TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech makes the 44th bowl appearance in program history when it faces Kentucky in the 72nd-annual TaxSlayer Bowl on New Year's Eve in Jacksonville, Fla.
- Georgia Tech enters the postseason as one of college football's hottest teams, having won three-straight and five of its last six games to close the regular season. The Yellow Jackets are one of only 13 NCAA Division I FBS teams that is riding a winning streak of three games or more into the postseason.
- Georgia Tech is making its 44th all-time bowl appearance, which ranks 13th in major college football history. With a 24-19 all-time record in bowl games, the Yellow Jackets' rank 10th all-time in bowl wins and 12th all-time in bowl winning percentage (.558 - minimum 15 victories).
- Georgia Tech is making its eighth appearance in the TaxSlayer Bowl (formerly known as the Gator Bowl), which makes it the Yellow Jackets' most common bowl destination all-time (Tech has played in seven Orange Bowls). The Jackets are 3-4 all-time in the TaxSlayer/Gator Bowl.
- With a TaxSlayer Bowl win over Kentucky, Georgia Tech would record its 11th nine-win season in the last 60 years but its fourth in nine seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson**.
- The TaxSlayer Bowl serves as the 20th all-time meeting between Georgia Tech and Kentucky but the first since 1960. The Yellow Jackets hold an 11-7-1 edge in the series and have won two-straight (1959, 1960) and four of the last five (dating back to 1956) matchups versus the Wildcats.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

2

Sets of twins on Georgia Tech's roster (DBs **Lance Austin** and **Lawrence Austin**; OL **Brad Morgan** and **Scott Morgan**). Georgia Tech is the only NCAA Division I FBS program in the nation with two sets of twins currently on its roster.

5

Georgia Tech has already won five more games this season (8) than it did last season (3). Through the regular season, the Yellow Jackets' five-win improvement was tied for the second-largest among all Power 5 conference programs (Colorado - 6; Georgia Tech - 5; Washington - 5) and tied for the fifth-largest among all FBS programs (Colorado - 6; Eastern Michigan - 6; UCF - 6, Wyoming - 6; Georgia Tech - 5; Army - 5; Troy - 5; Washington - 5; Western Michigan - 5).

7

Georgia Tech had seven interceptions over the final three games of the regular season (two at Virginia Tech, three vs. Virginia, two at Georgia). Over the first nine games of the season, the Yellow Jackets had a total of four interceptions.

8

Georgia Tech won eight regular-season games for the fourth time in **Paul Johnson's** nine seasons as head coach. Prior to Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008, the Yellow Jackets had won eight regular-season games only eight times in the previous 51 seasons.

9

Georgia Tech forced nine turnovers over the final three games of the regular season (four at Virginia Tech, three vs. Virginia, two at Georgia). Over the first nine games of the season, the Yellow Jackets had a total of nine takeaways.

34

Georgia Tech scored 34 points off of opponents' turnovers over the final three games of the regular season (17 at Virginia Tech, 10 vs. Virginia, seven at Georgia). Over the first nine games of the season, the Yellow Jackets scored a total of 14 points off opponents' turnovers.

44

Georgia Tech is making the 44th bowl appearance in school history, which is tied for 13th in major college football history.

257.4

Georgia Tech is rushing for 257.4 yards per game this season, which leads the ACC and ranks 10th nationally.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- give it a final record of 9-4;
- extend its winning streak to four games;
- cap the Yellow Jackets' 11th nine-win campaign in the last 60 seasons and their fourth in nine seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson**;
- be the 25th bowl victory in school history;
- make it the 10th program with 25 bowl wins (LSU is also playing for its 25th bowl win on Dec. 31 vs. Louisville in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl);
- be its third win in its last four bowl games;
- even its record at 4-4 in eight all-time TaxSlayer Bowl appearances (formerly known as the Gator Bowl);
- move the Yellow Jackets to 12-7-1 all-time versus former Southern and Southeastern Conference rival Kentucky;
- be its third-straight win over UK but its first since the last meeting between the teams in 1960;
- give the Yellow Jackets a perfect 3-0 record versus SEC opponents this season and move the Jackets to 5-1 in their last six matchups with the SEC.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- give it a final record of 8-5;
- drop it to 24-20 all-time in bowl games and 3-5 in the TaxSlayer Bowl (formerly known as the Gator Bowl);
- be its first loss to Kentucky since 1958;
- be its first loss in three games against SEC opponents this season.

DID YOU KNOW?

Georgia Tech has committed the sixth-fewest penalties per game in the nation this season (4.08 pg) and been penalized for the seventh-fewest yards per game (35.67 pg).

NOTING NOV. 26 WIN AT GEORGIA

• Georgia Tech rallied from a 13-point deficit with two touchdowns in the final 6:28 of the game — including the game-winner with 30 seconds remaining — to defeat archrival Georgia, 28-27, on Nov. 26 at Sanford Stadium in Athens, Ga.

• Things looked bleak for Georgia Tech when it trailed 27-14 and faced second-and-12 on its own four yard line with less than 10 minutes left on the clock. However, back-to-back completions of 23 yards to **Brad Stewart** and 39 yards to **Qua Searcy** sparked a seven-play, 94-yard drive that culminated with **Dedrick Mills** cutting the deficit to 27-21 on a five-yard touchdown run with 6:28 to go in the game.

• Georgia picked up a first down on its ensuing possession and was threatening to run out the clock when Georgia Tech cornerback **Lance Austin** intercepted a tipped pass to give the Yellow Jackets possession at UGA's 46 yard line with 3:39 remaining.

• Georgia Tech easily marched inside Georgia's 10 yard line, picking up three first downs in five plays to give it first-and-goal at the UGA six.

• After two runs for no gain, the Yellow Jackets faced third-and-goal from the UGA six with 36 seconds to go. Head coach **Paul Johnson** called for an A-back pass from **Qua Searcy** to quarterback **Justin Thomas**. However, Thomas was covered coming out of the backfield so Searcy pulled down the ball and ran up the middle. With defenders converging, he leapt from the three yard line and flew across the goal line for the game-winning touchdown. **Harrison Butker's** extra point gave the Jackets a 28-27 lead with 30 seconds remaining in the game.

• Georgia's Hail Mary attempt on the final play of the game was intercepted by Georgia Tech linebacker **Brant Mitchell** to seal the Yellow Jackets' win.

• The 13-point deficit was the largest that Georgia Tech has ever overcome after three quarters in a win under Johnson (prev.: 11 at Wake Forest, Oct. 2, 2010 - GT trailed 17-6 after three quarters, won 24-20).

• The 13-point deficit is tied for the seventh-largest deficit that Georgia Tech has ever overcome at any point of a win.

• Georgia Tech's game-winning eight-play, 46-yard touchdown drive marked the fourth time in 37-career starts that Thomas has engineered a drive that resulted in Georgia Tech scoring the game's tying or winning points in the final minute of regulation (2014 vs. Georgia Southern, 2014 at Georgia, 2016 vs. Boston College).

• Sophomore AB **Clinton Lynch's** 42-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was his seventh play from scrimmage of the season that covered at least 42 yards (two rushes, five receptions). He has scored on all seven.

• Sophomore WR **Brad Stewart's** 87 receiving yards were a career high (prev. 70 vs. Duke, Oct. 29, 2016).

• Stewart's 64-yard reception on Georgia Tech's second touchdown drive in the second quarter was the longest of his career and the longest by a GT wide receiver this season (prev. for both: Stewart's 50-yard reception vs. Duke, Oct. 29).

