JOHNNY JONES

HEAD COACH • 4TH YEAR AT LSU (16TH YEAR AS HEAD COACH)

Consistency and Improvement. The two watchwords of the first three years of Johnny Jones tenure as LSU men's basketball coach.

- 19 wins, 9 SEC wins in 2013
- 20 wins, 9 SEC wins in 2014, NIT bid
- 22 wins, 11 SEC wins in 2015, NCAA Tournament appearance.

Top 3 in the SEC.

In three years, Jones has won 61 games overall and 29 in the Southeastern Conference. That's more than any coach at LSU has won in their first three years on the job in Baton Rouge. Jones is also the first LSU coach to take his team to two post-season events in their first three years as the head coach.

Now as Jones prepares for his fourth season at the helm as head coach of the LSU Tigers, he prepares to bring in a recruiting class that some publications has named No. 1 in the country. There is No. 1 overall high school recruit Ben Simmons, who grew up in Australia and played at Montverde in Florida. No. 14 player Antonio Blakeney also of Florida and Mr. Basketball of Louisiana, Brandon Sampson of Madison Prep in Baton Rouge.

Throw in New Orleans native Craig Victor who has transferred from Arizona, seniors Keith Hornsby and Josh Grey, along with junior Tim Quarterman and several players with a year's experience in the program and the consistency and improvement is set to continue for LSU Basketball.

For Johnny Jones, his head coaching tenure is cementing his legacy at LSU after 21 years involved with the program:

- Four years as a player.
- 13 years a member of Dale Brown's coaching staff.
- In his fourth year as the head coach at LSU.

For Jones, just the fifth LSU alum to hold the top position in the men's basketball program and the third to have played and served as head coach, his beliefs about reaching out to fans and giving them an exciting style of basketball to watch in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center has been a strong selling point to fans and recruits alike.

Jones in his three seasons have put on the floor teams that will play hard from start to finish and play a style of basketball that

makes players want to showcase their talent in a team concept.

In his opening statement after being hired, Jones brought back the "HIT" philosophy of LSU Basketball that Coach Dale Brown used when Jones played and coached. The "HIT" philosophy stands for "Hard, Intelligent and Together."

More than anything, Jones, since his hiring on April 13, 2012, has gone out of his way to embrace all aspects of the community, traveling throughout the state on the LSU Tiger Tour and speaking to civic groups and youth organizations. Included in his points in all his stops was how much he wants people to embrace LSU basketball. It's not only fans he wants to hear that message but high school coaches who are excited again to have LSU coaches visiting with them on a regular basis.

LSU and Coach Jones has a successful booster club that gathers before each game for food and scouting reports in the practice facility prior to each home game, Jones is also hosting public luncheons each month to talk to fans about their basketball program and the luncheons are drawing strong crowds each month during the season.

Besides basketball, there is life outside the arena and academics is an important and successful part of LSU life. Every senior in the LSU program has graduated during Jones tenure and in two of the last three years, the basketball program has posted a perfect 1,000 APR score.

This is Jones' third career head coaching position he has served as the interim head coach at the University of Memphis during the 1999-2000 season and began his run as the head coach at the University of North Texas prior to the 2001-02 season.

When Johnny Jones suited up for his first game as an LSU Tiger against Colgate in the Great Alaskan Shootout on Nov. 28, 1980, it would mark the first of 121 games that he would play for LSU. The player would turn assistant coach and be with Coach Dale Brown for another 407 contests.

As a player at LSU, besides playing on the 1981 NCAA Final Four team, Jones started 54 career games. Jones is the only person in LSU history to both play (1981) and coach (1986, asst.) in an NCAA Final Four.

LAST TIME OUT -- LSU 90, VANDERBILT 82 (Nashville, Tenn. 1/2/16)

LSU ran its record to five wins in the last five games, all coached by Johnny Jones, against Vanderbilt Saturday night with a rallying 90-82 victory at Memorial Gymnasium. It marked the second time in Tiger basketball history that LSU has won five straight games against the Commodores and the first time that LSU has won three straight games in as many years at Memorial Gymnasium.

The win marked the first time that LSU has won its conference opener on the road since 2011.

Ben Simmons had another of the big-time games making 10-of-15 field goals and 16-of-19 free throws to score 36 points to go with 14 rebounds. It was his 10th double double of the season (9 pts-reb, 1 reb-ast) this season.

Keith Hornsby had 23 points, hitting four treys, while Craig Victor II made it 11 points. But Hornsby and Victor have scored in double figures in each of the games since their return to the LSU team.

