



### #11 ABBEY CHEEK UTILITY INMAN, S.C.

Considered the top overall prospect in the state of South Carolina by SCVarsity.com and The State, Cheek brings raw talent and power to the Bluegrass

State. Entering her senior season at Chapman High School in Inman, S.C., Cheek is an all-around athlete earning countless honors in softball, volleyball and basketball.

Cheek had a great junior season with a .549 batting average, adding 16 home runs, three triples and six doubles. Those gaudy numbers came even though most teams didn't pitch to the slugger, registering over 30 walks - mostly intentional - which set a new school record. Cheek hit .486 her sophomore season with 12 homers, five triples and 12 doubles, while her freshman season she had seven homers, five triples and nine doubles. The impressive athlete has led Chapman to the regional and division championship each of the last three seasons.

A five-year letterwinner in softball, Cheek has been named South Carolina High School League and High School Sports Report All-State and All-Region all three years, while she was the SCHSL Region Player of the Year her freshman and junior years and HSSR Player of the Year all three years. Cheek, who was a nominee for South Carolina Gatorade Player of the Year last season, played travel ball with the South Carolina Elite under head coach Tony Genovese. Genovese described Cheek as "probably the best hitter on the team, she'll hit for high average and a lot of home runs. She plays third and first and can play the outfield." Cheek played a year up with the SC Elite, hitting over 200 home runs in her nine years with the squad. Cheek is on fullcountsoftball.com's national watch list and was named to the USA Elite Select All-Star roster.

An all-region honoree in volleyball and basketball, Cheek is very involved away from athletics as a four-year member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and Beta Club. Daughter of Monica Cheek and stepfather Lee Newman, she has an older brother, Jerrett Heard, and sister, Caitlyn Cheek. She plans a major in kinesiology/health promotion.




### #19 KELSEE HENSON OUTFIELD PADUCAH. KY.

Kelsee has been a member of the All-District Team for the past three years. She has been named to the All-Region Team for the past two years.

Kelsee was voted 2nd team All-State as a sophomore and All-State honorable mention as a freshman. She has been a state runner-up for two years and was a member of the East/West All-Star team.

Henson has been named to the All-District team three times and the All-Region team twice. She earned honorable mention All-State honors are a freshman and was on the All-State second team as a sophomore. After signing her letter of intent, Henson said she was happy the recruiting process was over, and even happier to be a Wildcat.

"I woke up this morning and just I felt happy," Henson said. "I'm bad in the morning and woke up this morning ready to get out of bed. I've always bled blue. It's always been my dream to go to the University of Kentucky and it's just an even bigger honor to play softball there. There's a lot of pressure lifted off my shoulders knowing now that I know where I'm going and I don't have to worry about it anymore."















### #21 HANNAH HUFFMAN OUTFIELD LEBANON, OHIO

A speedy, left-handed hitter that is a strong slapper and can also showcase some power, Huffman comes to Kentucky after an impressive high school career at

Lebanon High School in Ohio. Huffman hit .519 this fall for LHS, including a .595 on-base percentage and 21 stolen bases.

Her junior year, Huffman hit .452, while she hit .333 her sophomore season with a .380 on-base percentage and one home run and .350 her freshman season with a .409 on-base percentage. Huffman helped her team make deep runs into postseason play each of the last three years, including the state championship game her freshman season.

Behind Huffman's strong play, LHS claimed district and sectional championships each of the last three years, while advancing the state semifinals last season. The outfielder, who can play some infield, was named all-league each of the last two years. Huffman was also a strong performer in travel ball, hitting .510 last summer with two home runs and 70 stolen bases, while the summer of her sophomore season she had a .572 on-base percentage with a .450 batting average.

Huffman is a skilled athlete that also participated in cross country in high school, qualifying for regionals all three years. Outside of athletics, Huffman was a four-year Harmon Civic Trust Scholar Athlete and member of the National Honors Society and secretary of her school's Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

She also was an ASA Gold Participant and volunteered at the LPC Feeding Ministry. The daughter of John and Krista Huffman, Hannah has one sister, Zoe. She is planning a majoring in architechture.



## #24 MADISON KEARSCHNER OUTFIELD LOUISVILLE, KY.

Kearschner in her final year at Ballard High School hit .322 in 28 games played, with an on-base percentage of .412, leading her team in that category. She tal-

lied 28 hits and 22 RBI while crossing the plate herself 17 times.

