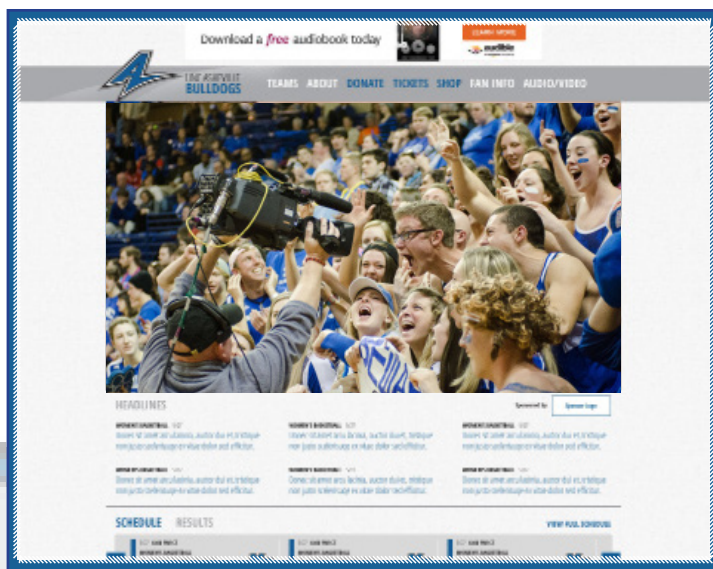

► Bulldogs Break Barriers; March on to Postseason

LEXINGTON, KY.- The UNC Asheville Women's Basketball team earned a No. 14 seed and punched their ticket to Lexington where they will face the No. three seeded University of Kentucky on Saturday, March 19 at 4:00 p.m. in Memorial Coliseum. The game will be broadcast live on ESPN2.

The Bulldogs bring an overall record of 26-6, a regular season conference championship as well as the Big South Conference tournament title into post-season play. Asheville is led by the Big South Conference Coach of the Year, Brenda Mock Kirkpatrick, and carries the Big South Conference Player of the Year, and Big South Conference tournament MVP, Chatori Major on their roster as they move into the first round of the NCAA tournament.

"Obviously we were extremely excited to be involved in the selection show process and enter the prestigious field of 64 teams. I was very pleased with our 14 seed and also the location of our game being in close proximity to Asheville so fans who are unable to make the men's tournament can still be a part of the dance," said head coach Brenda Mock Kirkpatrick.

The No. 12 ranked Wildcats carry an overall record of 23-7 and have punched their ticket to the 2016 NCAA tournament as an at-large team. Kentucky advanced through the SEC tournament, collecting wins over LSU (79-71), and Florida (92-69) before falling to the SEC Conference Champion, University of South Carolina in the semifinals.

The Bulldogs punched their ticket to the big dance with a double overtime (64-62) victory over Liberty University and a Big South Conference Championship crown.

Asheville defeated the No. two seeded Liberty University in a thrilling double-overtime game that ended the Bulldogs' nine-year championship drought.

In the second overtime, Asheville's Paige Love put up the first points for Asheville to give the Bulldogs a 62-60 edge. Nine scoreless possessions would follow before Liberty responded with a jumper from Kearney to tie the game at 62 with 21 seconds remaining. The Bulldogs put the ball in the hands of Conference player of the year, and tournament MVP, Chatori Major who was im-

mediately triple-teamed on the baseline. Major was able to find an opening to dish to Bree Fitzgerald for the lay-in to give Asheville the 64-62 advantage with nine seconds remaining. The Flames were unable to come up with a bucket on their last possession to give Asheville the two-point victory.

After a record-breaking regular season, UNC Asheville entered the Big South Conference Championship tournament as the number one seed on their home floor.

Asheville claimed its first-ever Big South regular season championship and clinched the No. 1 seed for the first time in program history. The Bulldogs finished the regular season with a 16-4 conference record, setting a school record for league victories as well as the first time with double-figure Big South wins.

The Bulldogs were picked to finish 8th out of ten teams in the Big South Conference Preseason Poll back in October. Throughout the 2015-16 season, the Bulldogs opening league play with four straight wins and never dropped below second place in conference standings.

Asheville cracked Colleg Insider.com's Women's Mid-Major Poll for the first time in school history. The team landed in the number 25 spot for the first time on February 25. The Bulldogs would hold a spot in the rankings for three consecutive weeks, moving up as high as the 21 spot in the third week.

The Bulldogs finished the season leading the Big South Conference in two statistical categories, scoring (69ppg), and field goal percentage (42.5%). Asheville led the conference in as many as seven categories at once during the season.

Entering the final day of Big South Conference regular season play, the Bulldogs were tied for first place with Liberty University at 15-4. Asheville's victory over High Point (85-64) boosted them to their most-ever league wins, replacing a previous high of nine conference wins. The Flames dropped their final contest to Presbyterian College to drop them to second place with a record of 15-5.

Tyler Smith

#14 • 5-11 • Sr. • Port Tobacco, MD

2015-16: A Bulldog senior who saw the floor in 19 games for Asheville this season. Smith averaged 1.7 points per game on 35.5 percent shooting. She saw a season-best six points, seven rebounds in Asheville's game against Warren Wilson back in December.

2014-15 (Junior): Appeared in 14 games off the bench ... scored a season-high four points in a win at Longwood (Dec. 14).

2013-2014 (Sophomore): Played in 23 games and sparked the Bulldogs with her play off the bench...averaged 1.3 points and 1.9 rebounds per game...made her sophomore debut in home win over Eastern Kentucky (11-16) as she scored five points and tied career-high in rebounds with six...tallied six points on 2-of-2 shooting from the field in home win over Charleston Southern (1-26)...grabbed four rebounds at Western Carolina (11-20) and in home win over Bluefield (11-26)...scored basket vs. Vanderbilt (12-21)...collected three rebounds in four different games.

