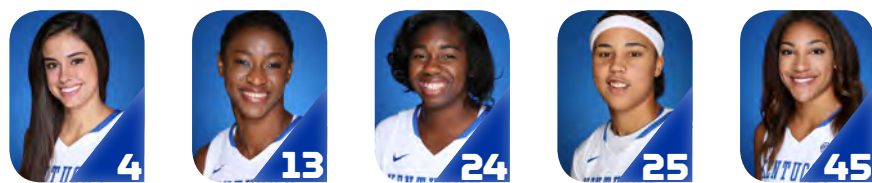

QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its 43rd season of varsity women's basketball with a 763-504 all-time record.
- The Wildcats have had great success in Memorial Coliseum, sitting at 417-147 (.739) overall in the historic building, including a 127-19 (.869) mark under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- Kentucky has won 58 consecutive regular-season non-conference games in Memorial Coliseum, dating back to Dec. 19, 2008 vs. Alabama A&M.
- Thursday marks the first all-time meeting between Kentucky and New Hampshire in women's basketball. NHU is the second America East Conference opponent UK has faced this season. UK is 2-0 all-time against the current alignment of the AEC.
- Kentucky began its season with a victory over No. 14 Miami, 82-66 inside Memorial Coliseum. The win over a ranked opponent was the 45th in Matthew Mitchell's career at Kentucky. UK followed that win by defeating Albany the next day 70-46. Albany went to the second round of the NCAA Tournament last season and returned three starters from that squad.
- For the seventh straight year, UK began its season ranked inside the top 20 of the USA Today/Coaches' and AP Top 25. Currently, UK is No. 15 in the Associated Press Top 25 and No. 19 in the USA Today/Coaches' Top 25. Kentucky has been ranked in both the USA Today/Coaches' Top 25 and The Associated Press Top 25 since week 13 of the 2009-10 season, which is a program-record streak of 134 weeks.

- An All-SEC Freshman performer last season, starting all 33 games with 8.5 points per game.
- Hit 49 3s last season - the third most by a true freshman in program history.

- Had eight points and seven rebounds - including four offensive - against Albany.