She wore jersey No. 33 for Ballard High School in Louisville, Ky., leading them to many regional and district titles during her time with them.

Kearschner was ranked as the No. 4 overall prospect in the state of Kentucky coming out of high school, and in the top 175 nationally accoring to recruiting service MaxPreps.com.













## #22 LAUREN LEWIS OUTFIELD CHATTANOOGA, TENN.

Ranked as the 26th best player in the class of 2015 by fullcount-softball.com and 25th best player in the class of 2015 by studentsports.com, Lauren Lewis

brings a winning tradition to Lexington after several state titles at Baylor High School in Chattanooga, Tenn., with current UK freshman Haley Andrus. Fullcountsoftball.com describes Lewis as a "powerhitting outfielder with a strong arm." Lewis, who has been playing varsity softball since eighth grade, is a three-year all-state and best of preps selection after strong freshman, sophomore and junior seasons.

The slugger hit .408 as a freshman with 12 doubles, 11 home runs and 63 RBI on her way to Max Preps Freshman All-America honors. Her sophomore season, Lewis hit .479 with 14 doubles, 10 homers and 47 RBI and had an amazing performance in the TSSAA State Tournament. Lewis set the tournament record for most grand slams, most home runs, most RBI and most RBI in a game at the event. Last season, Lewis hit .424 with 15 doubles, eight homers and 49 RBI. Lewis lettered in softball as an eighth grader, hitting .434 with 11 doubles and one homer.

Out of her school-record 30 career home runs hit in high school, Lewis has six grand slams. An all-around athlete that also played basketball, Lewis has been active away from athletics, helping set up a blood drive at her high school that took in over 200 donations. Lauren comes from an athletic family as her father, Kirk, played baseball at Auburn. She is the daughter of Kirk and Sheri Lewis and has one sibling, Landon. Lauren is planning on majoring in nursing.



### #1 SARAH RAINWATER OUTFIELD NICHOLASVILLE, KY.

Rainwater, a two-sport athlete at East, excelled in basketball as well as softball. Rainwater has won half of the eight district championships she's played in

and has been to the state tournament twice for soft-ball.

"We are excited to welcome Sarah to our team this fall," UK head coach Rachel Lawson said. "She is a very athletic player that has the potential to add speed and depth to our team. She's a local kid that plays with a lot of passion and knows what being a part of the Big Blue Nation is all about."

Whilst playing for East Jessamine High School just outside of Lexington, Ky., Rainwater was named the 2015 Kentucky 2-A State Player of the Year, after batting over .330 in her senior season.

She was named a 2015 participant of the Kentucky High School East/West All-Star game representing Region XII. She was also selected to the All-Star team for the East/West game in 2014 where she represented Region XII.

## RACHEL LAWSON

### HEAD COACH - NINTH SEASON - ALL-TIME WINNINGEST HEAD COACH AT UK

When Rachel Lawson was named head coach of the University of Kentucky softball team in July 2007 she saw a program poised for success. She knew athletics director Mitch Barnhart and the rest of UK's administration would give her unwavering support, and most importantly she knew the Big Blue Nation would provide the home-field advantage necessary for her team to compete in the Southeastern Conference.

Now entering her ninth season as UK's head coach, Lawson's vision for the UK softball program has started to become a realization. The winningest head coach in program history has not only lead UK to its first-ever appearance in the Women's College World Series, three NCAA Super Regionals the last four seasons, including a program-best 50 wins in 2014, but UK's administration came through on their promise and commitment to softball by providing Lawson with one of the nation's greatest collegiate softball facilities in the \$9.5 million John Cropp Stadium.

Lawson and Co. have made sure the beautiful stadium has seen lots of wins over the past few seasons as UK has had its two most successful seasons in program history each of the last two years. In 2014, Lawson guided Kentucky to the Women's College World Series behind 50 wins. The Wildcats also set single-season records in at-bats, runs scored, doubles, home runs, RBI, total bases, walks, fielding percentage, putouts, lowest ERA and strikeouts. UK, which advanced to the program's first SEC Tournament Championship, started the season with a program-best 12 straight wins.

In two of the last three seasons, Lawson had led the Wildcats to a national seed in the NCAA Tournament - the school's first-ever national seed was in 2013 - and hosted a NCAA Regional. Kentucky, which has made the NCAA Tournament each of the last six seasons - one of just 21 schools nationally to claim that honor - is one of just nine schools to be a national seed each of the last two seasons.

