Series Notes: Friday's contest between Alabama and Kentucky will mark the 145th meeting between the two programs - the sixth-most games UA has played against any single opponent.

### **OPENING TIP**

- ▶ Alabama captured an 81-73 victory over seventh-seeded Ole Miss in the 2016 SEC Tournament second round on Thursday night. The 10th-seeded Tide drained 12 three-pointers en route to securing a spot in Friday's SEC quarterfinals against No. 2 seed and 16th-ranked Kentucky.
- >> Friday's game will air on SEC Network as John Saunders (play-by-play), Jon Sundvold (analyst) and Kaylee Hartung (sideline) will be on the call. The contest will also be available via the Crimson Tide Sports Network, with Chris Stewart and Bryan Passink calling all the action. Fans will be able to follow along on gametracker (via RollTide.com), and game updates will be available on Twitter via @AlabamaMBB.
- >> With the victory over Ole Miss, Alabama head coach Avery Johnson recorded his 18th win in his first season at the helm of the men's basketball program. The win ties Wimp Sanderson's mark in the 1980-81 season for the most by a first-year head coach in school history.
- >> The Tide and Wildcats will meet for the 16th time in SEC Tournament history and it will mark the first time the teams have squared off in the postseason since March 12, 2011. In the last postseason meeting between the two teams, Kentucky defeated Alabama, 72-58, in Atlanta, Ga.
- ▶ Alabama is just 2-13 in games played against Kentucky in the SEC Tournament. It is the only team that Tide has a below .500 mark vs. conference teams in the league's tournament. The last time the Tide defeated UK in the SEC Tournament came on March 11, 1983 in Birmingham, Ala. (won 69-64). The only other time Alabama defeated the Wildcats in the postseason event on March 6, 1982 in Lexington, Ky. (won 48-46).
- → Alabama has an all-time record of 62-49 in SEC Tournament play and has won six SEC Tournament titles (1934, 82, 87, 89, 90, 91). The six tournament championships rank second in league history.
- >> Senior guard Retin Obasohan earned first team all-conference honors, all-defensive team honors and was named the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year, the league office announced on Tuesday. Obasohan becomes the second Crimson Tide player in as many years to earn Scholar Athlete of the Year (Levi Randolph) and is the first Alabama player to earn both first team honors and all-defensive league accolades in the same season since Trevor Releford did so in 2013.



### ALABAMA IN THE SEC TOURNAMENT

### SEC TOURNAMENT NOTES

- The Tide and Wildcats will meet for the 16th time in SEC Tournament history and will mark the first time the teams have squared off in the postseason since March 12, 2011, when Kentucky defeated Alabama, 72-58, in Atlanta, Ga.
- Alabama is just 2-13 in games played against Kentucky in the SEC Tournament, including having dropped eight straight to the Wildcats in postseason play. It is the only team that Tide has a below .500 mark vs. conference teams in the league's tournament.
- The last time the Tide defeated UK in the SEC Tournament came on March 11, 1983 in Birmingham, Ala. (won 69-64). The only other time Alabama defeated the Wildcats in the postseason event on March 6, 1982 in Lexington, Ky. (won 48-46).
- Alabama has an overall record of 62-49 in SEC Tournament play. The Tide's .559 winning percentage in the tournament ranks second among SEC schools.
- Since the SEC Tournament was restarted in 1979, Alabama is 46-32 (.590) in the event, the second best record in the league during that span.
- Additionally, the Tide ranks second in championship game appearances (13) and SEC Tournament titles (6).

- From 1982-92, Alabama won the SEC Tournament five times and appeared in the title game a total of nine times.
- Alabama has advanced to the semifinals 23 times, the third most in the league, and the finals 13 times, the second most in the league.
- From 1989-92, the Tide won 11 consecutive games in the SEC Tournament.

### NOTES FROM NASHVILLE

- Alabama is 4-5 in its four tournament appearances in Nashville, Tenn.
- In 2001, the first time Nashville hosted the SEC Tournament, Alabama defeated Vanderbilt, 78-59, before falling to Florida, 69-61.
- In the 2006 SEC Tournament, UA fell to Kentucky, 68-61, in its lone tournament game that season.
- In 2010, Alabama defeated South Carolina, 68-63, before dropping a 73-67 decision to Kentucky.
- In the 2013 tournament, the Tide defeated Tennessee, 58-48, before falling to the Gators, 61-51.
- In 2015, the Tide fell in the opening round to the Florida, 69-61.

### UA VS. THE FIELD AT SEC TOURNAMENT

- Alabama is 62-49 all-time in the SEC Tournament and has a non-losing record against every SEC program in tournament play with the exception of Kentucky. The Wildcats have ended the Tide's run 13 times.

### ABOUT ALABAMA'S OPPONENT — KENTUCKY

- Alabama and Kentucky last met in the SEC Tournament on March 12, 2011 with Kentucky taking a 72-58 victory. The Tide is 2-13 all-time against the Wildcats in the conference tournament. Kentucky is the only team that Alabama has a losing record with in SEC tournament play.
- Friday's game marks the 145th game played between Alabama and Kentucky the sixth-most games played against any one opponent in UA men's basketball history. The Wildcats own a 106-37 edge in the all time series, including having won five straight games overall. The Tide dropped both regular season contests this season.
- Kentucky clinched a share of the regular-season Southeastern Conference championship with a victory over LSU in the regular-season finale and a 13-5 record overall. The Wildcats tied with Texas A&M for the league crown. It marked UK's league-leading 47th SEC championship, 37 more than anyone else in the league. It was also the fourth time UK has won at least a share of the SEC championship in head coach John Calipari's seven seasons at Kentucky. For Calipari, it was his 14th league crown, spanning three different conferences.
- Jamal Murray and Tyler Ulis are proving to be two of the best scoring guards in the country. Combined in league play, they were the best this season. In conference-only games, Murray and Ulis averaged 40.8 points per game in conference play, more than any other duo in the major conferences, which includes the Power 5 conferences and the American and the Big East.
- Kentucky probable starters (starting five from last game): Guard Tyler Ulis (16.6 ppg, 7.4 apg, 1.4 spg), Guard Isaiah Briscoe (9.7 ppg, 5.2 rpg, 3.1 apg), Guard Jamal Murray (20.0 ppg, 5.1 rpg, 2.2 apg, 42.1 3FG%), Forward Skal Labissiere (6.8 ppg, 3.2 rpg, 51.5 FG%), Forward Alex Poythress (10.0 ppg, 6.2 rpg, 60.4 FG%).

Riley Norris tied a school record with eight three-pointers in a win over then-No. 19 South Carolina on Jan. 13. He became the sixth different UA player to achieve the feat and the first since Mykal Riley did so on March 13, 2008.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The 10th-seeded Alabama men's basketball team knocked down 12 three-pointers to defeat seventh-seeded Ole Miss, 81-73, on Thursday night at Bridgestone Arena in the second round of the 2016 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament. The Crimson Tide moves on to the quarterfinals to take on No. 2 seed Kentucky on Friday at 6 p.m. CT.

Sophomore Riley Norris led the Tide with his third double-double of the year with 16 points and 11 rebounds. Senior Retin Obasohan finished with a team-high 17 points - all coming in the second half. Senior Arthur Edwards and sophomore Justin Coleman also finished in double figures with 15 points

Alabama had a season-high 12 blocks, which matched the Tide's secondmost blocks in an SEC Tournament game in program history (12 vs. Florida on March 6, 1997). Furthermore, freshman Donta Hall led the Tide with five blocks, which were the second-most in an SEC Tournament game an Alabama player. Hall finished just one block shy of the Alabama record for blocks in an SEC Tournament game set by Antonio McDyess in 1995.

Alabama (18-13) was able to shake off a slow start by heating up from the outside. Sophomore Riley Norris got the Tide going with three buckets from deep in the opening five minutes. However, Alabama would have to overcome two early fouls on senior captain Retin Obasohan, who went to the bench at the 15:45 mark in the opening half.