- Kentucky is 1-0 against ranked teams this season and are scheduled to play 11 more games against teams inside the AP Preseason Top 25 and USA Today/Coaches Top 25, including No. 4/3 South Carolina (twice), No. 5/6 Louisville, No. 10/9 Mississippi State, No. 13/13 Tennessee, No. 16/17 Oklahoma, No. 18/16 Arizona State, No. 19/23 Florida, No. 24 Texas A&M and No. 25 Missouri (twice). UK is also scheduled to play Auburn, Georgia (twice) and Duke, who are each receiving votes in one of the polls. In all, 16 of Kentucky's 29 regular-season games will come against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the current listing.
- Kentucky went 8-3 against ranked opponents last season, marking the best winning percentage against ranked foes in program history.
- In 43 years of varsity women's basketball, Kentucky has 86 wins over ranked opponents, including 45 of those wins coming under Mitchell.
- Last season, UK advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 for the fifth time in the last seven seasons - one of just seven schools nationally to claim that honor. The Wildcats ended the season ranked No. 15 in the USA Today/Coaches' Top 25 and No. 12 in the Associated Press Top 25.
- Kentucky ended the 2015-16 season with a 25-8 record, marking its seventh straight 20-win season and the sixth 25-win season in the last seven years under head coach Matthew Mitchell. Prior to Mitchell, Kentucky had only won 20+ games 10 times, while only recording one 25+ win season.
- The impressive 2015-16 regular season led Kentucky to a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament as the Wildcats were selected to host the first and second rounds of the event for the third straight season. The top-three seed in the event marked the fifth straight for UK.
- Matthew Mitchell, who is the all-time winningest head coach in program history, is in his 10th season at Kentucky. Mitchell welcomes a new - yet familiar - coaching staff this season in associate head coach Kyra Elzy, assistant coach Niya Butts and assistant coach Lin Dunn.
- Combined the Kentucky women's basketball coaching staff has compiled over 80 years of experience at the Division I level, including coaching or playing in a combined 34 NCAA Tournaments with eight Final Fours, four national championships and a WNBA Championship. Elzy and Butts are in their second stint in Lexington after serving on Mitchell's staffs before. Butts was an associate head coach on Mitchell's first staff at Kentucky before Elzy joined the staff for four successful seasons. Dunn, who is a Women's Basketball Hall of Famer, has over 40 years of coaching experience, including three decades in the college.
- Kentucky returns several of its top performers from last season in its leading scorer, leading rebounder, leading 3-point shooter, second and third assist leaders, leader in steals and leader in blocks.
- Senior guard Makayla Epps leads the returners after averaging a team-best 17.1 points per game last season with 4.8 rebounds per game, 143 assists and 41 steals. Epps has been named a preseason All-America honoree by multiple publications this preseason and is in fantastic shape as she enters her final campaign in Lexington. Epps was also named to the Nancy Lieberman Preseason Watch List.
- Fellow senior Evelyn Akhator returns as Kentucky's top post presence last year, averaging a team-best 9.3 rebounds with 13 double-doubles in 2015-16. Akhator was named to The Sporting News Preseason All-American Third Team.
- Sophomores Maci Morris and Taylor Murray also return for UK. Morris led UK with a team-best .392 mark from 3 in 2015-16, while Murray led UK with 56 steals, becoming the first true freshman to lead the team in steals since Victoria Dunlap in 2007-08. UK also returns post Alyssa Rice, who has played in 60 career games with 13 starts, and Cincinnati transfer Makenzie Cann, who sat out last season due to NCAA Transfer rules.
- Six newcomers have been added to the mix, including senior Bellarmine transfer Jessica Hardin, sophomore Stony Brook transfer Ogechi Anyagaligbo - the 2016 America East Conference Rookie of the Year - and four-star guard Jaida Roper from Memphis, Tenn. Three walk-ons are new to the roster in Pikeville, Ky., native Rachel Potter, Bowling Green, Ky., native LaShae Halsel and Morgantown, W.Va., native Paige Poffenberger.

SCOUTING NEW HAMPSHIRE

- New Hampshire starts the season with a 1-1 record after suffering a 61-56 loss to Cornell University in its season opener on Friday, Nov. 11 before defeating New England College on Monday, 58-38.
- Against Cornell, UNH posted a strong performance on the boards, out-rebounding Cornell 45-25, including a 16-9 edge in offensive rebounds. Junior Carlie Pogue was the driving force for the Wildcats against Cornell, tallying a game-high 20 points, as well as pacing all players with 13 rebounds in the game.
- Junior Brittini Lai was the only other UNH player to score in double figures in the outing, adding 17 points to go along with five assists. Lai also recorded the only block for the Wildcats in the game.
- Against Cornell, New Hampshire committed 24 turnovers, which ultimately made the difference in the game as the Big Red fully capitalized on them, earning 26 points off of turnovers.
- UNH turned the tables on New England College, forcing 25 turnovers and limiting NEC to just 22.2% from the field. UNH outrebounded New England 55-38 in the game with 17 second-chance points.

2016-17 GAME NOTES

WINNING TOOLS EDUCATION DAY THURSDAY

Matthew Mitchell and the University of Kentucky women's basketball team will hold its annual Winning Tools Education Day Thursday. All local primary and secondary schools, including elementary, middle and high schools, were encouraged to take advantage of free tickets to the game.

The Winning Tools Education Day is based on Mitchell's Winning Tools of honesty, hard work and discipline, which he has used to successfully build the Kentucky women's basketball program. With the Winning Tools at the center of program, Mitchell is the winningest head coach in program history, guiding Kentucky to a school-record seven straight NCAA Tournament appearances. The Wildcats have advanced to five Sweet 16s the last seven seasons and are one of seven schools nationally to claim that honor.

WILDCATS REIGN IN KENTUCKY CLASSIC

Kentucky opened its 2016-17 season in style over the weekend by defeating No. 14 Miami (Fla.) 82-66 and Albany - who went to the NCAA Tournament second round last season and returned three starters - 70-46. It marked the first time that Kentucky has won each of their first two games of a season by at least 16 points since 2011-2012.