Now sitting at 276-199 in her eight seasons at Kentucky, Lawson is the winningest head coach in school history and already has more wins in SEC play than UK had all told as a program when she took over in 2007. UK finished the 2014 season ranked sixth in both national listings for its best final ranking ever. In 2013, Kentucky was ranked in the top 14 of both collegiate softball rankings for the second time in school history with nine wins over ranked teams. In her seven seasons at Kentucky, Lawson has defeated 55 ranked foes, including 30 wins vs. top-10 teams and 15 against top-five teams.

Lawson's 2013 squad set the stage for the 2014 run to the Women's College World Series, setting several school records, including a then-program record 41 wins. All told, Lawson has directed the Wildcats to 30 or more victories in six-straight seasons, which also resonates as a program record. In her seven years with Kentucky, Lawson has helped UK players earn 25 All-SEC honors and 18 SEC Player of the Week honors.

Lawson's impact on the UK program is obviously, but her ability to develop players sometimes gets overshadowed by her impressive credentials in handling the day-to-day running of a program. Lawson, who serves as the pitching coach for the Wildcats, has guided three different pitchers to throw no-hitters against top-25 teams in just the last three seasons alone. In all, UK has 12 career no-hitters - all of which have come under Lawson's tenure - including two perfect games.

Kentucky's 2012 season was highlighted by an impressive second-half surge with upsets of 12 ranked opponents, a then Lawson-best fifth place finish in SEC action, a program-record six captured conference series and a senior class who became the first class in school history to tally a .500 record or better in each of their four seasons of play.

The end of the 2012 season also marked the conclusion of some of the best individual careers in UK history as Lawson helped pitcher Chanda Bell become the first player in school history to record 200-plus strikeouts all four seasons, while slugger Brittany Cervantes is the school's leading home run hitter. Pitcher/infielder Rachel Riley also excelled under Lawson, ranking top 10 in school history in field percentage and nearly every pitching category.




In 2011, Lawson directed the Wildcats to their first NCAA Super Regional appearance and finished the season ranked No.12 in the country. The 2011 team earned a 40-16 overall record to set a new single-season standard for wins in a season before Lawson's 2013 team posted 41. UK appeared in the national rankings for a school-record 14 consecutive weeks, defeated 12 top-25 ranked opponents, captured five SEC series and became a national story with a dramatic postseason run which included a seventh-inning rally to knock off the nation's No. 2 team in Michigan in Ann Arbor to advance to Super Regionals.

The 2011 Wildcats shattered 12 single-season UK records, including home runs (65), RBI (275) and batting average (.275). Individually, the Wildcats had a school-record five players earn National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-Region honors in Meagan Aull, Cervantes, Kara Dill, Riley and Megan Yocke. Following the end of the impressive 2011 season, Lawson was rewarded with a five-year contract extension keeping her at the helm of the Wildcat program through 2016. That contract has been extended several times since, including June of 2014, which keeps Lawson in UK blue through the 2020 season.

In 2010, the Wildcats charted a 32-27 record and entered into the national rankings for the first time in program history, while also knocking off five top-seven ranked opponents on the year. Behind the pitching tandem of sophomores Riley and Bell, the Wildcats broke school records in nearly every pitching category. Kentucky's offense continued to make strides as well with improvements in batting average, home runs, RBI and sacrifice hits for the third consecutive season under the direction of Lawson.

Lawson led the Wildcats to their first NCAA Tournament appearance and charted the school's first postseason victories in 2009, just her second season leading Kentucky. UK notched a 34-23 record and the first winning season in UK history in nearly 10 seasons. Kentucky upset three ranked opponents on the year, including No. 7 Georgia in a 2-0 victory in the SEC Tournament. Molly Johnson became the school's first All-America selection when she was voted to the second team in 2009. Kentucky earned 13 victories in conference play, and finished sixth overall in league action.

## RACHEL LAWSON, CONT.

Lawson's impact on the program was immediate as many Wildcats broke into the school record books under her tutelage. Pitcher Amber Matousek became the first pitcher in 10 years to record 10 or more strikeouts in a game when the sophomore right-hander achieved the feat three times in the season. Johnson set the school record for most doubles (20) in a season, while rocketing up the school charts for career home runs, doubles, batting average, slugging percentage and on-base percentage.

