COMMONWEALTH STADIUM

Through a \$120-million reinvention, Commonwealth Stadium transformed into a state-of-the-art facility in the 2015 season. The new Commonwealth Stadium has taken on a modern look, but one that remains uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Commonwealth (61,000) has been reduced over the course of the two-year project, but the value of all remaining seats have been increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses have been revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and premium spaces.

Players and coaches have reaped the benefits of the new Commonwealth Stadium as well, as new home-team facilities have been built and new multi-purpose recruiting room plays host to future Wildcats on their on-campus visits.

The Wildcats look forward to opening their 44th season at Commonwealth Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 3 vs. Southern Miss.

2016 SPRING NOTES

OFFENSIVE PREVIEW

- Year Four of the Mark Stoops era began with major changes in the offensive coaching staff, including the additions of new offensive coordinator Eddie Gran, co-offensive coordinator and guarterbacks coach Darin Hinshaw and wide receivers coach Lamar Thomas
- Gran will inherit 23 returning letterwinners on offense from the 2015 season, including nine primary starters.
- One of the main storylines from last year was the emergence of redshirt freshman quarterback Drew Barker. He played in five games, earning a starting nod in the final two contests for the Wildcats (35 of 70 passes for 364 yards and 1 TD). Pushing Barker for a starting spot will be freshman Gunnar Hoak and junior college transfer Stephen Johnson II.
- Kentucky is blessed to be able to go four deep on the running back depth chart, including juniors Boom Williams and Mikel Horton, senior Jojo Kemp and sophomore Sihiem King.
- Williams leads the running-back group with 1,341 yards on 195 carries in his career, adding 11 TDs. He set a single-season school record by averaging 7.1 yards per carry last seson.
- Kemp has carried it 268 times for 1,360 yards, including 13 TDs. Horton, a physical bruiser, has five touchdowns on 141 career carries and 624 yards.
- An explosive talent, King played in all 12 games last season as a freshman, notching 11 carries for 127 yards and a touchdown.
- In 2015, UK's running backs combined for 1,855 yards on 312 carries, an average of 5.9 yards per carry.
- New wide receivers coach Lamar Thomas will have depth of talent at the wide receiver position, including returning starters Jeff Badet (29 catches for 430 yards and two TDs), Dorian Baker (55 catches for 608 yards and three TDs) and Garrett "Juice" Johnson (46 catches for 694 yards and two TDs). Midyear enrollee and 6-foot-7 receiver Dakota Holtzclaw will fight for a position in the spring as well.
- Kentucky had 14 different players catch passes last season and 13 of them return in 2016, including eight wideouts.
- The Wildcats have a trio of tight ends looking to impress in the spring. Freshman All-SEC and Freshman All-American C.J. Conrad is the only tight end with a career reception. He caught 15 passes for 149 yards and one TD last season and was a fierce run blocker. Senior Tanner Fink and sophomore Darryl Long will look to gain experience this spring.
- The offensive line is one of the most experienced positions as it returns 86 career starts, including 47 from 2015.
- Senior center Jon Toth headlines the O-line as he has started in 35 consecutive games and is considered one of the top centers in college football. Toth was a nominee for the Rimington Trophy last season, given to the nation's top center. Senior Zach Myers is a formidable backup to Toth as he saw action in all 12 games a year ago.
- Junior Kyle Meadows, who started the final nine games last season, returns at right tackle, while sophomore George Asafo-Adjei who earned the starting nod in the first three games at the position, also is back after a solid offseason.
- Returning starters at the left and right guard positions are juniors Nick Haynes and Ramsey Meyers.

