Series Notes: Tuesday's contest between Alabama and Kentucky will mark the 144th meeting between the two programs – the sixth-most games UA has played against any single opponent.

OPENING TIP

➤ Alabama will travel to Lexington, Ky., to take on the No. 16/14 Kentucky Wildcats on Tuesday night at 6 p.m. CT (7 p.m. ET). It will mark the second contest between the two teams this season as Kentucky defeated Alabama, 77-61, back on Jan. 9 in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

▶ Tuesday's game will air on ESPN as Brad Nessler (play-by-play), Sean Farnham (analyst) and Shannon Spake (sideline) will be on the call. The contest will also be available via the Crimson Tide Sports Network, with Chris Stewart and Bryan Passink calling all the action. Fans will be able to follow along on gametracker (accessed through RollTide.com), and game updates will be available on Twitter via @AlabamaMBB.

✤ Senior guard Retin Obasohan has been making his case for first team all-conference honors. Against league competition, Obasohan is averaging 19.9 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.5 steals per game, while shooting 49.2 percent from the floor and 37.0 percent from beyond the arc through 14 league games, He enters the Kentucky contest ranking fourth in scoring average, fifth in field goal percentage and tied for sixth in steals per game. Moreover, he has nine games of 20 or more points vs. SEC teams and has scored in double figures in all but one game in conference play.

➤ Alabama comes into its game at Kentucky with an RPI of No. 41 and a strength of schedule of No. 23 in the nation, according to ESPN.com (through games of Feb. 21). The Tide's RPI ranks fifth-best in the SEC, while its SOS is third-best in the league. Alabama shares the SEC lead with 5 wins vs. the RPI top 50 (5-5).

▶ Alabama owns a record of 4-2 against top-25 teams this season. The Tide defeated then-No. 20 Wichita State (64-60) on Nov. 27, then-No. 17 Notre Dame (74-73) on Nov. 29, then-No. 19 South Carolina (73-50) on Jan. 13 and then-No. 15 Texas A&M (63-62) on Feb. 10. The four top-25 victories leads the SEC.

➤ The Tide currently ranks first in the SEC wins vs. top-25 ranked teams (4), tied for first the SEC in RPI top-50 wins (5), third in the league in strength of schedule (23) and fifth in RPI (41).

➤ The Tide will begin a two-game homestand when it takes on the Auburn Tigers on Saturday, Feb. 27, at 4 p.m. on SEC Network. It will mark the second meeting this season between the two teams as the Tigers took an 83-77 victory back on Jan. 19 in Auburn, Ala.

ABOUT ALABAMA'S OPPONENT — KENTUCKY

• Kentucky is currently on a 35-game win streak when playing in the friendly confines of Rupp Arena, the second-longest winning streak in the venue's history. UK's last home loss came on Feb. 27, 2014 in an overtime loss to Arkansas. With an all-time record of 544-64 (.895) in Rupp Arena, Kentucky is 117-4 (.967) in Rupp Arena under John Calipari including 62-1 (.984) against nonconference opponents. Calipari is just three wins shy of Tubby Smith for the second most for any UK head coach in the arena.

• Tuesday's game marks the Kentucky leads the 144th game played between Alabama and Kentucky – the sixth-most games played against any one opponent in UA men's basketball history. The Wildcats own a 105-37 edge in the all time series, including having won four straight games overall. The Tide is 10-55 in games played in Lexington and have only one six times in 29 total games played in Rupp Arena. Furthermore, Alabama has lost six straight games in Rupp Arena, with the last victory coming on Jan. 14, 2006 (won, 68-64).

• Kentucky led the Southeastern Conference with four players on the coaches' preseason All-SEC teams. Sophomore Tyler Ulis and freshman Skal Labissere were named to the All-SEC First Team while senior Alex Poythress and freshman Jamal Murray made the All-SEC Second Team. Ullis and Labissere were also named first team by the media while Poythress took home preseason second team honors.

• Though Kentucky isn't quite as big and as long as it was last season, the Wildcats are still one of the tallest teams in the country and still appear to be one of the best on the boards. The Wildcats rank third in the Southeastern Conference in rebounding offense (39.0), second rebound margin (+5.5) and first in rebounds allowed per game (33.5).

• *Kentucky probable starters (starting five from last game):* Guard Tyler Ulis (16.7 ppg, 6.9 apg, 1.5 spg), Guard Isaiah Briscoe (9.6 ppg, 5.4 rpg, 3.3 apg, 1.1 spg, 40.3 3FG%), Guard Jamal Murray (19.3 ppg, 4.8 rpg, 2.1 apg), Forward Derek Willis (7.8 ppg, 4.0 rpg, 43.9 3FG%), Forward Marcus Lee (6.7 ppg, 6.1 apg, 1.7 bpg).

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. -- The Alabama men's basketball team fell to Mississippi State, 67-61, in front of a sellout crowd at Coleman Coliseum on Saturday afternoon. Junior forward Shannon Hale finished with a season-high 22 points, but a late run by the Bulldogs helped snap a sixgame losing streak to the Tide in the series.

Playing in front of its fourth home sellout of the season, the crowd was on its feet when Alabama (16-10, 7-7 SEC) cut the Mississippi State lead to one point, 58-57, late in the contest. However, the Bulldogs (12-14, 5-9) went on 9-4 run the rest of the way to seal the win.

Senior guard Retin Obasohan scored 22 points to go along with six rebounds and three steals. It marked his 12th game of scoring 20 or more points and 20th double-figure scoring game of the year. Combined, Obasohan and Hale scored 44 of Alabama's 61 points.

The Bulldogs pulled away with a 15-3 run over 9:19 in the first half to take a 27-18 lead with 3:28 on the clock. Alabama battled back and Obasohan hit a buzzer-beating shot to trim the Bulldogs lead to 32-29.

The second half began with a pair of technical fouls on each team. Mississippi State's Gavin Ware was called for the first one with 17:46 to play. Just 15 seconds later, Alabama head coach Avery Johnson was whistled for his first technical foul of the season. That seemed to ignite the Tide, as it used a 7-0 run to pull within one point at 41-40 with 14:42 remaining.

However, Mississippi State immediately answered with a 6-0 run of their own to stretch its lead back up to seven, 48-41, with 11:02 left.

Trailing 58-51 with 6:05 left, Alabama refused to go away and rallied for six consecutive points late to make it a one point game with 4:27 to play. But the Tide could not get any closer as Mississippi State claimed its first win in Tuscaloosa since Jan. 19, 2008.

Junior forward Jimmie Taylor added eight points and five rebounds, while senior Arthur Edwards pulled down a game-high seven boards. Alabama won the battle of the boards, 36-33, losing for just the second time this year when outrebounding its opponents (12-2).

Quinndary Weatherspoon led the Bulldogs with 15 points, followed by Craig Sword with 13 and Ware with 12. Travis Daniels recorded six rebounds for Mississippi State.

ALABAMA MEN'S BASKETBALL QUICK HITS

TEAM

 Avery Johnson was introduced as Alabama's 20th head men's basketball coach on April 8, 2015. Johnson, who led the San Antonio Spurs to the 1999 NBA title and was named the 2006 NBA Coach of the Year, came to the Capstone after a successful coaching career in the NBA. As an NBA coach for seven-plus season, Johnson owned a record of 254-186 (.577) after spending four-plus seasons with the Dallas Mavericks and two-plus seasons with the Brooklyn Nets. During his time in Dallas, Johnson led the Mavericks to the postseason in each of his three-plus seasons as head coach. He led the Mavericks to a record of 194-70 (.735) and set an NBA record for reaching the 50-win plateau (62 games) and the 150-win plateau (191 games), the fastest of any head coach in league history. In 2005-06, Johnson led the Mavericks to their first appearance in the NBA Finals en route to earning NBA Coach of the Year honors. The San Antonio Spurs retired his No. 6 jersey in 2007.