• Freshman RB **Dedrick Mills** scored his 12th touchdown of the season (11th rushing) in the fourth quarter. Despite missing four games, his 12 total touchdowns are tied for 12th in Georgia Tech single-season history and his 11 rushing touchdowns are tied for 13th in GT single-season history.

• Senior PK **Harrison Butker** scored four points (all on PATs) to move into a tie atop Georgia Tech's all-time scoring list with 322 career points (Luke Manget - 1999-2002).

• Georgia's 139 passing yards were the fewest allowed by Georgia Tech this season (prev.: 144 vs. Boston College, Sept. 3).

• With the win, Georgia Tech claimed consecutive victories at Georgia for the first time since 1998 (21-19) and 2000 (27-15).

• Johnson became the second coach in Georgia Tech history with three wins at Georgia (2008, 2014 and 2016), joining Bobby Dodd, who won at UGA five times (1950, 1952, 1954, 1956 and 1962).

• Johnson became the fourth coach in Georgia Tech history with as many as three wins overall versus Georgia, joining Bobby Dodd (12), William Alexander (7) and George O'Leary (3).

• Thomas became the first Georgia Tech starting quarterback to beat Georgia twice in his career since Joe Hamilton accomplished the feat in 1998 and 1999.

• Thomas is the first Georgia Tech quarterback to win twice at Georgia since Wade Mitchell accomplished the feat in 1954 and 1956.

NOTING KENTUCKY

• Kentucky is making its first bowl appearance in six seasons after finishing with a 7-5 overall record in 2016.

• After an 0-2 start, Kentucky won seven of its final 10 regular-season games to finish the regular season with a winning record for the first time since 2009.

• Like Georgia Tech, Kentucky closed the regular season by winning its state's Governor's Cup. UK beat in-state rival and No. 11-ranked Louisville, 41-38, in the finale on a 47-yard field goal by Austin MacGinnis with 12 seconds remaining.

• Georgia Tech and Kentucky have two common opponents this season. Tech beat UK's SEC East rivals Vanderbilt (38-7 on Sept. 17) and Georgia (28-27 on Nov. 26). UK beat Vandy (20-13 on Oct. 8) but lost to Georgia (27-24 on Nov. 5).

• Also like Georgia Tech, Kentucky's strength is a high-powered rushing attack and a big-play passing game off play action. The Wildcats rank No. 16 nationally (third in the SEC) in rushing with 241.3 yards per game and rank 12th nationally (first in the SEC) with 14.9 passing yards per completion.

• Kentucky is the only Power 5 conference team and one of only four NCAA Division I FBS teams overall that had two 1,000-yard rushers during the regular season (New Mexico, Tulsa and South Florida being the others). Junior Stanley Williams led UK with 1,135 rushing yards (7.1 avg., 7 TD) and freshman Benny Snell ranked second on the squad with 1,057 yards on the ground (5.9 avg., 13 TD).

• The bowl appearance is Kentucky's first since it appeared in the BBVA Compass Bowl following the 2010 season. The Wildcats fell to Pittsburgh, 27-10, on Jan. 8, 2011 in Birmingham, Ala.

• UK has lost two-straight bowl games. Its last bowl win was a 25-19 victory over East Carolina in the Liberty Bowl following the 2008 season (Jan. 2, 2009).

• Kentucky is making the 16th bowl appearance in school history. The Wildcats are 8-7 all-time in bowl games.

• Head coach Mark Stoops is 19-29 (8-24 SEC) in four seasons at Kentucky. Prior to taking the helm at UK in 2013, he spent three seasons as the defensive coordinator at Florida State. His only matchup versus Georgia Tech in his three seasons with the Seminoles came in the 2012 ACC Championship Game, a 21-15 FSU victory.

GEORGIA TECH-KENTUCKY SERIES HISTORY

• The TaxSlayer Bowl serves as the 20th all-time meeting between Georgia Tech and Kentucky but the first since 1960.

• Georgia Tech holds an 11-7-1 edge in the series. The Yellow Jackets have won two-straight (1959, 1960) and four of the last five (dating back to 1956) matchups versus the Wildcats.

• The previous 19 meetings between GT and UK all came as members of the Southern (1921-1932) and Southeastern Conferences (1933-1963). Georgia Tech left the SEC following the 1963 season.

GEORGIA TECH vs. NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

• Georgia Tech's 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12 was the 91st win over a nationally ranked team in school history.

• Georgia Tech has 91 wins in 265 all-time matchups versus teams ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25.

• The Yellow Jackets' triumph in Blacksburg on Nov. 12 marked the 26th time in Tech history that the Jackets knocked off a top-25 team on the road and the first since a 30-24 overtime win at No. 9 Georgia on Nov. 29, 2014.

• Prior to the Nov. 12 win over VT, the Jackets had not beaten a ranked team on the road in regulation since they toppled No. 13 Georgia, 45-42, on Nov. 29, 2008 and had not defeated a ranked ACC opponent on the road since a 38-27 victory at No. 11 Virginia Tech on Sept. 30, 2006.

• The Yellow Jackets officially own 11 wins over ranked teams in nine seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson**. A 12th victory, a 39-34 triumph over No. 25 Clemson in the 2009 ACC Championship Game, was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

JACKETS REBOUND FROM TOUGH LUCK IN '15

• Thanks largely to a season-long string of misfortune, Georgia Tech's run of 18-consecutive bowl appearances was snapped with a 3-9 campaign in 2015.

• After going 11-3, winning the ACC Coastal Division championship and defeating Mississippi State in the Capital One Orange Bowl in 2014, two major factors contributed to last season's 3-9 record:

- 16 key players combined to miss more than 80 games due to injury
- six of the Yellow Jackets' nine losses came by eight points or less

• Due to the spate of injuries last season, 34 Yellow Jackets made their collegiate debuts in 2015 (which ranked fifth among all NCAA Division I FBS programs) and 23 freshmen saw playing time for Georgia Tech, which was tied for 10th among all Power Five conference teams.

• With so much youth on the field last year, Georgia Tech boasts an experienced roster in 2016, highlighted by the fact that the Yellow Jackets returned 81 percent of their rushing yards, 84 percent of their receiving yards and 98 percent of their passing yards from a season ago.

• Despite last season's hiccup, Georgia Tech has finished in first or second place in the ACC's Coastal Division six times in the past nine seasons and seven times in 12 seasons since the ACC split into divisions in 2005.

OFFENSE

• Since enduring a grueling early stretch that saw Georgia Tech face three of the nation's top 25 defenses over the first five games of the season, the Yellow Jackets' offense surged over the last seven contests of the regular season.

• The Yellow Jackets averaged 30.9 points and 426.4 yards per game over the last seven contests of the regular season.

• More impressively, the Yellow Jackets averaged 7.5 yards per play and nearly three points per possession (2.73) over the last seven games of the regular season. They punted only 21 times (3.0 per game) and came away with points on 36 of their 79 possessions (45.6 percent) during the seven-game span.

• Over the course of its first five games of the campaign, Georgia Tech faced three of this season's top 30 defenses in terms of total defense (Boston College - eighth, 310.6 ypg; Clemson - ninth, 313.9 ypg; Miami - 27th, 355.3 ypg), yards allowed per play (Clemson - sixth, 4.61 ypp; Miami - 11th, 4.84 ypp; Boston College - 27th, 5.08 ypp) and scoring defense (Clemson - 12th, 18.4 ppg; Miami - 13th, 18.9; Vanderbilt - 27th, 22.6 ppg).