2012-2013 (Freshman): Played in 18 games and averaged 1.2 points and 1.5 rebounds per game...scored six points with three rebounds at Presbyterian College (2-2)...grabbed four rebounds at national power UNC Chapel Hill (11-25)...scored four points and collected season-high six rebounds during home game vs. Coastal Carolina (2-9)...tallied four points at Campbell (2-16).

Before UNC Asheville: Averaged 15 points, 12 rebounds and two assists per game as a senior while leading St. Mary's Ryken to its first winning record in the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference ... selected to the All-Conference and All-County teams ... contributed 12 points and nine rebounds per game as a junior while earning team MVP recognition ... standout in cross country, soccer, softball and track and field as well.





GUARD

Paige Love

#30 • 5-8 • Sr. • North Wilkesboro, N.C.

2015-16: A member of the 2015-16 Big South Conference All-Academic team, Love is a regular starter for the Bulldogs. She averages 5.2 points per game and 3.3 rebounds. She has start 19 of 22 games played this year and averages 24.1 minutes per game for Asheville. Love is third on the team in steals and assists, averaging 1 steal and 1.8 assists per game. Love offers the Bulldogs a host of intangibles, and could be considered the glue that keeps the team together. She has posted double-digit scoring in five games for Asheville this season, capping off her senior season in Asheville with a season-high 15 points against High Point University.

2014-15 (Junior): Appeared in 26 games with 22 starts ... filled out the stat sheet with seven points, five boards, four assists, a block and a steal in 31 minutes played in the season opener against ETSU (Nov. 14) ... tallied a team and season-high 14 points including 9-of-11 from the charity stripe against North Carolina A&T (Nov. 18) ... poured in 13 points to go along with five rebounds at Longwood (Dec. 14) ... grabbed a team-high nine rebounds to go along with six points against High Point (Jan. 13) ... nearly finished with a double-double against Coastal Carolina (Jan. 24), pulling down a team-high 10 boards and scoring eight points while also passing out five assists ... scored 11 points, grabbed seven rebounds and dished out six assists in a season-high 33 minutes of action in an overtime win against Longwood (Feb. 5) ... contributed six points and four boards in a win at Coastal Carolina (Feb. 28)

2013-2014 (Sophomore): Started the season with a bang when her half-court shot at the buzzer defeated Furman, 69-66 (11-9)...shot earned Play of the Day honors on ESPN the next day...finished the year as Asheville's third leading scorer (9.3) and leading rebounder (5.2)...career-high of 22 points came at Longwood (1-9) where she hit late shot to give the Bulldogs a road victory...also had five steals in that victory...tallied 19 points with seven rebounds at home vs. High Point (1-16)...scored 14 points with six rebounds and four assists in home triumph over Liberty (1-18)...posted double-double at Coastal Carolina (1-23) with 16 points and 12 rebounds...second on team in assists with 69...pumped in 16 points and garnered six rebounds at Winthrop (2-8)...registered 16 points and seven rebounds plus three assists in early-season victory over Eastern Kentucky (11-16)...averaged 10.1 points and 5.6 rebounds per game in conference play.

2012-2013 (Freshman): Played in all 30 games and started 15 times...started the final 10 games of the year...fourth leading scorer on club with 7.4 points per game average...second on team in assists (83) and fourth in three-pointers made (21) and steals (24)...had career-high of 18 points in three different games vs. Columbia College (12-8), at Charleston Southern (1-24) and Coastal Carolina (1-26)...first career double-double came at home vs. Charleston Southern (2-7) with 14 points and 10 rebounds...tallied 11 points at Gardner-Webb (1-31) and at High Point (2-14)...pumped in 10 points and had four assists during home win vs. Montreat (11-20)...scored nine points and had seven assists vs. Bethune-Cookman (12-18) in Hatter Classic at Stetson...dished out six assists at Campbell (2-16) and at Winthrop (3-2)...scored seven points and had five rebounds in first collegiate game vs. Western Carolina (11-10)...went 6-of-8 from the field and 3-of-4 from beyond the arc vs. Columbia College (12-8).

Before UNC Asheville: Led Wilkes Central to a 30-2 record and a runner-up finish in the state 2-A tournament as a senior ... honors include MVP of the East-West All-Star Game, Most Outstanding Player of the state championship game, Max Preps All-State, Wilkes County Co-Player of the Year and All-District first team ... averaged 15 points, four assists and two steals per game ... scored 12 points per game as a junior ... also played four years on the volleyball team.



GUARD

Chatori Major

#3 • 5-7 • Jr. • Camp Lejeune, N.C.

2015-16: Major earned Big South Conference tournament MVP honors, along with being selected as a member of All-Tournament team. She was also voted the 2015-16 Big South Conference Player of the Year. She averaged 13.4 points per game, 3.2 rebounds per game and 27.7 minutes per game. Major is Asheville's leading scorer and has provided team-high points in 11 games this season. Major leads the Bulldogs in 8 statistical categories. She ranks in the top 10 in the Big South in: Three-point percentage (2nd), scoring (5th), Field Goal percentage (4th) and Three-pointers made (8th). Major has started all 29 games this season and has scored in double figures in 21 games.

