1951, 1961), prior to the construction of Pauley Pavilion. UCLA last defeated Kentucky in the 2006 Maui Invitational.

LAST WEEK

The Bruins went 2-2 last week, going 1-2 with a fourth-place finish at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational in Lahaina, Hawaii. On the island of Maui, UCLA defeated UNLV before losing to No. 5-ranked Kansas and Wake Forest. UCLA returned home on Friday evening and defeated CSUN, 77-45, on Sunday evening. UCLA held the visiting Matadors to 29.3 percent shooting, as no CSUN player scored in double figures. Isaac Hamilton and Tony Parker each scored a team-leading 14 points against the Matadors, while Bryce Alford logged a season-high 10 assists.

LEADING SCORER

Junior guard Bryce Alford has registered a team-leading 15.3 points per game, having scored in double figures in five of UCLA's seven games. He leads the Bruins with 5.6 assists per game, compiling a 2.3 assist-turnover ratio. Among UCLA's top shooters, Alford has shot 83.3 percent from the free throw line, knocking down 30 of 36 foul shots. He enters this week's game against Kentucky having logged an 82.5 career free throw percentage (231/280).

NEARING 1,000: Bryce Alford has scored 956 career points in just over two seasons at UCLA. He stands 44 points away from becoming the 52nd player at UCLA to have scored 1,000 or more career points. As a sophomore in 2014-15, Alford scored 554 points, averaging 15.4 points per game (second most on the team).

DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Tony Parker, a 6-foot-9 senior forward/center from Atlanta, has recorded five double-doubles in seven games. Parker has averaged 14.1 points and a Pac-12 leading 12.1 rebounds per game, scoring in double figures in all but one contest. He opened the season with three double-doubles in the team's first three games, becoming UCLA's first player to accomplish that feat since Bill Walton opened the Bruins' 1973-74 campaign with nine straight double-doubles.

STANDING TALL

Sophomore center Thomas Welsh, at 7-feet and 245 pounds, has averaged 12.0 points and 6.1 rebounds per game through seven contests. Welsh, who scored in double figures just twice last season, has tallied at least 20 points in two games this year – 22 against Cal Poly (Nov. 15) and 20 versus UNLV (Nov. 23). The former standout at Loyola High School (Los Angeles) finished with 20 points and eight rebounds against UNLV in the Maui Invitational last week.

HOW ABOUT HAMILTON?

Junior guard Isaac Hamilton rounds out UCLA's list of five players who have averaged in double-figure scoring nearly one quarter through the Bruins' season. Hamilton (11.9 ppg, 4.4 rpg, 3.1 apg) has shot 43.2 percent from the field, making 10 of 31 three-point attempts (32.3 percent). He currently ranks second on the team with 34.1 minutes per game and has started all seven contests. The former standout at St. John Bosco High School (Bellflower, Calif.) has scored at least 10 points in five of seven games, tallying a season-high 19 points against Kansas (Nov. 24).

TOP-RANKED OPPOSITION

This Thursday evening's game will mark the second time in the last three seasons in which the Bruins have hosted the nation's No. 1-ranked team at home. In Jan. 2014, UCLA lost to No. 1-ranked Arizona, 79-75, in a Pac-12 contest in Pauley Pavilion. UCLA last defeated the nation's No. 1-ranked team at home on Jan. 12, 2002, taking down Kansas by an 87-77 margin in Pauley Pavilion. UCLA last faced the No. 1-ranked team when the Bruins played Kentucky on Dec. 20, 2014, at the United Center in Chicago as part of the CBS Sports Classic (UCLA lost, 83-44).

ABOUT AARON

A 6-foot-1 freshman guard from Chatsworth, Calif., Aaron Holiday ranks third on the team in scoring (13.0 ppg), first in 3-point percentage (45.5) and second in free throw percentage (80.8). A starter for UCLA through the first seven games, Holiday has averaged 13.0 points, 3.4 rebounds and 3.1 assists per game. He scored a season-high 18 points against UNLV (Nov. 23) in the Maui Invitational and most recently had 13 points (perfect 3-for-3 from 3-point range) against CSUN last Sunday evening (Nov. 29). He has scored in double figures in five of UCLA's seven games.