• For the season, Georgia Tech ranks eighth among Power 5 conference teams and 17th overall nationally in yards per play (6.6), is tied for third among Power Five conference teams and seventh overall nationally in plays of 50 yards or more (17) and is tied for second among Power 5 conference teams and tied for third overall nationally in plays of 80 yards or more (3).

• Despite relatively pedestrian traditional rankings (69th in scoring offense, 82nd in total offense), Georgia Tech ranks 16th among Power Five conference teams and 22nd overall nationally in offensive efficiency, according to *ESPN.com* (ESPN's efficiency is based on the point contributions to the team's scoring margin, on a per-play basis. The values are adjusted for strength of schedule and down-weighted for "garbage time." The scale goes from 0 to 100; higher numbers are better and the average is roughly 50).

• The deviation between Georgia Tech's traditional offensive rankings and its offensive efficiency is due in large part to the fact that the Yellow Jackets simply have not had the ball very much. Tech ranks 61st nationally in average time of possession (30:06 per game) and is last out of 128 FBS teams in plays per game (58.8).

• The Yellow Jackets' lack of offensive plays reached historic levels in the next-to-last game of the regular season, as they had only 41 snaps in their 31-17 victory over Virginia. The 41 offensive plays were Georgia Tech's fewest in 51 years and the second-fewest in single-game school history.

• In more traditional offensive metrics, Georgia Tech ranks among the national leaders in passing yards per completion (second - 20.44 avg.), rushing offense (10th - 257.4 ypg), passing efficiency (10th - 158.16) and yards per rush (17th - 5.52 avg.).

• The running game is the backbone of head coach **Paul Johnson's** high-powered spread option offense. Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008, no team has rushed for more yards than Georgia Tech's 35,205. Johnson's former squad, Navy, ranks second nationally with 34,787 rushing yards during the same eight-plus-year span.

• Georgia Tech has led the ACC and finished among the top 10 nationally in rushing yardage in each of Johnson's eight full seasons as head coach.

• After ranking just 35th nationally with 216.8 rushing yards per game through four contests this season, Georgia Tech has climbed all the way to 10th in the nation in rushing offense with an ACC-best 257.4 yards per game.

• While they struggled to establish a ground presence against Boston College (119 rushing yards vs. No. 7 rushing defense in the nation on Sept. 3) and Clemson (95 rushing yards vs. No. 22 rushing defense in the nation), the Yellow Jackets have rushed for a much more Georgia Tech-like 287.5 yards per game and 6.0 yards per carry in their other 10 games this season.

• Georgia Tech has been outrushed only 15 times in Johnson's nine seasons as head coach.

• Only three times in Johnson's nine seasons at the helm have the Yellow Jackets won a game in which they have been outrushed — two of those game this season (outrushed 176-119 in 17-14 win over Boston College on Sept. 3 and 263-226 in 28-27 win at Georgia on Nov. 26).

• Protecting the ball has also been a big part of Georgia Tech's offensive success this season. The Yellow Jackets' 15 regular-season turnovers were tied for the 24th-fewest nationally.

• The Yellow Jackets' four interceptions were the second-fewest thrown by any FBS team during the regular season.

• With 25 total fumbles (11 lost) in 12 games, the Yellow Jackets put the ball on the ground at the second-lowest rate (2.08 per game) of Johnson's nine seasons at Tech. By contrast, the Jackets fumbled 36 times in 12 games last season (3.0 per game), which was the highest average in Johnson's nine seasons on The Flats.

• After turning the ball over at least once in each of its first five games this season, Georgia Tech went two-and-a-half games and 136 total plays between turnovers, a streak that ended when the Yellow Jackets fumbled on their first two touches of the second half against Duke on Oct. 29.

• In Johnson's nine seasons at the helm, Georgia Tech has produced 14 rushers that have eclipsed the 1,000-yard plateau for their careers. That is 30 percent of the 46 Yellow Jackets that have amassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the 125-year history of Georgia Tech football.

• With Thomas shelved due to a minor injury in the second half of Georgia Tech's 35-10 win over Mercer on Sept. 10, the Yellow Jackets did not attempt a pass over the final two quarters, marking the third time in Johnson's nine seasons as head coach that Tech did not throw a pass over the course of an entire half. The Yellow Jackets also didn't attempt a single pass in the second half of a 45-42 win over Georgia on Nov. 29, 2008 and the second half of a 69-6 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 3, 2015.

TOP SINGLE-GAME OFFENSIVE PERFORMANCES

• Georgia Tech's rushing performance against Pitt (241 yards, 5.4 yards per carry) was perhaps its most impressive of the season, as the Panthers put together the nation's No. 9-ranked rushing defense (108.9 ypg, 3.39 yards per carry) over the course of the regular season.

• The Yellow Jackets turned in one of their most impressive offensive performances in recent memory during a 38-35 win over Duke on Oct. 29. The Jackets' 605 yards of total offense were their most in the last 31 games, dating back to their 612-yard output in a 56-28 win at Pitt on Oct. 25, 2014.

• The Jackets were especially impressive through the air against Duke, as their 264 passing yards were their most in the last 38 games, dating back to the 2014 season opener versus Wofford (282). Tech's 264 passing yards against Duke were also its most against an FBS opponent in nine seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson**. The last time Tech threw for more yardage against an FBS foe came on Oct. 6, 2007, when it had 309 passing yards in a 28-26 loss at Maryland.

• Despite suffering a 48-20 defeat at No. 18 North Carolina on Nov. 5, Georgia Tech rushed for a season-high 374 yards against the Tar Heels.

• In their 30-20 victory at No. 18/22 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, the Yellow Jackets racked up 309 rushing yards, 343 total yards and 5.3 yards per play against a Hokies defense that allowed only 148.5 rushing yards per game during the regular season.

QUARTERBACKS

• One of the nation's most exciting and versatile quarterbacks, fifth-year senior **Justin Thomas** is in his third year as Georgia Tech's starting signal-caller.

• Dating back to the beginning of his sophomore campaign in 2014, Thomas has started 37 of the Georgia Tech's last 38 games under center. He made 35-consecutive starts from the beginning of the 2014 season through Nov. 5 at North Carolina but the streak was snapped when he sat out of Georgia Tech's 30-20 victory at No. 18 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12 due to an upper-body injury sustained in the second half at UNC.

• With a 50-yard pass to **Brad Stewart** on the third play of the Jackets' 38-35 win over Duke on Oct. 29, Thomas became the 39th player in NCAA Division I FBS history and fourth player in ACC history with 4,000 passing yards and 2,000 rushing yards in a career.

• Thomas turned in one of the best individual performances in Georgia Tech history with 459 yards of total offense and four touchdowns accounted for in the Yellow Jackets' come-from-behind 38-35 victory over Duke on Oct. 29.

• Thomas' 459 yards of total offense versus Duke were a career high, surpassing the 353 that he amassed in his first-career start versus Wofford on Aug. 30, 2014, and the most by a Yellow Jacket since George Godsey had a school-record 477 yards in a 39-38 loss to Virginia on Nov. 10, 2001.

• The 459 yards of total offense were good for the third-highest single-game total by an individual in Georgia Tech history (477 - Godsey; 474 - Joe Hamilton vs. Maryland, Sept. 30, 1999).

• Thomas finished with 264 passing yards and 195 rushing yards against Duke, marking the first time that he had 100-plus passing yards and 100-plus rushing yards in the same game in 20 contests, dating back to his 121 passing yards and 125 rushing yards in Georgia Tech's 49-34 win over Mississippi State in the 2014 Orange Bowl (Dec. 31, 2014).

