TEAM NOTES

ABOUT KENTUCKY

- Kentucky is 16-5 (6-2 SEC) in its seventh season under coach **John Calipari**. Its RPI stands at No. 18.
- Kentucky is ranked No. 20 in the current AP Top-25 poll and is No. 19 in the coaches' poll.
- Kentucky ranks 12th nationally in blocked shots (5.8 bpg), 31st in rebound margin (+6.8), 39th in field-goal percentage (.474) and 41st in the country in scoring margin (+10.7).
- Senior forward Alex Poythress is a native of Clarksville, Tennessee, and has three double-doubles on the season.
- Sophomore point guard Tyler Ullis needed just 17 games to reach the 100-assist mark this season, and he has scored at least 20 points in eight of UK's last 10 games.
- Ullis had 26 points and eight assists in Kentucky's overtime loss at fourth-ranked Kansas Saturday.
- Freshman and leading scorer **Jamal Murray** has made at least one 3-pointer in every game this season.
- Kentucky's roster features four former McDonald's All-Americans (Poythress, Ullis, Isaiah Briscoe and Marcus Lee).

LAST MEETING WITH KENTUCKY

- The undersized and undermanned Vols battled the top-ranked team in the nation before dropping a 66-48 decision in front of a sold-out Thompson-Boling Arena crowd Tuesday, Feb. 17, 2015.
- Junior guard Kevin Punter Jr. led the Vols with 14 points, while senior guard Josh Richardson tallied 10.
- Kentucky was led by Devin Booker, who netted 18 points, despite shooting 5-of-16 from the floor and 2-of-9 from 3-point range. Andrew Harrison added 14 points for the Wildcats.
- Tennessee's defense played havoc with Kentucky all night. The Wildcats shot just 41.5 percent from the floor, including 37.5 percent in the second half. UK made 5-of-22 3-pointers, 1-of-9 in the second half.
- The Vols were within seven points for the game's first 31 minutes. They cut their deficit to four points on three different occasions midway through the second half, bringing the crowd to a fever pitch.
- Punter finished a layup off a baseball pass from Richardson with nine minutes left to bring the Vols to within 48-44.
- Kentucky took firm control with a 10-0 run to take the first double-figure lead of the game with less than seven minutes to go on a Karl-Anthony Towns 3-point play. The layup, which was Towns' first shod attempt of the game, extended the Wildcats' lead to 55-44 with 6:54 left in the game. Trey Lyles' putback with five minutes put UK up 58-44.
- Despite its size disadvantage, UT battled the Cats to a deadlock on the boards, 35-35.

MEMORABLE VOL PERFORMANCES AGAINST KENTUCKY

- Chris Lofton reeled off 31 points, Major Wingate scored 12 and current Orlando Magic point guard
 C.J. Watson added 10 as No. 11 Tennessee beat Kentucky 75-67 at Rupp Arena on Feb. 7, 2006.
- Beating the Wildcats was three times as nice during the 1978-79 season. UT notched program win No. 900 in Lexington on Jan. 20, 66-55, before topping UK 101-84 in Knoxville on Feb. 17. Then the Vols won

the 1979 SEC Tournament with a 75-69 win over UK in Birmingham, Ala. on March 3. Current Vol Network radio analyst **Bert Bertelkamp** was UT's point guard that season.

 As Bernard King walked off the court at Memorial Gym after a deflating 88-82 loss on Jan. 13, 1975, a Kentucky fan flipped a lit cigarette into the Tennessee legend's hair. Outraged, King vowed he would never lose to Kentucky again. He vigorously carried out that promise, finishing his career 5-1 against the Wildcats.

SERIES NOTES

- The Kentucky series is UT's oldest and most-played among SEC opponents. The Vols and Wildcats first met on Feb. 5, 1910, and have clashed 218 times over the years.
- Since the AP poll was established, an unranked UT team has beaten a ranked Kentucky team 17 times.
- No program in college basketball has logged more wins over Kentucky than Tennessee (67).
- Kentucky is one of only three SEC schools (along with Alabama and Missouri) to lead its all-time series against the Volunteers.
- Four Tennessee All-Americans were Kentucky natives: Allan Houston, Chris Lofton, Danny Schultz and Paul "Lefty" Walther.