• Alabama enters Tuesday's game ranked No. 41 in the RPI and boasts the 23rd-toughest schedule in the nation, according to ESPN.com (as of Feb. 22). Alabama is tied for tops in the SEC in RPI top-50 wins (5) and leads the league in victories of Associated Press top-25 ranked teams (4). In addition, the Tide ranks third in the league strength of schedule and fifth in overall RPI.

• Alabama has played six ranked opponents this season and has won four of those games, which leads the SEC. It's the first time since the 2001-02 season that an Alabama team has four victories over AP top-25 teams during the regular season. In addition, Alabama has faced an additional four opponents who were receiving votes to be ranked at the time they played (Dayton, Oregon, at South Carolina and at LSU), making 10 of its 26 opponents this year ranked or receiving votes in the AP top-25 poll at the time the game was played.

• Including this season, Alabama has won 55 games in league play over the past six years. The number ranks third in the league, trailing only Kentucky (78) and Florida (72). UA is one game ahead of Georgia (54), followed by Ole Miss (53) and Tennessee (52).

• Alabama owns a record of 7-0 this season when holding opponents to less than 60 points in a game. Furthermore, the Tide is 12-2 on the year when holding the opposition to less than 70 points in a game.

• As a team, Alabama ranks among the league leaders in defensive stats entering the Kentucky game. The Tide ranks third in the league in three-point field goal percentage defense (.322/64th nationally), fourth in scoring defense (67.1/66th nationally), fifth blocked shots per game (5.1/32nd nationally) and ranks sixth in field goal percentage defense (.401/39th nationally).

• The Tide's defensive effort is even better during Southeastern Conference play. Against league competition only, Alabama leads the SEC in three-point field goal percentage defense (.293), ranks fourth in blocks per game (5.2), fourth in scoring defense (69.0) and fifth field goal percentage defense (.412).

• A key stat for Alabama this season is rebounding. Alabama, which currently ranks 11th out of 14 teams in the SEC in terms of rebounding margin (-2.1), is 10-2 this year when it outrebounds the competition, However, the Tide falls to 6-8 on the year when it is outrebounded by its opponents.

• This year's squad is one of the younger teams in the SEC. Of the 12 available players on the roster (Nick King and Avery Johnson Jr. both must sit out this year due to NCAA transfer rules), seven are either freshmen (4) or sophomores (3).

INDIVIDUAL

• Senior guard Retin Obasohan has twice been named the SEC Player of the Week for the weeks of Feb. 8 and Dec. 14. In doing so, Obasohan became the first Alabama men's basketball player to earn the recognition twice in the same season since Kennedy Winston did so during the 2004-05 campaign.

• Obasohan has been making his case for first team all-conference honors by his play during SEC play. The Antwerp, Belgium native is averaging 19.9 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.5 steals per game, while shooting 49.2 percent from the floor and 37.0 percent from beyond the arc through 14 league games, He enters the Kentucky contest ranking fourth in scoring average, fifth in field goal percentage and tied for sixth in steals per game. Moreover, he has nine games of 20 or more points vs. SEC teams and has scored in double figures in all but one game in conference play.

• Making his first start of the season on Jan. 13 vs. South Carolina, sophomore forward Riley Norris went off for a career-high 27 points and tied a school record with eight made three-pointers en route to a win over No. 19 South Carolina, 73-50. During SEC play, Norris leads the team in rebounds per game (6.3) and three-point field goal percentage (.415) while ranking third in scoring average 9.6 points per game.

• Over his last six games, Justin Coleman has been on fire. Over the stretch, the Birmingham, Ala., native is averaging 10.5 points and 3.0 assists per game, while shooting 42.3 percent from beyond the arc (11-of-26). He enters Tuesday's ranking fifth the SEC and ranks eighth in the nation in free throw percentage (.889), having missed just six free throws the entire season (64-of-72).

• Junior forward Shannon Hale has missed a total of five games this season, including two games recently (at Mississippi State on Feb. 2 and vs. Missouri on Feb. 6). In the last eight games he has seen action, Hale has been a valuable piece for the Tide as the Johnson City, Tenn., native is averaging 12.5 points and 3.6 rebounds per game.

ALABAMA COMPETING IN 103RD SEASON OF BASKETBALL

- Alabama is in its 103rd season of basketball in 2015-16.
- The Tide has an all-time record of 1,616-994-1 (.619), which includes a 763-585 (.567) record in SEC play.
- Alabama ranks second in the SEC in league victories and all-time winning percentage.
- UA has made 32 NCAA (19) or NIT (13) appearances and has won seven SEC regularseason titles and six SEC Tournament championships.

SCOUTING ALABAMA

- Alabama (16-10, 7-7 SEC) had its five-game winning streak snapped with a narrow home loss to Mississippi State last Saturday. With the defeat, the Tide falls to 6-2 over its last eight contests heading into Tuesday night's showdown at league-leaders Kentucky. It marks the second meeting between the Tide and Wildcats this season. Kentucky captured a 77-61 decision over Alabama back on Jan. 9 in Tuscaloosa, Ala.
- Senior guard Retin Obasohan, who averaged 28.5 ppg in two contests last week, including a career-best 35-point performance in the win at LSU on Feb. 17, leads Alabama in scoring (16.9 ppg), steals (1.5) and minutes (32.7 mpg) through the Tide's 26 contests. The Antwerp, Belgium, native currently ranks sixth in the SEC in scoring average and field goal percentage (.467), tied for fifth in steals per game and is seventh in minutes per game entering Tuesday's contest.
- Junior forward Shannon Hale and graduate transfer Arthur Edwards rank second and third on this year's team in scoring average at 11.2 ppg and 9.5 ppg, respectively. Hale, who has missed five games on the season, enters Saturday's contest averaging 12.5 points and 3.6 rebounds a game in the last eight games he has suited up. Meanwhile, Edwards ranks second on the team and eighth in the SEC in three-point field goal percentage at 38.7 percent (55-of-142) for the year. Edwards ranks second on the team in double-figure scoring games with 14, while Hale is third with 13.
- Sophomore Riley Norris has stepped up his play during the SEC season. The Albertville, Ala., native pulled down a career-high 16 rebounds in the win at LSU on Feb. 17 and leads the team in league play in rebounding (6.3 rpg) and three-point field goal percentage (.415), while ranking third in scoring (9.6 ppg).
- As a team, Alabama is outscoring the competition for the season by 0.5 points per game (67.6-67.1). The Tide comes into Tuesday's contest ranked among the top defensive teams in the SEC. Entering the game, Alabama ranks third in the league in three-point field goal percentage defense (.322), fourth in scoring defense (67.1), fifth in blocked shots per game (5.1) and is sixth in field goal percentage defense (.401). Offensively, the Tide is fourth in three-pointers made per game (7.7).

ALABAMA-KENTUCKY - SERIES NOTES

- Tuesday's game will mark the 144th meeting in series history between to two schools, and the second time this season the teams will square off on the hardwood. The Wildcats captured a 77-61 win over Alabama in Tuscaloosa back on Jan. 9.
- The 144 games played against one another stands as UA's sixth-most common opponent in program lore. Kentucky owns a 106-37 edge in the all-time series, including wins in four straight and 11 of the last 13 meetings.
- The Tide is 10-55 all-time against the Wildcats in Lexington and owns a 6-23 mark against UK in Rupp Arena.