• Thomas' 264 passing yards against Duke were good for the second-highest total of his career and his most since he threw for 282 yards in the first start of his career versus Wofford on Aug. 30, 2014.

• Thomas' 195 rushing yards against Duke were a career high (prev.: 165 at Virginia Tech, Sept. 20, 2014), good for a tie for 15th in Georgia Tech single-game history and just four shy of the single-game school record for a quarterback, held by Eddie Prokop, who ran for 199 yards versus Tulsa in the 1944 Sugar Bowl.

• Thomas' 276.97 quarterback efficiency against Duke was a career high (prev.: 275.25 vs. Wofford - Aug. 30, 2014) and the third-highest in school history (312.80 - Tevin Washington, Sept. 1, 2011 vs. Western Carolina; 289.80 - Joshua Nesbitt, Nov. 14, 2009 at Duke).

• According to the ACC and *sports-reference.com*, Thomas is only the fourth FBS player since 2000 with at least 190 rushing yards, 250 passing yards, two rushing touchdowns and two passing touchdowns in a game, joining Indiana's Antwaan Randle El (Oct. 21, 2000 vs. Minnesota), Michigan's Denard Robinson (Oct. 2, 2010 vs. Indiana) and Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel (Jan. 4, 2013 vs. Oklahoma).

• In recognition of his performance against Duke, Thomas was named the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, the ACC Offensive Back of the Week and a member of the Davey O'Brien Award's "Great 8" list and the Manning Award's Stars of the Week.

• The National Player of the Week award was the first of Thomas' career while the ACC Player of the Week honor was his second. He was also named ACC Offensive Back of the Week following Georgia Tech's 27-24 win at Virginia Tech on Sept. 20, 2014.

• Prior to his incredible showing against Duke, Thomas' best all-around performance of the season came in the Yellow Jackets' previous game against Georgia Southern (Oct. 15). His 250 yards of total offense (172 passing, 78 rushing), three touchdowns responsible for (two rushing, one passing), 172 passing yards, 224.98 pass-efficiency rating and two rushing touchdowns were all season highs prior to the otherworldly performance against Duke.

• In the four games prior to sustaining the injury that kept him out of action against Virginia Tech, Thomas put together pass-efficiency ratings of 212.20 at Pittsburgh (7-of-10, 130 yards, 1 TD, 0 INT - good for the highest passer rating of his career against a Power Five opponent at the time), 224.98 against Georgia Southern (7-of-11, 172 yards, 1 TD, 0 INT - a season high and the fourth-highest of his career at the time), 276.97 against Duke (career high, third-highest in program history) and 215.51 (4-of-9, 144 yards, TD) at North Carolina.

• In addition to piling up the gaudy numbers, Thomas led Georgia Tech to scores on six of its 11 offensive possessions against Duke (not including a final drive when the Jackets ran out the clock to seal the victory). He engineered a six-play, 86-yard drive late in the fourth quarter that culminated with him throwing the game-winning 21-yard touchdown pass to **Clinton Lynch** with 5:38 to go in the ballgame.

• The superb showing against Duke was one of three times this season that Thomas engineered a fourth-quarter comeback that led Georgia Tech to victory.

• Two of the Thomas-led fourth-quarter comebacks — in the season opener versus Boston College (Sept. 3) and the regular-season finale at Georgia (Nov. 26) — culminated with Georgia Tech scoring the winning points in the final minute of the game.

• In 37 career starts, Thomas has engineered four drives that have resulted in Georgia Tech scoring the game's tying or winning points in the final minute of regulation.

JUSTIN THOMAS — LATE-GAME HEROICS

Sept. 13, 2014 vs. Georgia Southern

Georgia Tech trailed 38-35 when it took over with 4:12 to go at its own 28 yard line. Thomas led the Yellow Jackets on an 11-play, 72-yard drive that culminated with a 13-yard touchdown pass to Deon Hill with 23 seconds remaining that lifted Tech to a 42-38 win.

Nov. 29, 2014 at Georgia

Georgia Tech trailed 24-21 when it took over on its own 43 yard line with 13 seconds to go. Thomas ran 21 yards to the UGA 36 yard line on the first play of the series to set up Harrison Butker's 53-yard field goal as time expired in regulation. GT went on to win, 30-24, in overtime.

Sept. 3, 2016 vs. Boston College

Georgia Tech trailed 14-10 when it took over on its own 41 yard line with 3:33 to go. Thomas led the Yellow Jackets on an 11-play, 59-yard drive that included a 22-yard pass on fourth-and-19 and a 26-yard pass on third-and-10. The drive culminated with a four-yard touchdown run by Dedrick Mills with 35 seconds remaining that lifted Tech to a 17-14 win.

Nov. 26, 2016 at Georgia

Georgia Tech trailed 27-14 midway through the fourth quarter (Thomas led a 94-yard touchdown drive that cut the deficit to 27-21) and needed another touchdown when it took over on the UGA 46 yard line with 3:33 to go. Thomas led the Yellow Jackets on an eight-play, 46-yard drive that was capped by Qua Searcy's six-yard touchdown run with 30 seconds to go that lifted the Jackets to a 28-27 triumph.

• One of the nation's most prolific big-game quarterbacks, Thomas owns four wins in his career against ranked teams with victories over No. 19 Clemson, No. 9 Georgia and No. 7 Mississippi State (Orange Bowl) in 2014 and No. 9 Florida State in 2015. He's 4-6 overall against ranked teams and 3-4 versus top-10 opponents.

• In addition to the success that he has enjoyed on the field, Thomas also achieved great success in the classroom as one of five Yellow Jackets that earned a bachelor's degree prior to this season. Thomas graduated last spring with a B.S. in business administration and took six hours of electives last semester while finishing out his collegiate career on the gridiron.

• Making his first-career start in place of the injured Thomas on Nov. 12 at No. 18 Virginia Tech, sophomore **Matthew Jordan** led Georgia Tech to scores in 6-of-13 possessions (not including a kneel-down on the final play of the game) and an impressive 30-20 win over the 18th-ranked Hokies.

• Jordan ran for 121 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries in the win at Virginia Tech (all career highs — prev.: 72 yds. vs. Tulane, Sept. 12, 2015; 28 carries at Miami, Nov. 21, 2015; 2 TD vs. Mercer, Sept. 10, 2016).

• Jordan only completed 2-of-7 passes for 34 yards against VT but both completions (a 10-yarder to **Brad Stewart** in the first quarter and a 24-yarder to **Ricky Jeune** in the third quarter) came on third down and helped extend Georgia Tech scoring drives.

• Despite only seeing limited action prior to his first-career start, Jordan has rushed for eight touchdowns in just 13 career games.

• Jordan is tied for 14th in the ACC with six rushing touchdowns this season.

OFFENSE

RUNNING BACKS

• A threat to go the distance every time he touches the ball, sophomore A-back **Clinton Lynch** has been Georgia Tech's most prolific threat at running back this season. He leads the Yellow Jackets in all-purpose yards (882) and receiving yards (490), ranks second on the team in touchdowns (8) and is the team's fourth-leading rusher (392 yards).

• Lynch's 882 all-purpose yards have come on just 51 touches (35 carries, 16 receptions), good for a spectacular 17.3 yards per touch. He is averaging 11.2 yards per rush and 30.6 yards per reception, both team highs (min. three rushes/receptions).