DEFENSIVE PREVIEW

- Defensive coordinator, D.J. Eliot, welcomes back 18 returning letterwinners in the spring, including six starters.
- Kentucky started 17 different players on defense last season, with only three (DE Farrington Huguenin, CB Chris Westry and MLB Josh Forrest) starting in all 12 games. Of the 17 starters last season, six received their first career start in 2015 (DE Denzil Ware, CB Chris Westry, S Mike Edwards, CB Derrick Baity, DT Regie Meant and DT Cory Johnson) and only one was a senior (C. Johnson).
- Of a possible 132 total starts (12 games, 11 starters), only 57 total starts return on defense in 2016.
- The Cats will look to replace 55.4 percent of its tackles, 73.5 percent of its sacks, 67.9 percent of its tackles for loss, 45.4 percent of its interceptions and 33.3 percent of its forced fumbles from 2015.
- The only position where a starter from 2015 does not return is weakside linebacker and middle linebacker. UK will look to replace graduating seniors Josh Forrest (team-leading 93 tackles, 6.0 TFL, 3.5 sacks, 2 INTs, 5 PBU and 2 QBH), Khalid Henderson (62 tackles, 6.5 TFL, 2.0 sacks, 1 INT, 2 PBU, 2 QBH and 1 FF) and Ryan Flannigan (53 tackles, 0.5 TFL, 2 PBU, 2 QBH) who combined for 24 starts at linebacker last season. Looking to fill that void are rising sophomores Josh Allen (4 tackles, 1.5 TFL, 0.5 sacks) and Jordan Jones (10 tackles in 2015), along with mid-year enrollee Kash Daniel and Division I transfers De'Niro Laster, Courtney Love and Spencer Foy.
- Following the departure of three seniors (Cory Johnson, Jabari Johnson and Melvin Lewis), defensive line coach Jimmy Brumbaugh will look to returning starters in junior Regie Meant (31 tackles, 1.5 TFL, 1.0 sacks) and sophomore Denzil Ware (39 tackles, 5.5 TFL, 1.0 sacks, 2 QBH and 1 FF) to fill the void. However, six players (Kengera Daniel, Tymere Dubose, Matt Elam, Jacob Hyde, Adrian Middleton and Courtney Miggins) return in the spring after earning playing time in 2015. Brumbaugh also looks forward to seeing how mid-year enrollee and junior college transfer Naquez Pringle can fit in his system this spring.
- Kentucky's secondary should be the most experienced in the spring as it has eight returning letterwinners, including Freshman All-American and Freshman All-SEC cornerback Chris Westry (36 tackles, 1.5 TFL, 1.0 sacks, 2 INTs, 8 PBU, 1 QBH). Also seeing three starts at cornerback and showing big-play potential was freshman Derrick Baity (19 tackles, 1.0 TFL, 2 PBU). Sophomores Mike Edwards (39 tackles, 2.0 TFL, 1 INT, 2 PBU, 1 FF) and Darius West (17 tackles) and seniors Marcus McWilson (66 tackles, 1.5 TFL, 1.0 sacks, 2 PBU, 1 QBH, 1 FF) will man the safety spots. Blake McClain (31 tackles, 1.0 TFL, 5 PBU, 1 FF) plays cornerback and nickelback.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- The 2016 Kentucky football schedule will feature seven home games and five road tilts.
- Kentucky will face a challenging schedule in 2016, including home conference games with South Carolina, Vanderbilt, Georgia and Mississippi State. UK will travel to Florida, Alabama, Tennessee, Missouri and non-conference foe Louisville.
- UK will open its schedule with the 2016 lidlifter vs. Southern Miss on Sept. 3 at Commonwealth Stadium. The Wildcats will then travel to Florida on Sept. 10 to

open its league slate, before breaking from SEC play to host New Mexico State on Sept. 17.

- The Wildcats will then face three SEC foes, hosting South Carolina (Sept. 24) and Vanderbilt (Oct. 8), and traveling to Tuscaloosa to face Alabama (Oct. 1). UK will break for an open date on Oct. 15, before hosting Mississippi State on Oct. 22 and traveling to face Missouri on Oct. 29.
- Kentucky will play host to Georgia on Nov. 5 and travel to Tennessee on Nov. 12, before concluding its home schedule with Austin Peay on Nov. 19. Kentucky and Louisville will conclude the regular season on Nov. 26 at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium. It marks the second consecutive season UK will finish the year with two straight non-conference games.
- For the 25th consecutive year, the 2016 regular season will culminate with the SEC Championship Game on Saturday, December 3 at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta.

COACHING CHANGES

- Eddie Gran was named assistant head coach of the offense/offensive coordinator as well as running backs coach on Dec. 29, 2015.
- Darin Hinshaw was named the co-offensive coordinator/quaterbacks coach on Dec. 29, 2015.
- Lamar Thomas was named the wide receivers coach on Feb. 2, 2016.
- UK co-defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach, Derrick Ansley, was hired to be the defensive backs coach at Alabama on Feb. 3, 2016. Former Cincinnati co-defensive coordinator, Steve Clinkscale, was hired in late February to replace Ansley.

MID-YEAR ENROLLEES

Kentucky welcomed seven mid-year enrollees to the program in January. Three are junior college transfers and four are true freshmen. They will go through the off-season workouts and participate in spring practice.

Kash Daniel, Linebacker 6-1, 235, Fr.-HS Paintsville, Ky. (Paintsville) Gunnar Hoak, Quarterback 6-4, 190, Fr.-HS Dublin, Ohio (Dublin Coffman) Dakota Holtzclaw, Wide Receiver 6-7, 215, Fr.-HS Columbus, Ohio (Worthington Kilbourne) Drake Jackson, Center 6-2, 302, Fr.-HS Versailles, Ky. (Woodford County) Tate Leavitt, Offensive Tackle 6-6, 310, Jr.-JC Thornville, Ohio (Sheridan/ Hutchinson Community College) Naquez Pringle, Defensive Line 6-2, 330, Jr.-JC Georgetown, S.C. (Carvers Bay/ Itawamba CC) Stephen Johnson II, Quarterback 6-3, 190, Jr.-JC Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. (Los Osos/Grambling/ College of the Desert)

- Last year, UK added six mid-year enrollees, including high school graduates offensive lineman George Asafo-Adjei, tight end C.J. Conrad, defensive end Kengera Daniel and linebacker Jordan Jones, and two Nebraska transfers, tight end Greg Hart and linebacker Courtney Love.
- The four freshmen all made an immediate impact on the team in their debut season. Asafo-Adjei played

in 11 of 12 games with three starts. Conrad played in all 12 games with nine starts and ranked fifth on the team in receptions with 15 catches for 149 yards and a touchdown. He was one of just two freshman tight ends in the nation honored on the Mackey Award Midseason Watch List and he was seventh in the SEC in receptions for first-year players. Daniel saw action in seven games and Jordan Jones charted 10 tackles in nine games played.