- The Bulldogs pulled away with a 15-3 run over 9:19 in the first half to take a 27-18 lead with 3:28 on the clock. Alabama battled back and Obasohan hit a buzzer-beating shot to trim the Bulldogs lead to 32-29.
- The second half began with a pair of technical fouls on each team. Mississippi State's Gavin Ware was called for the first one with 17:46 to play. Just 15 seconds later, Alabama head coach Avery Johnson was whistled for his first technical foul of the season. That seemed to ignite the Tide, as it used a 7-0 run to pull within one point at 41-40 with 14:42 remaining.
- However, Mississippi State immediately answered with a 6-0 run of their own to stretch its lead back up to seven, 48-41, with 11:02 left.
- Trailing 58-51 with 6:05 left, Alabama refused to go away and rallied for six consecutive points late to make it a one point game with 4:27 to play. But the Tide could not get any closer as Mississippi State claimed its first win in Tuscaloosa since Jan. 19, 2008.
- COACH AVERY JOHNSON'S THOUGHTS: "They just did a great job. We found out that (Mississippi State guard) Malik Newman was going to be scratched with some sort of injury before the game, and I don't know if that made us relax a little bit more. I thought that we didn't have our best game and Mississippi State had a lot to do with that. We weren't as sharp as we have been on both ends of the floor. We weren't as consistent as we've been in certain situations. But let's tip our hats to Mississippi State. It is not always about necessarily what we did wrong, even though we had some malfunctions, but they had a lot of energy. We didn't have the type of energy that we normally have in games recently. '

ALABAMA-MISSISSIPPI STATE: AN INSIDE LOOK AT THE NUMBERS

- What Lost The Game For UA: Alabama hit just 11-of-21 shots from the charity stripe in the contest. The 52.4 percent shooting from the foul line in the contest marked the third-lowest percentage by the Tide in a game this season.
- The Difference Maker: Retin Obasohan and Shannon Hale combined for 44 of the team's 61 points on the night, with each scoring 22 points. However, the duo did not have much support from their teammates. Obasohan (8) and Hale (7) combined for 15 of the team's 22 made field goals. They went 15-of-33 (.455) from the field, while the rest of the team combined to go 7-of-19 (.368).
- The Wow Stat: Both Mississippi State and Alabama had 11 turnovers in the contest. However, the Bulldogs had a big 19-9 advantage in points off turnovers. The Tide moves to 8-9 on the season when the competition has the same or more points off turnovers in a game. When Alabama outscores its opponents in the category, it is 8-1 this season.

SEC TURNAROUND

- Alabama started league play winning just once in its first six SEC contests. However, the Tide has turned things around by winning six of its last eight entering Tuesday's contest at Kentucky.
- The Tide had its five-game winning streak in league play snapped last Saturday by Mississippi State. It was the longest win streak in SEC play for Alabama since the 2010-11 season.
- Despite the loss, Alabama has now captured three-consecutive SEC road wins for the first time since the 2004-05 campaign.
- The difference has been made on the defensive end of the floor. Over the last eight games, the Tide has been holding the opposition to nearly points per game less a game, while the opponents' field goal percentage and three-point field goal percentage have also dropped drastically.

TOPPLING THE TOP 25

- With the 63-62 win over No. 15/13 Texas A&M on Feb. 10, Alabama picked up with SEC-leading fourth win over top-25 opponents this season. It marked the first time since the 2001-02 season that the Tide has secured four top-25 wins during the regular season.
- It is the highest ranked team the Tide has toppled since defeating then-No. 12 Kentucky, 68-66, back on Jan. 18, 2011.
- Other ranked teams Alabama has defeated include then-No. 21 Wichita State (64-60) on Nov. 27 followed by a 74-73 victory over then-No. 17 Notre Dame on Nov. 29. The Tide also defeated then-No. 19 South Carolina, 73-50, on Jan. 13.
- Alabama's first two victories over ranked teams against Wichita State and Notre Dame came in back-toback contests. It marked the first time Alabama had won consecutive games against ranked opponents since they defeated then-No. 12 Florida on Feb. 26, 2006, after downing then-No.8 Tennessee on Feb. 18.
- The victory over Wichita State snapped a 21-game losing streak to ranked opponents dating back to Jan. 18, 2011, when Alabama beat then-No. 12 Kentucky at home (68-66). It also marked the first win over a ranked opponent at a neutral site since Nov. 29, 2009, when the Tide beat then-No. 15 Michigan.
- In all, Alabama has played 10 games in which its opponent has either been ranked or receiving votes to be ranked in its 25 games this season. The Tide enters Saturday's game vs. Mississippi State with the nation's No. 12-rated strength of schedule according to ESPN.com (as of Feb. 19).

RETIN'S RISING

- Retin Obasohan has recorded 12 20-point games and has 20 double-figure scoring contest this season. Moreover, he has reached the 20-point mark in seven of the last 10 Alabama games.
- The highlight over the stretch was Obasohan going for a career-high 35 points at LSU on Feb. 17. The senior guard connected on 11-of-18 shots from the floor and hit 11-of-11 foul shots against the Tigers.
- Obasohan currently leads the team in scoring (16.9 ppg), steals (38), minutes (32.7), field goals made (149) and attempted (319) and free throws made (105) and attempted (150), while ranking second in assists (2.8 apg).
- Obasohan has only gotten better in league play. During the SEC season, Obasohan is averaging 19.9 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 3.4 apg and 1.5 spg, while shooting 49.2 percent from the field and 37.0 percent from beyond the arc.
- In fact, the longer the season goes, the better Obasohan's numbers have gotten. Below is a breakdown of Obasohan's first six contests this season in comparison with his last 20 games, last 15 games, last 10 games, last three games

- With the nod, Obasohan becomes the third different Alabama player to earn first team academic alldistrict first team honors, joining Terrance Meade (2003) and Levi Randolph (2013, 2014, 2015).
- Obasohan is now eligible to become the second player in men's basketball program history to earn Academic All-American accolades (Levi Randolph achieved the feat in 2015). The Academic All-America team will be announced in late February.
- · A native of Antwerp, Belgium, Obasohan earned his undergraduate degree in finance last May, graduating with a 3.30 grade point average. He is currently pursuing a master's in marketing in which he has a perfect 4.0 GPA through two semesters.
- On the court, the 6-2, 210-pound guard has been equally impressive. Coming into Saturday's game at Florida, Obasohan, who is this year's co-captain, currently leads Alabama in points (16.0 ppg), steals (1.5 spg), shots made (124) and attempted (267), and free throws made (87) and attempted (125). Furthermore, Obasohan leads the Tide with 17 double-figure scoring games and 10 games of scoring 20 or more points.
- Obasohan, who speaks four languages English, Dutch, French and Nigerian and leads the Tide's efforts in the community as a two-time SEC Community Service award honoree.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- · Coming into Tuesday's contest, Alabama owns an RPI of No. 42 in the nation with a No. 23 overall strength of schedule, according to ESPN.com (through games of Feb. 21). The Tide ranks fifth in the SEC in terms of RPI and is third in the league in strength of schedule. Alabama is one of eight teams in the league to boast of a top-80 RPI.
- Ten of the Tide's 26 contests on the season have been played against teams either ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 or receiving votes at the time the game was played. The Tide has faced six top-25 teams (then-No. 23 Xavier, then-20 Wichita State, then-No. 17 Notre Dame and then-No. 9 Kentucky, then-No. 19 South Carolina and then-No. 15 Texas A&M) and an additional four teams (Dayton, Oregon, at South Carolina and at LSU) who were receiving votes to be ranked at the time of the game.

LAST TIME OUT: KENTUCKY 77, ALABAMA 61 - JAN. 9, 2016 (TUSCALOOSA, ALA.)

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - Alabamasuffered its first true home loss of the season Saturday, dropping a 77-61 decision against then-No. 9/8 Kentucky on Jan. 9 in Coleman Coliseum in front of a sellout crowd.

Kentucky shot 68 percent over the second half any attempt at an Alabama comeback. The Tide closed to within four points early in the second period, but the Tide made two of its last 11 shot attempts as the Wildcats pulled away.

