UK PLAYS NO. 8 SOUTH CAROLINA IN COLUMBIA

The Kentucky women's soccer team will have one of its biggest opportunities remaining for a quality win on its schedule Sunday afternoon as it finishes its Columbia swing in the Palmetto State against the undefeated at No. 8 South Carolina Gamecocks at 2 p.m. ET from Stone Stadium live on the SEC Network+, ESPN3 and the WatchESPN app.

UK was shutout for just the second time all season on Thursday night at Missouri, dropping a 2-0 decision to the Tigers on the road. Kentucky has now gone two matches running without a win and sits at 0-2-1 in the Southeastern Conference, sitting on one point through three matches.

The Wildcats beat South Carolina 1-0 in the teams' last meeting - coming back in 2014 when Kentucky made the Sweet 16 in Lexington. The Wildcats and Gamecocks did not meet in 2015 due to the SEC scheduling grid.

Sunday afternoon's match will be the 22nd all-time meeting between USC and UK. The Wildcats lead the all-time series 13-7-1. The two sides did not meet in 2015. UK has won three of the last four meetings with the Gamecocks and has gotten a result in four of the last five matches against USC.

QUICK NOTES

- UK is starting a true freshman goalkeeper for the third time in the last four seasons, and second-straight year. (2012 - Kayla Price (FR), 2013 - Kayla King (SR), 2014 - Taylor Braun (FR), 2015 - Katelyn Jensen (FR).
- This is the first year under Jon Lipsitz that Kentucky is playing a 3-5-2 formation (prior: 4-3-3).
- Tanya Samarzich has two two-goal matches this season (High Point, Murray State).
- The Wildcats started five freshman on opening day, the most under Jon Lipsitz in his tenure.
- Kentucky started the 2013 season 0-1-1 and made it to the second round of the NCAA Tourney.
- UK had 28 shots vs. Alabama, the most since a 5-0 win over Frances Marion in Aug. 2014.
- Kentucky made the 2014 SEC Tournament Championship match for the first time since 2006, after also collecting the program's first-ever SEC Tournament win under Jon Lipsitz in 2014.
- Courtney Raetzman was drafted No. 32 overall to the Chicago Red Stars in the 2015 NWSL Draft. She became the second UK player ever drafted to play professional soccer at any level.
- For the first time in program history, UK made four-straight NCAA Tournaments from 2011-14. The Wildcats have advanced to the second round in two of the last three seasons, setting a program record for the best season in program history in 2014 with an appearance in the Sweet 16, going 16-7-1 in 2014.

LIPSITZ IN EIGHTH YEAR

Jon Lipsitz is in his eighth year as the head soccer coach at the University of Kentucky.

Lipsitz currently owns a 188-89-25 career record after four years at UK and stops at Charlotte (59-24-4 in four years) and Denison (43-10-4 in three years) prior to coming to Lexington.

His .695 career winning percentage is the third highest among active coaches in the Southeastern Conference entering the 2016 season.

NEW FORMATION

Kentucky is using a 3-5-2 formation this year after using a 4-3-3 in the first seven years of Jon Lipsitz's tenure at UK. The coaching staff elected to make the change from a 4-3-3 to a 3-5-2 after the 3-0 loss at Pepperdine.

SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Goalkeeper Evangeline Soucie was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Sept. 5 after recording a then-career high eight saves in a win at Louisville and on that Sunday, notching her first-career clean sheet.

28 SHOTS

Kentucky recorded 28 shots vs. Alabama on Sunday in a 1-1 draw. It was the eighth time under Jon Lipsitz that UK has recorded 28 or more shots in a single match and the first time UK has failed to win when doing so.

NEW FORMATION

Kentucky sits at No. 38 in the initial release of the Ratings Percentage Index (RPI), which would comfortably qualify the Wildcats for the NCAA Tournament at this point. The top 32 teams that are seeded by the selection committee will host a First Round match on their campus sites.

EIGHT DIFFERENT GOAL SCORERS

Kentucky has had eight players score a goals this year.

FIVE GOAL WONDER

Kentucky scored a season-high five goals against Murray State on Sunday, and four goals in the second half alone. It was the most goals scored in a single match since scoring

seven goals vs. Toledo on Aug. 30, 2015 and most goals in a half since scoring six in the second half of that same match.

MILLER IN THE CLUTCH

Midfielder Kaitlin Miller has scored two game-winning goals this season, including the match winner at Louisville in the annual "Battle of the Bluegrass" at Louisville in addition to her GWG vs. Murray State on Sunday.

HOME OPENER SUCCESS

Kentucky lost its first home opener since 1998 against No. 23 South Florida at the Bell Soccer Complex. UK was a perfect 7-0-0 in home openers under Lipsitz until that match. UK held a 2-0 lead and lost, 3-2.

TWO-GOAL RARITY

Kentucky's 2-0 lead against South Florida that was blown into a 3-2 loss was the first time since Oct. 11, 1994 against Cincinnati that the Wildcats had lost a match in which it had held a two-goal lead in regulation.

BATTLE OF THE BLUEGRASS

UK has won six in a row against Louisville for the first time in the history of the "Battle of the Bluegrass". Kentucky allowed UL to score a goal for the first time in 393 minutes this year when the Cards took the early 1-0 lead.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

Kentucky has played one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the nation, having already played three nationally-ranked teams and additionally, three true road

UK head coach Jon Lipsitz ranks second among league coaches in all-time winning percentage. Lipsitz has posted a .695 percentage throughout his career entering the 2016 season.

SAMARZICH'S BRACE

Kentucky's Tanya Samarzich had a two-goal performance against High Point on Sunday. It was the first time a UK player scored two goals in a match since Michaela Dooley's hat trick on Aug. 30, 2015 in a 4-1 win over Toledo. She would score twice in the match vs. Murray State on Sunday, Sept. 11 as well making her the first player at UK with two two-goal matches in the same season since Arin Gilliland in 2013.