• Lynch leads the ACC in both yards per rush (11.2) and yards of total offense per play (11.2).

• Sixteen of Lynch's 51 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (seven rushes, nine receptions — 31.4 percent) and seven of his 51 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (two rushes, five receptions — 11.5 percent).

• Six of Lynch's eight touchdowns have covered 40 yards or more.

• On Nov. 5 at North Carolina, Lynch hauled in an 83-yard touchdown reception from **Justin Thomas** in the first quarter, which was Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since a 95-yard touchdown run by Orwin Smith vs. Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011.

• Lynch's 83-yard touchdown reception at UNC was the sixth-longest pass play in Georgia Tech history and the longest by a Yellow Jacket since Embry Riddle's 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.

• Lynch had his best game as a receiver on Oct. 29 against Duke, when he had three receptions for 90 yards and two touchdowns. The 90 receiving yards were a career high for the sophomore (prev.: 87 vs. Vanderbilt on Sept. 17) while the three receptions and two touchdown catches were season highs and matched career highs.

• His two TD receptions against Duke included a 46-yard catch-and-run that gave Georgia Tech a 21-7 lead in the second quarter and a spectacular grab in traffic for a 21-yard touchdown with 5:38 to go in the ballgame that proved to be the game-winning score in the Yellow Jackets' 38-35 victory.

• Lynch's best overall performance of the season came in an other-worldly 32.8 yards per touch over five touches — two receptions for 87 yards (43.5 avg.) and three rushes for 77 yards (25.7 avg.) — in the Yellow Jackets' 38-7 win over Vanderbilt on Sept. 17.

• Lynch's two receptions against Vanderbilt went for 10 and 77 yards while his three carries covered 19, 29 and 29 yards. His 87 receiving yards were then a career high (prev.:

69 at Virginia, Oct. 31, 2015) and his 77 rushing yards remain just one yard shy of his career high (78 vs. Georgia, Nov. 28, 2015).

• Lynch averaged 40.5 yards per touch against Georgia Southern on Oct. 15 with two catches for 81 yards. His two receptions against Georgia Southern covered 65 yards (TD) and 16 yards.

• B-back **Dedrick Mills** is one of the nation's top freshman running backs. He earned honorable-mention freshman all-America status from *Campus Insiders*.

• Despite missing four games (Sept. 10 vs. Mercer - suspended; Oct. 29 vs. Duke - injured; Nov. 12 vs. Virginia Tech - suspended; Nov. 19 vs. Virginia - suspended), Mills leads all active Yellow Jackets with 602 rushing yards and 11 rushing touchdowns in just eight contests.

• Mills also leads the squad with 12 total touchdowns (11 rushing, one receiving).

• Although he played at least four fewer games than his nearest competitors, Mills' 11 rushing touchdowns rank fourth nationally among freshmen.

• Mills' 11 rushing touchdowns are tied for sixth overall in the ACC and 49th among all players nationally.

• Due to the fact that he does not meet the minimum threshold of playing in 75 percent of his team's games, Mills does not officially rank among the nation's freshman leaders in scoring and rushing. However, if he did qualify, Mills would rank second among all freshmen nationally in scoring at 9.0 points per game (leader: Western Michigan PK Butch Hampton - 9.5 ppg) and rank sixth among the nation's freshmen with 75.2 rushing yards per game (leader: Missouri's Damarea Crockett - 96.5 ypg).

• Mills became the first true freshman to start a season opener for Georgia Tech since wide receiver Tyler Melton in 2008 when he started the Sept. 3 opener against Boston College.

• Mills did not disappoint in his debut, rushing for a team-best 68 yards on 18 carries and, most importantly, scoring the game-winning touchdown from four yards out with 35 seconds to go in the ballgame.

• After sitting out of the home opener versus Mercer, Mills returned to score on runs of 15, four and five yards against Vanderbilt, becoming the first true freshman to score three touchdowns in a game in **Paul Johnson's** nine seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach.

• Prior to Mills' three-touchdown performance versus Vanderbilt, the last true freshman to score three touchdowns in a game for Georgia Tech was Johnathan Dwyer, who ran for three scores against Samford on Sept. 8, 2007 (Lynch scored three touchdowns — two receiving, one rushing — as a redshirt freshman on Oct. 31 of last season at Virginia).

• In recognition of his three-touchdown game versus Vanderbilt, Mills was named the ACC co-Rookie of the Week.

• Mills was a bright spot in the Yellow Jackets' loss to No. 5/3 Clemson on Sept. 22, rushing for a then-career-high 75 yards and his fifth touchdown of the season, a two-yarder that brought Georgia Tech within two scores early in the fourth quarter.

• Mills earned his second ACC Rookie of the Week award in three games when he received the honor after running for a then-career-high 99 yards on 19 carries (5.2 avg.), amassing 108 all-purpose yards and scoring three touchdowns (two rushing, one receiving) against No. 14 Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 1.

• Mills became the first Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Rookie of the Week multiple times since WR Calvin Johnson earned the accolades four times as a freshman in 2004.

• Mills recorded the first 100-yard rushing game of his career with 132 yards on just 19 carries (6.9 avg.) at No. 18 North Carolina (Nov. 5).

• A-back **Qua Searcy** has been one of Georgia Tech's most valuable offensive players, with 271 rushing yards on 41 carries (6.6 avg.) and 147 yards on nine receptions (16.3 avg.).

• Searcy joins Lynch as the only Yellow Jackets with at least 100 rushing yards and 100 receiving yards this season.

• Searcy's bookended the regular season with the biggest performances of his career.

• In the Sept. 3 season opener against Boston College, Searcy caught three passes for 60 yards, both career highs. In fact, coming into the season, the third-year sophomore owned just three receptions for 45 yards in his collegiate career.

• Searcy played an integral role in both of Georgia Tech's touchdown drives in the 17-14 win over BC. On the Yellow Jackets' first offensive series, he caught a 31-yard pass on third-and-12 that set up the Jackets' first score of the day. Trailing 14-10 and facing fourth-and-19 with less than three minutes remaining in the ballgame, Searcy hauled in a 22-yard reception to extend a drive that was capped by Mills' game-winning four-yard touchdown run with 35 seconds to go.

• Searcy became a permanent part of Georgia Tech lore when he scored the game-winning touchdown on a six-yard run with 30 seconds to go in the Yellow Jackets' 28-27 win at archrival Georgia on Nov. 26.

• Searcy also hauled in a 39-yard reception — the longest of his career — during a 94-yard scoring drive that cut the Yellow Jackets' 27-14 deficit to 27-21 midway through the fourth quarter.