"it was a tough night for us tonight," head coach Avery Johnson said. "We got off to another slow start. They kind of dominated us on the boards early and set the tone in terms of the rebounding throughout the course of the game. We couldn't get [Alex] Poythress under control. He had a terrific game. [Jamal] Murray made some shots. We did a good job of defending the threepoint line tonight, but our interior defense just wasn't there and then offensively we're still a work in progress in terms of trying to become a balanced team."

UK led by as many as 16 points in the first half, but the Tide finished on a 6-0 run and headed to the locker room down 38-28. Alabama stayed hot out of the break to extend the run to 14-4 and make the score 42-36 with 16:43 to play. Alabama was able to cut the lead down four points, 46-42, after a follow-up dunk by Jimmie Taylor, but Kentucky began a 12-2 run that lasted just over five minutes and put the game out of reach.

Alabama sunk seven three-pointers and blocked seven shots for the second game in a row. The Tide was 18-of-27 from the free throw line, but lost the rebounding battle 43-25. Kentucky also outscored Alabama 34-20 in the paint.

Senior Retin Obasohan finished with 21 points to mark his third straight game with more than 20 points. It was also the fifth 20-point game on the season for Obasohan, who hit 3-of-4 three pointers. Senior guard Arthur Edwards scored 11, while sophomore Riley Norris added 10. Junior Jimmie Taylor and freshman Donta Hall each led the Tide with six rebounds and Taylor blocked a gamehigh four shots.

Alex Poythress scored a game-high 25 points for Kentucky, while Jamal Murray put up 21. Marcus Lee led the Wildcats with a game-high 11 rebounds.

- Dating back to the 2009-10 season, Alabama owns a record of 95-25 (.792) on the Coleman Coliseum floor, including a 9-3 mark this season. During the 2013-14 season, the Tide finished with a 13-4 mark at home and outscored teams by an average of 9.5 points a game (73.4-63.8). In 2014-15, Alabama finished with a 14-5 record in home games and outscored the competition by 7.2 points per game (67.3-60.1).
- Since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, the Tide has won 84 of the last 103 games played under the arched roof of Coleman Coliseum (84-19; .816).
- Overall, Alabama owns a record of 553-128 (.813) in the facility's 48th season of use.
- Alabama finished the non-conference portion of its schedule at 5-0 to extend non-conference win streak • to 15 straight games at Coleman Coliseum. The last home loss in the non-conference regular season came when the Tide dropped a 77-74 decision to Xavier on Dec. 21, 2013.

• Since 2009, Alabama owns a home record of 42-16 (.724) against SEC competition. Since 2011, the Tide boasts a 37-12 (.755) mark at home against the conference.

RECORD IN CLOSE GAMES

- Seventeen of Alabama's 26 contests this season have been decided by fewer than 10 points. In all, Alabama owns a record of 11-6 in such games this season.
- Entering this season, Alabama owned a combined 13-22 (.371) record in games that were decided by less than 10 points over the last two years. Last season, the Tide went 8-10 in such contests, which was an improvement from going 5-12 in such games during the 2013-14 campaign.
- For the year, the Crimson Tide is 5-1 in one possession games, which is something that has not come easy for Alabama teams in the past two years. Alabama has combined for a record of 5-9 (.357) in one possession games over the last two years (3-5 in 2014-15 and 2-4 in 2015-16).

TIDE'S TRENDS

- There there have been a few noticeable trends when it comes to the 2015-16 Alabama men's basketball team.
- One of the biggest trends to keep in eye during a game is the field goal percentages throughout a game. The Tide owns a record of 11-3 when holding its foes to less than 40 percent shooting in a game. In addition, Alabama is 12-2 when holding the opposition to 70 points or less in a game.

AVERY JOHNSON EMBARKS IN FIRST YEAR AS ALABAMA HEAD COACH

- Avery Johnson was introduced as Alabama's 20th head men's basketball coach on April 8, 2015. Johnson, who led the San Antonio Spurs to the 1999 NBA title and was named the 2006 NBA Coach of the Year, comes to the Capstone after a successful coaching career in the NBA.
- Johnson boasted a 254-186 (.577) career coaching record after spending seven-plus seasons as a head coach in the NBA (Dallas Mavericks and Brooklyn Nets).

2016 SIGNEES

Alabama head men's basketball coach Avery Johnson officially welcomed forward Braxton Key (Nashville, Tenn./Oak Hill Academy) and junior guard Ar'Mond Davis (Tacoma, Wash./College of Southern Idaho), who each signed a National Letter of Intent to be a part of the men's basketball program at the Capstone.

Braxton Key | F | 6-8 | 240 Nashville, Tenn. | Oak Hill Academy

Braxton Key is highly-touted signee who hails from Nashville, Tenn. The 6-8, 240-pound small forward is a consensus four-star recruit, who is rated as the No. 66 overall player in the nation and the No. 13 small forward, according to ESPN.com. Key (formerly known as Braxton Blackwell) currently plays at the famed Oak Hill Academy under head coach Steve Smith, but spent most of his prep career playing for Drew Maddox at Christ Presbyterian Academy. He was a two-time Class AA Mr. Basketball in the state of Tennessee, averaging 20.7 points, 10.5 rebounds and 4.9 assists in leading Christ Presbyterian Academy to a state title in 2014-15. As a sophomore, Key averaged 19.6 points, 11.2 rebounds and 3.6 assists, while shooting 67 percent from the floor and 41 percent from deep.

Ar'Mond Davis | G | 6-6 | 180 Tacoma, Wash. | Southern Idaho CC

Ar'Mond Davis is considered one of the top junior col lege prospects in the nation. The Tacoma, Wash., native is rated as a four-star prospect and ranked No. 6 overall junior college player in the nation by 247Sports.com. He currently plays at the College of Southern Idaho under head coach Jared Phay. As a freshman, Davis was second on the team with 10.9 points and 3.9 rebounds per game, helping his team to a 31-3 record. Through the early part of his sophomore year, the 6-6, 180-pound shooting guard is averaging 14.3 points, 5.6 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game while shooting 48 percent from the field. Davis was invited to attend the All-American JUCO Showcase Elite 80 West in Las Vegas, an event where Davis was one of the top prospects. Davis played his high school ball under Mike Cocke at Foss High School in Tacoma, Wash. As a senior, he averaged 26.3 points per game.





Alabama had three players in double digits to help push the Crimson Tide past the Kennesaw State Owls, 77-64, in front 14,970 fans inside Coleman Coliseum. The win was the first of head coach Avery Johnson's collegiate coaching career.

The 14,970 fans at the game was the largest crowd at a home opener since a crowd of 15,043 fans were in attendance against North Carolina in the 1989 season opener.

Alabama, which led wire to wire, held the Owls to just one point over the first 6:45 to build a 12-1 lead. With 17:48 left in the first half, the Tide went on a 19-4 run over 6:50, leading 21-5. The Tide took an 11-point lead to the locker room at halftime, up 43-32.

The second half began with a long scoring drought from KSU which went 0-of-4 and had three turnovers across 3:45. Alabama was bale to build its largest lead of the game, 52-35.

Kennesaw State responded midway through the half with an eight-point run of its own to close the gap to trail just 56-49, but that's as close as it would come.

Senior Retin Obasohan led Alabama with 18 points, while Dazon Ingram added 16 in his first career start. Shannon Hale scored 13. Taylor's 10 rebounds led the Tide. Alabama outscored the Owls 25-8 in points off of turnovers and had a 48-12 advantage in points in the paint.

Alabama fell its 2015-16 road opener, 80-48, against the Dayton Flyers at UD Arena.

It was a back-and-forth game early on, as the Tide's junior forward Jimmie Taylor opened the scoring on a put back off of an offensive rebound.