Vanderbilt led by a 35-34 advantage at the halftime, but in the second half as both teams shot over 50 percent, LSU was able to rally to get a couple of

five-point advantages before Vandy tied the game at 48-48 with 14:54 to play. The Commodores got their last lead at 51-50 but LSU posted seven straight points and then a 5-2 go to up the margin to nine and Vandy could get no closer than four the rest of the way.

The Tigers had a 40-24 advantage in the paint and a 14-7 lead in points off turnovers. LSU also had an 11-4 second chance advantage as the rebounds went the Tigers way (40-29 and 11-3 offensively).

JIM HAWTHORNE'S FINAL BROADCAST SEASON HAS SEEN HIM CALL WINS OVER KENTUCKY

LSU has defeated Kentucky a total of 25 times and Jim Hawthorne has been on the microphone on the LSU Sports Radio Network for 18 of those wins, 17 of those at the Pete Maravich Center.

Hawthorne, now that LSU has won its bowl game at the end of 2015, is concentrating on what is now the final 18 regular season games of his final season as "Voice of the Tigers." He signed off from baseball at the College World Series last June and from his final football broadcast at the Texas Bowl in Houston.

It's been an eventful time for the Louisiana native, who missed several November games in basketball and three football games after a medical procedure he described at a recent press conference in NYC, where he received the prestigious Chris Schenkel Award from the National Football Foundation, as a "bump in the road."

When he began as the voice of basketball at LSU, he commuted for two seasons from his then home in Shreveport. He sat out the 1981-82 season before moving to Baton Rouge to fully take over the job of basketball play-by-play beginning with the 1982-83 season and eventually would add football and baseball to his assignments becoming the voice of more than one generation of LSU fans.

Since 1979 he has been on the basketball call for six SEC title teams (1981, 1985, 1991, 2000, 2006, 2009) and three NCAA Final Fours (1981, 1986, 2006).

Chris Blair, who has called Georgia State sports for over a decade, has been chosen as Hawthorne's successor as "Voice of the Tigers" and will begin calling games when the Tiger baseball season begins in February.

SENIOR HORNSBY CONTINUES WITH STRONG START, 6 DOUBLE FIGURE GAMES

It was a long wait to start his senior season, but Keith Hornsby has come out with six consecutive double figure scoring games for the Tigers.

Against Houston (12/13) at Hofheinz Pavilion, Hornsby entered in the first half and made six treys, hit 10 field goals and had no turnovers in an amazing 32-point performance ... Hornsby made a trey with seven seconds left to tie the game and force overtime.

In another road game at Vandy (1/2), Hornsby again had a 20-plus number, hitting 8-of-13 field goals (4-7 treys) and 3-4 at the free throw line for 23 points.

With some stat help from his Grammy Award winning father, Bruce Hornsby, the 32-point effort was a college career high ... At UNC-Asheville, Hornsby had 27 vs. Liberty and 26 vs. Ohio State. His previous LSU high was 25 against Tennessee on March 4, 2015.

Hornsby had 10 plus-20-point games at UNC-A before coming to LSU. The Vandy game gives him a total of 16 games of 20 or more points.

Against Gardner-Webb (12/16), Hornsby returned to the starting lineup where he has stayed and he has posted double figure numbers in all six games he has played in.

In six games, Hornsby has had 12 total assists. He has averaged 17.5 points a game and is shooting 45.2% from the arc, hitting 14-of-31. He has also taken advantage of getting to the line, making 25-of-29 (86.2 percent).

Hornsby went over 1,000 combined career points at the two schools in the Auburn game last year in the Southeastern Conference Tournament ... Hornsby hit 72 treys a season ago and averaged 13.4 points a game for LSU as a junior ... He now has 86 career treys.

CRAIG VICTOR II SHOWS NO EFFECT FROM YEAR OFF

The wait to finally get to play after transferring from Arizona ended on Dec. 16 as Victor, the New Orleans native, made his LSU debut in the Gardner-Webb game.

Victor played 20 minutes, hitting 4-of-7 field goals, including 1-of-2 three-pointers to score 10 points with five rebounds, one blocks and three steals.

Victor has posted double figures in event game and in five games is shooting 56.9 percent from the field (29-of-51). His high was 19 against Wake Forest and then he came back with 11 at Vanderbilt. In the two games last week, Victor was 13-of-25 from the field.

