QUICKLY...

- ◆ The South Carolina Gamecocks (2-1, 1-1 SEC) head back on the road this week as they travel to Lexington, Ky. to face the Kentucky Wildcats (1-2, 0-1 SEC) in another SEC Eastern Division showdown. Game time is set for 7:30 pm at Commonwealth Stadium (61,000) with the SEC Network handling the broadcast. Brent Musburger and Jesse Palmer will be in the booth with Kaylee Hartung on the sidelines.
- ◆ The Gamecocks are off to a 2-1 start, including a 1-1 mark in the SEC, with wins over Vanderbilt and East Carolina and a loss at Mississippi State. Kentucky is 1-2, dropping their first two games to Southern Miss and at Florida before rebounding with a 62-42 win over New Mexico State last week.
- This week's game is the third SEC game for the Gamecocks and their third conference road game. It's the first time in Carolina history that the team has opened with three conference road games before playing a conference home game. After this week's tilt, Carolina will play five home games with one bye week over the next six weeks, including SEC matchups with Texas A&M, Georgia, Tennessee and Missouri.

CAROLINA VS. KENTUCKY: This is the 28th meeting between the Gamecocks and Wildcats in a series that dates back to 1937. Carolina leads the all-time series 17-9-1, including an 8-4-1 mark in Columbia and a 9-5 advantage in Lexington. The teams played just three times (1937, 1978 and 1981) before Carolina joined the SEC for the 1992 season. Since then, they have met every year. Since joining the league, the Gamecocks own a 16-8 record against UK, including wins in 13 of the 16 meetings in this century.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Kentucky opened up a 24-7 halftime lead in Columbia on September 12, 2015, then held off a late Carolina comeback in a 26-22 Wildcat win. The Gamecocks outgained Kentucky, 417-399 on the day, but three times had to settle for an Elliott Fry field goal from under 30 yards. Brandon Wilds rushed 16 times for 106 yards, while Perry Orth completed 13-of-20 passes for 179 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: Kentucky scored 21 points in the final 8:06 of the game to pull out a 45-38 come-from-behind victory over South Carolina in Lexington on October 4, 2014. In a seesaw battle, the Gamecocks opened up a 17-7 lead, fell behind 24-17, then rallied to take a 38-24 lead midway through the fourth period, but could not contain Jojo Kemp, who rushed 17 times for 131 yards and three scores. UK defensive end Alvin Dupree intercepted a pass and returned it six yards for the game-winning score with just 2:29 on the clock. Mike Davis had a big game for the Gamecocks, rushing 23 times for a gamehigh 183 yards and three scores. Dylan Thompson completed 23-of-37 passes for 218 yards as Carolina rolled up 500 yards of offense, but was picked off three times.

THE LAST CAROLINA WIN: The 13th-ranked Gamecocks opened up a 27-7 lead over Kentucky heading into the final stanza, but the Wildcats made it interesting with 21 fourth-quarter points before falling by a 35-28 count in Columbia on Oct. 5, 2013. Mike Davis rushed for 106 yards and two touchdowns and quarterback Connor Shaw added 312 yards of total offense, including 262 through the air on 17-of-20 passing. Damiere Byrd had one of the top days of his career, catching five passes for 94 yards, including a 62-yard TD catch on the first drive of the game.

A South Carolina win over Kentucky would...

- ◆ Snap the Wildcats' two-game winning streak in the series. Kentucky has never defeated South Carolina in three-straight meetings.
- ♦ Give the Gamecock's their 18th win in 28 games in the all-time series with the Wildcats, and their 17th victory in 25 tries since the two schools became SEC Eastern Division rivals.
- ♦ Give the Gamecocks' their second conference win of the season, surpassing their SEC win total from 2015, and matching their overall win total of last season at three. South Carolina went just 1-7 in SEC play last season and 3-9 overall during the 2015 campaign.

YOUARE LOOKING LIVE: The South Carolina Gamecocks (2-1, 1-1 SEC) head back on the road this week as they travel to Lexington, Ky. to face the Kentucky Wildcats (1-2, 0-1 SEC) in another SEC Eastern Division showdown. Game time is set for 7:30 pm ET at Commonwealth Stadium (61,000) with the SEC Network handling the broadcast. Brent Musburger has the play-by-play with Jesse Palmer handling the color commentary and Kaylee Hartung working the sidelines.

A HISTORY LESSON: 2016 marks the 123rd season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 110th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina is 25 games over the .500 mark with an all-time record of 588-563-44.

SEC HISTORY: The 2016 season marks South Carolina's 25th year in the SEC. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 84-110-1 (.433) all-time in SEC regular-season play, but are 29-22 (.569) in conference action since the start of the 2010 season.

