THE STARTING FIVE

1. Champions Classic

Michigan State is 3-2 all-time in the Champions Classic. Last season, Denzel Valentine put on a dazzling display with 29 points, 12 rebounds and 12 assists as No. 13 MSU defeated No. 4 Kansas, 79-73. In 2014, No. 19 MSU fell to No. 4 Duke, 81-71, as Branden Dawson paced the Spartans with 18 points and nine rebounds, while the Blue Devils shot 54.0 percent from the field. In 2013, No. 2 MSU defeated No. 1 Kentucky, 78-74, in Chicago, behind 22 points, eight assists and eight rebounds from Keith Appling, and 20 points from Gary Harris. The Spartans defeated No. 7 Kansas, 67-64, in 2012 in Atlanta behind 19 points from Appling and 18 points from Harris. Appling hit a 3-pointer with 1:36 to go up by four points. KU responded with a three-point play, but Appling converted on an acrobatic driving layup with 14 seconds remaining to take a 67-64 lead. In the inaugural classic, No. 6 Duke defeated MSU, 74-69, in New York's Madison Square Garden. Appling led MSU with 22 points. Duke and Kentucky both join MSU with 3-2 records in Champions Classic action, while Kansas is 1-4.

2. The Nation's Toughest November

Michigan State begins the 2016-17 season with arguably the toughest opening month in college basketball history, certainly Spartan history. With games scheduled against consensus No. 1 Duke, No. 2 Kentucky, No. 10 Arizona and a potential matchup against No. 12 Louisville, Michigan State could face four Top 15 squads in November alone. The Spartans have never faced three Top 15 opponents in November, and have never played four Top 15 opponents in any month during the regular season.

3. Frequent Flier Miles

Not only will the Spartans play a diabolical slate of opponents, they will face a brutal travel schedule to open the season. Beginning with a flight to Hawaii on November 8 and ending with the return flight from Duke on Nov. 29, the Spartans will travel more than 13,600 miles in 22 days, including additional trips to New York City and the Bahamas.

4. Hall of Famer Tom Izzo

Now in his 22nd season at Michigan State, Hall of Fame coach Tom Izzo has built the Spartans into one of the elite programs in the nation. MSU is the only school in the country to win 27 or more games in each of the last five seasons. The Spartans' 19 straight NCAA Tournaments are a Big Ten record, the third-longest active streak in the nation and the fourth-longest active streak of all time. He's been able to accomplish this while playing more ranked teams than anyone else since 1998. Michigan State has appeared in a nation's best seven Final Fours in the last 18 seasons. Izzo's seven Final Four trips are tied for fifth most in NCAA history. Izzo was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Sept. 9.

5.Playing The Best

Since the 1997-98 season, the year of Michigan State's first of 19 straight trips to the NCAA Tournament, the Spartans have played 206 games against ranked opponents. That total ranks first among teams that have appeared in a Final Four since then. The Spartans are followed by North Carolina (192), Texas (186), Duke (180), Illinois (175), Kentucky (174) and Michigan (173).

MSU VS. KENTUCKY NOTES

<u>Series History</u>
Kentucky leads the all-time series with Michigan State, 12-11, with the Spartans owning a 3-2 edge in neutral-site contests. MSU is 5-2 against Kentucky under Tom Izzo, including 1-0 against a John Calipari-coached Kentucky team. Michigan State and Kentucky played in front of a world-record crowd of 78,129 at Detroit's Ford Field on Dec. 13, 2003. MSU has defeated Kentucky to advance to two of its seven Final Fours under Coach Izzo, beating the Wildcats in the 1999 and 2005 regional finals.

Calipari (Clarion State '82) is 622-185 (.771) in his 25th year as a head coach, including a 219-47 (.823) mark in his eighth season at Kentucky. He arrived in Lexington in 2009, following nine seasons at Memphis, where he posted a 214-68 record. Prior to his stint with the Tigers, Calipari coached 2-plus seasons in the NBA with the New Jersey Nets. His first head coaching job came at UMass, where he posted a 189-70 mark in eight seasons. He has appeared in four Final Fours and captured the 2012 NCAA Championship with Kentucky, while being inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2015. Tom Izzo is 1-1 in his career against John Calipari.