With the game tied, 16-16, Arthur Edwards made a three-pointer to give Alabama its first lead of the game. After the Rebels (20-12) answered to tie the game, the Tide sparked a 7-0 run to take a 26-19 lead and would never trail again. Alabama took a 40-36 lead to the locker room on the back of eight three pointers, tying its season high for threes in a half.

The Tide used two big second half runs to take control of the game. The first run came with the score tied at 42-all, as Alabama went on an 8-0 spurt to take a 50-42 lead with 16:17 to play. Midway through the half, the Tide went on a 9-0 run to push the lead to 66-52, giving Alabama its largest lead of the game with just 7:49 to play. Ole Miss was able to chip away, but Alabama held on to give Avery Johnson his 18th win of the season.

For the game, Alabama was 28-for-53 (52.8 percent) from the floor, including 50 percent (12-of-24) from beyond the arc. Ole Miss went cold in the second half to finish 26-for-67 (38.8 percent) for the night. The Rebels won the rebounding advantage 43-35, with a 15-5 edge on the offensive glass. The two teams combined to miss 25 free throws.

Moody recorded 39 points for Ole Miss on 12-of-27 shooting, which tied for the second-most points scored by a player in an SEC Tournament game. Tomasz Gielo finished with 11. Marcanvis Hymon collected nine rebounds while Moody had eight.



## ALABAMA MEN'S BASKETBALL QUICK HITS

### **TEAM**

- Avery Johnson was introduced as Alabama's 20th head men's basketball coach on April 8, 2015. Johnson, who led the San Antonio Spurs to the 1999 NBA title and was named the 2006 NBA Coach of the Year, came to the Capstone after a successful coaching career in the NBA. As an NBA coach for seven-plus season, Johnson owned a record of 254-186 (.577) after spending four-plus seasons with the Dallas Mavericks and two-plus seasons with the Brooklyn Nets. During his time in Dallas, Johnson led the Mavericks to the postseason in each of his three-plus seasons as head coach. He led the Mavericks to a record of 194-70 (.735) and set an NBA record for reaching the 50-win plateau (62 games) and the 150-win plateau (191 games), the fastest of any head coach in league history. In 2005-06, Johnson led the Mavericks to their first appearance in the NBA Finals en route to earning NBA Coach of the Year honors. The San Antonio Spurs retired his No. 6 jersey in 2007.
- Alabama has lost 13 games this season, seven of which have come against RPI top 50 teams, including five ranked in the top 20 in the latest ESPN.com RPI (March 7). Those teams include No. 4 Oregon, No. 6 Xavier, No. 13 Kentucky (twice) and No. 20 Dayton.
- Alabama is one of just 15 teams in the nation to have beaten four wins teams ranked in the AP Top 25 this season. In the four years prior to this season (2011-15), the Tide was a combined 0-18 vs. top-25 opponents.
- Alabama has played seven ranked opponents this season and has won four of those games, which leads the SEC. It's the first time since the 2001-02 season that an Alabama team has four victories over AP top-25 teams during the regular season. In addition, Alabama has faced an additional four opponents who were receiving votes to be ranked at the time they played (Dayton, Oregon, at South Carolina and at LSU), making 11 of its 30 opponents this year ranked or receiving votes in the AP top-25 poll at the time the game was played.
- Alabama has won 56 games in league play over the past six years. **That number ranks fourth in the league, trailing only Kentucky (80), Florida (72) and Georgia (57).** UA is tied for fourth with Ole Miss (56), followed by Tennessee (52).
- Alabama owns a record of 8-0 this season when holding opponents to less than 60 points in a game. Furthermore, the Tide is 13-3 on the year when holding the opposition to less than 70 points in a game.
- As a team, Alabama ranks among the league leaders in defensive stats entering the SEC Tournament. The Tide ranks second in the league in scoring defense (67.1/62nd nationally) and three-point field goal percentage defense (.318/45th nationally), and ranks fifth and blocked shots per game (5.1/28th nationally) and field goal percentage defense (.403/40th nationally).
- The Tide's defensive effort was even better during Southeastern Conference play. Against league competition only, Alabama led the SEC in three-point field goal percentage defense (.291), ranked third in scoring defense (68.5) and blocked shots per game (5.2) and fifth field goal percentage defense (.413).
- A key stat for Alabama this season is rebounding. Alabama, which currently ranks 13th out of 14 teams in the SEC in terms of rebounding margin (-3.3), is 11-2 this year when it outrebounds the competition, However, the Tide falls to 7-11 on the year when it is outrebounded by its opponents.
- This year's squad is one of the younger teams in the SEC. Of the 12 available players on the roster (Nick King and Avery Johnson Jr. both must sit out this year due to NCAA transfer rules), seven are either freshmen (4) or sophomores (3).

### **RETIN OBASOHAN NOTABLES**

- Senior guard Retin Obasohan has been tabbed the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year, First Team All-SEC and SEC All-Defensive team, the league office announced on Tuesday. Retin becomes the second player in as many years and the third player in program history to earn the Scholar Athlete of the Year, joining Levi Randolph (2015) and Justin Knox (2009).
- Obasohan has twice been named the SEC Player of the Week for the weeks of Feb. 8 and Dec. 14. In doing so, Obasohan became the first Alabama men's basketball player to earn the recognition twice in the same season since Kennedy Winston did so during the 2004-05 campaign.
- Obasohan is one of the most improved players in the nation when looking at just his numbers alone. **He has nearly tripled his per game scoring average from a year ago, while all of his other numbers have had drastic improvements.** Last season, Obasohan averaged 6.2 points, 2.9 rebounds and 0.8 assists in 19.5 minutes per game, while collecting 12 games with double figures and failed to reach 20 points in a game. During his senior year, he comes into the SEC Tournament game averaging 17.7 points, 3.9 rebounds and 2.6 assists in 32.6 minutes per contest, while collecting 14 games of 20 or more points 11 of which came during SEC play and 25 double-digit scoring games.
- Obasohan finished the SEC season averaging 20.6 points per game in SEC play. In doing so, he became the first Alabama player to average 20 or more points per game in league play since former great Buck Johnson achieved the feat when he averaged 20.4 ppg during league play back in the 1986 SEC season. Obasohan recorded 11 games of 20 or more points vs. SEC teams and has scored in double figures in all but one game in conference play.
- Obasohan has scored 549 points on the season, which ranks 30th in program history in points in a season. Should he score another 51 points this year, Obasohan would become just one of eight players in Alabama program history to reach the 600-point milestone for a season.

### ALABAMA COMPETING IN 103RD SEASON OF BASKETBALL

- · Alabama is in its 103rd season of basketball in 2015-16.
- The Tide has an all-time record of 1,618-967-1 (.619), which includes a 764-588 (.565) record in SEC play.
- Alabama ranks second in the SEC in league victories and all-time winning percentage.
- UA has made 32 NCAA (19) or NIT (13) appearances and has won seven SEC regular-season titles and six SEC Tournament championships.

### RETIN OBASOHAN EARNS A TRIO OF ALL-LEAGUE HONORS

- Senior guard Retin Obasohan was named the 2016 Southeastern Conference Scholar Athlete
  of the Year and First Team All-SEC, the league office announced on Tuesday morning. In
  addition, the Antwerp, Belgium, native earned a spot on the league's all-defensive team, giving
  him a trio of all-conference awards to cap what has been an outstanding season.
- Obasohan is the third player in program history, and the second in as many years, to claim
  the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year, joining former standouts Levi Randolph (2015) and
  Justin Knox (2009) as past recipients. Furthermore, Obasohan is the second player in program
  history to be named to both the league's first team and all-defensive team in the same season.
  Trevor Releford accomplished that feat back in 2013.
- Obasohan, the Tide's senior captain, ranked third in the SEC with an average of 20.6 points
  per game in league contests on his way to becoming the first player in 30 years to average
  more than 20 points per game in league play. The last player to accomplish the feat was Buck
  Johnson, who averaged 20.4 ppg in SEC play during the 1985-86 season. Obasohan finished
  the conference season ranked third in scoring average, fifth in field goal percentage (.496) and
  eighth in steals per game (1.4).
- For the season, Obasohan enters the SEC Tournament quarterfinals leading the Tide and ranking fifth in the SEC with 17.7 pointer per game. He has collected 14 games of 20 or more points – 11 of which came during SEC play – and 25 double-digit scoring games.