Also, that 40 percent free throw percentage is a bit of a mirage. In the excitement of playing his first game, Victor was admittedly struggling at the line, going 1-for-10. But, in the next four games, he is now 7-of-10 from the line. So the season line now shows 8-of-20.

For the five games he is averaging 13.4 points per game and 5.0 rebounds.

Victor has been at LSU since the end of the fall semester 2014. He played in eight games at Arizona, averaging 3.1 points and 1.1 rebounds. He was ranked as the No. 37 overall recruit when he signed with Arizona, the No. 9 power forward and the No. 1 player from Louisiana in his recruiting class as ranked by ESPN ... He averaged 13.7 points and 8.6 rebounds after transferring for his senior year to Findlay Prep in Nevada ... He was a first-team All-State pick in Louisiana after the 2013 season after averaging 14.1 points and 11.3 rebounds for St. Augustine in New Orleans.

GOOD FREE THROW GAMES 9, BAD FREE THROW GAMES 4

It was a mixed bag for the Tigers in the first month of the season from the charity stripe, even in wins such as Gardner-Webb (12/16) when LSU at one point missed 11 straight free throws in a night that finished with LSU making just 12-of-29 at the line (41.4 percent). So far, the season has gone back and forth from good to somewhat troublesome (but it hasn't been aligned with wins and losses):

For the season, LSU is 224-of-333 from the free throw line (67.3%), but the Tigers have had 42 more attempts than opponents (333-291) and made 23 more free throws (224-201).

Ben Simmons and Keith Hornsby are proving the percentage guys for the Tigers with Simmons making 80-of-107 through 13 games (74.8%) while Hornsby despite the late start is 25-of-29 or 86.2%.

BEN SIMMONS BECOMES FIRST TIGER SINCE 2013 WITH FOUR STRAIGHT 20-PT GAMES

With his 36 point game at Vanderbilt, Simmons became the first LSU Tiger to record four consecutive games of 20 points or more since Charles Carmouche did it at the end February and into March of 2013.

Simmons had three straight 20-point games in November and matched it going into SEC play and now has surpassed it with four straight:

Present Streak –

Vs. Oral Roberts – 24 pts

Vs. American – 23 pts

Vs. Wake Forest – 21 pts

At Vanderbilt – 36 pts

The next longest streak that Simmons could hit is the six straight games of 20 points or more that present Houston Rocket Marcus Thornton had for the Tigers back in the SEC Championship year of 2009.

SIMMONS KEEPING STAT RESEARCHERS BUSY

Here's what ESPN researchers and others were posting after some of Ben Simmons games this season:

Vs. McNeese (11/16) – 11 pts-13 rebs ... Third player ranked No. 1 on ESPN recruiting list since inception to double double in the first game they played, joining Anthony Davis and Kevin Love.

Vs. South Alabama (11/19) – 23 pts-16 rebs ... First SEC freshman with 20 point-15 rebound game since Julius Randle of Kentucky (2013-14) ... Fifth top 10 recruit to have a 20-15 game in first three games of career.

Vs. Marquette (11/23) – 21 points, 20 rebounds, 7 assists -- Eighth LSU player since 1973-74 to record a 20/20 game, the 13th such game by a Tiger in that time span ... At that point, just fifth major conference player to have a 20 point-20 rebound-5 assist game in the last 20 seasons.

Vs. NC State (11/24) – 4 points, 14 rebounds, 10 assists -- First LSU player to have a rebounds-assists double double ... Only DI player listed 6-10 or taller to have 10 assists, no TOs in last 20 seasons.

At Charleston (11/30) – 15 pts-18 reb ... Joined Evan Turner in 2009 as the only players in the last 20 seasons to average 15 points, 10 rebounds and 5 assists in the month of November.

Vs. North Florida (12/2) – 43 pts-14 reb-7 asts-5 stls-3 blocks ... Most points by an LSU player since Shaquille O'Neal scored 43 vs. Northern Arizona on Dec. 28, 1991 ... Simmons is the fourth freshman in the past 20 years with 40 points and 10 rebounds in a game ... First major college player to have a game of 40-10-5-5 in last 20 years ... 43 points most by an SEC player since Arkansas' Rotnei Clark had 51 versus Alcorn State, Nov. 13, 2009 ... First LSU player to make 15 FG since Tasmin Mitchell vs. Auburn (1/20/10).

Vs. American (12/22) – 23 points, 5 rebounds, 6 assists -- Leads DI with 6 games of 20 points, 5 rebounds, 5 assists.