BOOM MAKING NOISE, MOVING UP CAREER CHARTS

- Stanley "Boom" Williams totaled 855 rushing yards in 2015, the most for a Wildcat in a season in five years, since Derrick Locke had 887 yards in 2010.
- Williams now has 1,341 rushing yards for his career and ranks 23rd on the UK career rushing list.
- Williams ranked eighth in the SEC with 85.5 rushing yards per game.
- Williams averaged a school record 7.1 yards per carry in 2015, leading the SEC and ranking fourth in the nation.
- Williams is the third UK player in school history to have five 100-yard rushing games in his sophomore season (Sonny Collins, 1973 and Rafael Little, 2005).
- Williams is the first UK player with three 100-yard rushing games against SEC opponents in a single season since Derrick Locke in 2009.

MACGINNIS ON PACE TO BECOME UK'S TOP SCORER

Junior kicker Austin MacGinnis is on pace to become UK's leading scorer. He has already recorded 165 points which ranks 10th on the career list. He needs one more point to move up to No. 9 with George Adams (1981-84) and two to jump to No. 8 with Doug Pelfrey (1990-92).

NEW \$45 MILLION PRACTICE FACILITY TO OPEN IN JULY

Two major football construction projects have been in progress over the last two seasons, totaling \$165 million. A \$120 million "reimagining" of Commonwealth Stadium opened in September of 2015 and a new \$45 million practice/office complex is currently being built on the south side of the exisiting Nutter Field House. The comprehensive complex features state-of-the-art practice, office and support facilities for the players and coaches. Completion is planned for July of 2016.

DID YOU KNOW?

- This fall will be the 126th season of intercollegiate football for the UK football program.
- Kentucky is entering its fourth season under head coach Mark Stoops, who has energized the UK fan base with record-setting recruiting classes, facility upgrades and an influx in talent.

During Kentucky head football coach Mark Stoops' first three years on the job, a construction hard hat has been just as important as helmets are for his players.

Since his arrival at Kentucky, Stoops has methodically built Wildcat football on and off the field. He helped plan and raise funds for the \$125 million renovation of Commonwealth Stadium and the new \$45 million football complex that is scheduled to open this summer.

The re-imagining of Commonwealth Stadium in 2015 opened to rave reviews from fans, players and recruits. The new complex will be a showcase for Kentucky football as well as the hub where the Cats and their coaches focus their energies.

Stoops' building also has been evident in recruiting as he steadily improves the Wildcats' talent base. Stoops' first four recruiting classes have been rated higher in the Rivals.com rankings than any previous classes in the history of the recruiting evaluator.

On the field, after inheriting a program that had produced a 2-10 record the season before his arrival, Stoops has markedly improved the team's performance. In 2014, UK won five games – more than the previous two seasons combined. The squad also won five games last season, including a victory at South Carolina, UK's first SEC road win since 2009, and a win over Missouri, UK's first triumph against a ranked opponent since 2010.

That's progress, certainly, but only part of the way toward his goal of fielding championship teams at UK. Part of the acclaimed Stoops coaching family, he has a history of championship performance as an assistant coach and dramatic improvements during his years as a defensive coordinator at Florida State and Arizona.

Stoops was defensive coordinator at FSU from 2010-12, inheriting a unit ranked 108th in the NCAA in total defense and turning it into one of the nation's best. In the 2012 season, the Seminoles were second in the nation in total defense, allowing 254.1 yards per game, and sixth nationally in scoring defense at 14.7 points per game. Playing well against the run and the pass, FSU was third in the country in rushing defense and led the nation in pass defense. FSU led the ACC in seven defensive categories. Stoops also coached the defensive backs under head coach Jimbo Fisher.

Eight Seminoles on defense earned 2012 All-ACC honors, including four first-team selections, highlighted by one of the nation's top defensive end duos in Bjoern Werner and Cornellius Carradine, who combined for 24 sacks and 31 tackles for loss. Werner was a finalist for the 2012 Bronko Nagurski Award as the National Defensive Player of the Year and was among the national leaders in sacks with 13. Stoops also coached cornerback Ronald Darby to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year.

The Seminoles' prowess was a continuation of the 2011 season, when Stoops' defenders led the nation in fewest yards allowed per carry (2.3), ranked fourth in the nation in total defense (275 yards per game), second in rushing defense (82.7 ypg), fourth in scoring defense (15.1 points per game), and eighth in tackles for loss (8.6 per game) and quarterback sacks (3.1 per game). FSU led the ACC in eight defensive categories.

Stoops overhauled the Florida State defense in 2010, his first season as defensive coordinator. The Seminoles gave up 19.6 points per game, third-best in the ACC and 20th nationally. FSU ranked 42nd nationally in total defense that season; in contrast, the team was 108th nationally in total defense and 94th in scoring defense in 2009, the year before Stoops' arrival. FSU improved its overall defense by more than 80 yards per game, primarily by limiting opponents to 75 fewer rushing yards per game. The Seminoles ranked third in the nation in

quarterback sacks and were 21st in tackles for loss. In the secondary, Stoops coached Xavier Rhodes to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors and National Defensive Freshman of the Year accolades.

During Stoops' three seasons, FSU went 10-4, 9-4 and 12-2, including wins over South Carolina in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl, Notre Dame in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl and Northern Illinois in the 2013 Orange Bowl.

Stoops was defensive coordinator and DBs coach at Arizona from 2004-09, working for his brother, Mike, who was head coach of the Wildcats. During Mark's time there, Arizona's records improved steadily, going 3-8, 3-8, 6-6, 5-7, 8-5 and 8-5. The Wildcats advanced to the Las Vegas Bowl and Holiday Bowl during the last two years. Mark and Mike are also brothers of Oklahoma head coach Bob Stoops, with Mark being the youngest of the three. Mike is currently the defensive coordinator on Bob's staff at Oklahoma.