2014-15 (Sophomore): Played in all 31 games including three starts ... reached double-digit scoring in six games, leading the team in scoring on three different occasions ... reached double figures in scoring in six games ... poured in eight points in the season opener at ETSU (Nov. 14) ... scored a season-high 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the field at USC Upstate (Dec. 21) ... led team with 11 points against Liberty (Dec. 30) ... chipped in 10 points on the road at Campbell (Jan. 10) ... matched a season-high with 15 points on 7-of-10 shooting in a road victory at Gardner-Webb (Jan. 17) ... matched a season-high and led team with 15 points vs. Winthrop (Feb. 7) ... led team with 14 points and grabbed a season-high four rebounds against Gardner-Webb (Feb. 21).

2013-2014 (Freshman): Played in 20 games and improved as the season progressed...season-high of six points came in home win over Longwood (Feb. 15) where she played 12 minutes and had two steals and two rebounds...career-best in minutes played came in home loss to Winthrop (Jan. 2) with 13 minutes played and four points...knocked down a three-pointer at Presbyterian (Jan. 30)...scored bucket and had two assists at Big South Tournament vs. High Point (March 6)...grabbed three rebounds and was 4-of-4 from free throw line at Gardner-Webb (Feb. 1).

Before UNC Asheville: Led Camp Lejeune to spot in regional championship game with 26-1 record...averaged 24.7 points and 5.1 rebounds per game as a senior...earned All-Conference and All-Area honors as a sophomore, junior and senior...averaged 22 points per game as a junior...team MVP as a junior and senior...also lettered in volleyball and track and field.

Tianna Knuckles

#22 • 5-10 • Jr. • Wendell, N.C.

2015-16: Knuckles was selected as a member of the Big South Conference's All-Tournament team. She also earned Second-team All-Conference honors in the Big South Conference postseason awards. She is the second leading scorer for Asheville and has provided team-high points in 12 games this season. Knuckles leads the Bulldogs in three statistical categories. She has started 28 games this season and scored in double-figures in 22 games. She ranks in the top 10 in the Big South in: Three-pointers made (2nd), Three-point shooting percentage (6th), Scoring (7th) and Field Goal Percentage (10th).

2014-15 (Sophomore): Appeared in all 31 games, including five starts ... team's second leading scorer, averaging 8.6 points and 3.2 rebounds per game ... led the team in scoring eight times while leading the team in rebounding twice ... reached double-digit scoring 14 times during the season ... led the team in scoring with a season-high 19 points to go along with six rebounds in the season opener against ETSU (Nov. 14) ... chipped in 13 points and six rebounds against Wofford (Dec. 6) ... led team in scoring with 16 points on 5-of-7 shooting from the field at Furman (Dec. 10) ... tallied a team-high 14 points on 5-of-6 shooting including 4-of-5 from behind the arc in a win over Longwood (Dec. 14) ... led team with 16 points in 17 minutes against Western Carolina (Dec. 17) ... produced a team-high 14 points including a perfect 6-of-6 from the free-throw line at Presbyterian (Jan. 3) ... scored 12 points against Radford (Jan. 20) ... tallied 13 points and nine rebounds in an overtime win against Longwood (Feb. 5) ... scored 14 points while logging a season-high 27 minutes in the season's penultimate contest at Coastal Carolina (March 3).

2013-2014 (Freshman): Earned seven starts and played in all 31 games... Asheville's second leading scorer with a 9.5 average...was in double figures in points during 16 games...scored career-high 21 points on 9-of-17 shooting from field in home win over Presbyterian College (12-30)...named Big South Freshman of the Week in December for strong play at national power Vanderbilt...tallied 19 points in near upset of High Point on the road (2-22)...pumped in 18 points vs. Coastal Carolina at home (3-1)...second on the team in three-pointers made with 38...first career double-double came in road win at Longwood (1-9) with 10 points and 12 rebounds...tallied 15 points with eight rebounds vs. North Carolina A&T (12-17)...scored 11 points with three steals vs. Radford in Big South Tournament win (3-4)...added 12 points vs. High Point in Big South Tourney (3-6)...averaged 3.9 rebounds per game...collected nine rebounds vs. Winthrop (1-2)...knocked down three 3-pointers in seven different games...scored 12 points and hit crucial three-pointer in home win over Liberty (1-18).

Before UNC Asheville: Led East Wake to 18-8 overall record senior year... averaged 13 points, 2.3 rebounds and 1.4 steals per game as a senior...junior year averaged 13.8 points and 3.7 rebounds per game...named to All-Conference and All-District team as a junior and senior...outstanding student who earned Academic All-Conference honors all four of her years at East Wake... was named as a Marine Corp Distinguished Athlete...also lettered in volleyball..



GUARD

Ja'Da Brayboy

#24 • 5-6 • Jr. • Charlotte, N.C.

2015-16: Brayboy has locked down her role as Asheville's primary point guard this season, starting 22 games of 26 games played and averaging 26.4 minutes per game. Brayboy averages 6.9 points and 4 rebounds per game, leading the guards in rebounding and coming in fourth overall on the team. Brayboy leads the Bulldogs in assists, averaging 2.7 dimes per game with 71 on the season. She is also second on the team in steals with 31 picks this season with 1.2 per game. Brayboy has led the team in rebounds on three separate occasions this season and dropped double-digits in nine games.

2014-15 (Sophomore): Appeared in all 31 games including five starts ... contributed eight points and three assists in 25 minutes in a win over Barton (Nov. 24) ... pulled down seven rebounds against Wofford (Dec. 6) ... tallied 10 points and six rebounds in a win over Longwood (Feb. 5) ... led the team in rebounding and set a season-high with eight boards while also pitching in six points against Winthrop (Feb. 7).

