## QUICK HITTERS

$\star$ Vanderbilt improved to 17-11 overall and 9-6 in league play with an 87-74 win over Florida in Gainesville on Tuesday night. With the win, the Commodores swept the season series between the two teams.
« Damian Jones led four players in double figures with a career-high 27 points on 12-13 shooting from the floor. Jones also tied a career high in field goals made and added seven rebounds.
$\star$ Jeff Roberson garnered the fifth double-double of his career with 18 points and 10 rebounds. Wade Baldwin IV scored 13 points and had three assists. Baldwin has scored in double figures in 22 games this season.
$\star$ Matthew Fisher-Davis tallied 12 points, all on threes made (4-8). Fisher-Davis has made three or more threes in 15 games this season.
$\star$ Luke Kornet blocked four shots against the Gators, the ninth game this season he has posted four or more blocks.
$\star$ Saturday will be the first meeting between the two schools at Memorial Gym since 2014, since the teams played only once in the previous two years. Both teams had met on each other's home court for every season since the 1953-54 campaign prior to 2014.
$\star$ Nationally, Vanderbilt is second in the nation in 3FG\% defense at 28.5\%. Vanderbilt also ranks 6th in FG\% defense (38.0\%), 15th in blocks (5.4), and 22nd in 3FG\% (39.1\%).

* Vanderbilt ranks first in all games in the SEC in FG\% defense (.380) and 3FG\% defense (.285) and second in 3FG\% (.391), blocks (5.5), and 3FG made (8.5). In league games only, Vanderbilt leads the conference in blocks with 5.5 per game and is second in scoring (76.7 ppg), FG\% (.453), 3FG\% defense (.298), and 3FG made (8.5).
* The Commodores are 12-2 on the season at home and 3-8 in true road games this year, with the three road wins coming at Tennessee, Auburn, and Florida.
$\star$ Vanderbilt has won six in a row at home, are averaging 80.2 points per game in 14 home games, and have posted a scoring margin of +17.1 . The Commodores are shooting $48.3 \%$ at home, compared to $37.0 \%$ by opponents, and are converting on $41.4 \%$ of its attempts three, compared to $29.0 \%$ for opponents.
$\star$ Luke Kornet's 10 blocks against Auburn in Nashville set a new program record for blocks in a game - he surpassed three games with seven blocks by Will Perdue (vs. East Carolina, 12/28/87), Festus Ezeli (at Georgia, 2/16/11) and Damian Jones (at South Carolina, 2/13/14). The 10 blocks is also the most in the nation this season.
$\star$ Kornet leads the SEC in blocks in all games and in SEC games only, and Jones is seventh in all games and in SEC games only.
$\star$ Ten players have scored in double figures in a game this season - Wade Baldwin, Luke Kornet, Damian Jones, Jeff Roberson, Riley LaChance, Matthew Fisher-Davis, Nolan Cressler, Camron Justice, Josh Henderson, and Joe Toye. Baldwin, Kornet, Jones, Roberson, and Fisher-Davis have each posted double-doubles this season.
$\star$ Fisher-Davis is first in the SEC in all games in 3-Point Field Goal Percentage (.466).
$\star$ Vanderbilt is 11-2 on the season when Kornet attempts more two point baskets than three's.
$\star$ Head Coach Kevin Stallings, the school's all-time winningest coach, is in his 17th season with the Commodores and 23rd overall as a head coach, and is now the dean of SEC coaches. Stallings has 330 career wins at Vanderbilt and 453 overall as a head coach. He has eight 20 -win seasons in the last 12 seasons, with 11 total postseason appearances, six NCAA tournaments, and two Sweet 16's (2004 and 2007). He is also one of five SEC coaches to win 300 or more games at one institution, joining Kentucky's Adolph Rupp, Florida's Billy Donovan, and LSU's Dale Brown and Harry Rabenhorst, and is in 6th place all-time on the SEC wins list.
$\star$ Roberson is tied for fourth in the SEC in all games in free throw percentage at $83.5 \%$ and leads the SEC in league games only at 87.5\%.

## JONES COMING ON

Damian Jones is showing why he is considered one of the nation's top big men in his last three games, averaging 20.7 points
and 11.0 rebounds per game. Jones, a Wooden Award, Lute Olson Award, and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award watch list member,
who was also named as a preseason All-SEC First Team member, has scored 20 or more points in six different games this year,
including in two of his last three games. The engineering major from Baton Rouge, La., leads the SEC in field goal percentage in
league games only ( $62.8 \%$ ) and second in all games ( $59.0 \%$ ).
Vanderbilt has turned into Center University in the last eight seasons, with a center posting double digits in all but one of those
seasons. Here's a look at the totals from centers since the 2007-08 season.
2007-08 - A.J. Ogilvy - 17.0 ppg 2011-12 - Festus Ezeli - 10.1 ppg
2008-09 - A.J. Ogilvy - 15.4 ppg 2013-14 - Damian Jones - 11.3 ppg
2009-10 - A.J. Ogilvy - 13.4 ppg 2014-15 - Damian Jones - 14.5 ppg
2010-11 - Festus Ezeli - 13.0 ppg 2015-16 - Damian Jones - 14.3 ppg
Junior Luke Kornet is 11th in the nation in blocks at 2.87 blocks per game, and he has spurred the team to 155 blocks on the
season (already 5th all-time team total in program history) and blocking 10 or shots in a game on three separate occasions.
Damian Jones is second on the career blocks list with 163, and his 1.73 blocks per game career mark is the best in program
history, while Kornet is fifth in the program's history in career blocks per game (1.38) and fourth in total blocks (121).

The last two Februarys have been very kind to the Commodores, with Vanderbilt posting a combined 11-4 record in the last two years. Vanderbilt has won four of its last five league games this season, and in 2015, the Commodores won their last five regular season league games of the season and eight of their last 10.

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 959 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

Eight members of this year's team were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll or the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll for 2014-15. Junior Luke Kornet was also recently named to the CoSIDA All-District Three Academic Team.

The Commodores signed two players in the early signing period, 6'8 forward Clevon Brown from San Antonio, Texas, and Payton Willis, a 6'4 guard from Fayetteville, Ark. Brown, who attended Churchill High School, is ranked as the 9th-best player in the state of Texas by Texas Hoops, and the 126th-ranked player nationally by Rivals.com. attends Fayetteville High School in Fayetteville, Arkansas, averaged 15.9 points, 3.6 rebounds, 3.5 assists, and 1.5 steals per game while also shooting $44.7 \%$ from three in his junior season and was honored as an all-conference and all-state selection as a sophomore and junior.