Stoops inherited an Arizona unit that was 109th in the nation in total defense and 107th in scoring defense in 2003, the year before he arrived. By the end of his term at Arizona, the Wildcats ranked in the nation's top 25 in total defense his final two seasons and ranked as high as 33rd in scoring defense.

Prior to Arizona, Stoops coached the defensive backs three years at Miami (Fla.). The 2001 national champion Hurricanes led the nation in pass efficiency defense, scoring defense and turnover margin. That team also established a school record with 27 interceptions and 45 total takeaways.

Stoops' 2002 secondary led the nation in pass defense and pass efficiency defense. Despite having to replace all four starters in the defensive backfield, the 2003 team led the nation in pass defense. In his three seasons, Miami went 35-3, including the 12-0 Rose Bowl title campaign, plus appearances in the Fiesta and Orange bowls. Ten Miami defensive backs who played at least one season under Stoops were eventually selected in the National Football League draft – seven in the first round.

Stoops got his first experience in leading a



defense as co-defensive coordinator at Houston in the 2000 season. He coached the secondary at Wyoming from 1997-99 and the Cowboys notched three straight winning seasons. A highlight of his time there was a school-record 24 interceptions in the '97 season. His first full-time coaching job was in 1996 at South Florida, helping USF in the start-up of its program before the Bulls had their first kickoff in '97.

Stoops has recruited and developed numerous outstanding defensive backs, many of whom went on to National Football League careers. Among the notables are Antoine Cason and Michael Johnson at Arizona, Miami's Philip Buchanon, Kelly Jennings, Brandon Meriweather, Ed Reed, Antrel Rolle, Mike Rumph and Sean Taylor and Wyoming's Brian Lee.

Stoops was raised in Youngstown, Ohio. Like his brothers, Mark played in the secondary at the University of Iowa for Hall of Fame coach Hayden Fry. He participated in four bowl games as a player. Fry hired Stoops as a graduate assistant coach at Iowa in the 1990 and '91 seasons. The Hawkeyes won the 1990 Big Ten title and played in the Rose Bowl, duplicating feats Stoops also achieved as a player. Stoops went on to coach four years in high school before entering the collegiate ranks.

Stoops and his wife, Chantel, have two sons, Will and Zack.

ART STILL SELECTED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

Art Still, whose dominance at defensive end helped lead Kentucky to some of its greatest moments in school history, was named to the College Football Hall of Fame by the National Football Foundation.

Originally from Camden, N.J., Still played at Kentucky from 1974-77 under Coach Fran Curci. Still helped the Wildcats to a 19-4 record in his final two seasons. UK went 9-3 in his junior year, winning a share of the Southeastern Conference championship, and capped the season with a 21-0 blanking of North Carolina in the Peach Bowl. The Cats were ranked 18th in the final Associated Press poll.

UK posted a 10-1 mark in his senior season, finishing the campaign No. 6 in the final AP ranking. The Wildcats went 7-3 against Top-20 ranked teams his last two seasons, winning the last five in a row vs. ranked foes Florida, North Carolina, West Virginia, at Penn State and at LSU. Paced by Still's dominating performances, Kentucky led the SEC in total defense and rushing defense.

Still was a four-year starter who totaled 327 tackles during his career, an amazing figure for a defensive end. Quarterback sacks were not kept during his career and tackles for loss are available only for his senior year, when he compiled 22 TFL - a school record that "Still" stands.

One interesting fact about Still is that he also saw significant action on offense as a tight end in short-vardage or goalline situations, averaging approximately 15 plays per game and frequently helping pave the way for touchdowns or first downs. Kentucky rushed for 269.1 yards per game in 1976, the second-highest mark in school history, and rushed for 228.7 yards per game in 1977

Still was a unanimous first-team All-America selection in 1977 as chosen by AP, United Press International, Football Writers Association of America, the American Football Coaches Association, Newspaper Enterprise Association, Walter Camp Football Foundation, The Sporting News and Football News.

Still was a finalist for the Lombardi Award and the UPI National Lineman of the Year. He was the Brooks-Irvine Memorial Football Club of South Jersey College Player of the Year.

Anticipation. Electricity. And then a Boom. Williams, that is. Kentucky's Stanley "Boom" Williams raced 75 yards for a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage to open the 2015 season and The New Commonwealth Stadium in storybook fashion. But, the Wildcats would need a storybook ending to fend off a late UL Lafayette charge.

Sophomore running back Mikel Horton scampered 12 yards for a touchdown with 57 seconds remaining to lift UK to a 40-33 win over visiting UL Lafayette in front of a sellout crowd of 62,933 fans.

After jumping out to a 23-point advantage behind three touchdown passes from junior Patrick Towles, Boom's rushing touchdown and two field goals, Kentucky yielded 23 consecutive points to the Ragin' Cajuns in less than nine minutes of play to tie the score at 33.

UL Lafayette forced the home team into a three-and-out to take over possession with a chance at seizing the lead with 6:58 remaining. UK senior lineman Melvin Lewis stuffed Louisiana's Flijah McGuire for a three-yard loss to help force the Cajuns into a punt, setting the stage for Horton and the offense.

Needing a score, UK generated a nine-play, 58-yard game-winning drive. Kentucky's offense benefited from two 15-yard penalties during the winning push, but Horton was able to take advantage of the miscues to lift Kentucky to the win.