BROTHERLY LOVE: Aaron Holiday is the younger brother of former UCLA guard Jrue Holiday. Jrue, in his sixth NBA season, was a freshman for the Bruins in 2008-09. He was selected No. 17 by the Philadelphia 76ers in the first round of the 2009 NBA Draft after his freshman season and now plays for the New Orleans Pelicans. Jrue Holiday is married to former UCLA soccer player and USA women's national team player Lauren (Cheney) Holiday.

Media Availability

Steve Alford's weekly media availability typically takes place on the court in Pauley Pavilion at approximately 3:00 p.m. on Tuesdays prior to practice. Players follow prior to the team's 3:30 or 4:00 p.m. practice. Members of the media are welcome to observe and record the first 15 minutes of practice those days. Press conferences are not open to the public.

Credentials

Admission to press seating and the media room is by credential only. All credential requests should be made through UCLA's credential website at least two days prior to the game. Website address and instructions can be obtained by emailing Alex Timiraos (atimiraos@athletics.ucla.edu). Members of the media covering UCLA should request credentials for road games through Timiraos (via email, or phone at 310-206-0524).

Credential Pickup

Credentials are available during the week at the Athletic Communications Office. Credentials not claimed prior to game day will be available at Pauley Pavilion's "Will Call" window (Northwest corner of the arena). The media will call window and entrance opens two hours prior to tip-off.

Media Seating

A press pass enables entrance at Pauley Pavilion's Northwest media gate (across from the intramural field). Press seating is located in the upper level of the arena's south side (opposite team benches). Pauley Pavilion's media workstation is located in the Southeast corner of the building on the event level, adjacent to the Southeast elevator.

Postgame Procedure

Head coach Steve Alford and selected players will be available to the media in Pauley Pavilion's media room following a 10-minute cooling off period after each game. UCLA's locker room is closed to the media. To access the media room during or after the game, follow the stairwell down to the court and proceed to the southeast corner (elevator access available at the arena's southeast corner). The visiting team's head coach will be available following a 10-minute cooling off period outside the visiting locker room (northwest corner, event level).

PRESEASON PROJECTIONS

UCLA was selected fifth in the Pac-12 preseason media poll, announced at Pac-12 Media Day on Oct. 15 in San Francisco. Arizona was picked to finish first, collecting 18 of 36 first-place votes. UCLA secured one first-place vote. Last season, UCLA finished fourth in the standings after having been picked fourth in the preseason poll. The Bruins have won the Pac-12 regular-season title in four of the last 10 seasons.

PREDICTIONS: Members of the media have correctly picked the regular-season winner of the conference 14 times in 23 tries. Arizona has correctly been selected in nine of the previous 14 times it has been predicted to win the league crown. UCLA last won the Pac-12 regular-season title in 2012-13.

2014-15 IN REVIEW

- UCLA went 22-14 overall (11-7 in Pac-12 action), advancing to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament.
- The Bruins defeated SMU (60-59) and UAB (92-75) in the NCAA Tournament before losing to Gonzaga (74-62).
- Norman Powell earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors, while Kevon Looney was a second-team selection.
- Bryce Alford established UCLA's single-season record for most three-pointers (93).
- The Bruins went 16-1 at home, posting a perfect 9-0 mark at home in league play for the first time since 2006-07.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS

Kentucky enters this Thursday's game as the nation's No. 1-ranked team in both the AP and USA Today Coaches polls. Under seventh-year head coach John Calipari, Kentucky has been primarily using three freshmen in its starting lineup this season (Skal Labissiere, Isaiah Briscoe and Jamal Murray). The Wildcats enter Thursday's matchup with a 7-0 record, including a 74-63 win over then No. 5-ranked Duke at the United Center in Chicago (Nov. 17). Murray has averaged a team-leading 15.0 points per game, while Alex Poythress has registered 7.0 rebounds per game.

MAUI INVITATIONAL

Last week, UCLA went 1-2 in three games at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational, securing a win over UNLV in a first-round game before losing to then No. 5-ranked Kansas and Wake Forest on consecutive days. Bryce Alford and Thomas Welsh each scored a team-leading 20 points in the 77-75 win over UNLV, a game in which UCLA had to rally from a 62-58 deficit in the final eight minutes. Kansas defeated UCLA, 92-73, in a semifinal game on Tuesday, while Wake Forest edged the Bruins, 80-77, in the tournament's third-place game on Wednesday.