At Vanderbilt (1/2) – 36 points, 14 rebounds, 4 assists, 16-19 FT -- The 16 free throws is the most by an LSU player in an SEC game since Chris

Jackson made 16 at Florida in Dec. 1988. Ironically, that was also Jackson's first SEC game ... The 19 free throw attempts was third most by an LSU players in an SEC game (Pete Maravich had 27 vs. Florida in 1969, while Kenny Higgs had 20 vs. Mississippi State in 1978).

SCOUTING KENTUCKY

Nationally ranked Kentucky comes to Baton Rouge in the first of two meetings between the two schools this year. The Wildcats are coming off a good 83-61 win over Ole Miss at Rupp Arena in the SEC opener for both teams. Tyler Ulis made 8-of-13 field goals had a double double of 20 points and 16 assists with six steals to lead Kentucky while Jamal Murray had 18 points (4 treys) and Marcus Lee added 13 points.

The Wildcats shot 33-of-66 from the field overall and 7-of-25 from the arc. Kentucky was just 10-of-20 from the free throw line with 18 assists. Kentucky had a 42-30 advantage in points off turnovers and a 16-9 total on second chance points.

John Calipari is in his seventh year as a head coach.

Kentucky leads the series, 86-25, with LSU's last win coming in the "Ice Dome" game (as the building was renamed by ESPN's Brad Nessler) in January 2014, 87-82. Of the 25 wins, 17 have come in Baton Rouge and 16 in this building.

COACH JONES RECORD

The Tigers win against Vandy on Jan. 2 gave him his 69th win over his four-years as head coach at LSU and that is more wins than any LSU coach had in their first four years as head coach at LSU.

This is Johnny Jones' 21st year at LSU in some basketball capacity – 4 years as player, 13 years as an assistant coach for Dale Brown and now four years as a head coach ... He played in the 1981 NCAA Final Four and was on the bench as an assistant coach for the 1986 NCAA Final Four.

JONES OFF THE COURT

Coach Jones also has a lot going off the floor and that includes the academic side of LSU where every senior who has been in the LSU program during Coach Jones tenure has walked down the aisle to receive a degree.

During his time as coach the team has received the perfect score of 1,000 in the APR in two of the last three years.

In the community this summer, Jones was able to cut the ribbon on the first "Johnny Jones Courts For Kids" based on golf events held the last couple of years.

The first court in Baton Rouge was located at Expressway Park on South 11th Street. The park features a playground, recreation center, picnic areas, a practice football field, and a trailhead to the Downtown Greenway. The outdoor basketball court was made possible through the generosity of tournament sponsor Walk-On's and Coach Jones' courts program.

The Courts for Kids program's mission is to refurbish courts in local communities around Louisiana. This particular court was formerly a tennis court that has been refurbished and made into one full basketball court and one half basketball court. Other new amenities include new fencing, new basketball goals, bleachers, and a newly painted surface.

JONES AND TIGERS VISIT LOCAL CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

Coach Johnny Jones and the Tigers continued what has been a long-standing tradition of the team and coaches visiting the Our Lady of the Lake Children's Hospital in Baton Rouge prior to Christmas to bring smiles and interact with patients, parents and the hard-working staff at the local facility.

As always, the players sang Christmas carols in many of the patient rooms and even sang to a group of nurses at one of the stations on the floor. Coach Johnny Jones and the players autographed basketballs and posters for each of the rooms and a couple of youngsters were soon seen in the halls testing out their new basketballs.

"I think it's always great for our young men to have an opportunity to give back and be a part of something that we think is really special," said Coach Jones. "To come out and be able to put some cheer in these young kids' hearts and to see the smiles on their faces and their families means a great deal to us. It's the least we can do at this time of the year to have an opportunity to come out and touch someone. It means a great deal to us and we are hopeful at the end of the day that this is going to make them at least have something to smile about."

JONES' TIGERS VERY YOUNG

Now the number skewed up a bit with Keith Hornsby and Craig Victor playing, but LSU shows a playing experience number of 1.13 in Kenpom.com and that ranked 328 out of 351 teams in Division I in terms of experience.

The present Division I average is 1.70 years. Only Missouri and Kentucky have younger and lower numbers than the LSU average.