The Commodores have faced eight teams in the top 31 of the current NCAA RPI (Kansas, 1st; Kentucky, 12th; Dayton, 17th; Texas, 21st; Purdue, 22nd; Texas A\&M, 24th; Baylor, 26th; South Carolina, 31st)

The game with Kentucky on Saturday will be the seventh ranked game for Vanderbilt this season, and the seven ranked games is the most a Vanderbilt team has faced in a season since the Commodores had 10 games against ranked foes in 2011-12. The most games against a ranked foe in a single season came in the 2002-03 campaign, when the Commodores faced 12 ranked teams.

Luke Kornet became the second Vanderbilt player to notch a triple double after he scored 11 points, grabbed 11 rebounds, and blocked 11 shots against Auburn on January 12, joining Brad Tinsley, who had 11 points, 10 rebounds, and 10 assists in a win over Presbyterian on November 12, 2010. Kornet is the 13th player in the nation this season to garner a triple-double, and the first to do so with 10 blocks, which is the most in the nation in a single game by an individual player.

## Game Notes:

-Vanderbilt improved to 17-11 overall and 9-6 in league play with an 87-74 win over Florida in Gainesville. With the win, the Commodores swept the season series between the two teams.
-It marked the first time since the 2010 SEC campaign that VU swept the season series with Florida.
-The double-digit win was Vanderbilt's first over Florida in Gainesville since a $74-63$ win over the Gators on February 1, 1997. Team
-Vanderbilt shot $57.7 \%$ from the floor against the Gators, their second-highest percentage from the field this season and their best in SEC play. The Commodores also made 50\% of their shots from beyond-the-arc, the 12th game this season VU has made 10 or more threes in a game.
-The Commodores limited the Gators to 40\% from the field and 26.3\% from three, and also outrebounded Florida, 36-32.
-Vanderbilt moves to 13-2 on the season when outrebounding an opponent and 15-4 when outshooting an opponent. -Although the Gators had more offensive rebounds (12) than Vanderbilt (8), VU outscored Florida in second-chance points, 17-7.
-The Commodores never trailed in the game.

## Individual

-Damian Jones led four players in double figures with a career-high 27 points on 12-13 shooting from the floor. Jones also tied a career high in field goals made and added seven rebounds.
-Jeff Roberson garnered the fifth double-double of his career with 18 points and 10 rebounds. Roberson has scored in double figures in 10 league games this season.
-Wade Baldwin IV scored 13 points and had three assists. Baldwin has scored in double figures in 22 games this season. -Matthew Fisher-Davis tallied 12 points, all on threes made (4-8). Fisher-Davis has made three or more threes in 15 games this season.
-Luke Kornet blocked four shots against the Gators, the ninth game this season he has posted four or more blocks. -Josh Henderson made an 80-foot heave at the end of the first half to give Vanderbilt a 40-35 lead.

## Recap

GAINESVILLE (AP) -- If Vanderbilt makes the NCAA Tournament, the Commodores probably will be able to point to two circus shots against Florida.

Damian Jones scored a career-high 27 points, Jeff Roberson added 18 points and 10 rebounds and Vandy beat the Gators 87-74 Tuesday night for a resumebuilding road win.
"Damian was obviously spectacular," Vandy coach Kevin Stallings said. "Jeff Roberson was spectacular."

Wade Baldwin IV chipped in 13 for Vanderbilt (17-11, 9-6 Southeastern Conference), which won for the fourth time in five games. Stallings' team also snapped a fourgame skid in Gainesville.

Although the Gators (17-11, 8-7) had no answer for Jones inside -- he made 12 of 13 shots -- the biggest difference may have been two amazing shots the Commodores made.

Trailing 37-35 in the final seconds of the first half, Florida looked like it would tie the game. But Schuyler Rimmer had an easy layup blocked, and Josh Henderson tossed in an 80-footer at the buzzer. Vandy hit one nearly as improbable in the second half, when Matthew FisherDavis banked in a contested 30 -footer as the shot-clock expired.
"My goodness," Florida coach Mike White said. "That's eight points right there. Just huge plays. They made a lot of plays."

For Henderson, a fifth-year senior averaging 11 minutes a game, it was just the second trey of his career. Teammates mobbed him near the free-throw line before both teams headed to the locker room.
"We had a couple of lucky plays and balls went in, but we always tell our team that when you're the aggressor, it's amazing how many times those balls go in," Stallings said.

Justin Leon Ied Florida with 16 points, John Egbunu added 14, and Devin Robinson finished with 11.

Florida's biggest problem was defense.
Vanderbilt shot 57.7 percent -- by far the highest percentage the Gators have given up this season. The Commodores finished 10 of 20 from 3-point range.
"They were unbelievable," White said. "I'm not going to sit up here and tell you that we were terrible defensively. We made mistakes, yeah. Was it our best defensive efforts? No. It needed to be one of our best defensive efforts."

Despite Vandy's gaudy offensive numbers, Florida still had plenty of chances.

Trailing 69-67, the Gators had at least four attempts to tie or take the lead. Eventually, the Commodores took over and put the game away with a 14-2 run.
"We just weren't playing hard," Robinson said. "It's real surprising."

Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 63rd Season
Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 63rd season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 950 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