### SCOUTING ALABAMA

- Alabama enters the SEC Tournament quarterfinals coming off an impressive 81-73 victory over Ole Miss on Thursday night. Four players reached double figures for the Tide, led by Retin Obasohan's 17 points – all of which came in the second half.
- Obasohan, who boasts a team-leading 14 games of 20 or more points and two 30-point games, leads Alabama in scoring (17.7 ppg), steals (1.4) and minutes (32.6 mpg) through the Tide's 31 contests. The Antwerp, Belgium, native entered the SEC Tournament ranks fifth in the SEC in scoring average, sixth in field goal percentage (.473), which also leads all guards in the conference) and is seventh in both steals per game minutes per game.
- Junior forward Shannon Hale and senior guard Arthur Edwards rank second and third on this year's team in scoring average at 10.9 ppg and 9.4 ppg, respectively. Hale, who has missed five games on the season, ranks third on the team in double-figure scoring games (15) and is second in free throw percentage (.747). Meanwhile, Edwards ranks leads the team and ranks eighth in the SEC in three-point field goal percentage at 39.6 percent (65-of-164) for the year. He also is second on the team with 16 double-digit games on the year.
- Sophomore Riley Norris stepped up his play during the SEC season. The Albertville, Ala., native pulled down a career-high 16 rebounds in the win at LSU on Feb. 17 and led the team in league play in rebounding (6.1 rpg), ranked second in three-point field goal percentage (.380), while ranking fourth in scoring (8.3 ppg) and second in minutes per game (31.6).
- As a team, Alabama is being outscored by the competition for the season by 0.2 points per game (67.1-67.3). The Tide comes into the SEC Tournament quarterfinals ranked among the top defensive teams in the SEC. Entering the event, Alabama ranked second in the league in scoring defense (67.1) and three-point field goal percentage defense (.318) and is fifth in blocked shots per game (5.1) and field goal percentage defense (.403). Offensively, the Tide is fifth in three-pointers made per game (7.7).

### ALABAMA-KENTUCKY - SERIES NOTES

- Friday's game will mark the 145th meeting in series history between to two schools, and the
  third time this season the teams will square off on the hardwood. The Wildcats swept the
  regular season series, winning 77-61 in Tuscaloosa back on Jan. 9 and 78-53 in Lexington on
  Feb. 16.
- The 145 games played against one another stands as UA's sixth-most common opponent in program lore. Kentucky owns a 107-37 edge in the all-time series, including wins in five straight and 12 of the last 14 meetings.
- The Tide and Wildcats will meet for the 16th time in SEC Tournament history and will mark the first time the teams have squared off in the postseason since March 12, 2011. In the last postseason contest between the two teams, Kentucky defeated Alabama, 72-58, in Atlanta, Ga.
- Alabama is just 2-13 in games played against Kentucky in the SEC Tournament. It is the only team that Tide has a below .500 mark vs. conference teams in the league's tournament. The last time the Tide defeated UK in the SEC Tournament came on March 11, 1983 in Birmingham, Ala. (won 69-64). The only other time Alabama defeated the Wildcats in the postseason event on March 6, 1982 in Lexington, Ky. (won 48-46).
- The Tide has dropped 12 of the last 14 games played against the Wildcats. The last UA victory over UK came on a 59-55 win on Jan. 22, 2013 in Coleman Coliseum.

### ALABAMA SHOOTS PAST OLE MISS, 81-73, IN SEC TOURNAMENT SECOND ROUND

- The 10th-seeded Alabama men's basketball team knocked down 12 three-pointers to defeat seventh-seeded Ole Miss, 81-73, on Thursday night at Bridgestone Arena in the second round of the 2016 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament.
- Sophomore Riley Norris led the Tide with his third double-double of the year with 16 points and 11 rebounds. Senior Retin Obasohan finished with a team-high 17 points – all coming in the second half. Senior Arthur Edwards and sophomore Justin Coleman also finished in double figures with 15 points each.
- Alabama had a season-high 12 blocks, which matched the Tide's second-most blocks in an SEC Tournament game in
  program history (12 vs. Florida on March 6, 1997). Furthermore, freshman Donta Hall led the Tide with five blocks,
  which were the second-most in an SEC Tournament game an Alabama player. Hall finished just one block shy of the
  Alabama record for blocks in an SEC Tournament game set by Antonio McDyess in 1995.
- Alabama (18-13) was able to shake off a slow start by heating up from the outside. Sophomore Riley Norris got the Tide going with three buckets from deep in the opening five minutes. However, Alabama would have to overcome two early fouls on senior captain Retin Obasohan, who went to the bench at the 15:45 mark in the opening half.
- With the game tied, 16-16, Arthur Edwards made a three-pointer to give Alabama its first lead of the game. After the Rebels (20-12) answered to tie the game, the Tide sparked a 7-0 run to take a 26-19 lead and would never trail again. Alabama took a 40-36 lead to the locker room on the back of eight three pointers, tying its season high for threes in a half.
- The Tide used two big second half runs to take control of the game. The first run came with the score tied at 42-all, as Alabama went on an 8-0 spurt to take a 50-42 lead with 16:17 to play. Midway through the half, the Tide went on a 9-0 run to push the lead to 66-52, giving Alabama its largest lead of the game with just 7:49 to play. Ole Miss was able to chip away, but Alabama held on to give Avery Johnson his 18th win of the season.

### ALABAMA-OLE MISS: AN INSIDE LOOK AT THE NUMBERS

- What Won The Game For Alabama: Three-point shooting. Alabama connected on 12-of-24 shots from beyond the arc, including eight threes in the opening half. The 12 treys were the second-most made in a game by an Alabama team in its SEC Tournament history and also were the third-most in a game this season by the Tide.
- The Difference Maker: Retin Obasohan in the second half. The SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and first team All-SEC performer battled foul trouble and went scoreless in just 8 minutes of action in the opening half. However, Obasohan went for 17 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the field over the final 20 minutes to help lead the Tide to the win.
- The Wow Stat: Eight of Alabama's 15 made field goals in the opening half came from behind the arc. In fact, the Tide shot better from beyond the arc (12-of-24, 50.0 percent) than it did from the free throw line (13-of-28, 46.4 percent).

### **TOPPLING THE TOP 25**

- Alabama leads the SEC with four top-25 victories on the year and owns a record of 4-3 when playing ranked for the year. In the four years prior to this season (2011-15), the Tide was a combined 0-18 vs. top-25 opponents.
- Most recently, Alabama captured a 63-62 win over then-No. 15/13 Texas A&M on Feb. 10. It marked the first time since the 2001-02 season that the Tide has secured four top-25 wins during the regular season.
- It is the highest ranked team the Tide has toppled since defeating then-No. 12 Kentucky, 68-66, back on Jan. 18, 2011.
- Other ranked teams Alabama has defeated include then-No. 21 Wichita State (64-60) on Nov. 27 followed by a 74-73 victory over then-No. 17 Notre Dame on Nov. 29. The Tide also defeated then-No. 19 South Carolina, 73-50, on Jan. 13.
- Alabama's first two victories over ranked teams against Wichita State and Notre Dame came in back-to-back contests.
   It marked the first time Alabama had won consecutive games against ranked opponents since they defeated then-No.
   12 Florida on Feb. 26, 2006, after downing then-No.8 Tennessee on Feb. 18.
- The victory over Wichita State snapped a 21-game losing streak to ranked opponents dating back to Jan. 18, 2011, when Alabama beat then-No. 12 Kentucky at home (68-66). It also marked the first win over a ranked opponent at a neutral site since Nov. 29, 2009, when the Tide beat then-No. 15 Michigan.