ABOUT LAST WEEK: Freshman Brandon Mc-Ilwain threw for 195 yards and rushed for two touchdowns in his first career start to lead the Gamecocks to a 20-15 win over East Carolina last Saturday night in Columbia. After not scoring in the first half in the season's first two games, Carolina put 17 points on the board in the first seven minutes of the contest and made it stand up. The Pirates outgained the Gamecocks, 519-312 while running 91 plays to Carolina's 53, but the Gamecocks won the turnover battle, 4-0, including three in the redzone, to preserve the win.

QUICK SCORE: A.J. Turner returned the opening kick 80 yards against ECU and on the first snap from scrimmage, Brandon McIlwain scored from 9-yards out, giving the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead just 17 seconds into the contest. It was the fastest points in a game for Carolina since Marcus Lattimore scored from 17-yards out at the 14:47 mark of the first quarter following a fumble on the opening kickoff in a 69-24 win over Troy on November 20, 2010. Carolina went on to put 17 points on the board in the first seven minutes against the Pirates. It was a far cry from the season's first two games, in which the Gamecocks were blanked for the first 30 minutes against both Vanderbilt and Mississippi State.

TOP (RE)TURNER: After returning the opening kick against ECU 80 yards, A.J. Turner has moved atop the SEC rankings and is fourth in the country, averaging 35.5 yards per return (142 yards on 4 returns).

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE: After

forcing just one turnover in the season's first two games, Carolina came up with four turnovers in the win over ECU. Three of the turnovers were inside the Carolina five-yard line, as the Gamecocks limited the Pirates to just two scores in six red zone chances. Chris Lammons had an interception and forced a fumble, while Jamarcus King had his first career pick. Antoine Wilder also forced a fumble near the goal line.

SEEING RED: The Gamecock defense ranks first in the SEC and seventh in the nation in red zone defense. The Gamecocks allowed ECU to score on just two of six chances in the red zone. In 16 opportunities this season, the Carolina defense has allowed just five touchdowns and four field goals, while forcing four turnovers in the red zone.

SEVEN NEW STARTERS VS ECU...: The Gamecocks had seven players make their first career start in the win over East Carolina. Those who had their number called to start the game for the first time included Brandon McIlwain, K.C. Crosby and Randrecous Davis on offense and Ulric Jones, Jamarcus King, Steven Montac and Antoine Wilder on defense.

...AND 14 THIS SEASON: In addition to the seven who started for the first time against ECU, Carolina had seven players make their first career start in the season opener against Vanderbilt. They included Bryan Edwards, Rashad Fenton, Kelsey Griffin, D.J. Park, Jamari Smith, Donell Stanley and A.J. Turner. Of the 14 first-time starters, three are true freshmen.

22-SKIDOO: East Carolina's Zay Jones caught 22 passes for 190 yards last week, shattering the record for the most pass receptions in a game against South Carolina. However, Jones averaged just 8.6 yards per reception and his longest went for just 15 yards. The previous mark was 16, set by Florida State's Ron Sellers in 1968 and matched by Vanderbilt's Earl Bennett in 2005.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: When he got the call against East Carolina last week, Brandon McIlwain became just the fourth true freshman to start at quarterback for the Gamecocks since they joined the SEC. Steve Taneyhill (1992), Mikal Goodman (1999) and Lorenzo Nuñez (2015) were the others.

MAC ATTACK: True freshman quarterback Brandon McIlwain made his much-anticipated debut in the opener at Vanderbilt. He responded by completing 5-of-11 passes for 35 yards and rushed seven times for 29 yards. He played the entire second half at Mississippi State and completed 11-of-22 passes for 126 yards and two scores. He earned the start and went the distance against ECU, completing 16-of-28 passes for 195 yards and rushing nine times for 34 yards and two touchdowns.

QUARTERBACK SHUFFLE: The Gamecocks split time at the quarterback position through two games. Senior **Perry Orth** came into the season as the only experienced signal-caller, while **Brandon McIlwain**, a true freshman, enrolled in January and went through spring drills. Orth made the start in each of the first two contests and has made 10 career starts, owning a 2-8 mark.

FEELING THE ORTHQUAKE: Senior signal-caller Perry Orth got the starting nod at Vanderbilt and came up with his second career win. After a shaky start, the veteran got things going in the second half, rallying the Gamecocks with 13 points after being blanked through the first 30 minutes. He finished the night 11-for-19 for 152 yards, hitting 6-of-7 passes in the fourth quarter. That performance earned him the start at Mississippi State. He played the entire first half and completed 9-of-17 passes for 83 yards with a pick.

WHO WILL THEY THROW IT TO?: Carolina's returning wide receivers had combined for just 28 catches and 356 yards. The man counted on to be next in a line of outstanding Carolina wide receivers that includes Sidney Rice, Kenny McKinley, Alshon Jeffery and Bruce Ellington is redshirt sophomore Deebo Samuel. Samuel, a 6-0, 205-pounder from Inman, S.C., was hampered by a hamstring injury for much of the 2015 season, but showed his talent by hauling in five passes for 104 yards in the season finale against Clemson. He had four receptions in the first two games for 66 yards and scored on an 8-yard run,

but sat out the ECU game with a hamstring injury. The only other wideouts who came into the 2016 season having caught a pass in a game are walk-on senior **Matrick Belton** and redshirt sophomore **Terry Googer**. Belton, a 6-3, 215-pounder who began his career at Hampton University, started five games last season, catching 11 passes, while Googer, a 6-4, 220-pounder from Atlanta, caught five passes while making a pair of starts.