2015-16: Weaver has been a key defensive presence for the Bulldogs this season, stepping up as the team's leading rebounder, averaging 6.7 boards per game despite a gap of seven games she missed due to injury. Weaver has started in 17 of 22 games played this year. She has recorded team-high rebounds in 10 games this season. Weaver leads Asheville in total rebounds (147), rebounding average (6.7/g), defensive rebounds (90, 4.1/g) and blocked shots (23). She has recorded at least 3 rebounds in every game played. She is ranked 10th in the Big South in rebounding, blocked shots and defensive rebounds.

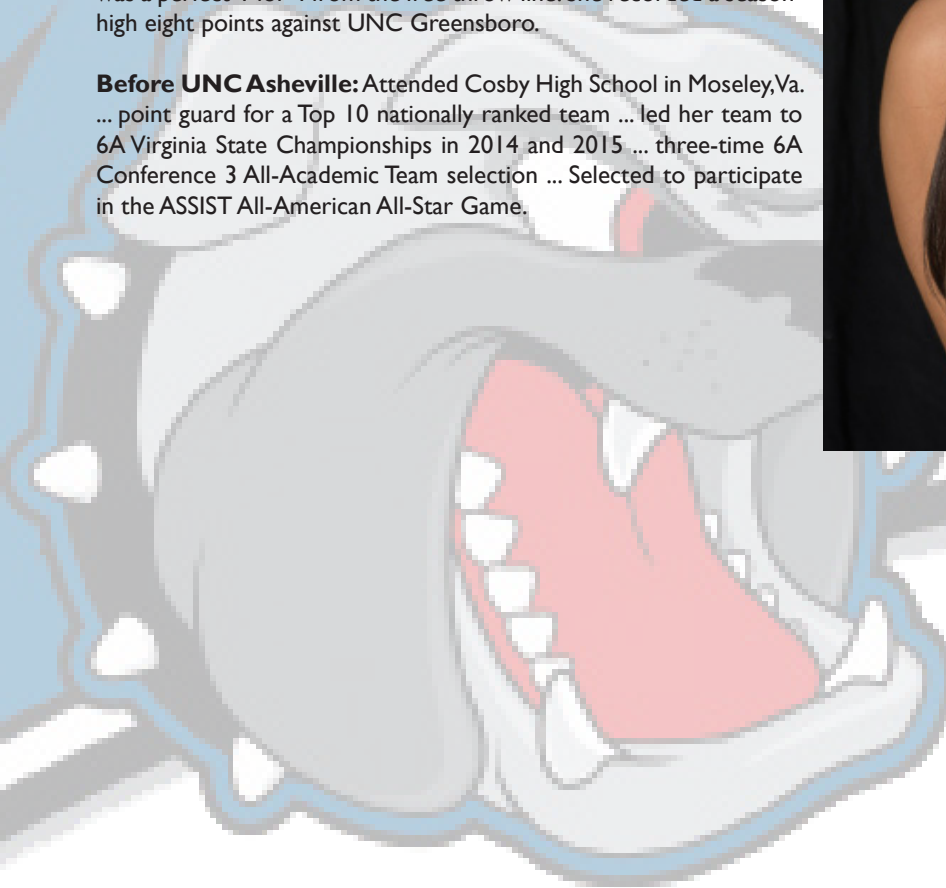

Kiara Smith joined the Bulldogs as an assistant coach in July 2015, coming to Asheville after spending the last two seasons as a Graduate Assistant with N.C. State following a playing career at UT-Chattanooga.

As a player with the Mocs, Smith was a member of the Southern Conference Regular Season Championship Team in 2009 and a part of the Southern Conference Championship team in 2010. The team grabbed an NCAA postseason appearance in 2014 and reached the postseason NIT following the 2015 campaign.

As a graduate assistant with the Seminoles, Petersen's responsibilities included directing the scout team, assisting with video, helping with team travel and official visits along with aiding skill development and individual workouts. Josh also helped run Florida State's women's basketball camp while he was in Tallahassee.

A native of Abernathy, Texas, Petersen moved to Tallahassee before his senior year of high school and graduated from Godby High School. He earned his master's degree in sports management at FSU in the spring of 2014 and his B.S. degree in accounting and finance in 2012.



Asst. Coach

Honey Brown

Maryville College, 1994 • Fourth Season

Honey Brown begins her fourth year as a member of Brenda Mock Kirkpatrick's coaching staff.

During her career, she has coached eight all-conference performers, including one conference player of the year and one most improved player. She's also coached six 1,000-point scorers.

Prior to Asheville, Brown spent four seasons as an assistant at St. Louis working primarily with SLU's point guards. Before her time with the Billikens, Brown served as director and head trainer at Performance Training, Inc., in Orlando, Fla. While there she managed all aspects of the company, including staffing issues, schedules and marketing.

Brown also spent four years as an assistant at Ohio University and a season as an assistant at Central Florida. She got her start in coaching as an assistant with Lenoir City High School in Lenoir, Tenn. While with LCHS she helped lead the Panthers to a state tournament appearance in 1998.

A 1994 graduate of Maryville College, she was third in the nation in 3-point percentage for Division III her junior year; while serving as a team captain her final two seasons. The Scots made four consecutive appearances in the NCAA III Tournament during her career at Maryville, including two trips to the round of 16.





Head Coach

Brenda Mock Kirkpatrick

Wake Forest, 2001 • Fourth Season as H.C.

Waynesville native and former Florida assistant coach Brenda Mock Kirkpatrick is in her fourth year as head coach of the UNC Asheville women's basketball program.

Coach Kirkpatrick was elected as the 2015-16 Big South Conference Coach of the year. The Big South Conference Coaches made the unanimous decision to elect her as the league's Coach of the year, with Kirkpatrick receiving all 10 first place votes.