Kentucky quarterback Patrick Towles threw for 257 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. UK generated 435 yards of total offense. Williams secured his third-career 100-yard rushing game on 10 carries for 135 yards, which included the opening-drive score. Horton carried six times for 28 yards and the final touchdown. Sophomore Garrett Johnson led the receiving corps with five catches for 85 yards and a touchdown. Five receivers snared at least one ball for 30 or more receiving yards, and three different receivers caught touchdowns from Towles.

Senior linebacker Josh Forrest paced the defensive effort with 15 tackles, including a sack, three pass breakups and the game-clinching interception. Junior corner J.D. Harmon was a part of two turnovers for the Cats. He forced a fumble deep in Kentucky's territory to end a lengthy Ragin' Cajun drive in the opening quarter before picking off a pass in the second quarter. Lewis added nine tackles to the defensive effort.

It was a tale of two halves, with Kentucky's offense scoring 24 unanswered first-half points before the Wildcat defense made big play after big play in the second half, securing a 26-22 victory over South Carolina in front of 82,178 at Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia, S.C.

Heading into halftime with a 24-7 lead, South Carolina scored the first 15 points of the second half, including three Elliott Fry field goals and a 33-yard touchdown pass from Perry Orth - who was playing for injured Gamecock quarterback Connor Mitch - to Jerrell Adams, to cut the UK lead to 24-22

The Gamecocks decided to go for the two-point conversion to try to tie the game before freshman Denzil Ware scooped up a fumble and returned it 98 yards for two points to give UK a 26-22 lead with 8:09 to go in the game

After a short drive by the UK offense, South Carolina started another drive on a tired Kentucky defense before another freshman made a big play with rookie cornerback Chris Westry earning his first-career interception to put the Wildcats back in the driver's seat.

The Wildcat offense, which struggled for much of the second half, sealed the victory from there, taking the final 4:32 off the clock, including a key 11-yard quarterback draw by Patrick Towles on third down to drain the Gamecocks of timeouts. Sophomore Stanley "Boom" Williams took over from there with a 25-yard rush to end the game.

The victory for Kentucky broke a 22-game losing streak in road games with the Wildcats last road win coming at Louisville in Sept. 2010. Kentucky's last SEC road victory was at Georgia in Nov. 2009. UK is now 2-0 on the season and starts conference play with a victory for the first time since defeating Arkansas in 2007 in Fayetteville

Towles was in command in the first half through the air, going 21-for-29 overall for 192 yards. The junior signal caller threw his only interception on the first drive of the game that set up South Carolina deep in Kentucky territory with Mitch rushing in from one-yard out to give USC a 7-0 lead with 12:03 to play in the first quarter.

That was all the Gamecocks would get offensively in the first half as Kentucky rattled off the next 24 points to end the half, starting with an eight-yard rush from Horton to tie the game 7-7. Kemp got in on the scoring later in the first quarter, completing an eight-play drive with a two-yard rush for a touchdown to give Kentucky a 14-7 lead.

A USC missed field goal gave possession back to Kentucky with 2:46 to go in the half and Towles and Co. took advantage. After a 20-yard completion to Dorian Baker, Towles connected to Jeff Badet for 43 yards to the USC 11-yard line to set up a 1-yard rush from Towles with 17 seconds to go in the half to give UK a 24-7 lead

Despite a sparkling defensive effort in which the Kentucky football team held Florida scoreless in the second half, a fourth-quarter rally fell short as Florida prevailed 14-9 in front of a sold-out Commonwealth Stadium.

Trailing 14-3 going into the fourth quarter, the Wildcats made it a one-score game behind two Austin MacGinnis field goals. UK had the ball twice over the final five minutes in an attempt to score the go-ahead touchdown but Florida held on for the win.

Kentucky's defense stymied the Gator attack for the entire second half. Five Wildcats registered six or more tackles on the night, led by Khalid Henderson's nine stops. UK posted three tackles for a loss and J.D. Harmon picked off a pass in the end zone to halt a Florida drive in the middle of the third quarter that would have pushed UF's lead to three scores. The interception sparked a momentum change in the game as UK would go on to put together back-to-back scoring drives

Following Harmon's interception in the third quarter, Patrick Towles' 33-yard quarterback scramble highlighted a 75-yard drive by the Wildcats to inch closer at 14-6 with 14:50 in the fourth. MacGinnis

connected on a 22-yard field goal for the Wildcats to make it a one-possession game. After the UK defense forced a three-and-out, MacGinnis made it a five-point contest with 10:57 to go with a 45-yard field goal. Towles found Jeff Badet for a 45-yard strike down the left sideline to push the Wildcats into field-goal range as the drive's highlight.

Following UK's third field goal of the game, Florida managed one first down before being forced to punt with 8:34 remaining. Faced with a third-and-10 from its own 22, Towles found Baker open on the right sideline to keep the drive alive. Williams followed with a 14-yard rush, but the drive stalled at UK's 48. The Gators picked up two first downs and killed 3:44 of clock before punting back to the Wildcats, which began the final drive at their own 20. Towles and Baker hooked up for a 20-yard gain on fourth-and-3 at the Kentucky 27 to keep the drive alive. On a subsequent fourth-down play, Towles' deep ball down the left side line intended for Ryan Timmons was picked off to preserve the Gators' victory.

