SCOUTING KENTUCKY

>> The Wildcats have won back-to-back games at Alabama 77-61 last Saturday and over Mississippi State 80-74 on Tuesday. In the win over the Bulldogs, Kentucky was led by Jamal Murray's 22 points on 5-of-11 3-pointers and Tyler Ulis' 21 points and five assists. The Wildcats opened SEC play defeating Ole Miss 83-61 and losing at LSU 85-67. Murray ranks fifth in the SEC averaging 17.6 points per game to go along with 4.3 rebounds and 2.6 assists. Ulis adds 14.2 points and is second in the SEC with 6.0 assists per game. while Isaiah Briscoe chips in 10.9 points, 5.4 rebounds and 3.1 assists. Kentucky has won four of its last five games, including a 75-73 win over #16/15 Louisville on Dec. 26. The Wildcats lead the SEC in field goal pct. (.476), rebounding defense (31.9) and are second in the league with 14.0 offensive

AUBURN-KENTUCKY SERIES

» This is the 109th meeting between the Tigers and Wildcats with UK holding a commanding 91-17 series lead. The Wildcats have won 18 straight games in the series and 32 of the last 33.

No. 4 Auburn beat 20th-ranked Kentucky 66-63 in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum in 2000 in the only Tiger win during the 33-game stretch.

The Tigers have a 13-30 record against Kentucky in Auburn with the Wildcats defeating the Tigers eight straight times. Kentucky has a 46-2 edge over Auburn in Lexington with the two Tiger wins coming in 1983 over No. 6 UK 75-67 and in 1988 over No. 1 UK 53-52. The Wildcats are 26-2 against Auburn in Rupp Arena, including 14 straight Tiger

losses.

Kentucky is 15-2 against Auburn at neutral sites, including last season's Wildcat win over Auburn in the SEC Tournament semifinals in Nashville.

BRUCE PEARL vs. KENTUCKY

» Bruce Pearl is 4-11 against Kentucky (0-2 coaching Auburn), with this being the first time he has faced the Wildcats in Auburn Arena.

At Tennessee, Pearl went 3-3 vs. Kentucky in Knoxville, 1-5 in Lexington and 0-1 in neutral sites.

TIGER NEWCOMERS 72.7% OF SCORING

» Auburn's newcomers have accounted for 72.7 percent of the Tigers' scoring this season, 830 of the 1142 total points.

Nov. 13 - Bryce Brown was suspended for the season-opener vs. UAB after playing in two different summer leagues ... only two summer league games played combined.

Nov. 13 - New Williams suffered a left knee injury in practice on Nov. 11 and has missed most of Auburn's first six games, playing just eight minutes against Northwestern State (11/27) and three minutes at Middle Tennessee (12/12). He missed at Hawaii and the South Carolina game as well.

Nov. 27 - Tahj Shamsid-Deen separated his surgically-repaired right shoulder on Nov. 27 and is expected to miss 10-14 days. Shamsid-Deen missed the 2015-16 season-opener with a shoulder injury in addition to the final 11 games of last season to have surgery on both of his separated shoulders. The team's best defender, he averaged 6.0 points, 1.5 assists and 1.1 rebounds last season.

Shamsid-Deen re-injured his right shoulder at No. 10 Xavier Dec. 19 after playing only six minutes and has been out since.

Nov. 27 - Devin Waddell missed the Northwestern State game with a concussion.

Dec. 23 - T.J. Dunans injured his left knee going for a rebound with a second before halftime after

playing 13 minutes vs. Harvard in the Diamond Head Classic semifinals. He has not played since.

Jan. 2 - TJ Lang elbowed in face 30 seconds before the half vs. Tennessee in the SEC opener and didn't return.

LAST TIME OUT

Vanderbilt 75, Auburn 57 (Jan. 12, 2016, in Nashville, Tenn.)