WELCOME ABOARD: Bryan Edwards became the sixth true freshman to start in the season opener for the Garnet & Black since the start of the 2009 season. He joined Stephon Gilmore (2009), Marcus Lattimore (2010), Jadeveon Clowney (2011), Bryson Allen-Williams (2014) and Al Harris Jr. (2014).

AND NOW WE KNOW WHY: True freshman Bryan Edwards showed why he earned the starting nod in his first collegiate game. The 6-3, 210-pounder from Conway, S.C., hauled in eight passes for 101 yards in the win over Vanderbilt. He was the only freshman receiver in the country to log a 100-yard game in the season's first week. It was just the eighth 100-yard receiving game in a season opener in Gamecock history and he is the only true freshman on the list. After three games, Edwards is the only freshman in the SEC to rank among the league leaders in both receptions (T7th-5.0) and yards (6th-69.0) per game. He leads the nation's freshmen with 207 receiving yards through three games.

THE BEST IS HURST: Tight end Hayden Hurst, a 6-5, 250-pound former professional baseball player, looks to be a playmaker on offense. In limited duty last season, his first on the gridiron since 2011, he hauled in eight passes for 106 yards. The 23-year-old sophomore is second on the team with 12 catches for 128 yards, including an eight-catch, 68-yard effort at Mississippi State. Tight end K.C. Crosby caught four passes against ECU and is third on the team with eight receptions.

TURN UP: Redshirt freshman A.J. Turner had an impressive debut at Vanderbilt after earning the start with a strong fall camp. The 5-10, 195-pounder rushed 13 times for 70 yards against a solid Commodore defense. After three games, he is the Gamecocks' top rusher with 35 carries for 115 yards, and has added five catches for 52 yards and a score. Turner, who is also the Gamecocks' kick returner, ranks third in the nation among freshmen with 103.0 all-purpose yards per game.

SOMETHING FROM DAVID: After not getting a snap at Mississippi State and logging just five carries through the first two games, **David Williams** carried seven times for a team-high 67 yards against East Carolina, including a 25-yard burst on a 4th-and-1 in the final drive to seal the victory.

HANDLING THE WORKLOAD: Redshirt freshman **A.J. Turner** has done the bulk of the work from the running back position, as he has garnered 35 of the 48 carries by the running backs. Here's how the Carolina running backs have performed this season and in their careers.

WHERE HAVE ALL THE SENIORS GONE:

The Gamecocks list just four seniors on the offensive side of the ball in **Matrick Belton**, **Perry Orth**, **Darius Paulk** and **Mason Zandi**. All four are redshirt seniors. Zandi is the only one of the four to begin his collegiate career at South Carolina and the only one who came to Columbia as a scholarship player. Only Minnesota (3), Old Dominion (4), Florida (4) and Troy (4) have as few seniors on offense as do the Gamecocks.

ZANDI STANDS ALONE: Redshirt senior Mason Zandi is the only senior on the offensive side of the ball on the 2016 roster that came to South Carolina as a scholarship player. Zandi, a 6-9, 315-pound local product from Chapin, S.C. was named preseason third-team All-SEC by the league's coaches. He is also just one of six players in Gamecock history with the last name starting with "Z" to earn a football letter. The most recent prior to Zandi was Zip Zanders, who lettered in 1986. Mason's father, Ali, is a native of Iran who fled his home country during its 1970s revolution.

CORY AT THE HELMS: Cory Helms, a 6-4, 310-pound junior from Alpharetta, Ga., is a welcome addition to the offensive line. Helms, who earned Freshman All-America honors in 2013 at Wake Forest, spent two seasons with the Demon Deacons before sitting out 2015 as a transfer. He started the season opener at center, but moved to right guard at Mississippi State.

IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE: Zack Bailey was the only Gamecock named to the 2015 SEC

All-Freshman team, as selected by the league's 14 coaches. The 6-6, 315-pound true freshman from Summerville, S.C., played in all 12 games in 2015, making five starts, with three at center and two at left guard. He has started each game this season at left guard.

EVERY GAME QUA: Defensive lineman **Marquavius Lewis** has started all 15 games since his arrival on the Columbia campus. He owns the longest current consecutive streak of starts on the squad.