TOP PERFORMERS: Isaac Hamilton averaged a team-leading 14.7 points per game in three contests in Maui, scoring in double figures in UCLA's games against Kansas and Wake Forest. Aaron Holiday registered 14.3 points per game, connecting on 4 of 8 shots from 3-point range and 13 of 14 free throw attempts.

ON DECK

After this Thursday's game against Kentucky, the Bruins will return to Pauley Pavilion on Sunday, Dec. 6, to host Long Beach State at 6 p.m. This Sunday's game will mark the third meeting between UCLA and Long Beach State in the last four years. UCLA has compiled a 13-1 all-time record against the 49ers, with Long Beach State's lone victory taking place during the 2009-10 season at the 76 Classic in Anaheim. Last season, the Bruins secured a 77-63 victory over Long Beach State in Pauley Pavilion (Nov. 23, 2014) to improve their early-season record to 4-0.

PARKER'S PROGRESSION

Senior forward/center Tony Parker made steady increases in production each of his first three seasons. Last year, he registered 11.5 points and 6.7 rebounds in 24.6 minutes per game (34 games, 33 starts). As a sophomore in 2013-14, he logged 6.9 points and 4.4 rebounds in 17.2 minutes per game (37 games, nine starts). Parker averaged 2.4 points and 1.2 rebounds in 6.3 minutes per game as a freshman in 2012-13 (33 games). He enters UCLA's game against Kentucky having scored 825 career points at UCLA, 175 shy of the 1,000 career point mark.

WATCHLIST: Prior to this season, Parker was named to the 2015-16 Karl Malone Award watch list, as announced by the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame. The Malone Award is annually distributed to the nation's premier power forward. Parker is one of 20 players in the nation who was named to the initial watch list for this award.

KEY CONTRIBUTIONS

Junior guard Isaac Hamilton was one of four UCLA players to start in all 36 games last season (averaged 10.6 points, 3.4 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game). He scored a season-high 36 points in UCLA's 96-70 win over USC at the Pac-12 Tournament, marking the program's highest single-game point total since Feb. 10, 2005 (Dijon Thompson had 39 points versus Arizona State). Last season, he played at least 30 minutes in 30 of 36 games.

IN THE FAMILY: Isaac Hamilton is the fifth of six children and has four brothers, two of which have played in the NBA and a third (Daniel) who is a sophomore at Connecticut. His older brother Gary played four years at Miami (2003-06) and Jordan was a two-year player at Texas (2010-11) before being selected No. 26 in the 2011 NBA Draft by the Dallas Mavericks. Last season, Jordan played in 14 games for the Los Angeles Clippers.

MOVING TO THE NBA

Two UCLA players – Norman Powell and Kevon Looney – were selected in the 2015 NBA Draft. Powell (16.4 ppg, 4.7 rpg) graduated last June and was a second-round selection by the Milwaukee Bucks (immediately traded to the Toronto Raptors). Powell served as the team's "honorary captain" last Thursday night in Pauley Pavilion. Looney (11.6 ppg, 9.2 rpg) was drafted No. 30 as the final first-round pick by the Golden State Warriors following a strong freshman year at UCLA.

SCORE AND DISTRIBUTE

Bryce Alford entered the season as one of six returning players in the nation to have averaged at least 15.0 points and 4.5 assists per game in 2014-15 while totaling 170 or more assists. Also on that list are Jalan West (Northwestern State), Kahlil Felder (Oakland), Kris Dunn (Providence), Juan'Ya Green (Hofstra) and Chris Fowler (Central Michigan). Alford played in more games (36) and totaled more minutes (1307) than any of those players.

NEWS & NOTES

HOME COOKIN'

The Bruins have posted a 35-4 overall record at home in two-plus seasons under head coach Steve Alford. Last season, UCLA went 16-1 at home. The team's only home loss came against Gonzaga (87-74) on Dec. 13, 2014. In 17 home games, UCLA averaged 80.7 points per game. Since UCLA re-opened renovated Pauley Pavilion (Nov. 2012), the Bruins gone 49-7 at home. Two of those seven losses came against teams ranked in the AP top 25 poll. UCLA's regular-season schedule in 2015-16 features 17 home games.