Kirkpatrick and the Bulldogs captured the Big South Conference regular season crown for the first time in program history this year, and set a new school record for most Big South Conference wins at 16, replacing a previous best of nine. Asheville was picked to finish 8th in the Big South Conference Preseason Poll in late October.

In the 2015-16 season, Kirkpatrick amassed 23 wins, bettering her record of 22 victories in the past three seasons combined. To start the 2015-16 season, the Bulldogs also matched the program's best start of 9-2 before falling to Clemson University on the road in December.

In the past four seasons, she has been steadily rebuilding the Bulldog program. Asheville has continued to make positive strides, finishing 9-22 last season but saw 10 of those losses come by a single-digit margin, including six coming by only three points or less.

The 2013-2014 Bulldogs finished with 11 wins, the most for the program in four seasons. Asheville had landmark non-conference victories over Furman and Eastern Kentucky. In addition, the Bulldogs downed Liberty, giving the Blue & White its first home win over the Lady Flames in 17 years. Asheville earned a 43-42 win over Radford in the first round of the Big South Conference Tournament. The win was the Bulldogs first tournament win in seven years.

Kirkpatrick joined the Bulldog program after serving as an assistant to Amanda Butler at the University of Florida for five years. She helped lead the Gator program to five consecutive post-season berths, including two trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Before going to Florida, Kirkpatrick worked at Charlotte for two years when Butler was the head coach of the 49er program. During their two years together in Charlotte, the 49ers compiled 40 wins, captured a share of the 2006 Atlantic 10 regular-season championship and earned a pair of



postseason berths.

Kirkpatrick broke into the coaching ranks in the 2002-03 season with Georgia Tech under then-head coach Agnus Berenato, helping the Yellow Jackets win 20 games and earn a bid into the NCAA Tournament for only the second time in program history. Berenato departed following that record-setting campaign for the University of Pittsburgh, while Kirkpatrick remained on staff in Atlanta for the 2003-04 season. Following her stay at Georgia Tech, Kirkpatrick spent a short time in Jacksonville before heading to Charlotte.

A successful collegiate playing tenure afforded Kirkpatrick the opportunity to play professionally in France for Nantes-Reze 44 during the 2001-02 season before launching her coaching career.

Kirkpatrick earned a bachelor's of arts in history and sociology in 2000 and a master's of arts in education in 2001 from Wake Forest University. She enjoyed an outstanding career in Winston-Salem, where the two-time captain averaged 7.2 points and 5.1 rebounds per contest during her four-year



career. As a senior in 2000-01, the six-foot forward garnered honorable mention All-ACC honors after contributing 10 points and 6.2 rebounds per game.

During her time as a Demon Deacon, Kirkpatrick was a first-team academic all-district selection and a four-year member of the ACC Student-Athlete Honor Roll. Despite having to take a medical redshirt (ACL) for the 1996-97

season that delayed her collegiate debut, Kirkpatrick did not miss a game during her four-year career, appearing in all 111 contests and earning 57 starts.

The daughter of Weaver and Brenda Kirkpatrick, she is most often referred to as 'Coach Mock' or 'Mock,' which is her middle name, and also her mother's maiden name.

A native of Waynesville, Mock graduated from Tuscola High School in 1996 as a decorated student and athlete. While maintaining a 4.2 grade-point average, she lettered in softball and volleyball in addition to her stellar hoops career, where she was an honorable mention All-America selection by Street & Smith and USA Today in 1995 and 1996, while setting two state records for free throws: most in a game (25-of-25) and most consecutive (39), totaling 51 points in the game she hit 25 free throws. Kirkpatrick was the Asheville Citizen-Times Player of the Year for three consecutive seasons. She played for John Best at Tuscola in basketball.

Major calls player of year honor “unreal”

Chatori Major said she was just hoping that “maybe people would know my name” during her collegiate basketball career at North Carolina-Asheville.

The 20-year-old former Lejeune High standout certainly accomplished that goal after Major was named the Big South Conference’s player of the year.

“It’s unreal,” the junior said. “I was surprised when my coach told me because I wasn’t expecting it.”

The 5-foot-7 Major took the league’s top player award after leading the Bulldogs in scoring with 13.4 points per game to go along with 3.2 rebounds. She also finished in the top 10 in the conference in three-point percentage (2nd), scoring (4th), field goal percentage (4th), and 3-pointers made (8th).

Major’s efforts helped Asheville (23-6, 16-4) to its first Big South Conference regular-season title and set a school record for most league victories. The top-seeded Bulldogs host No. 9 Campbell (13-17) on Friday in the quarterfinals of the conference tournament.

“It’s a very big honor,” Major said in a telephone interview Thursday.

Major, who graduated from Lejeune in 2013, started all 29 games. Eleven times she led UNCA in scoring and hit double digits in 21 games.

“Being confident,” she said when asked what attributed to her individual success. “I was able to attack the basket and I was able to open penetration lanes for my teammates. When teams focused on me, it opened things for my teammates.”

While pleased with her award, Major said she isn’t content.

“I’m happy, but I’m not satisfied,” she said. “I feel there’s so much more left, not just from me but also from my team. I’m excited to see what’s going to happen in the tournament.”

And Major’s main focus now is winning the conference tournament and earning the league’s automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

“We just have to take it game by game and possession by possession like we’ve done all season and play our game,” she said. “It definitely gives us motivation to win it since our guys did it. I’m happy for them, but now it’s our turn.”

With Major hoping to lead the way.

“I’m a nervous person and I would say there’s a lot of pressure on me, but everybody has been telling me to just do my thing and everything will fall in place,” she said. “I know if I’m not scoring, my teammates will.”