GETTING IN THE SACK: The Gamecocks produced four sacks against East Carolina after notching just one in the first two games. **Chris Lammons, Keir Thomas** and **D.J. THE SKAI TURNED RED(SHIRT): Skai

Moore will take a redshirt and miss the 2016 season following offseason surgery to address a herniated disk in his neck. The 6-2, 220-pounder from Cooper City, Fla., was the Gamecocks' leading tackler in 2015 with 111 stops, tying for third in the SEC with 9.2 tackles per game. He also led the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and with four pass interceptions, tying for fourth in the SEC. Moore became the first Gamecock to reach the century mark in tackles since 2006, while his 111 tackles was the second-highest total recorded by a Carolina player in the last 25 years. He led the team in tackles for a third-consecutive season, becoming the first player to do so since 1992-94. In addition, Moore has 11 career picks, tying for third on the all-time list.

THE FRISCO KID: Senior Elliott Fry was the star in the season opening win at Vanderbilt, hitting both of his field goal attempts from 48 and a career-long 55 yards. He added a pair of field goals in the win over ECU and is 4-for-5 on the season. The six-foot, 170-pounder from Frisco, Texas has connected on a school record 129 consecutive extra points and has hit 75.0 percent (57-of-76) of his career field goal attempts. That average jumps to 81.8 percent (54-of-66) when attempting from under 50 yards out. He holds the school's career records for extra points made and attempted and is second in points scored with 306, behind only Collin Mackie (330).

FRY BURNS THE 'DORES: Senior placekicker Elliott Fry connected on a 48-yard field goal in the third quarter, then hit on a career-long 55-yard field goal in the final minute to provide the margin of victory in the season opening win at Vanderbilt and earn him SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. It tied for the second-longest field goal in Gamecock history, matching Ryan Succop's 55-yarder against Vandy in the 2006 season. Only Mark Fleetwood's 58-yarder against Georgia in 1982 is longer.

FRY FEATS:

- ◆ When **Elliott Fry** booted the game-winner at Vanderbilt in the season opener, he became the first SEC kicker to make a field goal of 55+ yds with less than one minute to play in 4th quarter (or in OT) in the last 10 years.
- ◆ Elliott Fry's 55-yard field goal against Vanderbilt matches Hawaii's Rigoberto Sanchez for the longest field goal made this season.

KICKIN' IT WITH KELLY: Senior punter Sean Kelly was, in some people's eyes, the MVP of the Gamecock squad in 2015. The 5-10, 190-pounder from Oakland, Fla. has been busy this season, already punting 19 times. He is averaging 42.7 yards per punt with seven inside the 20 and a long of 66 yards. Last season he averaged 44.3 yards per punt, third in the SEC, while the Gamecocks ranked second in the SEC and seventh in the nation in net punting with a 41.3 yard average.

ROAD KILL: The Gamecocks' 13-10 season opening win at Vanderbilt snapped the squad's six-game road losing streak. Carolina is 15-14 in its last 29 true road games, with eight of the 14 losses coming to teams ranked in the top-25 in the country, including seven in the top-11.

SO YOU'RE SAYIN' THERE'S A CHANCE:

While winning just three games last season including a victory over No. 15 North Carolina, the Gamecocks had their share of close losses. Five of their setbacks were within one score and were decided by a total of 20 points, including losses to Kentucky (by 4), at Texas A&M (7), at Tennessee (3), The Citadel (1) and Clemson (5). Four of their losses came to teams ranked in the AP's final top-25 (#2 Clemson, #16 LSU, #22 Tennessee and #25 Florida), while another setback came at Georgia, ranked 24th in the final Coaches' poll.

A NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN: Will Muschamp was introduced as the 34th head football coach at the South Carolina on December 7, 2015. A 21-year coaching veteran, Muschamp, a 1994 graduate of Georgia, has spent 13 years in the SEC, including four as the head coach at Florida, where he posted a 28-21 record from 2011-14. He was recognized as the SEC Coach of the Year in 2012 after an 11-win campaign. Last season, he served as the defensive coordinator at Auburn. Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and once in the Big 12 Championship Game, winning all three. He has also coached in two national championship games, helping LSU win the national title in 2003.

AND HE BROUGHT HIS POSSE: With the exception of holdover offensive line coach Shawn Elliott, Coach Muschamp brought an entirely new coaching staff to Columbia. Bobby Bentley (Running Backs), Coleman Hutzler (Special Teams Coordinator/Linebackers), Bryan Mc-Clendon (Co-Offensive Coordinator/Wide Receivers), Mike Peterson (Outside Linebackers), Travaris Robinson (Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Backs), Kurt Roper (Co-Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks), Lance Thompson (Assistant Head Coach - Defense/Defensive Line), and Pat Washington (Tight Ends) are the newcomers. Coach Muschamp has also beefed up the off-thefield support staff with a number of football analysts and others focused on recruiting to go along with the usual number of graduate assistants.

NOW THAT'S A HOMESTAND: The Gamecocks will play five-straight home games during the 2016 season. Between October 1 and November 5, Texas A&M, Georgia, UMass, Tennessee and Missouri will venture to Williams-Brice Stadium, with a bye week scheduled for October 15. Auburn is the only other school in the country with five-consecutive home games on its slate this season. The last time South Carolina had five-straight home games on its schedule was in 1988 when the Gamecocks opened the season against North Carolina, Western Carolina, East Carolina, Georgia and Appalachian State.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: The Gamecocks are 25-7 in their last 32 home games (.781) and 41-10 (.804) in their last 51 home games, including a school-record 18-game game home winning streak. The school's previous longest home winning streak was 15 games, set from 1978-80.