## VANDERBILT BASKETBALL QUICK HITTERS

- This is the 113 th year of Vanderbilt basketball, with the first season taking place in 1900-01. There were no teams in 1904-05 and 1905-06.
- The Commodores have been to 13 NCAA Tournaments and 12 NIT's. Vanderbilt advanced to the Elite 8 in 1965 (field of 23), and the Sweet 16 in 1988, 1993, 2004, and 2007. The Commodores captured the NIT Championship in 1990 and finished runner-up in 1994.
- The Commodores are a charter member of the SEC, with the 2015-16 season being the 82nd year in the conference.
- Vanderbilt is the only private institution in the SEC with the lowest enrollment of any of the 14 schools $(6,738)$.
- Vanderbilt's Perry Wallace became the first AfricanAmerican scholarship basketball player in the SEC when he took the court in 1967.
- The Commodores have 44 career 1,000 -point scorers, with Shan Foster (2004-08) the all-time leading scorer with 2,011 career points.
- Vanderbilt has had 12 All-Americans since 1950. They are: Billy Joe Adcock (1950), Clyde Lee (1965), Tom Hagan (1969), Jan van Breda Kolff (1974), Will Perdue (1988), Billy McCaffrey (1993), Dan Langhi (2000), Matt Freije (2004), Derrick Byars (2007), Shan Foster (2008), and John Jenkins (2011).
- The Commodores had three players drafted in the first 31 picks of the 2012 NBA Draft - John Jenkins, Atlanta, 23rd pick, Festus Ezeli, Golden State, 30th pick, Jeffery Taylor, Charlotte, 31st pick - the most by the Commodores in one draft. In all, 35 Vanderbilt players have been selected in the NBA Draft since 1950.
- The Commodores ended a 61 -year SEC Tournament drought in 2012 by claiming the tournament championship in New Orleans, the team's first SEC tournament championship since 1951 .
- Coach Stallings is the winningest coach in Vanderbilt history after surpassing legendary mentor Roy Skinner on November 15, 2013, against Lipscomb.
- Stallings has led his Commodore teams to 12 postseason tournaments since his arrival in 1999 and has had eight $20+$-win seasons. His 2004 and 2007 teams advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since the tournament expanded to 64+ teams.
- Stallings has appeared in the NCAA Tournament six times, including a stretch of three consecutive appearances from 2010-2012. It was the first time in school history that Vanderbilt has advanced to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments.
- All three of the university's top all-time scorers played for Coach Stallings (Foster, Jeffery Taylor, Matt Freije). John Jenkins, who is 10th on the list, also played for him.
- Vanderbilt's intercollegiate athletics teams are nicknamed the Commodores, in honor of the nickname given to founder Cornelius Vanderbilt, who made his fortune in shipping. Vanderbilt donated $\$ 1$ million to begin "Central University" in 1875 - the campus was later renamed for Cornelius because of his generosity. Cornelius never stepped foot on the campus that bears his namesake.

NASHVILLE - The 18th-ranked Vanderbilt Commodores know how to start off a season strong, and tuning up with scrimmages against North Carolina and Virginia certainly helped.

Luke Kornet had 13 points and 13 rebounds and №. 18 Vanderbilt routed Austin Peay 80-41 on Friday night in the opening round of the Maui Invitational and the season opener for both teams. The Commodores opened the game scoring the first 21 points and hit their first nine shots inside the arc.
"We've had a couple scrimmages against two of the best teams in the country, and l'm not surprised we were on our game because we've been on our game most of the fall," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "So confidence comes from knowing what to expect, and । have confidence in our team because they give me reason to expect that they're going play hard."

Vanderbilt came into the season ranked for the first time since the 2011-12 season and only the seventh time ever. Stallings has four starters back from the team that went 21-14 and won 10 of its final 14 games before losing in the NIT quarterfinals.

Wade Baldwin IV led Vandy with 14 points, and Damian Jones added 12. The Commodores will play St. John's in Maui on Nov. 23.

Khalil Davis scored 10 Points for Austin Peay. This was one of two guarantee games for Austin Peay, from the Ohio Valley Conference, this season, and coach Dave Loos said the Commodores putting a pair of 7 -footers on the court early affected his Governors.
"We obviously got off to a terrible start, and Vanderbilt got off to a great start," Loos said. "They're a good basketball team. I think they're as advertised, certainly in my book. They're big, they make shots, they overwhelmed us obviously early."

The last time these teams met in December 2013, Austin Peay just missed a tip-in with a second left in a $58-56$ loss. This time, Fisher-Davis hit a 3 -pointer within the opening minute, and the Commodores never let it get closer than that.

Stallings was able to go to his bench early, playing three of his four freshmen. Baldwin stole an inbound pass by Austin Peay that appeared thrown to him and scored Vandy's final bucket of the first half. Vandy led 47-15 at halftime. Stallings pulled all but one starter with $9: 08$ left and a $69-28$ lead.

NASHVILLE - There was nothing tentative about Jeff Roberson's play Monday night.

After missing Vanderbilt's season opener with a concussion, Roberson returned to the court against GardnerWebb and had a productive performance off the bench. He scored a career-high 18 points and tied a personal best with eight rebounds as the 17th-ranked Commodores cruised to a $98-62$ win.
"Jeff played a man's game tonight," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "He got in there and was physical, and played great defensively. He was great on the boards, both offensive and defensive. Scored inside, he made it from the perimeter, he drove it and did a great job at the foul line."

Vanderbilt (2-0) really needed Roberson, too, after starting forward Luke Kornet was sidelined with a sprained ankle with 2:17 left in the first half.

Roberson shot 6 of 8 from the floor and 5 for 6 at the foul line. The 6 -foot-6 sophomore from Houston had four offensive rebounds.
"I guess I do whatever I've got to do," said Roberson, known more for his defensive abilities. "Obviously, I wish Luke didn't get hurt, but we have a lot of depth on this team. Throughout the season anybody should be ready because you never know when your time is coming."

Kornet, a 7-foot-1 junior, was off to a strong start with a team-high 10 points at halftime. His status for Thursday's game against Stony Brook was uncertain.

Riley LaChance added 13 points, including three 3 -pointers, for Vanderbilt.

Tyrell Nelson led Gardner-Webb (0-2) with 16 points, and Harold McBride added 10.

The Commodores, who return six of their top seven scorers from last season's NIT quarterfinal team, forced 19 turnovers with their defensive pressure. They outscored the Runnin' Bulldogs 35-9 in points off turnovers.

Gardner-Webb, which beat Purdue and Clemson en route to a 20 -win season in 2014-15, had an off night on offense and shot 42 percent from the floor.

Vanderbilt looked crisp on the other end, hitting 58.2 percent. The Commodores went 11 of 23 from beyond the 3 -point stripe.

Vanderbilt's Damian Jones, a 7-foot center, had a solid night with 10 points and seven rebounds.

NASHVILLE - Back in August, Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings warned his team about the third game of the season. He was right.
The 17th-ranked Commodores needed a late rally to beat unheralded Stony Brook 79-72 in overtime on Thursday night.

A bruised back kept Wade Baldwin IV out of the starting lineup for the first time in 22 games, but he still led the Commodores (3-0) with 21 points off the bench.