### RETIN'S RISING

- Retin Obasohan has recorded 14 20-point games, has led the Tide in scoring 20 times and has 25 double-figure scoring contest this season. Moreover, he has reached the 20-point mark in nine of the last 15 games and 11 times during SEC play alone.
- The highlight over the stretch was Obasohan going for a career-high 35 points at LSU on Feb. 17. The senior
  guard connected on 11-of-18 shots from the floor and hit 11-of-11 foul shots against the Tigers.
- Obasohan currently leads the team in scoring (17.7 ppg), steals (44), minutes (32.6), field goals made (184) and attempted (388) and free throws made (135) and attempted (196), while ranking second in assists (2.6 apg).
- Obasohan only got better during league play. During the SEC season, Obasohan averaged 20.8 ppg, 4.7 rpg, 3.0 apg and 1.4 spg, while shooting 49.6 percent from the field and 41.8 percent from beyond the arc.

### RETIN OBASOHAN NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK...AGAIN

- Alabama men's basketball senior guard Retin Obasohan earned his second Southeastern Conference Player of the Week honor on Feb. 8. He also earned the recognition for the week of Dec. 14,
- Obasohan became the first Alabama men's basketball player to win the weekly honor twice in the same season since former standout Kennedy Winston achieved the feat during the 2005-06 campaign.
- Obasohan is just the fourth different Alabama men's basketball player to earn the league's POW award since 2013, joining Trevor Releford (week of Dec. 19, 2013), Levi Randolph (week of Nov. 24, 2015) and Ricky Tarrant (week of Dec. 29, 2015).

### RECORD IN CLOSE GAMES

- · Twenty-one of Alabama's 31 contests this season have been decided by fewer than 10 points. In all, Alabama owns a record of 13-8 in such games this season.
- Entering this season, Alabama owned a combined 13-22 (.371) record in games that were decided by less than 10 points over the last two years. Last season, the Tide went 8-10 in such contests, which was an improvement from going 5-12 in such games during the 2013-14 campaign.
- For the year, the Crimson Tide is 5-2 in one possession games, which is something that has not come easy for Alabama teams in the past two years. Alabama has combined for a record of 5-9 (.357) in one possession games over the last two years (3-5 in 2014-15 and 2-4 in 2015-16).

Alabama had three players in double digits to help push the Crimson Tide past the Kennesaw State Owls, 77-64, in front 14,970 fans inside Coleman Coliseum. The win was the first of head coach Avery Johnson's collegiate coaching career.

The 14,970 fans at the game was the largest crowd at a home opener since a crowd of 15,043 fans were in attendance against North Carolina in the 1989 season opener.

Alabama, which led wire to wire, held the Owls to just one point over the first 6:45 to build a 12-1 lead. With 17-48 left in the first half, the Tide went on a 19-4 run over 6:50, leading 21-5. The Tide took an 11-point lead to the locker room at halftime, up 43-32.

The second half began with a long scoring drought from KSU which went 0-of-4 and had three turnovers across 3:45. Alabama was bale to build its largest lead of the game, 52-35.

Kennesaw State responded midway through the half with an eight-point run of its own to close the gap to trail just 56-49, but that's as close as it would come.

Senior Retin Obasohan led Alabama with 18 points, while Dazon Ingram added 16 in his first career start. Shannon Hale scored 13. Taylor's 10 rebounds led the Tide. Alabama outscored the Owls 25-8 in points off of turnovers and had a 48-12 advantage in points in the paint.

Alabama fell its 2015-16 road opener, 80-48, against the Dayton Flyers at UD Arena.

It was a back-and-forth game early on, as the Tide's junior forward Jimmie Taylor opened the scoring on a put back off of an offensive rebound.

Sophomore forward Riley Norris gave the Tide the lead at 18-16 with 10 minutes left, however, it was all Dayton from that point on. The Flyers began with 1 10-0 run and would eventually stretch to a 24-6 run over the final 10 minutes to open up a 40-24 lead going into the locker room.

Dayton was a perfect 9-for-9 from the foul line in the half and shot 41 percent (13-of-32) from field, draining five from beyond the arc. Meanwhile, the Tide committed 10 turnovers and shot just 30 percent (9-of-30) from the floor.

Alabama could not gain any traction in the second half, making only eight field goals while turning the ball over 10 more times.

For the game, the Flyers made 46.7 percent (28-60) of their shots, which included 9-of-21 from behind the arc. Dayton also hauled in 47 rebounds. The Tide was 29.8 percent (17-57) overall and recorded 34 rebounds.

The loss was the largest margin of defeat since a 105-71 setback against Ole Miss on March 3, 2001.

Alabama used 15 three-point baskets and six double-figure scoring efforts to earn the 105-93 victory over Louisiana.

The 100-plus points marked the first time the Crimson Tide has finished in triple-figures since Nov. 18, 2013, against Stillman College, and was the first time against a Division I foe since Dec. 27, 2005, when the Tide took down Jackson State, 101-66. The last time Alabama scored 105 points was 10 years ago to the day against Alabama State on Nov. 20, 2005. Moreover, the Tide's 15 three-pointers were the most an Alabama team has collected since they hit a school record 19 against East Tennessee State on Dec. 1, 2004.

The Tide made its first seven three-point attempts and used an 18-4 run midway through the first half to take a 29-14 lead.

The Tide led 55-39 at halftime and continued to control the game in the second half, while shooting 54 percent from the field. Alabama finished the game shooting 60 percent from three-point range and 74 percent from the free throw line.

Riley Norris, Shannon Hale and Justin Coleman each had 18 points to lead the team. Coleman's added eight assists (one turnover), while Dazon Ingram added 10 points, a team-high seven rebounds and five assists. Retin Obasohan had 17 points, while Arthur Edwards added 12.

Alabama fell to No. 23 Xavier, 64-45, in the opening round of the AdvoCare Classic on Thanksgiving Day.

The Tide got out to a strong start over the first five minutes, taking a 9-2 lead and holding Xavier to 0-of-5 shooting. Alabama also outrebounded the Musketeers 9-3 during the stretch. The Tide then went cold, shooting just 2-of-10 from the field in the next five minutes as Xavier answered back with their first field goal at the 13-47 mark to spark a 6-0 run and pull within one point.

With 9:52 to play in the first half, Alabama began a five-plus minute scoring drought that saw it turn the ball over six times as Xavier used another 6-0 run to take a 14-13 lead. The Tide finished the half down 27-24.

### ALABAMA 64 NO. 20 WICHITA STATE 60

Nov. 27, 2015 • Orlando, Fla. HP Field House • 4,170

Alabama upset No. 20 Wichita State, 64-60, in the second round of the 2015 AdvoCare Invitational.

The win snapped a 21-game losing streak to ranked opponents and was the first win over a ranked opponent at a neutral site since Nov. 29, 2009, when the Tide beat then-No. 15 Michigan.

The game saw eight ties and nine lead changes, and was not decided until the final 10 seconds.

Alabama started off well when it took an early lead, as the Shockers failed to score for four minutes beginning at the 18:49 mark. The Tide finished the half strong by going on a 14-6 run over the last 3:41 to take a 32-30 lead at intermission.

Wichita State put together an 11-5 run to start the second half and took a 41-39 lead at the 16:13 mark. Alabama had three turnovers in 90 seconds during the run. The Tide then went 1-of-7 shooting over the next six minutes to fall behind 48-45. That would be the largest lead by Wichita State, as Alabama responded with a 9-1 run to grab a 52-49 lead. However, the Shockers answered with back-to-back threes for a 55-52 lead at the nine-minute mark.

The Tide would again respond, this time with back-to-back threes from Shannon Hale and Riley Norris to retake the lead, 58-55, and never trailed again.

Hale finished with 20 points on 6-of-10 shooting and 6-of-7 from the free throw line. Norris added 12 and Ingram scored 11. Ingram was the Tide's leading rebounder with eight boards, while Arthur Edwards added five. The Tide finished shooting a season-best 76 percent at the free throw line.

The Alabama men's basketball team earned its second upset over a top-25 team in three days, taking down No.17 Notre Dame, 74-73, on Nov. 29 at the AdvoCare Invitational in Orlando, Fla.