Sophomore forward Riley Norris gave the Tide the lead at 18-16 with 10 minutes left, however, it was all Dayton from that point on. The Flyers began with 1 10-0 run and would eventually stretch to a 24-6 run over the final 10 minutes to open up a 40-24 lead going into the locker room.

Dayton was a perfect 9-for-9 from the foul line in the half and shot 41 percent (13-of-32) from field, draining five from beyond the arc. Meanwhile, the Tide committed 10 turnovers and shot just 30 percent (9-of-30) from the floor.

Alabama could not gain any traction in the second half, making only eight field goals while turning the ball over 10 more times.

For the game, the Flyers made 46.7 percent (28-60) of their shots, which included 9-of-21 from behind the arc. Dayton also hauled in 47 rebounds. The Tide was 29.8 percent (17-57) overall and recorded 34 rebounds.

The loss was the largest margin of defeat since a 105-71 setback against Ole Miss on March 3, 2001.

Alabama used 15 three-point baskets and six double-figure scoring efforts to earn the 105-93 victory over Louisiana.

The 100-plus points marked the first time the Crimson Tide has finished in triple-figures since Nov. 18, 2013, against Stillman College, and was the first time against a Division I foe since Dec. 27, 2005, when the Tide took down Jackson State, 101-66. The last time Alabama scored 105 points was 10 years ago to the day against Alabama State on Nov. 20, 2005. Moreover, the Tide's 15 threepointers were the most an Alabama team has collected since they hit a school record 19 against East Tennessee State on Dec. 1, 2004.

The Tide made its first seven three-point attempts and used an 18-4 run midway through the first half to take a 29-14 lead.

The Tide led 55-39 at halftime and continued to control the game in the second half, while shooting 54 percent from the field. Alabama finished the game shooting 60 percent from threepoint range and 74 percent from the free throw line.

Riley Norris, Shannon Hale and Justin Coleman each had 18 points to lead the team. Coleman's added eight assists (one turnover), while Dazon Ingram added 10 points, a team-high seven rebounds and five assists. Retin Obasohan had 17 points, while Arthur Edwards added 12.

Alabama fell to No. 23 Xavier, 64-45, in the opening round of the AdvoCare Classic on Thanksgiving Day.

The Tide got out to a strong start over the first five minutes, taking a 9-2 lead and holding Xavier to 0-of-5 shooting. Alabama also outrebounded the Musketeers 9-3 during the stretch. Alabama upset No. 20 Wichita State, 64-60, in the second round of the 2015 AdvoCare Invitational

The win snapped a 21-game losing streak to ranked opponents and was the first win over a ranked opponent at a neutral site since Nov. 29, 2009, when the Tide beat then-No. 15 Michigan.

The game saw eight ties and nine lead changes, and was not decided until the final 10 seconds.

Alabama started off well when it took an early lead, as the Shockers failed to score for four minutes beginning at the 18:49 mark. The Tide finished the half strong by going on a 14-6 run over the last 3:41 to take a 32-30 lead at intermission.

Wichita State put together an 11-5 run to start the second half and took a 41-39 lead at the 16:13 mark. Alabama had three turnovers in 90 seconds during the run. The Tide then went 1-of-7 shooting over the next six minutes to fall behind 48-45. That would be the largest lead by Wichita State, as Alabama responded with a 9-1 run to grab a 52-49 lead. However, the Shockers answered with back-to-back threes for a 55-52 lead at the nine-minute mark.

The Tide would again respond, this time with back-to-back threes from Shannon Hale and Riley Norris to retake the lead, 58-55, and never trailed again.

Hale finished with 20 points on 6-of-10 shooting and 6-of-7 from the free throw line. Norris added 12 and Ingram scored 11. Ingram was the Tide's leading rebounder with eight boards, while Arthur Edwards added five. The Tide finished shooting a season-best 76 percent at the free throw line.

The Alabama men's basketball team earned its second upset over a top-25 team in three days, taking down No.17 Notre Dame, 74-73, on Nov. 29 at the AdvoCare Invitational in Orlando, Fla.

Senior guard Retin Obasohan finished with a game-high 19 points, and converted a last-second layup to secure the victory., while junior Shannon Hale also had 19. Graduate transfer Arthur Edwards finished with a career-high 15 points and junior forward Michael Kessens led the team with nine rebounds to go along with eight points off the bench.

Alabama set the tone early as Edwards' sparked an 18-3 run over 5:20 of the first half, including a 13-0 stretch as the Tide took a 21-8 lead. Notre Dame answered with a 7-0 run of its own and managed to close the gap to 43-39 at intermission

The Irish started hot in the second half, using a 10-2 run to take a 49-45 lead with 17:18 to play. From that point on the teams were never separated by more than three points in a game that featured eight ties and nine lead changes.

Notre Dame held a one-point lead, up 73-72, with 28.6 seconds left in the game when forward Zach Auguste, who finished with 16 points, had a chance to pad the Irish's lead at the free throw line. However, he missed both free throw attempts and Alabama called a timeout with 23.5 seconds to play.

The Tide couldn't get anything going out of the timeout, so head coach Avery Johnson called another with 12.6 seconds to play, setting up Obasohan's heroics

The Alabama men's basketball won its third consecutive game, defeating Southern Miss for its first true road win, 58-55. The Tide used a big 19-4 second half run to hold off the Golden Eagles.

Retin Obasohan led the Tide with a seasonhigh 20 points to go along with five rebounds and three steals.. Arthur Edwards set a career high for the second consecutive game, tallying 17 while going 5-of-8 from behind the arc, to go along with five boards. Shannon Hale finished with nine points but struggled offensively, hitting just 3-of-10 shots from the floor on the night.

Trailing by five points, 39-34, at the 15:29 mark of the second half, the Tide used a 19-4 run over the next 8:03 to build a ten-point lead at 53-43 with 7:09 to play. That run included a 12-0 stretch when Southern Miss failed to score for eight minutes while shooting 0-of-9.

Alabama struggled to put the game away, going on a scoring drought of its own. The Tide failed to score for nearly four minutes after taking a 10-point lead and Southern Miss cut the lead down to three in the final seconds. Dazon Ingram had a chance to seal the win, but missed both his free throws. Southern Miss came down and took two three-pointers, but both were off the mark and Alabama walked away with the three-point win.

Southern Miss outscored the Tide 16-10 over the final 10 minutes of the first half. It looked like Alabama would take a 29-27 lead into the locker room, but USM's Khari Price hit a buzzer-beating shot over three quarters of the court to give the Eagles a 30-29 halftime lead - their first halftime lead this season.

The two teams combined to make 22 threepoint baskets with each shooting 11-of-29.

Alabama won its third straight one-possession game, defeating Clemson on the road, 51-50. The victory also marked the Tide's fourth consecutive win away from home.

The Tide finished with a season high 44 rebounds, including 21 on the offensive glass, while senior Retin Obasohan set a career-high with 23 points. His previous career high came against Charleston Southern on Dec. 14, 2013.

The Tide trailed 50-49 with under a minute to play when Shannon Hale stole a pass and took it to the rim for what would be the game-winning dunk. Clemson ran the clock down to just under five seconds before shooting for the win. Avry Holmes' shot fell short and Jaron Blossomgame's put back was no good as the ball went out of bounds, giving the Tide possession with three seconds remaining.

Alabama started the first half well, making its first four three-point shots to take a 16-7 lead on the back of a 13-2 run over a 2:43 stretch. Clemson answered with a 6-0 run to cut the Tide's lead to 19-13. Midway through the half, Alabama went on an 11-2 run over four and half minutes to take a 30-19 lead - it's largest of the game - with 5:36 on the clock.

Clemson slowly chipped away at the deficit for the entire second half and pulled to within four, down 45-41, with 10 minutes to play. From that point on the Tide made just one of its 13 field goal attempts, until Hale's heroics.

