KENTUCKY TRAVELS TO INDIANA FOR MIDWEEK

After becoming just the third team in the country to take a game off of the now-No. 1 Florida Gators this season, the Kentucky softball team will embark on a four-game, five-day road trip west to Indiana and Missouri on Wednesday afternoon, beginning with a midweek game at Indiana at 6 p.m. ET from Bloomington.

The Wildcats win on Saturday clinched postseason eligibility for the ninth-straight season, as UK is guaranteed to finish the 2017 season with a .500 or above record. Kentucky has two wins over top-5 teams this season, and already has racked up eight wins against the top-25. In Monday's NCAA RPI release, Kentucky crept up five spots to No. 16, putting themselves in the hosting conversation for possible regionals come Selection Sunday.

Kentucky has won the last three meetings with Indiana in the last three seasons, with Meagan Prince coming just two outs away from a perfect game last season at John Cropp Stadium before the Hoosiers got a double and a single in back-to-back batters to score a run and break up the perfect game in UK's 2-1 win. Indiana's last win vs. UK came in 16-13 fashion in Rachel Lawson's first year as Kentucky's head coach back in 2007.

Indiana is sitting at 19-24 overall with a 5-9 record inside the Big Ten. Michelle Gardner is in her ninth season in Bloomington and is 172-258-1 in her time there.

* Rachel Lawson is in her tenth season at the helm of the UK softball program and already ranks as the winningest head coach in school history. She was named SEC Coach of the Year in 2016 for the first time in her career.

* UK has played 16 of its last 19 games against teams in the top 25.

* UK's loss to Georgia on Sunday, March 19 snapped a school-record 14-game winning streak.

* Kentucky has eight wins over top-25 teams, including vs. #3 Florida, at #5 UCLA, vs. #15 Michigan, at #16 Georgia, at #24 Ole Miss and three wins against #22 Arkansas..

Rethlake's Improvement

One of the key's to Kentucky's season is no doubt Erin Rethlake, both at the plate and in the circle. In week two of the season, she became a slapper - for the first time in her softball career - she is hitting .302 with 32 hits and 11 RBI. In the circle, she is second on UK with a 1.66 ERA and a 6-2 record. Last year, Rethlake had the highest ERA on UK's pitching staff and was the worst statistical hitter than met UK's batting minimums. Rethlake pitched UK's games on Friday & Sunday against Florida and in 12.1 innings, gave up three runs.

Scouting Indiana

Coming off a 2-1 series loss to nationally-ranked Ohio State, the Indiana Hoosiers enter this week's midweek affair with an overall record of 19-24 and 5-9 within the Big Ten. IU has lost eight of their last 10 games, having played six of those games against top-10 Minnesota, and No. 21 Ohio State, with both series coming on the road. The Hoosiers are 6-3 in their nine home games this season at Andy Mohr Field with Wednesday's game coming as the fourth-straight home contest for the Hoosiers. IU is led offensively by Rebecca Blitz, who is hitting .331 on the season with 42 hits and 10 RBI. Indiana has four players hitting above .300 on the season, with power hitter CaraMia Tsigirigos hitting .318 with 10 homers and 30 RBI. In the circle, the Hoosiers' Tara Trainer has the lowest ERA with a 3.23 and a 10-13 record on the season. Like Kentucky, IU has four pitchers they can use.

Series History vs. Indiana

Wednesday's meeting will be the 20th all-time meeting between UK and IU in softball, with Kentucky holding an 11-8 lead in the overall count. The team's last meeting came in 2016, when Meagan Prince was two outs away from pitching a perfect game in the seventh inning, before the Hoosiers broke it up at John Cropp Stadium in UK's home opener. Kentucky ended up winning, 2-1. Kentucky has won the last two meetings in the series. IU's last win over UK came April 1, 2008 in Rachel Lawson's first year as a head coach, in a 16-13 barnburner.

Good Spot in the RPI

The Wildcats checked in at No. 16 in the NCAA's week four release of the RPI (April 17). Kentucky has the No. 24 strength of non-conference schedule in the nation and has nine wins against the RPI top 20. The SEC is the No. 1 RPI conference with nine of the top 25 teams in the country.