Senior guard Retin Obasohan finished with a game-high 19 points, and converted a last-second layup to secure the victory, while junior Shannon Hale also had 19. Graduate transfer Arthur Edwards finished with a career-high 15 points and junior forward Michael Kessens led the team with nine rebounds to go along with eight points off the bench.

The Alabama men's basketball won its third consecutive game, defeating Southern Miss for its first true road win, 58-55. The Tide used a big 19-4 second half run to hold off the Golden Eagles.

Retin Obasohan led the Tide with a seasonhigh 20 points to go along with five rebounds and three steals.. Arthur Edwards set a career high for the second consecutive game, tallying 17 while going 5-of-8 from behind the arc, to go along with five boards. Shannon Hale finished with nine points but struggled offensively, hitting just 3-of-10 shots from the floor on the night.

Trailing by five points, 39-34, at the 15:29 mark of the second half, the Tide used a 19-4 run over the next 8:03 to build a ten-point lead at 53-43 with 7:09 to play. That run included a 12-0 stretch when Southern Miss failed to score for eight minutes while shooting 0-of-9.

Alabama won its third straight one-possession game, defeating Clemson on the road, 51-50. The victory also marked the Tide's fourth consecutive win away from home.

The Tide finished with a season high 44 rebounds, including 21 on the offensive glass, while senior Retin Obasohan set a career-high with 23 points. His previous career high came against Charleston Southern on Dec. 14, 2013.

The Tide trailed 50-49 with under a minute to play when Shannon Hale stole a pass and took it to the rim for what would be the game-winning dunk. Clemson ran the clock down to just under five seconds before shooting for the win. Clemson slowly chipped away at the deficit for the entire second half and pulled to within four, down 45-41, with 10 minutes to play. From that point on the Tide made just one of its 13 field goal attempts, until Hale's heroics.

Alabama, without leading rebounder Dazon Ingram (5.9 rpg), grabbed 44 boards to Clemson's 30, and is now 2-0 when outrebounding their opponent. Justin Coleman, who started in place of Ingram, finished with a career-best five rebounds.

Alabama lost to Oregon at Birmingham's Legacy Arena in the Vulcan Classic, 72-68. Sophomore Justin Coleman set a career high with 24 points, but the Tide let a 12-point halftime lead slip away in the second half.

Alabama had a chance to win in the final seconds. Down 68-65, sophomore Riley Norris attempted a three-point shot with 19 seconds left that fell short. The Tide immediately fouled the Ducks. Arthur Edwards sank a three-point shot with six seconds left to pull within two, but the Tide was forced to foul, sending Oregon back to the line to secure the four-point victory.

The Tide started hot, shooting 63 percent from beyond the arc in the first half. Coleman scored 12 unanswered points by himself to give Alabama a 17-8 lead with 11:14 left in the first half. With 10:28 left before the break, Alabama used a 15-6 run to take a 32-20 lead, it's largest of the game. The Tide would take a 38-26 lead into the locker room.

Oregon came out of the break strong, using a 21-6 run to take a 47-44 lead with 13:53 to play. Neither team took more than a six-point lead for the rest of the game. Coleman tied the game at 60 with back-to-back three-pointers with 5:42 left in the game. Norris would later tie it 65-65 with 2:22 to play but the Tide never regained the lead.

The Ducks forced 14 turnovers for 22 points and stole the ball nine times. Alabama lost the rebounding battle 35-30.

Coleman led the Tide in scoring while making a career-high seven field goals and matching his high with six free throws. Norris and Edwards each finished with 12 points. Jimmie Taylor and Norris led the team with five rebounds each.

Alabama' won in overtime against Jacksonville State, 67-59. The Tide, which held a double-figure lead in the second half, used a 10-0 run in overtime to take control of the game.

Arthur Edwards led Alabama with 16 points to go along with five rebounds and three assists, while Riley Norris scored 10 points and grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds for his second career double-double. Jimmie Taylor added 13 points and six rebounds while blocking a season-high five shots.

After starting the second half 6-of-10 from the field and take a 46-33 lead with 11:13 remaining in regulation, Alabama went cold, missing its final 11 attempts and allowing the Gamecocks to pull back to a 55-55 tie. The Tide had a chance to win in the final seconds, but senior guard Retin Obasohan missed both potential game-winning free throw chances with 2.3 seconds left on the clock.

After allowing an early bucket in overtime, Alabama scored 10 unanswered points while going a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line after making just 20-of-35 in regulation. The Gamecocks would not score again until there were 29 seconds remaining.

The first half featured seven lead changes and two ties before Jacksonville State took a 29-27 lead to the locker room. Alabama shot 43 percent and was outrebounded 20-13. The Tide stayed in the game by forcing eight Gamecock turnovers in the first frame alone.

Alabama started the second half with a 19-4 run over the first 8:47 to take a 46-33 lead, its largest of the game, and seemed on its way to a victory. However, the Gamecocks immediately answered with a 13-3 run of their own to trim the lead to 49-46 with 2:14 left to play. Jacksonville State continued to claw its way back with a pair of threes in the final minute to tie the game at 55-55.

Alabama started the new year with a 68-49 win over Norfolk State at Coleman Coliseum in its final non-conference game of the regular season. The Crimson Tide held the Spartans to just 25 percent shooting over the second half to take control of the game.

Retin Obasohan matched his career high, going for a game-high 23 points on 9-of-12 shooting from the floor and 3-of-6 from beyond the arc. The Antwerp, Belgium, native had a season-high four steals as he recorded third 20-point game of the season. Arthur Edwards matched his career high with five three-point baskets to add 15 points, while Riley Norris came off the bench to record 10 points and eight boards.

Alabama put together an 8-0 run early in the game to take a 14-8 lead with 12:18 remaining before the break. Alabama used hot shooting throughout the opening stanza to take a 33-28 edge at halftime as six of the Tide's 10 made field goals were from beyond the arc (6-of-14). Obasohan scored 14 points in the opening 20 minutes, while junior forward Michael Kessens pulled down eight of his game-high nine rebounds.

Alabama outscored Norfolk State 15-5 to start the second half, taking a 15-point lead at 48-23. Just over a minute later Alabama started a 16-3 run that would last seven-plus minutes and push the score to 64-38. The Tide cruised from there, capturing its 15th consecutive non-conference home victory at Coleman Coliseum.

The Tide's defense stepped up after the break. Obasohan recorded all four of his steals in the second half and the team forced eight turnovers overall. The game marks the first time the Tide has held a team to under 50 points since Feb. 4, 2015, when Alabama defeated Missouri 62-49.

### ALABAMA 66 OLE MISS 74

Jan. 7, 2016 • Oxford, Miss. The Pavilion at Ole Miss • 9,500

Alabama began conference play with a loss at Ole Miss (11-3, 1-1 SEC). The Crimson Tide controlled the first half but let the game get away in the second thanks to being outscored 42-26 after the break.

The Rebels, opening their new facility The Pavilion, took an early 25-15 lead on the back of a 7-0 run and 6-of-8 free throw shooting. Alabama (9-4, 0-1 SEC) responded with a 25-7 run over the last 8:36 of the first half to take a 40-32 lead. Senior guard Retin Obasohan and graduate transfer Arthur Edwards each scored 14 points in the opening frame. The Tide defense held Ole Miss to just 33 percent shooting and recorded five steals.

Alabama suffered its first true home loss of the season, dropping a 77-61 decision against No. 9/8 Kentucky.

Kentucky shot 68 percent over the second half any attempt at an Alabama comeback. The Tide closed to within four points early in the second period, but the Tide made two of its last 11 shot attempts as the Wildcats pulled away.

The game was played in front of a sellout crowd of 15,383 fans - the Tide's first packed house of the year.

UK led by as many as 16 points in the first half, but the Tide finished on a 6-0 run and headed to the locker room down 38-28. Alabama stayed hot out of the break to extend the run to 14-4 and make the score 42-36 with 16:43 to play. Alabama was able to cut the lead down four points, 46-42, after a follow-up dunk by Jimmie Taylor, but Kentucky began a 12-2 run that lasted just over five minutes and put the game out of reach.