ASHEVILLE – UNC Asheville coach Brenda Mock Kirkpatrick is well aware of the success of Kentucky, the Bulldogs' opening round foe in the NCAA women's tournament.

Before coming to Asheville in 2012, Kirkpatrick was as an assistant at Florida, which competes in the Southeastern Conference with Kentucky.

"I spent five years as an assistant at Florida and have been watching Coach (Matthew) Mitchell build that program into a national powerhouse," she said Monday after learning the Bulldogs earned a No. 14 seed to the Lexington Regional against the No. 3 seeded Wildcats.

"They have continued that success since I left the SEC four years ago and will be an incredibly tough opponent on Saturday. I have watched them a couple of times this season, and they were very impressive in the conference tournament. We look forward to Saturday, and we know that it will be an exciting environment because Kentucky fans support their women's basketball program very well."

Kentucky (23-7) lost to No. 2 South Carolina in the SEC semifinals. The Bulldogs (26-6) won the Big South regular-season title and earned a bid to the tournament with a 64-62 win over Liberty in two overtimes in the Big South tournament championship game Sunday.

Saturday's game will begin at 4 p.m. and will be televised on ESPN2.

The Asheville men are seeded 15th in the South Region and will play No. 2 Villanova at 12:40 p.m. Friday in Brooklyn, N.Y.

"Obviously, we were extremely excited to be involved in the selection show process and enter the prestigious field of 64 teams," Kirkpatrick said.

"I was very pleased with our 14 seed and also the location of our game being in close proximity to Asheville so fans who are unable to make the men's tournament can still be a part of the dance."

Coaches of Asheville men, women share special

Seconds after the UNC Asheville women beat Liberty on Sunday at Kimmel Arena to earn a berth in the NCAA tournament, some of the first people on the floor to celebrate with the women were members of the Bulldogs' men's team.

It was a scene that didn't surprise those close to the program.

There is a closeness between the teams and it begins with the coaches.

Brenda Mock Kirkpatrick and Nick McDevitt can't help but run into each other several times a day because their offices are separated by a conference room, which they share along with a printer.

They wouldn't want it any other way. McDevitt is a fan of Kirkpatrick and her staff and Kirkpatrick feels the same way about the men's coaches.

"I'm thankful he is who he is," said Kirkpatrick, whose team, seeded 14th in the Lexington Region, has a 26-6 record and will play No. 3 Kentucky in the opening round of the tournament on Saturday.

"With those close quarters if there was a guy down there that who was not invested in women's basketball, that's going to make our job uncomfortable. He is so humble and he's never come across that 'We're men's basketball, we should be the top dog around here.' I've never felt that way."

And make no mistake. McDevitt is a big fan of Kirkpatrick and what she's accomplished in turning around a program that had fallen to the bottom of the Big South.

Nick McDevitt and his UNC Asheville men's team will play Villanova on Friday.

"We talk every day and we probably watch each other at some point during a practice multiple times during the week," said McDevitt, who was an assistant when Kirkpatrick joined the women's program in 2012.

His team left Wednesday for Brooklyn where the No. 15 seed Bulldogs will play No. 2 Villanova on Friday in the NCAA tournament.

"We've stolen drills from each other," he said. "It's like 'Hey, that's a little bit better way of doing that drill.' We may tweak something from what we see. We talk about our players to each other all the time. We're close."

"It's phenomenal what those young ladies have done and what she's done to go from two wins to winning the outfight championship and winning 26 games. She's got a really good bunch. They're athletic, coachable and a group of good girls who are doing it the right way."

Before coming to Asheville, Kirkpatrick worked as an assistant at Charlotte, Georgia Tech and Florida. Men's assistant Brett Carey spent some time at South Carolina. They both know that at bigger programs there may not be the camaraderie between the staffs that there is at Asheville.

"There is a closeness between not only our staffs but our teams as well and it's awesome to watch," Carey said.

"I've been other places, Brenda's been other places and you really don't get that a lot. I think it's unique. You don't want anybody feeling like a second fiddle. At the end of the day we're all coaching basketball and we're in this together."

"We can learn from them, they can learn from us. That's a good thing in my opinion."

It's part of what makes UNC Asheville special.



The Big South Conference

For more than 30 years, the Big South Conference has matured into a competitive leader in college athletics, actively pursuing excellence on the field of play and in the classroom. The League's growing presence as an NCAA Division I athletic conference is evident by notable accomplishments on the national stage, innovative marketing and media partnerships, increased television packages, and quality athletic competition while intentionally fostering the academic, personal, social, athletic and leadership development of each student-athlete. This has evolved into the Conference's mission of "Developing Leaders Through Athletics."

On April 24, 1983, Charleston Southern (then Baptist College) Athletic Director Howard Bagwell and Augusta President George Christenberry began recruiting members into the Big South and less than four months later on August 21, the Big South Conference was formed when Augusta, Charleston Southern, Campbell, Coastal Carolina and Winthrop committed to the new League. One month later, Dr. Edward M. Singleton was selected as the League's first Commissioner and continued to solicit new members. His efforts led to the additions of Armstrong State, Radford and UNC Asheville, giving the Big South more than the required six members to constitute an official conference. The Big South's first year of competition was in the Fall of 1984, and in September 1986, the Big South Conference was granted full-fledged NCAA Division I status.

During its infancy and prior to securing automatic bids to NCAA Championships, the Big South made early strides in earning at-large berths in several national postseason events, including volleyball, women's basketball and women's golf. In 1989, George F. "Buddy" Sasser replaced the retiring Dr. Singleton as Commissioner, and in 1990, the League received its first automatic bid -- an automatic qualifier to the NCAA Baseball Championship. Under Sasser's seven years of leadership, the Conference implemented its public relations and compliance programs, and introduced its first-ever men's basketball television package, featuring the Big South competing against some of the finest teams in the nation.