TO THE EAST COAST

Not shying away from cross-country travel, UCLA has played at least one game in the Eastern time zone each of the last seven seasons. This year's trek to Brooklyn in December will extend that streak to eight years. Last season, the Bruins played three games in as many days at the Battle 4 Atlantis (Paradise Island, Bahamas). UCLA played at least one game in New York City each of the previous four years, including a neutral site game versus Duke at Madison Square Garden in Dec. 2013. In Nov. 2012, the Bruins face Georgetown and Georgia at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn.

RANKED OPPOSITION

Since the start of the 2006-07 season, UCLA has gone 29-28 against teams ranked in the AP top 25 poll. In 2014-15, the Bruins compiled a 2-7 record against teams ranked in the AP top 25 poll. In 2013-14, UCLA went 2-3 against ranked foes. Prior to that, the Bruins went 4-2 in 2012-13, 0-2 in 2011-12, 2-3 in 2010-11, 0-2 in 2009-10, 1-4 in 2008-09, 7-2 in 2007-08 and 11-2 in 2006-07.

ATOP THE POLL

The Bruins were last ranked No. 1 in the AP poll during the week of Jan. 1, 2007. UCLA returned to the No. 1 spot in the AP poll for the first time in 12 years on Nov. 27, 2006. Including that week's ranking, UCLA maintained the No. 1 ranking in the AP and USA Today Coaches Polls for six consecutive weeks (until losing at Oregon on Jan. 6, 2007). UCLA has not been ranked No. 1 in the nation since that season. Prior to that, UCLA was ranked No. 1 in the final AP poll of the 1995 season (year in which the Bruins won their 11th NCAA title). UCLA has gone 242-15 (.942) in 257 games when playing as the country's No. 1 team. The Bruins have gone 128-3 in 131 home games (ranked No. 1). In all, UCLA has spent 134 weeks ranked No. 1 in the country (12 ahead of second-place Duke, 122).

RENOVATED ARENA

The 2015-16 campaign marks UCLA's fourth season playing in a renovated Pauley Pavilion. UCLA's iconic home was closed during the 2011-12 season to undergo a \$136-million renovation. Pauley Pavilion re-opened for the team's season opener on Nov. 9, 2012, against Indiana State, the first college program for which John Wooden coached before he accepted the job at UCLA. The reconfigured layout of Pauley Pavilion can seat as many as 13,800 (capacity was 12,800 before the renovation). The arena began its expansion and renovation in March 2010. At that time, the building remained in a functional capacity during the 2010-11 season. In its current configuration, Pauley Pavilion provides many additional amenities, including more concession points and restrooms, a custom designed 16-foot by 12-foot LED high-definition Daktronics video board and an interior LED ribbon board. Pauley Pavilion originally opened in time for UCLA's 1965-66 season. The Bruins' freshman team defeated the varsity team on Nov. 27, 1965, before the season was officially underway Dec. 3, 1965, when No. 1-ranked UCLA defeated Ohio State, 92-66.

VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

The Bruins have eight games scheduled against teams which are ranked or have been ranked in the AP's top 25 poll. Including UCLA's game last week against Kansas, the Bruins have four opponents (Kansas, Kentucky, Gonzaga and North Carolina) on the schedule currently ranked in the AP poll's top 15. Last season, the Bruins played six games during the regular season (and three in postseason action) versus teams ranked in the AP top 25 poll.

UCLA has faced the nation's No. 1-ranked team three times over the last two seasons. Most recently, the Bruins faced No. 1 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 2014. The previous year, UCLA fell to No. 1-ranked Arizona in a Pac-12 game in Pauley Pavilion (Jan. 9, 2014) before losing to No. 1-ranked Florida in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16. UCLA has gone 10-22 all-time against the Associated Press' No. 1-ranked team.

HEADING TO WESTWOOD

UCLA signed four high school seniors – Ike Anigbogu, Lonzo Ball, T.J. Leaf and Kobe Paras – to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period. These four players will enroll at UCLA in 2016 and be freshmen in 2016-17.

IKE ANIGBOGU: A 6-foot-10, 240-pound center, Anigbogu has played at Centennial High school in Corona, Calif., under head coach Josh Giles. Anigbogu has been ranked as high as No. 35, nationally, in his high school class by Scout.com.