The Gamecocks had their 18-game non-conference winning streak snapped in the 2014 regular season finale at Clemson, then lost the final two games of the 2015 regular season to non-conference in-state foes The Citadel and Clemson. Prior to the Clemson loss at the end of the 2014 campaign, Carolina's last non-conference loss came to Florida State in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have five players on their roster who have already earned their undergraduate degree. Included in the list are Jordan Diggs, Chaz Elder, Abu Lamin, Chris Moody and Mason Zandi.



Notes of Interest from the Palmetto State's Flagship University

- ◆ In the inaugural Palmetto Series of 2015-16, the South Carolina Gamecocks took the title, 10-5, over Clemson.
- ◆ During the 2015-16 academic year, South Carolina had its best Learfield Sports Directors' Cup finish (all-sports standings) since 2002-03. The Gamecocks had 680 points, which was 31st in the nation and seventh in the SEC.



- ◆ The combined men's and women's basketball records of 58-11 (84.06%) during the 2015-16 season was the second-best of any school in NCAA Division I (Connecticut, 63-11, 85.14%). The two teams opened their seasons with a combined 30-0 record, which is the best combined start in SEC basketball history.
- ◆ South Carolina was one of two schools (along with Nebraska) to finish its 2015-16 regular seasons in the Top 25 in average attendance this year in the sports of football, men's and women's basketball and baseball.
- ◆ South Carolina was one of three programs (and the only one in the SEC) in 2015-16 to have both its men's and women's golf teams make the match play portion of the NCAA Golf Championships.
- ◆ South Carolina student-athletes continually lead the SEC in community service hours. In 2015-16, Gamecock student-athletes performed a record 11,153 hours of community service. The volleyball team was named the Community Outreach Team of the Year at the 2016 Gamecock Gala.
- ◆ South Carolina led all SEC schools by placing 381 student-athletes on the 2015-16 SEC Academic Honor Roll. Included in that total were a leaguehigh 94 members on the Fall Honor Roll, which led the conference for the 10th-straight year.
- ◆ Carolina student-athletes combined to post a 3.278 GPA for the Spring 2016 semester, which was a departmental record and marked the 19thstraight semester in which student-athletes combined for a 3.0 GPA or better.
- ◆ South Carolina Football has three endowed scholarships. Recipients for endowed scholarships are selected each year by the head coach. The 2016 scholarships and recipients are:
 - Marcus Lattimore Endowed Football Scholarship T.J. Holloman
 - Tommy Suggs Endowed Quarterback Scholarship Perry Orth
 - Wraellen and Larry Winn Endowed Tight End Scholarship Hayden Hurst
- ◆ Gamecock radio analyst Tommy Suggs is one of the longest tenured radio voices in college football. The former standout quarterback who led the Gamecocks to the 1969 ACC Championship, is in his 44th season as part of the radio crew.
- ◆ South Carolina has won three NCAA Championships (2002 Women's Outdoor Track & Field, 2010 Baseball, 2011 Baseball) and three National Champions (2005 Equestrian, 2007 Equestrian, 2015 Equestrian).
- ◆ South Carolina will be hosting the 2017 SEC Outdoor Track & Field Championships next May at its newly-renovated track & field complex in the Athletics Village.

◆ South Carolina is in the process of building a new \$50 million Football Operations Center. The proposed facility will be located adjacent to the Jerri and Steve Spurrier Indoor Football Facility. The state-of-the-art facility will provide the coaches and student-athletes with the ability to train and compete at the highest level. It will feature: coaches' offices, locker room, meeting rooms, weight room, training room, dining room, players' lounge and equipment room. Construction is expected to begin in January 2017.



◆ South Carolina has several other fall sports currently in season:

Cross Country: Is off to a fast start with first-place finishes in each of its first two meets. Next up is the Notre Dame Invitational on Sept. 30.

Equestrian: Opens its regular season on Friday, Sept. 23, vs. Baylor.

Men's Soccer: Has won back-to-back games to even its record at 3-3 overall. They are 1-0 in Conference USA. This week, they are in action at Furman on Tuesday, Sept. 20, and home vs Georgia State, Saturday, Sept. 24.

Women's Soccer: Is ranked 14th in the country with an 8-0-1 record, including a 2-0 mark in the SEC. This week, they host LSU on Thursday, Sept. 22, and Kentucky on Sunday, Sept. 25.

Volleyball: Finished its non-conference schedule with a perfect 12-0 record. The Gamecocks begin conference play this week with a match at Missouri on Wednesday, Sept. 21.