FAST-PACED, HIGH SCORING TIGERS

LSU has averaged over 70 points each of the three seasons that Johnny Jones has been at LSU, last year averaging 73.4 points per game. That ranked fourth in scoring over the last decade at LSU behind the 75.2 the Tigers averaged in 2005, the 74.8 in 2009 and the 74.7 in 2014 ... Last year marked the first time LSU has averaged over 70 points more than two consecutive seasons for the first time since the 1995-96 campaign when the Tigers averaged over 70 points for the last of 14 consecutive seasons.

This year, through 13 games, the Tigers are averaging 84.2 points, the best 13-game mark for LSU since the 1999-2000 season when LSU averaged 86.6 points per game. The 84.2 average also leads the conference.

LSU is 55-20 in the Johnny Jones era when scoring 70 or more points. LSU in Jones' era is now 26-5 when the Tigers top 80 points or more (5-2 this year). LSU has failed to score 70 points 34 times in that period with a 14-22 record.

POSSESSIONS

The talk has been about more possessions this year with the new shot clock and rules that would speed up the pace of the game. LSU was ninth in the country last year at 72.9 possessions a game. LSU entered the American game (10/22) in the top six at 79 possessions a game, but with the Eagles using much of the shot clock, LSU was limited to 62 possessions and the season average fell to 77.3.

The Tigers had 80 possessions at Vanderbilt (1/2) and now is 16th in the country in possessions at 77.4 a game. Both LSU and Vanderbilt had 80 possessions in the contest, but LSU converted on 44 possessions, while Vandy scored on just 36 possessions.

LSU has an average possessions length according to Kenpom.com of 14.5 and that is 10th in the country. According to the web site the Division I average is 17.1.

ASSISTS ARE GOOD

If there was doubt assists are good, since Ben Simmons had 17 of LSU's 32 assists in the two games in Brooklyn in November, the pass to a player for a bucket is now a big part of LSU's offense.

LSU had 15 assists for its 27 baskets against Marquette (11/23) and 17 assists of its 28 baskets in the game against NC State (11/24). While LSU did turn the ball over 19 times with only 12 assists, those 12 assists matched up against 19 baskets or 63 percent.

In the comeback win against North Florida (12/2), LSU had 27 assists for 45 buckets (60 percent), 17 assists for 27 buckets in the second half (63%). Even in the loss at Houston (12/13), LSU had 18 assists for 34 baskets. LSU topped 20 assists with 21 against ORU for the 36 baskets in that game and had 18 assists for 32 baskets against American (12/22).

For the 13 games, LSU has 222 assists to 395 baskets (56.2%) ... More importantly, LSU has 222 assists to 156 turnovers, while opponents have 165 assists to 204 turnovers ... LSU is third in the league in assists average at 17.1 a game and is third in assist-to-turnover ratio.

Simmons has 70 assists, a 5.4 average, fourth in the conference. Tim Quarterman is eighth in the SEC with an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.3 (45-20).

LSU has won 32 straight games when it has 10+ assists MORE than its opponent and is 144-5 since 1975 in this category after a 21-10 advantage in the Kennesaw State game (11/16).

IS THE 5 BY 5 STAT LINE ACTUALLY POSSIBLE?

SIMMONS CLOSE AGAINST NORTH FLORIDA WITH 4 BY 5

Olgan Uluc of Fox Sports Australia has raised the question in a column if Ben Simmons can be the first D1 college player to accomplish the improbable stat line of 5 or more points, rebounds, assists, blocks and steals in a game.

Uluc wrote: "In basketball, the double-double is an impressive, yet somewhat common, statistical feat, where a player accumulates a total of at least 10 in two statistical categories. The triple-double is less common ... The quadruple-double is extremely rare, and the quintuple-double is essentially unheard of.

"The 'five-by-five' ... It would be the ideal achievement for a player like Simmons."

The statistical phenomenon is so rare that no college basketball player has ever achieved it, and only 10 NBA players have ever managed to put together the stat-line (Julius Irving, Hakeem Olajuwon - 6 times, David Robinson, Derrick Coleman, Vlade Divac, Jamaal Tinsley, Andrei Kirilenko, Marcus Camby and Nicolas Batum).

In the preseason game against Southwest Baptist, Simmons was just a steal away from achieving the statistical phenomenon; posting 17 points, nine rebounds, five assists, six blocks & four steals. For the second time this season, against North Florida, he was 4 by 5 with 43 points, 14 rebounds, seven assists and five steals. He had three steals.

SIMMONS AND THE FOULS DRAWN; 25 TIMES IN TWO GAMES LAST WEEK

It came up during the team's trip to Australia as the FIBA box scores used not only keeps the fouls a player commits, but also the fouls drawn.