RIVALRY RESTORED AS SEC TWEAKS "PERMANENT OPPONENT" SCHEDULING STRUCTURE

- In May, the SEC announced a new scheduling model beginning in 2015-16 that features three permanent opponents. Tennessee's three permanent opponents are Kentucky, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.
- The new scheduling format restores the historic Tennessee-Kentucky rivalry back to an annual home-and-home series. In 2013-14, Kentucky did not visit Knoxville for the first time since 1953. And last season, the Vols did not play in Lexington for the first time since 1953.
- Prior to this season, Tennessee's only "permanent" (home/away) SEC opponent was in-state rival Vanderbilt.
- Each SEC team now faces the other 13 teams at least one time during league play. They will then play their three permanent opponents a second time (essentially making the permanent opponents an annual home/away matchup), and the remaining two games will be scheduled on a rotating basis.

BIG ORANGE THORN IN CAL'S SIDE

Since UK coach John Calipari returned to the college game in 2000-01, Tennessee has dealt him six losses. No other program has more wins over Calipari-coached teams during that span.

At 77.4 ppg, Tennessee ranks sixth in the SEC through 21 games. Should the Volunteers maintain that scoring clip, it would represent their highest average since 2008-09 when they scored at a rate of 78.4 ppg. It would also mark just the fifth season since the turn of the century in which the Vols have averaged more than 75.0 ppg.

Shooting 74.0 percent from the foul line, the Vols currently boast the best free throw percentage in the SEC. If UT can maintain that clip at the charity stripe, it will record the Vols' best free-throw percentage since the 1986-87 season. That year, UT shot 75.8 percent from the line.

With an average of 5.4 blocks per game, the Vols are on pace to block 172 shots this season. That would rank as the fifth-highest single-season total in program history and the best blocks total since the 2000-01 season (191).

Standing 6-4, senior **Armani Moore** is among the SEC's leaders in blocked shots at 2.0 per game. If he keeps that pace, he would finish in tie for the second-best single-season blocks average in program history alongside 6-11 **Doug Roth** (1988-89). It would also give him 62 blocks this season—the second-most blocks ever recorded in one season by a Tennessee player.

Should he reach that mark, Moore would conclude his fouryear Tennessee career with 139 career blocks—good for sixth all time at UT.

The above projections are based on Tennessee playing a minimum of 32 games (regular season plus one SEC Tournament contest)

▶ IN SEC PLAY

Tennessee is shooting 82.1 percent from the foul line during SEC games (142-173), a mark that leads the SEC by more than eight percentage points. Tennessee's 30 made free throws against No. 24 South Carolina (Jan. 23) are the second-most made by a team in a single game during SEC play this year, and that game's corresponding 93.8 percent shooting from the line is the best single-game free throw percentage in league play thus far (accounting for more than 10 attempts).

In SEC games, the Vols are fourth in the league in scoring offense (76.1 ppg), fourth in turnover margin (+1.5), fourth in off. rebounds (12.9 orgp), and fourth in steals (6.6 spg).

Kevin Punter Jr. is averaging 24.0 ppg in SEC games, which ranks second to **Stefan Moody** of Ole Miss (25.1 ppg). Punter's 36 points against South Carolina (Jan. 23) stand in a tie for the most points scored in a league game this season. Additionally, his 11 made field goals at Auburn (Jan. 2) remain the highest number of successful attempts in conference play this season.

Senior **Armani Moore** ranks among the SEC's top 10 in four statistical categories when accounting for conference games only: blocked shots (3rd, 2.1 bpg), total rebounds (8th, 7.9 rpg), assists (8th, 4.4 apg), and steals (5th, 1.7 spg).

BIG 12/SEC CHALLENGE RECAP

- The Vols led by 14 points at halftime but were outscored by 26 in the second half as TCU held Tennessee to a season-low 22 points over the final 20 minutes to defeat the Big Orange, 75-63, in the Big 12/SEC Challenge in Fort Worth, Texas, on Jan. 30, 20166.
- Kevin Punter Jr. scored a game-high 24 points to lead the Vols in scoring for the 16th time this season, and freshman forward Kyle Alexander provided a nice boost off the bench, posting career-highs with 11 rebounds and six blocks.
- Punter extended his streak of double-digit scoring efforts to 19 consecutive games
- The Vols turned in a dominant first-half performance and put on a 3-point shooting clinic, making 8-of-16 attempts from long range. Punter led all scorers with 15 points at the break as UT went to the locker room with a 41-27 lead.
- The Horned Frogs came out firing to begin the second half, reeling off a quick 10-0 run to cut the Tennessee lead to four and continued to chip away at the deficit throughout the half. A pair of Malique Trent free throws with 7:59 to play gave TCU its first lead of the half, and the Horned Frogs ran away with it from there as the Vols struggled mightily on the offensive end.
- Tennessee shot just 23.5 percent and were 0 of 15 from 3-point range in the second half.
- TCU had four players score in double figures, led by Trent's 15. Chris Washburn added 14 points and nine rebounds for the Horned Frogs.