Alabama, without leading rebounder Dazon Ingram (5.9 rpg), grabbed 44 boards to Clemson's 30, and is now 2-0 when outrebounding their opponent. Justin Coleman, who started in place of Ingram, finished with a career-best five rebounds.

Arthur Edwards sank a three-point shot with six seconds left to pull within two, but the Tide was forced to foul, sending Oregon back to the line to secure the four-point victory.

The Tide started hot, shooting 63 percent from beyond the arc in the first half. Coleman scored 12 unanswered points by himself to give Alabama a 17-8 lead with 11:14 left in the first half. With 10:28 left before the break, Alabama used a 15-6 run to take a 32-20 lead, it's largest of the game. The Tide would take a 38-26 lead into the locker room

Oregon came out of the break strong, using a 21-6 run to take a 47-44 lead with 13:53 to play. Neither team took more than a six-point lead for the rest of the game. Coleman tied the game at 60 with back-to-back three-pointers with 5:42 left in the game. Norris would later tie it 65-65 with 2:22 to play but the Tide never regained the lead.

The Ducks forced 14 turnovers for 22 points and stole the ball nine times. Alabama lost the rebounding battle 35-30.

Coleman led the Tide in scoring while making a career-high seven field goals and matching his high with six free throws. Norris and Edwards each finished with 12 points. Jimmie Taylor and Norris led the team with five rebounds each.

Alabama' won in overtime against Jacksonville State, 67-59. The Tide, which held a doublefigure lead in the second half, used a 10-0 run in overtime to take control of the game.

Arthur Edwards led Alabama with 16 points to go along with five rebounds and three assists, while Riley Norris scored 10 points and grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds for his second career double-double. Jimmie Taylor added 13 points and six rebounds while blocking a season-high five shots.

After starting the second half 6-of-10 from the field and take a 46-33 lead with 11:13 remaining in regulation, Alabama went cold, missing its final 11 attempts and allowing the Gamecocks to pull back to a 55-55 tie. The Tide had a chance to win in the final seconds, but senior guard Retin Obasohan missed both potential game-winning free throw chances with 2.3 seconds left on the clock.

After allowing an early bucket in overtime, Alabama scored 10 unanswered points while going a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line after making just 20-of-35 in regulation. The Gamecocks would not score again until there were 29 seconds remaining.

The first half featured seven lead changes and two ties before Jacksonville State took a 29-27 lead to the locker room. Alabama shot 43 percent and was outrebounded 20-13. The Tide staved in the game by forcing eight Gamecock turnovers in the first frame alone.

Alabama started the second half with a 19-4 run over the first 8.47 to take a 46-33 lead, its largest of the game, and seemed on its way to a victory. However, the Gamecocks immediately answered with a 13-3 run of their own to trim the lead to 49-46 with 2:14 left to play. Jacksonville State continued to claw its way back with a pair of threes in the final minute to tie the game at 55-55.

Alabama started the new year with a 68-49 win over Norfolk State at Coleman Coliseum in its final non-conference game of the regular season. The Crimson Tide held the Spartans to just 25 percent shooting over the second half to take control of the game.

Retin Obasohan matched his career high, going for a game-high 23 points on 9-of-12 shooting from the floor and 3-of-6 from beyond the arc. The Antwerp, Belgium, native had a season-high four steals as he recorded third 20-point game of the season. Arthur Edwards matched his career high with five three-point baskets to add 15 points, while Riley Norris came off the bench to record 10 points and eight boards.

Alabama put together an 8-0 run early in the game to take a 14-8 lead with 12:18 remaining before the break. Just over a minute later Alabama started a 16-3 run that would last seven-plus minutes and push the score to 64-38. The Tide cruised from there, capturing its 15th consecutive non-conference home victory at Coleman Coliseum.

The Tide's defense stepped up after the break. Obasohan recorded all four of his steals in the second half and the team forced eight turnovers overall. The game marks the first time the Tide has held a team to under 50 points since Feb. 4, 2015, when Alabama defeated Missouri 62-49.

Alabama began conference play with a loss at Ole Miss (11-3, 1-1 SEC). The Crimson Tide controlled the first half but let the game get away in the second thanks to being outscored 42-26 after the break.

The Rebels, opening their new facility The Pavilion, took an early 25-15 lead on the back of a 7-0 run and 6-of-8 free throw shooting. Alabama (9-4, 0-1 SEC) responded with a 25-7 run over the last 8:36 of the first half to take a 40-32 lead. Senior guard Retin Obasohan and graduate transfer Arthur Edwards each scored 14 points in the opening frame. The Tide defense held Ole Miss to just 33 percent shooting and recorded five steals.

Alabama came out cold in the second half and allowed the Rebels to tie the game at 44 with a 12-4 run over the first six minutes. Ole Miss would spark an 11-0 run a few minutes later to take a 59-52 advantage with 6:55 to play. Alabama suffered its first true home loss of the season, dropping a 77-61 decision against No. 9/8 Kentucky.

Kentucky shot 68 percent over the second half any attempt at an Alabama comeback. The Tide closed to within four points early in the second period, but the Tide made two of its last 11 shot attempts as the Wildcats pulled away.

The game was played in front of a sellout crowd of 15,383 fans - the Tide's first packed house of the year.

UK led by as many as 16 points in the first half, but the Tide finished on a 6-0 run and headed to the locker room down 38-28. Alabama stayed hot out of the break to extend the run to 14-4 and make the score 42-36 with 16:43 to play. Alabama was able to cut the lead down four points, 46-42, after a follow-up dunk by Jimmie Taylor, but Kentucky began a 12-2 run that lasted just over five minutes and put the game out of reach.

Alabama sunk seven three-pointers and blocked seven shots for the second game in a row. The Tide was 18-of-27 from the free throw line, but lost the rebounding battle 43-25. Kentucky also outscored Alabama 34-20 in the paint.

Senior Retin Obasohan finished with 21 points to mark his third straight game with more than 20 points. It was also the fifth 20-point game on the season for Obasohan, who hit 3-of-4 three pointers. Senior guard Arthur Edwards scored 11, while sophomore Riley Norris added 10. Junior Jimmie Taylor and freshman Donta Hall each led the Tide with six rebounds and Taylor blocked a game-high four shots.

NO. 19 SOUTH CAROLINA Alabama

Riley Norris scored a career-high 27 points and tied a school record with eight three-pointers to lead the Alabama past No. 19/15 South Carolina, 73-50, in Coleman Coliseum. The Tide handed the previously undefeated Gamecocks their first loss of the year as Crimson Tide captured its third victory over a top-25 team this season.

Making his first start this year, Norris hit 8-of-11 treys on the night. He became the sixth different player in program history to reach the milestone and the first since Mykal Riley accomplished the feat on March 16, 2008.

Furthermore, in addition to Johnson securing his first Southeastern Conference win on Wednesday night, the Tide also captured its first home win over a ranked team since defeating then-No. 12 Kentucky, 68-66, on Jan. 18, 2011.

Alabama got off to a hot start with a 19-4 run over the first 8:21 that saw Norris sink four three-pointers on his way to 18 first half points. The Albertville, Ala., native hit all five of his threepointers in the opening stanza to help the Tide take a 35-22 lead to the locker room.

South Carolina would fail to score over the first eight minutes of the second half, as Alabama used a 13-0 run to build a 26-point lead at 48-22 with 14:07 left. Alabama would take its largest lead of the game moments late on a Norris three-pointer to put them up by 27.

Alabama made 13 three-pointers and won the rebounding battle 38-30 to improve to 5-0 this season when outrebounding the opposition.

In addition to his scoring output, Norris led the team with seven rebounds to go along hitting 9-of-16 shots from the field. Justin Coleman scored 14 points, five rebounds and had a game-high six assists, while Shannon Hale added eight points off the bench.