LONZO BALL: Ball, a 6-foot-5 guard at Chino Hills High School, has been ranked as the No. 1 point guard in the West by both ESPN.com and Scout.com. In addition, Ball has been rated as the No. 8 player in the nation by Rivals.com.

T.J. LEAF: Leaf, a 6-foot-9, 220-pound forward from El Cajon, Calif., has been rated the No. 13 player in his high school class, nationally, by ESPN.com. Last season, he was named the CIF San Diego Section Division II Player of the Year.

KOBE PARAS: Paras is a 6-foot-6 guard who has spent the last two years in Los Angeles and grew up in the Philippines. As a junior last season at Cathedral High School, Paras averaged 15 points per game.

• Since 1948, UCLA has produced the second-most NBA draft selections (114). Kentucky tops that list with 118 draft picks. Trailing Kentucky and UCLA on the all-time list are North Carolina (105) and Duke (85).

• With 15 former players on NBA rosters, UCLA leads all Pac-12 programs in that category and ranks fifth, nationally. Last season, 17 Bruins competed in the NBA, including five players from UCLA's 2013-14 squad.

• Former UCLA guards stole the show at last season's NBA All-Star Weekend in New York. Zach LaVine won the Sprite Slam Dunk Contest (Feb. 14), one night before Russell Westbrook was named the All-Star Game MVP (Feb. 15).

• Seven UCLA players under head coach Steve Alford have advanced to the NBA. Four of those Bruins were first-round NBA draft picks (Zach LaVine, Jordan Adams, Kyle Anderson and Kevon Looney). In addition, Norman Powell was a second-round pick in 2015, while Travis Wear and David Wear joined NBA teams as undrafted free agents.

UCLA AND THE NBA

Matt Barnes entered the 2015-16 NBA season as the most veteran former UCLA player in the league. Barnes, a second-round pick (No. 46 overall) by the Memphis Grizzlies in 2002, didn't make his NBA debut until Jan. 19, 2004, for the Los Angeles Clippers. Barnes entered this season having played in 779 career NBA contests. Also in his 12th season in the NBA, Trevor Ariza began the 2015-16 campaign having played in 714 career NBA games. Ariza is the only current Bruin in the league to have won an NBA championship (2009, Los Angeles Lakers).

NBA ALL-STAR SELECTIONS

UCLA has sent 17 players to the NBA who have competed in the annual NBA All-Star Game. Playing in the league from 1969-89, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar earned an all-time record 19 All-Star Game selections. Gail Goodrich, Marques Johnson and Reggie Miller each secured five trips to the NBA All-Star Game. Current UCLA products in the NBA who have earned All-Star selections include Russell Westbrook (2011, 2012, 2013, 2015), Kevin Love (2011, 2012, 2014) and Jrue Holiday (2013). This season's NBA All-Star Game will take place in Toronto on Feb. 13, 2016.

STRONG SCHEDULES

Since arriving at UCLA in March 2013, head coach Steve Alford has helped the Bruins add top-ranked opponents such as Duke, Gonzaga, Oklahoma, North Carolina, Kansas, Ohio State and Kentucky to the non-conference schedule. In 2013-14, UCLA faced Duke in a neutral site game at Madison Square Garden before scheduling a pair of home-and-home series with Gonzaga (Dec. 2014 and Dec. 2015) and Kentucky (Dec. 2015 and Dec. 2016).

CBS SPORTS CLASSIC: UCLA will play North Carolina in the CBS Sports Classic on Dec. 19 at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. UCLA faced Kentucky last season, and North Carolina played Ohio State in a doubleheader at the United Center in Chicago (Dec. 20, 2014) as part of the first-ever CBS Sports Classic. Next season, the one-day doubleheader moves to Las Vegas (Dec. 17, 2016), where UCLA will take on Ohio State.

MARK THE CALENDAR: The Bruins will finish their home-and-home series versus Gonzaga in Spokane, Wash., with a game at the McCarthey Athletic Center (Dec. 12). In addition, UCLA's home-and-home series versus Kentucky will feature the Wildcats' first-ever trip to Pauley Pavilion this Thursday (Dec. 3). UCLA will play Kentucky at Rupp Arena for the first time ever on Dec. 3, 2016.