Alabama sunk seven three-pointers and blocked seven shots for the second game in a row. The Tide was 18-of-27 from the free throw line, but lost the rebounding battle 43-25. Kentucky also outscored Alabama 34-20 in the paint.

Senior Retin Obasohan finished with 21 points to mark his third straight game with more than 20 points. It was also the fifth 20-point game on the season for Obasohan, who hit 3-of-4 three pointers. Senior guard Arthur Edwards scored 11, while sophomore Riley Norris added 10. Junior Jimmie Taylor and freshman Donta Hall each led the Tide with six rebounds and Taylor blocked a game-high four shots.

# NO. 19 SOUTH CAROLINA 50 ALABAMA 73

Riley Norris scored a career-high 27 points and tied a school record with eight three-pointers to lead the Alabama past No. 19/15 South Carolina, 73-50, in Coleman Coliseum. The Tide handed the previously undefeated Gamecocks their first loss of the year as Crimson Tide captured its third victory over a top-25 team this season.

Making his first start this year, Norris hit 8-of-11 treys on the night. He became the sixth different player in program history to reach the milestone and the first since Mykal Riley accomplished the feat on March 16, 2008.

Furthermore, in addition to Johnson securing his first Southeastern Conference win on Wednesday night, the Tide also captured its first home win over a ranked team since defeating then-No. 12 Kentucky, 68-66, on Jan. 18, 2011.

Alabama got off to a hot start with a 19-4 run over the first 8:21 that saw Norris sink four three-pointers on his way to 18 first half points. The Albertville, Ala., native hit all five of his three-pointers in the opening stanza to help the Tide take a 35-22 lead to the locker room.

South Carolina would fail to score over the first eight minutes of the second half, as Alabama used a 13-0 run to build a 26-point lead at 48-22 with 14:07 left. Alabama would take its largest lead of the game moments late on a Norris three-pointer to put them up by 27.

Alabama made 13 three-pointers and won the rebounding battle 38-30 to improve to 5-0 this season when outrebounding the opposition.

In addition to his scoring output, Norris led the team with seven rebounds to go along hitting 9-of-16 shots from the field. Justin Coleman scored 14 points, five rebounds and had a game-high six assists, while Shannon Hale added eight points off the bench.

### ALABAMA 63 Vanderbilt 71

Jan. 16, 2016 • Nashville, Tenn. Memorial Gym • 12,565

Alabama dropped the game at Vanderbilt, 71-63. The Tide connected on just 7-of-20 free throws (32 percent) and 6-of-20 (32 percent) from beyond the arc en route to its 12th loss in its last 13 contests at Memorial Gymnasium.

Alabama kept the game close through the first half. After falling behind early, the Tide used a 6-0 run to tie the game at 14-14 with 9:45 on the clock. Vanderbilt answered with an 8-0 run of its own to take a 23-16 lead. However, Alabama responded with another 6-0 run to pull within one point at the 4:54 mark. The teams were never separated by more than three points again in the first half.

Junior forward Shannon Hale scored 11 of his team-leading 13 points in the first half. Alabama outscored the Commodores 24-6 in the paint, recorded three blocks, and led the rebounding battle 17-14 at halftime.

Vanderbilt began the second half on a 10-1 run to take an 11-point lead, 43-32, with 15:02 left in the game. The Tide trailed by as many as 16 points, 63-47 with 3:02 left, before a late rally trimmed the lead to single digits in the final seconds.

Vanderbilt had a big advantage at the free throw line, hitting 22-of-36 from the charity stripe compared to 7-of-20 free throws made for Alabama. The Tide won the battle of the boards, 39-29, marking the first time it has lost a game when outrebounding the competition (5-1).

Hale's 13 points led the Tide's offense, while Arthur Edwards (12) and Retin Obasohan (10) also finished in double figures. Jimmie Taylor finished with eight points and team highs of nine rebounds and three blocked shots.

### **ALABAMA 77 AUBURN** 83

### Jan. 19, 2016 • Auburn, Ala. Auburn Arena • 9,121

Alabama fell to Auburn, 83-77, in front of a sold out crowd at Auburn Arena. Senior guard Retin Obasohan recorded his team-leading sixth 20-point game of the season, going for a careerhigh 27 points in the losing effort.

The Crimson Tide had three starters foul out of the contest in Jimmie Taylor, Michael Kessens and Arthur Edwards. Both Alabama (29) and Auburn (24) were whistled for a combined 53 fouls resulting in 40 free throw attempts by the Tigers and 28 for the Tide. Auburn finished the game outscoring Alabama by nine points at the free throw line (28-19).

Auburn was able to take the lead for good thanks to a 6-0 run over 1:11 to take a 58-51 lead with 13:39 left . Alabama was able to cut the lead to two points, but could not get any closer. In all, the game featured nine lead changes and six ties and neither team led by more than seven points in the

The Tide started the game off well. After going down 10-2 in the early minutes, Alabama used a 22-4 run over a span of 8:24 to take a 24-14 lead - the largest lead of the game for either team. Auburn quickly answered with eight consecutive points, all on free throws, on its way to an 11-0 spurt that would see the Tigers regain the lead. The teams were separated by just three points at halftime, with the Tide trailing 40-37.

Obasohan, who has reached the 20-point mark in six of his last 11 games, was joined in double figures by junior forward Shannon Hale, who finished with 13 points off the bench. Junior Jimmie Taylor recorded a team-leading eight rebounds to go along with eight points before fouling out with just under five minutes to play. Sophomore guard Justin Coleman added nine points and a team-high five assists.

### LSU **72 ALABAMA** 70

Alabama lost in the final seconds to LSU, 72-70, in front of a sold out crowd at Coleman Coliseum. Senior guard Retin Obasohan finished 20 points, but his final layup to tie the game came

With the scored tied at 70, Tim Quarterman made a put-back layup to give LSU a two-point lead with 33.7 seconds on the clock. Obasohan missed his first attempt at a game-tying layup, but created a tie-up with the LSU defenders to force a jump ball and keep the ball from alternating possession with 17.1 seconds left. After a timeout, Obasohan had a second chance to send the game to overtime, but his shot missed and the Tigers secured the rebound.

Obasohan added five rebounds and a teamleading four assists to his 20-point total. It was his team-leading seventh 20-point performance on the season. Edwards matched his career high with 17 points, while Norris finished with his third career double-double, recording 10 points and a team-leading 10 rebounds.

Alabama finished the first half on a 22-9 run over the last eight-plus minutes to take a 41-36 lead to the locker room. Arthur Edwards scored seven points over the run and finished the half

Midway through the second half, the Tide took a 60-54 lead, its largest of the contest. The Tigers immediately answered with a 6-0 run to tie the game, and the teams were never separated by more than three points again. The game featured six ties and 11 lead changes. Alabama dropped its first one possession game this season (3-1) and is now 4-2 in games decided by four points or less.

The loss snaps Alabama's 10-game home winning streak against LSU, which dated back to a 60-54 defeat to the Tigers on Jan. 31, 2004.

Alabama used a 16-2 run over the final four minutes and finished with an improbable 63-57 victory over Tennessee. UA trailed 48-33 with 13:54 left, but outscored the Volunteers 30-9 the rest of the way to snap a three-game losing streak.

Retin Obasohan finished with a game-high 22 points, while Shannon Hale added a season-high 20 points en route to the victory.

The Tide got off to a rough start, scoring just four points in the first 10 minutes of the game, which allowed the Volunteers to take a 16-4 lead. However, Alabama ended the half on a 14-6 run to pull within one point at the break, 25-24. The Tide overcame a first half that featured 11 turnovers and just 18 percent shooting from beyond the arc.

Alabama immediately scored out of the break, but Tennessee used a 21-5 run over the next 4:52 to take a commanding 48-33 lead with 13:54 remaining in the contest. But the tide turned as Hale scored 10 straight points for a 10-0 Alabama run to pull Alabama within five points. After a Tennessee timeout, the momentum continued when Obasohan scored consecutive buckets, the last coming in the form of an electric dunk that sent the 11,429 fans into a frenzy. The 14-0 run pulled Alabama within one point, 48-47.