Baldwin also gave teammate Damian Jones a pep talk during a timeout late in the game. He told Jones he was the best player on the floor and he needed to start acting like it.

Jones bounced back from a slow start with 13 points and six rebounds.

Vanderbilt (3-0) outscored Stony Brook 13-6 in overtime, as the Commodores hit 9 of 10 from the foul line.

Stony Brook's Carson Puriefoy made a layup with one second left in regulation to send the game into overtime tied at 66 . He finished with 16 points for the Seawolves (1-1).

Vanderbilt's Riley LaChance had 13 points and Matthew Fisher-Davis scored 11.

Commodores forward Luke Kornet, who missed the last 22 minutes of Monday's win over Gardner-Webb with a sprained ankle, scored nine.

Stony Brook went 4 of 17 from beyond the arc and Vanderbilt wasn't much better at 5 of 18.

Jameel Warney, a two-time America East player of the year, led the Seawolves with 22 points and 11 rebounds. He led the nation in double-doubles (24) and total rebounds (409) last season.

Warney, a 6-foot-8 forward, and Jones, a 7-foot center, are both NBA prospects.

Stony Brook's Ahmad Walker added 13 points and Lucas Woodhouse grabbed 11 rebounds.

After trailing by as many as 10 in the second half, LaChance's 3-pointer tied the score at 62 for Vanderbilt with 2:16 left in regulation.

Stony Brook tied it at 64 on Warney's jumper with 1:21 remaining in regulation and a layup by Jones gave Vanderbilt a 66-64 lead with 1:01 left. But Puriefoy's layup tied it and led to the overtime.

Stony Brook made seven of its first 12 shots to take a 19-9 lead on Puriefoy's jumper with 12:40 left in the first half.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings knew his team was ready to compete. He just didn't expect the 19th-ranked Commodores' $92-55$ victory over St. John's in the opening round of the Maui Invitational.
"I don't think you ever anticipate a game like that," he said after his team shot 53 percent from the field, 48 percent from 3 -point range and outrebounded the Red Storm 49-26. "We had a lot of people play well and we shot the ball well."

Jeff Roberson had 11 points and 13 rebounds for Vanderbilt, which opened the game with a 27-4 run. Vanderbilt scored the game's first nine points and it only got worse from there for the Red Storm (3-1), who lost for the first time under first-year coach Chris Mullin and nearly suffered the worst loss in school history.

Luke Kornet, one of Vanderbilt's three 7-footers, had 13 points and seven rebounds, and Camron Justice added 11 points.
"Rebounding is a lot about mentality," Kornet said. "I just tried to be as much of a physical presence as I could around the goal."

Federico Mussini led the Red Storm with 14 points.
When the Commodores went up 30-5, they had
made 10 of their first 18 shots from the field. St. John's had made two of 18 in the same span.

The lead got as high as $48-15$ with $3: 39$ to play in the first half, and the Commodores led 53-24 at the break.

The biggest lead was 41 points with 2:31 to play. Stallings had a chance to give players more minutes than normal.
"When we got the lead that was something we tried to do with three games in three days," Stallings said.

Damian Jones, the Commodores' second-leading scorer and rebounder, played 14 minutes and had five points and five rebounds.
"He's the leader of our band," Stallings said, "and if we want to do what we think we can in this tournament, he'll be a big part of it."

Depth was certainly an issue, with Vanderbilt's subs outscoring St. John's 26-0 in the first half.

Jones, who grabbed 10 rebounds, was 6 for 10 from the field and Baldwin was ever better at 6 for 8 . The Commodores were never threatened in the second half and led by as many as 24 points.

Vanderbilt (5-0) will play the winner of the game between No. 5 Kansas and UCLA for the championship on Wednesday.

The game couldn't have started much worse for Wake Forest (3-2). While Vanderbilt was opening 9 of 13 from the field, the Demon Deacons missed 12 of their first 13 shots. That amounted to a $21-5$ lead for the Commodores, who beat St. John's $92-55$ in the first round.

Wake Forest was able to get within $30-24$ with 6 minutes left in the first half, but Vanderbilt went on a 10-0 run that was started and ended by Jones scoring inside. The Commodores stayed comfortably in front this time and led 43-28 at halftime.

Jeff Roberson had 10 points and seven rebounds for Vanderbilt, and Riley LaChance had nine points and six assists.

Selden was 4 of 6 from 3-point range. He also had seven rebounds.

The Jayhawks (4-1) did what no other team in the field could do, take a lead over the Commodores (5-1). It didn't happen until the second half but when they got it they extended it to as many as 13 points.

Kansas trailed by 10 points midway through the first half and the Jayhawks were able to cut the lead to 30-26 at halftime.

They took control with their offense, shooting 62.5 percent (15 of 24) in the second half. They got the lead for the first time with $18: 16$ to play on a jumper by Mason, and Vanderbilt never was in front again.
"I thought that we played a lot better in the first half than we did in the second. I'm guessing that Bill felt like they probably played a lot better in the second half than they did in the first," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "But, you know, shots that we are pretty accustomed to making, we didn't make today."

Vanderbilt closed to $68-63$ with 16 seconds to play, and Mason and Jamari Traylor each made one free throw for the final margin.
"In the second half, they just came out and we got a little lazy and had some misses defensively," Vanderbilt's Luke Kornet said. "And they just came out made shots and we never really made the shots to counter it."

Devonte Graham had 12 points for Kansas, and Mason added 10.
Damian Jones led the Commodores with 17 points. Kornet had 14, and Wade Baldwin IV 11.

Jones grabbed 10 rebounds, but the Jayhawks, led by Perry Ellis' eight, outrebounded Vanderbilt 39-32.

Kansas won this tournament in 1996 and title No. 2 came with wins over St. John's, Wake Forest and the Commodores.


NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt held Detroit to just five made field goals inside the arc. Coach Kevin Stallings was a bit more upset that his Commodores gave up 11 3-pointers, even in a rout.

Wade Baldwin IV led seven Commodores in double figures with 20 points, and No. 16 Vanderbilt beat Detroit 102-52 in a quick stop at home.

The Commodores (6-1) played their first game since finishing second to Kansas in the Maui Invitational last week, and they visit No. 25 Baylor on Sunday. This was the first time Vanderbilt has had six players in double figures since Nov. 11, 2008, against Central Arkansas, and the
Commodores hadn't scored 100 since Feb. 12, 2012, in a 102-76 win at Mississippi.