WOODEN LEGACY: UCLA will be among eight teams competing in next season's DIRECTV Wooden Legacy, played at Cal State Fullerton and at the Honda Center (Anaheim). The Bruins will join a field that includes CSUN, Dayton, Nebraska, New Mexico, Portland, Texas AM and Virginia Tech. Next season's tournament will take place on Nov. 24, 25 and 27 (Thanksgiving Weekend). The first two days of games will be at Titan Gym (Cal State Fullerton).

CONFERENCE PROJECTIONS

The Bruins' 13-game non-conference schedule features at least three teams which have been picked to win their conferences in preseason league polls. Those four programs include Kentucky of the Southeastern Conference (SEC), Gonzaga of the West Coast Conference (WCC), Louisiana-Lafayette from the Sun Belt Conference and North Carolina of the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC). Below is a complete breakdown of these conference projections.

UCLA BASKETBALL ON THE AIR

For the eighth straight season, UCLA's basketball games are being produced by the UCLA Sports Network from IMG, with AM 570 Fox Sports LA in Los Angeles serving as the flagship station.

This is the 19th year of UCLA's partnership with AM 570 Fox Sports LA owner Clear Channel. Other stations on the UCLA Sports Network from IMG include KXEX (1550 AM) in Fresno and KSLK (96.1 FM) in Visalia.

Bill Roth serves as UCLA's play-by-play voice, and former Bruins' guard Darrick Martin is the radio analyst. UCLA hired Roth as the new play-by-play voice for Bruins' basketball and football games in April 2015. Roth, an 11-time Virginia SportsCaster of the Year honoree, spent the previous 27 seasons as the lead play-by-play broadcaster for Virginia Tech's football and men's basketball teams. He replaced Chris Roberts, who retired after the 2014-15 season.

A veteran of the industry for more than 25 years, Roth arrived in Westwood as a member of both the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame and Syracuse University's WAER Hall of Fame. He was involved in all facets of the athletic department at Virginia Tech. A frequent speaker at the university's fund raising and charitable functions throughout the region, he also hosted a Sunday morning television show, penned both online and magazine columns and even worked with campus police to develop unique emergency training modules for Virginia Tech faculty, staff and visitors.

Martin starred in UCLA's backcourt from 1989-92 and replaces Tracy Murray in the radio analyst role. Murray, a teammate of Martin's at UCLA from 1990-92, spent the previous seven seasons in that capacity before being named a shooting coach with the Los Angeles Lakers in Oct. 2015.

A 13-year NBA veteran, Martin entered the league with the Minnesota Timberwolves in 1994-95. As a point guard for seven NBA teams throughout his career, the former Saint Anthony (Long Beach) standout recorded 3,525 points and 1,475 assists in 514 career games. In 1996-97, he appeared in all 82 games (64 starts) with the Los Angeles Clippers, posting career highs in both points (10.9) and assists (4.1) per game.

After his playing career, Martin spent two seasons as an assistant coach and player development specialist with the Minnesota Timberwolves. In Sept. 2012, he was hired as an assistant coach on Steve Lavin's coaching staff at St. John's University in New York. While working with St. John's, he spent one year as an assistant coach and three seasons as the program's Director of Basketball Operations.

NOTES ON STEVE ALFORD

• Leads all coaches, age 51 and under, in career NCAA victories with 517 (Steve Alford turned 51 on Nov. 23, 2015) ... entered the 2015-16 season with a 513-258 record in 24 years and a 435-229 record at the NCAA Division I level the past 20 seasons ... has averaged 25.6 wins per season over the previous seven years.

• In his first season as UCLA's head coach (2013-14), he steered the Bruins to a 28-9 overall record, a trip to the NCAA Tournament's "Sweet 16" and the Pac-12 Tournament title ... last season, he guided UCLA back to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 after having advanced to the Pac-12 Tournament semifinals.

• While in Albuquerque, helped New Mexico secure four MWC regular-season championships and two tournament titles ... coached the Lobos to its two highest single-season victory totals (30 wins in 2009-10, 29 wins in 2012-13).

• Only head coach in school history at Iowa to have led the Hawkeyes to the Big Ten Tournament's title game (accomplishing that feat in 2001, 2002 and 2006) ... led Iowa to the Big Ten Tournament Championship in 2001 and 2006 ... established a school-record seven consecutive winning seasons at Iowa (2001-2007).