In three of the games in Australia, Simmons was fouled 11 times in one game, nine in a second and eight times in a third game.

In some recent games this stat has come forward again with the freshman shooting 10 free throws in Charleston and 15 at home against North Florida. Simmons drew nine fouls against Charleston and then a season high 13 against North Florida. That was almost half of the 27 fouls that North Florida committed ... In the American game, he was fouled eight times and was 7-of-9 at the line.

This past week, Simmons drew 13 fouls against Wake Forest (12/29) and the freshman made 11-of-16 free throws. Saturday at Vandy (1/2), he was fouled 12 times and finished 16-of-19 at the free throw line. For the two games, he drew 25 fouls and was 27-of-35 at the free throw line.

TIM QUARTERMAN OVERALL GOOD SEASON

The junior from Savannah, Georgia, scored 47 points combining the last game before finals and the first game after finals. Quarterman scored 20 points against North Florida (12/2) and a career-high tying 27 at Houston (12/13). For the two games, Quarterman made 15-of-23 field goals, including 4-of-9 treys.

Quarterman has had three games of 20 or more this season. They were part of his five consecutive games in double figures (six for the season).

While Quarterman had just five points in the game at Vandy (1/2), he also had 5 rebounds with three assists, two steals and just one turnover in 30 minutes.

For the season, Quarterman is averaging 11.4 points per game with a 4.8 rebound average ... Earlier this season he became the 31st person to have 200 career assists at LSU. He is 14 away from joining the group of LSU players with 100 career steals.

JOSH GRAY'S SENIOR SEASON GOING WELL

Josh Gray missed the season opener, but has posted three double figure games as well as his second 20-point game of his time at LSU.

Against North Florida, Gray had almost an identical line as Quarterman with 20 points, six assists, one turnovers and two steals. The North Florida game was on Dec. 2, 2015 and ironically, his LSU high of 25 was against UMass on Dec. 2, 2014.

In the Kennesaw State game (11/16), he scored 16 points with six assists. He has had 13 games of five or more assists at LSU.

At Vandy (1/2), Gray hit a three late in the first half to cut the margin to one at the half, 35-34, and he finished with seven points on 3-of-5 shooting with two assists and two steals in 14 minutes.

Gray is in his second year at LSU, the first time in his college career he has played at the same school in successive year. Last season, he averaged 7.1

points per game with 118 assists. So far this season, Gray is averaging 8.1 points, 2.8 rebounds and has 29 assists and 20 turnovers. He is 39-of-83 from the field (47%).

PATTERSON RETURNS FROM LEG INJURY

Patterson had been starting a few times until the Houston game (12/13) when he was out with a left leg injury. He returned to play against Wake Forest (12/29) and played 13 minutes. He did not score but had 1 assist.

Patterson, the sophomore who also prepped at Montverde Academy, got his first start of 2015-16 in the NC State game (11/24), played 16 minutes with 7 points, an assist and two steals. Patterson has also started at Charleston where he had five assists, and in the North Florida (12/2) game where he had his first double figure game of the year with 11 points and three assists.

He finished last season starting the final 11 games for the Tigers.

For his eight games, he is averaging 20.3 minutes per game, averaging 5.1 points with 17 assists and 9 turnovers. He has made 8-of-24 three-point attempts.

AARON EPPS HAVING STRONG SOPHOMORE SEASON

Epps, who played in 14 games last year while battling some injuries, has made great strides this season and posted the first double figures scoring game of his LSU career in the second game of the season against Kennesaw State (11/16) with 10 points on 4-of-8 shooting with 7 rebounds.

But his best play as come in some recent games, with double figures in four games, with his first career double double in the GWU game (12/16):

Epps is averaging 5.8 points per game and 3.0 rebounds and is 34-of-60 from the field.

BRIAN BRIDGEWATER

The junior from Baton Rouge had been seeing action in the post as well and scored five points in a 24-minute stint against NC State. Against North Florida, he played 19 minutes off the bench had four points and three rebounds. He missed the last four games with a leg injury and had surgery that will leave him out for a few weeks.

Bridgewater in the eight games is averaging 3.5 points and 3.0 rebounds.

THE FRESHMAN – BLAKENEY AND SAMPSON

The freshman class at LSU is not just Ben Simmons – there are two more very capable freshman – Antonio Blakeney of Sarasota, Florida and Brandon Sampson of Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Both have started at various points of the season and continue to be top contributors to the squad.