Senior post Evelyn Akhator led Kentucky by averaging 23.0 points and 11.5 rebounds per game, while fellow senior Makayla Epps averaged 18.5 points per game with 11 assists and three steals. As a team, Kentucky shot .434 from the field in the event averaging 14.5 assists per game and +5 in rebounding margin.

AKHATOR EARNS NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK, SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

A day after being named the National Player of the Week by CollegeSportsMadness.com, Evelyn Akhator was tabbed the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week by the league office Tuesday (11/15). The honor was the second weekly honor by the league office during Akhator's career. The native of Lagos, Nigeria, was also named SEC Player of the Week on Feb. 29, 2016 after her impressive performances against Missouri and Texas A&M to end the regular season.

Akhator had a great start to her senior season over the weekend, posting 18 points with 10 rebounds and two blocks against No. 14 Miami (Fla.) in the season opener before a career-high 28 points with 13 rebounds and four blocks against Albany. The senior is the first Kentucky player to record back-to-back double-doubles to start a season since Victoria Dunlap accomplished the feat in 2009-10. For her career, Akhator has 15 double-doubles, which ranks her tied for ninth all-time in program history with DeNesha Stallworth.

EPSS SHINES LATE AGAINST NO. 14 MIAMI (FLA.)

Last year, Makayla Epps made a living against some of the best teams in the nation averaging 18.4 ppg, hitting .486 from the field with 29 assists and 33 rebounds against highly-ranked Louisville, Duke, South Carolina (twice), Tennessee, Mississippi State and Texas A&M combined. That trend continued early this season as Epps scored 29 points with five assists and three steals against No. 14 Miami (Fla.) in the season opener. Epps had just seven points in the first half before 22 in the final 20 minutes, including 18 in the fourth quarter.

EPSS ON NANCY LIEBERMAN PRESEASON WATCH LIST

Kentucky senior guard Makayla Epps is one of 20 players in the nation on to the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Award preseason watch list. The award, which is hosted by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, annually recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball.

Epps is the only Southeastern Conference player on the preseason list, which will be narrowed down to 10 in mid-February before five finalists are selected in March. The winner of the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Award will be announced at the NCAA Women's Final Four in Dallas. The Selection Committee for the Nancy Lieberman Award is composed of top women's college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, sports information directors and Hall of Famers.

MULTIPLE PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA HONORS FOR EPSS

Makayla Epps has earned lofty praise this preseason. On top of her nomination to the Nancy Lieberman Watch List, the native of Lebanon, Ky., was named to College Sports Madness' and The Sporting News' Preseason All-America First Team, Athlon Sports Preseason All-America Second Team and was named Preseason All-SEC by league media. Last season, Epps earned honorable-mention All-America honors by both The Associated Press and Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

AKHATOR PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA THIRD TEAM BY THE SPORTING NEWS

Kentucky senior post player Evelyn Akhator was named to The Sporting News Preseason All-America Third Team in late September. Akhator was one of six Southeastern Conference players to be named to the publication's preseason All-America team. Last season, Akhator was named an All-SEC Second-Team performer by both the Associated Press and league coaches.

EPPS, AKHATOR HOPE TO BUILD ON IMPRESSIVE JUNIOR SEASONS

There is no question who the leaders on this Kentucky team will be with senior guard Makayla Epps and senior post Evelyn Akhator controlling the locker room and the floor for the Wildcats. Both enter their senior seasons after award-winning junior seasons where Epps was honorable mention All-America and Akhator an All-SEC performer.

Epps had an amazing junior season for Kentucky, playing in 32 games and averaging 17.1 points per game and 4.8 rebounds per game with 143 assists and 41 steals. The powerful guard scored 20-plus points 12 times during the season, while scoring in double digits in 29 of her 32 games played. Early in the season, Epps posted the second triple-double in program history with 21 points, 12 assists and 11 rebounds against Morehead State. In conference play, Epps averaged 16.1 points per game and in the SEC Tournament, Epps averaged 18.3 points per game, adding 12 assists and an impressive .553 shooting clip from the field.