The Last Meeting

Michigan State defeated Kentucky, 78-74, in a battle of No. 1 vs. No. 2. The second-ranked Spartans jumped out to a dominating start, scoring the game's first 10 points. Late in the first half, MSU pushed the lead up to 15 points before taking a 44-32 lead into the break. Trailing 59-48 midway through the second half, UK went on an 11-1 run, pulling within a single point. By the 4:41 mark, Kentucky had pulled even at 66. On MSU's next possession, Denzel Valentine found Keith Appling open in the corner for a 3-pointer. Gary Harris followed with a steal at midcourt, and drove for the layup, pushing the Spartan lead back up to five points. MSU then scored its next five points at the foul line, but clung to just a two-point lead in the final minute as UK's Julius Randle scored his 27th point of the game and 22nd of the half. On MSU's final possession, Valentine drove for a layup. His attempt was off the mark, but Branden Dawson was left unattended and tipped in the ball, giving the Spartans a 78-74 lead with five seconds remaining. Appling led MSU with 22 points, eight assists and eight rebounds, while Harris added 20. The win was the third for Tom Izzo over a No. 1 team.

Wildcat Notes

Kentucky entered the season as the 2nd ranked team in the AP Poll and was picked to win its 48th SEC regular-season championship by the media. Freshman De'Aaron Fox tallied a UK debut record 12 assists in an 87-64 win over Stephen F. Austin (11/11). The Wildcats replace 75 percent of their scoring and 70 percent of their rebounding from last year, but brought in a top-ranked recruiting class that features five five-star recruits. Three of those freshman were named to a preseason All-America team. UK wrapped up the 2015-16 season with a 27-9 record and made the second round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to Indiana, 73-67.

 Miles Bridges led all scorers with 21 points on 9-for-19 shooting. The 21 points were the second most ever by a freshman in his MSU debut, trailing only Jay Vincent's 25 in 1977. His seven boards were tied for the seventh most by a freshman in his first game, joining Branden Dawson (2011), Adreian Payne (2010) and Charlie Bell (1997).

 MSU started the game on a 9-0 run, seven of which came from Bridges to force an Arizona timeout. MSU eventually took a 17-2 lead before a 23-4 run by Arizona gave the Wildcats a 25-21 lead.

• All four of Michigan State's freshmen were on the floor together as early as the 16:25 mark in the first half. The group combined for 35 of MSU's 63 points.

 Arizona took its biggest lead of the game at 43-34 before the Spartans went on a 17-3 run to take a 51-46 advantage and their first lead since 21-20 in the first half.

 \bullet The Spartans held Arizona to 38.5% (20-52) shooting from the floor and 35.7 % (5-14) from three.

Playing in the 2016 Armed Forces Classic commemorating the 75th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, Michigan State scored the game's first nine points in sprinting out to a 17-2 lead. Arizona responded with a 23-4 spurt and held a 34-30 lead at the half. The Wildcats led by nine early in the second stanza, but MSU battled back to tie the contest at 44. Neither team led by more than three points in the final 6:58. With MSU trailing 63-60, Tum Tum Nairn Jr. rattled in a 3-pointer with seven seconds left to tie the contest. Following a timeout, Kadeem Allen lost Joshua Langford, who slipped, and drove the length of the court for a game-winning layup with 1.9 seconds left.