Alabama dropped the game at Vanderbilt, 71-63. The Tide connected on just 7-of-20 free throws (32 percent) and 6-of-20 (32 percent) from beyond the arc en route to its 12th loss in its last 13 contests at Memorial Gymnasium.

Alabama kept the game close through the first half. After falling behind early, the Tide used a 6-0 run to tie the game at 14-14 with 9:45 on the clock. Vanderbilt answered with an 8-0 run of its own to take a 23-16 lead. However, Alabama responded with another 6-0 run to pull within one point at the 4:54 mark. The teams were never separated by more than three points again in the first half.

Junior forward Shannon Hale scored 11 of his team-leading 13 points in the first half. Alabama outscored the Commodores 24-6 in the paint, recorded three blocks, and led the rebounding battle 17-14 at halftime.

Vanderbilt began the second half on a 10-1 run to take an 11-point lead, 43-32, with 15:02 left in the game. The Tide trailed by as many as 16 points, 63-47 with 3:02 left, before a late rally trimmed the lead to single digits in the final seconds.

Vanderbilt had a big advantage at the free throw line, hitting 22-of-36 from the charity stripe compared to 7-of-20 free throws made for Alabama. The Tide won the battle of the boards, 39-29, marking the first time it has lost a game when outrebounding the competition (5-1).

Hale's 13 points led the Tide's offense, while Arthur Edwards (12) and Retin Obasohan (10) also finished in double figures. Jimmie Taylor finished with eight points and team highs of nine rebounds and three blocked shots.

ALABAMA AUBURN

Alabama fell to Auburn, 83-77, in front of a sold out crowd at Auburn Arena. Senior guard Retin Obasohan recorded his team-leading sixth 20-point game of the season, going for a careerhigh 27 points in the losing effort.

The Crimson Tide had three starters foul out of the contest in Jimmie Taylor, Michael Kessens and Arthur Edwards. Both Alabama (29) and Auburn (24) were whistled for a combined 53 fouls resulting in 40 free throw attempts by the Tigers and 28 for the Tide. Auburn finished the game outscoring Alabama by nine points at the free throw line (28-19).

Auburn was able to take the lead for good thanks to a 6-0 run over 1:11 to take a 58-51 lead with 13:39 left . Alabama was able to cut the lead to two points, but could not get any closer. In all, the game featured nine lead changes and six ties and neither team led by more than seven points in the second half.

The Tide started the game off well. After going down 10-2 in the early minutes, Alabama used a 22-4 run over a span of 8:24 to take a 24-14 lead - the largest lead of the game for either team. Auburn quickly answered with eight consecutive points, all on free throws, on its way to an 11-0 spurt that would see the Tigers regain the lead. The teams were separated by just three points at halftime, with the Tide trailing 40-37.

Obasohan, who has reached the 20-point mark in six of his last 11 games, was joined in double figures by junior forward Shannon Hale, who finished with 13 points off the bench. Junior Jimmie Taylor recorded a team-leading eight rebounds to go along with eight points before fouling out with just under five minutes to play. Sophomore guard Justin Coleman added nine points and a team-high five assists.

Alabama lost in the final seconds to LSU, 72-70, in front of a sold out crowd at Coleman Coliseum. Senior guard Retin Obasohan finished 20 points, but his final layup to tie the game came up short.

With the scored tied at 70, Tim Quarterman made a put-back layup to give LSU a two-point lead with 33.7 seconds on the clock. Obasohan missed his first attempt at a game-tying layup, but created a tie-up with the LSU defenders to force a jump ball and keep the ball from alternating possession with 17.1 seconds left. After a timeout, Obasohan had a second chance to send the game to overtime, but his shot missed and the Tigers secured the rebound.

Obasohan added five rebounds and a teamleading four assists to his 20-point total. It was his team-leading seventh 20-point performance on the season. Edwards matched his career high with 17 points, while Norris finished with his third career double-double, recording 10 points and a team-leading 10 rebounds.

Alabama finished the first half on a 22-9 run over the last eight-plus minutes to take a 41-36 lead to the locker room. Arthur Edwards scored seven points over the run and finished the half with 14

Midway through the second half, the Tide took a 60-54 lead, its largest of the contest. The Tigers immediately answered with a 6-0 run to tie the game, and the teams were never separated by more than three points again. The game featured six ties and 11 lead changes. Alabama dropped its first one possession game this season (3-1) and is now 4-2 in games decided by four points or less.

The loss snaps Alabama's 10-game home winning streak against LSU, which dated back to a 60-54 defeat to the Tigers on Jan. 31, 2004.

Retin Obasohan finished with a game-high 22 points, while Shannon Hale added a season-high 20 points en route to the victory.

The Tide got off to a rough start, scoring just four points in the first 10 minutes of the game, which allowed the Volunteers to take a 16-4 lead. However, Alabama ended the half on a 14-6 run to pull within one point at the break, 25-24. The Tide overcame a first half that featured 11 turnovers and just 18 percent shooting from beyond the arc.

Alabama immediately scored out of the break, but Tennessee used a 21-5 run over the next 4:52 to take a commanding 48-33 lead with 13:54 remaining in the contest. But the tide turned as Hale scored 10 straight points for a 10-0 Alabama run to pull Alabama within five points. After a Tennessee timeout, the momentum continued when Obasohan scored consecutive buckets, the last coming in the form of an electric dunk that sent the 11,429 fans into a frenzy. The 14-0 run pulled Alabama within one point, 48-47.

After the Tide had a couple of chances to take the lead, Tennessee, which was 0-of-12 from the field during the run, answered with a 7-0 push of its own to take a 55-47 lead with 4:16 left.

But the Tide showed resiliency as it finished the game on 16-2 run to result in the final score. Graduate senior Arthur Edwards gave his team the lead for good on a three-pointer with 38 seconds remaining. The Alabama defense then held, and Obasohan finished the game with an and-1, converting a layup and the ensuing free throw.

Riley Norris finished with a career-high 13 rebounds and three steals to go along with six points.

Alabama got into foul trouble early at South Carolina and lost on the road, 78-64, in front of a sold out crowd at Colonial Life Arena. Retin Obasohan, who was one of four Crimson Tide players to foul out of the contest, finished with a game-high 23 points in the losing effort.

Alabama struggled early, shooting just 25 percent from the field and 23 percent from deep in the first half. The Tide did briefly take the lead at 20-19, but South Carolina finished the half on a 16-6 run over the last 8:32. At the half, the Tide trailed, 35-26, and had turned the ball over nine times

Out of the break, the Tide pulled within five points (45-40), but the Gamecocks used a 9-2 run to open up a 12-point lead. Another Gamecocks run pushed the score to 60-45 with 8:53 to play.

The Tide never surrendered as Obasohan sparked a 16-7 Alabama run, while scoring 14 straight points for the Tide along the way. The run pulled Alabama to within six points, trailing 67-61 with 4:23 to play.

However, South Carolina's Michael Carrera hit a three pointer which began a 7-0 run to take a 74-61 lead and seal their victory.

The Tide was outscored from the charity stripe 28-18 as the Gamecocks took advantage of 46 free throw attempts, compared to 25 for Alabama. The Gamecocks outscored the Tide 14-4 in points off turnovers and won the rebounding battle 50-41.

In addition to Obasohan's team-leading ninth game of 20 or more points, Shannon Hale added 16 and Riley Norris had 11. Obasohan also added team highs of six rebounds, four assists and three steals.

Retin Obasohan recorded 25 points and a career-best eight assists to lead Alabama to an 82-80 overtime victory at Mississippi State. It was the sixth consecutive win in the series for the Crimson Tide, the longest streak in the series since winning six straight from 1985-87. It is also the fourth victory in the last five trips to Humphrey Coliseum.

Obasohan scored 16 points in the first half en route to his fifth straight game of 20 or more points. Riley Norris had 16 points, while Justin Coleman added 15 points.