Nolan Cressler scored 14 points, his most since transferring to Vanderbilt. Matthew Fisher-Davis hit four 3-pointers in scoring a season-high 12 points. Josh Henderson finished with 11, and Damian Jones, Riley LaChance and Joe Toye all had 10 each.

Anton Wilson led Detroit (2-3) with 14 points. Jarod Williams had 12, and Chris Jenkins and Josh McFolley each had 11.

The Horizon League team came in tied for second in the nation scoring 96 points a game and scored the first five points. The Titans were tied twice.

Then Vanderbilt shook off its jet lag going on a 31-7 spurt that featured 14 straight points as the Titans missed 11 straight shots. The Commodores also strung together another 10-0 run as they just kept pushing their lead with a 3-pointer by Fisher-Davis putting them up 36-14 with 3:26 left.

Then the Titans hit three straight buckets, including back-to-back 3s. That prompted Stallings to take a timeout, and he slammed his dry erase board down on the floor as his Commodores huddled around.

Vanderbilt finished the half scoring the final nine points in leading 47-20 at halftime.

In the second half, the Commodores led by as much as 50 when Cressler hit a 3 with $7: 55$ left at $86-36$. They matched with the final margin with Stallings playing 13 players.

NASHVILLE - First, the 21st-ranked Vanderbilt Commodores lost the Southeastern Conference's best shot blocker to injury. Then they lost a 16-point lead on their own floor.

The Commodores announced just before tipoff that Luke Kornet will miss up to six weeks with a torn medial collateral ligament in his left knee. Minus the junior, they still jumped out to a big lead against Dayton.

But without their most physical player, the Commodores couldn't hold on and lost 72-67.

Kendall Pollard scored a season-high 21 points for Dayton. Scoochie Smith added 13 points, and Steve McElvene added 10 as Dayton shot its way back into the lead despite just seven points from leading scorer Charles Cooke.

The Flyers (7-1) now have beaten three teams from the Power 5 conferences this season, with previous wins over Alabama and lowa. They have won two straight since being routed 90-61 by Xavier.

Wade Baldwin IV and Damian Jones scored 18 apiece for Vanderbilt (6-3), which hit just two of its final 10 shots. Matthew Fisher-Davis and Riley LaChance each added 11 points.

Vanderbilt took its biggest lead at 38-22 off a 12-2 run. Darrell Davis answered by scoring the next eight points starting a 23-6 run that spanned halftime and put Dayton ahead 45-44 early in the second half on a layup by Cooke.

The Commodores missed eight of their first nine shots in the second half before Jones threw down a onehanded dunk and hit the free throw to put Vandy back up 47-45 with 13:50 left.

But Pollard hit just the fifth 3-pointer of his career with 44 seconds left to help seal the upset for Dayton, matching the Flyers' biggest lead. Smith missed two free throws with 36 seconds left, and Fisher-Davis hit a 3 from the left corner with 25 seconds left to pull Vandy within 69-67.

Baldwin missed a layup for Vandy, and the Flyers hit three of four free throws in the final 12 seconds.

## Damian Jones got the message.

The 7-foot junior, projected as an first-round NBA draft pick, scored a season-high 21 points and grabbed seven rebounds, leading the Commodores to an 80-56 win over Wofford on Saturday night.

Jones scored 14 points in the first half, the most by a Commodore this season. He hit 7 of 13 from the floor and 7 of 10 from the foul line.

Jeff Roberson added 13 points and seven rebounds for the Commodores (7-3), who outrebounded the Terriers 43-30.

Vanderbilt's Matthew Fisher-Davis scored 10 points, including three 3-pointers, and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds.

Fisher-Davis helped fill the void left by Luke Kornet, a 7-foot-1 forward who is out four to six weeks with an MCL tear in his left knee. Kornet is the team's best defender, the Southeastern Conference's leading shot blocker ( 2.75 bpg ) and was one of the nation's top 3-point shooters among big men last season (40 percent).

Baldwin added 10 points for the Commodores, who played their first game in 10 days after finishing first semester final exams.

Spencer Collins scored 13 points and Justin Gordon added another 11 as Wofford (3-7) shot just 34.4 percent from the floor in losing their third straight.

Vanderbilt broke a tie game with a 14-3 run capped by Jones' three-point play to take a 23-12 lead with 6:17 left in the first half and made a 10-0 run capped by Fisher-Davis' 3-pointer, building their lead to 35-19 with 52 seconds left in the half.

Vanderbilt hit six of its first eight shots from beyond the 3-point arc while Wofford shot 22.6 percent from the floor in the first half, including a 3 of 22 showing from 2-point range.

Stallings, whose team also has played Kansas with its strong front line, was asked about Purdue's wealth of size.
''Kansas didn’t hurt us inside," Stallings said. "We got killed inside tonight. It was an ugly game with a bunch of fouls. Purdue missed some open shots, but they got the ball where it needed to be."

NASHVILLE - Ben Simmons scored 36 points and grabbed 14 rebounds as the LSU Tigers beat Vanderbilt 90-82 in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams.

Simmons scored 18 in each half, and Keith Hornsby added 23 points as the Tigers (8-5) picked up their fourth victory in five games. Coach Johnny Jones has yet to lose to Vanderbilt, improving to 5-0 even with this the third straight at Memorial Gym.

Craig Victor II added 11 points for the Tigers.
Vanderbilt (8-5) came in leading the SEC in scoring defense, holding opponents to 61.8 points, and third nationally holding opponents to 35.8 percent shooting. With 7-foot-1 junior Luke Kornet still out with a torn MCL, the Commodores struggled to slow down Simmons.

Wade Baldwin IV led five Commodores in double figures with 17 points. Jeff Roberson added 13, Matthew Fisher-Davis 11 and Riley LaChance and Damian Jones each had 12.

The Tigers came in second in the SEC scoring an average of 83.8 points per game, while Vanderbilt leads the league and ranks third nationally holding opponents to 35.8 percent shooting. For the first 30 minutes, this looked to be headed for overtime just like last season when LSU pulled that win out. The teams swapped the lead 14 times with six ties.

Vanderbilt led 35-34 at halftime and last led 51-50 on a 3-pointer by Baldwin from the top of the key. Hornsby hit a 3 to put LSU ahead to stay with 13:21 remaining, and the Tigers built that lead to as much as nine until the final minutes. Vanderbilt got within four a couple times, the last on a driving layup by LaChance with 5:00 left.