During the season the head coach also charted her 100th career victory in a 5-1 UK triumph over Eastern Illinois on March 1. Lawson became the winningest head coach in program history on April 10, 2013 with win No. 182 against Eastern Kentucky in Richmond, Ky.

Lawson became just the third head coach in the history of the Kentucky softball program after spending three seasons at Western Kentucky. She also served as an assistant coach at Maryland from 1996-2002 and was the associate head coach of the Philadelphia Force professional team in 2006.

Lawson tallied a record of 92-84 (.523) during her tenure with the Hilltoppers. In her first season at WKU, she led the Toppers to a spot in the Sun Belt Conference Tournament championship game. Picked to finish last in the preseason poll, WKU tied for second in the conference standings after setting a school record with 12 Sun Belt victories. The Billings, Mont., native led WKU to a 33-24 record in 2005 and reached the 30-win plateau again in 2007.

Lawson and the Hilltoppers battled nine NCAA Regional participants in 2006, including four teams ranked in the top 25, while finishing third in the Sun Belt regular-season play. She guided the squad to wins over perennial powers Long Beach State, South Florida, Mississippi Valley, as well as No. 13 Louisiana-Lafayette and No. 21 Louisville. In fact, thenfreshman pitcher Ryan Rogge tossed the school's third no hitter against the Ragin' Cajuns in WKU's 8-0 victory.

The win handed UL its first run-rule defeat in an SBC contest. Three Hilltoppers - Lathrop, Rolfs and Rogge - each earned SBC Player- and Pitcher-of-the-Week honors throughout the season, as Rolfs and outfielder Alana Towns notched all-conference honors.

Lawson was a two-time all-conference player at Massachusetts, where she was part of a program that advanced to the 1992 Women's College World Series, and has seven years experience as an assistant coach at Maryland.

During her four-year career at UMass, Lawson helped the Minute-women post a combined record of 142-68 (67.6 percent) including a 39-3 (92.9 percent) Atlantic 10 mark. In addition to the 1992 WCWS appearance, she was a part of squads that also advanced to the NCAA Tournament her freshman season, won three A-10 Tournament titles and claimed the league regular-season championship four straight years.

Lawson was honored individually for her accomplishments on and off the field. She was both an All-Conference and All-Atlantic 10 Tournament performer in 1992 and 1994, and was also named to the A-10 Academic all-conference squad following each of her final two seasons.

Lawson joined the Maryland staff in 1996 and helped the Terrapins post six winning seasons in her seven years in College Park. Her responsibilities included recruiting, scheduling, organizing practice and travel, as well as running camps and clinics. In 1999, Lawson and company were selected the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Mid-Atlantic Coaching Staff of the Year after leading the Terrapins to a 51-23 record, their first ACC regular-season title and the championship game of the NCAA Region II Tournament.


During her time at Maryland, Lawson helped eight individuals earn NFCA all-region accolades -- with an All-America honoree in 1999 -- and nine players collected all-conference honors.

A 1994 graduate of Massachusetts with a degree in exercise science, Lawson also earned her master's degree in sports management from UMass in 1998. She is the daughter of Elaine and Gerald Lawson and has 12 siblings.



## KRISTINE HIMES

### ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH - NINTH SEASON

Talk with Kentucky softball head coach Rachel Lawson for two minutes about her program and its recent success and she will inevitably push off credit to associate head coach Kristine Himes, who is entering her ninth season with UK's program and has been with Lawson every step of the way in Lexington.

Himes is in her fifth season as the associate head coach of the Kentucky softball team after serving four seasons as assistant coach until a promotion following the 2011 season. Himes handles many day-to-day dealings with the program and is responsible for the development of the Wildcats' infield. She also is UK's hitting coach and has led some of the highest power offensives in school history in her time with the Wildcats.

On the field, Kentucky's batters have improved dramatically since Himes' arrival. The Wildcats charted an improved team batting average in five of Himes' first six seasons in Lexington. In fact, in the six years before Himes arrived at Kentucky, UK had only posted a team batting average over .255 two times, while UK has earned that honor in all seven years under Himes' tutelage.

In 2014, Himes helped guide Kentucky's to its first-ever appearance in the Women's College World Series behind some impressive defense and clutch hits. The Wildcats broke several single-season records en route to the program's first 50-win season, tying the school record for most home runs in a game with five against Ole Miss, while it hit 71 home runs overall, breaking the previous program record for homers in a season. UK also set single-season records in runs scored, doubles, RBI, total bases and walks drawn.

