# GOLDA JOHANSSON BORST

Head Coach | Visby, Sweden | Seventh Season

Golda Johansson Borst is entering her seventh season as the head coach of the women's golf team in 2016-17, a tenure that has featured five consecutive postseason appearances and a breakthrough individual appearance in the 2015 NCAA Championships.

UK's 2015 NCAA Regional showing set the program's longest NCAA Tournament streak in school history while Isabelle Johansson's NCAA Championships appearance marked the first since Heather Kraus qualified in 1998.

Borst and Kentucky's run of five straight postseason appearances came to an end in 2015-16, but injuries were to blame for the snap in the streak. Without key veterans like Ale Walker and Sarah Harris, who missed the

entire season because of injuries, UK's young nucleus was forced into action and made promising strides in 2015-16.

Johansson built on her 2015 NCAA Championships appearance by leading the team in stroke average to go along with a team-high six top-50 finishes. Grace Rose posted two top-20 finishes, while Anna Hack came on late in her freshman season with two top-25 finishes in her final three tournaments. Hack continued to show her promise into the summer, qualifying for the U.S. Women's Open as an amateur.

With the core of the 2015-16 team returning in 2016-17 and a pair of heralded signees headed to Lexington in Josephine Chang and Sarah Shipley, the future is bright for Kentucky women's golf under Borst.

In six years as the Kentucky coach, Borst has continued on the path of taking the program to new heights. Under Borst, UK has posted six of the top seven single-season scoring averages in program history while claiming 31 top-10 finishes.

Under the guidance of Borst, eight Wildcats have recorded 18 scoring averages that place in the top 25 in program history. Additionally under Borst, five Wildcats own nine of the top 10 marks for most par or better rounds.

Academically the program has been just as good as the on-the-course performances. The Wildcats have racked up 14 Women's Golf Coaches Association All-American Scholar Team honors in Borst's six seasons. The program consistently finishes among UK's team grade-point average leaders, leading all teams during the spring 2016 semester with a 3.713 team GPA.

Borst hit the ground running in her first year in 2010-11 and hasn't looked back.

In just her first season, the Wildcats recorded their second- and third-lowest rounds in program history, shooting a 287 in the first round of the UCF Challenge and a 288 in the third round of the Cougar Classic. Kentucky's 54-hole scoring average of 306.30 was, at the time, the second-best mark in program history. As a team, the Wildcats finished in the top 10 in half of the tournaments they played in.

The Wildcats improved their scoring average by 1.57 strokes in Borst's second year in the program. Kentucky earned an eight-stroke victory at the Bettie Lou Evans Fall Invitational, the first win for the program since 2009, and three top-five finishes, the most in a season since the 2005-06 team recorded five top-five finishes. The Wildcats' six top-10 finishes was the most since the 2008-09 team recorded



seven.

In her third season at the helm, Borst's squad broke the program's 54-hole season scoring average by 3.63 strokes, which was previously set in 2011-12. Kentucky brought home a first-place finish in the very first tournament of the season, the Old Waverly Bulldog Invitational. For the season, UK finished with three top-five finishes, including fifth place at the SEC Championship.

The Wildcats broke the program's 54-hole season scoring average for the third straight season in 2013-14, this time smashing the mark by 4.97 strokes. Kentucky brought home a first-place finish in the very first tournament of the season, the "MO" Morial Invitational. For the season, UK finished with four top-five finishes while firing three of the top five lowest rounds in program history.

Without any seniors on the roster in 2014-15, Borst took a young team and nearly broke the program single-season scoring average for a third year in a row. The Wildcats finished with the second-best stroke average in school history and posted their best postseason finish under Borst when they finished in seventh place at the NCAA South Bend Regional, just barely missing on the program's first NCAA Championships berth as a team since 1992.

In addition to five top-10 finishes during the season, the highlight of the 2014-15 season came at the NCAA South Bend Regional when Johansson qualified for the NCAA Championships in thrilling fashion. Playing in just her sixth collegiate tournament, Johansson won in a three-hole playoff to qualify for the NCAA Championships, the first Wildcat to do so since 1998.

Borst joined the Wildcats from LSU where she served as assistant women's golf coach from 2007-10.