» Cinmeon Bowers notched his seventh double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds as Auburn fell at Vanderbilt 75-57 in Memorial Gymnasium. Kareem Canty added 16 points and six assists while Tyler Harris had eight points and 10 boards. It was Bowers' 21st double-double in his one-plus seasons. The game opened with several runs. Vanderbilt made its first four shots, including three 3s, for a 13-2 lead. Auburn answered with nine straight points with the Commodores following with a 12-2 run for a 25-13 lead with 10:24 left. Vandy stretched its lead to 32-15 on Riley LaChance's third 3 of the half with six minutes to go. The Commodores made their first six 3-point attempts after going 5-of-24 at No. 22 South Carolina on Saturday. After starting 5-of-8, Auburn went 4-of-29 to close the half, trailing 39-22. Vanderbilt pushed its lead

to as much as 66-43 with 7:51 left, but Auburn responded with seven straight. Luke Kornet led Vanderbilt with a triple-double of 11 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks. Wade Baldwin IV added 17 points, 10 rebounds and seven assists. Auburn shot 32.8 percent from the floor and 4-of-22 from 3-point range while Vanderbilt was torrid with 55.3 percent shooting from the field and 7-of-13 (.538) from behind the arc.

LAST TIME vs. KENTUCKY

No. 1 Kentucky 91, Auburn 67 (Mar. 15, 2015, in SEC Tournament semifinals in Nashville, Tenn.)

» Antoine Mason finished his Auburn basketball career in a big way, scoring 23 points against Kentucky, raising his two-game total against the powerful Wildcats to 52 this season. It was the proper way to leave for the player who transferred in to Auburn for his final year of eligibility, but found more than a basketball court. He found friends and teammates who helped him deal with the Feb. 28 death of his father, former NBA standout Anthony Mason. Antoine Mason flew to New York to be with his father twice after he suffered a heart attack, and again before he died. Mason missed Auburn's last two regular-season games, but returned for the SEC Tournament and Auburn's three-game run before losing to Kentucky 91-67.

PLAYERS NOTES

KAREEM ONLY ONE IN AMERICA

» Auburn's Kareem Canty is the only player in the nation to make eight 3-pointers, have seven assists and only one turnover in the same game (at Middle Tennessee on Dec. 12). Canty scored a career-high 28 points at MTSU, making four of his 3-pointers in the final 1:54 of regulation.

Iona's A.J. English and Oklahoma's Buddy Hield are the only other player to make at least eight 3s and have seven assists in the same game this season, although English had six turnovers. English made 13 3-point field goals and had eight assists vs. Fairfield on Dec. 1.

Hield had eight 3s, seven assists and five turnovers at No. 1 Kansas on Jan. 4.

KAREEM THE DREAM

» Kareem Canty is ranked fourth in the SEC in scoring at 18.5 ppg, is third in assists with 5.7 apg, ranked eighth nationally with 3.6 made 3s per game, seventh in 3-point field goal pct. (.394) and fourth in minutes (33.8).

He had 22 points at Hawai'i, 20 vs. Tennessee and 21 vs. No. 22 South Carolina.

Canty was named to the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic all-tournament team by averaging 17.3 points and 7.0 assists.

He had 27 points in the win over New Mexico in the Diamond Head Classic and made the game-clinching 3-pointer with 26 seconds left to give the Tigers a four-point lead. It was his sixth 20-point game of the season, including four straight.

Canty led Auburn with 22 points and eight assists at Hawai'i and had 25 points at No. 10 Xavier.

He tied a career high with 28 points, seven assists and only one turnover in 39 minutes at Middle Tennessee. Canty made 4 straight 3-pointers in the final 1:54 of regulation and hit the game-tying free with 1.7 seconds left to send the game into overtime as Auburn overcame a 6-point deficit. He went 10-of-20 from the field and 8-of-13 from 3-point line. His eight made 3-pointers is a career-high.

The Harlem, N.Y., native had 21 points and six assists in the win vs. Mercer and nailed the

dagger 3-pointer to give the Tigers a 72-68 lead with 29 seconds remaining.

He had 24 points (6-of-12 3fgs) and seven assists vs. Colorado and scored a team-high 20 points to lead Auburn to its season-opening win over UAB. He was four rebounds shy of a triple-double with 17 points, 10 assists and a career-high six rebounds vs. Northwestern State.

» Tyler Harris, who is averaging 17.5 points and 8.5 rebounds in the last four games, is 14th in the SEC averaging 14.9 points, is fifth with 8.4 rebounds, fifth shooting 51.3 percent from the field, third with 3.3 offensive rebounds and sixth with 5.1 defensive rebounds.

The Dix Hills, N.Y., native recorded six double-doubles in the first 12 games of the season after not having a single one prior in his career.

Harris totaled 19 points and a career-high tying 13 rebounds vs. Tennessee in his SEC debut. He had 22 points and six assists vs. No. 22 South Carolina and 21 points, five rebounds, two blocks, an assist and steal at Missouri.