Defensively, Himes' coaching led Kentucky to its best season in the field in her tenure, setting a program record .972 fielding percentage, including a program-best 1,455 putouts.

The 2014 season was a continuation of the progress UK has shown under Himes as UK's offense in 2013 set or tied several school records as well. The Wildcats posted 62 home runs in 2013, which is the third most in program history. Himes preached patience at the plate in 2013 with UK responding by drawing the second-most walks in school history with 211 and moving runners around when they did get on base with 69 stolen bases.

Himes' coaching showed in UK's win over top-25 North Carolina in 2013 as the Wildcats set countless school records in the win. UK had 18 runs against UNC, which tied the most runs in a game with Kentucky's eventual 18-0 win marking the largest margin of victory in school history. UK had four homers in the game, which at the time was the most in a game in school history, while UK's 18 RBI was the most ever in a single game. Entering the game vs. UNC, UK had scored 12 or more runs in a game 27 times in school history with the Wildcats reaching that mark in the first inning alone against the Tar Heels.

The 2013 team hit three or more home runs in eight games, including four or more home runs three times. UK hit a school record five home runs against Middle Tennessee State, while it hit four homers in game one of the 2013 NCAA Tempe Super Regional, the most homers ever hit in an NCAA Tournament game for UK.

In 2011, Himes took over duties as UK's third base coach and the Wildcats delivered by shattering six offensive records including batting average (.295) and home runs (65). Four different players posted 10 or more homers in a season for the first time in school history.

The stage was set in 2010 for an offensive outbreak when UK had a .269 combined batting average with four players batting over .325.

Himes developed former All-America player Molly Johnson, who broke numerous school records, including the school's batting average and home run records when she graduated. She also notched single-season records with 81 hits in 2009 and 20 doubles in 2008.

Brittany Cervantes, who graduated in 2012, excelled under Himes, ending her career ranking first in the UK records for home runs with 48. Cervantes also finished top 10 in the UK career rankings in doubles, walks, RBI, runs scored and slugging percentage. In addition, the tandem of former stars Meagan Aull and Megan Yocke rank among UK's all-time leaders in nearly

every offensive category including batting average, doubles, home runs and stolen bases.

Himes showed her ability to develop talent in 2012, when she led Cervantes, Kara Dill and Griffin Joiner to All-SEC honors. Cervantes had a great senior season, leading the team in home runs, RBI and doubles. Dill continued to show offensive improvement leading the team with a .351 average and a career-high 71 hits, which ranked fifth-most



all-time in school history. Joiner had a great freshman season, hitting .278 with 20 RBI and four homers.

Prior to joining UK, Himes served under Lawson at Western Kentucky for one season. The Hilltoppers emerged as one of the top teams in the conference.

Himes' coaching career began at George Washington University, where she spent two seasons helping the Colonials continue to establish themselves as a Division I program.

Himes made her professional debut in 2006 with the Philadelphia Force before spending one season at Western Kentucky.

A native of Bolivar, Ohio, Himes was an All-Big Ten standout power-hitting third baseman for the Ohio State University. Himes finished her career as the Buckeyes' all-time career (41) and single-season (16) home run leader. She also was second in career games played and ranks in the top five in walks and RBI. The 2002 year marked a defining season in Buckeye history as Himes also helped lead OSU to a 55-14 record and an NCAA Regional Championship appearance. She was also invited to participate in the Olympic Training Camp that spring.

Himes graduated from OSU with a degree in business administration also earned a master's in sport management from WKU in 2007.

## **MOLLY JOHNSON-BELCHER**

ASSISTANT COACH - FIFTH SEASON

When former Kentucky standout Molly Johnson-Belcher played her last game in a UK uniform in 2010 some wondered what direction the program would head without its most productive offensive player ever. And although Johnson hasn't picked up a bat or glove in a game since 2010, head coach Rachel Lawson has still not spent a day as UK's head coach without the talented player - and now coach - as Johnson-Belcher is entering her fifth season as an assistant coach for the UK softball team

Johnson-Belcher, a four-year starter for the Wildcats, began her coaching career as an undergraduate assistant at UK in the fall of 2010 before being promoted to full time assistant coach prior to the 2011 spring season. Her impact on the program as a coach has been similar to her impact as a player, helping Kentucky to some of the best seasons in school history, including a school-record 50 wins and a trip to the Women's College World Series in 2014.