SPARTAN BASKETBALL NOTES

MSU's Freshman Class

Michigan State's freshman class of Miles Bridges, Joshua Langford, Nick Ward and Cassius Winston was widely regarded as one of the top recruiting classes in the nation. Bridges and Langford were McDonald's All-Americans, Winston joined Bridges as Jordan Brand All-Americans and all four players were ranked in the Top 40 in the nation. They are expected to have an immediate impact on the Spartans in 2016-17. In fact, they have the potential to go down as the most productive freshman class under Tom Izzo. The 2001-02 Spartan freshmen of Alan Anderson, Chris Hill, Kelvin Torbert and Aaron Alexander combined to average 77.4 minutes and 26.5 points, both of which rank first in the Izzo era. The 2002-03 freshmen (Maurice Ager, Paul Davis, Erazem Lorbek) averaged a combined 20.9 points, while 2012-13 freshmen (Matt Costello, Gary Harris, Denzel Valentine and Trevor Bohnhoff) averaged 19.7 points. In the season opener vs. Arizona, the freshman quartet combined for 35 points and 73 minutes.

MSU At The Garden

Michigan State is 3-11 all-time at Madison Square Garden. Under head coach Tom Izzo, the Spartans are 3-7 at MSG. Most recently, Michigan State split a pair of games in the 2014 East Regional, defeating No. 3 Virginia 61-59, before falling to eventual National Champion UConn, 60-54, in the regional finals. Earlier that season, MSU lost to Georgetown, 64-60. MSU fell to Duke, 74-69, in the 2011 Champions Classic. In 2010, Syracuse defeated MSU, 72-58, in the Jimmy V Classic. The Spartans split a pair of games at the 2006 College Hoops Classic, beating a Texas squad featuring Kevin Durant (63-61) and falling to Maryland (62-60). MSU's other win at the Garden was a 77-70 victory over Boston College in the 2005 Jimmy V Classic.

Spartans Share The Ball

Unselfishness is a trademark of all Tom Izzo teams. That has been especially true over the last three seasons as MSU has established a school record for assists in each of the last three years. Last season, MSU tallied a school record 719 assists, good for the 22nd-best total in NCAA history. MSU's nation's-best assist average of 20.5 was the 23rd-best average in NCAA history. The Spartans recorded an assist on a nation's-best 71.3 percent of its field goals. In 2014-15, MSU totaled 646 assists (16.6 apg), after recording 637 (16.8 apg) in 2013-14. In two exhibition games, MSU averaged 19.0 assists, led by freshman Cassius Winston at 7.5 apg. In the season opener, Tum Tum Nairn Jr. led MSU with four assists, as the Spartans had 15 on 25 made field goals.

From Beyond the Arc

The 2015-16 Spartans led the nation in 3-point field goal percentage and made a school record 321 3-pointers. This year's Spartan squad must replace Bryn Forbes (112) and Denzel Valentine (104) who combined for 216 3-pointers last season. Against Arizona, MSU hit 8-of-25 from behind the arc, led by Matt McQuaid hitting 3-of-8. MSU did shoot .455 in two exhibition contests, led by Miles Bridges (7-9). Cassius Winston (2-4), McQuaid (2-6) and Eron Harris (2-7) all averaged one made 3-pointer per contest. Last season, Harris shot .439 (43-98) from behind the arc, while McQuaid hit .409 (27-66) of his attempts.

MSU In November

Michigan State has an all-time record of 121-32 in games played in the month of November. This includes an 80-3 mark at home. The last team to beat MSU at home in November was a David Robinson-led Navy squad that bested the Spartans, 91-90, in overtime on Nov. 29, 1986. Tom Izzo is 58-0 all-time at home in November, 86-25 for the month.

Bridges' Preseason Honors

Freshman Miles Bridges is already gathering some national attention. The Flint, Michigan, native was also tabbed preseason First Team All-America by The Sporting News, while also landing a spot on the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award and the Naismith Trophy Preseason Watch Lists.

Spartans In The NBA

Michigan State had a Big Ten-best eight players on NBA opening day rosters, including Denzel Valentine (Bulls), Gary Harris (Nuggets), Deyonta Davis (Grizzlies), Bryn Forbes (Spurs), Draymond Green (Warriors), Adreian Payne (Timberwolves), Zach Randolph (Grizzlies) and Alan Anderson (Clippers).