OFFENSE

- In all, Searcy had 79 yards on eight touches in the win over Georgia.
- Searcy had his most impressive performance as a runner against Mercer on Sept. 10, rushing for a career-best 91 yards on just seven carries (13.0 avg.) in the Yellow Jackets' 35-10 win. Going into the game, he had only 72 rushing yards in his career.
- Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer are the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.
- Searcy recorded the longest play of his career with a 60-yard touchdown run against Virginia on Nov. 19 that extended Georgia Tech's lead to 21-10 late in the third quarter. Searcy's previous long play was a 36-yard reception versus Boston College on Sept. 3 and his previous long run was 31 yards, which he achieved twice (most recently vs. Mercer on Sept. 10).
- A-back **J.J. Green** started nine of the 10 games he played this season, his first as a Yellow Jacket. Green sat out last season due to NCAA transfer regulations after transferring to Tech from Georgia.
- Green's best performances in his first season at Tech came in ACC games versus Miami (Oct. 1) and Pitt (Oct. 8).
- Green rushed for a career-high 40 yards on just five carries (8.0 avg.) against Miami and his former head coach Mark Richt, who he played under at Georgia in 2013 and 2014.
- On Oct. 8 at Pitt, Green scored his first two touchdowns as a Yellow Jacket on a 96-yard kickoff return in the second quarter and a 10-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- Green's 96-yard kickoff return at Pitt was Georgia Tech's first kick return for a touchdown since Jamal Golden's 100-yarder at North Carolina on Nov. 10, 2012 and was the eighth-longest kickoff return in school history.
- Green missed the two games (Nov. 5 at North Carolina, Nov. 12 at Virginia Tech) due to a lower-body injury sustained versus Duke on Oct. 29.
- In a testament to the Yellow Jackets' depth at the position, 11 different running backs have already toted the ball for Georgia Tech in 2016 (Mills, Lynch, Searcy, Green, BB Marcus Marshall, AB Lynn Griffin, AB **Isiah Willis**, AB **Austin McClellan**, BB **Marcus Allen**, AB **Nathan Cottrell** and BB **Quaide Weimerskirch**).
- Georgia Tech's depth at running back was especially apparent in the 38-7 win over Vanderbilt on Sept. 17, when eight different backs combined for 448 all-purpose yards and all five of the Yellow Jackets' touchdowns.

- The injury bug bit Georgia Tech's corps of running backs hardest last season. In all, seven different RBs (four A-backs, three B-backs) missed games due to injury in 2015.

WIDE RECEIVER

- **Ricky Jeune**, a fourth-year junior that has started 24-straight games at wide receiver for the Yellow Jackets, led Georgia Tech with 22 receptions and ranked third on the squad with 368 receiving yards.
- Jeune has caught at least one pass in 10-of-12 games this season and had multiple receptions in 6-of-12 contests.
- Jeune has been held without a catch only three times in his 24 career starts.
- Jeune was a big part of Georgia Tech's prolific offensive showings over the second half of the season. In a six-game stretch from Oct. 8-Nov. 19, he totaled 14 catches for 247 yards and a touchdown and rushed once for 40 yards.
- Jeune hauled in three passes for 55 yards and his first touchdown of the season at Pitt (Oct. 8).
- Jeune's 31-yard touchdown reception at Pitt was the only touchdown catch by a Georgia Tech wide receiver during the regular season.
- On Oct. 15 against Georgia Southern, Jeune caught a season-high four passes for 51 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 35-24 win.
- Jeune made three catches for a season-high 85 yards against Duke on Oct. 29.
- On Nov. 5 at UNC, Jeune registered the first rush of his career when he hauled in a long lateral from quarterback **Justin Thomas** and took it 40 yards down the right sideline to set up a Georgia Tech field goal. He also caught a pass for 14 yards later in the game.
- On Nov. 12 at Virginia Tech, Jeune picked up a crucial first down with a 24-yard reception on third-and-14 from the VT 48 early in the fourth quarter. The big catch led to a field goal that extended Georgia Tech's lead to 23-7 in an eventual 30-20 win over the 18th-ranked Hokies.
- Jeune's biggest catch of this season and perhaps his career came in the season opener versus Boston College when he made a 26-yard grab on third-and-10 that extended what proved to be the Yellow Jackets' game-winning touchdown drive late in the fourth quarter.
- Jeune is joined in the starting lineup by sophomore wideout **Brad Stewart**, who has 17 receptions (third on the team) for 372 yards (third on the team, second among wideouts) this season.
- Stewart set a career high with 87 receiving yards in the regular-season finale at archrival Georgia (prev.: 70 vs. Duke, Oct. 29).
- Stewart's career-best 87 yards against UGA came on a career-long 64-yard catch in the second quarter and a pivotal 23-yard reception in the final period. The second-quarter catch led directly to the Yellow Jackets' second touchdown of the day and the 23-yard gain kickstarted a 94-yard touchdown drive and the rally from a 13-point fourth-quarter deficit in Tech's thrilling 28-27 victory.
- Stewart's 50-yard reception on the opening series of the 38-35 win over Duke was the longest by a Georgia Tech wide receiver this season.
- Stewart also hauled in receptions of 50 (Oct. 29 vs. Duke), 40 (Oct. 15 vs. Georgia Southern) and 41 yards (Nov. 5 at North Carolina) over the final six games of the season.

- Stewart's 21.9 yards per reception leads Georgia Tech wide receivers and ranks second on the team overall behind A-back **Clinton Lynch's** 30.6 yards per catch (min. three receptions).
- On Nov. 3, Stewart was named to the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District Team for District 4, which consists of all Division I programs in Alabama, Florida, Georgia and South Carolina. In addition to his exploits on the field, Stewart boasts a 3.58 cumulative grade point average in mechanical engineering.
- Between them, Jeune and Stewart have accounted for 70 of the 85 receptions, 1,353 of the 1,597 receiving yards and six of the eight touchdown catches amassed by Tech receivers since the beginning of the 2015 season.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- While injuries have taken their toll on Georgia Tech's offensive line over the course of the last two seasons, shuffling players in and out of the lineup due to various ailments has allowed the Yellow Jackets to build quality depth across the offensive front.
- In all, nine different Georgia Tech offensive linemen have starting experience, combining for a total of 105 starts and 209 career games.

- The unquestioned leader of Georgia Tech's offensive front, fifth-year senior center **Freddie Burden** was named first-team all-ACC by *ESPN.com* and claimed third-team all-conference recognition from the league's media and coaches.
- Burden was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after recording eight knockdowns and helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 289 yards and record a season-high 511 yards of total offense in a 38-7 win over Vanderbilt on Sept. 17.
- Burden sat out of the Nov. 12 game at Virginia Tech due to an upper-body injury, which snapped a string of 35-consecutive starts that dated back to the beginning of the 2014 season.
- Burden returned to the starting lineup for the final two games of the regular season and has started 37 of the last 38 games in all.
- Despite the wealth of offensive-line experience on the roster, three true freshmen have been a part of the starting lineup this season. **Parker Braun** started the last eight games of the regular season at left guard, **Jahaziel Lee** has made three of the last seven starts at left tackle (Oct. 15 vs. GS, Oct. 29 vs. Duke, Nov. 12 at Virginia Tech) and **Kenny Cooper** started at center on Nov. 12 at Virginia Tech.
- Braun established himself as one of the nation's top young linemen, which was validated by him being named to *ESPN.com's* true freshman all-America team.

OFFENSE

- Braun was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and paving the way for Tech's 309 rushing yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12.
- Braun is the only Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week.
- Fourth-year junior **Eason Fromayan** has received national recognition for his decision to forego his final season of eligibility in order to pursue a career as a NASCAR pit crew member.
- Fromayan, who started nine games for the Yellow Jackets this season (six at LT, three at RT) and graduated from Georgia Tech with a degree in business administration earlier this month, has been featured on *ESPN.com*, *NBCSports.com*, *NASCAR.com* and ESPN's *Outside The Lines*. He made a live appearance on ESPN *SportsCenter* on Friday, Dec. 23.