VOLS' S.O.S. 14th NATIONALLY

- Through the games of Jan. 30, ESPN's Basketball Power Index (BPI) rated Tennessee's strength-ofschedule as the 14th-toughest in the nation.
- UT is one of six SEC teams with a top-20 SOS.

NON-CONFERENCE SCORING SURGE

 Tennessee's non-conference scoring offense was its highest since the 2009-10 season. The Vols went 7-6 in regular-season non-conference play.

- However, that kind of shooting slump has not stopped Moore from impacting games, as the senior continues to stuff the stat sheet in other areas.

HUBBS FINDING WORK INSIDE

- With the Vols lacking in any true team size, wing Robert Hubbs III has displayed not only a willingness, but a knack for playing with his back to the basket. The junior from Newbern, Tennessee, scored many of his school-record 2,464 career points at Dyer County High School doing just that.
- Through his first two seasons as a Vol, 43.1 percent of Hubbs' field-goal attempts came from behind the 3-point line (125 of 290).
- This season, however, Hubbs has shifted his focus to attacking from the inside out, and has displayed athleticism and soft touch around the rim. This season, Hubbs has scored 140 of his 224 points (63 percent) in the paint.
- By contrast, only 35 of Hubbs' 209 field-goal attempts this season have been 3-pointers (17 percent). His 34 3-point attempts are the fewest of Tennessee's quards
- Said Hubbs of his renewed dedication for inside work: "An isolation post-up is my favorite play. Just posting up and going to work to try and get a basket really gets me going. I like being able to work myself inside-out and being able to back a guy down and see where his strengths are and how we compare."

MOORE CLIMBING BLOCKS LIST

- The 6-foot-4-inch Moore owns 117 career blocks and ranks 10th on Tennessee's all-time list.
- Of the SEC's current 10 leaders in blocked shots this season, Moore is the only one shorter than 6-8.

MOSTELLA ADDS SPARK OFF BENCH

- Tennessee has found an offensive spark off the bench in sophomore guard **Detrick Mostella**.
- Mostella has been particularly productive in UT's three SEC wins, averaging 14.7 points and shooting .421 from 3-point range in those games.
- Under head coach Rick Barnes in 2015-16 Mostella's minutes have increased to 18.1 per game, including a career-high 35 at Mississippi State (Jan. 16), during which he scored a career-best 24 points. That game also marked his first career SEC start and was UT's first road win of the season.
- Mostella has made at least one 3-pointer in each of Tennessee's last 12 games.

BAULKMAN ON TARGET FOR VOLS

- After averaging just 14.7 minutes primarily off the bench last season (he started just seven games), senior wing **Devon Baulkman** is averaging 9.0 ppg as a starter and is shooting .330 from 3-point range this season.
- Baulkman has made at least one 3-pointer in 17 of Tennessee's 21 games this season, and he has made multiple 3-pointers in 11 games.
- 57 percent of Baulkman's scoring this season has come from beyond the arc.

PUNTER HAS THREE 30-POINT GAMES

- Senior point guard Kevin Punter Jr. has scored 30 or more points three times this season—twice at home and once on the road.
- He dropped a career-high 36 in UT's upset win over No. 24 South Carolina Jan. 23. Prior to that, he scored 31 in the season-opener against UNC Asheville Nov. 13 and 31 at Auburn during UT's SEC opener on Jan. 2.

- Jalen Johnson is a 6-6 wing from Durham, North Carolina, who is in his senior year at hoops powerhouse Wesleyan Christian Academy in High Point.

- The Vols' roster features 13 players (11 scholarship student-athletes) representing six states as well as Ontario, Canada.
- There are three Vols who hail from the state of Tennessee, three from Georgia, and two players each from Alabama and Canada. Florida, Illinois and New York also are represented.
- · Tennessee has four seniors, one junior, two sophomores and six freshmen.
- Ten Vols stand 6-5 or shorter, and three players are 6-6 or taller.
- For the first time since the 1995-96 season, UT has just three players listed at 6-7 or taller. And this is the first year since 2011-12 that the Vols have no players taller than 6-9 on the roster.

FAST BREAK

Tennessee has produced 46 all-time NBA Draft picks, including eight first-rounders. Two Vols were selected in the 2014 NBA Draft, and Josh **Richardson** was the 40th overall selection (Miami Heat) in the 2015 draft this past June.