FIRST CLEAN SHEET

Freshman goalkeeper Evangeline Soucie tallied her first-career clean sheet against High Point, making four saves in the match. She has a 1.53 GAA and has played all 470 minutes in net this year for UK.

Kentucky's new \$7.7 million dollar soccer complex built in 2014 is named the Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex, after longtime UK Athletics supporters Wendell and Vickie Bell. The Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex houses separate facilities for the men's and women's programs, including new team rooms, player lounges, locker areas, coaches offices, press box and a gorgeous new grandstand.

SEC WATCH LIST

Four Kentucky players were named to the Southeastern Conference's preseason watch list, with Alex Carter, Kaitlin Miller, Tanya Samarzich and Katy Keen all being elected to the preseason watch list. The list is voted upon by the SEC coaches.

SOUICIE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Freshman goalkeeper Evangeline Soucie was named to the TopDrawerSoccer Preseason All-SEC Team. The freshman early enrollee spent the entire spring training and playing with Kentucky, as she graduated high school early in order to spend the spring season in Lexington.

SEASON TICKET SCARVES RETURN

Season ticket sales for the 2016 season at the Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex are up over 40 percent, as over 550 fans have already ordered their season tickets, shattering the program record set in 2015.

The highly-successful season ticket scarves are on sale for \$30 and gets fans into all home matches for the men's and women's soccer teams. The men are defending Conference USA Champions, with the women just one year removed from a Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the best in program history.

WILDCATS HAVE A FUTURE

The 2016 signing class has been ranked as the No. 8 class in the nation according to TopDrawerSoccer.com in its annual signing class

rankings.

The ranking of No. 8 overall nationally is the second-highest of the Jon Lipsitz era at Kentucky, second only to a No. 3 national ranking for the class of 2012. The class of 2011 was ranked No. 10 in the nation on National Signing Day – which was his third year at the helm of the program.

SUIT NO MORE

Head coach Jon Lipsitz is no longer wearing a suit for matches this year in order to show his appreciation for his entire coaching staff. The coaching staff will now all dress in the same gameday attire for all matches this season. He had worn a suit and tie for all UK regular season and postseason matches during his tenure until this season began.

A SWIFT TRANSITION

Senior starter Zoe Swift has been moved to a wideback for the first time in her collegiate career this season, after playing as a forward before. Swift scored 18 goals in 51 games up top before the conversion happened this preseason. She joined Alex Carter as UK's other centerback for the first two matches of the season before she moved to wideback for the second weekend of the year. UK has had success with back conversions from other positions including Alyssa Telang (MF), Natalie Horner (MF), Olivia Jester (MF), Cara Ledman (F) in recent times.

WILDCATS ON THE WEST COAST

This is the the second time in the last three seasons that UK has opened the season on the west coast. In 2014 when UK played Washington and Seattle U, that was the first time UK had opened a season on the Pacific Time Zone.

RAETZMAN A RED STAR

With the 32nd overall pick in the 2016 National Women's Soccer League draft, the Chicago Red Stars selected University of Kentucky standout Courtney Raetzman, who becomes the second UK player drafted in the last two years to the Red Stars.

Raetzman, a native of Elk Grove, Ill., started all 70 games that she appeared in during her four years in Lexington, playing over 6,000 minutes on the pitch, good for a top-10 spot all-time at UK in minutes played. She scored 12 goals, had 16 assists, and registered over 100 shots in her time in the Bluegrass.

UK's other draft pick, Arin Gilliland, was drafted by the Red Stars in 2014 and is still on the team as well.

SCHOOL IS BACK IN SESSION

Kentucky players started classes on

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina might be the hottest team in the country entering Sunday's match with the Wildcats, as the Gamecocks currently sit 9-0-1 on the season overall and a perfect 3-0-0 in the SEC, perched atop the league table on nine points with Arkansas. The Gamecocks are slotted at No. 8 in the NSCAA rankings and have one of the best defenses in the country, which will pose a stern test for UK's front line.

The Gamecocks beat LSU on Thursday night after being equalized to make it 1-1 but would then score two quick goals to pull out ahead.

USC has won nine matches in a row and is led in scoring by MAC Hermann Award finalist Savannah McCaskill, who has 10 goals and four assists on the year for 24 points. She is by far SC's most potent offense threat - and defensively, goalkeeper Mikayla Krzeczowski has a 0.55 GAA.

KENTUCKY/SC SERIES HISTORY

Sunday afternoon's match will be the 22nd all-time meeting between USC and UK. The Wildcats lead the all-time series 13-7-1. The two sides did not meet in 2015. UK has won three of the last four meetings with the Gamecocks and has gotten a result in four of the last five matches against USC.

LAST TIME VS. SOUTH CAROLINA

UK picked up its third, and most important win of the 2014 Southeastern Conference season on Friday night on a rainy night at the Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex as junior Courtney Raetzman scored a clinical goal from Cara Ledman in the 66th minute to seal a 1-0 win over South Carolina.

The strike for UK came in the 66th minute as Raetzman, a junior from Elk Grove, Ill., scored a sliding goal across the top of the six-yard box past a diving Sabrina D'Angelo, who recorded six saves on the night. The ball was fed in from the left flank as wideback Cara Ledman beat her player 1v1 down the side and cut in towards the top of the 18 on the left side. Ledman then shook the secondary defender to the outside, and got endline before serving in a low, high-paced cross to a foot-first diving Raetzman, who poked it home for the match's only goal.

KENTUCKY PREDICTED TO FINISH SEVENTH IN THE SEC