DEFENSE

- Despite a grueling recent schedule that saw Georgia Tech face five of the nation's top 45 scoring offenses over the final nine games, the Yellow Jackets finished the regular season ranked among the top 50 percent nationally in scoring defense (47th - 25.0 ppg) and total defense (63rd - 408.1 ypg).
- A ball-hawking defense was one of the keys to Georgia Tech's three-game winning streak to close the regular season. Over the final three games of the regular season (Nov. 12 at No. 18 Virginia Tech, Nov. 19 vs. Virginia, Nov. 26 at Georgia), Georgia Tech forced nine turnovers, including seven interceptions, and scored 34 points off turnovers. Over the first nine games of the season, the Jackets forced a total of nine turnovers, had just four interceptions and scored only 14 points off turnovers.
- Georgia Tech's defense also put more pressure on the quarterback late in the season, with a total of eight sacks in their wins over Virginia Tech (a season-high five) and Virginia (three). Over the first nine games of the season, the Yellow Jackets had a total of just eight sacks and did not record more than two in any game.
- Georgia Tech limited Georgia to 139 passing yards in the regular-season finale, which was the lowest passing total that the Yellow Jackets surrendered all season.
- The Jackets' defense turned in perhaps its finest overall performance of the season at Virginia Tech, when it limited the 18th-ranked Hokies to 437 yards and 20 points.
- Georgia Tech shut out Virginia Tech in the first half and surrendered its first points of the game on a 26-yard drive after a Yellow Jackets fumble early in the third period.
- 182 of Virginia Tech's yards and 13 of its 20 points came on its final two possessions, after Georgia Tech had jumped out to a 30-7 lead.
- Making the showing at VT even more impressive is the fact that Georgia Tech had allowed 1,195 yards and 83 points over its previous two games (559 yards in a 38-35 win over Duke on Oct. 29 and 636 yards in a 48-20 loss at North Carolina on Nov. 5).
- North Carolina's 636 yards were the second-most allowed in Georgia Tech history (second only to Notre Dame's 667 on Nov. 5, 1977). The Tar Heels' 48 points were tied for the 12th-most allowed in GT's modern history.
- Prior to its struggles against Duke and UNC, Tech limited Georgia Southern to 167 rushing yards and 3.3 yards per rush on Oct. 15, nearly 120 yards and 1.5 yards per rush less than their season averages going into the game. GS entered the contest with the nation's sixth-ranked rushing offense at 286.6 yards per game.
- Georgia Tech limited each of their first three opponents of the season to 14 points or less (Boston College - 14, Mercer - 10, Vanderbilt - 7). The last time Tech accomplished that feat came in 2001, when it surrendered seven points to Syracuse, seven points to The Citadel and seven points to Navy over the first three contests of the season.
- In its 38-7 win over Vanderbilt on Sept. 17, Georgia Tech allowed its fewest points in a game since its 69-6 win over Alcorn State in the 2015 season opener.
- Vanderbilt's seven points are the fewest that the Yellow Jackets have surrendered to a Power Five conference opponent since a 28-6 win over Clemson on Nov. 15, 2014.

- Boston College's 14 points in Georgia Tech's season-opening 17-14 victory in Dublin, Ireland are the fewest that the Yellow Jackets has allowed in an ACC game since the 28-6 win over Clemson in 2014.
- Georgia Tech did not allow more than 320 yards in any of its first three games this season. The last time that the Yellow Jackets surrendered 320 yards or less during any three-game stretch came in 2013, when they limited the first four opponents of the season to less than 320 yards — Elon (253), Duke (254), North Carolina (319) and Virginia Tech (276).
- Georgia Tech's Achilles heel on defense continues to be its third-down proficiency. The Yellow Jackets rank 126th out of 128 NCAA Division I FBS teams in third-down defense this season, with opponents converting third downs at a 50.6-percent clip (87-of-173).
- A key to the defensive success at Virginia Tech on Nov. 12 was the Jackets' ability to get off the field on third down, as they limited the Hokies to converting just 6-of-14 third-down opportunities. VT's 28.6-percent third-down conversion rate was tied for the third-lowest allowed by Georgia Tech this season (Vanderbilt: 4-of-13 - .308; Miami: 1-of-7 - .143).

DEFENSIVE LINE

- Defensive line is easily the most experienced part of Georgia Tech's defense this season as Jr. DE **KeShun Freeman**, r-Sr. DT **Patrick Gamble**, r-Sr. **Francis Kallon**, r-Sr. DE **Rod Rook-Chungong** and So. **Kyle Cerge-Henderson** have combined to make 103 career starts (36 for Freeman, 26 for Gamble, 26 for Rook-Chungong, nine for Cerge-Henderson and six for Kallon).
- Gamble, Freeman and Rook-Chungong all started all 12 games for the Yellow Jackets during the regular season while Cerge-Henderson and Kallon split 12 starts at defensive tackle.
- Georgia Tech's defensive front was a catalyst for the Yellow Jackets' stout defensive performances over the final three games of the regular season. Defensive linemen accounted for all of the Jackets' eight sacks over the final three games (2.5 for Gamble, 2.0 for Kallon, 2.0 for **Anree Saint-Amour**, 1.0 for Cerge-Henderson and 0.5 for Freeman) and 10 of the team's 12 tackles for loss (3.5 for Gamble, 2.0 for Saint-Amour, 2.0 for Kallon, 1.0 for Cerge-Henderson, 1.0 for Rook-Chungong and 0.5 for Freeman).
- Gamble leads Georgia Tech's defensive linemen with 47 total tackles this season, which includes a team-high 5.5 sacks and 8.5 tackles for loss.
- In the 44th game of his career, the fifth-year senior set a career high with 11 tackles in the regular-season finale at Georgia.
- Gamble was the only Georgia Tech defensive player to receive all-ACC recognition, as he was an honorable-mention selection by the league's media.
- Despite not being in the starting lineup, reserve defensive end **Antonio Simmons**, a junior, ranks second on the team with five tackles for loss and leads the squad with 12 quarterback hurries.
- Like Simmons, Saint-Amour has proven to be a dominant force coming off the bench, as he ranks second on the team with four sacks and is tied for fourth on the squad with four tackles for loss despite limited playing time.

DEFENSE

• On Sept. 15, Freeman received one of college football's highest honors when he was one of 25 football student-athletes across the nation named to the 2016 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. For more information, see p. 21.

LINEBACKERS

• Senior outside linebacker **P.J. Davis** ranks fourth among all active ACC players and is 19th among active NCAA Division I FBS players with 307 career tackles.

• Davis led Georgia Tech in tackles each of the last two seasons (119 in 2014, 77 in 2015) and picked up right where he left off last year with a team-best 34 stops through the first five-plus games this season.

• However, Davis, who missed much of the better part of three contests due to a lower-body injury sustained early in the Yellow Jackets' loss at Pitt on Oct. 8, returned to the lineup on Nov. 5 at North Carolina and has led the team in tackles with 36 over the last four games.

• Playing his best football of the season, Davis matched a career-high with 14 tackles in the home finale versus Virginia (Nov. 19) and followed that up with 12 stops in the regular-season finale at Georgia (Nov. 26).

• Despite missing nearly three full games, Davis ranks second on the team with 70 total tackles this season, trailing only **Corey Griffin** (79).

• Like Davis, middle linebacker **Brant Mitchell**, also played his best football of the season down the stretch with 30 tackles and two interceptions over the final three games of the regular season.

• Mitchell's 10 stops at Virginia Tech on Nov. 12 were a career best for seven days, until he topped the short-lived mark with 12 tackles against Virginia on Nov. 19.

• Mitchell was named the ACC Linebacker of the Week for the first time in his career following the performance versus UVA. In addition to his career-high 12 tackles, Mitchell also had one of the Yellow Jackets' three interceptions in the 31-17 triumph.