Hornsby hit another 3, and Vanderbilt didn't get closer than five the rest of the way.

Simmons, the freshman from Australia, dominated. He scored 11 straight in the first half and 15 of 17 in keeping LSU close. Simmons scored over and over again with dunks, and he was 16 of 19 with all of LSU's attempts until Tim Quarterman split a pair of free throws with 2:01 left.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. - Anthlon Bell scored a season-high 26 points, Moses Kingsley added 25 and Arkansas forced 26 turnovers in a 90-85 overtime victory against Vanderbilt.

Kingsley did his part by scoring in double figures for the 14th time this season. He and Bell, who hit 6 of 10 from 3-point range, scored consistently for Arkansas, which rebounded after its 23-point loss at Texas A\&M in a SEC opener last Saturday.

Arkansas also leaned on its defense to pressure Vanderbilt into its season-high for turnovers. The Commodores had 14 during a first half in which the Razorbacks started slow, but managed to build a 40-32 lead behind Kingsley's 10 points and Bell's nine.

Bell and Kingsley helped Arkansas quickly stretch its lead to 13 points early in the second half by scoring five quick points. But the Razorbacks went nearly five minutes without a field goal, while the Commodores used a 20-4 run to take a 52-49 lead.

Kingsley and Bell combined to score Arkansas' next 16 points, setting up a back-and-forth finish in regulation.

Vanderbilt guard Wade Baldwin IV made a driving layup with 12.8 seconds left to give the Commodores a 75-74 lead. After an Arkansas timeout, Bell knocked down a 3-pointer to make it 77-75 with two seconds left.

Damian Jones caught a full-court pass over 6-foot Arkansas guard Anton Beard and drove to the basket for a dunk at the buzzer to force overtime.

The 7 -foot Jones equaled career highs with 24 points and 15 rebounds for Vanderbilt ( $8-6,0-2$ ).

Instead, Arkansas turned to its defense. The Razorbacks forced five turnovers in overtime and converted the Vanderbilt mistakes into eight points. Arkansas outscored Vanderbilt 29-9 off turnovers.

The key stop came in the final seconds as Arkansas guard Jabril Durham had a steal and made two free throws at the other end to give the Razorbacks a five-point lead.

Durham finished with 11 points, six assists and four steals. Matthew Fisher-Davis scored a career-high 20 points for the Commodores, who have lost six of their past nine games after starting the season 5-0.

South Carolina (15-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) passed its first tough test of the season, taking its first lead on PJ Dozier's floater with 10:54 left. Dozier then hit a reverse layup as the rare near sellout crowd at Colonial Life Center roared.

Dozier scored seven of his nine points over the next 5 minutes and the Gamecocks held off Vanderbilt (8-7, $0-3$ ) with good defense. The Commodores missed 19 of their last 22 shots.

South Carolina and SMU are the only unbeaten teams left in Division I. South Carolina has only reached 15 wins in three of its past 10 seasons.

Riley LaChance scored 13 of his season-high 15 points in the first half. Wade Baldwin IV added 13 points and Damian Jones had 12.

The Commodores built an 8-0 lead less than 2 minutes in as Luke Kornet hit back-to-back 3-pointers and Jones had a putback.

The deficit was the largest South Carolina had faced all season. The Gamecocks also trailed for 19:45 of the first half, which was more time than they had been behind in any game.

But South Carolina kept it close. Five times the Gamecocks were down one and failed to take the lead.

Once South Carolina took over, though, Vanderbilt couldn't respond. Nolan Cressler fouled out with 7:55 left and Jones got his fifth foul with 6:34 to go. Baldwin also fouled out at the end as the Commodores sent South Carolina to the line.

Free throws kept Vanderbilt in it. The Commodores made 11 foul shots during the final 14 minutes.

NASHVILLE - Junior forward Luke Kornet reminded everyone why the Vanderbilt Commodores missed him so much when he missed five games with a torn left MCL.

Kornet blocked a school-record 10 shots and finished with the second triple-double in Vanderbilt history with 11 points and 11 rebounds Tuesday night, helping the Commodores snap a three-game skid to start Southeastern Conference play beating Auburn 75-57.

This was just Kornet's third game back, and this performance came about the time the 7-foot-1 junior had been expected back. He played 37 minutes, finally getting the triple-double with 39 seconds left after missing three free throws inside the final minute.

The Commodores (9-7, 1-3) had been the SEC's only team with three losses and came in having lost seven of their last 10 since opening the season with five straight victories. They also were coming off their worst shooting performance this season in a loss last weekend at South Carolina.

Vanderbilt shook that off with an impressive performance, knocking down 14 of its first 18 shots, including the first six 3-pointers. The Commodores both outshot Auburn ( 55.3 percent to 32.8 percent) and outrebounded the Tigers (45-35).

Wade Baldwin IV scored 17 points and tied his career-high with 10 assists. He just missed a triple-double with seven rebounds.

Jeff Roberson added 14 points for Vanderbilt, and Riley LaChance had 13.

Auburn (7-8, 1-3) lost its third straight. Kareem Canty had a team-high 16 points, and Cinmeon Bowers added 13 and 10 rebounds.

Tigers coach Bruce Pearl said this was probably the first time he's brought a team into Memorial Gym and didn't press all 40 minutes. He also said Vanderbilt fans should relax with the Commodores playing one of the toughest schedules in college basketball.

Pearl's short-handed Tigers just couldn't keep up with Vanderbilt's shooting, instead going scoreless for stretches. Vanderbilt strung together run after run, including a 19-4 stretch that padded the Commodores' lead to 17 for the first time with 6:05 left on a 3-pointer by LaChance.

NASHVILLE - Riley LaChance missed practice and for most of Vanderbilt's pregame shoot-around he was sick enough he could keep little down except water.

The sophomore guard couldn't have looked healthier against Alabama.

LaChance scored a season-high 18 points and hit a career-best 5 of 6 from 3-point range, and the Commodores beat Alabama 71-63 for their second straight victory.

LaChance also spent plenty of time Friday at the student health clinic with what Stallings said might be tonsillitis. That didn't stop LaChance from playing 35 minutes.

The Commodores (10-7, 2-3) desperately needed these games at home after opening their Southeastern Conference schedule 0-3, and they responded by winning back-to-back games for the first time since November. They won't have consecutive games at Memorial Gym again until the end of February.