He had 12 points and 12 rebounds vs. Harvard in the Diamond Head Classic and just missed his sixth double-double with 15 points and nine rebounds at Hawai'i.

He had three straight double-doubles at Coastal Carolina, at Middle Tennessee and vs. Mercer, and he had four in his first seven games as a Tiger as he had 20 points and 11 rebounds vs. Mercer after scoring 14 points and a career-high 13 rebounds at Middle Tennessee.

» Junior T.J. Dunans, who has not played because of injury since the second half of the Harvard game on Dec. 23, is averaging 12.4 points, 2.6 rebounds, 2.8 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.3 blocks. The Atlanta, Ga., native tied a career-high with 20 points vs. New Mexico.

He totaled 17 points, six rebounds, three assists, three steals and a block in his Auburn debut vs. UAB.

He had 20 points on 4-of-6 3-pointers, four rebounds and three assists vs. Northwestern State.

Dunans, who is shooting 52.3 percent from the floor, is an even better 59.6 percent (34-of-57) from 2-point range only.

HIGH-FLYING HORACE

» Freshman Horace Spencer, who has started the last seven games, is averaging 4.0 points, 5.1 rebounds and is sixth in the league with 1.7 blocks in 16.5 minutes per game.

Spencer leads all freshmen in blocks per game this season.

He tied his career-high with eight points at Missouri to go along with six rebounds and two blocks.

Spencer made his first start vs. New Mexico and responded with six points, five rebounds, three blocks and two steals.

He preserved Auburn's 75-74 win over UAB, blocking Chris Cokley's shot in the paint with 1.8 seconds left. The Philadelphia, Pa., native became just the third Auburn player to record five blocks in a game since the start of the 2012-13 season.

It was the first game-winning block for the 6-foot-9 Spencer in his basketball life.

Spencer had eight points and eight rebounds vs. Colorado and six points, seven rebounds, three blocks, two assists and a steal in 14 minutes vs. Georgia Southern.

BIG SHOT LANG

» Sophomore TJ Lang is shooting 41.5 percent (17-of-41) from 3-point range on the season.

Lang drained the game-winning 3-pointer with 16.3 seconds remaining from the right corner in Auburn's 75-74 win over UAB. The Tigers led for all but 20 seconds in the game, trailing only when the Blazers took the lead by two in the possession before.

He had a career-high 14 points, making 4-of-8 3-pointers in the win at Coastal Carolina.

The Mobile, Ala., native is averaging 4.9 points.

BB GUNNER

» Freshman Bryce Brown is seventh in the league with 2.4 made 3-pointers per game.

He scored a career-high 20 points in back-to-back games at Hawai'i and vs. Tennessee in his SEC debut while shooting 52.4 percent (11-of-21) from 3-point range.

The Stone Mountain, Ga., native scored a career-high 20 points on 6-of-12 3-pointers at Hawai'i in his 10th collegiate game. He was the first freshman to score at least 20 points a game since Chris Denson in the 2011 SEC Tournament.

He followed that with 20 points on 5-of-9 3-pointers vs. Tennessee in his SEC debut.

Brown scored 15 points in 18 minutes, making 4-of-8 three-pointers, in the win vs. Northwestern State.

He had 13 points on 3-of-7 3s vs. Harvard in the Diamond Head Classic semifinals and had 12 points on three 3-pointers in 20 minutes in the win at Coastal Carolina.

Brown scored 11 points in six minutes vs. Georgia Southern. He went 3-of-4 from 3-point range.

He is averaging 9.6 points on the season.

GRANGER & KEIM SEE INCREASED ROLES

» With all of Auburn's injuries, senior Jordan Granger and sophomore walk-on Patrick Keim each played a career-high minutes vs. Tennessee.

In the last four games, Granger is averaging 7.5 points and 3.5 rebounds in 29.8 minutes. He averaged 2.1 points and 1.3 rebounds in 13.6 minutes in Auburn's first 11 games. Granger totaled season-highs of seven points, five rebounds, two blocks and two steals in 33 minutes vs. the Vols.

Granger, who started 33 of 34 games last season, made his first start of this season vs. No. 22 South Carolina and had a season-high eight points, three rebounds, three steals and two assists in 31 minutes.

He had seven points, five rebounds and two blocks at Missouri and eight points in 27 minutes at Vanderbilt.

Keim, who played eight minutes total last season, played nine minutes vs. Tennessee as the backup point guard and recorded two assists and a steal. He had two rebounds in a career-high 11 minutes at Missouri.