The Tide led throughout the opening half and took a 38-34 lead at half. With UA leading 43-42 at the 15:10 mark, a Coleman three sparked an 8-0 to give UA its biggest lead of the game, 51-42. However, MSU responded with 14-0 run for their first lead of the game to take a 56-51 lead with 8:53 remaining.

State led by as many as seven (64-57) with five minutes left, but Alabama rallied tie the game at 65-65 with 1:43 left. Each team scored once more before the final minute.

The Bulldogs scored four straight points, but the Tide evened the score at 73-73. Alabama then went ahead 76-74 thanks to a threepoint play by Obasohan with 2:05 to play. Coleman made another shot from deep after the Bulldogs tied the score at 76-76. Alabama went 3-of-4 from the free throw line, two makes from Coleman and one by Norris, in the last nine seconds to ice the victory.

For the game, the Tide shot 27-of-58 (46.6 percent), including 11-of-29 from beyond the arc. Mississippi State was 33-for-71 (46.5 percent) from the floor, but just 3-for-18 from deep. Alabama grabbed 40 rebounds compared to 39 for the Bulldogs, but the Tide committed 20 turnovers to only 12 by Mississippi State.

Alabama led by as many as 24 points and went on to defeat Missouri, 80-71, in front of a sellout crowd at Coleman Coliseum. Five Crimson Tide players scored double-digit points, led by sophomore forward Riley Norris' 18-point day.

In addition to Norris' scoring output, senior guard Retin Obasohan tallied 16 points to go along with a game-high seven rebounds and four assists on the night. Sophomore guard Justin Coleman had his second straight solid outing, finishing with 14 points and a team-leading five assists.

The Tide took control of the game early with a 15-2 run midway through the first half. The run turned a 16-16 tie into a 31-18 lead for Alabama. The Tide outrebounded Missouri 20-13 in the first half and turned the ball over just three times en route to taking a 40-28 lead into the locker room.

Out of the break, the teams traded baskets until Alabama went on a 10-0 run to extend its lead to the largest of the lead, 67-43, with 9:28 remaining.

However, the Tigers never gave up and responded with an 8-0 spurt to cut the Alabama lead to 67-51. Missouri eventually cut the lead to single digits down the stretch, but could not overcome the Tide's advantage.

Alabama upset No. 15/13 Texas A&M, winning 63-62 in Coleman Coliseum. With the win the Tide has now defeated four teams ranked in the AP Top 25 in the regular season for the first time since 2001-02.

Alabama built an 11-point lead with 6:34 to play, but the Aggies battled back to pull within one in the final seconds. Texas A&M guard Anthony Collins had a chance to win the game or send it to overtime, but Collins, a 93 percent free throw shooter for year entering the contest, missed both free throws with just two seconds on the clock. The Tide then ran out the clock to seal the victory.

Retin Obasohan led the team with 16 points five assists and three steals. He now has 11 double-digit scoring games in the last 12 contests. Donta Hall grabbed a season-high 10 rebounds to go along with six points and a pair of steals in 21 minutes of action.

Alabama was down early, but used a 14-4 run over the final 9:13 of the first half to take a 32-27 lead at half. Riley Norris scored all 11 of his points in the first half. Both teams shot well in the opening frame, sinking a combined 11 three-pointers.

Texas A&M regained the lead three minutes into the second half, going up 38-37. However, Alabama immediately answered with an 8-0 run and would never trail again. The Tide held the Aggies scoreless for nearly five minutes during the run. With 9:04 to play, Alabama used a 7-0 run to extend its lead to 58-47 - its largest lead of the game.

Then the Aggies rallied, using a 15-5 run over the final six and a half minutes to pull within one point and setting the stage for the dramatic finish.

Arthur Edwards fouled out just 13 seconds later, but Alabama responded by holding Florida to 0-of-6 from the field over the next two minutes. In doing so, Alabama was able to extend its lead going on a 9-4 run over the next 5:03 to stretch its lead to 57-49 with 39 seconds remaining.

Obasohan was one of four Alabama players to reach double-figures with a game-high 15 points to go along with team highs of seven rebounds and two assists. Junior Jimmie Taylor had a big game as he finished with 11, including a couple of thunderous dunks late in the game, to go along with five blocked shots. Sophomore Justin Coleman and junior Shannon Hale each added 10 points off the bench.

Coleman ended the first half with a buzzerbeating three-pointer as Alabama trailed by four at halftime, 27-23. Both teams shot just 30 percent in the opening frame (9-of-30). Florida outrebounded the Tide 26-18 with 10 offensive rebounds.

The Tide pulled even with the Gators early in the second half, but would not take a lead until midway through the half. A 7-0 run over 2:16 gave Alabama a six-point lead, up 47-41, with 6:34 to play.

Alabama defeated Florida on the road on, 61-55. The win snapped an 11-game losing streak to the Gators and also marks the first time the Tide has won in Gainesville since Feb. 25, 1995 (10 straight losses).

Senior Retin Obasohan scored a career-high 35 points, including 23 in the second half, to lead the Alabama men's basketball to an impressive 76-69 victory over league-leaders LSU on Wednesday night in Baton Rouge, La. Obasohan, who also eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for his career, became the first Crimson Tide player to score 35 points in a game since Trevor Releford went for 35 in triple overtime at LSU on Feb. 23, 2013.

Obasohan was not the only Alabama player to shine, as Justin Coleman scored 21 points on the strength of a career-best five three pointers, while Arthur Edwards scored 12 points. Combined, the trio accounted for 68 of the Tide's 76 points on the night.

Alabama used two second half runs to take control of the game. Down 46-38 with 15:49 to play, the Tide used a 10-1 run to take its first lead in the second half. Obasohan scored his 1,000th career point on an 18-foot jumper with 5:54 left to tie the game at 53-53. Later in the half, a 7-0 run at the 3:26 mark gave Alabama control of the game, 69-62.

LSU built a first half lead on the back of a 13-3 run over four-plus minutes and took a 36-31 lead to the locker room.

Obasohan finished 11-of-18 from the field and a perfect 11-of-11 at the foul throw line. Sophomore Riley Norris also played impressively, as he recorded a career-high 16 rebounds.

Alabama fell to Mississippi State, 67-61, in front of a sellout crowd at Coleman Coliseum. Shannon Hale finished with a season-high 22 points, but a late run by the Bulldogs helped snap a six-game losing streak to the Tide in the series.

Playing in front of its fourth home sellout of the season, Alabama cut the Mississippi State lead to one point, 58-57, late in the contest. However, the Bulldogs went on 9-4 run the rest of the way to seal the win.

Retin Obasohan scored 22 points to go along with six rebounds and three steals. It marked his 12th game of scoring 20 or more points and 20th double-figure scoring game of the year. Combined, Obasohan and Hale scored 44 of Alabama's 61 points.

The Bulldogs pulled away with a 15-3 run over 9:19 in the first half to take a 27-18 lead with 3:28 on the clock. Alabama battled back and Obasohan hit a buzzer-beating shot to trim the Bulldogs lead to 32-29.

The second half began with a pair of technical fouls on each team. Mississippi State's Gavin Ware was called for the first one with 17:46 to play. Just 15 seconds later, Alabama head coach Avery Johnson was whistled for his first technical foul of the season. That seemed to ignite the Tide, as it used a 7-0 run to pull within one point at 41-40 with 14:42 remaining.

However, Mississippi State immediately answered with a 6-0 run of their own to stretch its lead back up to seven, 48-41, with 11:02 left.

Trailing 58-51 with 6:05 left, Alabama refused to go away and rallied for six consecutive points late to make it a one point game with 4:27 to play. But the Tide could not get any closer as Mississippi State claimed its first win in Tuscaloosa since Jan. 19, 2008.