Jeff Roberson scored 16 points and grabbed 11 rebounds, and Damian Jones added 13 for Vanderbilt.

Alabama (10-6, 1-3) came in off its third upset of a Top 25 team this season after handing No. 19 South Carolina its first loss Wednesday night but lost for the third time in four games.

Shannon Hale led Alabama with 13 points before fouling out with 4:14 left, and Retin Obasohan added 10.

The Crimson Tide led only twice with the biggest margin coming off Riley Norris' 3-pointer to open the game. Wade Baldwin IV hit a jumper to put Vandy ahead 17-16, and Alabama managed only to tie it up twice more.

Vanderbilt led 33-31 at halftime and started the second half on a 10-1 run. Alabama went nearly six minutes between field goals after Shannon Hale's layup with 23 seconds left before halftime until Norris' layup with 14:37 to go. In that time, the Commodores built their biggest lead to 43-32 with a 3-pointer from LaChance with 15:02 remaining.

Jones had one point in the first half but scored nine of Vanderbilt's first 15 points in the second. He capped that with a three-point play off his third dunk nearly midway through the half for a 48-38 lead.

Wade Baldwin IV scored a career-high 25 points and Matthew Fisher-Davis added 18 off the bench Thursday night as Vanderbilt utilized a prohibitive edge from 3-point range in an 88-74 victory over Tennessee.

Vanderbilt (11-7, 3-3 SEC) outscored Tennessee 39-12 on 3-pointers, including a 30-0 margin in the first half. Vanderbilt led by as many as 28 points on a snowy evening that produced a smaller crowd and less hostile atmosphere than the Commodores typically encounter when visiting Thompson-Boling Arena.
"It just didn't feel like the normal environment and understandably so, the roads are horrible," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "It kind of had a funky feeling to it all the way around. Nevertheless, you still have to play. You have to perform. They're not an easy team to play and they're not an easy team to beat, so we're happy to get in here and get a victory."

After losing its first three SEC games, Vanderbilt has won three straight to rejuvenate its NCAA Tournament hopes. The Commodores have turned things around by sinking 3-pointers and preventing opponents from making long-range shots.

Vanderbilt entered the night ranked fourth among all Division I teams in 3-point percentage defense (.275) and 14th in 3-point percentage (.409). The Commodores were 10 of 22 from 3-point range in the first half Wednesday and finished 13 of 33 . Tennessee was 4 of 20 and missed its first nine attempts.
"You could say that's Coach Stallings' philosophy," Baldwin said. "We definitely emphasize taking away the 3. We'd rather have them score on a contested two than on a layup or a 3-point shot."

Luke Kornet had 10 points, 14 rebounds and five blocks for Vanderbilt. Camron Justice scored 12 points and Jeff Roberson added 11 with 10 boards.

Kevin Punter Jr. scored 26 points to lead Tennessee (9-9, 2-4). Armani Moore added 14 points in his return to Tennessee's lineup after missing a game with an ankle injury. Robert Hubbs III had 10 points.
"We were just awful," Tennessee coach Rick Barnes said.


LEXINGTON - Tyler Ulis scored 21 points, Jamal Murray added 18 and Kentucky shot 64 percent in the second half to cruise past Vanderbilt 76-57 on Saturday.

The Wildcats (15-4, 5-2 Southeastern Conference) led throughout thanks to strong shooting, finishing at 55 percent from the field. Ulis' scoring was balanced, with 11 of his points coming during a second half in which Kentucky led by as many as 23 . He finished 9 of 13 from the field with two 3-pointers and five assists in 34 minutes

Murray was 7 of 13 from the field including 3 of 6 from long range. Alex Poythress got Kentucky started in both halves for 16 points on 8-of-10 shooting with many coming inside.

Kentucky held Vanderbilt (11-8, 3-4) to 32 percent shooting and 33 percent from behind the arc halting the Commodores' three-game winning streak. Vanderbilt entered the contest having made 29 of 62 3-pointers in its last three games

Kentucky controlled the paint 34-18 while finishing even with Vanderbilt on the boards 32-32. The Wildcats rolled despite shooting just six free throws, making four.

Damian Jones had 13 points and Jeff Roberson added 12 for Vanderbilt, which made 20 of 25 free throws. None of it mattered.

Kentucky followed up Thursday's win at Arkansas by meeting another challenge against a Commodores squad that appeared headed in the right direction after starting 0-3 in league play.

Vanderbilt had sought a statement win to go along with its resurgence and presented multiple threats, from the 7-foot duo of Luke Kornet and Damian Jones to a potent perimeter shooting game 41 percent from long range.

Neither were factors in a shooting performance almost as cold as outside temperatures in the mid-20s at tipoff.

Poythress seemed determined to do his part inside early despite giving away several inches, muscling inside for layups along with a layup. He scored six straight points to ignite Kentucky's 18-13 run coming out of the break for a 55-40 lead that wasn't threatened.

NASHVILLE - Embarrassed by an ugly loss at Kentucky, the Vanderbilt Commodores made sure they bounced back with possibly their best win this season.

Damian Jones scored 20 points and grabbed 12 rebounds as Vanderbilt beat Florida 60-59 for the quality win they've so needed desperately.

The Commodores (12-8, 4-4 Southeastern Conference) won for the fourth time in five games. Even better, this marked the Commodores' first victory over a team with a Top 30 RPI. Vanderbilt lost its first six such games this season and needed a victory before February. They got it against Florida, which came in tied for second in the SEC with an RPI of 22.

Baldwin led Vanderbilt with 24 points, scoring 10 of the Commodores' final 14 points to preserve the win.

Florida (13-7, 5-3) snapped a three-game winning streak.

KeVaughn Allen hit three 3-pointers in the final 32 seconds trying to rally the Gators. Kasey Hill also added 16, Dorian Finney-Smith had 12 and Chris Chiozza 10.

The Gators not only came in on a winning streak, they were coming off the highest-scoring game by an SEC team this season after beating Auburn 95-63 last weekend. But Florida lost junior forward Justin Leon to an apparent concussion in the opening minutes, and the Gators also struggled through too many shooting droughts in their worst shooting game this season.

Florida led only once early at 3-2 and tied it up three times, the last at 9 . Jones scored the next five points to put Vanderbilt ahead to stay as part of an 11-0 spurt, and the Commodores led 30-19 at halftime.