Florida opened the game's scoring with a 1-yard run by Will Grier on fourth down to go ahead 7-0. Kentucky answered with a 14-play, 64-yard drive that resulted in a MacGinnis 29-yard field goal to make the score 7-3.

In the second quarter, the Gators put together an 11-play, 67-yard drive, which ended in a 34-yard field goal attempt by Austin Hardin that was subsequently blocked by UK's CJ Johnson to preserve the 7-3 score. The visitors capped the half by marching 57 yards for a three-yard plunge by running back Kelvin Taylor to push UF's lead to 14-3 with 14 seconds remaining.

Patrick Towles guided Kentucky to two second-half touchdowns, while pacing the Wildcats to a 21-13 victory over No. 25 Missouri and a myriad of firsts at Commonwealth Stadium. The win was UK's first league victory at the New Commonwealth Stadium and its first win over a ranked foe since 2010.

Towles directed scoring drives in the third and fourth quarters to ignite the offensive effort in the second half. The junior found C.J. Conrad for a 24-yard strike before connecting with Dorian Baker with less than seven minutes to play to give the Wildcats an 11-point lead it would not relinquish.

Garrett Johnson led the team in receiving with a season-high 119 yards, including a long of 35 yards that matched his season best. Conrad had a breakout game, not only recording his first career catch but also his first career touchdown with 55 yards of offense through the air. Baker also had a standout game, matching his career high of 51 yards and recording the second touchdown of his career.

Mizzou was the first team of the night to scratch the scoreboard, using two third-down conversions to reach the red zone. With 17 yards between himself and the end zone, Mauk tossed a lob to an open J'Mon Moore for a touchdown with a

successful extra point to give the Tigers the 7-0 advantage with 3:42 remaining in the opening quarter. Following a rocky start to the drive that found the Wildcats in a first-and-29 situation, Towles found Johnson for consecutive 20-plus-yard throws to move the chains and get UK into Missouri territory for the first time in the contest. Towles used the opening play of the second quarter to dodge and weave through the Tiger defense for a rushing touchdown. That knotted the score at seven apiece.

A Missouri field goal made the score 10-7 before sophomore running back Jojo Kemp acted as the catalyst for the team, as three of his carries totaled a combined 37 yards, giving UK a first-and-goal late in the third quarter to set up the Conrad touchdown and put UK on top 14-10.

Kentucky continued to pour it on offensively in the final quarter, taking to the air again when Towles first found Johnson for a 35-yard reception, matching the wide receiver's season long, before Baker pulled in a 25-yard toss on the sideline.

Another pass to Johnson, fanned out to the left sideline for a 24-yarder, put the Wildcats within five yards of the end zone. Towles then found Baker on a 5-yard lob for his first touchdown of the season and the second of his career, putting UK up 21-10 over the Tigers with 6:20 left in the game.

The Tigers looked like they would soon answer back with a touchdown, quickly making their way through Kentucky territory. Despite their momentum, the staunch UK red zone defense, led by a pass breakup followed by a quarterback hurry by Ryan Flannigan, once again forced Missouri to concede a field-goal attempt. Baggett's 24-yard attempt was good, but the Wildcats were able to close out the final 2:56 of the game with a pair of first downs.

Despite trailing by 14 points with less than eight minutes in the fourth quarter, the Kentucky football team celebrated its 100th Homecoming anniversary at The New CWS in thrilling fashion, notching a 34-27 comeback overtime victory over in-state foe Eastern Kentucky University

Kentucky rallied from a 27-13 deficit late in the fourth quarter with back-to-back touchdown drives. Facing a fourth-and-3 at the end of regulation, Patrick Towles stood in the face of a blitz and found Dorian Baker for a 5-yard touchdown to force overtime.

The duo connected again in overtime with a 3-yard pitch-and-catch to take a 34-27 lead. CJ Johnson, who recorded 19 tackles, the most by a defensive lineman in program history, fittingly sealed the outcome with a game-clinching sack

The outcome tied the school record for biggest fourth-quarter comeback in school history - previously set a year ago when UK rallied from 14 down in the final stanza to win vs. South Carolina.

Towles rebounded from a two-interception first half to lead the offense for the Wildcats, connecting on 29-of-42 pass attempts for 329 vards and three touchdowns to go along with a rushing score.

The duo of Baker and Blake Bone carried the offense in receiving with 86 and 85 yards, respectively. Both bested their career highs by more than 20 yards each, and Baker's two touchdowns, which included the game-tying and game-winning catches, is a career best for the wide receiver.

Kentucky stayed in the game thanks to standout defensive performances by a number of players. Eight of Johnson's 19 tackles were solo stops, including a sack and two-and-a-half tackles for loss. Ryan Flannigan was one tackle off his career best with 11 tackles, Josh Forrest recorded double-digit tackles with 10 stops on the night, and Farrington Huguenin blocked a field goal and recovered a fumble.

For the Colonels, Bennie Coney paced the offense with 19-of-32 passing for 183 yards and two touchdowns. The pair of Thomas Ethan and Dy'Shawn Mobley combined for 158 of EKU's 180 rushing yards with 84 yards and 74 yards, respectively. Mobley also led the team in receiving with 50 yards on five catches.

AUBURN 30, KENTUCKY 27

OCT. 15. 2015 • LEXINGTON, KY. THE NEW CWS (63.407)

Kentucky scored 17 second-half points and rallied to within one score, but the Auburn Tigers held on for a 30-27 win in front of 63,407 fans in The New CWS in the first Thursday night primetime home game in program history.