After the Tide had a couple of chances to take the lead. Tennessee, which was 0-of-12 from the field during the run, answered with a 7-0 push of its own to take a 55-47 lead with 4:16 left.

But the Tide showed resiliency as it finished the game on 16-2 run to result in the final score. Graduate senior Arthur Edwards gave his team the lead for good on a three-pointer with 38 seconds remaining. The Alabama defense then held, and Obasohan finished the game with an and-1, converting a layup and the ensuing free throw.

Riley Norris finished with a career-high 13 rebounds and three steals to go along with six points.

### ALABAMA 82 MISSISSIPPI STATE 80

Retin Obasohan recorded 25 points and a career-best eight assists to lead Alabama to an 82-80 overtime victory at Mississippi State. It was the sixth consecutive win in the series for the Crimson Tide, the longest streak in the series since winning six straight from 1985-87. It is also the fourth victory in the last five trips to Humphrey Coliseum.

Obasohan scored 16 points in the first half en route to his fifth straight game of 20 or more points. Riley Norris had 16 points, while Justin Coleman added 15 points.

UA led throughout the opening half and took a 38-34 lead at half. With UA leading 43-42 at the 15:10 mark, a Coleman three sparked an 8-0 to give UA its biggest lead of the game, 51-42. However, MSU responded with 14-0 run for their first lead of the game to take a 56-51 lead with 8:53 remaining.

State led by as many as seven (64-57) with five minutes left, but Alabama rallied tie the game at 65-65 with 1:43 left. Each team scored once more before the final minute.

MSU scored four straight points, but the Tide evened the score at 73-73. Alabama then went ahead 76-74 thanks to a three-point play by Obasohan with 2:05 to play. Coleman made another shot from deep after the Bulldogs tied the score at 76-76. Alabama went 3-of-4 from the free throw line, two makes from Coleman and one by Norris, in the last nine seconds to ice the victory.

For the game, the Tide shot 27-of-58 (46.6 percent), including 11-of-29 from beyond the arc. Mississippi State was 33-for-71 (46.5 percent) from the floor, but just 3-for-18 from deep. Alabama grabbed 40 rebounds compared to 39 for the Bulldogs, but the Tide committed 20 turnovers to only 12 by Mississippi State.

Alabama led by as many as 24 points and went on to defeat Missouri, 80-71, in front of a sellout crowd at Coleman Coliseum. Five Crimson Tide players scored double-digit points, led by sophomore forward Riley Norris' 18-point day.

In addition to Norris' scoring output, senior guard Retin Obasohan tallied 16 points to go along with a game-high seven rebounds and four assists on the night. Sophomore guard Justin Coleman had his second straight solid outing, finishing with 14 points and a team-leading five assists.

The Tide took control of the game early with a 15-2 run midway through the first half. The run turned a 16-16 tie into a 31-18 lead for Alabama. The Tide outrebounded Missouri 20-13 in the first half and turned the ball over just three times en route to taking a 40-28 lead into the locker room.

Out of the break, the teams traded baskets until Alabama went on a 10-0 run to extend its lead to the largest of the lead, 67-43, with 9:28 remaining.

However, the Tigers never gave up and responded with an 8-0 spurt to cut the Alabama lead to 67-51. Missouri eventually cut the lead to single digits down the stretch, but could not overcome the Tide's advantage.

Alabama shot 47 percent from the field and 50 percent in the second half. The team blocked nine shots with Jimmie Taylor and Donta Hall each recording four swats. Alabama finished with 21 second chance points.

Arthur Edwards (11) and Jimmie Taylor (11) also finished in double figures. It was the second time this season that Alabama has had five players score in double-figures. Both Taylor and Donta Hall blocked four shots on the night.

Alabama upset No. 15/13 Texas A&M, winning 63-62 in Coleman Coliseum. With the win the Tide has now defeated four teams ranked in the AP Top 25 in the regular season for the first time since 2001-02.

Alabama built an 11-point lead with 6:34 to play, but the Aggies battled back to pull within one in the final seconds. Texas A&M guard Anthony Collins had a chance to win the game or send it to overtime, but Collins, a 93 percent free throw shooter for year entering the contest, missed both free throws with just two seconds on the clock. The Tide then ran out the clock to seal the victory.

Retin Obasohan led the team with 16 points five assists and three steals. He now has 11 double-digit scoring games in the last 12 contests. Donta Hall grabbed a season-high 10 rebounds to go along with six points and a pair of steals in 21 minutes of action.

Alabama was down early, but used a 14-4 run over the final 9:13 of the first half to take a 32-27 lead at half. Riley Norris scored all 11 of his points in the first half. Both teams shot well in the opening frame, sinking a combined 11 three-pointers.

Texas A&M regained the lead three minutes into the second half, going up 38-37. However, Alabama immediately answered with an 8-0 run and would never trail again. The Tide held the Aggies scoreless for nearly five minutes during the run. With 9:04 to play, Alabama used a 7-0 run to extend its lead to 58-47 - its largest lead of the game.

Then the Aggies rallied, using a 15-5 run over the final six and a half minutes to pull within one point and setting the stage for the dramatic finish.

Alabama defeated Florida on the road on, 61-55. The win snapped an 11-game losing streak to the Gators and also marks the first time the Tide has won in Gainesville since Feb. 25, 1995 (10 straight losses).

The Tide had to overcome adversity to clinch its fourth straight win and fifth win over its last six games. Leading 48-44 with 5:35 to play, senior Retin Obasohan was charged with his fifth foul.

Arthur Edwards fouled out just 13 seconds later, but Alabama responded by holding Florida to 0-of-6 from the field over the next two minutes. In doing so, Alabama was able to extend its lead going on a 9-4 run over the next 5:03 to stretch its lead to 57-49 with 39 seconds remaining.

Obasohan was one of four Alabama players to reach double-figures with a game-high 15 points to go along with team highs of seven rebounds and two assists. Junior Jimmie Taylor had a big game as he finished with 11, including a couple of thunderous dunks late in the game, to go along with five blocked shots. Sophomore Justin Coleman and junior Shannon Hale each added 10 points off the bench.

Coleman ended the first half with a buzzer-beating three-pointer as Alabama trailed by four at halftime, 27-23. Both teams shot just 30 percent in the opening frame (9-of-30). Florida outrebounded the Tide 26-18 with 10 offensive rebounds.

The Tide pulled even with the Gators early in the second half, but would not take a lead until midway through the half. A 7-0 run over 2:16 gave Alabama a six-point lead, up 47-41, with 6:34 to play.

Alabama defeated Florida on the road on, 61-55. The win snapped an 11-game losing streak to the Gators and also marks the first time the Tide has won in Gainesville since Feb. 25, 1995 (10 straight losses).

Senior Retin Obasohan scored a career-high 35 points, including 23 in the second half, to lead the Alabama men's basketball to an impressive 76-69 victory over league-leaders LSU on Wednesday night in Baton Rouge, La. Obasohan, who also eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for his career, became the first Crimson Tide player to score 35 points in a game since Trevor Releford went for 35 in triple overtime at LSU on Feb. 23, 2013.

Obasohan was not the only Alabama player to shine, as Justin Coleman scored 21 points on the strength of a career-best five three pointers, while Arthur Edwards scored 12 points. Combined, the trio accounted for 68 of the Tide's 76 points on the night.

Alabama used two second half runs to take control of the game. Down 46-38 with 15:49 to play, the Tide used a 10-1 run to take its first lead in the second half. Obasohan scored his 1,000th career point on an 18-foot jumper with 5:54 left to tie the game at 53-53. Later in the half, a 7-0 run at the 3:26 mark gave Alabama control of the game, 69-62.

LSU built a first half lead on the back of a 13-3 run over four-plus minutes and took a 36-31 lead to the locker room.

Obasohan finished 11-of-18 from the field and a perfect 11-of-11 at the foul throw line. Sophomore Riley Norris also played impressively, as he recorded a career-high 16 rebounds.

Alabama fell to Mississippi State, 67-61, in front of a sellout crowd at Coleman Coliseum. Shannon Hale finished with a season-high 22 points, but a late run by the Bulldogs helped snap a six-game losing streak to the Tide in the series.