» Auburn, defeated Tennessee 83-77 in its first SEC opener on CBS, is 4-0 at home all-time on the network, defeating LSU 67-52 in 2012, Alabama 88-76 in 2008 and Florida 88-69 in 1999.

It was the AULIVE game to benefit cancer patients in the fight to beat cancer. AULIVE raises the awareness of cancer prevention and detection while t-shirt sales and donations raise money to benefit cancer patients. One of the many goals is for each person in attendance at the game to buy an orange AULIVE t-shirt benefiting the cause and wear at the game.

T-shirt cost is \$20 and the proceeds benefit local cancer treatment/awareness.

The money raised directly benefits cancer patients at these hospitals: Coosa Valley, East Alabama Medical Center, Russell Medical Center, Children's of Alabama, Montgomery Cancer Center and the L5 Foundation in Knoxville, Tenn.

Pearl initiated the OUTLIVE program in 2009 at Tennessee in recognition of former Vol Chris Lofton, who beat testicular cancer through early diagnosis and treatment and went on to play the entire 2007-08 season while recovering from his battle with the disease.

The OUTLIVE program at Tennessee raised over \$1 million while Pearl has raised over \$500,000 in two years for Children's Harbor in Alabama.

» Auburn featured a nationally ranked recruiting class ranked 19th that features guard T.J. Dunans (nation's No. 1 ranked junior college player), 6-foot-9 forward Horace Spencer (ranked No. 48 by 247Sports), guard Bryce Brown and guard New Williams.

Not included in the recruiting class rankings are redshirt junior guard Kareem Canty, who averaged 16.3 ppg at Marshall in 2013-14, and graduate student Tyler Harris, who averaged 9.9 ppg and 4.0 rpg last season at Providence.

RETURNING STARTERS

» Auburn returned three starters in seniors Cinmeon Bowers (12.1 ppg, 9.6 rpg) and Jordan Granger (4.9 ppg, 3.4 rpg) and junior Tahj Shamsid-Deen (6.1 ppg, 1.5 apg), who missed the final 11 games of the season due to injury. TJ Lang made six starts last season.

RETURNING NUMBERS

» Auburn returned 33.8 percent of its scoring and 58.3 percent of its rebounding from last year's team that finished 15-20 overall, 13th in the SEC with a 4-14 record. The Tigers won three games

Auburn lost to Colorado in ESPN's College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon in Auburn Arena. This marked the second consecutive year the Tigers and Buffaloes have been a part of ESPN's College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon as the game was played in Boulder last season. It was the first time Auburn has hosted the prestigious event, and the first time in history the Tigers have been on ESPN in a regular season non-conference home game.

The Greensboro, N.C., native played in 27 games last year, starting one at center vs. No. 1 Kentucky in the SEC Tournament semifinals. He held Kentucky's Karl-Anthony Towns, the No. 1 pick in the 2015 NBA Draft, to zero field goals in the SEC Tournament semifinals.

2014-15 QUICK REVIEW

» In the 2015 SEC Tournament, Auburn won three games in three days for the first time in 30 years and reached the semifinals for the first time since 2009. The Tigers defeated Mississippi State and two postseason teams, Texas A&M (NIT) and LSU (NCAA), before falling to undefeated Kentucky.

• Auburn defeated five NCAA Tournament teams last season: LSU (twice), Xavier, Georgia and Texas Southern.

• KT Harrell was named an All-SEC second-team selection by the league's coaches and the Associated Press and was also voted to the SEC All-Tournament Team.

• KT Harrell was the SEC scoring champion at 18.5 points per game, the sixth Auburn player to lead the league in scoring.

Jared Harper is a consensus four-star by ESPN, 247Sports, Rivals and Scout. He is ranked 52nd nationally by Rivals, 91st by ESPN and 104th by 247Sports. He was named co-MVP at the Nike EYBL Peach Jam championship game, totaling 34 points, eight assists and four rebounds in Team Georgia's 104-77 victory against the St. Louis Eagles.

"Jared Harper is undersized and still underrated," said Pearl. "Prior to this summer, Jared was not even recognized amongst the top 100 players in the country or top 20 point guards in the nation.

He was the MVP of Nike's No. 1 summer event, the Peach Jam, and in my mind, one of the elite point guards in the country.

"He will be one of college basketball's most dynamic smaller guards. He has a great ability to push the break, find the open man, extend the defense with a tremendous basketball IQ."