ROSTER HEIGHT? RIM PROTECTORS? **BIG CHANGE FOR BARNES**

- Rick Barnes finds himself standing amongst a much smaller group of players this season than the giants he coached last year at Texas.
- Texas was one of the tallest teams in the nation last season, with an "effective height" of +3.2, which ranked 26th nationally. Effective height is the average of the center and power forward position.
- Last season's Longhorns boasted seven players who were 6-8 or taller.
- This Tennessee squad has just two players who are at least 6-8 (true freshman Kyle Alexander is the tallest, at 6-9).
- The average height on this Tennessee roster is 6-4.
- Texas was last season's national leader in blocked shots per game (7.8 bpg). The Longhorns also were fourth in the country in rebound margin (fourth, +8.5) and fifth in rebounds per game (fifth, 39.7 rpg).

PUNTER PLAYS ENTIRE GAME

• Kevin Punter Jr. played all 40 minutes in UT's win at Mississippi State on Jan. 16. He's the first Vol to play a complete, 40-minute game since current Orlando Magic point guard **C.J. Watson** did so vs. Auburn on March, 14, 2003.

- #VFL shooting guard Jordan McRae (2010-14), who was selected in the second round of the 2014 NBA Draft, broke the NBA D-League single-game scoring record by erupting for 61 points to lead the Delaware 87ers to an overtime victory over the Canton Charge on Jan. 26.
- · The NBA took note, and three days later on Jan. 29, McRae signed a 10-day contract by the Phoenix Suns. He made his debut Jan. 30 at the New York Knicks and totaled 12 points, four assists, two rebounds and a steal.

TENNESSEE A.D. HART A TRUE BASKETBALL MAN

- Tennessee Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Dave Hart is a true "basketball man," as he played collegiately at Alabama.
- A 1971 Alabama graduate, Hart played under legendary head coach C.M. Newton and earned a master's degree from UA in 1972 while working as a graduate assistant basketball coach.
- · Hart is the only AD in the SEC who was a college basketball player.

- Thompson-Boling Arena is hosting its 29th season in 2015-16.
- The Vols have won nearly 75 percent of their games in Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Vols have ranked in the top 10 nationally in attendance 12 times at TBA and own an active streak of 10 consecutive seasons ranked in the top 15.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Tennessee is 340-120 (.739) in 29 seasons in TBA.
- Since the 1998 season, the Vols are 240-60 (.800) in Thompson-Boling Arena.

Hoops a Priority on Rocky Top

The University of Tennessee has invested more than \$40 million into its basketball facilities since the end of the 2006-07 campaign.

Prior to the 2007-08 season, UT added a basketball-only practice facility and began the first phase of renovations to Thompson-Boling Δ repa

The \$19 million first phase of renovations included the addition of 32 luxury suites that are located in the existing north balcony, a loge area just below the luxury suites that includes 166 side court seats, new seats for the entire arena, a \$3 million center-hung scoreboard and concourse refurbishments, such as graphics and other amenities.

The Vols' state-of-the-art basketball practice facility, Pratt Pavilion, houses two full-size gymnasiums, one for each of the men's and women's basketball teams, as well as an athletic training room, weight room and film-study room.

The athletic department renovated the men's and women's basketball offices at the arena during the 2010-11 campaign, creating a new and impressive "front door" for the basketball programs.

New to Thompson-Boling Arena in 2013-14 was the 360-degree LED ribbon board that runs along the bottom of the upper deck.

And in March of 2014, TBA became the third college arena to install an LED lighting system (joining Arizona State and Notre Dame).

BARNES IS A NASCAR FANATIC

- Tennessee head coach **Rick Barnes** loves him some NASCAR. He grew up in the heart of NASCAR country in Hickory, North Carolina, attending races at Hickory Motor Speedway.
- Barnes has often said that if his brothers had to choose between watching him coach in the Final Four or attending a NASCAR race, they would undoubtedly attend the race!
- Barnes remembers attending the World 600 at Charlotte Motor Speedway on May 24, 1964. In that race, legendary driver **Glenn "Fireball" Roberts** was involved in a horrific crash that led to his death less than two months later.

USELESS (BUT INTERESTING) INFO

- Sophomore guard **Detrick Mostella** has the smallest shoe size on the team, as he wears a 10.5.
- Def Leppard drummer Rick Allen, known by fans of the band as "The Thunder God," rose to the top of his craft despite having his left arm amputated following a car wreck in 1984. The guy's got one arm!