Vanderbilt led by 14 before starting to miss shots, too. Florida went on a 12-2 spurt to pull within 44-40.

Prince lbeh added 13 points and 11 boards for the Longhorns (14-7) who had four players score in double figures.

Vanderbilt trailed by 16 early in the second half before staging a late run with a flurry of 3-pointers. The Commodores shot 53 percent after halftime but timely turnovers and Texas' offensive rebounding sealed the Texas win. Texas also outscored the bigger Commodores 40-18 in the paint.

Damian Jones scored a career-high 26 points for Vanderbilt (12-9). Matthew Fisher-Davis scored 19 for the Commodores.

Texas forced Vanderbilt into eight turnovers and a paltry 6-of-21 shooting as the Longhorns built a 31-16 lead by halftime.

Damian Jones and Matthew Fisher-Davis each had 20 points for Vanderbilt (15-11, 7-6). Jones also had 10 rebounds while Fisher-Davis was 6 of 9 from behind the arc. Jeff Roberson and Wade Baldwin finished 12 and 10 points, respectively.

An I.J. Ready 3-pointer brought Mississippi State within 71-70 in the final minute before Vanderbilt's Riley LaChance made 1 of 2 free throws with 26 seconds left.

On the final possession, Malik Newman missed a 3 that was rebounded by Ware. The ball was thrown out to Ready who found Weatherspoon in the left corner for the winning shot.

Vanderbilt took control early in the first half, largely due to the Commodores' size advantage in the post and deadly shooting beyond the arc. Vanderbilt hit four threepointers in the opening 10 minutes en route to a 21-7 lead.

Mississippi State answered with an 11-2 run that was capped by Ware's 3-point play with 7:19 left in the first half. But the Bulldogs would get no closer than five points the rest of the half and trailed 41-32 at halftime.

Vanderbilt made six three-pointers and held the Bulldogs without an offensive rebound in the first half. Fisher-Davis had five 3s and scored 17 before halftime.

Mississippi State shot 48.3 percent for the game and the Bulldogs were 7 of 17 beyond the arc. Vanderbilt shot 44 percent and made 10 of 233 -pointers.

NASHVILLE - The Vanderbilt Commodores finally have had enough of watching big leads turn into painful losses.

Damian Jones scored 15 points and grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds leading five Commodores in double figures as Vanderbilt grabbed a big lead early and held on in beating Georgia 80-67.

The Commodores (16-11, 8-6 Southeastern Conference) won for the third time in four games, this time bouncing back after blowing a 17-point lead Tuesday night when they lost at Mississippi State on a buzzer-beating 3 -pointer. That was the fifth time the Commodores had blown a double-digit lead and their second loss this season when leading by at least 16.

That prompted coach Kevin Stallings to criticize his Commodores, including himself, for struggling so after being picked to finish second in the SEC. Against Georgia, Wade Baldwin IV added a team-high 17 points. FisherDavis had 13, Jeff Roberson 12 and Luke Kornet 11. Georgia (14-11, 7-7) lost its third in four games.
J. J. Frazier led Georgia with 21 points, Yante Maten added 19 points and Derek Ogbeide had 11.

This game featured not just the SEC's two best defenses but two of the country's stingiest with Georgia holding opponents to a league-best 37.8 percent shooting with Vanderbilt just behind at 38 percent, good for seventh nationally. Playing at Memorial Gym, the Commodores shot 45.5 percent ( 25 of 55 ) while holding Georgia to 38.1 percent (24 of 63).

The Bulldogs led only once on the opening jumper by Ogbeide. Vanderbilt answered with the next 10 points, which included back-to-back baskets by Baldwin, one a 3-pointer, and finished with a 3-point play from Roberson. The Commodores pushed that lead to as much as 16 late in the half Joe Toye's dunk with 3:08 left at 35-19.

Georgia finished the half with six unanswered points to pull within 37-28.

Vanderbilt scored the first four points of the second half, but the Commodores went cold going nearly six minutes between buckets after Jones' dunk before Camron Justice hit a 3-pointer from the right corner with 11:53 left. In that time, Kenny Gaines finally started shooting after missing his first six shots, knocking down a jumper with 13:36 to go.

Georgia got within four a couple times, the last at 5662 on a driving layup by Maten. The Bulldogs got no closer once Vandy put together a 7-0 spurt capped by a 3-pointer by Fisher-Davis with 4:35 left.

GAINESVILLE - If Vanderbilt makes the NCAA Tournament, the Commodores probably will be able to point to two circus shots against Florida.

Damian Jones scored a career-high 27 points, Jeff Roberson added 18 points and 10 rebounds and Vandy beat the Gators 87-74 Tuesday night for a resume-building road win.
"Damian was obviously spectacular," Vandy coach Kevin Stallings said. "Jeff Roberson was spectacular."

Wade Baldwin IV chipped in 13 for Vanderbilt (17-11, 9-6 Southeastern Conference), which won for the fourth time in five games. Stallings' team also snapped a fourgame skid in Gainesville.

Although the Gators (17-11, 8-7) had no answer for Jones inside -- he made 12 of 13 shots -- the biggest difference may have been two amazing shots the Commodores made.

Trailing 37-35 in the final seconds of the first half, Florida looked like it would tie the game. But Schuyler Rimmer had an easy layup blocked, and Josh Henderson tossed in an 80-footer at the buzzer. Vandy hit one nearly as improbable in the second half, when Matthew FisherDavis banked in a contested 30 -footer as the shot-clock expired.

For Henderson, a fifth-year senior averaging 11 minutes a game, it was just the second trey of his career. Teammates mobbed him near the free-throw line before both teams headed to the locker room.
"We had a couple of lucky plays and balls went in, but we always tell our team that when you're the aggressor, it's amazing how many times those balls go in," Stallings said.

Justin Leon led Florida with 16 points, John Egbunu added 14, and Devin Robinson finished with 11.

Florida's biggest problem was defense.
Vanderbilt shot 57.7 percent -- by far the highest percentage the Gators have given up this season. The Commodores finished 10 of 20 from 3-point range.

Despite Vandy's gaudy offensive numbers, Florida still had plenty of chances.

Trailing 69-67, the Gators had at least four attempts to tie or take the lead. Eventually, the Commodores took over and put the game away with a 14-2 run.