• One week later at UGA, Mitchell intercepted Georgia's Hail Mary attempt on the final play of the game to seal the Yellow Jackets' 28-27 win over the Bulldogs.

• Mitchell turned in one of the finest performances of his young career on Oct. 8 at Pittsburgh. In addition to his four tackles, Mitchell had a key pass breakup that forced a Pitt punt late in the second quarter and recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter that led to the Yellow Jackets scoring a go-ahead touchdown with less than six minutes to play.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

• While Georgia Tech's front seven is ultra-experienced with five returning starters, the secondary has four new starters in 2016.

• Georgia Tech's starting four in the secondary (r-Jr. SS **Corey Griffin**, So. FS **A.J. Gray**, Jr. CB **Lance Austin** and Jr. CB **Step Durham**) combined for just three career starts between them prior to this season (Griffin - 2, Durham - 1).

• Griffin led the team with 79 tackles during the regular season. His 59 solo stops were 11 more than any other Yellow Jacket compiled during the regular season.

• Griffin notched a career-high 12 tackles at North Carolina on Nov. 5.

• Griffin turned in the finest all-around performance of his career on Oct. 15 against Georgia Southern with a then-career-high 10 tackles, including three tackles for loss and a sack, which both remain career highs.

• Prior to his career day against Georgia Southern, Griffin had not made a stop behind the line of scrimmage in his career.

• Griffin recorded a then-career-high nine stops against No. 5/3 Clemson on Sept. 22.

• Griffin had what was at the time a career day in the season opener against Boston College, matching a then-career high with six tackles (five solo) and recording the second interception of his career, which thwarted a BC scoring opportunity and set up Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the game.

• Gray also had a career day attacking Georgia Southern's option offense on Oct. 15, finishing with seven tackles and a career-high three tackles for loss from his free safety position.

• For the season, Gray ranks fourth on the team with 64 tackles, including 47 over the last seven games of the regular season (six at Pittsburgh, seven vs. Georgia Southern, nine vs. Duke, nine at North Carolina, five at Virginia Tech, five vs. Virginia and six at Georgia).

• Lance Austin is the two-time-defending ACC Defensive Back of the Week.

• Lance Austin earned the first of his two awards after breaking up three passes and intercepted another that he returned 24 yards for the game-clinching touchdown in the fourth quarter of a win 31-17 over Virginia on Nov. 19.

• The 24-yard interception return versus Virginia was Georgia Tech's only defensive touchdown of the regular season.

• In the regular-season finale at Georgia, Lance Austin picked off a deflected pass with 3:39 remaining in the game to set up Georgia Tech's game-winning touchdown drive in a 28-27 victory.

• Lance Austin's three pass breakups against UVA were the most by a Georgia Tech player this season. In fact, only two other Yellow Jackets have as many as three PBUs all season (Durham - 5, **Lamont Simmons** - 3).

• Lance Austin led the ACC with 15 passes defended, tied for the conference lead with 12 pass breakups and was tied for fifth in the league with three interceptions during the regular season.

• In addition to his prowess in pass coverage, Lance Austin recorded a career-high 10 tackles from his cornerback position on Oct. 8 at Pittsburgh.

• While Georgia Tech did not return any starters from last year's base secondary, Lance Austin's twin brother, junior **Lawrence Austin**, made six starts as Georgia Tech's nickel back in 2015 and has been in the starting lineup for each of the last nine games.

• Lawrence Austin turned in one of the finest performances by an ACC defender this season when he accounted for three of the Yellow Jackets' four takeaways with two interceptions and a forced fumble (which was recovered by his brother, Lance) in Georgia Tech's 30-20 triumph over No. 18/22 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12.

• With his two INTs at VT, Lawrence Austin became the first Georgia Tech player with multiple interceptions in a game since Jemea Thomas had two in a 31-17 win at No. 6 Clemson on Oct. 29, 2011.

• In his first start of the year, Lawrence Austin registered a career-high 12 tackles (tied for the second-most by a Yellow Jacket this season) against No. 5/3 Clemson on Sept. 22.

• Lance and Lawrence Austin combined to win the last three ACC Defensive Back of the Week awards of the season. Lawrence garnered the honor following his three-takeaway day at Virginia Tech on Nov. 12 and Lance earning the last two awards in recognition of his crucial interceptions against Virginia (Nov. 19) and Georgia (Nov. 26).

• Both of Georgia Tech's starting cornerbacks (Chris Milton and D.J. White) and both of the Yellow Jackets' starting safeties (Jamal Golden and Demond Smith) from a season ago graduated and three of the four spent training camp on NFL rosters (Golden* - New Orleans Saints; Milton* - Indianapolis Colts; White^ - Kansas City Chiefs). White remains a member of the Chiefs' regular-season roster, while Milton was signed by the Colts to the active roster on Nov. 19, 2016.

- Butker is 54-for-56 on place kicks this season (11-for-13 on field goals, 43-for-43 on extra points). He made his first 27 kicks of the year before missing a 32-yard field goal against Georgia Southern on Oct. 15.
- Butker matched a career high by making 3-of-3 field goals at No. 18/22 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, marking the third time in his career that he booted three field goals in a game and the first since he also went 3-for-3 in last season's "Miracle on Techwood Drive" win over No. 9 Florida State (Oct. 24).
- Butker has also been an incredible weapon for the Yellow Jackets on kickoffs this season, as 47 of his 64 traditional kickoffs have gone for touchbacks (a post-safety kick from GT's 20 yard line vs. Clemson and a pooch kick at the end of the first half at Pitt notwithstanding).
- Of Butker's 17 kickoffs that have been returned, only five have been brought out past the 25 yard line and none have been returned past the 38 yard line.
- For the season, Butker ranks second in the ACC and 19th nationally in field-goal percentage (11-for-13, .846).
- Senior punter **Ryan Rodwell** was one of the ACC's top punters down the stretch, averaging 48.2 yards per punt with seven boots of 50 yards or more and eight downed inside the 20 yard line over the final eight games of the regular season.
- Rodwell has been especially impressive during the Yellow Jackets' current three-game winning streak. Four of his six punts were downed inside the 20 yard line at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12), he averaged 52.2 yards over five punts with three of 50-plus yards, including a 65-yarder (all career bests) vs. Virginia (Nov. 19) and averaged 51.7 yards over three punts with two 50-plus yarders at Georgia (Nov. 26).
- For the season, Rodwell ranks third in the ACC and 25th nationally with a 43.4-yard punting average.

- Georgia Tech has blocked three field goals this season (**Rod Rook-Chungong** on Sept. 3 vs. Boston College, **Kyle Cerge-Henderson** on Sept. 10 vs. Mercer and a team block on Nov. 12 at Virginia Tech).

- Georgia Tech's three blocked kicks are tied for 21st nationally this season. The Yellow Jackets are one of only 40 NCAA Division I FBS teams that has blocked at least three kicks in 2016.

- Georgia Tech's 17 blocked kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season are the fourth-most by an FBS team during that span.

- The Yellow Jackets had the tables turned on them at North Carolina on Nov. 5 when the Tar Heels blocked a 32-yard field-goal attempt late in the first half. It was the first field-goal blocked by a Georgia Tech opponent since Pittsburgh accomplished the feat on Oct. 17, 2015.
- On Oct. 8 at Pitt, junior **J.J. Green** returned a kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown. It was Georgia Tech's first kickoff return for a touchdown since Jamal Golden's 100-yarder versus North Carolina on Nov. 10, 2012 and the eighth-longest kick return in program history.