• Guided Missouri State (then named Southwest Missouri State) to its only appearance in the NCAA Tournament's "Sweet 16" in 1999 ... took over as head coach at Missouri State in the summer of 1995 at age 31 after having led Manchester College to the NCAA Division III championship game in March 1995.

ELITE COMPANY

In March 2014, Steve Alford became the 12th head coach in college basketball history to have led at least four NCAA Division I programs to the NCAA Tournament (Missouri State, Iowa, New Mexico and UCLA). His teams have played in the NCAA Tournament the past four seasons, with consecutive Sweet 16 appearances in 2014 and 2015. In 2014, he became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to the Pac-12 Tournament title in his first year as head coach.

CONNECT FOUR: The other 11 coaches to have led at least four NCAA Division I teams to the NCAA Tournament include John Beilein, Lefty Driesell, Cliff Ellis, Larry Eustachy, Jim Harrick, Lon Kruger, Fran McCaffery, Tom Penders, Rick Pitino, Tubby Smith and Eddie Sutton. THIS DAY IN BRUIN HISTORY

Dec. 3, 1965 - UCLA 92, Ohio State 66

UCLA defeated Ohio State, 92-66, before a crowd of 11,781 in the team's first-ever regular season game in Pauley Pavilion on Dec. 3, 1965. It took UCLA nearly one half to get going, but once the Bruins returned to the court after halftime, they broke the game open.

Leading by just three points at the break, UCLA took a commanding second-half lead to secure a 26-point victory. The Bruins outscored the visiting Buckeyes by a 57-34 margin after halftime.

"Once we got running, I was pleased with the club," head coach John Wooden told reporters. "In the first half, we seemed a little bit lethargic. When we did get going, we ran well. We got to 'em. While we were not stealing the ball on our press, that is not the only point of the press. I think we destroyed part of their game with it."

The Bruins cruised to the season-opening win thanks to a 28-point effort from Mike Lynn and a 23-point performance from Mike Warren. Lynn tallied 21 of his 28 points after halftime. For the game, Lynn and Warren combined to make 19 of 33 field goal attempts, while Edgar Lacey registered 14 points and 14 rebounds.

Ohio State had a team-leading 24 points from Bill Hosket, who made 11 of 19 shots and grabbed 13 rebounds.

"UCLA's quickness is so much greater than you realize and you can't break away from their press," Ohio State head coach Fred Taylor told the media after the game. "We tried not to run with them, but we just couldn't help it. Lynn was much quicker, much better than we expected. [Doug] McIntosh also was much better, and Warren did a good job of driving them. There is an awful lot of material on that club."

The Bruins' win against Ohio State came nearly six months after the Bruins' new, state-of-the-art building officially opened on campus. The new complex was introduced to the University at the June 1965 Commencement exercises. At that time, the building was dedicated and named for Regent Edwin W. Pauley, the principal donor to the building fund.

Pauley Pavilion first opened with permanent upholstered seats for more than 10,000 spectators, as well as collapsible bleachers for more than 2,000. With temporary chair seating, the arena was able to provide a maximum capacity of 13,000.

CHICAGO - Devin Booker scored a game-leading 19 points to lead No. 1 Kentucky past UCLA, 83-44, at the United Center in a CBS Sports Classic game.

Kentucky (12-0) led from the start, scoring the game's first 24 points before racing to a 41-7 halftime lead. The Wildcats also received 15 points from Aaron Harrison.

Isaac Hamilton scored a team-leading 14 points for UCLA (8-4), as the Bruins faced their third top-10 ranked opponent in a four-week span.

Bryce Alford finished with 13 points for the Bruins as the team's only other player to score in double figures. Kevon Looney, who entered Saturday's game with seven double-doubles in 11 games, finished with nine points and nine rebounds.

Saturday's meeting in Chicago marked the first matchup between the two storied programs in eight years. Kentucky limited UCLA to its lowest first-half point total on record (seven).

The Wildcats made four of their first six shots in the game's opening three minutes to secure a 9-0 cushion with 17:41 to play. After staking a 24-0 lead with 12:40 remaining before halftime, Looney scored UCLA's first points on a layup at the 12:17 mark.

Booker finished the game having made 5 of 6 3-point shots and 7 of 10 field goal attempts overall, while Harrison nailed three 3-pointers for Kentucky.