The Last Time They Met

COLUMBIA, S.C.— The Kentucky Wildcats (2-0, 1-0 SEC) would do just enough to hold off a furious second-half comeback attempt in a 26-22 win over Carolina (1-1, 0-1 SEC).

The nine-day break since the team's game against North Carolina would not slow down linebacker Skai Moore, who helped set up the game's first scoring drive of the day with his third interception of the season. Just one play later, Connor Mitch ran it in for his first career rushing touchdown.

The visitors would rally back for the game's next two scores and closed the first quarter with a 14-7 lead.

Brandon Wilds would be tasked with helping to boost the offense, and his effec-

tive running between the tackles would be its first spark of the night. With 7:21 to go in the first half, Wilds ran on four of the first five plays of the drive for 25 yards total. Connor Mitch would then hook up with Pharoh Cooper on a post route to put the offense in the redzone for the first time since its one-play scoring drive in the first quarter.

Just a few plays later, though, a botched option pitch would not only cost the Gamecocks seven yards on third down, but it would cost them their starting quarterback as well. Mitch would dive for the fumbled pitch, but injured his shoulder in the process.

A missed field goal ended Carolina's drive, and the Wildcats offense made quick work in the final three minutes of the half with a 76-vard touchdown drive. Towles set it up with a pair of long completions and capped it himself with a one-yard dive with seconds remaining in the half for a 24-7 lead.

The Gamecock defense came out on a mission to start the second half and quickly forced Kentucky's first punt of the game. A low, spiraling punt would be returned for 24 yards by Pharoh Cooper to set up the offense.

Perry Orth would take the reins of the offense after Mitch was diagnosed with a shoulder injury, and he and Cooper would connect to get the team back into the redzone. Carolina would later settle for a 27-yard field goal to get back on the scoreboard.

Kentucky would go three-and-out again to set up the Gamecocks just shy of midfield. A 34-yard run for Brandon Wilds on the first play of the drive would keep sliding the momentum little by little. The drive would stall inside the 15 again, though, leading to another Fry field goal and a 24-13 game.

The Wildcats continued to be stymied on offense, going three-and-out on its third straight drive of the half with four minutes to go in the third and the Gamecocks took over with the comeback attempt thriving. Strong runs from Shon Carson would put them down to the two yard line, but a penalty would set them back.

As the third quarter came to a close, the Gamecocks held a 136-22 advantage in yards gained in the 15-minute span, but were still in search of that elusive touchdown. The penalty would ultimately come back to cost them and a third straight drive would be sealed by a field goal.

After a fourth-straight punt from Kentucky, the Gamecocks would use some clutch throws from Orth to finally hit pay-dirt. Facing a third-and-12 on their own 33, Orth hit Cooper for 16. Later in the drive, he connected with Deebo Samuel for 10 on fourth-and-two, and on the very next play Jerell Adams took a post route 33 yards for the score and a 24-22 game. It was Orth's first career touchdown pass.

On the team's two-point attempt to try and tie the game, Cooper would fumble and Kentucky took it 98 yards for two points of their own and a 26-22 advantage. It would be a game-defining play, as it meant the Gamecocks needed a touchdown to complete the comeback.

The Wildcats would convert their first first down of the half with eight minutes to go, trying to respond to Carolina's comeback. It would go no further than that, but put 89 yards in front of the Gamecocks with just seven minutes left to go. What started as a healthy drive would be stopped after Orth was intercepted at the Kentucky 23 after being flushed from the pocket. The Wildcats were able to seal the win after a pair of first downs burned Carolina's remaining timeouts.

LEXINGTON, KY .- In a game that saw multiple momentum swings, South Carolina fell 45-38 to Kentucky as the Wildcats scored 21 unanswered points during the final eight-plus minutes. Defensive end Alvin Dupree gave Kentucky the lead with under three minutes remaining in the game with a six-yard interception return for a touchdown.

Carolina opened the game with the ball and proceeded to use a punishing ground attack that chewed up nearly the first eight minutes that ended with Mike Davis giving the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead with a one-yard touchdown run, his first of three scores on the night. On the drive, South Carolina ran a total of 19 plays, the second-most during



the Steve Spurrier era, and 17 of the plays came via the ground, accounting for 70 of the 79 yards.

After getting the ball back just over two minutes later, Carolina nearly lost the ball deep in its own territory on a high snap, but senior quarterback Dylan Thompson was able to fall on the ball. Facing a second-and-18, the Gamecocks went back to the ground, optioning to the left to Davis where the tailback found an open lane and raced out for a 40-yard run to midfield. Thompson was then able to go four-of-four as Carolina continued to march down the field. Davis finished off the drive with a two-yard run to extend the lead to 14-0 early in the second quarter.

Kentucky cut the deficit in half as Jojo Kemp finished off a six-play, 52-yard drive with a three-yard run up the middle. The Wildcats held the Gamecocks to a three-andout on their next possession, but Carolina was able to force a fumble from Kentucky quarterback Patrick Towles. South Carolina turned the fumble into points as sophomore kicker Elliott Fry converted on a 31-yard field goal attempt.

