WILDCATS TRAVEL WEST FOR "BATTLE OF THE BLUEGRASS"

The University of Kentucky women's soccer team will travel west to play the annual "Battle of the Bluegrass" on Friday night at 7:30 p.m. ET inside the newly-constructed Lynn Stadium in the Derby City to kick off week three of the NCAA women's soccer season.

The Wildcats will enter the third weekend of the season at 0-2-1 after Sunday's match with Northwestern was cancelled due to weather in the Lexington area that forced the match to be called at halftime with the score 0-0.

This weekend's matchup marks the 15th all-time meeting between UK and U of L in the annual "Battle of the Bluegrass". The rivalry match resumed in 2006 after a 10-year absence from 1996-2005, where the teams did not play each other. Kentucky has an 11-2-1 lead in the series. having won each of the last five meetings, with the last four all coming as shutout wins over U of L. The last time UK played at Lynn Stadium, Michaela Dooley had the game-winning goal in the 82nd minute off a header to give UK a 2-0 win after an insurance goal. In 2015, Katy Keen's second half goal at The Bell Soccer Complex gave Kentucky a 1-0 win.

Freshman Gina Crosetti and Marissa Bosco each scored goals in Kentucky's loss to No. 23 South Florida last week, as the youth movement continues to happen in Lexington.

- UK is starting a true freshman goalkeeper for the third time in the last four seasons, and second-straight year. (2012 - Kayla Price (FR), 2013 - Kayla King (SR), 2014 - Taylor Braun (FR), 2015
- The Wildcats started five freshman on opening day, the most under Jon Lipsitz in his tenure.
- Kentucky started the 2013 season 0-1-1 and made it to the second round of the NCAA Tourney.
- UK has won five straight matches against Louisville in the "Battle of the Bluegrass" series.
- Head coach Jon Lipsitz is in his eighth season.
- Lipsitz's .694 career winning percentage ranks third among active coaches in the SEC.
- Kentucky made the 2014 SEC Tournament Championship match for the first time since 2006, after also collecting the program's first-ever SEC Tournament win under Jon Lipsitz in 2014.
- Courtney Raetzman was drafted No. 32 overall to the Chicago Red Stars in the 2015 NWSL Draft. She became the second UK player ever drafted to play professional soccer at any level.
- For the first time in program history, UK made four-straight NCAA Tournaments from 2011-14. The Wildcats have advanced to the second round in two of the last three seasons, setting a program record for the best season in program history in 2014 with an appearance in the Sweet 16, going 16-7-1 in 2014.

LIPSITZ IN EIGHTH YEAR

Jon Lipsitz is in his eighth year as the head soccer coach at the University of Kentucky.

Lipsitz currently owns a 184-87-24 career record after four years at UK and stops at Charlotte (59-24-4 in four years) and Denison (43-10-4 in three years) prior to coming to Lexington.

His .695 career winning percentage is the third highest among active coaches in the Southeastern Conference.

HOME OPENER SUCCESS

Kentucky lost its first home opener since 1998 on Thursday night against No. 23 South Florida at the Bell Soccer Complex. UK was a perfect 7-0-0 in home openers under Lipsitz until that match.

TWO-GOAL RARITY

Kentucky's 2-0 lead against South Florida that was blown into a 3-2 loss was the first time since Oct. 11, 1994 against Cincinnati that the Wildcats had lost a match in which it had held a two-goal lead in regulation.

WILDCATS ON NATIONAL TV

The University of Kentucky women's soccer team will see unprecedented media coverage in the 2016 season, as the Wildcats will see all of their games featured on SEC Network+, as well as WatchESPN and the WatchESPN app. In addition to all 11 home matches being available on SECN+, Kentucky's entire SEC slate of matches, home and away, will also be featured on SECN+. The 16 SECN+ matches are in addition to the two already scheduled televised matches, which will remain the same, as the Wildcats will face Florida and Alabama on the SEC Network.

LIPSITZ ANNOUNCES CAPTAINS FOR 2016

Alex Carter and Kaitlin Miller, both seniors, will be the two captains for the Wildcats in 2016. Carter returns for a second year as captain under head coach Jon Lipsitz, with Miller entering her first season as a captain. Captains are chosen by both the team vote and coaching staff input before the spring season.

RINGING A NEW BELL IN 2014

Kentucky's new \$7.7 million dollar soccer complex is named the Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex, after longtime UK Athletics supporters Wendell and Vickie Bell. The Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex houses separate facilities for the men's and women's programs, including new team rooms, player lounges, locker areas, coaches offices, press box and a gorgeous new grandstand.

SEC WATCH LIST

Four Kentucky players were named to the Southeastern Conference's preseason watch list, with Alex Carter, Kaitlin Miller, Tanya Samarzich and Katy Keen all being elected to the preseason watch list. The list is voted upon by the SEC coaches.

SOUCIE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Freshman goalkeeper Evangeline Soucie was named to the TopDrawerSoccer Preseason All-SEC Team. The freshman early enrolee spent the entire spring training and playing with Kentucky, as she graduated high school early in order to spend the spring season in Lexington.

SEASON TICKET SCARVES RETURN

Season ticket sales for the 2016 season at the Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex are up over 40 percent, as over 550 fans have already ordered their season tickets, shattering the program record set in 2015.

The highly-successful season ticket scarves are on sale for \$30 and gets fans into all home matches for the men's and women's soccer teams. The men are defending Conference USA Champions, with the women just one year removed from a Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the best in program

Louisville is off to a flying start in 2016 with a 3-0-1 record and three clean sheets to show for. The Cards are coming off of an 8-8-2 season under 17th-year head coach Karen Ferguson-Dayes. UL defeated Toledo, 4-0 in its last outing on the pitch, which was preceeded by two more 4-0 thumpings to UAB and Toledo. The leading goal scorer for U of L is Gabrielle Vincent who has three goals and an assist on the young 2016 season, one of seven Cards who have scored this season. Goalkeeper Taylor Bucklin has started all four matches and has a GAA of 0.26 with five saves on the young season.

KENTUCKY/LOUISVILLE SERIES HISTORY