Rachel Lawson Elected to Serve on NCAA Softball Rules Committee

Head coach Rachel Lawson is serving her second season on the NCAA Rules Committee. She is focusing on the pace of play and duration of games as her main point of emphasis during her term.

Winning Big Games

With Kentucky's win against No. 3 Florida, the Wildcats have now won two games against teams inside the top-five (UCLA). Last season, UK won five games against teams inside the top five before the postseason, including a sweep of No. 8 LSU on the road in Baton Rouge. This is the fifth-straight season under Rachel Lawson in which UK has two or more top-5 wins.

SEC Sweeps

With Kentucky's sweep of No. 22 Arkansas, the Wildcats have swept three of the last nine SEC series they have played, and four of the last 11. These totals date back to 2016.

Home Sweet Home

Kentucky is 9-5 this season at John Cropp Stadium, with five wins over top-20 teams and three shutouts. The Wildcats won their first eight home games of the year before being swept by Tennessee.

Battle of the Bluegrass Victors

UK won its third-straight over in-state rival Louisville, 10-1 (6) for the Battle of the Bluegrass. The Wildcats' 10 runs scored were the second-highest offensive output of the season, just two runs shy of the season high vs. Memphis back in February down in Boca Raton, Fla., at FAU.

Grand Slam Central

Junior catcher Rachael Metzger hit her first-career grand slam on Sunday against Memphis, in the top of the second inning to put UK up, 4-0. It was her second home run of the season and fourth-career long bomb after not hitting one her sophomore season.

A week later in Carbondale - Abbey Cheek belted a go-ahead homer against Illinois-Chicago in a 2-2 game in the bottom of the fifth inning. UK ended up winning 6-2, with her grand slam making the difference.

Stealing All The Bases

UK has stolen 69 bases this season through the opening 11 weeks of 2017. Last season through 10 weeks the Wildcats successfully stole just 48 bases, 21 less than this season. The Wildcats rank 34th nationally in stolen bases per game, and Erin Rethlake ranks 64th individually - as she is 17-for-18 this season and that ranks third in the SEC.

Holding Onto Leads

The Wildcats are 19-0 this season when leading after four innings and 20-1 when leading through five innings this season. The Wildcats have scored first in 21 of their 40 games and UK is 19-2 of those games (UCLA - game 1, UGA - game 2 are the only two losses).

Schaper's HR in Westwood

Jenny Schaper hit a towering HR to deep center at Easton Stadium on Wednesday, Feb. 17 to give UK a win at No. 5 UCLA, 2-1 in extra innings. Meagan Prince pitched the entire game, throwing 162 pitches - a new career high by over 40 pitches - to give Kentucky its fourth win of the season.

Kelsey Nunley Honored as First Team NFCA All-American

Kentucky softball's Kelsey Nunley made more program history on Wednesday afternoon, becoming the first player in UK history to be named a National Fastpitch Coaches' Association First Team All-American.

Nunley, who was crowned the 2016 Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Year, joins current assistant coach Molly Johnson-Belcher as the two All-Americans in Kentucky's program,

with Johnson-Belcher earning second team honors in 2009.

Nunley joins five other pitchers on the NFCA First Team, including Delanie Gourney (Florida), Megan Good (James Madison), Paige Parker (Oklahoma), Aleshia Ocasio (Florida) and Jailyn Ford (James Madison). Nunley and Ocasio were at-large selections for the first team pitcher spot.

The senior from Soddy Daisy, Tenn., pitched a fantastic senior season for Kentucky, ending the year with a 21-6 overall record and a program single-season best 1.26 ERA in her 37 appearances in the circle for the Blue and White. Nunley started 23 games for UK, throwing 13 complete games and seven shutouts.

With her 181.1 innings pitched, Nunley overtook the NCAA active pitchers career innings lead, as she ended her career with a whopping 943.1 innings thrown in her four years in Lexington. She started 117 games in her four-year career with 21 shutouts and 86 complete games for the Wildcats.