Harris Tops Spartan Returners

Senior Eron Harris is Michigan State's leading returning scorer at 9.3 points per game. He is the only returning Spartan to have started a game last February or March. In the four games Denzel Valentine missed due to injury last season, Harris averaged 17.8 points. He has been named to the Jerry West Award Watch List, presented to the top shooting guard in the nation. As a sophomore at West Virginia in 2013-14, Harris averaged 17.2 points.

Strength of Schedule

In total, the 2016-17 schedule features 15 teams that appeared in the 2016 postseason, including 11 opponents that played in the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

2017 Recruiting Class

Michigan State signed a pair of forwards on the first day of the early signing period on Nov. 9. Jaren Jackson Jr. is a 5-star 6-11, 220-pound forward from Indianapolis. Playing as a senior at La Lumiere, the No. 1 high school team in America, Jackson Jr. has been named





to the All-USA Preseason Boys Basketball Team as selected by USA TODAY Sports. He is the son of Jaren Jackson Sr., a former star at Georgetown and 1999 NBA Champion with the San Antonio Spurs. Despite his 6-11 frame, he shot .442 from 3-point range as a junior. He was a member of the 2016 USA Basketball U17 team that won a gold medal in Spain. Xavier Tillman is a 4-star 6-8, 270-pound forward from Grand Rapids, Michigan. He is a three-time MLIVE Grand Rapids Press Dream Team honoree. He averaged 16 points, 10.4 rebounds, 2.9 assists as a junior, shooting 62% from the field while playing for Grand Rapids Christian, earning 2016 Associated Press Class A All-State honors.

Big Ten Schedule

With a 14-team conference each Big Ten team will play five schools twice, four schools on the road, and four schools at home. Michigan State will go home and home with Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, Ohio State and Purdue. The Spartans will host Iowa, Northwestern, Rutgers and Wisconsin, while traveling to Illinois, Indiana, Maryland and Penn State. Seven of Michigan State's 13 Big Ten opponents appeared in the 2016 postseason, including six in the NČAA Tournament (Indiana, Iowa, Maryland, Michigan, Purdue and Wisconsin) and one in the NIT (Ohio State).

Spartans In The Polls

Michigan State is ranked No. 13 in both the Associated Press Top 25 and USA Today Coaches Poll this week. The Spartans are one of four Big Ten teams to be ranked in the polls, joining Indiana (No. 6 AP/ No. 5 USA Today), Wisconsin (9/11) and Purdue (15/15). In addition to the conference opponents, MSU is also scheduled to play Duke (1/1) on top of meetings with Kentucky (2/2) and Arizona (10/9) in November and could possibly meet Louisville (12/12) in the Battle 4 Atlantis.

Coaching Stability

Michigan State has had just two basketball coaches in the last 41 seasons and three in the last 48. Tom Izzo is in his 22nd season, having taking over from his mentor Jud Heathcote, who spent 19 years as head coach (1976-95). Before Heathcote, Gus Ganakas spent seven seasons as head coach. Ganakas is currently in his 31st-straight season providing commentary on Spartan radio broadcasts.

Backcourt Experience

Michigan State's backcourt is its most experienced unit with seniors Eron Harris and Alvin Ellis III, junior Lourawls "Tum Tum" Nairn Jr. and sophomore Matt McQuaid all having played significant minutes during their career. Harris, Nairn and Ellis entered the season with a combined 60 career starts at MSU, including 41 last year. It will also receive an influx of talent from 2016 McDonald's All-American Joshua Langford and 2016 Michigan Mr. Basketball winner Cassius Winston, providing MSU with one of the deeper backcourts

Nation's Best Seven Final Fours in 17 Years

Michigan State advanced to the 2015 Final Four, marking the seventh trip to the Final Four in 20 seasons under Tom Izzo. The seven trips in the last 18 seasons rank as the most in the nation. In addition, MSU has appeared in 19 straight NCAA Tournaments, marking the nation's third-longest active streak, and the longest streak in Big Ten history.