It took the Wildcats just 56 seconds though to pull within three at 17-14 with 3:39 remaining in the half as Braylon Heard had rushes of 15 and 38 on the following drive. With time still left on the clock, South Carolina was able to move the ball down to the Kentucky 15-yard line, but an interception, followed by a 50-yard return by A.J. Stamps gave the Wildcats an opportunity late in the first half. With time expiring, Austin MacGinnis converted on a 47-yard field goal to tie the game at 17.

Kentucky took its first lead of the night on the opening drive of the second half. On third-and-four from midfield, the Wildcats went to a trick play with the ball exchanging hands three times before Towles, on the edge, found a wide open Ryan Timmons down field for a 48-yard touchdown pass to give the home team a 24-17 advantage.

Carolina quickly responded with a five-play drive that ended with a Shon Carson 25-yard run to tie the game at 24.

After the defense was able to force the Wildcats to punt, the Gamecock offense was back on the move despite starting from its own nine-yard line. Carolina steadily moved the ball down the field. Facing a third-and-four at the Kentucky 12-yard line, Thompson found Pharoh Cooper on the left sideline where the wideout spun back inside and dove to the end zone as the Gamecocks regained the lead at 31-24 with 1:48 left in the third quarter.

Carolina extended the lead to 14 early in the fourth quarter as the offense put together an eight-play drive that Davis capped off with a 26-yard run up the middle. Kentucky wouldn't go away though as a 41-yard return on the ensuing kickoff from Demarco Robinson put the Wildcats in South Carolina territory. Seven plays later, Kemp scored his second touchdown of the night on a one-yard run.

After a Carolina punt, the Wildcats came back down the field with Kemp doing the bulk of the work. The running back equalized the game at 38-38 with 2:46 on the clock with a five-vard run.

On the second play of the Gamecocks' ensuing possession, Thompson's pass was batted up in the air and Dupree came up with the interception and returned it six yards for a touchdown to give Wildcats a 45-38 lead with 2:23 remaining. Ashely Lowery sealed Kentucky's win with an interception in the game's final minute.

Head Coach Will Muschamp



MUSCHAMP

HEAD COACH First Year at South Carolina



Will Muschamp was introduced as the University of South Carolina's 34th head football coach in a press conference held at Williams-Brice Stadium on Dec. 7, 2015.

Regarded as an outstanding defensive mind, Muschamp, 44, is a 21-year coaching veteran, including 13 years in the Southeastern Conference. He has previous head coaching experience, posting a 28-21 record (.571) at the University of Florida from 2011-14. He led the Gators to three bowl games in his four seasons in Gainesville and was recognized as the SEC Coach of the Year in 2012 after guiding Florida to an 11-2 record and a Top-10 finish.

The Rome, Ga., native has coached in two national championship games (2003 and 2009), winning with LSU in 2003, and coached in a pair of BCS bowl games, following the 2008 and 2012 seasons. Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and once in the Big 12 Championship Game, winning all three. In addition, he was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award presented to the nation's top assistant coach.

Muschamp most recently served as the defensive coordinator at Auburn University in 2015, his third stint as an SEC defensive coordinator. He also held that title with Auburn from 2006-07 and at LSU from 2002-04. In his six seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's units ranked among the nation's Top-10 in total defense and in scoring defense five times.

Prior to taking the reins at Florida, Muschamp served as the defensive coordinator at the University of Texas from 2008-10. Under his guidance, the Longhorn defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks, and ranked in the Top-10 nationally allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth), and 297.4 yards per game (seventh), all Big 12 bests during that span. In 2009, the Longhorns played in the BCS National Championship game. Under Muschamp's tutelage at Texas, Brian Orakpo won the 2008 Rotary Lombardi, Bronko Nagurski and Ted Hendricks awards. In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp



had a combined eight players drafted, seven in the first four rounds, including first-rounders, Brian Orakpo and

Muschamp served with the NFL's Miami Dolphins as Assistant Head Coach for Defense in 2005 under Nick Saban.

Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU. He was the Tigers' linebacker coach for one season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 yards per game).

In four of his nine seasons as an FBS defensive coordinator, his teams have allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and twice led the nation in rushing defense. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to pace the nation.

The 1994 Georgia graduate moved immediately into coaching, working as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-96, earning his master's degree in 1996. He served as a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving on to his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season, where he helped the Blazers to a 10-2 record and the Gulf South championship.

During his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walk-on to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain his senior season. A safety on the gridiron, he earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

Born August 3, 1971, Muschamp and his wife, the former Carol Davis, have two sons, Jackson and Whit.



NASHVILLE, Tenn. — In head coach Will Muschamp's first game at South Carolina (1-0, 1-0 SEC), the Gamecocks posted the final 13 points to claim a 13-10 road win in Southeastern Conference play at Vanderbilt (0-1, 0-1 SEC) on Thursday night at Vanderbilt Stadium.