So, we have to figure out how are we going to get as many innings out of our pitching staff as we can to try and help with replacing all of the innings that we will need to replace Kelsey Nunley. I feel very good about the staff that we have put together. It is going to have a different look, but we are very versatile. It's a lot of different people doing what Kelsey Nunley could do by herself. She was a workhorse, she was very big and she was very strong, but there are more than one ways to get things done. Luckily, we have Meagan Prince coming back. She is going to be the anchor of this team. Meagan is great because she was a 20-game winner last night, but she is a great starter – and she is also a great closer and has a great closing mentality, so you could see her in two different roles. Shannon Smith is somebody who is a returner along with Erin Rethlake. Erin had surgery this offseason, but she's improving everyday and she has experience, so she is someone we really will lean on during the course of the season for this staff. She looks great – she's full go. She is on a little bit of a pitch count, but in the innings that she has pitched, she's looked incredibly strong. We've added to the pitching staff. We have three freshman who have come in. One freshman who has really been impressive as of late on the mound is Larissa Spellman –

she is from New Jersey – and she is not very large in stature – but she throws the ball incredibly hard and one thing that I have been really impressed with her is that she's really figuring out her own body. She is figuring out her mechanics and she is increasing the command of her pitching everyday and her mindset. 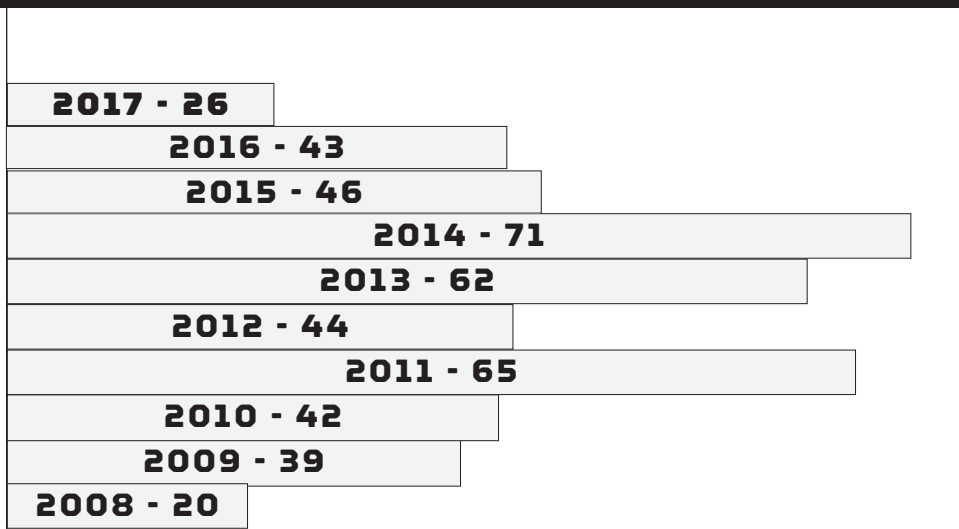