Harper had 35 points vs. South Cobb on Dec. 5, 2015.

Harper had 24 points and six rebounds in the Georgia Stars 83-77 overtime win against Team Takeover of Washington D.C. in the semi-finals of the Peach Jam.

Harper averaged 21 points and seven assists for Georgia Class 6A State runner-up Pebblebrook High School, which finished with a school record 27 wins (27-6), as a junior in 2014-15. Pebblebrook lost to Wheeler 59-58 in the state championship game in which Harper had given the Falcons a 58-57 lead with a free throw with 7.8 seconds remaining.

"When we committed Jared, we may have been his only SEC offer," said Pearl. "After this past summer, more than half the schools in our league would have been happy to have him, but the Harpers stayed loyal to the Auburn Family."

» Mustapha Heron, 6-5, 210, G Waterbury, Conn. (Sacred Heart)

Consensus five-star Mustapha Heron is the first five-star in Auburn history and will be the Tigers' third McDonald's All-American. He has garnered that ranking from ESPN, 247Sports, Rivals and Scout. He is ranked 21st nationally by Rivals, 23rd by Scout, 24th by ESPN and 24th by 247Sports.

"Mustapha is a program changer," said Pearl. "Mustapha was one of two or three players this summer whom I enjoyed watching more than anybody. You talk about productive, impossible to stay in front of, vicious at the rim, explosive with either hand, tremendous range in his jump shot, willing defender, leader and mature beyond his years.

"He should be the third McDonald's All-American that Auburn University has ever had. He is a great person and has a great family."

The reigning New Haven Register All-State Player of the Year averaged 22 points and 5.3 rebounds last season. Heron is only the second junior to earn the honor.

Heron attended Wilbraham & Monson prep school as a freshman and the start of his sopho-

more year. He transferred to Sacred Heart before the 2013-14 season started and helped lead the Hearts to consecutive Class S state titles. Sacred Heart went 28-0 last season and occupied the No. 1 spot in the Register/GameTimeCT Top 10 poll the entire season.

Sacred Heart was coming off three straight years of not qualifying for the postseason prior to Heron's arrival.

Playing AAU for the Harlem-based New York Rens, Heron averaged 20 points and nine rebounds for a squad that went 55-5 over the summer and won five of six tournaments throughout the country.

The Rens finished seventh this summer in ESPN's Top 25 AAU rankings.

The left-hander played in Treviso, Italy after being invited to play for the U-18 USA Select Team.

The AAU all-star team opposed a U-20 team from France, a U-19 team from Greece and a EuroCamp All-Star team that included six players who declared for the 2015 NBA Draft. Team USA went 3-0, the first time in the EuroCamp's history that the U.S. won even one game.

Heron has also played on the same court with LeBron James, Stephen Curry and Chris Paul.

Heron's father, Bryan, played at Central Connecticut State from 1985-89, averaging 14.4 points and 6.6 rebounds in his career before playing professionally in Europe.

» Anfernee McLemore, 6-7, 210, F Warwick, Ga. (Worth County)

Anfernee McLemore is rated as a four-star by ESPN and a three-star by 247Sports, Rivals and Scout. McLemore averaged 19 points, 11.8 rebounds and 6.4 blocks per game for Worth County as a junior, recording several triple-doubles.

"Anfernee is a terrific student-athlete," said Pearl. "He has a 4.0 GPA, is a hard-worker, disciplined, tremendous athleticism and a really productive player. I think he is a guy who will be four years in the program, leave with his master's degree and will continue to get better every year."

A two-time All-Area selection by the Albany Herald and a member of the newspaper's Super Six, McLemore has started for the Rams each of his four years in high school.

McLemore sports a 4.0 grade-point average in advanced classes. He had considered Yale, Brown, Oregon State, Stanford and Georgia Tech.

Canty had a chance to win it in regulation but his 3-point attempt rimmed out at the buzzer with the score tied at 100. Back-to-back layups from Jordan Granger and Spencer gave Auburn the early overtime lead that the Tigers held the remainder of the period, as they outscored Indianapolis 14-9. Canty, who was perfect 13-of-13 from the free throw line went on an 8-0 run by himself in the second half to give Auburn an 88-82 lead with 5:57 left in regulation. The Harlem, N.Y., native scored 12 of the Tigers' 13 points during the stretch. T.J. Dunans added 14 points and tallied three assists, two blocks and two steals.