Blakeney has been almost a regular part of the LSU line, starting 12-of-the-13 games and is averaging 9.8 points per game ... He has scored in double figures in seven of the game. He had 22 points when he earned FOW for the SEC against McNeese in the opening game and 22 versus South Alabama.

For the season, he has hit a team-high 18 treys and averaged 30 minutes per game.

At Vandy, Blakeney hit just two field goals, but did have two assists and no turnovers in the 30 minutes.

Sampson has been introduced five times in the starting lineup and is averaging 20.9 minutes per game. He has three games in double figures with 18 points against both McNeese State and NC State (in Brooklyn). He is averaging 7.2 points per game and has 15 treys (15-of-46). He was 2-of-2 in the American game (12/22) from the arc.

Sampson was 6-of-12 in his 18-point McNeese game (11/13) and 7-of-12 versus NC State (11/24), hitting four treys in both games. He dressed but did not play against Wake Forest (12/29) because of an unspecified injury. He returned at Vandy, playing eight minutes.

ELBERT ROBINSON III

While he was dressed but DNP in the games against Charleston and North Florida, the sophomore did start at Houston (12/13) and versus Gardner-Webb (12/16) ... In fact he has started seven of the 10 games in which he has played.

Against Houston, he played 13 minutes and had four points on 2-of-4 shooting and versus GWU, he had 6 points, keying LSU's start to the game. He hit 3-of-5 field goals in nine minutes.

Robinson has averaged 12.5 minutes a game, making 17-of-32 field goals. He is averaging 3.7 points and 2.8 rebounds a game.

DARCY MALONE

With the absence of Brian Bridgewater, that may allow Darcy Malone to pick up some minutes as he has played in the last four games, after sitting out the previous four. The Australian junior had four points versus Gardner-Webb (12/16) and two against ORU (12/19).

He played the second most minutes for him of the season at Vandy (11/2) and in 12 minutes had two points and one assist.

In his eight games, he is averaging 1.3 points and 1.0 rebounds a game.

PICKS AND ACCOLADES

LSU was picked to finish fourth in the SEC by the media panel for this year's SEC TipOff with Kentucky the predicted winner.

SIMMONS PRE-SEASON SEC POY; AP ALL-AMERICA SELECTION

When the SEC TipOff took place at the ESPN/SEC Network studios in Charlotte, the league and national media panel selected Australian freshman Ben Simmons as the preseason player of the year. Junior Tim Quarterman was named to the second team.

Simmons was named a preseason selection to the Associated Press All-America team. Simmons joined seniors Kyle Wiltjer of Gonzaga, Georges Niang of Iowa State and Buddy Hield of Oklahoma, along with junior Kris Dunn of Providence. While this is the third straight year for the pre-season All-America team selected by a panel of 65 media voters to have a freshman, it is only the fourth time a freshman has been named to the five-player team.

50 PERCENT SHOOTING WINS

LSU was 9-0 last year when shooting 50 percent or better from the field and started the year with three more 50 percent shooting nights and victories (50.8% against Kennesaw State, 11/16; 50.9 percent against South Alabama, 11/19) and the amazing 64.3% game against North Florida (12/2).

That ran LSU's record in the Johnny Jones era to 23-1 with 18 straight wins. But that streak came to an end at Houston (12/13) when both teams posted over 50 percent in LSU's loss for the Cougars. Jones is now 25-2 when the Tigers shooting 50 percent against ORU and 61.5% for the American game (12/22).

AWAY FROM HOME THIS YEAR

The Tigers are 1-2 on opponent's home courts this year ... LSU is 414-611 all-time ... Coach Jones is 17-22 in his tenure on road courts ... LSU has also lost two neutral court games to Marquette and NC State away from the Maravich Center this season.

AT THE MARAVICH CENTER

The Tigers concluded the 2015 season 13-4 for the year at the Maravich Center, 5-4 in the league ... This year, LSU is 7-1 in the building with Coach Johnny Jones 47-11 as LSU head coach ... LSU has posted 16 years of at least 13 wins in the Maravich Center's previous 44 years of play ... LSU was 8-0 in non-conference play last season and is 281-40 in non-conference games in the building with the Wake Forest loss (12/29) stopping a 15-game non-conference home win streak.

AGAINST NATIONALLY-RANKED TEAMS

LSU has 76 wins all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll going into the Kentucky game. With the Wildcats expected to be in the top 10 in the poll later on Monday, LSU has recorded 36 of those 76 wins against top 10 teams.