Last season, Johnson-Belcher helped guide Kentucky to its best season in program history. Her impact on UK's infield defense shined bright as underclassmen infielders Christian Stokes and Nikki Sagermann improved every day defensively for UK, while Krystal Smith showed drastic improvements defensively from years past to provide UK depth at third base and second base. The Wildcats responded to Johnson-Belcher's teachings by posting the best fielding percentage in program history.

In 2013, Johnson-Belcher, who is responsible for scouting, coaching film and on-field coaching of the infield, helped Lawson and associate head coach Kristine Himes mold a young team into a NCAA Tournament national seed that went to a NCAA Super Regional and finished ranked in the top 15 of both collegiate softball final rankings.

In her first year coaching at her alma mater in 2011, Johnson-Belcher helped UK to a then-school-record 40-win season, serving as the first base coach where UK shattered six offensive single-season records in the history-making season. She is also responsible for scouting, film and on-field coaching in the infield.

In her four years coaching at Kentucky, Johnson-Belcher as helped guide Kentucky to a new program-record win total three times.

Johnson-Belcher had an impressive playing career after her collegiate career ended as she suited up for the United States National Team a few years. She began her career with Team USA prior to her senior sea-


Perhaps the most productive player in school history, Johnson-Belcher capped her career as the all-time best in home runs (35) and batting average (.389) in school history. Her efficiency extended to the field where she was a dynamic shortstop as the cornerstone of Lawson's defense in starting in more than 100 career games.

Johnson-Belcher became the Wildcats' first All-America selection after a sensational junior season where she had career-highs in nine offensive categories while breaking three single-season Kentucky records. She set UK seasonal records in runs scored (53), hits (81) and on-base percentage (.498) en route to her garnering All-America status.

After emerging as one of the best collegiate players, Johnson-Belcher continued her career with the United States National team in the summers of 2009 and 2010. Johnson-Belcher suited up with the USA Futures squad in the 2010 summer and compiled an impressive 3-3 record against the world's top softball talent.

While at UK, Johnson-Belcher spent countless hours working the Kentucky softball camps and clinics while also serving as an undergraduate volunteer assistant coach in the fall of 2009.

Johnson-Belcher married in the summer of 2013 to Allen Belcher, who also works at UK Athletics as the assistant director of equipment operations.

director of operations. Cumbess will help the full-time coaching staff with all day-to-day logistical aspects of the program.

Cumbess recently completed a successful four-year career as a pitcher and first baseman for the Wildcats, ending her career as one of the most prolific hitters in program history. The native of Winter Haven, Fla., and Normal, Ill., ended her playing days ranked fourth all time in games played with 236, fourth in runs batted in with 118, seventh in doubles with 37, fifth in home runs with 26 and eighth in total bases with 310. In the circle, Cumbess ranks top 10 in all-time appearances with the fifth-best ERA at 2.83 and third-best opponent batting average at .215. Cumbess' 29 wins rank tied for sixth most on UK's career listing.

Cumbess graduated from Kentucky in the spring of 2014 with a bachelor of arts degree in integrated strategic communications. A three-year member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll and two-time NECA Scholar Athlete All-American. Cumbess is a member of the Frank G. Ham Society of Character.



**GRIFFIN JOINER Graduate Assistant** 

Griffin Joiner joins the Kentucky support staff after one of the most historic careers in program history that lasted from 2012-

15. Joiner played in almost every game during that time span for the Blue and White, and was the 19th overall pick in the 2015 NPF College Draft by the Akron Racers.

Joiner is the third Wildcat player to ever be selected in the NPF Draft, joining All-American and current assistant coach Molly Johnson-Belcher, who was selected second overall in the 2010 draft, and All-Southeastern Conference performer Megan Yocke, who went ninth overall in 2011.

Joiner's list of career awards include All-SEC Freshman Team by league coaches (2012); SEC Freshman of the Week (2012); Second-Team All-SEC by league coaches (2013); SEC All-Defensive Team by league coaches (2013); Preseason All-SEC by league coaches (2014); SEC Player of the Week (2014); Louisville Slugger/NFCA Player of the Week (2014); CoSIDA Academic All-District (2014); SEC All-Defensive Team by league coaches (2014); Third-Team NFCA All-Southeast Region (2014); Preseason All-SEC by league coaches (2015); SEC Academic Honor Roll (2012, 2013, 2014).