Auburn earned a 10-point advantage at 30-20 with less than eight minutes to play before the Wildcats pulled to within three following a Mikel Horton 1-yard plunge. Kentucky got the ball back at its own 15-yard line with 2:12 remaining and drove into Auburn territory, but lost the ball on downs as the Tigers clinched the victory.

Auburn took little time in taking an early lead thanks to the combination of Sean White and Ricardo Louis moving the chains with a pair of 20-plus-yard receptions. Once in the red zone, the Tigers turned to Peyton Barber to carry the ball in for a 1-yard rushing touchdown and a 7-0 advantage with just under four minutes into the quarter.

The Wildcats quickly retaliated, covering 75 yards on just six plays. Boom Williams broke through the Auburn defense and tore away for a 60-yard dash to put the Wildcats at first-and-goal from the 3-yard line. Williams completed the drive with consecutive rushes, tying the

game at 7-7 Three Daniel Carlson field goals and a Kerryon Johnson TD rush allowed Auburn to open up a 23-10 halftime lead.

Kentucky came out energized in the second half, with Patrick Towles spreading out the offense through the air as Johnson, Jeff Badet and Dorian Baker combined for 50 receiving yards to set up Williams for a 13-yard rush along the left sideline. Williams shouldered his way through the Auburn line and extended his arm with the ball in hand to complete a 6-yard rush for his second touchdown of the game. Within just over three minutes' time, the Wildcats were within six points of the Tigers, 23-17.

The Wildcats' defense came up with some impactful plays following the touchdown, forcing Auburn to concede a punt on consecutive drives. Highlighted by a 13-yard rush by Towles and an 11-yard pass to C.J. Conrad, who pulled two Auburn defenders along with him to give the team a first down, UK was able to lessen the deficit to 23-20 with 1:03 remaining in the guarter after an Austin MacGinnis field goal.

The fourth quarter saw the Tigers retaliate, aided by a 34-yard pass to Louis to reach the red zone. Barber added another rushing touchdown with 7:56 remaining in the contest, as the Wildcats fell behind 30-20.

With plenty of fight left, Kentucky answered back immediately. Towles found Blake Bone for an 11-yard pass and later launched to Badet on the Auburn 2-yard line for a 27-yard catch. Horton scored for the Wildcats on a 1-yard rush, once more bringing the Blue and White within three points of the Tigers, 30-27.

MISSISSIPPI STATE 42, KENTUCKY 16



OCT. 24. 2015 • STARKVILLE. MISS. DAVIS WADE STADIUM (61.168)

Mississippi State scored 21 points in the second quarter behind the impressive play of Bulldog senior quarterback Dak Prescott, handing Kentucky its first road loss of the season, 42-16, at Davis Wade Stadium in Starkville, Miss.

Prescott was the star of the game, going 25-for-35 through the air for 348 yards and three touchdowns, while rushing 13 times for 117 yards and three touchdowns on the ground. Brandon Holloway was the team's second-leading rusher, carrying the ball six times for 36 yards. Holloway was also the team's leading receiver with five catches for 98 yards and a touchdown.

Kentucky guarterback Patrick Towles went 23-for-42 in the game for 218 yards, rushing for a touchdown on six carries for 13 yards. Boom Williams was the leading rusher for Kentucky, carrying the ball 18 times for 95 yards, including a 25-yard rush. Dorian Baker had seven receptions for 56 yards, while tight end C.J. Conrad had a career game with six receptions for 56 yards and sophomore Juice Johnson had five catches for 74 yards. Kentucky (4-3, 2-3 Southeastern Conference) scored first when

Towles put in a quarterback sneak from two yards out to complete a seven-play, 69-yard drive in the first quarter. After the Bulldogs responded with a Prescott touchdown run to tie the game 7-7, UK put together an eight-play drive to retake the lead 10-7 after an Austin MacGinnis 44-yard field goal, his first of three on the day.

That was the last lead the Wildcats would claim as Mississippi State opened up the lead with three straight touchdowns in the second quarter, including two in the final 1:34 of the half. Prescott was at the center of all three touchdowns, throwing a 13-yard score to De'Runnya Wilson and eight-yard TD pass to Holloway before rushing in for 20 yards late in the first half.

MacGinnis added a 48-yard field goal with three seconds to go in the half and a 32-yarder late in the third quarter before Prescott connected with Darrion Hutcherson to increase the lead to 35-16. Prescott put the finishing touches on the win with 9:14 to play in the fourth quarter, rushing in from 18 yards out to give the Bulldogs a 42-16 victory.

Kentucky fell while hosting Tennessee in a 52-21 decision inside The New Commonwealth Stadium as the Volunteers used four touchdowns in the third quarter to clinch the game.

Josh Dobbs was the offensive leader for the Volunteers on 16-of-26 passing for 233 yards and two touchdowns. Dobbs added 51 rushing yards and two TDs on the ground. Josh Malone led the receiving corps with 103 yards and one touchdown on four catches.

The UK defense shined on Tennessee's opening possession, with Marcus McWilson sacking Dobbs, forcing a fumble that was picked up by C.J. Johnson, who returned it for a 77-yard touchdown.