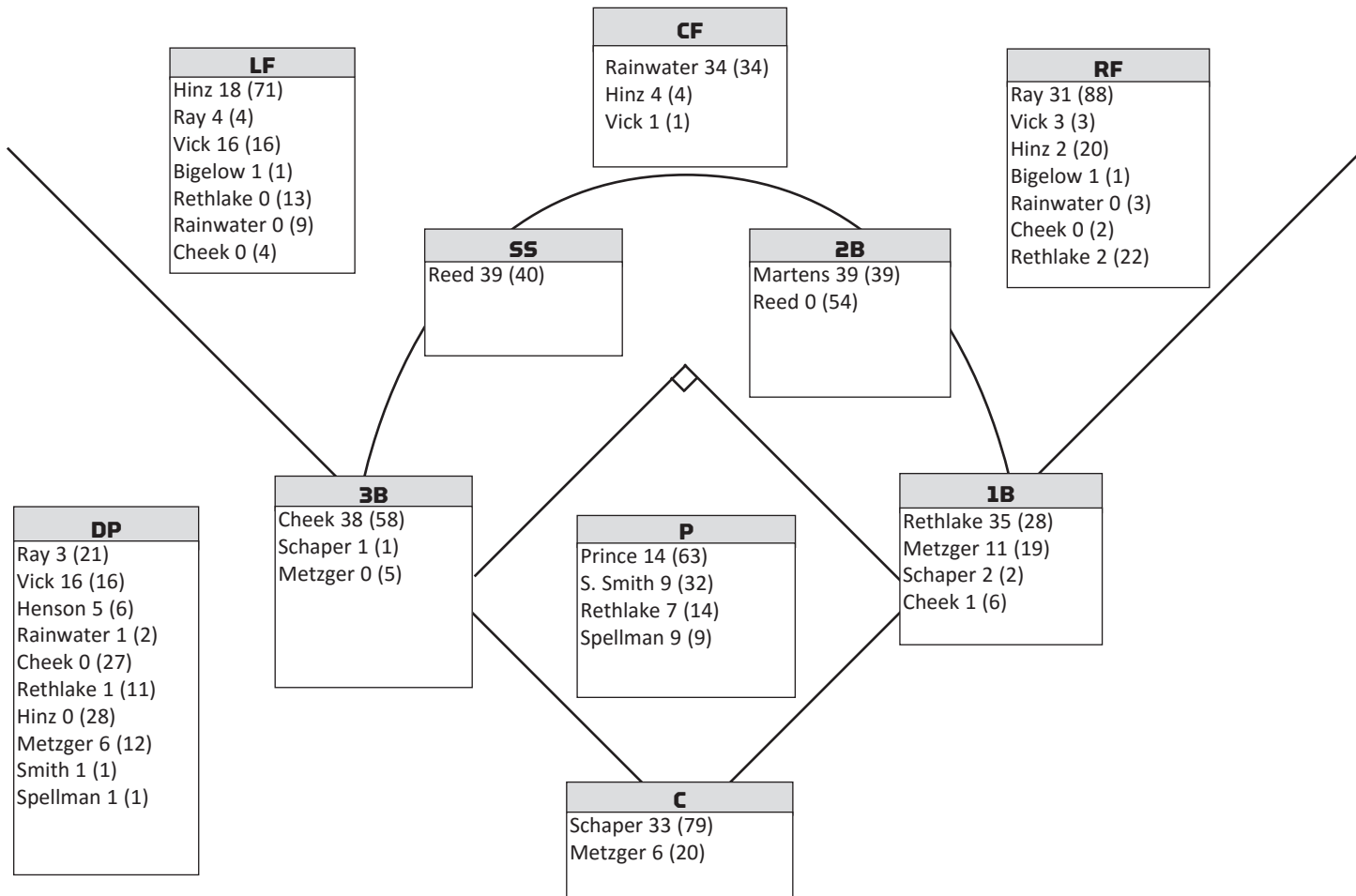

HEAD COACH RACHEL LAWSON (TENTH SEASON)

When Rachel Lawson was named head coach of the University of Kentucky softball team in July 2007 she saw a program poised for success. She knew athletics director Mitch Barnhart and the rest of UK's administration would give her unwavering support, and most importantly she knew the Big Blue Nation would provide the home-field advantage necessary for her team to compete in the Southeastern Conference.

Entering her 10th season as UK's head coach in 2017, Lawson's vision for the UK softball program has started to become a realization. The winningest head coach in program history has not only lead UK to its first-ever appearance in the Women's College World Series, four NCAA Super Regionals the last five seasons, including a program-best 50 wins in 2014, but UK's administration come through on their promise and commitment to softball by providing Lawson with one of the nation's greatest collegiate softball facilities in the \$9.5 million John Cropp Stadium.

She became the first coach in program history to eclipse 300 wins at Kentucky against Ole Miss on March 19 in a 3-1 win at John Cropp Stadium in Lexington.

Lawson and Co. have made sure the beautiful stadium has seen lots of wins over the past few seasons as UK had had some of its three most successful seasons in program history each of the last four years. In 2014, Lawson guided Kentucky to the Women's College World Series behind 50 wins. The Wildcats also set single-season records in at-bats, runs scored, doubles, home runs, RBI, total bases, walks, fielding percentage, putouts, lowest ERA and strikeouts. UK, which advanced to the program's first SEC Tournament Championship, started the season with a program-best 12 straight wins.