During her stay in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, LSU advanced to the NCAA regionals each of Borst's three seasons, highlighted by a 12th-place finish at the 2009 NCAA Championships.

With Borst, the Tigers recorded a 295.40 team-stroke average during 2009, improving upon the 300.40 posted in 2008. The 2009 season also saw LSU victories at the Bryan



Park National Collegiate and Mercedes-Benz Championship, as well as two individual titles. During 2010, LSU earned an individual title while registering a 54-hole 298.00 stroke average.

A four-year letterwinner for the women's golf team, Borst graduated from Tennessee in 2006 with a degree in communication studies. At Tennessee, Borst served as team captain in 2005 and finished with an 18-hole 76.19 stroke average.

Additionally, Borst earned Second Team All-SEC honors in 2006 and was named a three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll member. Borst's top collegiate finishes came when she placed second in both the 2005 Bryan Park National Collegiate and 2006 Dr. Donnis Thompson Invitational.

Borst and the Lady Volunteers advanced to the NCAA Women's Golf Championship during the 2004-06 seasons.

A native of Visby, Sweden, Borst competed

for the Swedish National Golf Team from 1999-2003. With Borst, the team claimed medalist honors at the Girls Team European Championship in 2000, second at the Lady's Team European Championship in 2001 and third in the Lady's Team European Championship in 2002.

Prior to coaching at LSU, Borst worked at the Ritz Carlton Golf Club in Sarasota, Florida, assisting in course and tournament operations.

Borst, formerly Golda Johansson, is married to Steve Borst.

Brian May is entering his third season as an assistant coach with the University of Kentucky women's golf team after serving as the head golf professional at the Frankfort Country Club for two and a half years.

In May's first season as an assistant coach at Kentucky, UK made a fifth straight appearance in NCAA Regionals, a school record.

At the NCAA Regionals, the Wildcats finished in seventh place with a furious last-day comeback, just narrowly missing out on the program's first NCAA Championships berth since 1992. The seventh-place finish is the best of the Golda Johansson Borst era.

Under May's watch, freshman Isabelle Johansson qualified for the NCAA

Championships as an individual, the first Wildcat to do so since Heather Kraus in 1998.

During May's first season as a Wildcat, Kentucky carded five top-10 finishes and posted the second-best single-season scoring average in school history.

In 2015-16, without key veterans like Ale Walker and Sarah Harris, who missed the entire season because of injuries, UK's young nucleus was forced into action and made promising strides with the tutelage of May.

Johansson built on her 2015 NCAA Championships appearance by leading the team in stroke average to go along with a team-high six top-50 finishes. Grace Rose posted two top-20 finishes, while Anna Hack came on late in her freshman season with two top-25 finishes in her final three tournaments.

May helped in the recruitment of incoming highly touted freshmen Josephine Chang and Sarah Shipley. With the additions of Chang and Shipley and a returning core of young talent, the future is bright for Kentucky women's golf.

A native of Frankfort, Kentucky, May graduated from the Golf Academy of the South in Orlando, Florida. In December of 2007, May returned to Lexington to take additional classes in exercise science at UK.

A PGA Level 3 Apprentice, May continued his golf career at the Frankfort Country Club where he served as the assistant golf professional for two years before being promoted to head golf professional in January of 2013.

A 2003 graduate of Franklin County High School, May is married to the former Corie Broering.

Her second-round 70 at the Longbow Golf Club marked the second-best round of her career and her tie for fifth marked the third top-five finish of her career ... Fired a career-best 69 in the first round of the Westbrook Invitational in Peoria, Arizona, on Feb. 22 ... Finished with a career-best 217 to finish in a tie for 16th at the Westbrook Invitational ... Tied for ninth place at the Ron Moore Intercollegiate in Highlands Ranch, Colorado, on Oct. 10-12 ... Recorded the best finish of her career by taking third (71-75-74-220) at Nebraska's season-opening Chip-N Club Invitational in early September, her best tournament score of her career at that time.

**2014-15 (Freshman at Nebraska):** Finished with a 77.67 stroke average on the year, which ranked as the fourth-best freshman stroke average in school history ...