After a 16-yard reception by freshman Bryan Edwards from senior Perry Orth and a 17-yard run by freshman A.J. Turner set him up, senior Elliott Fry stepped up and hit a career-long 55-yard field goal to give South Carolina the lead with 35 seconds remaining in the opener.



South Carolina broke onto the scoreboard midway through the third quarter when Fry hit a 48-yard field goal to cut Vandy's lead to 10-3. Orth connected with sophomore Deebo Samuel for the big play of the drive, as the duo's pass went for 30 yards to get the Gamecocks into Vanderbilt territory.

The Gamecocks tied the contest with 7:30 to go when Samuel swept around the left end and touched the pylon for the eight-yard scoring run. Orth completed five passes to start the drive and ran for a nine-yard gain, while Turner rushed twice for 25 yards, including the 20-yard scamper to set up Samuel's score.

Vanderbilt opened the scoring with a 36-yard field goal from Tommy Openshaw after the Commodores took advantage of a muffed punt by the Gamecocks, setting up the 13-yard scoring drive. That lead grew to 10-0 32 seconds into the second quarter when Khari Blasingam punctuated the 13play, 67-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run.

The Gamecocks looked like they would draw within one score as they drove inside Vanderbilt's 20-yard line later in the second quarter. But the Commodores' Oren Burks forced a fumble after a five-yard SC run, and Charles Wright covered it up to give Vandy back the ball.

With less than four minutes remaining in the game, Vanderbilt drove into Gamecock territory and set up a 45-yard field goal from the middle of the field, but the chance hooked left, giving South Carolina the chance to drive the field and claim the win.

On Vanderbilt's last possession, Gamecock defensive linemen Taylor Stallworth and Darius English combined for a sack of Commodore quarterback Kyle Shurmur to help close out the victory.

STARKVILLE, MISS. — South Carolina (1-1, 1-1 SEC) looked stronger in the second half for the secondstraight week, but it couldn't overcome Mississippi State's first-half tally, as the Bulldogs claimed a 27-14 win on Saturday night at Davis Wade Stadium.

Mississippi State (1-1, 1-0 SEC) claimed a 24-0 lead in the first half, using a trio of three-minute-or-less drives to take the lead. Fred Ross had a hand in the first two scoring plays, as the running back caught a six-yard pass to end the first drive before throwing a 17-yard pass to Donald Gray for the second touchdown.



Bulldog quarterback Nick Fitzgerald tossed the first and third scores, the latter to Jordan Thomas for a three-yard strike late in the second to make it 21-0. Westin Graves ended the first half with the first of his two field goals, the first coming from 27 yards out.

Freshman Brandon McIlwain engineered the Gamecocks' first scoring drive of the game late in the third quarter. The 12-play, 80-yard drive saw McIlwain run for 22 yards and throw for 58, including an 18-yard toss to A.J. Turner for the score. On the drive, the freshman was 4-for-6 from the air.

After the Bulldogs' Graves made it 27-7 with a 28-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter, the Gamecocks cut the lead to 27-14 after a 13-play, 83yard drive led again by McIlwain. The freshman again accounted for every yard for South Carolina, ending the drive with a four-yard completion to K.C. Crosby.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — The South Carolina Gamecocks (2-1) held on after a big first quarter to claim a 20-15 win over East Carolina (2-1) on Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium.

South Carolina jumped out to a 17-0 lead, putting the first touchdown on the board just 17 seconds into the contest. Freshman quarterback Brandon McIlwain ran in the first score from nine yards out after A.J. Turner posted an 80-yard return on the game's opening kickoff.

McIlwain and the Gamecocks put

together their second touchdown drive on their second possession, with the signal-caller capping the drive with a 10-yard run. The freshman connected with fellow rookie Bryan Edwards on the drive's big play, as Edwards brought down the 42-yard reception. David Williams followed that with a 20-yard run to set up McIlwain's score.

Senior Elliott Fry posted the first of three field goals that wrapped the first half, his from 37 to make it 17-0 halfway through the first quarter. East Carolina got two field goals of their own before halftime, one in each quarter, to make it 17-6. Davis Plowman hit from 32 and 43 yards for the Pirates.

Junior Jamarcus King had the biggest defensive play of the half, picking off a third-and-goal pass from the one to deny the Pirates a touchdown.

The Gamecock defense made big plays in the second half. Junior Chris Lammons made an interception at the one to stop East Carolina's first drive of the third quarter. On the Pirates' next possession, they drove to the Gamecock 8. The attempted 25-yard field goal was blocked by junior Ulric Jones, negating another ECU scoring chance.

Both teams hit field goals in the fourth quarter, Plowman a 45-yarder and Fry a 39-yarder. East Carolina drew within five points after a late four-yard touchdown pass from Phillip Nelson to Devin Anderson. The two-point conversion failed, and Hayden Hurst recovered the onside kick to get the ball and the win for South Carolina.