In August 1996, Kyle B. Kallander replaced Sasser as the League's third Commissioner, and in his 18 years at the helm of the Big South, Kallander has been instrumental in aggressively promoting the Conference to unprecedented new heights. The Conference has enjoyed record levels in marketing revenue during his tenure, as he has brought television coverage to Big South women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's soccer, volleyball and women's lacrosse for the first time in Conference history, as well as increased national television exposure to the League as a whole through aggressive and unique television packages.

Under Kallander's leadership, the Big South developed and initiated its first long-range strategic plan, re-affirming the League's vision as a distinctive athletic Conference committed to the quality of institutional life through athletic competition. He also spearheaded the efforts to add football as a championship sport, which came to fruition in 2002, and oversaw the additions of men's and women's indoor track & field in 1997 and women's lacrosse in 2013. At the same time, Kallander has solidified Conference membership with double-digit member institutions for six consecutive years. Recent additions include High Point, Gardner-Webb, Presbyterian College and Longwood, plus the return of charter member Campbell University. Kallander's long range vision has also included technological advancements, as the Conference introduced its first live video streaming event in 2005 and has since expanded its video offerings to more than 800 annually through a partnership with the member institutions, as well as the creation of several online and social media platforms.

Since 2000, the Big South Conference has experienced monumental growth and success in nearly every sport. During this time, the Conference has had an individual National Champion six times, has had more than 325 All-Americans, has reached the quarterfinals in the FCS Playoffs as well as the "Sweet 16" in men's soccer, women's basketball and baseball; has received national Top 25 rankings in football, men's soccer, men's basketball, women's basketball, baseball, men's outdoor track & field, and men's golf; had an individual selected to play in the NCAA Singles Championship eight times in addition to the first men's tennis doubles at-large selection; had the first women's golf program advance to the national finals; had the No. 1 ranked men's golfer in the country; had the nation's top scoring men's basketball team five consecutive years as well as the national men's basketball scoring leader twice; has received two at-large playoff berths in the Football Championship Subdivision since 2006; has had nine NFL Draft picks; and has had two institutions finish in the top 10 in the NCAA Men's Golf Championships -- including the Conference's highest-ever team finish in an NCAA event (fifth in 2007).

In 2006-07, the Big South was the only Conference nationwide to have an at-large participant in the football playoffs (Coastal Carolina), a team in the Second Round of the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament (Winthrop) and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Baseball Regionals (Coastal Carolina). In fact, Coastal Carolina's baseball program has been a No. 1 seed four times -- including a national seed for the first time in 2010, while the Chanticleers' FCS playoff berth in 2006 came in

just the fifth-year of the Big South's football existence. The 2009-10 season saw Liberty's Sam Chelanga win two NCAA National Championships (cross country, 10,000-meter run); Coastal Carolina's baseball team reach the Super Regionals for the second time in three years as well as being ranked No. 1 in the national RPI and as high as No. 3 in the national polls; and three women's basketball teams reached the postseason for the first time in Conference history. In 2010-11, Chelanga won two more NCAA National Championships

(cross country, outdoor 5,000-meter run), the Big South had its first automatic bid recipient in football (Coastal Carolina), UNC Asheville reached the Second Round of the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, Coastal Carolina's women's golf team was the first in Conference history to advance to the NCAA Championship out of Regional play, and a League-record 18 baseball players were drafted in the 2011 MLB First-Year Player Draft. In 2011-12, the Big South had a record five individuals selected for the NCAA Men's Golf Regionals -- the most of any Division I conference, as well as a record 42 All-Americans.

In 2012-13, the Big South had 32 student-athletes earn All-America distinction, while another 12 were named Academic All-Americans. The Conference also had two football playoff teams -- and two playoff wins -- for the first time, had a women's basketball team win a postseason game for the first time since 2005, had a League-record four men's basketball teams selected for postseason play, had two men's soccer teams reach the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season, and had two men's and women's golf programs selected for NCAA Regional play. This past season produced the League's first FCS playoff quarterfinalist, had four postseason wins in men's basketball, had its second women's golf team qualify for nationals, and tied the Conference-record with 13 Academic All-Americans.

Several former Big South student-athletes have also reached national prominence in recent years. Coastal Carolina's Amber Campbell made the U.S. Olympic Team in 2008 and 2012, and was one of five former Big South athletes to compete in the 2008 Games; High Point's Tamas Kovacs qualified for the 2012 London Games; VMI's Reggie Williams played in the NBA from 2010-14, Campbell's Eric Griffin signed with the Dallas Mavericks this past summer, UNC Asheville's Ty Wigginton was named an American League All-Star in 2010, and Coastal Carolina's Dustin Johnson has won nine PGA Tour events since departing the Big South Conference in 2007. Two former Big South baseball players made their major league debuts in 2014 (Eddie Butler and Tommy La Stella), while Avery Warley became the third Big South women's basketball player to play in the WNBA three years ago.

The Conference's tagline, "Developing Leaders Through Athletics" was unveiled in 2008-09 in conjunction with the Conference's 25th Anniversary. The League also honored its heritage with the Top 25 "Best of the Best" moments in League history from 1983-2008, with Liberty University's 10-year women's basketball championship run from 1996-2007 being crowned the No. 1 moment in the Big South's first 25 years. As part of the League's 30th anniversary celebration in 2013-14, All-Decade Teams were recognized for the first time in each sport. The Conference's on-field accomplishments have been duplicated in the classroom. For the past five years, nearly 50 percent of Conference's student-athletes were named to the Big South's Presidential Honor Roll for maintaining a 3.0 grade-point average for the academic year, and the League has had more than 120 Academic All-Americans in its history. Furthermore, the Big South has recorded double figure totals in NCAA Public Recognition Awards for APR progress the last five years.