LSU's last win against a top 10 teams in the AP poll came on Dec. 19, 2011, as LSU defeated No. 10 Marquette, 67-59, here in Baton Rouge.
Coach Johnny Jones is 4-6 against ranked teams.

TIGERS GOING FOR FIFTH CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASON

With 22 wins last year, the Tigers easily earned their fourth consecutive winning season (18 in 2012, 19 in 2013, 20 in 2014 and 22 in 2015). That tied for the fourth longest run of consecutive winning seasons in program history:

11 – 1982-1993; 6 – 2002-2007; 5 – 1977-1981; 4 – 2012-present; 4 – 1932-35

LSU's 22 wins tied for 10th most wins in a single season with the 1992-93, 1969-70 and 1952-53 seasons ... A total of 13 teams at LSU have won at least 22 games in a season topped by the 1980-81 team which won 31 games.

SIMMONS HAS EARNED BOTH SEC WEEKLY HONORS & ON WOODEN TOP 50

Ben Simmons has the distinction of having won both SEC weekly honors in the first four weeks of the basketball season. In week two, he was named the league Freshman of the Week for LSU's play in the home games against Kennesaw State (11/16) and South Alabama (11/19) ... Simmons averaged 22.5 points, 12.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists and three steals in the two wins.

Then on Dec. 8, he was named the player of the week after averaging 29 points, 16 rebounds, 5.5 assists, three steals and two blocks per game against Charleston and North Florida. The 43 points in the North Florida game was the most by an SEC freshman since Tennessee's Allen Houston had 43 points against LSU on Feb. 10, 1990.

He is also on the list of the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50, announced on ESPN's SportsCenter and on ESPN.com ... The 50 was chosen by a preseason poll of national college basketball experts and the list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who are the early front-runners for college basketball's most prestigious individual honor ... Simmons was one of seven SEC players on the list.

BLAKENEY WAS FIRST SEC FRESHMAN OF WEEK

Freshman Antonio Blakeney's 22 point opening contest against McNeese (11/13) earned him co-SEC Freshman of the Week honors announced on Nov. 16.

Review of previous opening games by freshmen show that Blakeney's 22 points equaled the 22 points that New Orleans native Randy Livingston

scored in the opening game of the 1994-95 season. Livingston also had nine assists in the game.

The 22 points was the most by any player in an opening game since Johnny O'Bryant III scored 25 points in the 2013-14 season opener at UMass.

WILL IT BE ANOTHER 23 YEARS

When Tim Quarterman posted a triple-double of 18 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists versus Ole Miss in the Maravich Center on Feb. 28, 2015, it marked the first triple double in just under 23 years. On March 19, 1992, in the NCAA Tournament first round game against BYU, Shaquille O'Neal of LSU posted the points-rebounds-blocks triple of 26-13-11 ... It was the sixth and final one of his career and he currently has the record along with Michael Anderson of Drexel (1985-88) for most triples in a career. There is also one recorded triple-double for Pete Maravich from 1969.

With Ben Simmons and his ability to pass, score and rebound, certainly the triple double is a part of the lexicon that may not have to wait another 23 years to take place.

AUSTRALIAN TOUR A SUCCESS

The Tigers were able to use their once-every-four-years foreign tour opportunity to bring Ben Simmons and Darcy Malone home to Australian where LSU played five games against teams from the National Basketball League and area all-star squads. LSU was 3-2 on the trip playing before packed gyms and arenas and gaining lots of new fans and media attention in Australia.

Simmons averaged 20 points and 9.0 rebounds in the five games with 27 assists, 11 blocks and 18 steals, while Tim Quarterman averaged 16.4 points and 5.2 rebounds. Also averaging in double figures was Antonio Blakeney with a 13.8 points average (6.2 rpg), Keith Hornsby 12.3 points per game and Brandon Sampson at 11.8 points per game.

In a four-quarter game with a 24-second shot clock that reset to 14 seconds after an offensive rebound, LSU averaged 87.2 points per game, shooting 43.8 percent from the floor. LSU was out rebounded in the five games and average of 42.6 to 39.0.

TIME FINALLY SET FOR FLORIDA ROAD GAME SATURDAY

With CBS Sports having a night NFL Wild-Card playoff game, the time has finally been set for the LSU game Saturday at Gainesville, Fla. The tip time is now 1:30 p.m. ET (12:30 p.m. CT) and will be broadcast on CBS and the LSU Sports Radio Network. LSU will then return home for a week of home games against Ole Miss and Arkansas.