Exhibition Recap

Michigan State averaged 90.0 points in a pair of exhibition victories. Miles Bridges led all scorers at 26.5 points per game, shooting .704 (19-27) from the field and .778 (7-9) from 3-point range. Cassius Winston averaged 13.5 points and 7.5 assists, while Nick Ward averaged 12.5 points. As a team, MSU shot .550 from the field, including .455 from 3-point range.

Breslin Upgrades on the Horizon

A major facilities upgrade - focused on improving the visitor experience - is on tap for the Breslin Student Events Center. The Breslin Center addition -- in all a \$20 million project -- involves construction of a new box office, the Tom Izzo Hall of History and, for the student-athletes and coaches of the men's and women's basketball teams, the addition of the Draymond Green Strength and Conditioning Center, a hydration station, lounges for players and recruits, and an alumni locker room. The work began in January 2016, with substantial completion expected by August of 2017 and final completion by June 2018.

Coach Izzo

In his 22nd year, Tom Izzo (Northern Michigan, '77) is 524-206 (.718), and 246-112 (.687) in the Big Ten, as the head coach of the Michigan State basketball program. He ranks as the winningest coach in Michigan State history, having passed his mentor Jud Heathcote with his 341st career victory on Nov. 28, 2009. In his 21 seasons as a head coach, Izzo has captured eight National Coach of the Year awards, including the Clair Bee Award in 2005 and NABC honors in 2001 and 2012. In 1999, Izzo was named National Coach of the Year by Basketball Times, while earning similar honors from The Associated Press, Basketball News and the USBWA in '98. He also earned National Coach of the Year accolades from CBSSports.com in 2012. He earned Big Ten Coach of the Year honors in 1998, 2009 and 2012. Izzo was enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on September 9, 2016, cementing his status as one of the game's all-time greats.

Among The Big Ten's Best

Tom Izzo's .687 winning percentage in Big Ten games ranks third all-time among league coaches with at least 10 years of service, behind former Wisconsin coach Bo Ryan (.717), and former Indiana coach Bob Knight (.700), and ahead of former Purdue coach Ward Lambert (.685). In all games, Ohio State's Thad Matta ranks first at .748, followed by Ryan (.737), Knight (.734), Izzo (.718), Wisconsin's Walter Meanwell (.712), and Lambert (.709). With 246 conference victories, Izzo ranks third all time.

Izzo Among Best Ever

Through his first 21 seasons, Tom Izzo won 524 games, ranking fifth in college basketball history for most wins by a college coach in his first 21 years.

Final Fours

Tom Izzo led MSU to seven Final Four appearances between 1999 and 2015, becoming just the fourth school in college basketball history to do it in any 17-year span, including just the third since the tournament field expanded to 64 teams in 1985. Izzo's seven Final Fours are the most by any coach since his first season in 1996 and he ranks fifth all-time, including tied for fifth among active coaches. The seven Final Fours are also the most by any Big Ten coach.

// Notes //

MSU started the game on a 9-0 run, seven of which came from Bridges to force an Arizona timeout. MSU eventually took a 17-2 lead before a 23-4 run by Arizona gave the Wildcats a 25-21 lead ... All four of Michigan State's freshmen were on the floor together as early as the 16:25 mark in the first half. The group combined for 35 of MSU's 63 points ... Arizona took its biggest lead of the game at 43-34 before the Spartans went on a 17-3 run to take a 51-46 advantage and their first lead since 21-20 in the first half ... Bridges went 5-for-8 from the floor in the second half, including three of his four dunks on the game ... Nairn's three with 7.0 seconds left was his first make from distance since Nov. 27, 2015 vs. Boise State ... The Spartans held Arizona to 38.5% (20-52) shooting from the floor and 35.7 % (5-14) from three ... MSU tallied 15 assists on 25 made shots, led by Nairn Jr.'s four. Cassius Winston and Alvin Ellis each added three helpers.