UNC ASHEVILLE CHANCELLOR - DR. MARY GRANT



Mary K. Grant, Ph.D., was appointed UNC Asheville's seventh chancellor in August 2014 and began leadership of UNC Asheville in January 2015. Previously, she served for 12 years as president of Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts (MCLA), in North Adams, Massachusetts.

A leader in the public liberal arts, Grant oversaw growth in enrollment at MCLA, strengthened the connections between the college

and the community and launched the college's first comprehensive capital campaign.

Grant is a passionate advocate for public higher education, civic engagement and community service. For her longstanding efforts and contributions, she received the 2014 MCLA Distinguished Alumnus Award, and received the 2014 New England Board of Higher Education's (NEBHE) Massachusetts State Merit Award. She is the recipient of the 2011 American Council on Education Massachusetts National Network of Women Leaders Lifetime Achievement Award and the 2011 Francis H. Hayden Award from the Berkshire Chamber of Commerce. In 2010, she received the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) District I Executive Leadership Award in recognition of her success in increasing MCLA's institutional stature in, and service to, the community. During her tenure as MCLA's 11th president, the college joined the Massachusetts State University System and was designated a top 10 public liberal arts college by U.S. News and World Report, joining UNC Asheville on this prestigious list.

Hallmarks of Grant's leadership include expanding academic programming and facilities; recruiting an array of outstanding new faculty; and providing students with new study away, internship, research, and service opportunities. She also provided leadership to advance the science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) agenda in Berkshire County and statewide in Massachusetts, spearheading efforts leading to MCLA successfully securing \$54 million to fund the Feigenbaum Center for Science and Innovation. In

addition, she established the Berkshire Compact for Education, a countywide initiative focused on strengthening education in Berkshire County.

Grant's board service includes Campus Compact, Commonwealth Covenant Fund, MassINC, Norman Rockwell Museum, John Adams Innovation Institute, and University of Massachusetts Boston Board of Visitors, among others. She also served on the Massachusetts Governor's Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Advisory Council and was chair of the Council of Presidents of the Massachusetts Statewide University System; chair of the board of the Massachusetts Campus Compact; and president of the board of the Council of Public Liberal Arts Colleges (COPLAC), of which MCLA and UNC Asheville are members.

Prior to her presidency at MCLA, she had extensive experience in public higher education including serving as the chief academic officer and deputy CEO of UMassOnline. She was a senior fellow at the John W. McCormack Institute of Public Affairs at UMass Boston, where she held several key administrative positions, including director of the Center for Social Policy and assistant vice chancellor for administration and finance and human resources. She also served as chair of the institute's faculty.

Grant holds a Ph.D. in social policy from The Heller School at Brandeis University, a master's degree in public affairs from the John W. McCormack Graduate School of Policy and Global Studies at UMass Boston, and a bachelor's degree in sociology from Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts. In 2012, Grant received an honorary degree from Williams College.

Grant is married to Jim Canavan, a management consultant and nonprofit leader, and they reside on campus in the Brumit Pisgah House with their dog, Sweeney.





DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS - JANET CONE

SENIOR ADMINISTRATOR FOR UNIVERSITY ENTERPRISES



Janet R. Cone, who has served as UNC Asheville's athletics director since 2004, is the only woman currently serving on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee that selects and seeds the teams for the March Madness Tournament.

Cone previously served as associate athletics director for Samford University, and also coached

women's basketball at Samford, Western Carolina University and Mars Hill College. Cone holds a bachelor's degree from Furman University and a master's degree from the University of South Carolina. She was one of just 28 Directors of Athletics to be named as Under Armour AD of the Year in 2013 by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics.

Off the field, she helped negotiate the first-ever college revenue development service platform with IMG College to combine athletics development and capital campaign with sponsorship sales. This partnership enters its second year this fall.

Outside of UNC Asheville, Cone helped create the Asheville Buncombe Regional Sports Commission and was the former chair. She currently serves as a founding board member for the group. In addition to her term on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee, she is also currently serving on the NCAA Division I Institutional Performance Committee and also sits on various Big South Conference Committees.

Under Cone's leadership the Bulldogs have achieved unbelievable progress with

the creation and implementation of the "More Wins, More Friends, and More Resources" strategic plan. Cone, who also serves as the Senior Administrator for University Enterprises, oversaw the successful opening of the Wilma M. Sherrill Center which houses the Kimmel Arena, a new tennis facility, and the expansion of the Karl Straus Track Facility. In addition, a campaign to build on-campus baseball and soccer stadiums is underway.

More importantly, the Bulldog athletic department Academic Progress Rate is 977, and Bulldog student-athletes have an overall 3.108 GPA and a Graduation Rate of 85%. A sustainable revenue plan has been implemented to increase the athletics budget from \$2.1M to \$5.7M and will add another \$1.2M over the next two years. Bulldogs have also won Big South Conference Championships in Baseball, Men's Basketball, Women's Basketball, and Women's Soccer and perform thousands of hours of community service each year.

In addition, Cone has rigorously worked to improve Gender Equity, and earlier this year, she announced the addition of women's golf as the 16th NCAA Division I athletics program at UNC Asheville. When women's golf tees off in 2016-17, they will become the second sport added in the last five years. Cone helped revive the women's swimming program in 2012-13, the first time the athletics department had added a sport in 20 years.