Playing in front of its fourth home sellout of the season, Alabama cut the Mississippi State lead to one point, 58-57, late in the contest. However, the Bulldogs went on 9-4 run the rest of the way to seal the win.

Retin Obasohan scored 22 points to go along with six rebounds and three steals. It marked his 12th game of scoring 20 or more points and 20th double-figure scoring game of the year. Combined, Obasohan and Hale scored 44 of Alabama's 61 points.

The Bulldogs pulled away with a 15-3 run over 9:19 in the first half to take a 27-18 lead with 3:28 on the clock. Alabama battled back and Obasohan hit a buzzer-beating shot to trim the Bulldogs lead to 32-29.

The second half began with a pair of technical fouls on each team. Mississippi State's Gavin Ware was called for the first one with 17:46 to play. Just 15 seconds later, Alabama head coach Avery Johnson was whistled for his first technical foul of the season. That seemed to ignite the Tide, as it used a 7-0 run to pull within one point at 41-40 with 14:42 remaining.

However, Mississippi State immediately answered with a 6-0 run of their own to stretch its lead back up to seven, 48-41, with 11:02 left.

Trailing 58-51 with 6:05 left, Alabama refused to go away and rallied for six consecutive points late to make it a one point game with 4:27 to play. But the Tide could not get any closer as Mississippi State claimed its first win in Tuscaloosa since Jan. 19, 2008.

Alabama fell to No. 16/14 Kentucky, 78-53, in front of a sellout crowd in Rupp Arena. Retin Obasohan finished with a game-high 29 points, which marked his 12th game scoring 20 or more points this season.

Kentucky, which entered the game in first place in the Southeastern Conference, used two runs to build a big lead. Over the last nine minutes of the first half, the Wildcats used a 16-2 run to turn a 17-15 contest into a 33-17 lead. Obasohan ended the half with a buzzer-beating layup and had 15 points at the break. Midway through the second half, Kentucky used an 11-1 run over three minutes to push the score to 55-33 with 11:03 to play. Alabama would never get closer than 14 points after that.

Obasohan scored over half the Tide's points, outscoring his teammates 29-24. He finished 9-of-13 from the field and 10-for-12 at the free throw line. Justin Coleman added eight points, while Brandon Austin put up six. Donta Hall led the team with eight rebounds.

The Tide shot just 26 percent from the field in the first half and was whistled for 14 fouls. Alabama finished the game 17-of-48 from the field. Kentucky went to the free throw line 28 times, where they scored 22 points.

Alabama lost the rebounding battle 41-29 and was outscored 40-22 in the paint. The Tide also turned the ball over a dozen times. The Wildcats scored on 60 percent of their possessions while holding Alabama to just 35 percent.

Alabama defeated Auburn, 65-57, in front of a sold out Coleman Coliseum. The Tide fell behind early in the second half, but outscored the Tigers 28-11 over the final 14:28 to seal the victory and give head coach Avery Johnson his first win in the series.

Alabama fell behind early in the second half as Auburn used a 15-3 run over the first five minutes of the frame to turn a two-point halftime deficit into a 44-34 with 14:58 left. However, the Tide quickly answered the Tigers' run with a 14-4 run of its own to tie the game at 48-48 with 6:34 to play.

From that point on, senior guard Retin Obasohan came up clutch by hitting key baskets down the stretch. Obasohan, who scored 11 of his game-high 16 points in the final 10:34, gave the Tide the lead for good with a layup at the 6:46 mark to push Alabama ahead, 50-49.

Alahama lost in the final seconds to Arkansas on by a final score of 62-61. The Crimson Tide had two opportunities to win the game in the final minute, but missed on both attempts.

The back-and-forth contest featured 12 ties and 13 lead changes as neither team was separated by more than four points over the final 15-plus minutes. With the win, Arkansas snapped a sevengame losing streak in Coleman Coliseum and it marked the Razorbacks' sixth win in 25 games played at Alabama. The last time an Arkansas team won in Coleman Coliseum came on Jan. 27, 2007.

Arkansas led 59-58 before making one of two free throws with 13.4 seconds left. After a timeout, Retin Obasohan's layup attempt missed as the shot clock wound down. Alabama recovered the rebound, and sophomore Justin Coleman quickly put up an attempt from beyond the arc, which also

Obasohan committed a foul with four seconds to play and sent the Razorbacks to the line, where Anthlon Bell made both free throws to take a 62-58 lead and seal the game. Obasohan knocked down a 35-footer as the buzzer sounded.

Obasohan, who scored 23 of the Tide's 34 second half points, led the way as he finished with 32 points - just three points off his career high of 35 set at LSU just two prior (Feb. 17).

Shannon Hale was the only other Crimson Tide player to finish in double digits, going for 10 points on the night. Donta Hall had another solid performance with five points, seven rebounds and a season-best five blocked shots in 21 minutes.

The Crimson Tide honored Obasohan and graduate transfer Arthur Edwards, who finished with six points and three assists, before the game for Senior Night.

Alabama lost the final game of the regular season at Georgia, 70-63. Junior forward Shannon Hale finished with a game-high and season-high 25 points.

The Crimson Tide kept the game close despite losing the rebounding battle, 48-26. The Bulldogs pulling down 19 offensive rebounds, compared to eight for Alabama, resulting in a 13-3 advantage in second-chance points

With 7:53 left to play, Georgia used a 9-2 run to take a 58-52 lead. Still trailing, 60-54, with 2:30 on the clock, Alabama began fouling. The Bulldogs' leading scorer J.J. Frazier sunk 10 consecutive free throws to keep the Tide at bay.

The teams played a close first half, with Georgia leading 27-25 at the break. Junior forward Jimmie Taylor blocked five shots in the opening frame and Hale put up eight points.

The Bulldogs scored the first six points of the second half to lead 33-25, but the Tide immediately answered with a 15-5 run over the next five minutes to take the lead, 40-38. Including the last five points of the Tide's run, Hale scored 15 straight points before Georgia regained the lead

Hale fouled out late in the game along with junior Michael Kessens. Senior Retin Obasohan added 15 points, and sophomore Riley Norris led the Tide with six rebounds. Obasoban recorded two steals to move into sole possession of eighth place in school history in the category.

The Tide finishes Avery Johnson's first season as head coach with a 17-13 record in the regular season. Johnson's eight conference wins are the most by a first-year head coach since Wimp Sanderson recorded 10 in the 1980-81 season.

Tenth-seeded Alabama knocked down 12 three-pointers to defeat seventh-seeded Ole Miss, 81-73, at Bridgestone Arena in the second round of the 2016 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament.

Riley Norris led the Tide with his third double-double of the year with 16 points and 11 rebounds. Retin Obasohan finished with a teamhigh 17 points - all coming in the second half.

Alabama had a season-high 12 blocks, which matched the Tide's second-most blocks in an SEC Tournament game in program history (12 vs. Florida on March 6, 1997). Furthermore, Donta Hall led the Tide with five blocks, which were the second-most in an SEC Tournament game by an Alabama player. Hall finished just one block shy of the Alabama record for blocks in an SEC Tournament game set by Antonio McDyess in

Norris got the Tide going with three buckets from deep in the opening five minutes. With the game tied, 16-16, Edwards made a three-pointer to give Alabama its first lead of the game. After the Rebels answered to tie the game, the Tide sparked a 7-0 run to take a 26-19 lead and would never trail again. Alabama took a 40-36 lead to the locker room on the back of eight three pointers, tying its season high for threes in a half.

The Tide used two big second half runs to take control of the game. The first run came with the score tied at 42-all, as Alabama went on an 8-0 spurt to take a 50-42 lead with 16:17 to play. Midway through the half, the Tide went on a 9-0 run to push the lead to 66-52, giving Alabama its largest lead of the game with just 7:49 to play. Ole Miss was able to chip away at the lead down the stretch, but Alabama held on to give Avery Johnson his 18th win of the season. The win ties Wimp Sanderson's mark in the 1980-81 season for the most by a first-year head coach in school history.