Akhator was a key addition to the Wildcats' post presence last season, averaging 11.5 points and 9.3 rebounds per game. The native of Lagos, Nigeria, scored in double figures 24 times, while posting 10 or more rebounds in 15 games. Against No. 11 Texas A&M in the regular-season finale, Akhator scored 15 points and pulled down a career-high 18 rebounds, including 10 offensive rebounds to earn SEC Player of the Week honors. In the SEC Tournament, Akhator averaged 11.7 points and 8.7 rebounds per game. Akhator's 13 double-doubles in 2015-16 were the most by any player in a single-season under head coach Matthew Mitchell.

WILDCATS PICKED TO FINISH TOP 5 IN SEC

The Southeastern Conference announced its Preseason Media Poll on Oct. 18 and Preseason Coaches Poll on Nov. 7. Kentucky was picked to finish fourth in the league in the media poll and fifth in the league in the coaches poll, while 2016 SEC champion South Carolina was tabbed as the top team in the conference in both polls. The media and coaches also named Makayla Epps to its Preseason All-SEC First Team.

RANKINGS STREAK KEPT ALIVE

YOUNG CATS GROW UP FAST

Last season, there was not much time for then freshmen Taylor Murray and Maci Morris to adjust to college basketball as the Wildcats only had nine eligible players. But the quick learning curve didn't bother either as both had successful freshman seasons and have become vocal leaders on the court as sophomores this season.

Murray led Kentucky in steals last season with 56, becoming the first true freshman to led the Wildcats in steals since Victoria Dunlap in 2007-08. The native of Odenton, Md., played in all 33 games averaging 6.8 points per game, 2.7 rebounds per game, 2.2 assists per game and 1.5 steals per game.

Morris was named to the All-SEC Freshman team last season by league coaches after starting all 33 games and averaging 8.5 points per game. Her 49 3-pointers last year were just one off tying the UK freshman 3-point record. Morris hit at a .392 clip from 3, which was the second best percentage for a true freshman from beyond the arc in program history.

KENTUCKY VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

In order to be one of the nation's best, you have to play against the nation's best. This year, Kentucky is 1-0 against ranked opponents will face several more opponents who are ranked or receiving votes in either the Associated Press Top 25 or USA Today/Coaches Top 25.

Kentucky is scheduled to play 11 more games against teams inside the AP Preseason Top 25 and USA Today/Coaches Top 25, including No. 4/3 South Carolina (twice), No. 5/6 Louisville, No. 10/9 Mississippi State, No. 13/13 Tennessee, No. 16/17 Oklahoma, No. 18/16 Arizona State, No. 19/23 Florida, No. 24 Texas A&M and No. 25 Missouri (twice). UK is also scheduled to play Auburn, Georgia (twice) and Duke, who are each receiving votes in one of the polls. In all, 16 of Kentucky's 29 regular-season games will come against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the current listing.

UK's lone win over a ranked foe this season was against then-No. 14 Miami.

Last season, Kentucky went 8-3 against ranked opponents, marking the best winning percentage against ranked foes in program history.

KENTUCKY ENDS 2015-16 SEASON RANKED HIGH IN SEVERAL NATIONAL CATEGORIES

Kentucky ended its 2015-16 ranking very high in several national categories, including 16th nationally and second in the SEC in scoring margin (+14.1), 18th nationally and third in the SEC in field goal percentage (.455), 24th nationally and second in the SEC in scoring offense (74.7), and 26th nationally and second in the SEC in 3-point field goal percentage (.356).

Last year's offense ranked as one of the best in program history, as its 2,465 points scored was 10th

best in school history. Kentucky's 2015-16 scoring margin of +14.1 was the seventh best margin in program history, while its 934 field goals made were the ninth most by a team in program history. Kentucky's 154 3-pointers made and 475 assists just missed the top 10 by two 3-pointers and five assists.

Although the turnovers and steals didn't come in at the pace they had in the past, the UK defense stayed fundamentally strong, limiting opponents to 60.6 points per game and a .372 mark from the field with 131 blocks, 507 turnovers forced and 222 steals.