Three of the last four seasons, Lawson has led the Wildcats to a national seed in the NCAA Tournament. The school's first-ever national seed was in 2013 - and UK hosted an NCAA Regional for the first time ever. Kentucky, which has made the NCAA Tournament each of the last eight seasons, is one of just 18 schools nationally to claim that honor.

Lawson helped guide Kentucky to its best regular season in program history in 2016, winning 43 games in the regular season, ending with a No. 9 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, a new program best. The Wildcats earned the right to host the NCAA Tournament for the third time in the last four seasons at John Cropp Stadium in Lexington. Lawson was named the 2016 SEC Coach of the Year, and joined Kelsey Nunley (SEC Pitcher of the Year) as the first two Kentucky winners of those awards.

The 2016 team finished with some of the best pitching numbers in program history, setting school records in the circle for lowest team ERA (1.71), lowest opponent batting average (.191), fewest runs allowed (130), fewest earned runs allowed (98), fewest hits allowed (280) and fewest doubles allowed (44).

Now entering her 10th season in 2017, Lawson has won 411 career games at the head of the dugout and has earned her first-career NFCA First Team All-American in 2016 when Kelsey Nunley was named to the elite squad as a pitcher. Nunley became the second All-American in program history (Molly Johnson, 2nd Team), and the first to be named to the First Team.

Now sitting at 322-213 in her ten seasons at Kentucky, Lawson is the winningest head coach in school history and already has more wins in SEC play than UK had all told as a program when she took over in 2007. UK finished the 2014 season ranked sixth in both national listings for its best final ranking ever. In 2013, Kentucky was ranked in the top 14 of both collegiate softball rankings for the second time in school history with nine wins over ranked teams. In her nine seasons at Kentucky, Lawson has defeated over 70 ranked foes, including 40 wins vs. top-10 teams and 18 against top-five teams.

Lawson's 2013 squad set the stage for the 2014 run to the Women's College World Series, setting several school records, including a then-program record 41 wins. All told, Lawson has directed the Wildcats to 30 or more victories in seven-straight seasons, which also resonates as a program record. In her nine years with Kentucky, Lawson has helped UK players earn 33 All-SEC honors and 23 SEC Player of the Week honors.

Lawson's impact on the UK program is obviously, but her ability to develop players sometimes gets overshadowed by her impressive credentials in handling the day-to-day running of a program. Lawson, who serves as the pitching coach for the Wildcats, has guided three different pitchers to throw no-hitters against top-25 teams in just the last four seasons alone.



In all, UK has 17 career no-hitters - all of which have come under Lawson's tenure - including two perfect games.

Kentucky's 2012 season was highlighted by an impressive second-half surge with upsets of 12 ranked opponents, a then Lawson-best fifth place finish in SEC action, a program-record six captured conference series and a senior class who became the first class in school history to tally a .500 record or better in each of their four seasons of play.

The end of the 2012 season also marked the conclusion of some of the best individual careers in UK history as Lawson helped pitcher Chanda Bell become the first player in school history to record 200-plus strikeouts all four seasons, while slugger Brittany Cervantes is the school's leading home run hitter. Pitcher/infielder Rachel Riley also excelled under Lawson, ranking top 10 in school history in field percentage and nearly every pitching category.

In 2011, Lawson directed the Wildcats to their first NCAA Super Regional appearance and finished the season ranked No.12 in the country. The 2011 team earned a 40-16 overall record to set a new single-season standard for wins in a season before Lawson's 2013 team posted 41. UK appeared in the national rankings for a school-record 14 consecutive weeks, defeated 12 top-25 ranked opponents, captured five SEC series and became a national story with a dramatic postseason run which included a seventh-inning rally to knock off the nation's No. 2 team in Michigan in Ann Arbor to advance to Super Regionals.

The 2011 Wildcats shattered 12 single-season UK records, including home runs (65), RBI (275) and batting average (.275). Individually, the Wildcats had a school-record five players earn National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-Region honors in Meagan Aull, Cervantes, Kara Dill, Riley and Megan Yocke. Following the end of the impressive 2011 season, Lawson was rewarded with a five-year contract extension keeping her at the helm of the Wildcat program through 2016. That contract has been extended several times since, including June of 2014, which keeps Lawson in UK blue through the 2020 season.