Tennessee retaliated shortly thereafter, with Dobbs scoring on a 28-yard run to equalize the score at 7-7 with 2:45 remaining in the opening quarter

After the Vols added a field goal to go up 10-7, Kentucky was able to swing the lead to a 14-10 advantage, penetrating the red zone after Patrick Towles had a 21-yard scamper to break out of fourth-and-5. With a 6-yard lob to CJ Conrad, the Wildcats earned a first-and-goal but quickly found themselves at fourth down once more. Towles took

charge again, with a 1-yard scramble that would land him in the end zone. However, the lead changed hands again after a 75-yard pass from Dobbs found its way into the hands of Malone. Tennessee put more points up to close out the half, fueled by a 63-yard run by Alvin Kamara that set Dobbs up for a 1-yard rush for a touchdown.

The Volunteers started off the second half with a pair of touchdowns within five minutes, both courtesy of Jalen Hurd. He first caught a 37-yard pass and later ran in a 4-yard carry.

Kentucky found a way to break through the UT defense, scoring in just four plays and traversing 75 yards of the field. Mikel Horton started things with an 18-yard carry, and Towles finished with a 39-yard TD pass to Garrett Johnson. Tennessee responded with a pair of touchdowns to complete the scoring.

The University of Georgia football team scored 14 points in the third guarter to open up a 21-point lead and roll to a 27-3 victory over Kentucky at Sanford Stadium.

Georgia started the scoring, getting a 28-yard touchdown rush by Terry Godwin with 8:57 to play in the first quarter to put the Bulldogs up 7-0.

The two teams traded field goals the reminder of the first half with Marshall Morgan hitting from 22 yards and UK's Austin MacGinnis hitting from 32 yards to cut the UGA halftime lead to 10-3

Georgia took control of the game in the third quarter. Kentucky received the opening kickoff of the second half and elected to go for it on fourth-and-short near midfield, but could not convert. The Bulldogs marched 52 yards down the field with Sony Michel's onevard scoring rush giving UGA a 17-3 lead.



Williams had rushes of 66 and 38 yards in his return from an elbow injury.

Kentucky got on the board first in the game, as Austin MacGinnis hit a 38-yard field goal in the first quarter. But Vandy took its first lead later in that period when Kyle Shurmur hit Kyle Anderton for a four-yard touchdown to give the Commodores a 7-3 lead.

In the second quarter. Kentucky got into the end zone when redshirt freshman quarterback Drew Barker connected with Ryan Timmons on a seven-yard pass to make it 10-7 Kentucky. That marked Barker's first career touchdown pass.

Jojo Kemp rushed for three touchdowns, Boom Williams ran for two and Kentucky rolled up 544 yards in a 58-10 blowout of Charlotte that ended a five-game losing streak.

Kemp broke TD runs of 6, 18, and 47 yards, Williams scored from 20 and 53 yards and Sihiem King added a 62-yarder as Kentucky (5-6) rushed for 415 yards, fourth most in school history.

Mike Edwards returned an interception 20 yards for another Wildcats score that handed the 49ers (2-9) their ninth straight loss.

Redshirt freshman Drew Barker added 129 yards passing in his first career start for Kentucky, which earned the first of two wins needed to reach the threshold for bowl eligibility. The Wildcats' defense held Charlotte to just 233 yards, recorded four sacks and forced three turnovers

Miles Butler kicked field goals of 21, 46 and 32 yards for Kentucky. Kentucky registered 50 points for the first time since August 2014 against UT Martin, and their 48-point victory margin was its largest since beating UTEP 77-17 in 2002.

One skid was bound to end with 13 combined consecutive losses between the schools coming in. Charlotte's growing pains were somewhat expected considering it's a first-

year FBS member, but the Wildcats' slump was putting them on the cusp of missing the postseason for a fifth straight season. The Wildcats succeeded behind a powerful ground game led by Kemp and Williams, who rushed for 165

and 140 yards respectively. That gave Kentucky its first pair of 100-yard rushers in a game since Randall Cobb and Derrick Locke in November 2010.

Barker was 16 of 29 passing in his first start for the Wildcats in place of junior Patrick Towles. His first offensive series wasn't encouraging as the drive mostly went backwards, but he quickly recovered to direct four straight scoring drives, including two ending with Kemp TD runs.

Kentucky built a 20-3 halftime lead that soon exploded into a rout thanks to its running backs and an opportunistic defense that forced two turnovers leading to 10 points and Edwards' interception return

Kentucky raced out to a 21-0 lead in the first quarter but couldn't hold on, as Louisville rallied for a 38-24 win at Commonwealth Stadium in the regular season finale.

Kentucky received the opening kickoff and marched down the field, taking a 7-0 lead on a one-yard rush by quarterback Drew Barker.

After an A.J. Stamps interception, Kentucky took advantage of a short field, going 13 yards in two plays, capped off by a six-yard touchdown rush by Boom Williams to make it 14-0 Kentucky.

On Louisville's next possession, Kentucky intercepted Louisville quarterback Kyle Bolin for the second time, and Josh Forrest returned the pick 81 yards for a touchdown to make it 21-0, still in the first quarter.

Louisville got on the board late in the first quarter when backup quarterback Lamar Jackson rushed 16 yards for a score to make it 21-7. In the second quarter, Kentucky added a 20-yard field goal by Miles

Butler to take a 24-7 lead, which would be the halftime score. Louisville rallied in the second half, eventually tying the game late in

the third quarter, and going on to the victory.

Dorian Baker had three catches for 94 yards for Kentucky, while Mikel Horton had 44 yards on the ground to lead the Cats