MUCH IMPROVED ON BOTH SIDES

When comparing Kentucky's final numbers in 2015-16 to its final numbers from 2014-15, the Wildcats were much improved in several areas. Below is a statistical breakdown.

UK is 28-24 all-time in overtime games, including a 9-2 mark under Matthew Mitchell, who is 11-3 in his 11-year career as a head coach in extra minutes.

KENTUCKY ALL-TIME

Kentucky is 763-504 (.602) in its 43rd year of varsity women's basketball, including 219-89 (.711) in nine seasons under Matthew Mitchell. Win No. 750 came against Auburn on Jan. 17, 2016 in Memorial.

CATS SIGN NO. 16 RECRUITING CLASS BY ASGR

According to ASGR, Kentucky and Matthew Mitchell signed the No. 16 recruiting class in the country during the early signing period, inking five quality players to NLIs.

The class consists of post Dorie Harrison (Nashville, Tenn.), wing Keke McKinney (Knoxville, Tenn.), guard Amanda Paschal (Brooklyn, N.Y.), guard Kameron Roach (Hopkins, S.C.) and post Tatyana Wyatt (Columbus, Ga.).

Harrison, McKinney, Roach and Wyatt are all top-100 recruits according to ProspectsNation.com and ASGR, while ASGR has Paschal ranked as the No. 56 JUCO player.

CATS EARN HIGH GPA

Kentucky not only excels on the court but in the classroom as well. UK posted a 3.077 GPA during the fall semester and a 3.463 GPA during the spring semester. UK posted a 3.077 GPA during the 2015 fall semester and a 3.463 GPA during the 2016 spring semester. The Wildcats have had a 3.0 team GPA or better six straight semesters.

In nine seasons under Mitchell, 26 Wildcats have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 100 percent of his players in their final season of eligibility have received their degree, including all four seniors last year.

A WINNING INSTITUTION

Kentucky is the only school to have both their men's and women's basketball teams ranked in the Top 25 of every Associated Press Poll since the start of 2014-15 season. UK has tallied a 407-104 combined record between its two programs since 2009-10. That record includes a 232-16 mark in Lexington. UK was one of three schools to have both men's and women's programs as a top four seed in the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

SIX CATS PLAYING OVERSEAS

Kentucky women's basketball currently has five alumnae who signed professional contracts to play overseas for the 2016-17 season.

Azia Bishop took her talents to Poland, where she is playing for the TS Ostrovia Ostrow.

Bria Goss played her first professional year in Finland for Hyvinkään Ponteva and is still with the team.

DeNesha Stallworth bounced around a bit in 2016 and is currently with the Artego Bydgoszcz in Poland.

COMEBACK CATS

Kentucky's mantra last season could be the "Comeback Cats" as UK had to battle back from at least nine-point deficits six times and double-digit second half deficits in four games (Baylor, Louisville, Alabama and Mississippi State). UK followed a similar story line in its second game this season, trailing by 12 in the second half at Arizona State before bouncing back to earn a win in overtime.

The Cats are 86-52 (.623) in "close games" (games decided by 10 points or fewer) under Matthew Mitchell, including 6-5 this season.

In June of 2014, Coach Matthew Mitchell and his wife, Jenna, pledged \$1 million over the next 10 years to the University of Kentucky Athletics Department. The donation will provide UK Athletics \$100,000 per year over the next 10 years to be used for a variety of capital projects, including updates and renovations for football. The donation is the largest ever given by a UK athletics employee to the athletics department.

Matthew and Jenna have been very active in the Lexington community since arriving in Lexington. In October 2016, Matthew and Jenna were presented the Community Service Award by the Urban League of Lexington.

RUPP ARENA CHOSEN FOR THREE STRAIGHT NCAA REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS

For the first time since the women's basketball Final Four in 1986, Rupp Arena and the University of Kentucky hosted the NCAA regional tournament in 2016 and will again in 2017 and 2018 for women's basketball.

In 2017, Bridgeport (Webster Bank Arena) and Lexington (Rupp Arena) will again host, joined by Oklahoma City (Chesapeake Energy Arena) and Stockton, Calif. (Stockton Arena) March 24-27.