In 2010, the Wildcats charted a 32-27 record and entered into the national rankings for the first time in program history, while also knocking off five top-seven ranked opponents on the year. Behind the pitching tandem of sophomores Riley and Bell, the Wildcats broke school records in nearly every pitching category. Kentucky's offense continued to make strides as well with improvements in batting average, home runs, RBI and sacrifice hits for the third consecutive season under the direction of Lawson.

HEAD COACH RACHEL LAWSON (TENTH SEASON)

Lawson's impact on the program was immediate as many Wildcats broke into the school record books under her tutelage. Pitcher Amber Matousek became the first pitcher in 10 years to record 10 or more strikeouts in a game when the sophomore right-hander achieved the feat three times in the season. Johnson set the school record for most doubles (20) in a season, while rocketing up the school charts for career home runs, doubles, batting average, slugging percentage and on-base percentage.

During the season the head coach also charted her 100th career victory in a 5-1 UK triumph over Eastern Illinois on March 1. Lawson became the winningest head coach in program history on April 10, 2013 with win No. 182 against Eastern Kentucky in Richmond, Ky.

Lawson became just the third head coach in the history of the Kentucky softball program after spending three seasons at Western Kentucky. She also served as an assistant coach at Maryland from 1996-2002 and was the associate head coach of the Philadelphia Force professional team in 2006.

Lawson tallied a record of 92-84 (.523) during her tenure with the Hilltoppers. In her first season at WKU, she led the Toppers to a spot in the Sun Belt Conference Tournament championship game. Picked to finish last in the preseason poll, WKU tied for second in the conference standings after setting a school record with 12 Sun Belt victories. The Billings, Mont., native led WKU to a 33-24 record in 2005 and reached the 30-win plateau again in 2007.

Lawson and the Hilltoppers battled nine NCAA Regional participants in 2006, including four teams ranked in the top 25, while finishing third in the Sun Belt regular-season play. She guided the squad to wins over perennial powers Long Beach State, South Florida, Mississippi Valley, as well as No. 13 Louisiana-Lafayette and No. 21 Louisville. In fact, then-freshman pitcher Ryan Rogge tossed the school's third no hitter against the Ragin' Cajuns in WKU's 8-0 victory.

The win handed UL its first run-rule defeat in an SBC contest. Three Hilltoppers - Lathrop, Rolfs and Rogge - each earned SBC Player- and Pitcher-of-the-Week honors throughout the season, as Rolfs and outfielder Alana Towns notched all-conference honors.

Lawson was a two-time all-conference player at Massachusetts, where she was part of a program that advanced to the 1992 Women's College World Series, and has seven years experience as an assistant coach at Maryland.

During her four-year career at UMass, Lawson helped the Minutewomen post a combined record of 142-68 (67.6 percent) including a 39-3 (92.9 percent) Atlantic 10 mark. In addition to the 1992 WCWS appearance, she was a part of squads that also advanced to the NCAA Tournament her freshman season, won three A-10 Tournament titles and claimed the league regular-season championship four straight years.

Lawson was honored individually for her accomplishments on and off the field. She was both an All-Conference and All-Atlantic 10 Tournament performer in 1992 and 1994, and was also named to the A-10 Academic all-conference squad following each of her final two seasons.

Lawson joined the Maryland staff in 1996 and helped the Terrapins post six winning seasons in her seven years in College Park. Her responsibilities included recruiting, scheduling, organizing practice and travel, as well as running camps and clinics. In 1999, Lawson and company were selected the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Mid-Atlantic Coaching Staff of the Year after leading the Terrapins to a 51-23 record, their first ACC regular-season title and the championship game of the NCAA Region II Tournament.

During her time at Maryland, Lawson helped eight individuals earn NFCA all-region accolades -- with an All-America honoree in 1999 -- and nine players collected all-conference honors.

A 1994 graduate of Massachusetts with a degree in exercise science, Lawson also earned her master's degree in sports management from UMass in 1998. She is the daughter of Elaine and Gerald Lawson and has 12 siblings.
